OFF THE TOP (through games of Mar. 4)

- ▶ San Diego State advances to its 13th consecutive Mountain West Championship semifinal round game and the Aztecs will look for their 13th appearance in the Mountain West title game when SDSU faces Boise State on Friday evening.
- ▶ Following a third consecutive second-half comeback victory, San Diego State records its 13th straight conference tournament opening win with a 73-60 victory over Air Force.
- ▶ San Diego State assistant coach Chris Acker served as an assistant coach the previous two seasons at Boise State.
- ▶ The Aztecs lead the all-time series 14-7, and swept the regular-season series this season, winning 83-65 in San Diego on Jan. 11 and 72-55 in Boise on Feb. 16.
- ▶ San Diego State is the top-seed in the Mountain West tournament for the fifth time in school history (2006, 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2020). The Aztecs own an 11-3 record (includes quarterfinal round win yesterday) as the top seed with one title (2006). SDSU has advanced to the championship game each of the four previous times it entered the event as a one seed.
- ▶ San Diego State won its seventh regular-season MW title this season (2006, 2011*, 2012*, 2014, 2015*, 2016 and 2020). and its 12th overall Mountain West championship. * - indicates shared title
- ▶ San Diego State has won this event a record five times (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011 and 2018).
- ▶ San Diego State has won the event as the one seed, two seed, four seed and five seed (twice).
- ▶ Amazingly, San Diego State has played for the tournament title in five of the last six years and in nine of the last 11 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019).
- ▶ Overall, San Diego State is 33-15 in the Mountain West tournament for a winning percentage of 68.8 percent. That is the highest win percentage and the Aztecs' 33 tournament wins are the most by any team - current or former - in league history. This is particularly impressive because 10 of SDSU's 48 tournament games have been played on the road (8-2 at UNLV), while UNLV has played 37 of 44 games at home.
- ▶ San Diego State is ranked No. 5 in the AP Poll this week. The Aztecs are in the AP top 5 for a school-record seventh straight week and has been in the AP top 10 for nine consecutive weeks. This is the highest SDSU has ever been ranked entering the conference tournament.

That is the most victories by any school in any venue in which it has not played a home game in the past 12 seasons. What is particularly impressive is that 15 of those 33 victories came as the road team playing at UNLV.

SDSU CLIFF NOTES (through games of Mar. 5, unless otherwise noted)

- ▶ San Diego State's metrics continue to pace at an elite level. As of Thursday, The Aztecs are 4th in NET (spent a national-best 45 non-consecutive days at No. 1 this season), 3rd in strength of record, 4th in KenPom, 7th in BPI and 7th in Sagarin.
- ▶ The NCAA committee listed San Diego State as the fourth overall seed and placed the Aztecs as the No. 1-seed in the East Region on Feb. 8 when they released the top 16 teams in the nation at that moment in time.
- ▶ San Diego State is at No. 5 in the AP Poll this week. Now nationally ranked for a 13th-straight week, the Aztecs have spent a school-record seven consecutive weeks in the top 5 and the last nine weeks in the top 10.
- ▶ San Diego State is enjoying its 79th appearance in the AP Top-25 Poll this week (all have occurred since the start of the 2010-11 campaign). Since the start of the '10-11 season, SDSU's 79 weeks in the top 25 are the 21st most nationally.
- ▶ San Diego State finds itself ranked among the nation's elite in several statistical categories, including 2nd in scoring margin (+16.2), 2nd in three-point field goal percentage differential (+9.1), 3rd in scoring defense (59.2), 5th in field goal percentage differential (+8.8), 9th in field goal percentage defense (38.3), 11th in three-point field goal defense (28.9), 12th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.36), 13th in three-point field goal percentage (38.0) and 21st in turnovers per game (11.0).
- ▶ San Diego State has four players averaging 10.1 points or more and six players averaging 6.9 points or more. Six Aztec players have scored 18 or more points in a game this season.
- ▶ San Diego State led the Mountain West Conference in many team stats entering the tournament, including scoring margin (+16.17), scoring defense (59.17), field goal percentage defense (38.3), turnover margin (+3.21), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.36), and three-point field goal percentage defense (28.9).
- ▶ San Diego State is currently ranked 5th in KenPom and has top 11 efficiency ratings on both offense (11th) and defense (7th). The Aztecs join Kansas and Duke as the only teams in the nation that rank in the top 11 of both sides of the ball.

- San Diego State's 15-0 conference record was the best start for a Mountain West team in the history of the league.

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS ((through games of Mar. 5, unless otherwise noted)

- San Diego State owns the nation's longest road winning streak (12, dates back to last season) and road/neutral streak (15) in the nation.
- San Diego State is the only team not to drop a road/neutral site game this season (15-0).
- The Aztecs 14 road/neutral road wins are the most in the nation (2nd: Hofstra, Liberty and Vermont have 13).
- San Diego State's 11-0 road record is the best in the nation and its 11 true road wins are tied for the third most in the nation (Vermont 12-3, Stephen F. Austin 12-2).
- In road/neutral games this season, San Diego State leads the nation in winning percentage (1.000), scoring margin (+15.9), field goal percentage differential (+10.9), and is 3rd in three-point field goal percentage differential (10.3). On offense, the Aztecs are 2nd in field goal percentage (50.7), 2nd in free throw percentage (80.8), 4th in three-point field goal percentage (39.9). While on defense SDSU ranks 5th in scoring (61.3), 21st in three-point field goal percentage (29.6) and 13th in field goal percentage (39.8).
- San Diego State is 10-0 in NET Quadrant 1 and 2 games. Nine of those 10 games have come away from home.

LAST TIME OUT

Win Streaks Extended

- San Diego State wins its 15th straight road/neutral game. This is a school record and the longest active win streak.
- San Diego State wins the opening game of its 13th straight conference tournament, a school record. That is tied with Michigan for the fourth longest active streak nationally.
- San Diego State defeats Air Force for the third straight time and is 12-2 in its last 14 games against the Falcons.

Big Picture

- San Diego State improves to 29-1, the best 30-game record in school history, and is the only team in the nation with only one loss.
- San Diego State is 15-0 in road/neutral games this season. The Aztecs are the only team in the nation to win every road/neutral contest in 2019-20 and leads the nation with 15 road/neutral victories.
- The 29 victories are tied for the third most in school history. The 2015-16 squad, that advanced to the NIT national semifinals in New York City ended the campaign 28-10. The only two teams with more victories, the 2010-11 (34) and 2013-14 (31), both advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.
- San Diego State is now 28 games above .500. Only once have the Aztecs completed a season more games above the .500 mark (2010-11, +31).
- San Diego State wins its 33rd game at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign. That is the most victories in a venue in which a team has not played a home game in the nation.

