OFF THE TOP (through games of Feb. 26)

- San Diego State looks to post the best league record in Mountain West Conference history on Saturday when the Aztecs travel to Reno to face Nevada in the regular-season finale.
- San Diego State, currently 16-1 in league play, is looking to eclipse the 2004-05 Utah squad that finished the season 13-1 for top Mountain West Conference record.
- To do that, the Aztecs will look to snap Nevada's 10-game homecourt win streak and 20-game conference homecourt win streak dating back to Feb. 7, 2018.
- San Diego State's 27-1 record is tied with the 2010-11 team for best record after 28 games. That season, the Aztecs lost the 29th game of the season.
- San Diego State, which spent 39 days (includes part of days) as the nation's only undefeated team after Auburn loss on Jan. 15, is the only team in the country with only one loss (Baylor, Dayton and Gonzaga all have two losses).
- San Diego State has won consecutive meetings against the Wolf Pack and is going for a sweep of the season series for the first time since 2016. The Aztecs have handed Nevada five of its last 18 overall losses.
- San Diego State has clinched its seventh regular-season MW title this season (2006, 2011*, 2012*, 2014, 2015*, 2016 and 2020). and its 12th overall Mountain West championship. SDSU will be the top-seed at the Mountain West tourney next week. * - indicates shared title
- San Diego State fell from a school-record tying No. 4 in the AP Poll to No. 5 this week. The Aztecs are in the AP top 5 for a school-record six straight weeks and has been in the AP top 10 for eight consecutive weeks.

- San Diego State clinched the outright regular-season title on Feb. 11. The Aztecs became the first team in the nation to clinch its regular-season title this season and became the first team in the nation to clinch its outright regular-season title with four games remaining since Steph Curry's Davidson team in 2007-08.
- San Diego State became the fourth team this century to clinch a regular season outright championship with four games to play.

- San Diego State's 15-0 conference record was the best start for a Mountain West team in the history of the league.
- The 2020 tournament will mark the fifth time (2006, 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2020) in the Mountain West era that the Aztecs have been the top seed. SDSU owns a 9-3 record as a top seed, advancing to the championship game on all four occasions and winning the title in 2006.

- San Diego State owns the nations longest road winning streak (11, dates back to last season) and road/neutral streak (13) in the nation.

- In road/neutral games this season, San Diego State leads the nation in scoring margin (+16.5), field goal percentage differential (+11.4), and is second in three-point field goal percentage differential (11.6). On offense, the Aztecs are 2nd in field goal percentage (50.6), 3rd in free throw percentage (79.6), 7th in three-point field goal percentage (40.1). - San Diego State is 9-0 in NET Quadrant 1 and 2 games. Eight of those nine games have come away from home.

HOME COOKING (through games of Feb. 26)

- San Diego State ended the season 14-1 with an average scoring margin of +16.0. Of the 15 home games, 12 were been decided by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs 13-game homecourt win streak, snapped last Saturday, was tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since the school-record 29-game win streak from Nov. 20, 2013 and ended Feb. 28, 2015.

► SDSU's 26-game unbeaten streak to open the season was the longest by an NCAA team since Gonzaga started the 2016-17 campaign 29-0 (advanced to the national championship game).

► How hard is it to win 26 games in a row? Of the active 353 Division I head coaches, Brian Dutcher has become just the eighth coach with a win streak of at least 26 games.

► San Diego State's 26-0 record is the best start in school history, eclipsing the 20-0 mark set by the 2010-11 SDSU squad (Kawhi Leonard's sophomore, and final, season with the Aztecs).

SDSU CLIFF NOTES (through games of Feb. 26)

► San Diego State's metrics continue to pace at an elite level. As of Thursday, The Aztecs are currently 5th in NET (spent a national-best 45 non-consecutive days at No. 1 this season), 4th in strength of record, 4th in KenPom, 4th in BPI and 9th in Sagarin.

► The NCAA committee listed San Diego State as the fourth overall seed and placed the Aztecs as the No. 1-seed in the East Region on Feb. 8 when they released the top 16 teams in the nation at that moment in time.

► San Diego State is at No. 5 in the AP Poll this week. Now nationally ranked for a 12th-straight week, this is the fourth time the team has been in this ranking spot (previously Jan. 27 through Feb. 10, 2014).

► Prior to this season, the Aztecs had been ranked in the AP top-5 a total of four weeks in school history. San Diego State spent each of the previous five weeks ranked No. 4 and combined with this week's No. 5 ranking, continues to surpass the previous combined total prior to this season.

► San Diego State is enjoying its 78th appearance in the AP Top-25 Poll this week (all have occurred since the start of the 2010-11 campaign). Since the start of the '10-11 season, SDSU's 78 weeks in the top 25 are the 21st most nationally.

► San Diego State finds itself ranked among the nation's elite in several statistical categories, including 2nd in scoring margin (+16.5), 2nd in three-point field goal percentage differential (+9.7), 3rd in scoring defense (58.6), 5th in three-point field goal defense (28.3), 5th in field goal percentage differential (+8.9), 8th in field goal percentage defense (38.0), 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.38), 12th in three-point field goal percentage (38.2) and 17th in turnovers per game (10.9).

► San Diego State has four players averaging 10 points or more and six players averaging 6.9 points or more. Six Aztec players have scored 18 or more points in a game this season.

► San Diego State leads the Mountain West Conference in many team stats, including scoring margin (+16.50), scoring defense (58.57), field goal percentage defense (38.0), turnover margin (+3.36) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.38), and three-point field goal percentage defense (28.3).

► San Diego State is currently ranked 4th in KenPom and has top 15 efficiency ratings on both offense (13th) and defense (5th). The Aztecs join Duke, Kansas and Gonzaga as the only teams in the nation that rank in the top 15 of both sides of the ball.

- ▶ All three SDSU seniors (Yanni Wetzell, Nolan Narain and KJ Feagin) scored in the first 2:36 of the contest.
- ▶ SDSU seniors scored the first six points of the game.

Other Notes

- ▶ Senior Nolan Narain hit a 3-point basket to open the game tonight. It was his first trey of the season and the 10th of his career... Narain's three points tied a season high.
- ▶ Senior KJ Feagin connected on the trey for the second Aztec basket of the game... He had multiple blocked shots for the first time of his career.

Player Notes

- ▶ **Malachi Flynn (17 points, 6 rebounds, 4 assists)** - Scored in double figures for the 27th time this season (he had nine the other game) and 65th time over his collegiate career... Led SDSU in scoring for the 18th time this season and now has led his college team in scoring 32 times for his career... Over the last three games, is averaging 21.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 5.3 assists per game... After scoring just two points in the first half on 0-for-6 shooting from the floor (0-for-4 from 3-point range), he scored 15 points in the second half on 4-for-8 shooting (3-for-6 from 3-point range)... Had at least one 3-pointer in 24 straight games and multiple 3-pointers in six consecutive games.
- ▶ **Matt Mitchell (15 points, 3-6 3PTG, 5 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 blocked shot, 1 steal)** - Scored in double figures for the second consecutive game, for the 18th time this season and 55th time of his career (SDSU is 41-14 in those games)... Now has 1,046 points for his career, which ranks 28th in program history... Scored 13 of his 15 points in the first half.
- ▶ **Jordan Schakel (11 points, 4 rebounds, 1 assist, 2 steals)** - Reached double figures in scoring for the 19th time this season and 29th time of his career (SDSU is 26-3 in those games)... Has at least one 3-pointer for the 10th straight game, which is the longest streak of his career... Also has multiple 3-pointers over each of the 10 games... Tied a season high with two steals (eighth time of the season).

