OFF THE TOP (through games of Tuesday, Feb. 1)

- The two teams currently tied for third-place in the ultra competitive Mountain West Conference race meet on Friday night, as San Diego State (12-5; 4-2 Mountain West) plays at Colorado State (16-3; 6-3 Mountain West).
- The teams met on Jan. 8 (27 days ago Friday) at Viejas Arena, with the Aztecs posting a 79-49 victory over the previously unbeaten No. 20/19 Rams.
- Forty-three hours after tipoff Friday, San Diego State will play host to Nevada at Viejas Arena (1 p.m. PT, Sunday).
- In all, beginning Friday, San Diego State is scheduled to play 11 times (five at home, six away) in the next 30 days (Feb. 4 - Mar. 5).
- San Diego State and Colorado State are meeting for the 90th time, with the Aztecs holding a 47-42 series advantage. The Aztecs have won seven of the last eight meetings.
- SDSU owns a 14-26 mark against the Rams at Moby Arena. The Aztecs have been victorious on their last three trips to the venue and are 11-4 in its last 15 games in Fort Collins.
- This marks the Aztecs first trip to Moby since Dec. 4, 2019 (794 days ago Friday). Despite not playing in the venue in more than two seasons, SDSU has still handed Colorado State two of its last nine losses at home. Since Feb. 12, 2009, SDSU is 2-0 at Moby, while the rest of the nation is 7-33.
- Last time out, the two-time defending outright Mountain West Conference regular season champions never trailed, in a 72-47 victory over New Mexico at Viejas Arena. It marked San Diego State's third conference victory by at least 25 points this season.
- The stout Aztec defense was on full display Monday, limiting the Lobos to season lows in points (47) and field goal percentage (30.8).
- San Diego State has won its last three meetings with New Mexico, all by more than 20 points. The Aztecs became the first school in the nation to accomplish that in the last 42 seasons.
- Junior forward **Keshad Johnson** recorded his second career double-double with a season-high 14 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Johnson tied for team-high honors in points, marking the first time in his 59-game career he has led the Aztecs in scoring.
- Senior guard **Matt Bradley** produced another stat-filled effort, with 14 points, five rebounds and three assists. Bradley, who is averaging 20 points in his last three outings, has made 24 of his last 36 attempts from the field (66.7 percent), including 5-of-9 from three-point range (55.6 percent) during that span.
- One of the nation's top defensive players, senior forward **Nathan Mensah** had five points, a season-high tying four blocked shots and a career-high five steals in 20 minutes of action. He became the first Aztec in the Brian Dutcher-Steve Fisher era to record a game with four blocks and five steals and he is one of just three players to do it this season.
- Since Dec. 8, San Diego State is 7-2 and is 1st nationally in fewest points allowed (54.3), opponent field goal percentage (35.1), opponent effective field goal percentage (41.4) and opponent two-point field goal percentage (38.6).
- Once again this season San Diego State ranks among the nation's best in defense. The Aztecs are 4th in scoring defense (56.8), 3rd in effective field goal percentage (42.3), 3rd in field goal percentage defense (36.9) and 19th in three-point field goal percentage defense (28.9). In addition, the Aztecs are 3rd in Kenpom adjusted defensive efficiency (85.2).

- SDSU head coach **Brian Dutcher** is in his fifth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 23rd season on the Aztec sidelines. In his four plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, a 108-36 overall record and has already been named the national coach of the year and twice named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. Among first time head coaches who started in the 2017-18 season, Dutcher's 107 wins are the most and he is the only head coach in the group to reach triple-digit victories.

TIMES & BROADCAST PARTNERS REVEALED FOR WYOMING & FRESNO STATE GAMES

San Diego State's home game against Fresno State, scheduled for Thursday, March 3, will tip at 8 p.m. PT and the contest will be shown on CBS Sports Network, the Mountain West Conference announced Wednesday. In addition, the team's game at Wyoming on Feb. 28 will also be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and will tip at 7 p.m. MT.

The games were announced on Jan. 31, but start time and television plans for the contests were not available prior to today. The Fresno State game was originally scheduled for Jan. 5, and the Wyoming game on Jan. 12, but were postponed due to COVID-19-related concerns within each program.

The Aztecs improved to 12-5 and 4-2 in Mountain West Conference play with a 72-47 victory over New Mexico Monday night at Viejas Arena. Junior forward Keshad Johnson had a 14-point, 10 rebound double double for the Aztecs, who became the first team in the last 42 seasons to defeat the Lobos by 20 or more points in three consecutive games.

AZTECS DON'T MISS A BEAT WITH DUTCHER

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 23 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he experienced 384 victories, 10 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each year.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons.
- His 96 wins in his first four seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first four campaigns.
- His 108 wins to date are the most of any first-time head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season, and he is one of two in that group who has reached triple digit wins (also: Bob Richey, Furman).