Series Notes

- San Diego State leads the all-time series, 59-24.
- The Aztecs are 5-1, with four straight wins, against the Falcons on neutral courts.
- San Diego State has won three straight, six of seven and 12 of the last 14 games between the teams.

Tournament Notes

- San Diego State improves 33-15 in Mountain West tournament history (68.8 percent). Regardless of other outcomes today, the Aztecs own the highest winning percentage and have the most victories of any team – current or past – in league history.
- The Aztecs are now 16-5 in quarterfinal games and are 12-4 in semifinal round Mountain West Conference history.
- The Aztecs are 23-7 in the Mountain West tourney since 2010.

Career Charts

- Malachi Flynn reached double figures for the 20th straight game. He becomes the sixth player in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era to reach double figures in at least 20 straight games (Brandon Heath (58), Jamaal Franklin (32), Marcus Slaughter (28), Mike Mackell (26) and Trey Kell (20)).

- Matt Mitchell played in his 72nd career victory. That moves him past Brandon Heath, the school's all-time leading scorer, into 19th place since the school started tracking the stat prior to the 1975-76 season.
- Mitchell started his 82nd career game moving him past Myron Epps into 18th place on the school's all-time chart (started 1978-79).

Game Notes

- San Diego State trailed at the half for the seventh time this season and with today's victory improved to 6-1 in those games.
- Air Force shot 60.0 percent in the first half which is the best shooting percentage for an SDSU opponent in a half this season. (UNLV – 57.7 percent in the first half on Feb. 22).
- The Aztecs were +9 on the glass in the second half and ended the game with a 29-25 rebound advantage. The Aztecs are 50-9 under Dutcher when owning a rebound advantage.
- The Aztecs shot 50 percent from the field for the 13th time this season (13-0). SDSU is 30-1 with 18 straight wins when making at least half of its shots.
- San Diego State scored the first bucket of the game and is 20-1 this season when they score first.
- San Diego State had a 9-0 run over 2:05 in the first half to turn a 13-7 deficit into a 16-13 lead.
- San Diego State used a 27-6 run to turn a 41-33 deficit with 18:45 to play in the second half in to a 60-47 lead with 7:02 to play.
- The Aztecs closed out the game on a 7-0 run after Air Force had pulled within six points with 1:57 remaining.
- Air Force scored 41 points in the first 21:15 of the game and was then limited to six points over the next 13:13.

After missing the first 18 three-pointers in his Mountain West Championships career, Schakel then hit five of his next seven... The Aztecs are 27-3 in his career when he scores 10+ points.

Malachi Flynn – 16 points (13 in the second half), 8 rebounds, 7 assists, 3 steals

Became the first player in the Dutcher/Fisher era to produce a game with 16 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists and 3 steals... Scored in double figures for the 29th time this season and 67th time in his career... Flynn scored just three of his 16 points in the first half... Led the team in assists for the 20th game and in rebounds for the fourth time... Averaged 5.8 assists over the last nine games... Averaged 6.9 rebounds during the last eight games... Has multiple treys in eight consecutive games.

Yanni Wetzell – 16 points, 3 rebounds, 2 blocked shots, 8-11 FGs

Reached double figures for 19th time this year and 28th time in his career... Wetzell's 16 points were his highest since he tallied 20 points at Boise State (3-16-20)... The Aztecs are 19-0 this season when he reaches double figures.

Matt Mitchell – 10 points, 5 rebounds, 2-4 3FGs

Scored 10 or more points in 12 of his last 14 games and 14 of his last 17 contests... This was his 19th game with double-digits this season and 56th in his career.

SERIES HISTORY VS. BOISE STATE

- ▶ The game between San Diego State and Boise State will mark the 22nd in the series.
- ▶ The Aztecs hold a seven-game edge over the Broncos in the all-time series, 14-7 with the Aztecs taking both previous meeting this season; 83-65 on Jan. 11 in San Diego and 72-55 on Feb. 16 in Boise. San Diego State has defeated the Broncos each of the three times the teams have met on a neutral court. In 2012 (65-62), 2013 (73-67) and 2017 (87-68) the teams met in the quarterfinals of the Mountain West tournament. SDSU has controled the games played on its home court (7-2), losing games in 2015 & 2016. In games played in Boise, SDSU is 4-5, and snapped a three-game losing streak in February.
- ▶ The Aztecs largest margin of victory in the series was a 19-point win (87-68) in the quarterfinal round of the 2017 Mountain West Tournament.
- ▶ The Broncos ended the longest home court winning streak in San Diego State basketball history. The 29-game run began on Nov. 20, 2013 and was snapped with a 56-46 victory on Feb. 28, 2015.
- ▶ In the eight meetings in San Diego, the Aztecs have won six w/ an average margin of victory of 5.0 ppg, in the Broncos wins in that time frame their average margin of victory is 6.5 ppg and only twice has the winning margin exceeded 10 points. During the series, 14 of the games have been decided by 10 points or less. The Aztecs largest margin of victory in the series was a 19-point win (87-68) in the quarterfinal round of the 2017 Mountain West Tournament. Boise State's best performance was last season in an 88-64 decision in Boise.

SAN DIEGO -- The first 20 minutes of San Diego State's season was a thing of beauty. Jordan Schakel and newcomer Malachi Flynn scored 15 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 11 rebounds for San Diego State, which ran past Texas Southern 77-42 Tuesday night.

San Diego State led the entire game and was up 40-10 with just less than four minutes to play in the first half. It was 48-13 at halftime, after SDSU made nine 3-pointers and outrebounded Texas Southern 30-16.

SDSU didn't keep up the intensity in the second half. "Then the second half was just tough to get through," Dutcher said. "We had 10 assists at half then we only had two assists in the second half. I think the thing that would have made it easier is if we'd made some free throws. Games like this, you make your free throws the lead stays what it is, but we missed so many free throws."

Overall, though, Dutcher was pleased. "This is a good team, a good group of guys that appears to be able to defend at a pretty high level. Our defense has been pretty solid and at the end of the day that's how we're going to win, with our defense and our rebounding."

The Tigers of the SWAC didn't crack 20 points until Yahuza Rasas made a layup with 11 minutes to go to make it 57-21.

Texas Southern coach Johnny Jones was ejected after being called for his second technical of the game, with 7:14 to go.

The Aztecs won the opening tipoff and Schakel drained the first of his four 3-pointers in the first half to get the rout started. The junior guard made another shot from behind the arc two minutes later. Flynn's first points with the Aztecs came on a corner 3 for a 15-6 lead. Freshman Keshad Johnson's first points also came on a 3 to give the Aztecs their 40-10 lead.