CUTTING DOWN THE NETS

- ▶ With its victory against New Mexico on Feb. 11 combined with Utah State's victory at Colorado State, San Diego State has earned the 2019-20 Mountain West regular season championship.
- ▶ The championship is the 12th in program history. San Diego State has won seven regular season and five conference tournament championships.
- ▶ San Diego State was the first team to earn its conference regular season title this season.

WHEN YOU WERE THE LAST UNBEATEN...

- ▶ At 26-0, San Diego State posted the best unbeaten record to open a season since Gonzaga opened the 2016-17 with a 29-0 record.
- ▶ It was the first time in school history that the Aztecs had been the lone undefeated team in the nation.
- ▶ In the last 10 seasons, the final unbeaten team has: won a national championship, advanced to the championship game three times, made it to the Elite Eight four times and made it to the Sweet 16 five times. Those numbers are even better when they appear when you consider that one of the teams (SMU in 2015-16) was ineligible for postseason and the 2017-18 team (Arizona State) opened with only a 12-0 record.
- ▶ Last season, Virginia opened the campaign 16-0 en route to winning the national title.

TOP-25 FACTS

- ▶ San Diego State is spending its 12th consecutive week in the AP Top-25 Poll this week.
- ▶ At No. 5, the Aztecs have equaled their second-highest ranking in the AP Poll in school history.
- ▶ The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 in the poll back on Dec. 9. SDSU has gone from 25 to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 to 7 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 5.
- ▶ This is the 78th week that the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- ▶ San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked by the AP.
- ▶ The Aztecs have been ranked No. 5 for three weeks previously (Jan. 27 through Feb. 10, 2014).
- ▶ San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- ▶ Prior to this season, the last time the Aztecs were ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.
- ▶ Prior to this season, the Aztecs had been ranked in the top-5 of the AP poll four times. This year they have eclipsed that number.

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEVADA

- ▶ This is the 25th meeting between the schools with San Diego State winning 18 of the previous 24 (18-6).
- ▶ San Diego State has won five of its last six games with Nevada.
- ▶ Nine of the meetings have been decided by single digits, including the two of the last three that have taken place in San Diego (2018: SDSU, 79-74; 2019: SDSU, 65-57; 2020: SDSU, 68-55).
- ▶ After Nevada joined the league in time for the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs won the first seven games by an average of 12.9 points. The Wolf Pack defeated SDSU for the first time as a member of the Mountain West on Jan. 4, 2017.
- ▶ In the history of the series, San Diego State won five of the first six meetings, dropped two of the next three get-togethers, won seven straight and then split the season series in 2016-17. SDSU has won five of the seven encounters between the teams over the last two seasons.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 3-0 against the Wolf Pack in the Mountain West Tournament. They faced off in the semifinals in each of the last two years and SDSU beat Nevada 90-73 in 2018 and 65-56 in 2019. The Wolf Pack were the No. 1 seed in both seasons and ranked No. 22 and No. 14 in the country in 2018 and 2019, respectively.
- ▶ In games played in Reno, the Aztecs and Wolf Pack are tied 5-5, but the Aztecs have been victorious just once in its last four in the "Biggest Little City In America."
- ▶ In games played in San Diego, the Aztecs are 8-1 vs. Nevada.
- ▶ Junior forward **Matt Mitchell** has a 5-2 career record and has averaged 11.0 points and 5.1 rebounds against the Wolf Pack.
- ▶ With 17 points & 16 rebounds, senior forward **Yanni Wetzell** collected his second double double of the year in the team's first game against Nevada.

SAN DIEGO (AP) - San Diego State home basketball games are starting to feel like they did back in the Kawhi Leonard era, when a packed Viejas Arena rocked and the Aztecs reached the Sweet 16 for the first time.

This time, it's a trio of transfers leading the No. 7 Aztecs back into national prominence. New Zealander Yanni Wetzell stepped up with 17 points and a career-high 16 rebounds Saturday night for SDSU, which got hot in the second half and beat Nevada 68-55 to remain the nation's only undefeated team.

The Aztecs pulled within one of the best opening streak in school history, a 20-0 run led by Leonard in 2010-11. That team finished a school-best 34-3.

With fellow big man Nathan Mensah missing his sixth straight game with a respiratory ailment, Wetzell had his best game with SDSU. "I was just that much more extra aggressive," said Wetzell, a graduate transfer from Vanderbilt. "We were down a couple at half and I knew that as a fifth-year senior I had to step up and try to lead these guys a little. I was just trying to be as aggressive as I can on the boards."

Wetzell's only mistake, it seemed, was an inadvertent tip-in that gave Nevada its only points during a 17-2 Aztecs run in the second half.

"Technically he had 19 points; just two for the other team," SDSU coach Brian Dutcher cracked.

Malachi Flynn scored 14 points for San Diego State (19-0, 8-0 Mountain West), and Jordan Schakel had 12. Matt Mitchell added 11 points.

Trailing 35-33 at halftime, SDSU changed up its ball-screen defense and staggered Nevada to send a charge through Viejas Arena.

"Proud of our effort, proud of the the way the guys hang in there," Dutcher said. "The crowd was incredible. I mean, I can't imagine a team coming in here and being comfortable playing in this noise. They can't hear their coaches, they're trying to call timeout, they can't hear them calling timeout. It's just a great home-court advantage when this building is full and rocking the way it is."

Jalen Harris, the Mountain West's second-leading scorer, had 16 of his 19 points in the first half for Nevada (11-8, 4-3), which withered offensively in the second half. Jazz Johnson scored 13.

"It's always been a great environment," said Nevada coach Steve Alford, who is familiar with the Aztecs from his days coaching at New Mexico. "They do such a great job and have a great student section. So, as far as home courts, it's a very difficult place to come in and play."

"I thought the players did a good job starting out the second half and the crowd got behind that and kind of accelerated things and we didn't handle that very well."

Nevada shot 14.7% in the second half and 28.1% for the game.

SDSU trailed 35-33 at halftime, but grabbed control in the opening minutes of the second half. Wetzell fed Schakel for a 3, Mitchell had a reverse layup and Flynn made a layup for a 40-35 lead, forcing Alford to take a timeout and firing up the crowd.

Nevada tied it at 40 when Johnson made a layup and then hit a 3.

But SDSU quickly jumped to an eight-point lead on Mitchell's bucket off a rebound, a free throw by KJ Feagin, a corner 3 by Mitchell and a jumper by Wetzell.

SDSU shut down the Wolf Pack after that.

It was just the second time this season SDSU trailed at halftime.

"The energy was a little different, but luckily we're an older group so we regathered and regrouped and came out aggressive in the second half," Wetzell said.

Wetzell said SDSU changed its ball-screen coverage.

"Instead of corraling the guard, we started to drop back and kind of gave up the mid-range shot for those guys," he said. "They started missing a few, so that's when we started getting a run and had a hot streak in the middle there."

Nevada, the second-best 3-point shooting team in the MWC, went 7 for 13 from behind the arc in the first half. The Wolf Pack trailed by two when Zane Meeks and Harris made consecutive 3-pointers to make it 28-24 with 5:42 to go.

POLL IMPLICATIONS

The Aztecs could move into the top five for the first time since February 2014, when they were headed to the Sweet 16 for the second time in school history.

► The Aztecs improve to 18-6 all-time against Nevada, including a 9-1 all-time mark in games played in San Diego.

► SDSU's 19-0 start is its second-best start in program history (20-0 in 2010-11).

► San Diego State extends the nation's longest winning streak to 19 games and is the only undefeated team in the nation.

