- The Aztecs are heading to the Bay Area to play in the Raising the B.A.R. Invitational Powered by Cal. SDSU will face Ole Miss, who is receiving votes in the latest national polls. Friday at 3 p.m. and then play either Furman or Cal on Saturday at either 1 or 3 p.m.
- B.A.R. stands for Basketball, Activism and Representation. The Raising the B.A.R. Invitational will be used to elevate the voices, stories and people in the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging space.
- The Aztecs are 4-1, just the second time they've won four of their first five games under Stacie Terry-Hutson (9th year).
- SDSU is coming off home wins against Georgia Southern (65-57) and UAB (55-51).
- In those two wins, Asia Avinger averaged 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 3.0 steals in 37.0 minutes per game.
- SDSU is holding opponents to 32.7 percent shooting, the second best in the conference (39th in the nation). They have held their opponent under 40 percent shooting in all four of their wins.
- The Aztecs had 13 steals against UAB Monday, tying their highest single-game mark from last year.
- Kim Villalobos had a season-high 10 points and seven rebounds against UAB and tied her career-high with three steals.
- Sophia Ramos is one of five active players in the nation with at least 1,100 points, 400 rebounds, 300 assists and 100 steals in her career while playing in less than 100 games. She is the only one of those five who also has a career free throw percentage over 80.
- Junior Isabela Hernandez (Bellingham, Wash.) is second all-time in career three-point percentage (.386).
- Point guard Asia Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year for the second straight

Asia Avinger Named Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year

- Redshirt freshman point guard Asia Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year by select media and the league's coaches.
- Avinger won the award prior to last year as well but then suffered a season-ending injury.
- She is the first player to ever win the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year twice.
- Avinger is the highest ranked recruit under head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson. She was one of the nation's best prep combo guards in 2020 earning a ranking of No. 56 in the nation according to espnW.
- Following her senior year, she was named the Orange County Register's Female Athlete of the Year and to the MaxPreps All-California First Team. She was also named the Trinity League MVP and the Orange County Player of the Year.
- As a senior she averaged 13.8 points, 6.3 rebounds and 4.0 assists and helped lead Rosary High School to the 2020 CIF Southern California DI Regional championship before the tournament was suspended due to COVID-19. Rosary HS won the 2019 State Championship and Avinger took home tournament MVP honors after scoring 24 points in the championship game.
- Avinger's twin brother Noah is on the Aztec football team and became the first freshman cornerback to start a game since 2009. Her older brother Lucky is also on the team.

Sophia Ramos Enters Senior Year with Sights Set on SDSU Record Books

- Barring injury, senior guard Sophia Ramos (San Antonio, Texas) could finish her career in the top five all-time in points and assists and become the only Aztec ever with 1,500 points, 400 assists and 500 rebounds in a career. She is also one of the best free-throw and three-point shooters in program history.
- Ramos is one of five active players in the nation with at least 1,100 points, 400 rebounds, 300 assists and 100 steals in her career while playing in less than 100 games. She is the only one of those five who also has a career free throw percentage over 80.
- With two more made free-throws, Ramos will move into 10th place for most free-throws made in a career, which means she will be top 10 all-time in four categories: 3-point field goal percentage, 3-point field goals made, assists and made free throws.
- Career records aren't kept for free throw percentage, but she has two of the top ten single-season marks for free throw percentage. She was 85 percent from the line in 2019-20 and 83.1 percent last year.
- Ramos became the 13th Aztec to reach 1,000 points in three seasons or less and the 10th to do it in 70 or fewer games.

Opponent Notebook (Ole Miss)

- The Rebels are 4-1 on the year and have won four in a row since their season opening loss to Belmont (62-50).
- This will be their first time playing outside of their home arena.
- They went 15-12 last year and were runner-ups in the WNIT.
- They returned 10 letterwinners and all five starters from that team.
- Ole Miss is receiving votes in the latest poll.
- Shakira Austin averages a double-double with 13.2 points and 10.8 rebounds.
- They are holding opponents to 46.8 points and 30.8 percent shooting from the floor, both are top 20 in the nation.
- Head coach Yolett McPhee-McCuin is in her fourth year at Ole Miss and ninth year as a head coach.

Series Notes

- This is the first ever meeting between the two programs.
- SDSU is 6-11 all-time against teams from the SEC.