"It felt pretty good," Schakel said of the hot start. "I was glad that it happened in the first couple minutes to get us off to a good start. I think we played well in the first half. It's always devastating when you're able to make 3s at a high clip like that. We have a lot of good shooters on this team and when we move the ball like that it's bound to happen."

Johnson added 10 rebounds for SDSU, which outrebounded the Tigers 62-41. Tyrik Armstrong led the Tigers with 10 points.

SAN DIEGO -- First a win at BYU and then finally, a win against pesky Grand Canyon. It's been a big five-day stretch for San Diego State, which dominated inside and outside against Grand Canyon to win 86-61 Tuesday night. Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah each scored 14 points.

KJ Feagin added 13 points for SDSU (3-0), which was coming off a big 76-71 win at former conference rival BYU on Saturday.

Grand Canyon (0-3) had won its previous two games against the Aztecs in San Diego, plus the most recent game in the series, a 76-72 victory in Phoenix on Dec. 7, 2016.

"Coach Dutch (Brian Dutcher) was really on edge coming into this game," Feagin said. "I knew he wanted this win. Coach Dave (Velasquez) talked about how we'd never beat them before and being a part of the team that got the win at BYU, now let's turn around and get Grand Canyon, so I'm happy that we accomplished both missions."

Dutcher said the win was "very satisfying. We knew that we'd lost, since we've been here, Coach (Steve) Fisher and I, twice to Grand Canyon, both important, critical games. At the time it doesn't seem that way but when the season finishes up you have that loss on your record and we knew it hurt us. We wanted to come out and play at a high level because we knew they were a very good opponent."

Dutcher succeeded Fisher as head coach after the 2016-17 season. Leading 15-14, SDSU got hot from inside and outside and raced to a 30-18 lead. Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer and a fall-away jumper during the big run.

The Aztecs twice hit consecutive 3-pointers in the first half. Feagin and Mitchell did it early on and then Adam Seiko and Keshad Johnson did it to give SDSU a 36-22 lead with six minutes before halftime.

GCU went scoreless for the final five minutes of the first half as SDSU jumped to a 40-24 lead.

"Offensively when you have 35 baskets and 25 assists, you're playing the game the right way," Dutcher said. "Overall, offensively we shared the ball as well as we have all year. We ended up outrebounding them for the game, which pleased me." Flynn had nine assists and Feagin had seven.

Wetzell's previous career-highs were 16 points against UNC Asheville on Dec. 31 and 11 rebounds against Arkansas on March 6.

The 6-foot-10 New Zealander made 9 of 11 shots as he scored from inside and outside. He showed a nice touch with everything from a hook shot, a jump hook and a 3-pointer. He made two of the Aztecs' final three shots of the first half and had 13 points in the first 20 minutes to help the Aztecs to a 34-26 lead. He then opened the second half with a hook shot and a 3-pointer to extend the lead to 13 points.

"I thought Yann would have an advantage in this game. That's the beauty of having a week off," coach Brian Dutcher said. "I thought we had an advantage inside against their power forward and Yann proved that to be true. He played with great poise and patience and strength and had a really nice game for us, both scoring and rebounding."

He had a rough game at BYU on Nov. 9, missing several inside shots. "It was just a matter of finding my rhythm. I know that I make those shots in practice every day and I'm just happy it came today. It was just a matter of keeping my confidence high."

Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah had 10 apiece for SDSU. Noel Coleman scored 10 for USD.

The Tigers rattled off consecutive baskets by Michael Littlejohn, Shakem Johnson and Mark Freeman to pull within four.

San Diego State then got hot again, with Flynn and Adam Seiko hitting 3-point shots and Wetzell making a fast-break layup to push the lead to 48-37.

Mitchell and Adam Seiko had nine points apiece. Seiko hit three 3-pointers and Littlejohn scored 21 for Tennessee State (3-3).

The Tigers outscored SDSU 13-4 in the final nine minutes of the first half. SDSU led 21-10 after Nathan Mensah's layup and then went the rest of the half without making a field goal.

The Tigers pulled back into it and took a 22-21 lead on Mark Freeman's 3-pointer with 3:45 left. Ben Kone hit the first of two free throws before the Aztecs closed the half with two free throws by Wetzell and KJ Feagin to take a 25-23 lead.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State was a second away from its first loss when Malachi Flynn let fly with a long 3-pointer. It found nothing but net, sending Viejas Arena into a frenzy and continuing the Aztecs' remarkable start.

Flynn hit a 3-pointer with nine-tenths of a second left to give the cold-shooting Aztecs a thrilling 59-57 victory over San Jose on Sunday for the Aztecs' first 10-0 start in nine seasons.

SDSU (2-0 Mountain West Conference) is off to its best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11. That team finished 34-3 after reaching the Sweet 16 for the first time.

The next stop for the Aztecs could be The Associated Press Top 25 for the first time in four years.

The Aztecs were in trouble after a flurry of 3-pointers by the Spartans in the final five minutes, including one by Brae Ivey for a 55-54 lead. Seneca Knight added a nice bank shot for a three-point lead for SJSU (3-7, 0-2).

But Matt Mitchell hit two free throws with 41.3 seconds to go. Knight missed two free throws and Mitchell rebounded KJ Feagin's missed 3-pointer with about 10 seconds left. After an SDSU timeout, the Aztecs retained possession following a held ball. Jordan Schakel passed to Flynn for his big shot.

Mitchell finished with 13 points, Nathan Mensah 12 points and 12 rebounds, and Schakel 11 points.

Knight had 15 for the Spartans while Ivey had 13 and Ralph Agee 12.

The Aztecs shot just 32% and let the Spartans pull within four points three times midway through the second half.

The Spartans got consecutive 3-pointers by Knight and Christian Anigwe to pull to 52-49 and silence the crowd with 4:18 to go.

BIG PICTURE

San Jose State: The Spartans have lost five straight. They trailed No. 25 Utah State by three at halftime on Wednesday night before losing 71-59.

San Diego State: The Aztecs should move into the AP Top 25 on Monday. They were 28th last week, 23 points shy of being ranked. They haven't been ranked since they were No. 24 on Feb. 28, 2015. They lost their next game to Boise State.

SAN DIEGO -- No. 20 San Diego State got the laughter it needed to ease back into action after a 10-day layoff for finals.

Yanni Wetzell scored 17 points and the Aztecs beat NAIA San Diego Christian 92-48 on Wednesday night to remain undefeated. It was the 13th-largest margin of victory in school history.

SDSU (11-0) hadn't played since beating San Jose State by two points by home on Dec. 8. The Aztecs were playing for the first time since jumping into The Associated Press Top 25. They moved up five spots Monday despite not playing last week.

