OFF THE TOP (through games of Tue., Jan. 5)

- The programs that have won the last two Mountain West Conference regular season championships open a two-game series Thursday when Nevada (co-2018-19 champs) faces San Diego State (outright 2019-20 champs).
- The teams meet on Thursday at 7 p.m. PT and on Saturday at 6 p.m. PT.
- The Aztecs a 19-6 series advantage, including a 9-1 home record against the Wolf Pack (Nevada's lone win over SDSU in San Diego came on Nov. 14, 1998). San Diego State has won the last three meetings between the teams and six of the last seven encounters.
- San Diego State has handed Nevada six of its last 23 losses. Since March 3, 2018, San Diego State is 6-1 against Nevada, while the rest of the country is 17-58.
- San Diego State responded from an immensely disappointing loss on Saturday (Colorado State rallied from 26 points down to win a game in which it led for 39 seconds) by routing the Rams on Monday night. SDSU settled for a 78-65 victory, but never trailed, raced out to a 21-6 lead, expanded the advantage to 42-13 and led 50-24 at intermission. The Aztecs led by double digits the final 34:14 of the game.
- The Aztec response from Saturday's game was strong and immediate. SDSU's 67.9 percent field goal shooting in the first half was its highest in a first half in nearly eight years (Feb. 19, 2013) and the 26-point halftime advantage matched Colorado State's largest deficit at intermission in the last 25 seasons.
- Senior guard **Jordan Schakel** scored a career-high 28 points, made a career-high eight three point field goals (on 8-of-11 shooting from beyond the arc) and tied a career-high with nine rebounds. The eight treys were the most by an Aztec player since Chase Tapley drained eight three-pointers against UNLV on Jan. 15, 2011.
- After his outburst Monday, **Schakel** is now averaging 14.6 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. He now leads the Mountain West Conference in three-point field goal percentage (45.9) and free throw percentage (95.8).
- Senior guard **Terrell Gomez** reached double figures for the third consecutive game with 13 points and four assists on Monday. The transfer has 1,723 career points (10th among all active players), 313 career three-point field goals (second among all active players) and has made 43.7 percent of his career three-point field goal attempts (first among active players with at least 260 career makes).
- In his last three games, **Gomez** has averaged 15.0 points and made 11-of-19 three-point field goal attempts (57.9 percent), with 10 assists and six steals.
- Junior forward **Nathan Mensah** reached double figures for the third time in five games and the 13th time in his career with 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field and eight rebounds against the Rams. He had three blocked shots and now has a rejection in seven straight games and 16 in his last five games. His 80 career blocks are 10th in school history.
- SDSU leading scorer this season, senior forward **Matt Mitchell** had an efficient game with 12 points, five rebounds, two assists and was 4-of-5 from the field and 2-of-3 from three-point range. Mitchell has reached double figures in all nine games this season and is averaging 14.9 points, 4.3 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game this season.

- SDSU has advanced to postseason play in 12 of the last 14 seasons in which a champions was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 36 of last 38 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won 40 straight when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 11th nationally in winning percentage (.754) since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 12.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 11 appearances in its conference championship game are the second most in Division I.
- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

All eight Aztec Division I opponents own a .500 or better record when factoring out the game against SDSU.
- San Diego State ranks among the national leaders in several categories including: 15th in scoring defense* (60.1), 22nd in Kenpom adjusted defensive efficiency* (91.7), 32nd in field goal percentage defense (38.7), 44th in turnover margin (+3.9), 37th in steals per game* (8.8) and 65th in turnover per game (12.0). * - indicates leads Mountain West Conference in category

REWIND, THE 2019-20 SEASON

- San Diego State is coming off a magical season that saw the Aztecs win their first 26 games of the season en route to a 30-2 record, a Mountain West Conference regular season title (record 12th league crown) and a climb to No. 4 in the Associated Press poll for five weeks before ending the campaign at No. 6. SDSU was the only team in the nation not to lose a road game in 2019-20, finishing the year 11-0 away from Viejas Arena.
- The USA Today National Coach of the Year last year, **Brian Dutcher** begins his fourth season at the helm of the San Diego State men's basketball program. He has an overall record of 80-28 in three-plus seasons and has led SDSU to the conference championship game in each of his three seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first three seasons.
- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in seniors forward **Matt Mitchell** (12.2 pts., 4.8 rebs., 1.7 asst. in 2019-20) and guard **Jordan Schakel** (10.0 pts., 3.4 rebs, 43.6 percent three-point shooting) and junior forward **Nathan Mensah** (6.9 pts., 6.8 rebs., 1.6 blks.). Mitchell and Schakel played in all 32 games (Mitchell started the final 19 and Schakel started 31) with Mensah appearing 13 times, all starts, before in injury prematurely ended his season.
- The Aztecs are picked to finish in first place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 seasons San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 12 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 16 years.

- Has appeared in 27 postseason tournaments, including 12 in the last 14 seasons in which a national champion was crowned.

- San Diego State has defeated top-25 ranked teams 34 times. The first was an 88-75 win over No. 13 Kansas State (12/21/73) and the most recent was over No. 14/17 Nevada (65-56 in the MW semifinal on 3/15/19).
- 574 student-athletes have earned letters playing for SDSU.
- SDSU has had 17 All-Americans, including three; Michael Cage (1984), Kawhi Leonard (2011), and Malachi Flynn (2020) who were consensus All-Americans.

TOP-25 FACTS

- From the start of the 2010-11 season to the week of Dec. 20, 2020, San Diego State's 83 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California and which also ranks as the 21st most nationally. The California program with the second most appearances in that time frame is UCLA with 45 and Saint Mary's 39 are the third most. Other than those three, no other men's basketball team in California has appeared in the AP poll more than 12 times.
- The Aztecs have receiving votes in each poll from the outset of the 2020-21 season and first appeared in the AP poll, at No. 24, on Dec. 7, moved up to No. 18 last week and made its debut in the Coaches poll last week, as well, at No. 20.
- Dec. 10's game was the second time San Diego State has played a ranked Arizona State team. The previous match-up came on Nov. 18, 2008 in Tempe. The No. 15 Sun Devils defeated SDSU 59-52.
- San Diego State joins Gonzaga, Kansas, Missouri and Villanova as the only teams with two victories this season against AP Top 25 teams.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher has a 7-4 record against top-25 competition, with the two most recent victories coming in the team's 2020-21 season opener, a 73-58 victory over No. 22 UCLA and its 80-68 win at No. 23 Arizona State.
- San Diego State spent 15 consecutive weeks in the AP Top-25 Poll last season, the program's third longest single season consecutive week streak trailing the 2010-11 squad which spent 19 straight weeks and the 2013-14 team which was spent 16 consecutive weeks ranked in the top-25.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Reaching No. 4 in the 2019-20 season, the Aztecs spent five weeks there establishing program records for consecutive weeks at that ranking and for the most weeks, in a season, at that rank.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019 and then went to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 to 7 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 5 to 5 to 6 and finished at No. 6.
- San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9, 2019 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked in the AP poll.
- In total, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 82 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, which is tied for the 19th most appearances in the poll during the last 10 seasons.
- Prior to the 2019-20 season, the last time the Aztecs had been ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.
- Prior to last season, the Aztecs had been ranked in the top-5 of the AP poll four times. In 2019-20 they were ranked in the top-5 10 straight weeks.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING ON

