- San Diego State (5-14, 3-10) hosts Fresno State (13-6, 11-3) inside Viejas Arena on Saturday and Sunday. Both games will tip at 1 p.m. and be streamed on the Mountain West Network.
- The Aztecs are in the midst of six consecutive games at home. After the Fresno State series, SDSU will close out the regular season at Boise State (Feb. 26 and 28) and then head to Las Vegas for the Mountain West Tournament (March 7-10).
- SDSU was swept by UNLY earlier in the week. In the second game, a 73-71 loss, the Aztecs had a season-high 23 assists while committing just four turnovers, also a season best.
- All 10 players who played Tuesday scored and seven Aztec scored at least six points.
- Sophia Ramos returned to the court vs. UNLV after missing 10 weeks with a hand injury. In her first game back, she scored 12 points to reach 1,000 in her career and in the next game she dished out a career-high 10 assists becoming the first Aztec to do so in over three years (Geena Gomez).
- Ramos became the 22nd Aztec to score 1,000 career points, the 13th to accomplish it in three years or less and just the 10th Aztec to reach the mark in 70 or fewer games.
- Prior to Sunday's game, Téa Adams will be honored for Senior Day. The 5'9" guard from Kirkland, Wash. enters the Fresno State series with career totals of 897 points, 237 assists and 117 steals. This season she is averaging career-highs in points (11.1), assists (3.5), steals (1.3) and field goal (.461) and three-point percentage (.394).
- Sophomore Isabela Hernandez is now SDSU's all-time leader in career three-point percentage after reaching 100 career attempts, the minimum required. She is 42-for-105, an even 40 percent from deep.
- The Aztecs have had 11 different players score at least 10 points in a game and have had six different players lead the team (or tie for the lead) in scoring.
- The Aztecs had a team GPA of 3.19 in the 2020 fall semester and had six players record a 3.40 GPA or better.

Last Time Out (L, 71-73 vs. UNLV, Feb. 16, 2021)

The Aztec women's basketball team (5-14, 3-10) fell to UNLV (13-8, 11-5) after the Rebels' Nia Johnson scored a driving lay-in with three seconds left.

SDSU trailed by six with 1:53 left but rallied to tie the game with 14 seconds left after Mercedes Staples hit a jumper.

The Aztecs had one of their most efficient offensive performances of the season, dishing out a season-high 23 assists while turning the ball over just four times, also a season-best.

All 10 Aztecs that played scored and seven players had at least six points. Mercedes Staples led the team with 16 points and hit two big shots in the final 30 seconds. Sophia Ramos, playing in her second game after missing 10 weeks with a hand injury, had a career-high 10 assists and turned the ball over just once in 37 minutes. Freshman Kamaria Gipson tied a career-high with 10 rebounds and Téa Adams chipped in 12 points.

UNLV scored the first bucket of the game, but the Aztecs would then go on a 13-2 run and held the Rebels to 3-for-15 shooting in the opening quarter. The Aztecs trailed by two at the half but caught fire in the third, shooting 12-for-16 from the floor and scoring 28 points, their most in any quarter this season, and took an eight-point lead entering the fourth.

UNLY responded with a 14-2 run to start the fourth quarter to pull within one point. The Rebel lead would grow to six points, but UNLY went 1-for-11 down the stretch to allow the Aztecs to tie the game behind Mercedes Staples' clutch shots.

UNLY Johnson's made a tough running lay-in through traffic on the right side for the game-winner. Sophia Ramos' half court heave at the buzzer was off the mark.

Rebounding (52-31 UNLV) and fouls were the difference in the game with SDSU committing 22 which led to 23 made free throws for UNLV. The Aztecs were fouled just 10 times and made only six free throws.

The Rebels were led by Desi-Ray Young's 20 points and 12 rebounds.

The Aztecs had a season-high 23 assists on 29 made field goals. SDSU had just four turnovers, a season best.

THE NOTE

Sophia Ramos had a career-high 10 assists, becoming the first Aztecs to have 10 or more assists since Geena Gomez did it against New Mexico on January 20, 2018.