The Aztecs are off to their best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11, when they reached the Sweet 16 for the first time and finished 34-3. They are one of four remaining undefeated teams.

KJ Feagin added 12 points and Malachi Flynn and Jordan Schakel had 10 apiece for SDSU.

The Aztecs used it to get their legs back after the long layoff and to prepare for Saturday's game against Utah at Staples Center in Los Angeles. That's the last of four big non-conference games the Aztecs are hoping will bolster their resume for an at-large NCAA Tournament bid in case they don't win the Mountain West Conference tournament and the automatic bid that comes with it.

SDSU has already won at BYU, and beat Creighton and Iowa to win the Las Vegas Invitational.

SDSU had 24 assists, led by Feagin with eight. The Aztecs had a lot of slam dunks and worked on their press against the outmanned Hawks.

Bryce Parsons gave the Hawks a 2-0 lead before the Aztecs went on a 14-0 run. The Hawks pulled within single digits before SDSU used an 8-0 run to take control for good. Wetzell had another slam and a free throw, and Matt Mitchell converted a three-point play for a 27-16 lead. SDSU led 45-27 at halftime.

San Diego Christian's Marc Combs scored all 14 of his points in the first half.

LOS ANGELES -- Malachi Flynn and San Diego State head into Christmas off one of their most impressive wins of the season.

Flynn scored 16 points to lead the 20th-ranked Aztecs to a 80-52 victory over Utah on Satin the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic at Staples Center.

Yanni Wetzell and Nathan Mensah added 14 points apiece for the Aztecs (12-0), who remain one of the nation's four unbeaten teams. They are also off to the second-best start in program history.

San Diego State dominated inside with a 42-20 advantage in points in the paint. They led 29-19 at halftime with 18 of their points coming inside.

The Utes -- who upset No. 6 Kentucky on Wednesday -- came in shooting 50.2% from the field but were 15 of 48 on Saturday. That is their second worst-shooting game in Larry Krystkowiak's nine seasons as coach.

Timmy Allen led Utah (9-3) with 21 points. The Utes didn't make a field goal in the final 3:33.

It is the second time this season the Aztecs have held a team under 32% from the field. Their shooting was much better as they went 31 of 63.

The Aztecs scored the first seven points and roared to a 15-2 lead. The Utes did not get on the scoreboard until the 16:16 mark and trailed by double digits when Wetzell hit a 3-pointer to make it 12-2 with 15:19 remaining.

San Diego State's largest lead in the first half was 14. It was up 29-19 at halftime and extended it to 34 during the final minute.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State didn't look anything like the nation's 15th-ranked team for a long stretch of the first half against scrappy Cal Poly.

The Aztecs missed inside shots, had free throws clang off the rim and big man Yann Weitzell and guard KJ Feagin air-balled 3-point shots.

And then the stunner: The Mustangs raced back from a 10-point deficit to take a 23-22 lead to hush the crowd at Viejas Arena.

That's when SDSU finally woke up. Weitzell started a 9-0 run that closed the first half and the Aztecs won 73-57 to continue their best start in nine seasons.

Malachi Flynn scored 14 points and Weitzell and Jordan Schakel added 12 points apiece for the Aztecs (13-0), who are one of three undefeated teams nationally.

SDSU remains on its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing 34-3. SDSU, Auburn and Liberty are the nation's only undefeated teams.

After leading just 31-23 at halftime, SDSU opened it up early in the first half. Flynn hit two long 3-pointers, including one that banked in, and Feagin also hit a shot from behind the arc. Weitzell, a New Zealander, made three close-in shots to help the Aztecs take a 50-31 lead.

Kyle Colvin scored 13 points and Junior Ballard had 12 for the Mustangs. Alimamy Koroma had 12 rebounds.

The Aztecs frittered away an early 18-8 lead and let the Mustangs go ahead 23-22 on Koroma's two free throws with 2:41 before halftime. The Mustangs also got 3-pointers by Colvin and Ballard in surprising the Aztecs.

SDSU turned it on in the final 1:40 to take a 31-23 halftime lead. After Matt Mitchell missed a 3-pointer, Koroma rebounded but Weitzell stole the ball and scored. Flynn and Schakel had layups before Mitchell followed Flynn's missed 3 with a slam dunk, was fouled and made the free throw.

SDSU forced a season-high 23 turnovers.

SAN DIEGO -- Undefeated and 13th-ranked San Diego State passed the first test of its toughest stretch of the season when it outlasted old friend Justin Hutson and undermanned Fresno State.

Malachi Flynn scored 16 points and Matt Mitchell had 15 for SDSU, which beat the Bulldogs 61-52 Wednesday to remain one of two undefeated teams nationally.

Mitchell had three big baskets in the second half in his first start of the season and Flynn, a transfer guard, scored his 1,000th career point as SDSU (14-0, 3-0 Mountain West) remains on its hottest start in nine seasons. The Aztecs haven't been this good since 2010-11, when they opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing 34-3.

SDSU and Auburn remain the nation's only undefeated teams. The Aztecs snapped a five-game losing streak to the Bulldogs, who had won their last three games at Viejas Arena.

Jarred Hyder scored 23 for Fresno State (4-10, 0-3), which was without leading scorer Nate Grimes, out with a wrist injury.

Mitchell, starting in place of sophomore forward Nathan Menshah (respiratory ailment) hit a long jumper just inside of nine minutes to go and then drained a 3-pointer for a 46-36 lead.

Earlier in the half, Mitchell had a nice spin-move layup followed by a free throw, and then Flynn made a pretty left-handed layup gave SDSU a 33-23 lead.

Joel Mensah had consecutive baskets to help give SDSU a cushion after the Bulldogs had pulled within five points with 13 minutes to play.

Flynn and KJ Feagin scored four points apiece during a 10-0 run at the end of the first half that gave the Aztecs a 25-17 lead after they struggled earlier against the Bulldogs.

Flynn started the run with a 3-pointer with 5:14 to go and added a free throw after a technical foul against Mustafa Lawrence. Flynn fed Feagin for a baseline reverse layup, Feagin hit a jumper and Trey Pulliam made a runner.

Fresno State had taken an early lead after 3-pointers by Hyder and New Williams.

LOGAN, Utah -- Stout defense is a cornerstone of success for San Diego State this season. It certainly helped the No. 13 Aztecs extend their unbeaten start in a tough road environment.

Malachi Flynn scored 22 points, Matt Mitchell added 19 and San Diego State beat Utah State 77-68 on Saturday night to improve to 15-0. The Aztecs own the nation's longest winning streak. Auburn is the only other undefeated Division I team.

San Diego State (15-0, 4-0 Mountain West) snapped the Aggies' 15-game home winning streak and beat them for the 12th time in the last 14 meetings. The Aztecs shot 51% from the field and scored 13 points off 11 turnovers.