SAN DIEGO — SAN DIEGO — Malachi Flynn scored 10 of San Diego State's last 17 points and the No. 5 Aztecs rallied from a sev-en-point deficit to beat Colorado State 66-60 Tuesday night and rebound from their only loss.

Flynn finished with 17 points for SDSU (27-1, 16-1 Mountain West) after scoring just two points in the first half.

The Aztecs trailed 56-49 with 8:22 left before going on a 13-0 run. Jordan Schakel hit a put-back and Flynn a 3-pointer before Schakel hit the go-ahead 3-pointer with 4:50 left, making it 57-56.

SDSU's 13-0 run over 5 minutes, 17 seconds gave it a 62-56 lead.

The Aztecs were out-of-sync for much of the game and once again took poor shots. But unlike Saturday night, when their furious rally fell short against UNLV, they were able to get the lead and keep it.

Matt Mitchell scored 15 and Schakel 11.

Nico Carvacho scored 17 for CSU ((19-11, 10-7) and Isaiah Stevens had 12.

Carvacho made a layup and Kendle Moore two free throws to pull the Rams to 62-60. Mitchell missed a 3 and then Stevens missed a shot, with SDSU's Yanni Wetzell tying up Carvacho, with SDSU getting the passion.

Mitchell and Flynn each made two free throws in the final nine seconds.

SDSU had been the nation's last unbeaten team before its school-record 26-game winning streak was snapped in a 66-63 home loss to UNLV on Saturday night.

The Rams came out fired up and surprised the Aztecs with a 12-0 run early in the first half to overcome a nine-point deficit and take a 14-11 lead.

SDSU seemed content to launch 3-pointers and not try to get inside, even when 6-foot-11 CSU center Nico Carvacho was out of the game. The Aztecs made only 6 of 17 from behind the arc in the first half.

The Aztecs pulled to 35-34 when Mitchell finally drove the lane and scored and was fouled, but he missed the free throw. Dischon Thomas made one of two free throws for the Rams to make it 36-34 at halftime.

NET NATIONAL RANKING

- ▶ The NCAA announced its first NET (NCAA Evaluation Tool) rankings on Monday, Dec. 16, and San Diego State slotted comfortably at No. 3, behind only Ohio State (No. 1) and Kansas (No. 2).
- ▶ As of Feb. 24, the Aztecs are ranked No. 5 after a record 24-day streak at No. 1.
- ▶ Since its initial ranking this season, the Aztecs had been No. 1 for 45 days (including 17 days in a row from 12/22/19-to1/7/20 and the aforementioned 24-day streak), No. 2 for 12 days, No. 3 for eight days, No. 4 four days and now No. 5 for the last two days.
- ▶ In the 67 days the NET has been calculated (through Feb. 24, 2020), San Diego State has, by far, spent the most time at the top of the ranking (45 days). Baylor has been No. 1 for 14 days, Kansas for 10 days, and Ohio State for one day.
- ▶ The NET replaced RPI last year as the primary sorting tool for evaluating teams during the season. NET relies on game results, strength of schedule, location, scoring margin, net offensive and defensive efficiency, and the quality of wins and losses to create its rankings.

...AND THEN THERE WERE FOUR...THREE...TWO...ONE...NONE

- ▶ When the season started on Nov. 5, all 353 schools that compete at the Division I level were undefeated.
- ▶ After games on Jan. 15, there was one Division I school that remained unbeaten...San Diego State.
- ▶ After San Diego State's 66-63 loss to UNLV on Feb. 22, there were no unbeaten teams in the nation.
- ▶ San Diego State is currently the lone Division I men's basketball program with only one loss (Gonzaga - 27-2, Dayton - 26-2, and Baylor - 25-2) and the only teams with two losses this season.
- ▶ San Diego State's 26-game winning streak to start the season equals the 2007-08 Memphis Tigers for the fourth best start to a Division I season since the start of the 1996-97 season. The only schools to have better starts in that time frame were Kentucky (38-0 in 2014-15) and Gonzaga (29-0 in 2016-17) and Illinois (29-0 in 2004-05).
- ▶ SDSU's 26-0 start was the best start to a season in program history. The 2010-11 Aztecs opened that year 20-0.
- ▶ San Diego State's 26-game winning steak was the longest in the nation this year.

MORE AZTEC TIDBITS

- ▶ San Diego State is currently 5-1 in February and 45-18 in its last 63 games played in the month.
- ▶ San Diego State finished 9-0 in January and 61-18 in the last 79 January games.
- ▶ San Diego State finished December 5-0 and is now 55-14 in its last 69 games played in that month.
- ▶ San Diego State finished November 8-0 and has a 51-13 record in its last 64 November games.
- ▶ San Diego State's 26-game win streak to open the season is the longest of the Brian Dutcher era and the longest in school history.
- ▶ In San Diego State history there have been seven win-streaks of at least 11 games. Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for six of them.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 30 straight games and are 61-8 in the Dutcher era when leading at intermission.

FLYNN PICKS UP MORE HARDWARE

Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** has already been named to the John R. Wooden Award and the Lute Olson National Player of the Year award midseason watch lists as well as the Sporting News midseason All-America team, a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award and a late season watch list member of the John R. Wooden Award, this week he was added to the Oscar Robertson Trophy Watch List and the Citizen Naismith Trophy Team.

- ▶ Flynn is one of 12 players to be named a finalist for the **Oscar Robertson Trophy** watch list. The award is presented by the USBWA and recognizes that organization's Player of the Year.
- ▶ The **Citizen Naismith Trophy Team** is made of up of 30 Division I players who are on its midseason watch list. Only layers on the mid season list are eligible to win the award which recognizes the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Player of the Year. Flynn is the fourth SDSU player to appear on the team, joining Aztec Hall of Fame inductees Kawhi Leonard, Jamaal Franklin and Xavier Thames who received the honor during the 2010-11, 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons, respectively.
- ▶ Flynn, one of 20 players in Division I this season, is the third Aztec men's basketball player to be included in the **Wooden Watch**. Previously Kawhi Leonard was named to the list in 2011 and Jamaal Franklin was selected for the 2013 watch list. Flynn is one of three juniors on the list and the only player from a Mountain West Conference school.
- ▶ Flynn was on the **Lute Olson Award** watch list, at the beginning of the season, and is one of two players from the Mountain West (Sam Merrill, Utah State) on the midseason list.
- ▶ Flynn was named a second-team **Sporting News midseason All-American** earlier this season. He is the only player from the Mountain West and one of two from non-power basketball conference to appear on the list.
- ▶ Flynn is the only player from a non-power basketball conference among the 10 finalists.

FROM THE WAY BACK FILE

WETZELL EARNS SECOND MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARD

- ▶ **Yanni Wetzell**, a graduate transfer originally from Auckland, New Zealand, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Jan. 13. It is his second MW weekly award after being named the Player of the Week on Nov. 25, 2019.
- ▶ Wetzell averaged 18.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.0 steals in 28.5 minutes in two games last week.
- ▶ He hit 16-of-19 (.842) attempts from the field and 5-of-6 (.833) attempts from the charity stripe in two games.
- ▶ Against Boise State, he made 9-of-12 shots tying his career-best for field goals in a game and matched his career-high with four assists. He became the fourth Aztec since the 1996-97 season to record at least 20 points, 5 rebounds and 4 assists, while shooting 75-plus percent from the field in a game.

FLYNN CRUISES PASSED 1,000-CAREER POINTS

- ▶ Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** began the game versus Fresno State (1/1) eight points away from reaching 1,000 for his career.
- ▶ With a layup, which put the Aztecs up 37-27 at the 12:24 mark in the second half, Flynn reached 1,000 career points. He added eight more in the game to finish with 16 and enters the team's game at Utah State with 1,008-career points.
- ▶ Flynn scored 302 points as a freshman and 489 points as a sophomore at Washington State. He enters the game against Utah State with 217 points with the Aztecs this season.

