STORYLINES (SDSU info current; national rankings through games of Fri., March 12)

- San Diego State looks to add to its Mountain West Conference record 13 league titles (includes 2021 outright regular-season title), including a conference-high five tournament championships when the top-seeded Aztecs face 2nd-seeded Utah State in the championship game for the third consecutive season.
- San Diego State and Utah State are meeting for the 22nd time, with the Aztecs owning a 13-8 advantage. The Aggies have won the last three meetings, including last season's championship game (59-56 on March 6, 2020). SDSU has won the most recent meeting with every other league opponent.
- The teams have split the four Mountain West tournament encounters, with SDSU winning in the 2014 quarterfinals (73-39) and the 2016 quarterfinals (71-65) and the Aggies prevailing in the 2019 title game (64-57) and the 2020 title game (59-56).
- This marks the fourth consecutive season the Aztecs are in the title game, the seventh time in the last eight seasons and a league-high 13th time SDSU has played in the event (UNLV has the second most championship game appearances with eight).
- San Diego State ran the nation's third-longest active win streak to 13 games yesterday with a 77-70 victory over 5th-seeded Nevada. The Aztecs never trailed in the second half and enjoyed at least a 6-point advantage the last 17:51 of the contest. SDSU limited the Wolf Pack to just 35.8 percent shooting from the field and committed just nine turnovers in picking up its sixth consecutive win in the series.
- Senior forward and Mountain West Conference Player of the Year **Matt Mitchell** led the way for the Aztecs with 24 points and eight rebounds. The Aztecs improve to 13-1 in Mitchell's career when he gets to 20 points. In addition, the senior attempted 35 free throws in the three games against the Wolf Pack this season and he ends his career with 149 career points against the team from Reno.
- Senior guard **Jordan Schakel** scored 15 points and narrowly missed his first career double-double with nine rebounds. One night after passing Kawhi Leonard in career scoring at SDSU, Schakel became the 35th player to reach the 1,000-point club in school history. This was his 22nd career game with at least 15 points and the Aztecs are 21-1 in those contests.
- The one-two punch of Mitchell and Schakel combined to score 39 points and added 17 rebounds. The duo was 12-of-24 from the field and scored SDSU's first 20 points of the second half.
- San Diego State is the top-seed in the Mountain West tournament for the sixth time in school history (2006, 2012, 2014, 2016, 2020 and 2021). The Aztecs own a 13-4 record as the top seed with one title (2006). SDSU has advanced to the championship game each of the six times it entered the event as a one seed.
- San Diego State clinched its eighth regular-season MW title this season (2006, 2011*, 2012*, 2014, 2015*, 2016, 2020 and 2021). * - indicates shared title
- San Diego State has won this event a record five times (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011 and 2018).
- San Diego State has won the event as the one seed, two seed, four seed and five seed (twice).
- Amazingly, San Diego State has played for the tournament title in seven of the last eight years and in 11 of the last 13 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021).
- The Aztecs are 5-7 in the Mountain West title game. Only twice has SDSU won both the Mountain West regular-season title and conference

- SDSU has won 51 of last 54 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 52 of 53 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 11th nationally in winning percentage (.754) since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 13.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 12 appearances in its conference championship game are the second most in Division I.
- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

- Overall, San Diego State is 36-16 in the Mountain West tournament, a winning percentage of 69.2 percent. The Aztecs' 36 tournament wins are the most by any team - current or former - in league history. This is particularly impressive because 10 of SDSU's 52 tournament games have been played on the road (8-2 at UNLV), while UNLV has played 38 of its 45 tournament games at home.
- San Diego State owns 37 victories in Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign. That is the most victories by any school in any venue in which it has not played a home game in the past 13 seasons. What is particularly impressive is that 16 of those 37 victories came as the road team playing at UNLV. Villanova is second with 30 victories at Madison Square Garden.

- San Diego State is ranked No. 19 in the AP Poll this week, marking the fourth consecutive week that the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Top 25 Poll and the sixth week this season. This is the 87th week that SDSU has appeared in the Top 25, all have occurred since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. That is the 19th-highest total during that range, just one week shy of the Syracuse total (88).