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 22 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time he experienced 386 victories, 10 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including eight NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured two more Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament three times.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons.
- His 73 wins in his first three seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first three campaigns.
- His 80 wins to date are the second most of any first time head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

His 2019-20 team was arguably one of the best in program history:

- They opened with a 26-game winning streak, a program record and the longest streak in Division I last year, and were the last unbeaten team in the nation for all or part of 39 days.
- Spent 15 weeks ranked reaching No. 4 in both national polls, and remained there for a program-record five weeks, before finishing at No. 6.
- Went 17-1 in Mountain West action, a MW record for league wins, and opened with 15 straight MW victories, also a MW conference record.
- Finished with a 30-2 mark; the third most wins in program history and its two losses are the fewest for an SDSU team in its DI era (since 1970-71).
- The Aztecs were the only team to end the regular season with just one loss (28-1) and were one of three teams (Gonzaga & Dayton) to end the year with two losses.
- San Diego State's two losses came by a combined six points and 23 of its 30 wins came by 10 points or more.
- Following the 2019-20 season, Dutcher was named the *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, the NABC District 17 & USBWA District IX Coach of the Year, the Mountain West Coach of the Year (by votes of both the media and coaches) and was one of four finalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the 11th-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 162-22 home record, winning 88.0 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2020-21 season underway here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 189 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 165-24 mark, including a 80-10 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 118-19 at home, including a 55-9 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (44-7 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 51-10 in their last 61 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- San Diego State is 26-4 in its last 30 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 23-3 in its 26 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- SDSU is 16-6 in conference home openers since joining the Mountain West prior of the 1999-2000 season.
- The Aztecs have lost only once to Nevada on its home floor (71-76, OT on Nov. 14, 1998) and has won its last seven at home against the Wolf Pack since that 1998 meeting.

- San Diego State ended the 2019-20 season 14-1 at home, with an average scoring margin of +16.0. Of the 15 home games, 12 were decided by at least nine points. In SDSU's first five home games this season, its margin of victory has been 20.3 points.
- Last season's 13-game home court win streak, snapped on Feb. 22, 2020, was tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since the school-record 29-game win streak from Nov. 20, 2013 and ended Feb. 28, 2015.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

- Competed in 100th collegiate game of his career in the 2020-21 season opener vs. No. 22/21 UCLA (11/25) where he led the team w/15 pts (SDSU is 22-1 when he scores at least 15 pts in a game).
- His 35 points vs. Brigham Young (12/18) are a career-high, the most in the Mountain West against Division I opposition this season, and the most since Malachi Flynn scored 36 at Nevada (2/22/20).
- His 35 points against Brigham Young are the 10th-highest single game total this season against a Division I opponent.
- Is the only Aztec to score in double digits in every game this season.
- **12 free throws and 15 free throw attempts at Arizona State leads the team and the MW for a single game this season.**
- In the MW is No. 9 in scoring (14.9/g), No. 8 in free throw percentage (.772) and No. 11 in steals (1.33/g).

- **Has scored in double figures in 24 of his last 28 games, all starts, and in those 24 games is averaging 14.9 points.**
- In his career (108 games) he has reached double figure scoring 66 times & in those games SDSU has a 50-16 record.
- His 108-career games rank No. 51 among active players in Division I.
- Ranks in the top-20 of the San Diego State career record book in 13 statistical categories.
- **Enters today's game is 36 rebounds & 9 assists from becoming the third player in program history to compile 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals. (Trey Kell & Winston Shepard).**

Senior Guard **Jordan Schakel**

Overall: 14.6 points, 3.6 rebounds, 1.1 steals, 40.8 FG%

- Totaled career-bests w/28 points, including 8 three pointers and has 15 or more points in five of nine games this season.
- Recorded a then career-high 25 points in the team's victory at No. 23 Arizona State
- For his career, when he scores in double figures, the Aztecs are 33-4 and in games in which he scores at least 15 points, the team's record is 12-1.
- **His .417 (170-of-408) career three-point shooting percentage ranks No. 24 among active players in Division I, but among those that have made at least 170 threes he ranks No. 8.**
- Ranks No. 1 in the program in career FT percentage (.8671), No. 2 in 3FG percentage (.4166) & No. 5 in three-point FGs (170).
- Has 49 games with multiple threes and SDSU is 40-9 in those contests.
- Over 70 percent (.705) of his career hoops (170-of-241) are from the bonus distance & this year 28-of-40 (.700) buckets are treys.
- Has played 2,214 career minutes and committed just 51 turnovers (0.92 turnovers per 40 minutes played) and has a 1.45:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- **Has reached double figure scoring in 27 of the last 41 games after reaching that plateau just 10 times in the previous 61 games.**
- Versus Pepperdine (12/6) made five two-point buckets and one three pointer. It marked just the seventh time, in 98 career games, that he made three-plus more two-point buckets than three-pointers.
- **Nationally, among the top-100 rankings is No. 12 in free throw percentage (.958), No. 32 in three-point FG per game (3.11/g), No. 33 in three-point FG percentage (45.9), No. 37 in three-point FG (28) & No. 69 in three-point FG attempts (61).**
- In the Mountain West, ranks No. 1 in free throw percentage (.958), No. 1 in three-point FG percentage (.459) No. 3 in three-point FGs (3.11/g), No. 11 in scoring (14.56/g) & No. 15 in steals (1.22).