MULTI-TEAM EVENT SUCCESS

- ▶ Since the start of the 2010-11 season San Diego State has competed in 12 Multi-Team Events (MTE).
- ▶ San Diego State has played 32 games in those events and has compiled a 27-5 record.
- ▶ San Diego State has been crowned champion in seven of the 11 MTEs it's competed in since 2010-11, including the 2019 Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational late last month.

FLYNN NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Malachi Flynn, a junior transfer from Washington State, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 1. In three games, Flynn hit 19-of-40 from the floor (.475) averaging 20.0 points to go along with 3.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds, 2.3 steals and had a 1.6:1 assist to turnover ratio. In two games in the Las Vegas Invitational, he totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, and had seven rebounds, seven assists and five steals. The Tacoma, Wash., native, led SDSU in scoring all three games and was the overall leading scorer in two of three contests the team played that week.

- ▶ **Trailing by nine points starting the second half against Iowa in the LVI Championship game, Flynn went 8-of-13 from the field, 3-of-7 from distance and 9-of-9 from the line, scoring 28 points in the half, en route to being named the tournament's MVP.**

BRINGING HOME HARDWARE FROM CONTINENTAL TIRES LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL

- ▶ With wins over Creighton (83-52) and Iowa (83-73), the Aztecs won the Las Vegas Invitational, its first exempt tournament title since the 2017 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.
- ▶ **Malachi Flynn**, who was held scoreless in the first half against Iowa but totaled 28 of the team's 51 second-half points en route to the win. In two San Diego State wins, Flynn totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, was 13-for-13 from the line and had seven rebounds, seven assists, and five steals. For his efforts he was named the tournament MVP
- ▶ **Yanni Wetzell** averaged 14.5 points (11-of-15 FG, 1-of-2 3FG, 6-of-8 FT), 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and had a steal and a block and was named to the All-Tournament Team.
- ▶ **Jordan Schakel** was also named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.5 points (10-16 FG & 7-of-10 3FG), 4.5 rebounds, with an assist and two steals.

WETZELL NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Yanni Wetzell, a graduate transfer originally from Auckland, New Zealand, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 24. In two games, Wetzell hit 15-of-18 from the floor (.833) averaging 16.5 points to go along with 8.5 rebounds and 1 assist and one steal win a pair of wins. Against USD, he reached career-highs with 20 points and 12 rebounds to become the first Aztec this year to finish a game with a double double.

- ▶ Wetzell is one of three players this year who has had a game where his shot at least .800 from the floor, grabbed at least 12 boards and was perfect from beyond the three-point line.

FOREIGN FRONT LINE

- ▶ The four tallest players on the 2019-20 San Diego State roster all stand 6'-10" and all are foreign born.
- ▶ **Yanni Wetzell**, a graduate transfer and forward, is a native of Auckland, New Zealand.
- ▶ **Nathan Mensah**, a sophomore forward, hails from Labadi, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ **Joel Mensah**, no relations to Nathan and a sophomore forward, is from Korle Gonno, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ **Nolan Narain**, a senior forward, came to the States from north of the border in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons as well as an NIT national semifinalist appearance. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 143-20 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2019-20 season underway, here are a few statistics to keep an eye on.

- ▶ In its last 243 home games, SDSU has compiled a 213-30 mark, including 125-17 against conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, the Aztecs are 145-20 at home, including a 63-9 record in conference home contests during that stretch.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 56-8 in their last 64 conference home games.

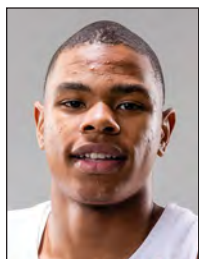

Third Season • 21st Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, begins his third season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Last season, Dutcher guided San Diego State to a 21-13 record which included multiple victories over nationally ranked Nevada. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first two seasons and for the second year in a row directed his squad to the championship game of the Mountain West Championship tournament.

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 20-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the post-season 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 14 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan

Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.

SAN DIEGO -- The first 20 minutes of San Diego State's season was a thing of beauty. Jordan Schakel and newcomer Malachi Flynn scored 15 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 11 rebounds for San Diego State, which ran past Texas Southern 77-42 Tuesday night.

San Diego State led the entire game and was up 40-10 with just less than four minutes to play in the first half. It was 48-13 at halftime, after SDSU made nine 3-pointers and outrebounded Texas Southern 30-16.

SDSU didn't keep up the intensity in the second half.

"Then the second half was just tough to get through," Dutcher said. "We had 10 assists at half then we only had two assists in the second half. Overall, though, Dutcher was pleased.

The Tigers of the SWAC didn't crack 20 points until Yahuza Rasas made a layup with 11 minutes to go to make it 57-21.

Texas Southern coach Johnny Jones was ejected after being called for his second technical of the game, with 7:14 to go.

The Aztecs won the opening tipoff and Schakel drained the first of his four 3-pointers in the first half to get the rout started. The junior guard made another shot from behind the arc two minutes later. Flynn's first points with the Aztecs came on a corner 3 for a 15-6 lead. Freshman Keshad Johnson's first points also came on a 3 to give the Aztecs their 40-10 lead.

"It felt pretty good," Schakel said of the hot start. "I was glad that it happened in the first couple minutes to get us off to a good start. I think we played well in the first half. It's always devastating when you're able to make 3s at a high clip like that. We have a lot of good shooters on this team and when we move the ball like that it's bound to happen."

Johnson added 10 rebounds for SDSU, which outrebounded the Tigers 62-41.

Tyrik Armstrong led the Tigers with 10 points.

SAN DIEGO -- First a win at BYU and then finally, a win against pesky Grand Canyon.

It's been a big five-day stretch for San Diego State, which dominated inside and outside against Grand Canyon to win 86-61 Tuesday night. Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah each scored 14 points.

KJ Feagin added 13 points for SDSU (3-0), which was coming off a big 76-71 win at former conference rival BYU on Saturday.

Grand Canyon (0-3) had won its previous two games against the Aztecs in San Diego, plus the most recent game in the series, a 76-72 victory in Phoenix on Dec. 7, 2016.

"Coach Dutch (Brian Dutcher) was really on edge coming into this game," Feagin said. "I knew he wanted this win. At the time it doesn't seem that way but when the season finishes up you have that loss on your record and we knew it hurt us. We wanted to come out and play at a high level because we knew they were a very good opponent."

Dutcher succeeded Fisher as head coach after the 2016-17 season.

Leading 15-14, SDSU got hot from inside and outside and raced to a 30-18 lead. Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer and a fall-away jumper during the big run.

The Aztecs twice hit consecutive 3-pointers in the first half. Feagin and Mitchell did it early on and then Adam Seiko and Keshad Johnson did it to give SDSU a 36-22 lead with six minutes before halftime.

GCU went scoreless for the final five minutes of the first half as SDSU jumped to a 40-24 lead.

"Offensively when you have 35 baskets and 25 assists, you're playing the game the right way," Dutcher said. "Overall, offensively we shared the ball as well as we have all year. We ended up outrebounding them for the game, which pleased me."

Flynn had nine assists and Feagin had seven.

He made two of the Aztecs' final three shots of the first half and had 13 points in the first 20 minutes to help the Aztecs to a 34-26 lead. He then opened the second half with a hook shot and a 3-pointer to extend the lead to 13 points.

