Aztec Team Notes

- Anna Toohey (Jr., F, Winston-Salem, N.C.) was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week for the week
 ending on March 28. In a pair of home victories, 2-1 over Fresno State and 3-0 over San Jose State, Toohey produced seven
 shots, put all on frame, scored two goals, the game winner in each contest, and added an assist. It is her first MW Player
 of the Week honor and the first for an Aztecs this season.
- San Diego State continues to reign at the top of the West Division table with its 6-1-0 record after wins last week on the Sports Deck against Fresno State and San Jose State by scores of 2-1 and 3-0, respectively.
- San Diego State's 6-1-0 start is its best since a 7-0-0 run to open the 2012 season (also: the Aztecs started the 1996 &1998 seasons 6-1-0). The 2012 team finished the season 21-2-1 and reached the Sweet 16 in the NCAA tournament.
- With three games left in the regular season, four of the six teams in the West Division are still in the running to participate
 in the conference's championship match. The Aztecs control their own destiny and with two wins will wrap up the division's
 top spot. With one win, SDSU eliminates Fresno State. A San Diego State win at UNLV will eliminate the Rebels and a win
 at Boise State eliminates the Broncos.
- If the two teams who finish at the tip of each division have the same record, there are three tie breaking scenarios to determine which will host the Mountain West championship game:
 - 1. Comparison of goal differentials within divisional matches.
 - 2. Comparison of goals scored within divisional matches.
 - 3. Comparison of the win-loss records against other divisional opponents in descending order beginning at the top of the standings.
- In the now 33 seasons of Aztec women's soccer, San Diego State has started a season with at least six wins in its first seven games five times. In 1996, 1998, 1999 and now 2021 the program has opened the campaign 6-1 and in 2012 the Aztecs got off to a 7-0 start. In all the previous years the team has at least six wins in its first seven games, except in 1996, SDSU earned all or part of its conference championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament.
- Since the 2021Spring schedule consists of only Mountain West contests, the Aztecs 6-1-0 record is an impressive start to
 league play. In the now 22 years of the Mountain West, San Diego State has opened conference play with at least six wins
 in its first seven games four times, including in 2012, when the side was 7-0-0 to start league play. The three years in which
 SDSU has had six wins in its first seven MW games are 2013, 2015 and now 2021.

- The Aztecs shutout of San Jose State was its second of the year and second in its last three home games. In addition, it was the third clean sheet in the last six home games for SDSU.
- After a week in which it outscored its opponents 5-1, San Diego State is now No. 9 in the nation in points per game (7.71), No. 10 in scoring offense (2.71 goals per game), and No. 11 in shots per game (17.43). In addition, the team is putting 8.43 shots on frame per game, which is No. 13 in the nation. SDSU either leads or ranks second in the Mountain West in each of those categories.
- The Aztecs rank No. 17 in the nation and lead the Mountain West with an average of 2.29 assists per game. Its 16 total assists are
 No. 1 in the league and No. 53 in the nation.
- SDSU leads the Mountain West in total goals (19) and total points (54) which rank No. 54 & No. 55 in the nation, respectively.
- San Diego State's 19 goals through its first seven games are the most since the 1999 team scored 18 times in its first seven outings.
 The most goals in an Aztec team's first seven games came in the program's inaugural season of 1989 when that team totaled 22 goals in its first seven games and the 1996 iteration of the Aztecs scored 21 goals in its first seven contests.

Aztec Player Notes

Anna Toohey (Jr., F, Winston-Salem, N.C.) has a goal in each of the last three games, all game winners, and an assist. In the same
stretch, she has attempted nine shots and put all nine on frame. She has earned a starting assignment in each of the last six games.

Toohey is the reigning Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week and leads the team in points (10), game winners (3), is tied for the lead with four goals and is second in assists (2), shots (13) and shots on goal (12). Her three game winners rank No. 14 in the nation entering this week.