Opponent Notebook (Furman)

- Furman is 4-1 on the year with their only loss coming at Georgia (78-41).
- In their four wins, their average margin of victory is 30.8.
- Furman's mascot is the Paladins and they are located in Greenville, South Carolina.
- They were picked to finish fourth in the Southern Conference.
- Tierra Hodges leads the team in scoring and rebounding and is a two-time all-conference selection. She has over 1,100 career points.
- Sydney James was the 2021 SoCon Freshman of the Year. Tate Walters was also on the SoCon All-Freshman team.
- They average 19.8 offensive rebounds per game, fourth in the nation. Overall, they bring in 47.8 rebounds, 14th in the nation.
- Head coach Jackie Carson (12th year) has over 175 career wins at Furman.

Series Notes

- This is just the second ever meeting between the two programs.
- The Aztecs lost to Furman on the road 60-43 Nov. 21, 2014.
- SDSU is 1-2 all-time against teams from the Southern Conference. Aside from Furman, they beat UNC Greensboro and lost to Chattanooga.

Opponent Notebook (California)

- The Golden Bears are 4-0 on the year.
- They have wins over two teams SDSU will face later this season: Utah State (81-49) and UC San Diego (64-54).
- They went just 1-16 last year and 1-12 in the Pac-12.
- They are holding opponents to 53.8 points on 31.7% shooting.
- Freshman Jayda Curry is averaging 22.0 points per game.
- Evelien Lutje Schipholt is averaging a double-double with 13.8 points and 10.3 rebounds per game.

Aztecs Partner with Jordan Brand

The San Diego State women's basketball program is the newest member of the Jordan Brand family.

Beginning this season, the team will wear the latest Jordan Brand footwear and all on-court apparel including uniforms, practice gear and travel attire will be Jumpman branded.

SDSU is the ninth women's basketball program in the Jordan lineup, joining Florida, Georgetown, Houston, Marquette, Michigan, North Carolina, Oklahoma and UCLA. The Aztecs are one of just two programs on the West Coast to be partnered with the brand.

The apparel will feature San Diego State's official color scheme of red and black elements and will sync with Jordan Brand's iconic colors.

The San Diego State men's team has been partnered with the Jordan Brand since the beginning of the 2018-19 season.

"We are excited to be a part of this special brand," Head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson said. "We recognize that we are in elite company being one of the few women's programs to don the Jumpman logo. Jordan is one of the most popular shoes in the basketball community and this will help us market the San Diego State program.

Aztecs Add Jason Glover and Kellie Lewis to Coaching Staff

Head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson added two new assistant coaches in the offseason in Jason Glover and Kellie Lewis.

Glover was most recently the Associate Head Coach at USC (2017-21) and brings over 30 years of coaching experience to SDSU including 15+ years at the DI level. Glover, who has spent time in the NBA, WNBA, NBA G-League and junior college, is known for being an X's and O's tactician and has an impressive track record in player development.

Glover, who attended SDSU for two years, has spent the past eight seasons as an associate head coach at the DI level. He was at USC for the last four years coaching under Mark Trakh, who he also coached with at New Mexico State for the 2016-17 season. That year the Aggies went 24-7 and 14-0 in the WAC and reached the NCAA Tournament.

Lewis was most recently at Colorado State (2018-21) and comes to SDSU with 17 years of DI experience, including five as the head coach at Florida Atlantic.

Lewis also spent a combined nine years at Nebraska (2007-12) and Washington (2003-17) as an assistant while also coordinating each program's recruiting efforts. In her career, Lewis has coached in the Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 (then Pac-10), Conference USA and Sun Belt.

During Lewis' last two years at Colorado St., the Rams were second in the nation for fewest turnovers per game. Last season, CSU went 15-6 overall and 11-5 in the Mountain West and ranked in top ten nationally in four categories (turnovers/game, assist-to-turnover ratio, three-point % and defensive rebounds/game).

Lewis coached a high-scoring offense throughout her tenure as head coach of Florida Atlantic, including the program's No. 2 all-time single-season scoring offense both by total points (2,331) and average (77.7) in 2013-14. Her teams made 195 three-pointers or more in four of her five seasons and broke the school record for threes in a season twice. The Owls sunk 264 triples in 2013-14, then 294 in 2015-16, a Conference USA record.

In addition to those single-season three-point field goal records, FAU also set the program record for highest team three-point field goal percentage (.350) in 2015-16. Among other records set under Lewis' guidance were C-USA's single-game three-point field goals record (20) and steals (33).

Terry-Hutson also announced the hiring of Mel Boscarino as the Director of Player Development She joins the women's basketball team after working for SDSU's event management department since 2019.

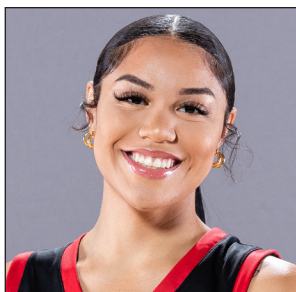
