- San Diego State (5-12, 3-8) hosts UNLV (10-8, 8-5) inside Viejas Arena on Monday (1 p.m.) and Tuesday (3 p.m.). Both games will be streamed on the Mountain West Network.
- The Aztecs are in the midst of six consecutive games at home. After the UNLV series, SDSU will host Fresno State this weekend (Feb. 20 & 21) before closing out the regular season at Boise State (Feb. 26 and 28).
- The Aztecs are on a five-game losing streak and most recently fell to New Mexico twice in their last series.
- The Aztecs are second in the conference in in scoring defense (64.8) and three-point field goal defense (.293) and fourth in field goal percentage defense (.386).
- SDSU is committing just 14.5 personal fouls per game, the 28th-fewest in the nation.

First Year at UNLV

- Mallory Adams scored a season-high 16 points last vs. New Mexico (Feb. 5) and is averaging 9.8 points over the last four games.
- Sophomore Isabela Hernandez has a career three-point percentage of 40.3 in 99 attempts. After her next attempt (make or miss) she will have the best career three-point percentage in program history (minimum 100 attempts).
- Hernandez had a career-high nine rebounds in the Aztecs' last game vs. New Mexico.
- Kiara Edwards, who started the last two games, had a career-high nine points on 4-for-5 shooting in SDSU's first game against New Mexico (Feb. 3).
- The Aztecs have had 11 different players score at least 10 points in a game and have had six different players lead the team (or tie for the lead) in scoring.
- The Aztecs had a team GPA of 3.19 in the 2020 fall semester and had six players record a 3.40 GPA or better.
- The Mountain West posted a .600 win percentage (27-18) in non-conference play in 2020-21. If the season were to end today, this would be the conference's best win percentage in non-conference action since the 2009-10 season (.622).
- SDSU announced they will be the newest member of the Jordan Brand family beginning at the start of the 2021-22 season. SDSU is just the ninth women's basketball program in the Jordan lineup.

Last Time Out (L, 48-65 vs. New Mexico, 2-5-21)

The Aztec women's basketball team (5-12, 3-8) lost to New Mexico (9-2, 6-2) 65-48 on February 5 inside Viejas Arena.

It was the second game in a row where the Aztecs held a lead at halftime over the Lobos only to see New Mexico get hot in the third quarter and pull away for the win.

Mallory Adams had her best game of the season, finishing with 16 points and going 7-for-8 from the line in a season-high 27 minutes. Isabela Hernandez had six points and hauled in a career-high nine rebounds. Additionally, Mercedes Staples had nine points and five rebounds while Kim Villalobos had eight points and three assists.

New Mexico scored the game's first six points followed by 11 straight by the Aztecs. SDSU struggled with turnovers early on but shot at a high percentage and led by as much as 11 points.

SDSU cooled off in the second quarter but their defense continued to hold New Mexico at bay. The Aztecs held a four-point led at the half while forcing 11 Lobo turnovers and holding them to 24 percent shooting.

New Mexico shot 64 percent from the field in the second half, including 56 percent from three. A 14-2 run across the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth put the game out of reach.

The Lobos were 7-for-11 from the field in both the third and fourth

New Mexico had four players score between 10-13 points and were led by Ahlise Hurst's 13.

The Aztecs had 11 assists on their 16 field goals and forced 17 New Mexico turnovers.

Aztecs Partners with Jordan Brand

The San Diego State women's basketball program announced they will be the newest member of the Jordan Brand family.

Beginning at the start of the 2021-22 season, the team will wear the latest Jordan Brand performance footwear and all on-court apparel including uniforms, practice gear and travel attire will be Jumpman branded. SDSU is the ninth women's basketball program in the Jordan lineup, joining Florida, Georgetown, Houston, Marquette, Michigan, North Carolina, Oklahoma and UCLA. The Aztecs are one of just two programs on the West Coast to be partnered with the iconic brand.

The apparel will feature San Diego State's official color scheme of red and black elements and will sync with Jordan Brand's iconic colors.

The San Diego State men's team has been partnered with the Jordan Brand since the beginning of the 2018-19 season.

"We are excited to be a part of this special brand," Head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson said. "We recognize that we are in elite company being one of the few women's programs to don the Jumpman logo. Jordan is one of the most popular shoes in the basketball community and this will help us market the San Diego State program.

Asia Avinger & Jayden Perez Out for the Year

Guards Asia Avinger and Jayden Perez will miss the entire 2020-21 season due to leg injuries.

Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.), the preseason Mountain West Freshman of the Year, was expected to play a large role in the Aztecs' backcourt this season. One of the nation's best 2020 combo guards according to espnW, Avinger was ranked No. 56 in the nation according to ESPN, the highest ranked recruit under Terry-Hutson.

Perez, a junior from Las Cruces, N.M., has appeared in 27 games off the bench the last two seasons and was set to assume a larger role in the 2020-21 season.

Opponent Notebook (UNLV)

- UNLV is 11-8 on the year and 9-5 in the Mountain West.
- They were recently split their home series with Boise State, losing the first 85-59 but then rebounding to win the finale 74-62.
- They have won six of their last eight conference games.
- UNLV is 5-0 on the road this year and 4-0 in conference play.
- They return just one starter (Bailey Thomas) from last year's team that went 13-17 and tied for fifth (9-9) in the MW (with the Aztecs).

- UNLV has the second best rebound margin (+3.2) in the league.
- The Lady Rebels struggled with turnovers, committing 15.3 per game and have a turnover margin of -0.79
- Head coach Lindy La Rocque is in her first season as head coach of UNLV. A Las Vegas native, she spent the last three years as an assistant at Stanford, her alma mater.

- The Lady Rebels have won six of the last seven meetings.
- The home team won in both of the games last season with both games being decided by single-digits.

Aztecs Sign Two Talented Wings to NLIs

Aztec women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson announced the signings of four-star guards Cailee Crawford (Albuquerque, N.M.) and Khylee Pepe (Long Beach, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent.

"We are thrilled to add Cailee and Khylee to our program," Terry-Hutson explained. "They are both talented perimeter players who are great passers and can play multiple positions. They will fit in well with our team of versatile players."

Pepe (5'11") is a consensus four-star recruit and is ranked No. 83 in the espnW HoopGurlz top 100 rankings. She is a three-time all-state selection in California and was recruited by numerous power five programs. After playing her freshman season at Mater Dei (Santa Ana, Calif.), she transferred to Bishop Montgomery High School (Torrance, Calif.) where she has helped them win two league championships.

At Bishop Montgomery, she was named to the All-CIF and CalHiSports All-state team the last two seasons and took home league MVP honors last season. This past season, she averaged 17 points, eight rebounds, four assists and three steals and had 10 games with 20 or more points. She averaged 25.4 points over her final five games and set a new school record with 41 points in a game.

As a freshman at Mater Dei High School, she averaged 11.7 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.6 assists and was a Second Team All-County selection. She helped the Monarchs win the Trinity League and finish fourth in the CIF-SS Open Division.

A 6'0" wing, Crawford is a four-star recruit according to Prospects Nation and has appeared in espnW's HoopGurlz top 100 rankings for 2021 recruits. Last season, she averaged 19.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 3.5 assists while also contributing a steal and a block per game. She shot an efficient 58 percent from the field inside the arc. She averaged 22.2 points and 6.2 rebounds as a sophomore, helping Highland High School advance to the 4A quarterfinals.

Crawford is a two-time 4A All-State selection in New Mexico and was the 4A State Co-Player of the year last season. She has also been named to the All-Metro First Team three times while helping Highland High School win over 20 games each season and claiming two district titles.


