#### Aztec Notes

- Falling for the fourth time in five games this season on Thursday, the Aztecs look to move in the other direction hosting Long Beach State on Sunday night. The game is scheduled to kickoff at 7 p.m. PT and will be streamed on the Mountain West Network.
- The series against Long Beach State began in 1999, with the last meeting coming in 2018. The Aztecs and the Beach have
  played ten times with SDSU owning a slim 5-4-1 advantage in the all-time series, including a 3-1-1 mark in San Diego. The
  Beach is currently in the midst of a four-game unbeaten streak in the series (3-0-1). They have held the Aztecs scoreless in
  each of the last three matchups, including the last meeting on the Sports Deck (2-0 on August 27, 2017).
- Alexa Madueno (So., GK, Woodland, Calif.) established a season and career-high when she recorded 14 saves in the
  team's game at No. 13 Stanford (8/29). The saves are the most since Aubree Southwick set the program record of 16
  saves in a game at Oregon State on Sept. 19, 2010.
- Through five matches this season, Alexa Madueno (So., GK, Woodland, Calif.) has recorded 41 saves, blowing past her
  total of 35 saves in 11 contests last season. She is averaging 8.2 saves per game so far. If you extrapolate that out to
  the team's 19 regular-season games, Madueno would total 156 saves, 50 more than the program's current single season
  record of 106 which was set by Aubree Southwick in the 2007 season.
- Alexa Madueno (So., GK, Woodland, Calif.) leads the nation in saves (41) and ranks No. 8 in saves per game (8.20).
   In addition, she is No. 35 in goalie minutes played (450:00) and No. 89 in shutouts (1). She leads the Mountain West in each of those categories, with the exception of shutouts in which she ranks No. 3.
- Denise Castro (Fr., MF, San Ysidro, Calif.) enjoyed the best weekend of her, so far, abbreviated college career. In games at Saint Mary's (8/26) & No. 13 Stanford (8/29), she led the side with three shots, put all of them on frame, and scored the team's lone goal, her first as an Aztec, at Saint Mary's.
- Laura Fuentes (Sr., MF, Newark, Calif.) has become the Aztecs iron lady, starting in all 55 games of her college career.
   Three other Aztecs Emma Gaines-Ramos (So., F, San Diego, Calif.), Alexa Madueno (So., GK, Woodland, Calif.) and Claire Watkins (Jr., D, San Diego, Calif.) are tied for the second-longest active consecutive start streak with 16. The 16 straight starting assignments for the trio cover their entire Aztec careers.
- When head coach Mike Friesen put together this season's non-conference schedule, he knew it would be challenging, but

The Aztecs eight non-conference opponents own a 20-5-2 record (.777), four of the eight are currently ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, and every one of the eight opponents has a .500 or better record.

- After a victory in its first match of the season, the Aztecs have come out on the wrong end of its last four decisions. Since head coach
   Mike Friesen took control of the program in 2007, covering 290 games, this is just the second time that one of his team's last lost
   four straight. The four-game losing streak that the Aztecs have equaled, came at the opening of the 2016 season.
- It is said, "If you don't play, you can't win." For the 2021 Aztecs it could be adjusted to "if you don't shoot, you can't score." In five games, SDSU has been outshot overall 111-to-33, 55-to-13 in shots on goals, and outscored 14-to-2 (note that 63-of-111 shots and 9-of-14 goals have come courtesy of No. 13 Stanford & Washington State in the last two games). Overall, the Aztecs' opponents are scoring a goal for every 7.9 shot attempts compared to San Diego State's one goal per 16.5 shot attempts.
- Head coach Mike Friesen's 159 victories (159-98-33) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took over the program, are the
  most by any current coach in the MW and rank second in league history (Jennifer Rockwood, BYU, 190 victories). Colorado College's
  Geoff Bennett's 145 victories in the last 14 seasons ranks second among current MW head coaches.