SDSU CLIFF NOTES (through games of Fri., Mar. 12)

- San Diego State has won consecutive outright conference regular-season titles for the first time in the school's Division I era.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season, San Diego State is 52-6 (89.7 percent). That is second nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (57-2, 96.6 percent) and just ahead of Baylor (48-6, 88.9 percent).
- San Diego State rankings in the metrics as of Saturday: 21st in the NET, 8th in RPI, 10th in KPI, 12th in Torvik, 23rd in BPI, 24th in KenPom, and 24th in Sagarin.
- San Diego State is one of only three teams in the nation that has a scoring margin of at least +13.6, a rebound margin of +4.3 and a turnover margin +3.7 this season. The others are Baylor and Houston.
- At 22-4, San Diego State has its second best record after 26 games in the last seven seasons (last season the Aztecs opened 26-0). Overall, it is the fourth best 26-game start in the Division I era, trailing 2019-20 (26-0), 2013-14 (23-3) and 2010-11 (25-1).
- San Diego State is 16-0 this season and has won 18 straight games when owning an edge in rebounding.
- The Aztecs are 13-1 this season and 32-1 the last 33 times it has attempted more free throws than its opponent.
- In the Brian Dutcher era, San Diego State is 60-3 when holding its opponent to 62 points or less. The Aztecs have done that 16 times (15-1) in 26 games this season.

ELITE LEADER

In his first three-plus seasons, head coach Brian Dutcher has led the Aztecs to 95 wins, the most by any SDSU coach in the now 100th season of basketball on The Mesa.

Since the start of the 2017-18 season only two first-time head coaches who were hired that year, have amassed at least 89 victories (through games of March 12):

1. Brian Dutcher, San Diego State (95)
2. Bob Richey, Furman (89)

- Nationally, San Diego State ranks among the leaders this season in the following categories: 7th in scoring defense (60.7), 8th in field goal percentage defense (38.7), 11th in scoring margin (+13.6), 19th in turnover margin (+3.7), 18th in three-point field goal percentage (38.1) and 34th in steals per game (8.2).
- San Diego State leads the Mountain West Conference in the following team categories: scoring margin (+13.6), scoring defense (60.7), three-point field goal percentage (38.1), steals per game (8.2), turnover margin (+3.7), turnovers forced (15.2) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25).
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** became the fifth Aztec player to earn Mountain West Conference Player of the Year honors, joining Brandon Heath (2006), Jamaal Franklin (2012), Xavier Thames (2014) and Malachi Flynn (2020). He is one of only three players in school history to compile 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in his career (also: Trey Kell and Winston Shepard).
- Senior guard **Jordan Schakel** is 3rd among Division I players this season in three-point field goal percentage at 47.2 percent. Schakel ranks 4th among all Division I players averaging 1.217 point per possession this season (minimum 300 possessions).

SERIES HISTORY VS. UTAH STATE

This is the 22nd meeting between the schools, with San Diego State winning 13 of the last 18 and overall holding a 13-8 advantage in the all-time series.

- In Logan, SDSU is 4-4, having lost three of the last four meetings on the Aggies home floor and San Diego State owns a comfortable 7-1 lead in games played in Viejas Arena and have won the last seven in a row. On a neutral floor, SDSU trails Utah State 3-2, having lost the last two Mountain West Championship games to the Aggies (2019 & 2020).
- SDSU has won the regular-season series (home-and-home) in four of the five seasons in which both teams were members of the MW.
- Last season San Diego State was the only visiting team in the nation to win in Logan, an 80-68 victory on Feb. 1. In San Diego, the Aztecs overcame a 10-point second-half deficit to win, 80-68, on Feb. 1.
- This season the Aztecs lost twice in Logan, but were without 2020-21 Mountain West Player of the Year Matt Mitchell, who was injured in the second half of the first game of the series and did not play in the second game. The Aztecs fell by final scores of 45-57 & 59-64, the two lowest scoring games of the year for San Diego State.
- The series began in 1962 with Utah State winning the first meeting 101-57, and went on to win the next two matchups. Beginning with the fourth game of the series, in 2014, the Aztecs won 11 straight. During that 11-game span, San Diego State had an average winning margin of 13.2 points. The streak included a 73-39 victory in the quarterfinal game of the 2014 Mountain West Tournament. The 34-point win is SDSU's largest margin of victory in 52 MW tourney games. The Aggies won the last three meetings a 59-56 victory in the 2020 Mountain West Tournament championship game.
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** has a 4-4 career record and has averaged 11.6 points and 3.8 rebounds and junior forward **Nathan Mensah** is 1-4 and averaging 7.2 points and 7.8 rebounds against the Aggies.