Sam Merrill had 26 points and Neemias Queta added 15 points and 14 rebounds for the Aggies. Utah State (13-4, 2-2) lost back-to-back games for the first time since coach Craig Smith took over the program before the start of the 2018-19 season.

Consecutive 3-pointers from Flynn and Mitchell sparked a 10-1 run that helped the Aztecs take a 21-12 lead with 7:18 left in the first half. Flynn's outside basket barely beat the shot-clock buzzer before a media timeout. Utah State enabled the run by going more than five minutes without scoring.

San Diego State made six straight baskets to stay in front after the Aggies started to hit shots. Trey Pulliam capped the stretch with a jumper to give the Aztecs their largest first-half lead at 34-23.

Many of their first-half baskets came after executing high ball screens to perfection. San Diego State forced Utah State to defend late into the shot clock on possession after possession.

The Aztecs eventually built a 16-point lead early in the second half, going up 53-37 when Jordan Schakel buried a 3-pointer to cap a string of three straight San Diego State baskets.

Diogo Brito and Merrill nailed successive 3s to spark a 12-3 run. Queta finished it off with a dunk that cut the Aztecs' lead to 56-49.

Mitchell scored back-to-back baskets to keep the Aggies from getting closer. They helped San Diego State open a 63-50 lead with 5:41 left.

San Diego State outrebounded Utah State 34-30 and had four players with at least five rebounds. Mitchell led the way with a team-high seven. The Aztecs have finished with more rebounds than 11 of their 15 opponents this season.

LARAMIE, Wyo. -- The seventh-ranked and undefeated San Diego State Aztecs were ready for whatever awaited them in Laramie.

They planned ahead to deal with the 7,220-foot elevation, which can sap a player's strength. They had no intention of being upset by the Wyoming Cowboys, who have beaten ranked Aztecs teams before, but not this night.

Malachi Flynn scored 19 points, Yanni Wetzell added 17 and the the Aztecs beat Wyoming 72-52 on Wednesday night to remain one of the nation's two undefeated teams.

San Diego State (16-0, 5-0 Mountain West) continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time, finishing a school-record 34-3.

Jordan Schakel added 11 points for the Aztecs, whose 16-game winning streak is the longest in the country. San Diego State and Auburn are the nation's only undefeated teams. Auburn beat Vanderbilt on Wednesday night to improve to 14-0.

To combat the elevation, coach Brian Dutcher had the Aztecs return home Sunday after winning at Utah State on Saturday night. They then took a charter flight to Wyoming on Tuesday night.

The plan worked. San Diego State was a little sloppy early and let Wyoming get within three points on Hunter Maldonado's 3-pointer with just less than eight minutes left in the first half.

San Diego State then closed the half on a 14-6 run to take a 32-21 lead. Wetzell grabbed Flynn's missed 3 for a dunk and then fed Adam Seiko for a layup. Schakel hit two 3-pointers while Seiko and Flynn each added a bucket.

San Diego State lost the last two times it played in Laramie while in the Top 25, 68-62 as the fifth-ranked team on Feb. 11, 2014, and 58-45 as No. 15 on Jan. 19, 2013.

Flynn, Schakel and KJ Feagin each hit a 3-pointer in the first four minutes of the second half to push the lead to 47-30.

Hunter Maldonado scored 18 points for Wyoming (5-11, 0-5), the conference's last-place team. Hunter Thompson added 15 for the Cowboys, who lost their third straight.

The short-handed Aztecs continued to be without Nathan Mensah (respiratory ailment) and Aguek Arop (shoulder), and Joel Mensah was sidelined with back spasms.

Feagin made three 3-pointers in the first seven minutes and Malachi Flynn added two, helping the Aztecs race to a 14-point lead. They never let up, beating the Broncos 83-65 on Saturday night to remain undefeated and continue chasing school history.

Feagin scored 16 of his season-high 23 points in the first half, Yanni Wetzell added 20 and Flynn had 19 for the Aztecs (17-0, 6-0 Mountain West). San Diego State and Auburn remain the nation's only undefeated teams.

"From the first jumper I knew that it was going to be one of those breakout games," said Feagin, a graduate transfer from Santa Clara. "I'm just happy to get out of that slump I was in, so now it's about stringing some good games along and not letting it be just one out of the few games that I play well."

Feagin made four 3-pointers to help SDSU to a 48-25 halftime lead.

"KJ Feagin showed up offensively," coach Brian Dutcher said. "He's been good all year so everybody's been waiting for the breakout game and this is definitely the breakout game."

SDSU continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time before finishing a school-record 34-3.

RJ Williams scored 16 for Boise State (11-7, 3-3).

The Aztecs gave the sellout crowd plenty to cheer about. After they took a 23-9 lead, BSU pulled within eight points on Williams' slam dunk, but the Aztecs answered with an 18-2 run to blow it open.

Feagin made consecutive shots for a 33-19 lead, Jordan Schakel drained a 3 and Wetzell had a layup. Flynn and Wetzell made impressive shots on consecutive possessions for a 45-21 lead. Flynn dribbled between his legs, stepped back and hit a long 3. Wetzell made a post-up hook.

Feagin matched his season high of 13 with more than 6 1/2 minutes left in the first half. His previous season high was against Grand Canyon on Nov. 13.

BSU tied its season-high with 18 turnovers.

"They just blitzkrieged us," Boise State coach Leon Rice said. "We tried to help on the post a little bit and whack, whack, whack, three 3s.

FRESNO, Calif. -- San Diego State won't make any scoring highlight reels with games like their one against Fresno State, yet the Aztecs might make it deep into the NCAA Tournament.

In a contest in which they had no 3-point game, the No. 7 the Aztecs relied on a suffocating defense to shut down Fresno State 64-55 on Tuesday night.

San Diego State (18-0, 7-0 Mountain West Conference) remains one of two unbeaten teams in Division 1, along with Auburn. The Aztecs extended two nation-leading streaks: 18 consecutive victories, and nine straight road or neutral-site wins.

"I was leaving the hotel (earlier) and saw Clemson beat Duke on the road," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "I told these guys, 'Everyone knows you're ranked and they bring their best effort. Enjoy every one of them. What you're doing is not easy. Winning on the road is the hardest thing in basketball. Your perfect record on the road is unheard of.'"

San Diego State hasn't been 18-0 since the 2010-11 team advanced to the Sweet 16. The Aztecs experienced just their fifth victory by single digits, due in part to an offense that missed 15 of 18 3-point attempts and had no offensive rebounds in the first 30 minutes.

"Both teams did a good job on defense, said guard Malachi Flynn, who led all scorers with 20 points. "They did a really good job of making us make shots."