### **Player Notes**

Alexa Madueno (So., GK, Woodland, Calif.) played every minute of the team's first four games (450 minutes) and every minute
of her college career (1,455 minutes). At No. 13 Stanford (8/29), she established a career-high with 14 saves, two shy of the
program's all-time single game record, and faced more shots (44) against the Cardinal than any Aztec keeper in since the 2016 season
(Penn State took 29 shots against the Aztecs on Sept. 9, 2016). Against Army West Point (8/19) she recorded the fourth clean

Head Coach: Mike Friesen, 15th Season Assistant Coach: Chassion Griggs, Fifth Season Assistant Coach: Cole Schmit, Fifth Season sheet of her college career in a 1-0 decision. Madueno made four saves, three in the final 10 minutes to secure the Aztecs victory. At Saint Mary's (8/26) she recorded a then career-high 8 saves. So far this season, she is 1-4-0 with a 2.80 GAA and a .745 save percentage. She leads the MW in total saves (41), saves per game (8.2) and is seventh in save percentage. She went 8-3-0 last year, had a .714 save percentage (35-of-49) and surrendered 14 goals in 1,005 minutes (1.25 GAA). She was included on the Mountain West All-Newcomer team and was a second-team All-MW performer. Madueno is the first true freshman keeper to start every game in a season for SDSU since Aubree Southwick in 2007 and is the third keeper, and only true freshman, to play every minute in a season for the Aztecs since Stephanie Pearson in 2003. The only other keeper to start and play every minute in a season for San Diego State since 2003 was Brooke Lisowski in 2019.

- Laura Fuentes (Sr., MF, Newark, Calif.), a 2020 United Soccer Coaches second-team All-Pacific Region and first-team All-MW performer leads the side with six shots & three points. She is tied for the team lead with a goal (T-10 in the MW) and an assist (T-5in the MW) and ranks second with four shots on goal. Fuentes had the lone goal in a 1-0 decision against Army West Point (8/19). The tally was the fourth PK of her career and her fourth game winner. She leads the side with 1.20 shots per game and is tied for the lead at 0.20 goals per game. She has never missed a contest and has earned a starting assignment in each of her 55 career games.
- Denise Castro (Fr., MF, San Ysidro, Calif.) is one of two freshmen to have started all four games this season (also Sarah Funk). In 354 minutes, she has produced five shots, all five on frame which leads the team, and scored the first goal of her collegiate career in the team's 1-2 decision at Saint Mary's (8/26). She ranks second on the side with 1.00 shots per game and is tied for the lead at 0.20 goals per game. She is No. T-10 in the Mountain West in goals.
- Malia Kaleiohi (Sr., D, San Diego, Calif.) opted to utilize the extra year of eligibility offered by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and tallied her first point of the year, an assist, at Saint Mary's (8/26). She has a goal and five assists in 48 career games.
   Her 378 minutes played so far this year is tied for the third most among field players and her five starts this year equals the second most of her career (earned 11 starting assignments in 2019).
- Emma Gaines-Ramos (So., F, San Diego, Calif.) has tallied six shots, putting two on frame, in 309 minutes. Gaines-Ramos was a first-team All-Mountain West honoree last season after producing three assists in league play, the second most by an Aztec true freshman in the last five years. She has started all 16 games of her college career.