LOGAN, Utah – The San Diego State men's basketball team took a 10-point lead into the second half at Utah State on Saturday afternoon, but saw Aggies go to the free throw line 20 times in the second half, knock down 17 attempts, were able to erase the Aztecs lead, and earn a 64-59 win in the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

It was the second consecutive loss for SDSU, which had not suffered back-to-back defeats in its last 48 games dating back to March 6 & 9, 2019. Before being snapped the streak was tied for the third longest in Division I.

The Aztecs (9-4, 3-3 Mountain West) got nearly half of its 59 points from two guards who came off the bench. Senior Terrell Gomez led SDSU with 16 points and freshman Lamont Butler finished with a season-high 13 points. Add senior guard Jordan Schakel's 11 points to the 29 from Gomez and Butler, and the threesome totaled 67.7 percent of the team scoring (40-of-59 points).

In addition to his season-best 13 points, Butler, who is the only Aztec freshman to appear in every game this season, played 25 minutes and had a game-high five steals, both season bests for the Moreno, Valley, Calif., native.

Senior forward Nathan Mensah and sophomore forward Keshad Johnson led SDSU with five rebounds and senior guard Trey Pulliam finished with seven points and two assists.

After struggling from the floor two nights earlier, San Diego State outshot the Aggies 41.1 percent (23-of-56) to 37.3 percent (19-of-51), including going 13-of-27 (48.1 percent) in the first half. The Aztecs held Utah State (11-3, 8-0 MW) to a season-low 22 first half points. But with a 12-2 run to open the second half, Utah State tied the game at 34-34 with 16:28 to play.

The game was back-and-forth over the succeeding 13 minutes with eight lead changes, five ties and neither team able to generate more than a four-point lead. Finally, at the 4:28 mark, the Aggies took a lead which it would not relinquish on its way to its 10th straight win. In the final 4:32, Utah State went to the line 10 times and made nine of their attempts and the Aztecs were 2-of-3 over the same time frame.

Utah State's Steven Ashworth led all scorers with 17 points. Brock Miller totaled 11 points and Neemias Queta chipped in with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

NOTING THE NEVADA WIN

Here are a few notes from the victory over Nevada on Friday.

- San Diego State advances to the Mountain West Conference championship game for the 4th consecutive year and a record 13th time in league history (UNLV is second with eight appearances).
- The Aztecs won their 13th consecutive game which is the third longest active win streak in Division I and is tied for the fourth longest win

streak in school history. Of the nine longest win streaks in school history, Brian Dutcher has been the head coach for two of them and served as Steve Fisher's top assistant for seven others.