Junior Forward **Nathan Mensah**

Overall: 9.6 points, 7.6 rebounds, 2.1 blocks, 63.0 FG%

- Set career-highs with 18 points and 6 blocks vs. Saint Mary's (12/22).
- Established a then career-high with 17 points and a career-best 15 rebounds at No. 23 Arizona State (12/10).
- Defensive stopper on the back line who can erase mistakes by perimeter defenders.
- Ranks No. 10 on the program's career blocked shots list (80).
- Has recorded six, three, three and three blocks in 4 of the last 5 games (at No. 23 Arizona State, vs. Brigham Young, vs. Saint Mary's & Colorado State-1/4) and is one of two players in the MW, this year, to have four games of at least three blocks.
- **Is one of six players this season to record at least three blocks, 17 points and 15 rebounds in a game this year (at No. 23 Arizona State).**
- **He became the first Aztec player in at least 25 seasons to produce a game with at least 18 points, 13 rebounds and six blocked shots (vs. Saint Mary's). He is one of just two players to do it in Division I basketball this season (also: Charles Bassey, Western Kentucky).**
- Through nine games committed 7 turnover in 202 minutes this year (1.3 turnovers per 40 minutes played) and has a 1.0:1 assist to turnover ratio.
- Led the nation in 2019-20 with a .617 field goal percentage among player who appeared in no more than 13 games and were on the court for at least 20 minutes per game.
- In 34 games in his freshman season (2018-19) he had four double digit rebounding games. In his last season in 14 games he had three, including a then career-high 12 boards vs. San Jose State (12-8-19) and twice this season (at Arizona State & vs. Saint Mary's).
- In nine games this year, he is shooting a team-best .630 (34-of-54) from the floor and has attempted the first three three-pointers of his career.
- Played the first 13 games in 2019-20 before an injury ended his season, but in that time he upped his rebounds and points per game from

his freshman to sophomore season from 5.5-to-6.8 and 5.6-to-6.9, respectively. In Mountain West games the improvement was even more stark; rebounds went from 5.8-to-9.5 and points from 6.1-to-9.0.

Senior Guard Terrell Gomez

Overall: 9.6 points, 1.1 rebounds, 2.4 assists, 47.0 FG%

- Scored a season-high 19 pts vs. Colorado State (1/2).
- A grad transfer from CSUN with one year of eligibility: first-team All-Big West (2018-19 & 2019-20) and was the 2017-18 Big West Freshman of the Year.
- Nationally, among active career leaders, ranks No. 2 in free throw percentage at .892, No. 2 in three pointers (310), No. 5 in three-point FG attempts (716) and No. 9 in scoring with 1,723 points.
- Since the start of the 1996-97 season, was only the second player in college basketball to have made at least 300 treys, shot at least .437 from the bonus distance, and done so in less than 100 games (John Jenkins, Vanderbilt).
- Is one of four players, since the start of the 1996-97 season, to have a FT percentage of at least .892 & to have hit 300 threes in his college career.
- Appeared in the 100th game of his college career vs. Pepperdine (12/6) and has started all but seven of his 104 games as a collegian.
- Among MW players is ranked No. 8 in three-point FG (2.22/g) and No. 15 in steals (1.22/g).
- One of only two active players to have made 313 three pointers (317 - Jhivvan Jackson, UTSA).

Senior Guard Trey Pulliam

Overall: 5.3 points, 3.6 assists, 2.8 rebounds, 36.5 FG%

- Has started each of the first nine games after coming off the bench in all 32 games last season.
- Has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.9:1 this season up from 2.1:1 last year.
- In his last 15 games has a 3.4:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Is averaging 1.8 turnover per 40 minutes played this year (11 turnovers in 243 minutes of action) and has a career average of 1.9 turnovers per 40 minutes (39 turnovers in 774 minutes).
- Assists per 40 minutes played is up to 5.3 this season from 4.3 last year.
- Ranks No. 1 in the MW (No. 44 nationally) in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.91:1) and No. 9 in the MW in assists (3.56/g).
- Ranks third on the team in minutes (242:38) and minutes per game (27.0).
- His four steals vs. Katherine (12/2) are tied for the most in a game by a MW performer this year.

Junior Forward Aguek Arop

Overall: 4.6 points, 3.1 rebounds, 1.3 assists, 34.3 FG%

- Was the only player on the team to have more offensive than defensive rebounds in 2019-20. In a small sample size so far this year the trend continues; he has 13 offensive and 9 defensive boards.
- Ranks second on the team, No. 10 in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds (13) and is fifth on the squad in total boards (22). In the last 28 games has 39 offensive & 33 defensive rebounds.
- No. 10 in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds (1.86/g)
- Grabbed a career-high 7 rebounds vs. UC Irvine (11/27) and led the team in the category for the first time in his career.
- In his first 31 appearances he averaged 7.2 rebounds per 40 minutes played, in the last 29 his average is up to 8.1.
- Has started the last six games he's dressed, after coming off the bench in the first 53 of his career.
- Pound-for-pound the strongest player on the team who can defend from the three to the five.
- 6-7 tall with a 7-1 wingspan.

Senior Forward Joshua Tomaic

Overall: 4.7 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.2 steals, 58.1 FG%

- A grad transfer from Maryland with one year of eligibility.
- In nine games as an Aztec, is averaging 4.7 pts in 14.9 minutes per game and has 8 assists and 11 steals. In three years at Maryland he averaged 5.7 minutes and 1.3 points per game, totaled eight assists and didn't have a steal.
- Last season at Maryland, Tomaic scored 18 points in 16 games, so far this year he has 42 points in nine games.
- Among Aztecs who have double-digit shot attempts, his .581 FG percentage ranks No. 2 on the team.
- Has twice logged double-digit minutes in four consecutive games this year; they equal the second longest streak of his career, trailing only a six-game run from Jan. 4-Jan. 22, 2018. Has played double digit minutes in eight of nine games this year.

Junior Guard Adam Seiko

Overall: 3.8 points, 2.7 rebounds, 1.9 assists, 32.0 3FG%

- Earned the first two starts of his career vs. Colorado State (1/2 & 1/4) after coming off the bench in his first 68 appearances.
- Scored a season-best 12 points vs. Colorado State also recorded career-highs w/ 4 assists, 4 field goals, 4 three-point FG & 6 three-point FG attempts.
- Has a 1.86:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in 2020-21, compared to 1.2:1 in his previous two seasons.
- Has committed one turnover or less in 14 of the last 15 games and 37 of the last 39.

Sophomore Forward Keshad Johnson

Overall: 3.9 points, 2.7 rebounds, 0.7 assists, 47.4 FG%

- His 14 points vs. UC Irvine (11/27) are a career-high and 11 of them came in a 1:53 span early in the second half.
- Versus UC Irvine & St. Katherine (12/6), he was 8-of-14 (.571) from the floor, 3-of-7 (.429) from beyond the arc; last year, in 18 games, he was 12-of-34 (.353) and 4-of-18 (.222) from those to areas, respectively.
- Averaged 11.5 pts, 4.5 rebs, 1.0 assists in games against UC Irvine & St. Katherine.
- Seven offensive rebounds ranks third on the team and his average per 40 minutes played is 3.5 in 2020-21.
- In two games (vs. UC Irvine & St. Katherine) averaged 11.5 pts, 4.5 rebs, 1.0 assists.
- Has five block in seven appearances in 2020-21 compared to one in 18 games last season.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- San Diego State opened the 2020-21 season hosting three Division I in-state foes in UCLA, UC Irvine, and Pepperdine, and on Dec. 22 played Saint Mary's in a neutral site game, defeated each, and is scheduled to play a total of eight regular-season games against California

Division I schools.