"I thought Yann would have an advantage in this game. That's the beauty of having a week off," coach Brian Dutcher said. "I thought we had an advantage inside against their power forward and Yann proved that to be true. He played with great poise and patience and strength and had a really nice game for us, both scoring and rebounding."

He had a rough game at BYU on Nov. 9, missing several inside shots. "It was just a matter of finding my rhythm. I know that I make those shots in practice every day and I'm just happy it came today. It was just a matter of keeping my confidence high."

Malachi Flynn, who was held scoreless in the first half against Iowa but totaled 28 of his team's 51 second-half points en route to the win. In two San Diego State wins, Flynn totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, was 13-for-13 from the line and had seven rebounds, seven assists, and five steals. For his efforts he was named the tournament MVP.

Yanni Wetzell averaged 14.5 points (11-of-15 FG, 1-of-2 3FG, 6-of-8 FT), 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and had a steal and a block and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Jordan Schakel was also named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.5 points (10-16 FG & 7-of-10 3FG), 4.5 rebounds, with an assist and two steals.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State was a second away from its first loss when Malachi Flynn let fly with a long 3-pointer. It found nothing but net, sending Viejas Arena into a frenzy and continuing the Aztecs' remarkable start.

Flynn hit a 3-pointer with nine-tenths of a second left to give the cold-shooting Aztecs a thrilling 59-57 victory over San Jose on Sunday for the Aztecs' first 10-0 start in nine seasons.

SDSU (2-0 Mountain West Conference) is off to its best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11. That team finished 34-3 after reaching the Sweet 16 for the first time.

The next stop for the Aztecs could be The Associated Press Top 25 for the first time in four years.

The Aztecs were in trouble after a flurry of 3-pointers by the Spartans in the final five minutes, including one by Brae Ivey for a 55-54 lead. Seneca Knight added a nice bank shot for a three-point lead for SJSU (3-7, 0-2).

But Matt Mitchell hit two free throws with 41.3 seconds to go. Knight missed two free throws and Mitchell rebounded KJ Feagin's missed 3-pointer with about 10 seconds left. After an SDSU timeout, the Aztecs retained possession following a held ball. Jordan Schakel passed to Flynn for his big shot.

Mitchell finished with 13 points, Nathan Mensah 12 points and 12 rebounds, and Schakel 11 points.

Knight had 15 for the Spartans while Ivey had 13 and Ralph Agee 12.

The Aztecs shot just 32% and let the Spartans pull within four points three times midway through the second half.

The Spartans got consecutive 3-pointers by Knight and Christian Anigwe to pull to 52-49 and silence the crowd with 4:18 to go.

BIG PICTURE

San Jose State: The Spartans have lost five straight. They trailed No. 25 Utah State by three at halftime on Wednesday night before losing 71-59.

San Diego State: The Aztecs should move into the AP Top 25 on Monday. They were 28th last week, 23 points shy of being ranked. They haven't been ranked since they were No. 24 on Feb. 28, 2015. They lost their next game to Boise State.

SAN DIEGO -- No. 20 San Diego State got the laughter it needed to ease back into action after a 10-day layoff for finals.

Yanni Wetzell scored 17 points and the Aztecs beat NAIA San Diego Christian 92-48 on Wednesday night to remain undefeated. It was the 13th-largest margin of victory in school history.

SDSU (11-0) hadn't played since beating San Jose State by two points by home on Dec. 8. The Aztecs were playing for the first time since jumping into The Associated Press Top 25. They moved up five spots Monday despite not playing last week.

The Aztecs are off to their best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11, when they reached the Sweet 16 for the first time and finished 34-3. They are one of four remaining undefeated teams.

KJ Feagin added 12 points and Malachi Flynn and Jordan Schakel had 10 apiece for SDSU.

The Aztecs used it to get their legs back after the long layoff and to prepare for Saturday's game against Utah at Staples Center in Los Angeles. That's the last of four big non-conference games the Aztecs are hoping will bolster their resume for an at-large NCAA Tournament bid in case they don't win the Mountain West Conference tournament and the automatic bid that comes with it.

SDSU has already won at BYU, and beat Creighton and Iowa to win the Las Vegas Invitational.

SDSU had 24 assists, led by Feagin with eight. The Aztecs had a lot of slam dunks and worked on their press against the outmanned Hawks.

Bryce Parsons gave the Hawks a 2-0 lead before the Aztecs went on a 14-0 run. The Hawks pulled within single digits before SDSU used an 8-0 run to take control for good. Wetzell had another slam and a free throw, and Matt Mitchell converted a three-point play for a 27-16 lead. SDSU led 45-27 at halftime.

San Diego Christian's Marc Combs scored all 14 of his points in the first half.

LOS ANGELES -- Malachi Flynn and San Diego State head into Christmas off one of their most impressive wins of the season.

Flynn scored 16 points to lead the 20th-ranked Aztecs to a 80-52 victory over Utah on Satin the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic at Staples Center.

Yanni Wetzell and Nathan Mensah added 14 points apiece for the Aztecs (12-0), who remain one of the nation's four unbeaten teams. They are also off to the second-best start in program history.

San Diego State dominated inside with a 42-20 advantage in points in the paint. They led 29-19 at halftime with 18 of their points coming inside.

The Utes -- who upset No. 6 Kentucky on Wednesday -- came in shooting 50.2% from the field but were 15 of 48 on Saturday. That is their second worst-shooting game in Larry Krystkowiak's nine seasons as coach.

Timmy Allen led Utah (9-3) with 21 points. The Utes didn't make a field goal in the final 3:33.

It is the second time this season the Aztecs have held a team under 32% from the field. Their shooting was much better as they went 31 of 63.

The Aztecs scored the first seven points and roared to a 15-2 lead. The Utes did not get on the scoreboard until the 16:16 mark and trailed by double digits when Wetzell hit a 3-pointer to make it 12-2 with 15:19 remaining.

San Diego State's largest lead in the first half was 14. It was up 29-19 at halftime and extended it to 34 during the final minute.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State didn't look anything like the nation's 15th-ranked team for a long stretch of the first half against scrappy Cal Poly.

The Aztecs missed inside shots, had free throws clang off the rim and big man Yann Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin air-balled 3-point shots.

And then the stunner: The Mustangs raced back from a 10-point deficit to take a 23-22 lead to hush the crowd at Viejas Arena.

That's when SDSU finally woke up. Wetzell started a 9-0 run that closed the first half and the Aztecs won 73-57 to continue their best start in nine seasons.

Malachi Flynn scored 14 points and Wetzell and Jordan Schakel added 12 points apiece for the Aztecs (13-0), who are one of three undefeated teams nationally.

SDSU remains on its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing 34-3. SDSU, Auburn and Liberty are the nation's only undefeated teams.

After leading just 31-23 at halftime, SDSU opened it up early in the first half. Flynn hit two long 3-pointers, including one that banked in, and Feagin also hit a shot from behind the arc. Wetzell, a New Zealander, made three close-in shots to help the Aztecs take a 50-31 lead.

Kyle Colvin scored 13 points and Junior Ballard had 12 for the Mustangs. Alimamy Koroma had 12 rebounds.

The Aztecs frittered away an early 18-8 lead and let the Mustangs go ahead 23-22 on Koroma's two free throws with 2:41 before halftime. The Mustangs also got 3-pointers by Colvin and Ballard in surprising the Aztecs.

SDSU turned it on in the final 1:40 to take a 31-23 halftime lead. After Matt Mitchell missed a 3-pointer, Koroma rebounded but Wetzell stole the ball and scored. Flynn and Schakel had layups before Mitchell followed Flynn's missed 3 with a slam dunk, was fouled and made the free throw.

