Azters Notes

- San Diego State opened the season with three straight victories, outscoring its opponents 12-4 in those games, before a
 1-2 defeat in its last outing and now sits in second place in the Mountain West's West Division table, one game shy of the
 halfway point in the season.
- In its game at San Jose State (3/12), the Aztecs totaled 6 goals. They were the most tallies in a game by an SDSU team, since the team put up 5 goals in a 5-4 victory at Air Force on Oct. 19, 2019. The five goal margin of victory (6-1) is the largest since a 5-0 victory over Air Force on Oct. 22, 2018.
- San Diego State's 6 goal total at San Jose State equals the highest in a road contest in program history (since the 1989 season). It matches the 6 goals scored at Fresno State in a 6-0 win on Sept. 2, 1996 and a 6-0 win at Wyoming on Oct. 10, 1999. The 6 goals are tied for the third most in a game (regardless of location) for a San Diego State team. The most goals in a game came in a 10-0 win at La Verne (9/25/98) in the third contest in program history.
- San Diego State's 13 goals in its first four games are the most since the 1996 team scored 16 times in its first four
 outings. The most goals in an Aztec team's first four games came in the program's inaugural season of 1989 when that
 team totaled 18 goals in its first four games. SDSU's 13 goals through four games are the third most behind the two
 aforementioned seasons.
- You want offense...we got offense. San Diego State is the No. 5 in the nation in scoring offense (3.25 goals per game),
 points per game (9.00), and shots per game (19.75). In addition, the team is putting 8.75 shots on frame per game,
 which is No. 7 in the nation. SDSU leads the Mountain West in each of those categories.
- With an average of 2.5 assists per game the Aztecs rank No. 11 in the nation and are second in the MW and its 10 total assists are No. 68 nationally and second in the league.
- The Aztecs lead the Mountain West in total goals (13) and total points (36) which rank No. 65 & No. 71 in the nation, respectively.
- Rachelle Elve (So., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) had the first hat trick of her college career in a 6-1 dismantling of San
 Jose State (3/12). It was the 10th hat trick in program history and the first since Aliyah Utush had one against New
 Mexico on Nov. 4, 2017. Elve was the team's top goal scorer last season with seven strikes.

- Elve has 1 assist and her 7 points are fied for the team lead. Her 9 total shots and 5 shots on goal are both second on the squad and she ranks 53rd in the nation in goals per game (0.75) & 59th in points per game (1.75).
- Chloe Frisch (Sr., F, Solana Beach, Calif.) is tied with Elve for the team lead in goals (3) and she is pacing the side with 21 shots and 11 shots on goal. Nationally, her shots per game (5.25) and shots on goal per game (2.75) rank No. 8 & No. 11, respectively. Frisch is level with Elve in goals per game (0.75 53rd in the nation) & points per game (1.75 59th in the nation).
- With her assist on Jessica Sanders' goal vs. Boise State, Frisch moved into a tie for eighth on the program's career assist list. Frisch
 has 16 career assists, on par with Erika Sutton (2005-06) and Hannah Keane (2011-14) and enters the weekend one assist from
 equaling Kelly Grogg (1996-98) for seventh place with 17.
- Laura Fuentes (Jr., MF, Newark, Calif.) has two assists, which leads the team and ranks second in the Mountain West. She is third on the team in shots (8) and points (7), and tie for third with six others in goals (1). Her goal came on a PK and was the game winner against Boise State (3/7).
- Anna Toohey (Jr., F, Winston-Salem, N.C.) has a goal and an assist (both at SJSU), and her assist came on the third goal of Elve's
 hat trick. Three of her four shots have been on frame and she has started in each of the last three games.
- Phoebe Leitch (Sr., D/MF, Forest Row, England) has a goal and an assist. She has produced three shots with two being on goal.
- The goals from Jordan Girman (Sr., D, Cotati, Calif.) and Claire Watkins (So., D, San Diego, Calif.), were the first of each player's
 college careers. Girman's strike came in the San Jose State rout (3/12) and Watkins' was the game winner in the season opener
 against Nevada (3/5).
- On two shots Jessica Sanders (So, D, San Carlos, Calif.) has one goal in the Boise State 3-1 victory. It was the first goal of her
 career.
- In addition to Fuentes's two assists, Emma Gains-Ramos (Fr., F, San Diego, Calif.), Veronica Alavos (Sr., D, San Diego, Calif.) and

Malia Kaleiohi (Jr., MF/F, San Diego, Calif.) have one assists each. For Gaines-Ramos & Avalos, it was each of their first point as a college player. Kaleiohi doubled her career-point total with her assist.