It took a 7-0 run in the final 5:32 of the first half to give the Aztecs a 26-21 lead at the break, and a meandering 11-6 run to open the second half for a 37-27 lead. The latter run was punctuated by Flynn's midcourt steal and layup.

A 10-point lead qualified as a blowout, the way the Aztecs play defense. Fresno State (5-12, 1-5) shot 28.6% in the first half, and 36.4% overall.

"Points were hard to come by," Dutcher said. "You have to love the game to enjoy that game. We can suffer through bad offense because our defense is so good. We may struggle shooting but we're going to be in the game because our defense never falters."

"Defense travels," he said.

Orlando Robinson led the Bulldogs with 18 points.

Malachi Flynn scored 14 points for San Diego State (19-0, 8-0 Mountain West), and Jordan Schakel had 12. Matt Mitchell added 11 points.

Trailing 35-33 at halftime, SDSU changed up its ball-screen defense and staggered Nevada to send a charge through Viejas Arena.

Jalen Harris, the Mountain West's second-leading scorer, had 16 of his 19 points in the first half for Nevada (11-8, 4-3), which withered offensively in the second half. Jazz Johnson scored 13.

Nevada shot 14.7% in the second half and 28.1% for the game.

SDSU trailed 35-33 at halftime, but grabbed control in the opening minutes of the second half. Wetzell fed Schakel for a 3, Mitchell had a reverse layup and Flynn made a layup for a 40-35 lead, forcing Alford to take a timeout and firing up the crowd.

Nevada tied it at 40 when Johnson made a layup and then hit a 3.

But SDSU quickly jumped to an eight-point lead on Mitchell's bucket off a rebound, a free throw by KJ Feagin, a corner 3 by Mitchell and a jumper by Wetzell.

SDSU shut down the Wolf Pack after that.

It was just the second time this season SDSU trailed at halftime.

The Aztecs (20-0, 9-0 Mountain West), the nation's only unbeaten team, equaled the 20-0 start by the 2010-11 team led by Kawhi Leonard.

SDSU also matched the longest winning streak in school history, set with that opening run in 2010-11 and matched by the 2013-14 team, which also reached the Sweet 16.

Matt Mitchell scored 15 and Jordan Schakel 11 for SDSU.

Jake Hendricks scored 20 for Wyoming (5-16, 0-9), which lost its seventh straight game.

LAS VEGAS -- While remaining the country's only unbeaten team was important to the San Diego State Aztecs, they had another milestone on their minds Sunday.

"It was important because we wanted to hit 21-0 and make (school) history," junior Trey Pulliam said.

Mission accomplished.

Malachi Flynn scored 21 points, Pulliam added a career-high 18 points and the fourth-ranked Aztecs (21-0, 10-0 Mountain West) staved off UNLV's second-half rally to win 71-67 and break the school records for best start and longest winning streak in the program's 99 seasons.

Jordan Schakel contributed 11 points for the Aztecs. San Diego State had won 20 straight games twice before -- during the 2010-11 and 2013-14 seasons. The latter team made the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and finished 31-5.

Bryce Hamilton scored 29 points to lead UNLV (11-11, 6-3). Reigning Mountain West Player of the Week Marvin Coleman chipped in with 11 points.

"We knew they played hard, they been playing great to start conference play," Flynn said of the Runnin' Rebels. "We knew it was gonna be a good test. They fought hard for sure. We know when we come out everybody is going to give us their best shot. It's gonna help us in the long run. We know they're gonna come in and try to beat a top-four team."

Which UNLV certainly did, using a 12-4 run to open the second half. The Runnin' Rebels took the lead -- their first since the game's first basket -- with 13:28 left when Cheikh Mbacke Diong's bucket made it 40-38. That seemed to awaken the Aztecs, who went on a 15-7 run to lead 55-47 with 4:54 left.

"It's college basketball, everyone has a run in them and (UNLV coach) TJ (Otzelberger) has done a great job with his team," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "We knew they were ready for this moment, cause we'd seen it many times with TJ's club, they get better and better. They played the right way, they were rewarded for it, but at the end of the day we made enough timely plays and important plays to get out of here with the win."

Particularly on defense, as the Aztecs did a good job at locking in defensively late and holding the Rebels scoreless for more than five minutes, despite the Rebels shooting 46.4% from the floor in the second half.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- It didn't take San Diego State long to put away New Mexico and remain undefeated.

KJ Feagin scored 18 points and the No. 4 Aztecs scored the first 17 points of the game to rout undermanned New Mexico 85-57 on Wednesday night.

San Diego State (22-0, 11-0 Mountain West) made seven of its first nine shots, including three 3-pointers, to blow the game open early. The Lobos missed their first seven shots and also turned it over twice in that span. The lead never dropped below 12 points thereafter and the Aztecs continued their perfect season.

Malachi Flynn added 12 points with six assists and was the key to the game. "We played the right way and we were rewarded for it," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "Malachi was a perfect example of it. He could have run out here and scored 20 or 30 points but he didn't care. He just moved the ball. He played effortless basketball. He set the tone."

Nothing New Mexico (16-7, 5-5) did early could slow down the Aztecs. "I thought that opening three minutes by San Diego State was the most impressive three minutes I've ever gone up against another team in my four years as a head coach," Lobos coach Paul Weir said. "They came out laser focused, not missing."

New Mexico, which lost at home for the first time this season, was missing four starters from the beginning of the season -- two to suspensions, one because he was dismissed and another for an injury.

The latest was leading scorer JaQuan Lyle, who already had just missed two games because of an injury. He was suspended Wednesday for two games after he was host to a party Saturday in which two people were shot, suffering non-life-threatening wounds.

Playing so shorthanded meant everything had to go right for New Mexico. But nothing did.

"We were going to need some shots to go down and we were going to need for them to miss some and quite frankly, they didn't," Weir said. "By them hitting them and us missing them the margin just kind of grew and grew. I think you just have to tip your hat to how great a team San Diego State was."

RAINING 3s San Diego State went 10 of 20 behind the arc in the first half and finished with 15 3-pointers.

SAN DIEGO -- Moments after San Diego State retired Kawhi Leonard's jersey at halftime, and with the No. 4 Aztecs trailing Utah State by eight points, coach Brian Dutcher joked with the NBA superstar.

"Kawhi was near the bench at the start of the second half and I said, 'Go get a uniform on, Kawhi, we might need you,' " Dutcher said. "And he told me, 'Hey, just win the game.' And I said, 'Yes sir. OK, we're going to win the game.'"

