- The Aztec kicks off their 2021-22 season Tuesday when they host Cal State Los Angeles inside Viejas Arena at 11 a.m.
- SDSU beat Biola 79-52 in an exhibition game last Monday. They scored 56 points in the 1st half and 13 different players scored.

- Sophia Ramos (14), Mallory Adams (13) and Mercedes Staples all scored in double-figures. Ramos also led the team in rebounds (7), assists (7) and steals (5).
- The Aztecs went 7-17 in 2020-21 with a 5-12 mark in conference.
- San Diego State received one first place vote in the preseason Mountain West poll and was predicted to finish in eighth place.
- Point guard Asia Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year for the second straight season. She missed all of last season with an injury.
- Senior quard Sophia Ramos (San Antonio, Texas) enters the year with career totals of 1,092 points, 405 rebounds, 308 assists and an 82.6 free throw percentage. She could finish her career in the top 5 all-time in points and assists and become the only Aztec ever with 1,500 points, 400 assists and 500 rebounds in a career.
- Last year Ramos became the 13th Aztec to score 1,000 career points in three years or less and just the 10th Aztec to reach the mark in 70 games or fewer. In her 76 career games, she has scored in double-digits 61 times & scored 20 or more points 15 times.
- In addition to Ramos, the Aztecs return five other players who received at least 10 starts last season (Mercedes Staples, Alex Crain, Kamaria Gipson, Isabela Hernandez and Kiara Edwards).
- SDSU also returns Kim Villalobos who was a Mountain West All-Freshman Team selection a year ago. She played with the El Salvador National Team over the summer.
- In total, SDSU returns four starters and nine letterwinners from a year ago.
- The Aztecs have two newcomers: Khylee-Jade Pepe and Meghan Fiso. Pepe (Bishop Montgomery HS, Long Beach, Calif.) is a consensus four-star recruit and was ranked No. 83 in the country by espnW. Fiso played her freshman season at Michigan and was the 2020 AP Class 3A Player of the Year in Washington and was a top 40 recruit according to Prospects Nation.
- Junior Isabela Hernandez (Bellingham, Wash.) enters season second all-time in career three-point percentage. She is 45-for-116, good for 38.8 percent, just barely behind Charley Murray's (1998-99) 39.6 percent.
- The Aztecs officially joined the Jordan Brand family this season, becoming just the ninth women's basketball program in the Jordan lineup.

Asia Avinger Named Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year

- Redshirt freshman point guard Asia Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year by select media and the league's coaches.
- Avinger won the award prior to last year as well but then suffered a season-ending injury.
- She is the first player to ever win the Mountain West Preseason Freshman of the Year twice.
- Avinger is the highest ranked recruit under head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson. She was one of the nation's best prep combo guards in 2020 earning a ranking of No. 56 in the nation according to espnW.
- Following her senior year, she was named the Orange County Register's Female Athlete of the Year and to the MaxPreps All-California First Team.
 She was also named the Trinity League MVP and the Orange County Player of the Year.
- As a senior she averaged 13.8 points, 6.3 rebounds and 4.0 assists and helped lead Rosary High School to the 2020 CIF Southern California DI Regional championship before the tournament was suspended due to COVID-19. Rosary HS won the 2019 State Championship and Avinger took home tournament MVP honors after scoring 24 points in the championship game.
- Avinger's twin brother Noah is on the Aztec football team and became the first freshman cornerback to start a game since 2009. Her older brother Lucky is also on the team.

Sophia Ramos Enters Senior Year with Sights Set on SDSU Record Books

- Senior guard Sophia Ramos (San Antonio, Texas) enters the year with career totals of 1,092 points, 405 rebounds, 308 assists and an 82.6 free throw percentage.
- Ramos became the 13th Aztec to reach 1,000 points in three seasons or less and the 10th to do it in 70 or fewer games.
- Barring injury, she could finish her career in the top five all-time in points and assists and become the only Aztec ever with 1,500 points, 400 assists and 500 rebounds in a career.
- Career records aren't kept for free throw percentage, but she has two
 of the top ten single-season marks for free throw percentage. She was 85
 percent from the line in 2019-20 and 83.1 last year.
- Ramos is 10th all-time in career assists with 308 and career made three-pointers (96) and just outside the top ten in three-point field goal percentage (.342) and made free throws (232).

Aztecs Partner with Jordan Brand

The San Diego State women's basketball program is the newest member of the Jordan

Beginning this season, the team will wear the latest Jordan Brand footwear and all oncourt apparel including uniforms, practice gear and travel attire will be Jumpman branded. SDSU is the ninth women's basketball program in the Jordan lineup, joining Florida, Georgetown, Houston, Marquette, Michigan, North Carolina, Oklahoma and UCLA. The Aztecs are one of just two programs on the West Coast to be partnered with the brand.

The apparel will feature San Diego State's official color scheme of red and black elements and will sync with Jordan Brand's iconic colors.

The San Diego State men's team has been partnered with the Jordan Brand since the beginning of the 2018-19 season.

"We are excited to be a part of this special brand," Head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson said. "We recognize that we are in elite company being one of the few women's programs to don the Jumpman logo. Jordan is one of the most popular shoes in the basketball community and this will help us market the San Diego State program.