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 111-33 (.771) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but three of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 82 home games against the those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 72-11 (.866).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 445-323 (.579) overall, and SDSU has a winning record against 19 of those 24 programs.

AMONG THE MOUNTAIN WEST'S BEST

San Diego State is pacing at an elite level in the Mountain West in games played through Jan. 2, 2021.

- The Aztecs lead the conference in scoring defense (60.1 ppg), three-point field goal percentage (.383), total steals (79), and steals per game (8.9).
- SDSU ranks second in field goal percentage defense (.397), three-point field goals (87), blocks (32), turnovers forced (15.89/g).
- The Aztecs are third in the Mountain West in scoring margin (+13.1), three-point field goal per game (9.7), three-point field goal attempts (227), turnover margin (+3.9/g) & turnovers per game (12.0).

AZTEC PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- San Diego State has been picked to increase its conference-record number of Mountain West titles to 13 this year by nearly every media outlet. The Aztecs were picked to win the league by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West, *Lindy's Sports*, *Blue Ribbon Yearbook*, ESPN, Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, John Gasaway and Jeff Borzello and Jon Rothstein.
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** has been the player most honored when the preseason predictors talk about San Diego State, he has been named first-team preseason All-Mountain West by the media who regularly cover the league, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon* and John Rothstein. CBS Sports included him in the top-101 players (No. 61) and *Lindy's* ranked him at No. 124 in its top-150. In addition, Mitchell has been included on the preseason watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award.
- Senior guard **Terrell Gomez** was selected the Newcomer of the Year by *Blue Ribbon* and *Lindy's* predicted he would be a second-team All-MW selection, No. 131 among its top-150 as well as, among newcomers in the league, the most impactful newcomer, the best shooter, No. 1 signing coup and having the best shot at earning all-conference honors.
- **Jordan Schakel**, a senior guard, was selected a third-team All-MW performer and the best shooter in the Mountain West Conference by *Lindy's*.
- Freshman guard **Lamont Butler** was named the best playmaker/passers coming into the league by *Lindy's*.
- Assistant Coach **Dave Velasquez** was named one of the top-25 assistant coaches ready to lead their own program by *The Athletic*.
- Though not ranked in either the preseason AP or Coaches polls, San Diego State is receiving votes in both and is the only Mountain West program who is currently doing so.
- With the exception of Gonzaga, every team in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls are members of Power-5 conferences. So, *The Athletic* published its rankings of non-Power-5 programs and San Diego State was ranked No. 4 on that list.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO WIN 13TH MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE

- San Diego State has won a Mountain West-record 12 titles in men's basketball (seven regular season & five tournament), four more than its closest competitor, and nearly every preseason prediction has the Aztecs picking up its 13th crown in 2020-21.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 years the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the preseason poll. The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in six of the last seven years.
- In addition to the MW media, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon*, ESPN, ESPN's Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, Jeff Borzello and John Gasaway as well as College Hoops Today's Jon Rothstein have predicted the Aztecs will win the MW.

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEVADA

This is the 26th meeting between the schools with San Diego State winning 19 of the previous 25 (19-6).

- San Diego State has won six of its last seven games with Nevada.
- 10 of the meetings have been decided by single digits, including the two of the last three that have taken place in San Diego (2018: SDSU, 79-74; 2019: SDSU, 65-57; 2020: SDSU, 68-55).
- After Nevada joined the league in time for the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs won the first seven games by an average of 12.9 points. The Wolf Pack defeated SDSU for the first time as a member of the Mountain West on Jan. 4, 2017.
- In the history of the series, San Diego State won five of the first six meetings, dropped two of the next three get-togethers, won seven straight and then split the season series in 2016-17. SDSU has won six of the eight encounters between the teams over the past three seasons.
- The Aztecs are 3-0 against the Wolf Pack in the Mountain West Tournament. They faced off in the semifinals in 2018 and 2019 and SDSU beat Nevada by scores of 90-73 in 2018 and 65-56 in 2019. The Wolf Pack were the No. 1 seed in both seasons and ranked No. 22 and No. 14 in the country in 2018 and 2019, respectively.
- In games played in Reno, the Aztecs lead the Wolf Pack 6-5, but the Aztecs have been victorious just twice in its last five in the "Biggest Little City In America."
- In games played in San Diego, the Aztecs are 9-1 vs. Nevada.
- Junior forward **Matt Mitchell** has a 6-2 career record and has averaged 10.6 points and 4.8 rebounds against the Wolf Pack.

RENO, Nev. - San Diego State guard K.J. Feagin called it a "gut check." Coach Brian Dutcher said his team was "rattled." But even in front of 10,855 fans at rival Nevada, the No. 5 Aztecs overcame a 13-point second-half deficit for a 83-76 win. "We like playing on the road," Feagin said after San Diego State finished the regular season undefeated in road and neutral games (14-0). "We like the road environment," he added. "It was hostile here. ... It was a gut check. We were down. We were bruised, but not defeated." Malachi Flynn had the biggest impact in the comeback victory by scoring 36 points, more than any Aztecs player since 2005 on 13-of-20 shooting from the floor. "It's cool, but the regular season is over," Flynn said of setting a career high in points. "We have to move on. It's March." Feagin said Aztecs fans can be relieved knowing his brief departure with an ankle injury won't be as serious as originally appeared. He returned and finished with 14 points for the Aztecs (28-1, 17-1 Mountain West) while shooting 4 of 10 beyond the arc. "It hurts right now, but my team needed me," Feagin said. "Everything else should be fine by tournament time. In two or three days, I should be able to play again." The Wolf Pack (19-11, 11-6) connected on 22 of their first 37 shots and held a 54-39 lead with 16:52 left. But the Aztecs answered with a 31-12 run over the next 10 minutes. Nevada was scoreless from the field for seven straight minutes during that stretch. "We played a really good basketball team," Nevada coach Steve Alford said. "Obviously, our guys gave a good effort. We just came up short." Jalen Harris led Nevada with 24 points, while seniors Lyndsey Drew and Jazz Johnson added 13 each. The Aztecs beat the Wolf Pack on the boards 24-21 and won points in the paint 28-22. "I'm a little concerned over the last three games," Dutcher said of a stretch that included his team's only loss of the season against UNLV. "We've been letting teams shoot 50%. We have to get back and play a higher level of defense because it's March. We can't let teams shoot like that against us."