- With his jumper at the 15:25 mark of the first half, Jordan Schakel passed the 1,000-career-point plateau. He becomes the 35th player in SDSU's 100-year history to achieve the milestone. He is the third player on the roster with 1,000 points (also: Matt Mitchell and Terrell Gomez).
- Schakel has 15 or more points in four consecutive games for the first time in his 119-game career (SDSU is 21-1 when he scores at least 20 points).
- San Diego State wins its 22nd game of the season. It marks the fourth consecutive season the Aztecs have compiled at least 21 victories (all four under head coach Brian Dutcher).
- San Diego State is 52-6 since the start of the 2019-20 season. That is the second-best record in the nation over that span, trailing only Gonzaga.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 37 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova with 30 victories in Madison Square Garden.
- San Diego State led at the half for the 14th straight game and improves to 13-1 in those games.
- San Diego State's first 20 points of the second half were scored by either Matt Mitchell (15) or Jordan Schakel (5).
- San Diego State did not trail in the second half marking the 12th game during the 13-game win streak that it did not face a deficit after intermission.
- San Diego State had nine turnovers tonight marking the sixth time the Aztecs have had single-digit turnovers (SDSU is 6-0 in those games). The Aztecs are 17-1 the last 18 times they have had nine turnovers or less.
- San Diego State shot better than its opponent tonight (SDSU: 45.3, Nevada: 35.8) and improves to 52-1 the last 53 times it has had an advantage in the category.
- The Aztecs held Nevada to under 40 percent shooting and improves to 39-1 the last 40 times it has done so to its opponent.
- **Jordan Schakel** – 15 points, 6-9 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 9 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals - Surpassed the 1,000-career point plateau, becoming the 35th player in program history to achieve the milestone... Has 15+ points in four consecutive games for the first time in his 119-game career... Tied a career-high with nine rebounds (third time this season and fifth time in his career)... He has scored 15 points or more 15 times this season (SDSU is 15-0 in those games) and 22 times in his career (21-1)... Reached double figure scoring for the 20th time this season (SDSU is 18-2 in those games) and 50th time in his career (45-5)... Hit multiple threes for the 19th game this season (SDSU is 17-2 in those games) and 62nd time for his career (52-10)... Schakel entered the game with 51 career points against Nevada for a 5.1 ppg average... He had 15 points this evening.
- **Matt Mitchell** – game-high 24 points, 3-7 3FGs, 8 rebounds, 2 steals - Scored in double figures for the 20th time in 2020-21 (SDSU is 17-3 in those games)... Mitchell reached 20 points in the a game for the sixth time this season and 14th time in his career (SDSU is 13-1 in those games)... In three games against Nevada this season he attempted 35 free throws... Scored 19 of his game-high 24 points in the second half... Drew a game-high eight fouls... Mitchell ends his career with 149 career points against Nevada.
- **Trey Pulliam** – 13 points, 6-12 FGs, 4 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals - Pulliam has consecutive double-figure scoring games for the first time in his 58-game career... Last 2 games: 28 points, 13-25 FGs, 8 assists... Led the team in assists for the fourth consecutive game and the 18th time this season... He has four or more assists in four straight games (20 total) for the first time in his career... Last four games: 20 assists, five turnovers... Eleven times this season an Aztec player had at least four rebounds and four assists in a game (Pulliam has done it seven times)... Has five double-digit scoring games in his last nine games after posting two in his first 49 games.
- **Lamont Butler** – 10 points, 2 rebounds, 2 assists - Notched his fifth career double-digit scoring game and first since Feb. 10... Has 18 points in his last two games... Drew five fouls in 12:39 of action.

THE WIN STREAK

- San Diego State has won 13 consecutive games and has not suffered a loss since Jan. 16. On Saturday, it will have been 56 days since the Aztecs last loss.
- San Diego State has been one of the most impressive teams in the country over the last month. Since the start of the 13-game win streak on Jan. 22 (entering play Saturday), here is a look at the Aztecs national rankings 4th in scoring margin (+21.5), 4th in rebound margin (+9.9), 6th in points per game allowed (59.1) 11th in field goal percentage defense (37.8), 2th in turnover margin (+4.4), 17th in three-point field goal percentage (40.0) and 18th in scoring (80.8).

AND THE AWARD GOES TO.....

With the 2021 Air Force Reserve Mountain West Men's Basketball Championship Tournament underway, its award season and four members of the San Diego State men's basketball team have been honored for their play and coaching. Three players and head coach Brian Dutcher have been included in the Mountain West's postseason awards, which are based on the conference's regular-season schedule and are voted on by the league's 11 head coaches.

- Senior forward Matt Mitchell was named the Mountain West Player of the Year and a first-team All-Mountain West performer & a member of the Mountain West All-Defensive Team.
- Senior guard Jordan Schakel is a second-team All-Mountain West selection
- Junior forward Nathan Mensah is an honorable mention All-Mountain West honoree and included on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher is the Steve Fisher Mountain West Coach of the Year Award winner for the second year in a row.

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State playing only road or neutral games for the rest of the year, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- San Diego State had the nation's longest road winning streak (13 games, dating back to the 2018-19 season) halted at Utah State (1/14), the same program that ended SDSU's longest road/neutral streak (16) in the nation in its final game of the 2019-20 campaign.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State's 78-45 (.634 record in road games is the ninth best in the nation.
- Last season the Aztecs' 16 road/neutral road wins were the most in the nation.
- San Diego State's 11-0 road record last season was the best in the nation and its 11 true road wins were tied for the third most in the nation behind Vermont (12-3) and Stephen F. Austin (12-2).

In its last nine neutral site games, San Diego State is 8-1, with its only loss coming against Utah State in the championship game of the 2020 Mountain West tournament.