- Keeper Alexa Madueno (Fr., GK, Woodland, Calif.) has played every minute (360:00) this season. She has surrendered six goals (1.50 GAA) and has 13 saves (.694 save percentage). Her record for the season and her career is 3-1-0.
- In a one-time only scenario, the 2020 season will be contested in the Spring 2021 semester and will consist of Mountain West Conference games only. The 10-match conference-only schedule, in a divisional double round-robin format, will take place over a six-week period (March 5-April 11). Matches will be played on Friday and Sunday. A single match will take place on Sat., April 17, at a campus site between the two division winners to determine the Conference automatic qualifier to the NCAA tournament.
- The Aztecs are in the West Division with Boise State, Fresno State, Nevada, San Jose State and UNLV. The Mountain Division includes
 Air Force, Colorado College, Colorado State, New Mexico, Utah State and Wyoming. There will be no regular season inter-divisional
 games.
- Head Coach Mike Friesen is in the midst of his 14th campaign leading the Mountain West's most dominant women's soccer program.
 Friesen has guided his squad to ten Mountain West championships (five tournament and five regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances. In 14 seasons of conference play, Friesen has an 83-23-15 record. His 83 victories are the most by any current Mountain West head coach.
- Friesen's 153 victories (153-92-33) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by
 any coach in the Mountain West. Colorado College's Geoff Bennett ranks second on the list with 137 victories in the last 13 seasons.
- San Diego State has picked to finish with a share of the conference crown in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the tenth
 time in 11 seasons the Aztecs have been picked to finish in either first or second place. The only time SDSU was lower than second
 place in the preseason poll in the last 11 campaigns was last season, a year in which it was predicted to finish fourth. That team
 went 10-9-1, shared the Mountain West regular-season title at 8-3-0, and reached the championship game of the league tournament.
- Having won five of the last eight regular-season titles, SDSU finds itself as the favorite in the eyes of the conference's head coaches
 for the seventh time in the last eight years.
- The Aztecs have won nine of the last 15 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction
 of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 14th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to ten conference crowns.

Inside The Matchup

This will be the 27th meeting between the Aztecs and Rebels with San Diego State holding a 16-9-2 advantage in the series, which started in 1998... In games played on SDSU's home field, the Aztecs are 9-3-1, but in the last three meetings on The Mesa, the series has gone 1-1-1... Last year, on Oct. 4, 2019, San Diego State defeated the Rebels 1-0 on an unassisted Darcy Weiser goal in the 76th minute... Aztecs head coach Mike Friesen is 9-4-2 gaginst UNLV. including 5-2-1 at home gaginst the Rebels.

The Rebels were predicted to finish ninth in the MW coaches preseason poll and enter its game with the Aztecs with a 2-1-1 record...

UNLV is playing its third road game of the season and has a 1-1-0 mark so far with wins at San Jose State (3-0) and a loss at Fresno State (2-3)... The key to controlling UNLV is marking reigning Mountain West Player of the Week Naliah Harping (Fr., F, Broomfield, Co.) who scored four goals last weekend, including a hat trick at San Jose State.. Harping leads the side with four of its six total goals and one of its two assists... Citlalli Alonso (Sr., MF, Mira Loma, Calif.) and Marcella Brooks (So., MF/F, Las Vegas, Nev.) have the teams other two goals and Alonso & Harpring own the two game winners... In goal Emberly Sevilla has played all 380:00 minutes for the Rebels... She has let in three goals (0.71 GAA) and made seven saves (.700 save percentage) and has a 2-1-1 record... UNLV is coached by Jenny Ruiz-Williams is in her first season leading her alma mater and has a 2-1-1 career record.