Opponent Notebook (Cal State Los Angeles)

- The Golden Eagles didn't play in 2020-21 due to COVID-19 and went 12-16 overall and 10-12 in the CCAA in the 2019-20 season.
- They lost at UNLV 106-45 on Wednesday and at Pepperdine ??-?? on Friday
- They were picked to finish fourth in the preseason CCAA Coaches poll.
- CSULA returns just three players from the 2019-20 team and will have 10 newcomers on the squad this season.
- Their three starters are Nicole Flennaugh, the 2019-20 CCAA Freshman of the year, Alyssa Fisher, a three-year starter and Yesnia Smith.
- Head coach Torino Johnson is in his third year and second season at CSULA. The Golden Eagles set program records for three-pointers made and three-point percentage in 2019-20.

Series Notes

- San Diego State leads the all-time series 3-2.
- All five regular season meetings happened between 1976 and 1979.
- They last met in an exhibition game in 2017, a 71-50 Aztec win.

Aztecs Add Jason Glover and Kellie Lewis to Coaching Staff

Head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson added two new assistant coaches in the offseason in Jason Glover and Kellie Lewis.

Glover was most recently the Associate Head Coach at USC (2017-21) and brings over 30 years of coaching experience to SDSU including 15+ years at the DI level. Glover, who has spent time in the NBA, WNBA, NBA G-League and junior college, is known for being an X's and O's tactician and has an impressive track record in player development.

Glover, who attended SDSU for two years, has spent the past eight seasons as an associate head coach at the DI level. He was at USC for the last four years coaching under Mark Trakh, who he also coached with at New Mexico State for the 2016-17 season. That year the Aggies went 24-7 and 14-0 in the WAC and reached the NCAA Tournament. Prior to that, Glover spent three years at Utah Valley, where the Wolverines doubled their win count from Glover's first year to his third.

Glover worked in professional basketball from 2008-13. In 2012-13, he was the associate head coach of the Reno Bighorns of the NBA's G-League in the winter and the associate head coach of the WNBA's Tulsa Shock in the summer. He finished off the 2013 season as the Bighorns' interim head coach.

Laimbeer and helped develop young stars such as Michael Beasley and Kevin Love.

Glover moved into the professional coaching ranks in 2008 when he spent two seasons with the Bighorns, serving as the team's director of operations and as an assistant coach.

Glover began his DI coaching career on the men's side. He started off at Dixie State in 1990, spending three years with the Rebels. There he coached under Dave Rose, who would later go on to lead BYU to 11-straight 20-win seasons. Dixie State was ranked in the top-10 of the NJCAA twice during his tenure.

From Dixie State, he went to Nevada where he coached the Wolfpack's men's squad for seven seasons (1993-2000) as Pat Foster's top assistant.

Glover was a pitcher on the Aztec baseball team from 1981-83 before transferring to Grand Canyon. Playing for Aztec hall of fame coach Jim Dietz, he had a career record of 11-0 and was part of two nationally ranked teams that made the postseason.

Kellie Lewis

Lewis was most recently at Colorado State (2018-21) and comes to SDSU with 17 years of DI experience, including five as the head coach at Florida Atlantic.

Lewis also spent a combined nine years at Nebraska (2007-12) and Washington (2003-17) as an assistant while also coordinating each program's recruiting efforts. In her career, Lewis has coached in the Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 (then Pac-10), Conference USA and Sun Belt.

During Lewis' last two years at Colorado St., the Rams were second in the nation for fewest turnovers per game. Last season, CSU went 15-6 overall and 11-5 in the Mountain West and ranked in top ten nationally in four categories (turnovers/game, assist-to-turnover ratio, three-point % and defensive rebounds/game).

Lewis coached a high-scoring offense throughout her tenure as head coach of Florida Atlantic, including the program's No. 2 all-time single-season scoring offense both by total points (2,331) and average (77.7) in 2013-14. Her teams made 195 three-pointers or more in four of her five seasons and broke the school record for threes in a season twice. The Owls sunk 264 triples in 2013-14, then 294 in 2015-16, a Conference USA record.

In addition to those single-season three-point field goal records, FAU also set the program record for highest team three-point field goal percentage (.350) in 2015-16. Among other records set under Lewis' guidance were C-USA's single-game three-point field goals record (20) and steals (33).

Prior to her head coaching position at Florida Atlantic, Lewis was an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator at Nebraska for five seasons. The Huskers reached the postseason three times during her tenure and won its first and only Big 12 title with a 32-2 (16-0 conference) record in 2009-10. Among her recruiting accomplishments at Nebraska was signing a top-25 class in 2011, the highest during then-head coach Connie Yori's tenure, as well as the signing of Lindsey Moore, the 2009 Gatorade High School Player of the Year in Washington.

Lewis was an assistant at Washington for four years (2003-07), working under June Daugherty, who she played for at Boise State. While at UW, she helped the Huskies reach consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in 2006 and 2007. She also coordinated recruiting efforts at UW, and in 2006, the Huskies signed a six-player class that was rated eighth in the nation by Blue Star Basketball.

Terry-Hutson also announced the hiring of Mel Boscarino as the Director of Player Development She joins the women's basketball team after working for SDSU's event management department since 2019. Her responsibilities include filming and editing of games and practices, creating player and scout edits and highlights, as well as supervising all student staff and assisting with the program's social media platforms.

Prior to SDSU, Boscarino spent time in the events departments at Wake Forest (2018-19) and Stanford (2017-18).