- Claire Watkins (Jr., D, San Diego, Calif.) has started all 16 games since transferring from Oregon prior to the 2020 campaign. In 351
  minutes this season, she has produced three shots. With the departure of four-year starting center defender Sarah Broacha, she, and
  fellow defender Kiera Utush (Jr., D, Rocklin, Calif.), have taken the reins as the program's center defenders.
- Lauren Dicus (Sr., D, Danville, Calif.) earned the 38th starting assignment of her career against Pepperdine (8/22), a consecutive
  streak of 13 games, before missing the Saint Mary's match (8/26). Dicus took one shot against Army West Point (8/19) and her
  58th minute attempt resulted in a hand ball in the AWP box which led to Fuentes' game winning PK. She has played 304 minutes
  in four starts in 2021.
- Sarah Funk (Fr., F, El Cajon, Calif.) is one of two freshmen (also Denise Castro) to have started all five games this season. She
  produced one shot in her collegiate debut vs. Army West Point (8/19) and one at Stanford (8/29). Funk has played 350 minutes,
  second most among Aztec freshmen (Denise Castro has played 354 minutes).
- In total, nine freshmen/newcomers have seen field time for the Aztecs this season. In addition to Castro and Funk, Trinity Coker (Fr., D, Poway, Calif.) has played 130 minutes in five games and attempted two shots (vs. Army West Point 8/19 & Washington State 9/2) putting one, vs. Washington State, on frame. Hope Paredes (Fr., MF, Irvine, Calif.) has 224 minutes of field time in four games, including starts at Saint Mary's (8/26) & vs. Washington State (9/2), and has produced three shots. Nicholette Palomo (Fr., F, Cerritos, Calif.), Alexys Ocampo (Fr., F/MF, Upland, Calif.), who has one shot, and Carlin Blake (MF, Overland Park, Kan.), have played 52, 139 and 160 minutes, respectively. Lily Davis (So., D, San Diego, Calif.), a transfer from Indiana, has played in four matches and a total of 130 minutes, and Olivia Sekimoto (So., MF/F, Chula Vista, Calif.), a transfer from American University, played 10 minutes in her lone appearance, at Saint Mary's (8/26).
- At Saint Mary's (8/26) & again vs. Washington State (9/2), freshmen Denise Castro, Sarah Funk and Hope Paredes earned starting assignments. The Saint Mary's game marked nearly two years since San Diego State had three freshmen in the starting lineup. The last time the Aztecs started three freshmen was in the championship match of the 2019 Mountain West Tournament (Nov. 19, 2019) when, then freshmen, Kiera Utush (D, Rocklin, Calif.), Jessica Sanders (D, Belmont, Calif.) & Rachelle Elve (F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) earned starting assignments.
- 2020 Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team All-Mountain West performer Anna Toohey (Sr., F, Winston-Salem, N.C.), has appeared in four games, starting three times, played 199 minutes, and produced one shot against Army West Point (8/19). She did not compete at No. 13 Stanford (8/29).
- Rachelle Elve (Jr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) totaled 10 goals in 2019 & 2020, the highest total among returning Aztecs (Chloe Frisch, who graduated after the 2020 season, scored 11 goals in her last two campaigns). Elve returns this season as the Mountain