Aztecs Partners with Jordan Brand

Opponent Notebook (Fresno State)

- Fresno State is 13-6 on the year and 11-3 in the Mountain West.
- They were the preseason favorites to win the Mountain West and were the regular season champions last year.
- They have won five games in a row and nine of their last 10.
- The Bulldogs are 3-2 on the road this year.
- Sophomore Haley Cavinder leads the Mountain West in scoring (19.0 ppg) and her twin sister Hanna is second (17.9 ppg).
- Senior Maddi Utti averages 13.1 points per game and leads the conference in field goal percentage (.535).
- The Bulldogs score 80.2 points per game while shooting 46.3 percent from the field, both rank in the top 25 in the nation.
- Fresno State is also top three in the conference in free throws made and attempted, three-pointers made and attempted, three-point percentage (.360), assists per game (14.7), steals per game (8.2) and turnovers per game (12.4).
- They commit just 12.7 fouls per game, the fewest in the entire nation.
- The Bulldogs allow 71.4 points per game, 10th in the conference and allow their opponents to shoot 40.9 percent from the field.
- Head coach Jamie White is in her seventh season at Fresno State. She has led the Bulldogs
 to four postseasons and three 20-win seasons. She has the highest winning percentage
 among active coaches in the Mountain West.

- The Bulldogs have won seven of the last eight meetings and 11 of the last 13.
- Four of the last five meetings were decided by six points or less.
- The Aztecs are 13-10 all-time against Fresno State at home.

Asia Avinger & Jayden Perez Out for the Year

Guards Asia Avinger and Jayden Perez will miss the entire 2020-21 season due to leg injuries.

Avinger (Cerritos, Calif.), the preseason Mountain West Freshman of the Year, was expected to play a large role in the Aztecs' backcourt this season. One of the nation's best 2020 combo guards according to espnW, Avinger was ranked No. 56 in the nation according to ESPN, the highest ranked recruit under Terry-Hutson.

Perez, a junior from Las Cruces, N.M., has appeared in 27 games off the bench the last two seasons and was set to assume a larger role in the 2020-21 season.

Aztecs Sign Two Talented Wings to NLIs

Aztec women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry-Hutson announced the signings of four-star guards Cailee Crawford (Albuquerque, N.M.) and Khylee Pepe (Long Beach, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent.

"We are thrilled to add Cailee and Khylee to our program," Terry-Hutson explained. "They are both talented perimeter players who are great passers and can play multiple positions. They will fit in well with our team of versatile players."

Pepe (5'11") is a consensus four-star recruit and is ranked No. 83 in the espnW HoopGurlz top 100 rankings. She is a three-time all-state selection in California and was recruited by numerous power five programs. After playing her freshman season at Mater Dei (Santa Ana, Calif.), she transferred to Bishop Montgomery High School (Torrance, Calif.) where she has helped them win two league championships.

At Bishop Montgomery, she was named to the All-CIF and CalHiSports All-state team the last two seasons and took home league MVP honors last season. This past season, she averaged 17 points, eight rebounds, four assists and three steals and had 10 games with 20 or more points. She averaged 25.4 points over her final five games and set a new school record with 41 points in a game.

As a freshman at Mater Dei High School, she averaged 11.7 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.6 assists and was a Second Team All-County selection. She helped the Monarchs win the Trinity League and finish fourth in the CIF-SS Open Division.

A 6'0" wing, Crawford is a four-star recruit according to Prospects Nation and has appeared in espnW's HoopGurlz top 100 rankings for 2021 recruits. Last season, she averaged 19.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 3.5 assists while also contributing a steal and a block per game. She shot an efficient 58 percent from the field inside the arc. She averaged 22.2 points and 6.2 rebounds as a sophomore, helping Highland High School advance to the 4A quarterfinals.

Crawford is a two-time 4A All-State selection in New Mexico and was the 4A State Co-Player of the year last season. She has also been named to the All-Metro First Team three times while helping Highland High School win over 20 games each season and claiming two district titles.