SAN DIEGO -- Undefeated and 13th-ranked San Diego State passed the first test of its toughest stretch of the season when it outlasted old friend Justin Hutson and undermanned Fresno State.

Malachi Flynn scored 16 points and Matt Mitchell had 15 for SDSU, which beat the Bulldogs 61-52 Wednesday to remain one of two undefeated teams nationally.

Mitchell had three big baskets in the second half in his first start of the season and Flynn, a transfer guard, scored his 1,000th career point as SDSU (14-0, 3-0 Mountain West) remains on its hottest start in nine seasons. The Aztecs haven't been this good since 2010-11, when they opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing 34-3.

SDSU and Auburn remain the nation's only undefeated teams. The Aztecs snapped a five-game losing streak to the Bulldogs, who had won their last three games at Viejas Arena.

Jarred Hyder scored 23 for Fresno State (4-10, 0-3), which was without leading scorer Nate Grimes, out with a wrist injury.

Mitchell, starting in place of sophomore forward Nathan Menshah (respiratory ailment) hit a long jumper just inside of nine minutes to go and then drained a 3-pointer for a 46-36 lead.

Earlier in the half, Mitchell had a nice spin-move layup followed by a free throw, and then Flynn made a pretty left-handed layup gave SDSU a 33-23 lead.

Joel Mensah had consecutive baskets to help give SDSU a cushion after the Bulldogs had pulled within five points with 13 minutes to play.

Flynn and KJ Feagin scored four points apiece during a 10-0 run at the end of the first half that gave the Aztecs a 25-17 lead after they struggled earlier against the Bulldogs.

Flynn started the run with a 3-pointer with 5:14 to go and added a free throw after a technical foul against Mustafa Lawrence. Flynn fed Feagin for a baseline reverse layup, Feagin hit a jumper and Trey Pulliam made a runner.

Fresno State had taken an early lead after 3-pointers by Hyder and New Williams.

LOGAN, Utah -- Stout defense is a cornerstone of success for San Diego State this season. It certainly helped the No. 13 Aztecs extend their unbeaten start in a tough road environment.

Malachi Flynn scored 22 points, Matt Mitchell added 19 and San Diego State beat Utah State 77-68 on Saturday night to improve to 15-0. The Aztecs own the nation's longest winning streak. Auburn is the only other undefeated Division I team.

San Diego State (15-0, 4-0 Mountain West) snapped the Aggies' 15-game home winning streak and beat them for the 12th time in the last 14 meetings. The Aztecs shot 51% from the field and scored 13 points off 11 turnovers.

Sam Merrill had 26 points and Neemias Queta added 15 points and 14 rebounds for the Aggies. Utah State (13-4, 2-2) lost back-to-back games for the first time since coach Craig Smith took over the program before the start of the 2018-19 season.

Consecutive 3-pointers from Flynn and Mitchell sparked a 10-1 run that helped the Aztecs take a 21-12 lead with 7:18 left in the first half. Flynn's outside basket barely beat the shot-clock buzzer before a media timeout. Utah State enabled the run by going more than five minutes without scoring.

San Diego State made six straight baskets to stay in front after the Aggies started to hit shots. Trey Pulliam capped the stretch with a jumper to give the Aztecs their largest first-half lead at 34-23.

Many of their first-half baskets came after executing high ball screens to perfection. San Diego State forced Utah State to defend late into the shot clock on possession after possession.

The Aztecs eventually built a 16-point lead early in the second half, going up 53-37 when Jordan Schakel buried a 3-pointer to cap a string of three straight San Diego State baskets.

Diogo Brito and Merrill nailed successive 3s to spark a 12-3 run. Queta finished it off with a dunk that cut the Aztecs' lead to 56-49.

Mitchell scored back-to-back baskets to keep the Aggies from getting closer. They helped San Diego State open a 63-50 lead with 5:41 left.

San Diego State outrebounded Utah State 34-30 and had four players with at least five rebounds. Mitchell led the way with a team-high seven. The Aztecs have finished with more rebounds than 11 of their 15 opponents this season.

LARAMIE, Wyo. -- The seventh-ranked and undefeated San Diego State Aztecs were ready for whatever awaited them in Laramie.

They planned ahead to deal with the 7,220-foot elevation, which can sap a player's strength. They had no intention of being upset by the Wyoming Cowboys, who have beaten ranked Aztecs teams before, but not this night.

Malachi Flynn scored 19 points, Yanni Wetzell added 17 and the the Aztecs beat Wyoming 72-52 on Wednesday night to remain one of the nation's two undefeated teams.

San Diego State (16-0, 5-0 Mountain West) continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time, finishing a school-record 34-3.

Jordan Schakel added 11 points for the Aztecs, whose 16-game winning streak is the longest in the country. San Diego State and Auburn are the nation's only undefeated teams. Auburn beat Vanderbilt on Wednesday night to improve to 14-0.

To combat the elevation, coach Brian Dutcher had the Aztecs return home Sunday after winning at Utah State on Saturday night. They then took a charter flight to Wyoming on Tuesday night.

The plan worked. San Diego State was a little sloppy early and let Wyoming get within three points on Hunter Maldonado's 3-pointer with just less than eight minutes left in the first half.

San Diego State then closed the half on a 14-6 run to take a 32-21 lead. Wetzell grabbed Flynn's missed 3 for a dunk and then fed Adam Seiko for a layup. Schakel hit two 3-pointers while Seiko and Flynn each added a bucket.

San Diego State lost the last two times it played in Laramie while in the Top 25, 68-62 as the fifth-ranked team on Feb. 11, 2014, and 58-45 as No. 15 on Jan. 19, 2013.

Flynn, Schakel and KJ Feagin each hit a 3-pointer in the first four minutes of the second half to push the lead to 47-30.

Hunter Maldonado scored 18 points for Wyoming (5-11, 0-5), the conference's last-place team. Hunter Thompson added 15 for the Cowboys, who lost their third straight.

The short-handed Aztecs continued to be without Nathan Mensah (respiratory ailment) and Aguek Arop (shoulder), and Joel Mensah was sidelined with back spasms.

SDSU continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing a school-record 34-3.

RJ Williams scored 16 for Boise State (11-7, 3-3).

The Aztecs gave the sellout crowd plenty to cheer about. After they took a 23-9 lead, BSU pulled within eight points on Williams' slam dunk, but the Aztecs answered with an 18-2 run to blow it open.

Feagin made consecutive shots for a 33-19 lead, Jordan Schakel drained a 3 and Wetzell had a layup. Flynn and Wetzell made impressive shots on consecutive possessions for a 45-21 lead. Flynn dribbled between his legs, stepped back and hit a long 3. Wetzell made a post-up hook.

Feagin matched his season high of 13 with more than 6 1/2 minutes left in the first half. His previous season high was against Grand Canyon on Nov. 13. BSU tied its season-high with 18 turnovers.

"They just blitzkrieged us," Boise State coach Leon Rice said. "We tried to help on the post a little bit and whack, whack, whack, three 3s.

FRESNO, Calif. -- San Diego State won't make any scoring highlight reels with games like their one against Fresno State, yet the Aztecs might make it deep into the NCAA Tournament.

In a contest in which they had no 3-point game, the No. 7 the Aztecs relied on a suffocating defense to shut down Fresno State 64-55 on Tuesday night.

San Diego State (18-0, 7-0 Mountain West Conference) remains one of two unbeaten teams in Division 1, along with Auburn. The Aztecs extended two nation-leading streaks: 18 consecutive victories, and nine straight road or neutral-site wins.