"The Aztecs did just that. With Leonard watching from one baseline, another guy from Riverside, Matt Mitchell, scored 24 of his season-high 28 points in the second half -- including three straight 3-pointers -- to help rally SDSU to an 80-68 victory Saturday night and remain the nation's only undefeated team.

"What a great night for an Inland Empire kid to have a great game, Kawhi Leonard jersey hanging," Dutcher said after the Aztecs extended the nation's longest winning streak -- and the longest in school history -- to 23 games. "Matt stepped up and did it with Kawhi sitting there court-side watching him play."

With Mitchell turning red-hot, the Aztecs turned a 41-31 deficit into a 68-58 lead in a span of 13 minutes.

Mitchell spent one season at Riverside's King High -- Leonard's alma mater -- before transferring.

Mitchell scored 11 points in four minutes for SDSU (23-0, 12-0 Mountain West). His third straight 3-pointer, with 13:16 to go, gave SDSU a 50-49 lead.

Yanni Wetzell then had a steal and layup, and Mitchell made two free throws to extend the lead to five.

Utah State (17-7, 6-5) ended a two-minute scoring drought on Sam Merrill's 3-pointer. Utah State tied it at 54 on Merrill's jumper, but Mitchell hit two free throws to give SDSU the lead.

Wetzell later hit a 3, and Mitchell hit a jumper to just beat the shot clock, and then drained a 3 for a 66-58 lead.

The comeback sent the sellout crowd of 12,414 into a frenzy, just like in 2010-11, Leonard's second and final season at SDSU.

Malachi Flynn and Feagin scored 13 each and Wetzell had 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Merrill had 16 points and Brock Miller 15 for Utah State.

Feagin scored 21 points, hitting five 3-pointers, and the fourth-ranked Aztecs remained the nation's lone unbeaten team by beating Air Force 89-74 Saturday night.

Jordan Schakel had 18 points for San Diego State (24-0, 13-0), which is off to the nation's best season-opening run since the 2016-17 Gonzaga team began the year 29-0. Malachi Flynn scored 17 points, and Matt Mitchell had 16.

The Aztecs' 13-0 conference opening is also the best start to a season in Mountain West history.

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said the Aztecs extended their winning streak "by hitting big shot after big shot" down the stretch. Despite allowing the most points by an opponent in their last 28 games, the Aztecs closed it out against Air Force by finishing on a 22-10 run.

Lavelle Scottie had 16 points and Caleb Morris had 12 for the Falcons, who lost their sixth straight.

Air Force tried to run down San Diego State down the stretch. Joyce connected from 3-point range and Scottie hit a jumper to help the Falcons close to 65-58 with 11:09 to play. A layup by Scottie capped a 6-0 burst that made it 67-64 with 6:45 remaining.

San Diego State answered with a driving layup by Nolan Narain and Mitchell's long 3-pointer just before the shot clock expired, rebuilding the Aztecs' lead to 72-64 with 4:42 left.

That was part of a 9-2 run that expanded SDSU's 35-33 halftime lead to 44-35. Mitchell also made a layup on a nice spin move, Flynn hit a jumper and Schakel a 3-pointer.

Flynn, who made just 1 of 8 shots in the first half, made a left-handed layup and Schakel hit another 3 for a 51-40 lead with 13 minutes left. Mitchell had a steal and a thunderous slam dunk for a 62-44 lead with 7:20 to go.

Vante Hendrix had 20 points for New Mexico. The Aztecs had a tough go in the first half with the short-handed but fired-up Lobos.

Wetzell had 14 points in the first half and Mitchell 11. Mitchell, Schakel and KJ Feagin each had two fouls in the first half, while New Mexico's Corey Manigault had three, including a technical for taunting after a thunderous dunk that gave the Lobos an early 10-5 lead. Manigault drew a second technical late in the second half and was ejected.

SDSU beat the Lobos 85-57 at Albuquerque on Jan. 29.

BOISE, Idaho -- No. 4 San Diego State keeps winning, forcing coach Brian Dutcher to dig deep for creative ways to keep his team focused.

After the Aztecs beat Boise State 72-55 Sunday, he revealed some of his slogans that keep the team on task.

"Early in the year, we had five games in eleven days, so we were like, 'Let's win five in eleven,'" Dutcher said. "And then we had five games the entire month of December, so we said, 'Let's win five in December.' And we did it. I told our team they don't hang a banner for twenty wins, so we hung a banner with four to go."

His mantra changed after San Diego State (26-0, 15-0 Mountain West) wrapped up the conference regular season title, though his message hasn't.

"I told our team, 'Let's get greedy. Let's play for perfection,'" Dutcher said. "If we're this close, we might as well play for a perfect regular season. Why not win three straight as a mini-goal to chase something other than seeding in the tournament? Let's do something special."

The Aztecs, which own the nation's longest active winning streak, looked special in handling a Bronco squad that hadn't lost a home conference game since Feb. 27, 2019.

Malachi Flynn scored 22 points and dished out six assists to lead San Diego State in scoring, joined by all four of the team's starters in double digits. Yanni Wetzell added 14 points and seven rebounds.

Boise State (17-10, 9-6) struggled to find any rhythm on offense and finished the game shooting 41.2% from the field.

"They wanted it," Boise State coach Leon Rice said of his team. "It's not like they didn't show up either. They wanted it too much in some ways and let it get away."

After wrapping up the Mountain West regular season title on Tuesday with a victory over New Mexico State, San Diego State didn't show any signs of let down.

The Aztecs went on an 8-2 run to close out the first half and take a 40-26 lead into the locker room.

Justinian Jessup led the Broncos with 22 points, while Derrick Alston added 12.

All five of San Diego State's starters finished with double figures in scoring.

SAN DIEGO -- Elijah Mitrou-Long scored 19 points, including two free throws with 11.5 seconds left, as UNLV handed No. 4 San Diego State its first loss of the season, 66-63 on Saturday night to end the Aztecs' 26-game winning streak.

San Diego State, which had been the nation's only undefeated team since Jan. 15, erased most of a 14-point deficit when it pulled to 64-63 on Malachi Flynn's 3-pointer with 14.5 seconds left. Mitrou-Long was fouled by Matt Mitchell with 11.5 seconds left and made both free throws.

Flynn missed a contested 3-pointer with 3.3 seconds left and the ball went to the Runnin' Rebels. After a long pass down the court, Mitchell ended up with the ball and his desperation shot at the buzzer fell short.

SDSU unveiled the regular-season conference banner before the game and then looked nothing like the team that raced to the best start in school history. The Aztecs trailed by 14 midway through the second half and were down 11 with 4:32 to go.

SDSU had been projected as the No. 1 seed in the East in the NCAA Tournament. Providing the Aztecs don't stumble again, the loss could keep the Aztecs in the West as the No. 2 seed. Gonzaga is the projected No. 1 seed in the West, where the regionals will be at Staples Center up the freeway in Los Angeles.