- Chloe Frisch (Sr., MF, Solana Beach, Calif.) is pacing the side with 31 shots and 15 shots on goal, and is tied with Toohey for the team lead in goals (4). Nationally, her shots per game (4.43) and shots on goal per game (2.14) rank No. 13 & No. 23, respectively. Frisch had the game winner at San Jose State (March 12).
- With her assist on the Jessica Sanders (So., D, San Carlos, Calif.) goal vs. Boise State (March 7), Frisch moved into a tie for eighth
 on the program's career assist list. Frisch has 16 career assists, on par with Erika Sutton (2005-06) and Hannah Keane (2011-14),
 and enters the weekend one assist from equaling Kelly Grogg (1996-98) for seventh place with 17.
- Rachelle Elve (So., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) had the first hat trick of her college career in a 6-1 dismantling of San Jose State
 (March 12). It was the 10th hat trick in program history and the first since Aliyah Utush had one against New Mexico on Nov. 4, 2017.
 Elve was the team's top goal scorer last season with seven strikes. In addition to her three goals, Elve has one assist, and her seven
 points are tied for third on the team. Her 11 total shots and six shots on goal are both third most on the squad.
- Laura Fuentes (Jr., MF, Newark, Calif.) has three assists, which is tied for the team lead and tied for second in the Mountain West.
 She is tied for third on the team in points (7), is fourth with two goals, and fifth in shots (11). Her first goal came on a PK and was the game winner against Boise State (March 7).
- Tied for the team lead in assists (3), Emma Gaines-Ramos (Fr., F, San Diego, Calif.) is tied for third on the side with 11 shots and
 fourth with five shots on goal. Her assists came in the victories against SJSU (March 12 & March 28) and on the game-winner vs.
 UNLV (March 20).
- Phoebe Leitch (Sr., D/MF, Forest Row, England) has a goal and an assist. She has produced six shots, putting four on goal.
- The goals from Jordan Girman (Sr., D, Cotati, Calif.) and Claire Watkins (So., D, San Diego, Calif.), were the first of each player's
 college careers. Girman's strike came in the San Jose State rout (March 12) and Watkins' was the game winner in the season opener
 against Nevada (March 5). In addition, Watkins had an assist on the game winner against San Jose State (March 28).
- On two shots, Jessica Sanders (So., D, San Carlos, Calif.) has one goal, in the Boise State 3-1 victory. It was the first goal of her
 college career.
- On two shots, Kiera Utush (So., D, San Carlos, Calif.) has one goal, in the victory over San Jose State (March 28). It came off a set
 piece from outside the top of the 18 from the left side.
- In addition to Fuentes & Gaines-Ramos' three assists, Veronica Avalos (Sr., D, San Diego, Calif.), Daniela Filipovic (Jr., D, Laguna Hills, Calif.), Taylor Moorehead (Jr., F, Valencia, Calif.), and Malia Kaleiohi (Jr., MF/F, San Diego, Calif.) have one assists each. For Avalos and Filipovic, it was each of their first points as a college player. Kaleiohi doubled her career-point total with her assist and for Moorehead it was the third assist of her Aztec career.
- Keeper Alexa Madueno (Fr., GK, Woodland, Calif.) has played every minute (630:00) this season. She has surrendered seven goals
 (1.00 GAA) and has made 21 saves (.750 save percentage). Three times she has stopped a season-high four shots. She earned her
 first collegiate clean sheet vs. UNLV (March 20) and picked up her second vs. San Jose State (March 28). Her record for the season
 and her career is 6-1-0.