West's top goal scorer in the last two seasons. At San Jose State (3/12/21), in the team's first foray away from home during the 2020 campaign, she tallied the program's 10th hat trick and the first since Aliyah Utush's trifecta vs. New Mexico on Nov. 4, 2017. Her first shot attempt this season, along with her first starting assignment, came at Stanford (8/29). She earned a starting nod vs. Washington State (9/2) and she has totaled 185 minutes in five matches.

- Daniela Filipovic (Sr., MF, Laguna Hills, Calif.), who recorded the first point of her career on an assist last season, is back in 2021 having opted to utilize the extra year of eligibility offered by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Filipovic produced her first shot of the campaign in the Pepperdine game (8/22) and has 288 minutes in four games (she did not compete vs. Washington State (9/2).
- Malia Kaleiohi (Sr., D, San Diego, Calif.) is back in 2021 having opted to utilize the extra year of eligibility offered by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Kaleiohi has started all five games this season (378 minutes) and assisted on Castro's goal at Saint Mary's (8/26). Her first shot on the campaign came against Pepperdine (8/22) and she ranks T-5 in the Mountain West in assists.

#### **General Notes**

- In his 15th campaign leading the Mountain West's most dominant women's soccer program, head coach Mike Friesen has guided
  his squad to ten Mountain West championships (five tournament and five regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances,
  each the most among any current league head coach. Entering his 15th season of conference play, Friesen has an 88-27-13 record.
   His 88 league victories are the most by any head coach in Mountain West history (the inaugural season of the MW was in 1999).
- The Aztecs opened the regular season on August 19 with a 1-0 victory over Army West Point. The win improved the program's record in season openers, on its home pitch, to 15-6-1. Since 2007, when head coach Mike Friesen assumed leadership of the program, SDSU is 7-3-1 in games which opened a season on the Sports Deck. Those three losses are all to Power-5 programs, and two of those programs went on to appear in that season's NCAA Tournament (UCLA in 2016 & Texas Tech in 2019). Now in its 33rd year of competition, the Aztecs are 18-14-1 overall in season openers, regardless of location.
- San Diego State is picked to finish in second place in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the 11th time in 12 seasons the
  Aztecs have been picked to finish in either first or second place. The only time SDSU was lower than second place in the preseason
  poll in the last 12 years was in 2019, a year in which the Aztecs were predicted to finish fourth. That team went 10-9-1, shared the
  Mountain West regular-season title at 8-2-0, and reached the championship game of the league tournament.
- San Diego State's 2.46 goals per game in 2020 is the highest for a Mountain West team in the last 19 seasons. In 1999 and 2002
  Brigham Young averaged 2.68 goals per game and BYU owns the league record of 3.46 goals per game in 2000.
- Having won five of the last eight regular-season titles, not including the 2020 season in which the league was divided into two divisions
  and the Aztecs earned the West Division title, SDSU finds itself not the favorite in the eyes of the conference's head coaches for just
  the second time in the last nine years.
- The Aztecs have won nine of the last 16 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 15th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to ten conference titles.
- San Diego State has earned 11 Mountain West titles since the conference's inception in 1999. SDSU was the regular season champions in 1999, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2019. The program was the tournament champion in 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017, and its five tournament titles are the most among any current member of the Mountain West and the second best in the league's history (BYU, 7).
- The Aztecs 0-3 decision against Pepperdine on Aug. 22, snapped an 11-game home match winning streak. The last time San Diego
  State had lost on the Sports Deck prior to Sunday night came on Sept. 13, 2019, in a 0-1 decision to San Diego. The Aztecs had gone
  nearly two years without a home defeat.

#### Long Beach State

The Beach are 2-2-0 after a 1-2 defeat at San Diego on Thursday night... Long Beach State was predicted to finish in first place in the Big West Conference preseason poll and in its last campaign, in 2019, was 4-12-1 including 2-5-1 in league action... Long Beach State has five players with a goal each... Lena Silano leads the team with 13 shots, two assists, has put six on frame and has a goal... Defender Kaitlin Fregulia was picked as the side's lone member of the Big West preseason all-conference team... Of the ten players who started double figure games for the Beach in 2019, they return four in 2021, bringing back 87.5 percent of the goal scoring (14-of-16 total goals) and 46.6 percent of its assists (7-of-15 total assists) from the 2019 campaign... In her first season of collegiate competition, keeper Morgan Houston-Shepherd has a 2-2-0 record, a 1.00 GAA, and .810 save percentage, and leads the team in minutes in goal (360:00) ... The Beach are coached by Mauricio Ingrassia, who is in his 18th season at the helm of the program and brings a career-record of 171-114-40 into the season and has a 4-1-1 record against San Diego State.

#### <u> LIVESTATS</u>

SAN DIEGO — Senior Laura Fuentes scored on a penalty kick in the 58th minute against the Army West Point Black Knights to send the San Diego State women's soccer team a 1-0 victory in each team's season opener. The win improved the Aztecs record in season openers on SDSU's home field to 15-6-1.

Fuentes, a senior out of Newark, Calif., got the keeper to go left and slotted the ball low to the right to convert the PK. She is a perfect 4-of-4 in penalty kicks for her career. The attempt was set up by fellow senior Lauren Dicus, who with the ball in the Army West Point box, attempted a pass which one of the Black Knights touched with her hand. The ball was placed on the spot and Fuentes took care of the rest.