Fourth Season • 22nd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fourth season as San Diego State head coach after three years in which he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th and 12th Mountain West crowns and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. He is the only coach in the 99-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program, and over the summer signed a contract extension which will keep him on The Mesa through the 2025-26 season.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an

at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

LOGAN, Utah - San Diego State suffered its worst shooting night of the 2020-21 season, hitting just 17-of-51 shots (31.5 percent), and watched its Division I leading 13-game road winning streak come to an end in a 57-45 loss at Utah State on Thursday evening.

Junior forward Nathan Mensah was one of the bright spots going 6-of-9 from the floor and totaling 13 points to lead the Aztecs. It was the fourth consecutive game in double figures and sixth of the season for the Accra, Ghana native. He also added nine rebounds, three steals, two blocks and an assist.

The only other player in double figures for San Diego State was senior forward Matt Mitchell, who finished with 10 points, two assist and two rebounds. Mitchell has reached double-digit scoring in each of the teams 12 games.

The Aztecs (9-3, 3-2 Mountain West) were limited to 20 points in the first half, the third game this year they have reached that total in the first 20 minutes. On the previous two occasions they came out in the second half and totaled 45 against Pepperdine, in a 65-60 win, and had 42 points against BYU, but lost 62-72. Against Utah State (10-3, 7-3 MW) they outscored the Aggies in the second half, totaling 25 points, couldn't overcome its tough shooting night.

San Diego State had a 5-2 lead on the three pointer from senior guard Trey Pulliam two minutes into the game and was up 7-4 after a Mensah bucket with 16:59 to play in the half, but 11 turnovers in the first 20 minutes combined with the Aggies shooting 14-of-29 (48.3 percent) gave Utah State to a 33-20 halftime advantage.

In the second half, San Diego State cut the lead to five points on two occasions, but could get no closer in the 12-point loss. Both teams set season lows for scoring in the second half. Utah State totaled 24 points in the second half, the lowest of the season for the hosts, while the 25 points in the second half for San Diego State marked the fewest of the season for the road team.

For Utah State, Neemias Queta tallied 14 points and 16 rebounds to lead the Aggies to their ninth consecutive victory. Brock Miller led all scorers with 16 points.

The teams have little time to prepare for game two of this series. The tip off is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. PT on Saturday and will be broadcast on CBS.

LOGAN, Utah - The San Diego State men's basketball team took a 10-point lead into the second half at Utah State on Saturday afternoon, but saw Aggies go to the free throw line 20 times in the second half, knocked down 17 attempts, and were able to erase the Aztecs lead and earn a 64-59 win in the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

It was the second consecutive loss for SDSU, which had not suffered back-to-back defeats in its last 48 games dating back to March 6 & 9, 2019. Before being snapped the streak was tied for the third longest in Division I.

The Aztecs (9-4, 3-3 Mountain West) got nearly half of its 59 points from two guards who came off the bench. Senior Terrell Gomez led SDSU with 16 points and freshman Lamont Butler finished with a season-high 13 points. Add senior guard Jordan Schakel's 11 points to the 29 from Gomez and Butler, and the threesome totaled 67.7 percent of the team scoring (40-of-59 points).

In addition to his season-best 13 points, Butler, who is the only Aztec freshman to appear in every game this season, played 25 minutes and had a game-high five steals, both season bests for the Moreno, Valley, Calif., native.

Senior forward Nathan Mensah and sophomore forward Keshad Johnson led SDSU with five rebounds and senior guard Trey Pulliam finished with seven points and two assists.

After struggling from the floor two nights earlier, San Diego State out-shot the Aggies 41.1 percent (23-of-56) to 37.3 percent (19-of-51), including going 13-of-27 (48.1 percent) in the first half. The Aztecs held Utah State (11-3, 8-0 MW) to a season-low 22 first half points. But with a 12-2 run to open the second half, Utah State tied the game at 34-34 with 16:28 to play.

The game was back-and-forth over the succeeding 13 minutes with eight lead changes, five ties and neither team able to generate more than a four-point lead. Finally, at the 4:28 mark, the Aggies took a lead which it would not relinquish on its way to its 10th straight win. In the final 4:32, Utah State went to the line 10 times and made nine of their attempts and the Aztecs were 2-of-3 over the same time frame.

Utah State's Steven Ashworth led all scorers with 17 points. Brock Miller totaled 11 points and Neemias Queta chipped in with 10 points and 10 rebounds.