SDSU'S RECORD SEASON

San Diego State's 17-1 Mountain West record this season is the highest winning percentage of any team in conference history, eclipsing Utah (13-1) in 2004-05. It's also the best record in school history.

NEAR HISTORIC WIN

Nevada came minutes away from pulling off the program's first regular season win against a Top 5 team and its first ever since it beat No. 3 Gonzaga in the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

BIG PICTURE

San Diego State: The Aztecs finished the regular season with one loss and avenged two blowout defeats at Reno the past two years: 28 last year and 25 in 2017-18.

Nevada: The Aztecs ended the Wolf Pack's six-game win streak and Nevada's 20-game conference home win streak. The Wolf Pack lost their second game this season after taking a lead into the break against San Diego State.

SAN DIEGO - Jordan Schakel hit 8 of 11 3-pointers and scored a career-high 28 points as San Diego State got past Colorado State 78-65 on Monday night.

Colorado State defeated San Diego State 70-67 on Saturday, setting a school and Mountain West Conference record by erasing a 26-point deficit. In the rally they had a 19-0 first-half run and went 14-0 in the second half before scoring the last 11 points of the game.

In this one the Rams trailed by 29, 42-13, late in the first half and had a 14-0 run early in the second half but never got closer than 14 points until scoring the final basket of the game.

Terrell Gomez had 13 points for San Diego State (7-2, 1-1 Mountain West Conference). Matt Mitchell added 12 points. Nathan Mensah had 11 points.

David Roddy and John Tonje had 15 points for the Rams (6-2, 3-1), whose four-game win streak was broken. Isaiah Stevens had 11 points.

SCHAKEL NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

San Diego State men's basketball player Jordan Schakel has been named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 13.

Schakel scored 25 points, grabbed six rebounds and had two steals in the Aztecs' lone game of the week, an 80-68 victory over No. 23/24 Arizona State at Desert Financial Arena in Tempe, Ariz. With the victory San Diego State improves its record to 5-0 this year and 35-2 since the start of the 2019-20 season.

The Torrance, Calif., native was 9-of-15 from the floor (.600), including 5-of-9 from beyond the three-point line (.556) and knocked down both his free throw attempts.

His 25 points were a game and career-high for the 6-6 guard, and his five threes equaled his career best.

Schakel drew an offensive foul on preseason All-American guard Remy Martin in then games second possession, and then started his offensive barrage.

In just over two minutes, from 18:08-to-15:57 in the first half, he grabbed an offensive rebound and turned it into his first three pointer and then did it again 30 seconds later for his second trey. He had a steal and knocked down a pair of free throws to stake the Aztecs to an early 12-2 lead. Arizona State battled back to take a 32-31 lead, but with 1:22 to go before halftime, Schakel grabbed a defensive board, went coast-to-coast, and scored on a layup to put the Aztecs back in front, a lead which it took into the intermission.

Coming out of the locker room, the teams played a back and forth game for the first five minutes of the second half. At the 15 minute mark, the Sun Devils led 43-42, but then Schakel erupted.

In the next 3:40 he knocked down three treys and a jumper in the paint to help turn a one-point deficit into a 12-point lead, 57-45 with 11:20 to go. From there, Arizona State was never able to cut the Aztecs lead to single digits. Schakel scored two more buckets down the stretch, including the team final two points, in the 12 point victory.

This is the first Mountain West weekly award of Schakel's career and the second for an Aztec, in the three weeks of the season.

AZTECS DEBUT AT NO. 24 IN AP POLL

Running its record to 4-0 after victories over No. 22 UCLA and UC Irvine, picked to win the Pac-12 and Big West Conferences in preseason polls, respectively, and a thrilling come from behind win against Pepperdine, San Diego State men's basketball made its 2020-21 debut in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, coming in at No. 24. The Aztecs garnered 123 points and is the only Mountain West team in this week's poll.

Monday's initial appearances in AP poll, on Dec. 7, is two days earlier than last year's team, which went on to reach No. 4 for a program-record five weeks before finishing the season at No. 6. In addition, this appearance, after the second week of competition, is the earliest week San Diego State has appeared in the poll in a year in which it was not ranked in the preseason. In 2013-14, SDSU made its debut in the poll in the fourth week of competition (No. 24 on Dec. 2, 2013) and last year's team was initially ranked in the sixth week (No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019).

San Diego State spent 15 weeks in the AP poll last year, the third most in a season for the program, trailing only the 2010-11 team, which was ranked for 19 weeks, and the 2013-14 team, which appeared in the poll for 16 weeks.

San Diego State appears in the poll for the 82nd time since the start of the 2010-11 season, easily outdistancing all other California schools in weeks being ranked in that time frame. UCLA has appeared in the poll for 45 weeks, Saint Mary's 39 weeks, USC 12, and California 11, since the start of the 2010-11 season.

MITCHELL NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Matt Mitchell was named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 29. In sweeping both games last week, 73-58 over No. 22 UCLA and 77-58 versus UC Irvine, Mitchell averaged 13.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals to help improve the Aztecs record to 2-0 this year and 32-2 in its last 34 games.

Against UCLA, he was one of the team leaders with 15 points. He knocked down three triples, and added two rebounds, two assists and two steals. It was the 44th time in his career he made multiple three pointers in a game, and the 15th time since the start of last season (33 games at the time). The game was the 100th of Mitchell's Aztec career, and he became the 33rd player in program history to reach the milestone.

Versus UC Irvine, the Riverside, Calif., native, finished with 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals. He scored six points in the first half, with four coming in the final two minutes of the period as the Aztecs pried open a nine-point advantage at halftime en route to a 77-58 victory.

For the week, Mitchell shot .391 from the floor (9-of-23), .364 from distance (4-of-11) and knocked down 4-of-5 from the line. After two games, he leads the Aztecs in scoring, steals (4), is second in assists (4) and fourth in rebounds (6).

This is the first Mountain West weekly award of the season, the first for an Aztec this season, and the first of Mitchell's career.