The first 45 minutes were fairly even, especially on the stat sheet. The Aztecs out shot Army West Point 5-4 and had a couple of dangerous chances which they were unable to convert.

In the 29th minute, Anna Toohey, who was just inside the left corner of the box, took a pass from Fuentes, who was at the top of the 18. Toohey showed the ball to a defender, then took it back and drove around her. She fired a shot across the face of the goal from 15 yards out which the Black Knight's keeper had no chance to stop.

Later in the period, Malia Kaleiohi got free down the right side and served the ball into the six toward a crashing Emma Gaines-Ramos. Gaines-Ramos was driving to the back post, but the ball was just out of her reach and the teams went to the intermission tied at 0-0.

"We knew Army was going to be very organized, have a plan, stick to that plan," head coach Mike Friesen said. "We were prepared for a lot of what they did in the first half, but we just didn't follow through on our game plan. One of the things they did was to step up and squeeze us and we didn't play over the top of them. That was one of the things we talked about at half time and in the first 15 seconds of the second half, we played behind them and that really opened the game up."

On the play that turned the game, center defender Kiera Utush took possession in Aztec territory and played a ball deep down the middle of the field. Sarah Funk, a freshman forward, ran onto it, laid it off for Toohey who gave it right back, but the Black Knight's keeper Sage Strohman charged off her line and dove on the ball to smother the play

Then in the 53rd minute, Fuentes, on the left side of the box, took a cross from Funk, settled it and then fired a shot just over the crossbar. Finally, at the 57:38 mark, her PK attempt found the back of the net for what would eventually be the game winner.

San Diego State continued to press its advantage for the next 20-plus minutes and produced 12 of the team's total of 15 shots through the first 80 minutes.

However, in the final 10 minutes, the Black Knights turned up the pressure. They took six of their seven shots in the half in that time span and forced Aztecs' keeper Alexa Madueno to make the three saves she had in the second half. None was more important than a stop at the 82:18 mark. Army West Point's Keira Vesy found the ball 10 yards out on the left side of the box and fired a shot which would have tied the game, but Madueno dove to her left and punched it over the end line to preserve the 1-0 lead.

For the game, Madueno made four saves and earned the fourth clean sheet of her San Diego State career.

SAN DIEGO — The San Diego State women's soccer team surrendered an own goal less than five minutes into its contest against the Pepperdine Waves and was never able to claw its way back into the game, falling 3-0 on Sunday evening on the SDSU Sports Deck. It was the team's first home loss since a 0-1 decision to San Diego on Sept. 13, 2019.

"I thought we played a really good game," said head coach Mike Friesen. "We had an own goal, and they scored on a defensive mistake and a PK. It (the second score) was a silly goal to give away, but nothing too special that they did. (Pepperdine) is a very experienced team and that's why we played this game, so that we know what it takes to play at that level."

The first goal came at the 4:55 mark. Pepperdine's Leyla McFarland fired off a shot from a very tight angle on the left side of the goal. SDSU keeper Alexa Madueno got a hand on the ball, but couldn't control it and it deflected into the net, staking the Waves to a 1-0 advantage.

For most of the first 45 minutes, Pepperdine (2-0-0) had the advantage in the run of play, outshooting the Aztecs 8-ot-4. Malia Kaleiohi, Daniela Filipovic, Alexys Ocampo and Laura Fuentes produced the team's shots with Fuentes' attempts at the 8:50 mark the only shot on goal San Diego State (1-1-0) would get in the game. The sides went to intermission with the Waves up 1-0.

In the second half, Pepperdine got a goal in the 53rd minute from McFarland. Tori Waldeck attempted a shot, which Madueno stopped, but was unable to control. McFarland found herself in the right place at the right time and popped the ball over a sprawled Madueno to make it 2-0.

In the 60th minute, a Pepperdine player was fouled in the box and Trinity Watson scored low to her left on a penalty kick to make it 3-0, which would be the final score.