Amauri Hardy scored 17 points and Bryce Hamilton added 11 points and 10 rebounds for UNLV (15-14, 10-6).

Flynn scored 24, Mitchell 13 and Jordan Schakel 10 for SDSU. SDSU pulled to 62-60 on Flynn's two free throws with 1:47 left and Arap Aguek's layup with 25.6 seconds left. Mitrou-Long then made two free throws with 19.9 seconds left for a four-point lead.

Hardy's jumper gave UNLV a 44-30 lead three minutes into the second half before SDSU pulled within seven, thanks to Flynn's layup and Jordan Schakel's 3-pointer. But Hardy then made a jumper from the free-throw line and a layup to put the Runnin' Rebels back up by double digits.

UNLV took advantage of numerous SDSU breakdowns to take a double-digit lead midway through the first half and pushed it to 37-25 at halftime on a steal and slam dunk by Mitrou-Long.

SDSU had the lead just once, at 14-13 after Flynn's 3-pointer, and then allowed UNLV to go on a 10-0 run. Mitrou-Long started it by converting a 4-point play when he hit a 3-pointer and was fouled by Flynn. Cheikh Mbacke Diong scored inside and then Hardy hit a floater and Mitrou-Long made a layup.

SAN DIEGO — Malachi Flynn scored 10 of San Diego State's last 17 points and the No. 5 Aztecs rallied from a seven-point deficit to beat Colorado State 66-60 Tuesday night and rebound from their only loss.

Flynn finished with 17 points for SDSU (27-1, 16-1 Mountain West) after scoring just two points in the first half.

The Aztecs trailed 56-49 with 8:22 left before going on a 13-0 run. Jordan Schakel hit a put-back and Flynn a 3-pointer before Schakel hit the go-ahead 3-pointer with 4:50 left, making it 57-56.

SDSU's 13-0 run over 5 minutes, 17 seconds gave it a 62-56 lead.

The Aztecs were out-of-sync for much of the game and once again took poor shots. But unlike Saturday night, when their furious rally fell short against UNLV, they were able to get the lead and keep it.

Matt Mitchell scored 15 and Schakel 11.

Nico Carvacho scored 17 for CSU (19-11, 10-7) and Isaiah Stevens had 12.

Carvacho made a layup and Kendle Moore two free throws to pull the Rams to 62-60. Mitchell missed a 3 and then Stevens missed a shot, with SDSU's Yanni Wetzell tying up Carvacho, with SDSU getting the pass.

Mitchell and Flynn each made two free throws in the final nine seconds.

SDSU had been the nation's last unbeaten team before its school-record 26-game winning streak was snapped in a 66-63 home loss to UNLV on Saturday night.

The Rams came out fired up and surprised the Aztecs with a 12-0 run early in the first half to overcome a nine-point deficit and take a 14-11 lead.

SDSU seemed content to launch 3-pointers and not try to get inside, even when 6-foot-11 CSU center Nico Carvacho was out of the game. The Aztecs made only 6 of 17 from behind the arc in the first half.

The Aztecs pulled to 35-34 when Mitchell finally drove the lane and scored and was fouled, but he missed the free throw. Dischon Thomas made one of two free throws for the Rams to make it 36-34 at halftime.

BIG PICTURE

Colorado State: The Rams have rebounded nicely since losing their first three MWC games, including 79-57 against SDSU at Fort Collins on Dec. 4. They had won 10 of 13 coming into this game.

RENO, Nev. -- San Diego State guard K.J. Feagin called it a "gut check." Coach Brian Dutcher said his team was "rattled."

But even in front of 10,855 fans at rival Nevada, the No. 5 Aztecs overcame a 13-point second-half deficit for a 83-76 win.

"We like playing on the road," Feagin said after San Diego State finished the regular season undefeated in road and neutral games (14-0).

"We like the road environment," he added. "It was hostile here. ... It was a gut check. We were down. We were bruised, but not defeated."

Malachi Flynn had the biggest impact in the comeback victory by scoring 36 points, more than any Aztecs player since 2005 on 13-of-20 shooting from the floor.

"It's cool, but the regular season is over," Flynn said of setting a career high in points. "We have to move on. It's March."

Feagin said Aztecs fans can be relieved knowing his brief departure with an ankle injury won't be as serious as originally appeared. He returned and finished with 14 points for the Aztecs (28-1, 17-1 Mountain West) while shooting 4 of 10 beyond the arc.

The Wolf Pack (19-11, 11-6) connected on 22 of their first 37 shots and held a 54-39 lead with 16:52 left.

But the Aztecs answered with a 31-12 run over the next 10 minutes. Nevada was scoreless from the field for seven straight minutes during that stretch.

Jalen Harris led Nevada with 24 points, while seniors Lindsey Drew and Jazz Johnson added 13 each.

The Aztecs beat the Wolf Pack on the boards 24-21 and won points in the point 28-22.

SDSU'S RECORD SEASON

San Diego State's 17-1 Mountain West record this season is the highest winning percentage of any team in conference history, eclipsing Utah (13-1) in 2004-05. It's also the best record in school history.

LAS VEGAS -- Jordan Schakel scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half as No. 5 San Diego State rallied for a 73-60 win over Air Force in the quarterfinals of the Mountain West Conference tournament on Thursday.

Schakel, who shot 1 of 5 in the first half, hit four 3-pointers in the second half for the top-seeded Aztecs (29-1), who rode a 21-3 run to their 13th consecutive quarterfinal victory.

Yanni Wetzell and Malachi Flynn had 16 points each for San Diego State, which is hoping to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. After surviving the scare from Air Force, SDSU plays the winner of Boise State-UNLV in the semifinals.

AJ Walker scored 18 points for Air Force (12-20), which advanced off a 77-70 win against Fresno State on Wednesday.

Air Force shot 60% in the first half but just 27.3% in the second, opening the door for the Aztecs.

Air Force took a 44-39 lead on Caleb Morris' 3-pointer. Schakel then hit back-to-back 3s that gave San Diego State its first lead since early in the first half.

Matt Mitchell hit San Diego State's fifth 3 of the half for a 60-47 lead with 7:05 remaining.

Schakel hit his fourth 3 with 1:29 remaining to make it 71-60.

Walker, who averaged 10.9 points during the regular season, scored 14 points in the first half. His 3-pointer with 39.2 seconds remaining preserved a 37-33 halftime lead for Air Force.

San Diego State went 1 of 6 to begin the game, but responded by making 6 of 7 to take a 19-17 lead on a 3-pointer from Adam Seiko.

The Falcons made four of their seven 3s in the final 10 minutes of the first half.