UTAH FRIENDLY

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, San Diego State 19-5 against the four schools it has played from the state of Utah, and 17-3 in regular season meetings with those four schools. In that time frame:

- SDSU is 3-1 against BYU
- SDSU is 2-1 against Utah
- SDSU is 13-3 against Utah State
- SDSU is 1-0 against Southern Utah

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

- San Diego State owns the nation's longest road winning streak (13 games, dates back to the 2018-19 season) and had the longest road/neutral streak (16) in the nation snapped in its final game of the 2019-20 campaign.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State's 74-43 (.632) record in road games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Last season the Aztecs' 16 road/neutral road wins were the most in the nation.
- San Diego State's 11-0 road record last season was the best in the nation and its 11 true road wins were tied for the third most in the nation behind Vermont (12-3) and Stephen F. Austin (12-2).
- In its lone road game this year, San Diego State defeated No. 23 Arizona State 80-68 on Dec. 10 and in its only neutral site regular season game, SDSU defeated Saint Mary's 74-49 in Mott Athletic Center on the campus of Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, Calif.

FLYNN TAKEN BY RAPTORS AT NO. 29 IN NBA DRAFT

- Former San Diego State guard Malachi Flynn, was selected by the Toronto Raptors in the first round (29th selection) of the 2020 NBA Draft.
- Flynn is the second Aztec selected in the first round (Kawhi Leonard, San Antonio Spurs, 2011) since Head Coach Brian Dutcher came to San Diego State prior to the 1999-2000 season, and he is the third Aztecs overall to be selected in the first round (Michael Cage, Los Angeles Clippers, 1984).
- During his single season on The Mesa, Flynn led SDSU in points (564), points per game (17.6), field goals (184), field goal attempts (417), three-point field goals (76), three-point field goal attempts (204), free throws (120), free throw attempts (140), assists (163), assists per game (5.1) and steals (56), steals per game (1.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.86:1), minutes (1,072) and minutes per game (33.5). In addition, he was third on the team in rebounds (143) and rebounds per game (4.5).
- Following the 2019-20 campaign, Flynn became the most decorated Aztec in a single season. He was named a consensus second-team All-American after being recognized by The Associated Press, National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), United States Basketball Writers of America (USBWA) and The Sporting News. With that honor, he joined SDSU Hall of Famers Michael Cage and Kawhi Leonard as the third consensus All-American in program history. In addition, he garnered second-team All-American honors from CBS Sports, NBC Sports and The Athletic and first-team distinction from Sports Illustrated and STADIUM. He was the Most Valuable Player of both the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational and Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, an NABC first-team All-District 17 and USBWA All-District IX performer.
- Flynn was second Aztec to be named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team as well as a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, Naismith National Player of the Year, and Lute Olson National Player of the Year Awards. He was first-team All-Mountain West in both the coaches and media polls. He earned the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team in the coaches poll, and inclusion on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team. In the media poll he was Mountain West Newcomer of the Year in addition to twice garnering Mountain West Player of the Week honors and he capped his junior year being named the Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year.

MATT MITCHELL...DID YOU KNOW?

With 22 points against New Mexico on Feb. 11, 2020, senior **Matt Mitchell** became the 34th player in Aztec men's basketball to reach the 1,000-point career plateau.

BUT...DID YOU KNOW?

Mitchell enters the 2020-21 season on the precipice of even more rarefied Aztecs territory. He is on the verge of becoming just the third player in the 99-year history of the program to amass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in his Aztec career.

Having already surpassed 1,000 points last season and 100 career steals at Arizona State (12/10/20), Mitchell needs 36 rebounds and 9 assists to reach each of the target numbers.

When he does, he will join Trey Kell (2015-18) and Winston Shepard (2013-16) as the only Aztecs to ever post those numbers wearing an SDSU uniform.

ELITE LEADERS

In his first three-plus seasons, head coach Brian Dutcher has led the Aztecs to 79 wins, the most by any SDSU coach in the now 100th season of basketball on The Mesa.

Since the start of the 2017-18 season only two coaches, first time head coaches who were hired that year, have amassed at least 79 victories (through games of Dec. 29):

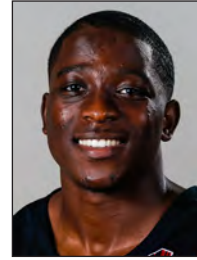

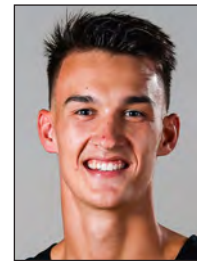

Fourth Season • 22nd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fourth season as San Diego State head coach after three years in which he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th and 12th Mountain West crowns and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. He is the only coach in the 99-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program, and over the summer signed a contract extension which will keep him on The Mesa through the 2025-26 season.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an

at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

SAN DIEGO — Mick Cronin might not be so eager to bring UCLA back to San Diego State anytime soon after his short-handed Bruins were given a rude welcome by the deep, disruptive Aztecs coached by old friend Brian Dutcher.

Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel scored 15 points apiece and SDSU used a suffocating defense and 3-point shots to humble 22nd-ranked UCLA 73-58 on Wednesday night in the season opener for both teams.

Mitchell and Schakel hit 3s early in the second half to open a 40-28 lead and the Aztecs dominated the rest of the way at empty Viejas Arena. Aguek Arop and Terrell Gomez scored 10 points each for San Diego State, which was 30-2 last season and expecting its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament before it was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

UCLA, which played on SDSU's home court for the first time since December 1991, was without key players Jalen Hill and transfer Johnny Juzang. Chris Smith, the Bruins' only senior, committed his fourth foul midway through the second half and came out — and then fouled out with 4:47 to go. He scored 10 points, none after halftime.

Jaime Jacquez Jr. had 17 points for UCLA, and Cody Riley added 14 points and 12 rebounds.

The game was part of a multi-team event that also includes Pepperdine and UC Irvine. UCLA and SDSU had been scheduled to play in a bubble in Orlando, but it fell apart. Longtime pals Dutcher and Cronin quickly put together this event.

Mitchell and Schakel each hit three 3-pointers, and the Aztecs, picked to repeat as Mountain West Conference regular-season champions, went 9 of 23 from behind the arc.

The Bruins, who went 19-12 last year and were picked to win the Pac-12 this season, played well for the first eight minutes before SDSU's defense began to take its toll.

Mitchell hit a jumper to start an 8-0 run midway through the first half that gave the Aztecs a 23-19 lead. Joshua Tomic made a jumper and fellow senior transfer Gomez hit two free throws before Nathan Mensah sank a baseline jumper.

UCLA ended a six-minute drought when Smith made a one-handed jumper.

Jacquez made a layup to pull the Bruins to 30-28 and was fouled, but missed the free throw. Arop hit a layup and two free throws in the final minute for a 34-28 halftime lead.