"I thought in the last 20 minutes we were fantastic." Friesen said. "This was the first time that really everybody stepped up and played the way we want to play, so that is huge to build on. I'm excited about where we can go from here, but disappointed with the result. But we play these games because they put us in a good spot to get to the postseason. This is a team (Pepperdine) that returned pretty much everyone from last year, and picked up some grad transfers, etc. It was good for our team to see the experience and composure they have, the willingness to do for the team whatever it takes to get a win. I thought we grew in the game and later we were very good. We had some quality chances in the first half; we just didn't put them away."

When the final whistle blew, the Aztecs had been outshot 19-to-6 and Pepperdine put eight shots on frame to SDSU's one. Madueno (1-1-0) made six saves, one off her career high.

In addition to the first half shots of Kaleiohi, Fuentes, Filipovic and Ocampo, Hope Paredes produced both Aztecs second half shots

San Diego State played nine newcomers, including seven true freshmen.

MORAGA, Calif. — Freshman Denise Castro scored the first goal of her college career and staked the San Diego. State women's soccer team to a 1-0 lead in the 34th minute, but after having a player sent off in the 66th minute, the Aztecs surrendered a pair of goals to the Saint Mary's and lost its game 2-1.

The teams spent the first 15 minutes feeling each other out, but in the 17th minute, the Aztecs produced the first dangerous chance. Emma Gaines-Ramos, on a corner, sent the ball across the face of the goal where Claire Watkins, who was crashing at the far post, got a head on it, but the attempt was just wide.

Then at the 33:37 mark, San Diego State (1-2-0) struck. A ball was played through the box and was left to harmlessly roll into touch by everyone but Malia Kaleiohi. Kaleiohi raced to the corner to keep it in bounds. She then played a give-and-go with Alexys Ocampo and found Laura Fuentes about 10 yards outside the 18. Fuentes served it to Denise Castro just outside the six-yard box. Castro settled the pass with a touch and hammered a shot off her left foot which was past the Gaels keeper before she could even move. The tally opened the San Ysidro, Calif., native's collegiate account and both Kaleiohi and Fuentes were credited with assists.

For the half, Saint Mary's (3-0-0) outshot the Aztecs 7-to-2, but the score remained 1-0 through the intermission and ino the second half.

The Gaels first dangerous chance came in the 50th minute when a shot from Vanessa Gaitan flashed across the goal face and just outside the far post. In the 55th minute a Saint Mary's striker got loose behind the defense, but the Aztec defense recovered, and her shot attempt went harmlessly wide right.

At the 65:05 mark, Hope Paredes, who earned the first start of her career in the game, made a hard side tackle on a Gael and was sent off with a red card. The Aztecs played the remaining 24-plus minutes a player down

Saint Mary's found the equalizer in the 74th minute. Annamaria DiGeronimo played a long through ball to Alexis Gutierrez who got behind the Aztecs defense and shot low to the right corner of the goal.

In the 84th minute, the Gaels took the lead on an Isabella Santavicca tally. She got the ball inside box, behind the defense. San Diego State keeper Alexa Madueno charged Santavicca and when the two met at the top of the six-yard box, the ball slowly rolled off Santavicca's foot and trickled into the goal for what would be the game winner

For the game Saint Mary's outshot the Aztecs 18-to-3, with Madueno making a career-high eight saves. In addition to Castro's goal and Watkins' header, Gaines-Ramos produced SDSU's third shot.

#### THE NOTE

The Aztecs started three freshmen in a regular-season game, Sarah Funk, Denise Castro & Hope Paredes, for the first time this year and the first time since the title match of the Mountain West Championship game on Nov. 9, 2019.

STANFORD, Calif. — San Diego State women's soccer keeper Alexa Madueno made a career-high 14 saves on Sunday at No. 13 Stanford, but the Cardinal offense was too potent, producing 44 shots and earning a 6-0 decision over the Aztecs at Laird Q. Cagan Stadium.