General Notes

- In its game at San Jose State (3/12), the Aztecs totaled 6 goals. They were the most tallies in a game by an SDSU team since the team put up 5 goals in a 5-4 victory at Air Force on Oct. 19, 2019. The five-goal margin of victory (6-1) is the largest since a 5-0 victory over Air Force on Oct. 22, 2018.
- San Diego State's 6 goal total at San Jose State equals the highest in a road contest in program history (since the 1989 season). It
 matches the 6 goals scored at Fresno State in a 6-0 win on Sept. 2, 1996 and a 6-0 win at Wyoming on Oct. 10, 1999. The 6 goals
 are tied for the third most in a game (regardless of location) for a San Diego State team. The most goals in a game came in a 10-0
 win at La Verne (9/25/98) in the third contest in program history.
- In a one-time only scenario, the 2020 season will be contested in the Spring 2021 semester and will consist of Mountain West Conference games only. The 10-match conference-only schedule, in a divisional double round-robin format, will take place over a six-week period (March 5-April 11). Matches will be played on Friday and Sunday. A single match will take place on Sat., April 17, at a campus site between the two division winners to determine the Conference automatic aualifier to the NCAA tournament.

- The Aztecs are in the West Division with Boise State, Fresno State, Nevada, San Jose State and UNLV. The Mountain Division includes
 Air Force, Colorado College, Colorado State, New Mexico, Utah State and Wyoming. There will be no regular season inter-divisional
 games.
- Head Coach Mike Friesen is in the midst of his 14th campaign leading the Mountain West's most dominant women's soccer program.
 Friesen has guided his squad to ten Mountain West championships (five tournament and five regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances. In 13+ seasons of conference play, Friesen has an 86-23-15 record. His 86 victories are the most by any current Mountain West head coach.
- Friesen's 156 victories (156-92-33) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by any
 coach in the Mountain West. Colorado College's Geoff Bennett ranks second on the list with 140 victories in the last 13+ seasons.
- San Diego State has picked to finish with a share of the conference crown in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the tenth
 time in 11 seasons the Aztecs have been picked to finish in either first or second place. The only time SDSU was lower than second
 place in the preseason poll in the last 11 campaigns was last season, a year in which it was predicted to finish fourth. That team
 went 10-9-1, shared the Mountain West regular-season title at 8-3-0, and reached the championship game of the league tournament.
- Having won five of the last eight regular-season titles, SDSU found itself as the favorite in the eyes of the conference's head coaches
 for the seventh time in the last eight years.
- The Aztecs have won nine of the last 15 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 14th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to ten conference crowns.

Inside The Matchup With UNLV

This will be the 28th meeting between the Aztecs and Rebels with San Diego State holding a 17-9-2 advantage in the series, which started in 1998 and includes the Aztecs' 1-0 victory on March 20 on the Sports Deck... In games played at UNLV, the Aztecs are 6-5-1, but in the last six meetings in Las Vegas, the series has gone 4-1-1 to the Aztecs... In its six wins at UNLV, the Aztecs have outscored the Rebels 15-4 and in its five losses have been outscored 8-1, with seven of the 12 games played in Las Vegas ending up as one goal affairs and SDSU holding a 4-3 record in those contests... Aztecs head coach Mike Friesen is 10-4-2 against UNLV, including 4-2-1 on the road against the Rebels.

Notebook

The Rebels (4-2-1) enter the week in third place in the West Division and need to defeat San Diego State in order to keep its hopes of winning the division and possibly earning the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament... After falling to the Aztecs 1-0 on March 20, UNLV has defeated its last two opponents (SJSU 3-0 & Fresno State 2-1 20T)... The key to controlling UNLV's offense has been to mark Naliah Harping, who has a team leading five goals, four of which were scored in one weekend, including a hat trick at San Jose State (3/14)... Harping leads the side with five of its 11 total goals... Jaden Terrana has a team-best two assists... In goal Emberly Sevilla has played all 667:32 minutes for the Rebels... She has let in just five goals (0.67 GAA) and made 18 saves (.783 save percentage) and has a 4-2-1 record... UNLV is coached by Jenny Ruiz-Williams is in her first season leading her alma mater and has a 4-2-1 career record.