QUOTABLE

"I just think we have great depth," Dutcher said. "We used a lot of guys, 10 guys, and we don't drop off much. This might be as deep a team as we've ever had. UCLA was short-handed. They were missing two players, potentially two starters, so I just think we wore them down. We picked them up full court the entire game and I think we just wore them down to the point where maybe they were on tired legs by the end of the game."

CROWD NOISE

Asked if his players were bothered by the faux crowd noise at usually raucous Viejas Arena, Cronin said: "The problem wasn't the crowd noise. The problem was San Diego State, their toughness, their execution."

BIG PICTURE

UCLA: Hill, a 6-10 swingman, has right knee tendinitis and is day-to-day. Juzang, a transfer from Kentucky, has a stress reaction in his right foot and isn't expected to play this week.

San Diego State: The Aztecs used their trademark tough defense during the first half to force UCLA into 10 turnovers and a scoring drought that allowed SDSU to take the lead.

SAN DIEGO — Keshad Johnson came off the bench to tally 14 points to carry San Diego State to a 77-58 win over UC Irvine on Friday.

Johnson scored 13 of his career-high 14 points in the second half on three 3-pters, also a career-best, a pair of free throws and a thunderous dunk. In addition to his point output the native of Oakland, Calif., had four rebounds and a steal.

After defeating No. 22/21 UCLA 73-58 two nights earlier, the Aztecs took a little time to get going against the Anteaters.

UC Irvine led by as many as three points four times in the first 17 minutes and San Diego State didn't get more than a one-point advantage until a Trey Pulliam three with 2:55 to play in the half. The hoop sparked a 9-0 run and sent the teams to the intermission with SDSU up 34-25.

Matt Mitchell scored seven of his 11 points in the game, in the first 20 minutes for San Diego State (2-0). Pulliam also finished the half with seven points. Aguek Arop added seven rebounds.

Returning to the floor after the break, the Aztecs pushed the lead to double digits in the first two minutes of the second half and never looked back. Within seven minute the lead was up to 25 and the game was completed with SDSU ahead by 19 points.

The third straight defense last season, allowing just 59.5 points per game, has picked up right where it left off giving up 58 points in each of its first two games.

Jordan Schakel scored only 3 points despite coming into the contest as the Aztecs' second leading scorer at 15.0 points per game. He shot 20% from behind the arc (1 of 5).

Brad Greene had 11 points and three assists for the Anteaters (0-2). Dawson Baker added 10 points. Collin Welp had 10 points.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State's men's basketball recorded its third straight victory to open the 2020-21 season on Wednesday night defeating the University of St. Katherine Firebirds, 83-41, at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs (3-0) used a 39-2 run in the first half to erase an early 11-9 deficit and seize command of the game.

SDSU had four players in double-digits, led by Jordan Schakel, who posted game-highs of 16 points and four steals, while Terrell Gomez followed closely with 13 points, including 3-for-5 clip from beyond the arc. Gomez has 300 three-pointers for his career, which ranks second in the nation among active players.

Freshman Keith Dinwiddie Jr. finished with a career-high 12 points on four threes of his own and Matt Mitchell reached double figures for the 59th time in a Scarlet and Black uniform with 10 points.

SDSU outscored the undersized Firebirds by 16 points in the point (26-10) as well as 11 points on the fast-break (15-4) to help key the victory. In addition, the Aztecs tallied 26 points off 17 Firebirds turnovers and maintained a 40-35 edge in rebounds, including a 36-27 edge on the defensive glass. The Aztecs bench finished with 29 points, marking the third time in as many games this season the bench has scored more than 20 points in a game.

Individually, Nathan Mensah led all players with seven rebounds, while Joshua Tomaic added six boards in the win.

Both SDSU and USK got off to a sluggish start, shooting a combined 13.3 percent from the floor (2-15) during the first four minutes and change, with each side making just one field goal.

After a pair of Mitchell free throws, the Firebirds (1-0) hit consecutive threes and forged their biggest lead of the game at 8-4. Shortly thereafter, Dinwiddie answered with the first of his four buckets, while Keshad Johnson followed with a dunk to put San Diego State on top 9-8.

The Firebirds moved back in front 11-9, at the 12:51 mark of the half, on a three pointer by Jesus Hernandez Jr. However, less than a minute later, Johnson converted an old-fashioned three-point play, sparking the Aztecs' 39-2 outburst.

Schakel scored seven points during the run, including five free throws, while Mensah added four to help give SDSU a 28-11 cushion by the 7:27 mark.

St. Katherine was held to just five more points in the half, and the Aztecs held a 48-16 advantage at intermission.

SDSU continued to pad its lead in the second half, fashioning its biggest advantage of the evening at 79-30 after a three-pointer by Mitchell with 6:42 remaining.

After opening 1-for-8 from the floor, the Aztecs connected on 26 of their final 48 shots, finishing with a .482 field-goal percentage for the evening.

The Firebirds were led by Hernandez's 12 points, all from three-point range.

San Diego State returns to action on Sunday, Dec. 6, when it hosts Pepperdine. Tipoff is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. PT, and the contest will be aired locally on YuView (Channel 4 on Spectrum and Cox cable systems). The Aztecs and Waves have not met since the 1994-95 campaign.

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State was so worried about Arizona State's fast break, it sent three players back on defense after every miss, leaving its two big men to work the offensive glass. Two against five turned out to be pretty good odds for the hard-working Aztecs.

Jordan Schakel scored 25 points, Nathan Mensah had 17 points and 15 rebounds, and No. 24 San Diego State dominated inside to beat No. 23 Arizona State 80-68 Thursday night.

"We sent the center and the power forward to the offensive glass and those guys did a great job on their own," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "It was a real key to the game."

The Sun Devils (3-2) got volume-scoring guard Alonzo Verge Jr. back after he missed two games during COVID-19 contact tracing but were without forward Marcus Bagley due to a lower left leg injury suffered Saturday against Cal.

San Diego State (5-0) already had a size advantage inside, and Bagley's absence turned it into an even bigger strength.

The Aztecs outscored Arizona State 36-9 in the paint and had 17 second-chance points on 11 offensive rebounds against the smaller Sun Devils. San Diego State pulled away with an 18-2 run in the second half to stretch the nation's longest road winning streak to 13 straight games.

"It was probably our closest to a complete game," said Schakel, who shot 5 of 9 from 3. "We still have a long way to go, but it was nice to put that kind of game together this early in the season."

The Sun Devils were pushed to the perimeter most of the night by the bigger Aztecs and, despite a couple of nice runs, didn't make enough outside shots. Arizona State shot 34% and missed 11 straight shots during a key stretch in the second half.

Verge led the Sun Devils with 25 points.