Madueno was two saves from equaling the program record for a match, which was set by Aubree Southwick at Oregon State on Sept. 19, 2010, who made 16 saves against the Beavers. The sophomore out of Woodland, Calif., he eclipsed her previous single-game high of nine stops, which she totaled at Saint Mary's on Thursday

Stanford's 44 shot attempts are the most an Aztecs opponent has produced since Penn State got off 29 in a 3-0 win at San Diego State on Sept. 9, 2016.

Facing a Stanford (3-0-0) team that produced 29 shots and beat CSUN 7-0 on Thursday, the Aztecs attempted to pack the box against the No. 13 Cardinal, but in the end the Stanford firepower proved to be the difference.

The Cardinal produced the first 12 shots in the game, and on its 13th attempt its broke though. Off a cross in the 22nd minute, there was a scramble in front of the goal. Belle Briede was able to collect it and slot the ball past Madueno for a 1-0 lead

Between that score and a tally with 20 seconds left prior to the intermission, Madueno stopped nine Cardinal shots, already a career-high in saves. The second Stanford goal, at the 44:40 mark, was off the foot of Andrea Kitahata and the teams went to halftime with the Cardinal leading 2-0. In the first 45 minutes, which was almost exclusively played in the Aztecs (1-3-0) half of the field, Sanford produced 25 shots while holding San Diego State without an attempt.

Kitahata scored at the 48:40 mark to extend the Stanford lead to 3-0 early in the second half. The Cardinal then added goals in the 72nd, 81st and 85th minutes for the 6-0 decision.

The Aztecs' most dangerous opportunity came in the 49th minute. Denise Castro, from the left side of the 18-yard box, played give and go with Sarah Funk, seven yards outside the top of the box. Funk's return pass to Castro was right on the mark. Castro one-timed it, but Sanford keeper Katie Meyer was up to the challenge.

Castro, a midfielder, led the side with two shots, both on frame. Emma Gaines-Ramos & Rachelle Elve, both strikers, took one shot each and both put their attempts on goal. Midfielder Laura Fuentes & forward Sarah Funk each took one shot.

Alexa Madueno's 14 saves are a career-high and two off the program record.

SAN DIEGO — The San Diego State women's soccer team played the Washington State Cougars nearly straight up for the first 85 minutes, allowing only one goal, but a pair of late Cougars tallies put the game away in a 3-0 win over the Aztecs on the SDSU Sports Deck on Thursday night.

San Diego State (1-4-0) saw the Cougars attempt the game's first two shots, before Emma Gaines-Ramos pulled the trigger in the ninth minute. The shot went just wide left of the goal.

Seven minutes later, Washington State (2-0-1) got the game's initial goal, at the 16:42 mark, when Enzi Broussard collected a ball on the right side of the box and played it to the far post. Sydney Struder headed it in behind Aztecs' keeper Alexa Madueno for a 1-0 lead.

The score would remain 1-0 through the end of the first half with the Cougars out shooting SDSU 8-to-1 and Madueno making two saves.

The second half would see more of the same, Washington State would outshoot the Aztecs 11-to-2 and Madueno would make seven saves, but despite the disparity in stats, San Diego State kept playing hard and proving difficult for the Cougars to handle.

However, in the 86th minute Grayson Lynch would score the first of her two late goals to put the game out of reach. She was assisted on the first by Elyse Bennett and scored the second, unassisted, in the 88th minute.

For the game the Aztecs were outshot 19-to-3. Gaines-Ramos produced two shots and Trinity Coker attempted the other in the 78th minute, which was the only shot to reach the line of the Washington State keeper Marissa Zucchetto.

Madueno made nine saves, many simply spectacular, to keep the Aztecs in the game. In the last three games, she has made eight, 14 and nine saves and for the year has 41. Entering the game, the sophomore out of Woodland, Calif., ranked No. 11 in the nation in saves per game (8.00) and No. 4 in total saves (32), both of which should move her up the rankings after Thursday evenings performance.

After the Washington State game, Alexa Madueno leads the Mountain West in saves with 41. The No. 2 ranked keeper in the league has 18 saves.