"I was leaving the hotel (earlier) and saw Clemson beat Duke on the road," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "I told these guys, 'Everyone knows you're ranked and they bring their best effort. Enjoy every one of them. What you're doing is not easy. Winning on the road is the hardest thing in basketball. Your perfect record on the road is unheard of.'"

San Diego State hasn't been 18-0 since the 2010-11 team advanced to the Sweet 16. The Aztecs experienced just their fifth victory by single digits, due in part to an offense that missed 15 of 18 3-point attempts and had no offensive rebounds in the first 30 minutes.

"Both teams did a good job on defense, said guard Malachi Flynn, who led all scorers with 20 points. "They did a really good job of making us make shots."

It took a 7-0 run in the final 5:32 of the first half to give the Aztecs a 26-21 lead at the break, and a meandering 11-6 run to open the second half for a 37-27 lead. The latter run was punctuated by Flynn's midcourt steal and layup.

A 10-point lead qualified as a blowout, the way the Aztecs play defense. Fresno State (5-12, 1-5) shot 28.6% in the first half, and 36.4% overall.

"Points were hard to come by," Dutcher said. "You have to love the game to enjoy that game. We can suffer through bad offense because our defense is so good. We may struggle shooting but we're going to be in the game because our defense never falters."

"Defense travels," he said. Orlando Robinson led the Bulldogs with 18 points.

Nevada shot 14.7% in the second half and 28.1% for the game.

SDSU trailed 35-33 at halftime, but grabbed control in the opening minutes of the second half. Wetzell fed Schakel for a 3, Mitchell had a reverse layup and Flynn made a layup for a 40-35 lead, forcing Alford to take a timeout and firing up the crowd.

Nevada tied it at 40 when Johnson made a layup and then hit a 3.

But SDSU quickly jumped to an eight-point lead on Mitchell's bucket off a rebound, a free throw by KJ Feagin, a corner 3 by Mitchell and a jumper by Wetzell.

SDSU shut down the Wolf Pack after that.

It was just the second time this season SDSU trailed at halftime.

The Aztecs (20-0, 9-0 Mountain West), the nation's only unbeaten team, equaled the 20-0 start by the 2010-11 team led by Kawhi Leonard.

SDSU also matched the longest winning streak in school history, set with that opening run in 2010-11 and matched by the 2013-14 team, which also reached the Sweet 16.

Matt Mitchell scored 15 and Jordan Schakel 11 for SDSU.

Jake Hendricks scored 20 for Wyoming (5-16, 0-9), which lost its seventh straight game.

The Aztecs played tight defense from the start, sparking an offensive outburst that gave them a 20-9 lead. Flynn and Mitchell hit early 3-pointers and Flynn stole the ball for a coast-to-coast slam dunk.

LAS VEGAS -- While remaining the country's only unbeaten team was important to the San Diego State Aztecs, they had another milestone on their minds Sunday.

"It was important because we wanted to hit 21-0 and make (school) history," junior Trey Pulliam said.

Mission accomplished.

Malachi Flynn scored 21 points, Pulliam added a career-high 18 points and the fourth-ranked Aztecs (21-0, 10-0 Mountain West) staved off UNLV's second-half rally to win 71-67 and break the school records for best start and longest winning streak in the program's 99 seasons.

Jordan Schakel contributed 11 points for the Aztecs. San Diego State had won 20 straight games twice before -- during the 2010-11 and 2013-14 seasons. The latter team made the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and finished 31-5.

Bryce Hamilton scored 29 points to lead UNLV (11-11, 6-3). Reigning Mountain West Player of the Week Marvin Coleman chipped in with 11 points.

"We knew they played hard, they been playing great to start conference play," Flynn said of the Runnin' Rebels. "We knew it was gonna be a good test. They fought hard for sure. We know when we come out everybody is going to give us their best shot. It's gonna help us in the long run. We know they're gonna come in and try to beat a top-four team."

Which UNLV certainly did, using a 12-4 run to open the second half. The Runnin' Rebels took the lead -- their first since the game's first basket -- with 13:28 left when Cheikh Mbacke Diong's bucket made it 40-38. That seemed to awaken the Aztecs, who went on a 15-7 run to lead 55-47 with 4:54 left.

"It's college basketball, everyone has a run in them and (UNLV coach) TJ (Otzelberger) has done a great job with his team," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "We knew they were ready for this moment, cause we'd seen it many times with TJ's club, they get better and better. They played the right way, they were rewarded for it, but at the end of the day we made enough timely plays and important plays to get out of here with the win."

Particularly on defense, as the Aztecs did a good job at locking in defensively late and holding the Rebels scoreless for more than five minutes, despite the Rebels shooting 46.4% from the floor in the second half.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- It didn't take San Diego State long to put away New Mexico and remain undefeated.

KJ Feagin scored 18 points and the No. 4 Aztecs scored the first 17 points of the game to rout undermanned New Mexico 85-57 on Wednesday night.

San Diego State (22-0, 11-0 Mountain West) made seven of its first nine shots, including three 3-pointers, to blow the game open early. The Lobos missed their first seven shots and also turned it over twice in that span. The lead never dropped below 12 points thereafter and the Aztecs continued their perfect season.

Malachi Flynn added 12 points with six assists and was the key to the game. "We played the right way and we were rewarded for it," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "Malachi was a perfect example of it. He could have run out here and scored 20 or 30 points but he didn't care. He just moved the ball. He played effortless basketball. He set the tone."

Nothing New Mexico (16-7, 5-5) did early could slow down the Aztecs. "I thought that opening three minutes by San Diego State was the most impressive three minutes I've ever gone up against another team in my four years as a head coach," Lobos coach Paul Weir said. "They came out laser focused, not missing."

New Mexico, which lost at home for the first time this season, was missing four starters from the beginning of the season -- two to suspensions, one because he was dismissed and another for an injury.

The latest was leading scorer JaQuan Lyle, who already had just missed two games because of an injury. He was suspended Wednesday for two games after he was host to a party Saturday in which two people were shot, suffering non-life-threatening wounds.

Playing so shorthanded meant everything had to go right for New Mexico. But nothing did.

"We were going to need some shots to go down and we were going to need for them to miss some and quite frankly, they didn't," Weir said. "By them hitting them and us missing them the margin just kind of grew and grew. I think you just have to tip your hat to how great a team San Diego State was."

SAN DIEGO -- Moments after San Diego State retired Kawhi Leonard's jersey at halftime, and with the No. 4 Aztecs trailing Utah State by eight points, coach Brian Dutcher joked with the NBA superstar.

"Kawhi was near the bench at the start of the second half and I said, 'Go get a uniform on, Kawhi, we might need you,'" Dutcher said. "And he told me, 'Hey, just win the game.' And I said, 'Yes sir. OK, we're going to win the game.'"

"The Aztecs did just that. With Leonard watching from one baseline, another guy from Riverside, Matt Mitchell, scored 24 of his season-high 28 points in the second half -- including three straight 3-pointers -- to help rally SDSU to an 80-68 victory Saturday night and remain the nation's only undefeated team.

"What a great night for an Inland Empire kid to have a great game, Kawhi Leonard jersey hanging," Dutcher said after the Aztecs extended the nation's longest winning streak -- and the longest in school history -- to 23 games. "Matt stepped up and did it with Kawhi sitting there court-side watching him play."

With Mitchell turning red-hot, the Aztecs turned a 41-31 deficit into a 68-58 lead in a span of 13 minutes.

Mitchell spent one season at Riverside's King High -- Leonard's alma mater -- before transferring.

Mitchell scored 11 points in four minutes for SDSU (23-0, 12-0 Mountain West). His third straight 3-pointer, with 13:16 to go, gave SDSU a 50-49 lead.