"Do we really care about how hard we've got to play? Do we know how hard we've got to play to beat a team like that?" Arizona State coach Bobby Hurley said. "There were a lot of examples of that tonight."

The Aztecs were without three players due to contact tracing, though only Keshad Johnson was expected to be part of the rotation.

Bagley's loss was a bigger one for the Sun Devils, leaving them without their top rebounder.

San Diego State took advantage, scoring 12 points off six offensive rebounds midway through the first half. The 6-10 Mensah had his way inside with 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first half to give the Aztecs a 35-33 lead.

Arizona State missed 11 of its first 15 shots before finding a better offensive rhythm and cleaned up the defensive glass better to rally from an early 12-point deficit.

The Sun Devils struggled against San Diego State's defensive pressure early in the second half and began turning the ball over, leading to a series of transition baskets during a 13-0 Aztecs run.

Arizona State had a stretch of eight minutes without a field goal as San Diego State extended the lead to 59-45.

"It was a combination of poor shot selection, careless turnovers, bad transition defense after mistakes," Hurley said. "We were still up two, 43-41, with 15 minutes left with all the things that I witnessed and we found a way to do worse than that, which is scary."

BIG PICTURE
San Diego State won its 17th straight nonconference game behind a big night by Schakel and a dominant performance inside.

Arizona State already lacks size inside and missing Bagley really hurt, particularly when the shots weren't falling in the second half.

POLL IMPLICATIONS
San Diego State entered the AP Top 25 for the first time this season and could climb considerably. Even with a win over Grand Canyon on Sunday, Arizona State could end up dropping out of the poll after being manhandled by the Aztecs inside.

QUIET REMY
Arizona State point guard Remy Martin didn't take his first shot until the 5:14 mark of the first half — a made 3-pointer — and wasn't much of a factor. The preseason AP All-American finished with nine points on 2-of-8 shooting with five rebounds and three assists.

"He had a little bit of a blank look on him, wasn't having that fire, that energy I'm used to seeing from Remy," Hurley said. "Overall, he's got to play better in these games, games like this where he's had a history of playing well."

SAN DIEGO - In a normal visit to San Diego State, the BYU Cougars would have to face a trash-talking student section and a sellout crowd of 12,414 at Viejas Arena.

Not this time. Because of COVID-19, Viejas Arena was empty Friday, which allowed the Cougars to focus strictly on the No. 18 Aztecs.

Alex Barcello scored 22 points and Brandon Averette hit a huge 3-pointer with 51 seconds left for BYU, which blew a 17-point lead before beating San Diego State 72-62 despite Matt Mitchell's career-high 35 points.

Playing in the empty arena, without the taunts of The Show, made a huge difference for the Cougars, who are still reviled even though the teams haven't been in the same conference for a decade.

"I've had nightmares of us having zero points in the first 19 minutes game or something," BYU coach Mark Pope said.

Actually, it was almost the opposite, as BYU used its size advantage and effective offense to take a 35-20 halftime lead before hanging on in the second half.

"Granted it's minus the 15,000 and The Show, but to come in here and get a win is a huge deal against a big-time team," Pope added. "I do think there's a very, very legitimate chance they don't lose another game this season until the postseason. They're that good. And so to come in here and get out with a win is just a tribute to our guys and how tough they are."

Mitchell was remarkable in scoring 26 points in the second half. He spurred a 14-0 run with three 3-pointers and then had a steal and dunk that tied it 61.

But BYU (7-2) regained control and handed San Diego State (5-1) its first loss. The Aztecs won their first 26 games last season and were the nation's last undefeated team en route to a 30-2 record. After Matt Haarms made a baseline jumper for a 63-61 BYU lead, Mitchell made one of two free throws. Averette then hit a 3 from straight on to put BYU up 66-62 with 51 seconds left.

"We've been doing this so long that can't you just picture that 3?" Pope said. "We beat them without The Show in here, and I don't know if we'd beat them with the Show in here. It's just different. But can't you just hear the gym? Like they're coming back, people are tearing their clothes off and going crazy and on fire. And then Brandon Averette bangs that 3 and the place goes deathly silent."

"That's how it felt when he shot it. In my mind, going live, that's how it felt for him to step up and make that big shot. There were so many huge plays but that's the fun one to talk about."

Barcello made four free throws in the last 35 seconds, sandwiched around a missed 3 by Mitchell, and Connor Harding made two free throws for the Cougars, who had a 40-26 rebounding edge.

Haarms and Averette scored 10 points apiece.

"Matt's performance was right up there," SDSU coach Brian Dutcher said. "We can take no celebration in that because we lost the game. It was fun to watch Matt put us on his shoulders but we didn't get a win, so it kind of went for naught."

Mitchell said BYU's defense "was fanned out a little bit and gave me space to work, gave me room to get to the basket, get to my spots. Some of my teammates couldn't make shots and I felt like there was a lid on the rim so I got a little more aggressive and shots started falling."

Jordan Schakel had only three points on 1-of-9 shooting after scoring a career-high 25 points in an 80-68 win at Arizona State on Dec. 10.

BYU's biggest lead was 35-18 late in the first half before Mitchell made two free throws to make it 35-20 at halftime. SDSU shot just 25 percent and had eight turnovers in the first 20 minutes. Schakel had no points and missed his only two shots.

BIG PICTURE
BYU: The Cougars used an impressive half-court offense in staying ahead of the Aztecs in the second half. Late in the first half, they got consecutive 3-pointers from Spencer Johnson and Barcello. The Cougars lead the series 49-25.

San Diego State: The Aztecs couldn't handle BYU's size early. They shot only 25% and had eight turnovers in the first half.

SAN DIEGO (AP) - John Tonje scored 11 points, and his four-point play with 12.3 seconds left helped carry Colorado State to a 70-67 win over San Diego State on Saturday.

Tonje buried the three and drew a foul on Jordan Schakel to give the Rams a 68-67 lead. Matt Mitchell missed a jumper for SDSU with three seconds remaining and Kendle Moore made two free throws to finish it, as CSU scored the last 11 points of the game.

The Rams had a 14-0 run earlier in the second half and a 19-0 run in the first half. The Aztecs led 36-10 led when Terrell Gomez made a three-pointer with 8:15 left before halftime. The Rams (6-1, 3-0 Mountain West) proceeded to outscore San Diego State 23-4 to narrow their deficit to 40-33 at halftime.

The comeback is the largest in school and conference history. The Aztecs on 14-of-30 free throws. David Roddy recorded his third consecutive double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds for CSU.

Gomez had 19 points for the Aztecs (6-2, 0-1). The two teams will battle each other once again on Monday, Jan. 4, starting at 6 p.m. PT inside Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