Yanni Wetzell then had a steal and layup, and Mitchell made two free throws to extend the lead to five.

Utah State (17-7, 6-5) ended a two-minute scoring drought on Sam Merrill's 3-pointer. Utah State tied it at 54 on Merrill's jumper, but Mitchell hit two free throws to give SDSU the lead.

Wetzell later hit a 3, and Mitchell hit a jumper to just beat the shot clock, and then drained a 3 for a 66-58 lead.

The comeback sent the sellout crowd of 12,414 into a frenzy, just like in 2010-11, Leonard's second and final season at SDSU.

Malachi Flynn and Feagin scored 13 each and Wetzell had 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Merrill had 16 points and Brock Miller 15 for Utah State.

San Diego State answered with a driving layup by Nolan Narain and Mitchell's long 3-pointer just before the shot clock expired, rebuilding the Aztecs' lead to 72-64 with 4:42 left.

Mitchell had a steal and a thunderous slam dunk for a 62-44 lead with 7:20 to go.

Vante Hendrix had 20 points for New Mexico.

The Aztecs had a tough go in the first half with the short-handed but fired-up Lobos.

Wetzell had 14 points in the first half and Mitchell 11.

Mitchell, Schakel and KJ Feagin each had two fouls in the first half, while New Mexico's Corey Manigault had three, including a technical for taunting after a thunderous dunk that gave the Lobos an early 10-5 lead. Manigault drew a second technical late in the second half and was ejected.

SDSU beat the Lobos 85-57 at Albuquerque on Jan. 29.

After the Aztecs beat Boise State 72-55 Sunday, he revealed some of his slogans that keep the team on task.

"Early in the year, we had five games in eleven days, so we were like, 'Let's win five in eleven,'" Dutcher said. "And then we had five games the entire month of December, so we said, 'Let's win five in December.' And we did it. I told our team they don't hang a banner for twenty wins, so we hung a banner with four to go."

His mantra changed after San Diego State (26-0, 15-0 Mountain West) wrapped up the conference regular season title, though his message hasn't.

"I told our team, 'Let's get greedy. Let's play for perfection,'" Dutcher said. "If we're this close, we might as well play for a perfect regular season. Why not win three straight as a mini-goal to chase something other than seeding in the tournament? Let's do something special."

The Aztecs, which own the nation's longest active winning streak, looked special in handling a Bronco squad that hadn't lost a home conference game since Feb. 27, 2019.

Malachi Flynn scored 22 points and dished out six assists to lead San Diego State in scoring, joined by all four of the team's starters in double digits. Yanni Wetzell added 14 points and seven rebounds.

Boise State (17-10, 9-6) struggled to find any rhythm on offense and finished the game shooting 41.2% from the field.

"They wanted it," Boise State coach Leon Rice said of his team. "It's not like they didn't show up either. They wanted it too much in some ways and let it get away."

After wrapping up the Mountain West regular season title on Tuesday with a victory over New Mexico State, San Diego State didn't show any signs of let down.

The Aztecs went on an 8-2 run to close out the first half and take a 40-26 lead into the locker room.

Justinian Jessup led the Broncos with 22 points, while Derrick Alston added 12.

All five of San Diego State's starters finished with double figures in scoring.

San Diego State, which had been the nation's only undefeated team since Jan. 15, erased most of a 14-point deficit when it pulled to 64-63 on Malachi Flynn's 3-pointer with 14.5 seconds left. Mitrou-Long was fouled by Matt Mitchell with 11.5 seconds left and made both free throws.

Flynn missed a contested 3-pointer with 3.3 seconds left and the ball went to the Runnin' Rebels. After a long pass down the court, Mitchell ended up with the ball and his desperation shot at the buzzer fell short.

SDSU unveiled the regular-season conference banner before the game and then looked nothing like the team that raced to the best start in school history. The Aztecs trailed by 14 midway through the second half and were down 11 with 4:32 to go.

SDSU had been projected as the No. 1 seed in the East in the NCAA Tournament. Providing the Aztecs don't stumble again, the loss could keep the Aztecs in the West as the No. 2 seed. Gonzaga is the projected No. 1 seed in the West, where the regionals will be at Staples Center up the freeway in Los Angeles.

Amauri Hardy scored 17 points and Bryce Hamilton added 11 points and 10 rebounds for UNLV (15-14, 10-6).

Flynn scored 24, Mitchell 13 and Jordan Schakel 10 for SDSU.

SDSU pulled to 62-60 on Flynn's two free throws with 1:47 left and Arop Aguek's layup with 25.6 seconds left. Mitrou-Long then made two free throws with 19.9 seconds left for a four-point lead.

Hardy's jumper gave UNLV a 44-30 lead three minutes into the second half before SDSU pulled within seven, thanks to Flynn's layup and Jordan Schakel's 3-pointer. But Hardy then made a jumper from the free-throw line and a layup to put the Runnin' Rebels back up by double digits.

UNLV took advantage of numerous SDSU breakdowns to take a double-digit lead midway through the first half and pushed it to 37-25 at halftime on a steal and slam dunk by Mitrou-Long.

SDSU had the lead just once, at 14-13 after Flynn's 3-pointer, and then allowed UNLV to go on a 10-0 run. Mitrou-Long started it by converting a 4-point play when he hit a 3-pointer and was fouled by Flynn. Cheikh Mbacke Diong scored inside and then Hardy hit a floater and Mitrou-Long made a layup.

SAN DIEGO — Malachi Flynn scored 10 of San Diego State's last 17 points and the No. 5 Aztecs rallied from a seven-point deficit to beat Colorado State 66-60 Tuesday night and rebound from their only loss.

Flynn finished with 17 points for SDSU (27-1, 16-1 Mountain West) after scoring just two points in the first half.

The Aztecs trailed 56-49 with 8:22 left before going on a 13-0 run. Jordan Schakel hit a put-back and Flynn a 3-pointer before Schakel hit the go-ahead 3-pointer with 4:50 left, making it 57-56.

SDSU's 13-0 run over 5 minutes, 17 seconds gave it a 62-56 lead.

The Aztecs were out-of-sync for much of the game and once again took poor shots. But unlike Saturday night, when their furious rally fell short against UNLV, they were able to get the lead and keep it.

Matt Mitchell scored 15 and Schakel 11.

Nico Carvacho scored 17 for CSU (19-11, 10-7) and Isaiah Stevens had 12.

Carvacho made a layup and Kendle Moore two free throws to pull the Rams to 62-60. Mitchell missed a 3 and then Stevens missed a shot, with SDSU's Yann Wetzell tying up Carvacho, with SDSU getting the pass.

Mitchell and Flynn each made two free throws in the final nine seconds.

SDSU had been the nation's last unbeaten team before its school-record 26-game winning streak was snapped in a 66-63 home loss to UNLV on Saturday night.

The Rams came out fired up and surprised the Aztecs with a 12-0 run early in the first half to overcome a nine-point deficit and take a 14-11 lead.

SDSU seemed content to launch 3-pointers and not try to get inside, even when 6-foot-11 CSU center Nico Carvacho was out of the game. The Aztecs made only 6 of 17 from behind the arc in the first half.

The Aztecs pulled to 35-34 when Mitchell finally drove the lane and scored and was fouled, but he missed the free throw. Dischon Thomas made one of two free throws for the Rams to make it 36-34 at halftime.

BIG PICTURE

Colorado State: The Rams have rebounded nicely since losing their first three MWC games, including 79-57 against SDSU at Fort Collins on Dec. 4. They had won 10 of 13 coming into this game.