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State playing its eighth road/neutral contest of the season, at Colorado State on Friday, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 89-55 (.618) record in road games is the **ninth best in the nation**.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 142-81 (.637) record in road/neutral games is the **ninth best in the nation**.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 62-41 (.602) in road games against the Mountain West, **which leads the conference**.
- In 2019-20, the Aztecs' 16 road/neutral road wins were the most in the nation.

SWEET HOME CALIFORNIA

In the first 16 games of the campaign, from UC Riverside (11/9) to Boise State (1/22), the Aztecs played 12 contests in the state of California. Here is how important that is:

- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 194-35 (.847) in games played in the state of California.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 165-23 (.878) in games played in Viejas Arena.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament eight of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the seventh-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 179-24 home record, winning 88.2 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2021-22 season underway, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:

- In its last 207 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 183-24 (.884) mark, including a 123-24 (.837) record against conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 135-20 (.871) at home, including a 74-11 (.871) record in conference home contests during that stretch.
- The Aztecs are 61-9 (.871) in their last 70 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- San Diego State is 36-4 (.900) at home in its last 40 games, with an average scoring margin of +15.3 points. Of the 40 home games, 28 were decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs are 34-4 (.895) in their 38 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State is 43-5 (.896) in its last 48 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs 11-game non-conference home court win streak, snapped on Dec. 18, 2020, by Brigham Young, is the seventh-longest in school history and longest since a 13-game win streak from Dec. 16, 2000 to Nov. 23, 2002.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State received a dominating performance on its return to the friendly environs of Viejas Arena Monday, cruising past New Mexico, 72-47, as the duo of Keshad Johnson and Matt Bradley scored 14 points apiece to help spark the victory.

With the win, the Aztecs (12-5, 4-2 Mountain West) emerged triumphant for the 15th time in the last 19 meetings against the Lobos and became the first team to defeat UNM by 20 or more points in three consecutive meetings. In addition, SDSU improves to 13-1 in its last 14 games immediately following a loss.

Johnson, who set a season-best with his point production on 6-of-10 shooting, also pulled down 10 rebounds for his second career double-double, while Lamont Butler finished with nine points and matched his personal best with six boards while adding four assists.

In addition, the Aztec cause was advanced by Trey Pulliam, who led all players with six assists, while Nathan Mensah came up with a career-best five steals to go with a game-high four blocks.

Collectively, SDSU connected on 26 of 58 of its field-goal attempts (.448) while sinking 11 of 14 free throws (.786). The Aztecs' deft ball movement was on full display, maintaining a robust 19-8 advantage in assists and while outscoring UNM on the fastbreak by a sizeable 25-1 margin.

San Diego State led throughout, but the Lobos (8-14, 1-8 MW) remained within striking distance for much of the first half, narrowing the gap to 25-20 on a three-pointer by Jamal Mashburn, Jr. with just under eight minutes left.

The Aztec defense clamped down for the rest of the period, however, as the visitors misfired on six straight field goals and sank just two foul shots during an 11-2 surge that gave the Scarlet and Black a 36-22 lead by intermission. Bradley keyed the run with seven points, including a triple after a Mensah steal.

SDSU maintained the momentum in the early stages of the second half, employing 13-4 blitz over the first 4:16 to build an insurmountable 49-26 advantage. Butler tallied five of his points during that span, while Johnson added four points and grabbed three rebounds.

The Aztecs enjoyed their biggest lead of the night at 67-39 following a Chad Baker-Mazara dunk with 4:27 remaining.

New Mexico was led by KJ Jenkins' game-high 16 points, while Mashburn, Jr. added 10 points in the defeat.

The Lobos shot just 30.8 percent from the field on 16-of-52 attempts. Consequently, SDSU moved to 12-2 this season when limiting the opposition to under 40 percent shooting.

San Diego State returns to the court on Friday, Feb. 4, when it travels to the Front Range of the Rockies to battle Colorado State at Moby Arena in Fort Collins, Colorado. The Aztecs-Rams showdown is set to tip off at 7 p.m. MT/6 p.m. PT and will be broadcast on FS1.

SERIES HISTORY VS. COLORADO STATE

This is the 90th meeting between Colorado State and San Diego State with the Aztecs owning a 47-42 advantage in the series, including a 35-15 lead in the Mountain West era.

- The Aztecs once trailed the series, 29-12, (SDSU is 35-13 since that time) and the last time the series was last tied was in 2017-18 (41-41).
- The Aztecs are 29-14 at home against the Rams, including 19-4 in Viejas Arena, and have a 16-2 home record against CSU since the start of the 2002-03 season.
- SDSU has won 25 of the last 32 versus the Rams and 27 of the last 33 regular-season matchups.
- San Diego State's two longest winning streaks against Colorado State are a nine-game run from Jan. 29, 2008 to March 5, 2011 & a five-game streak which started on Jan. 2, 2018 and was snapped on Jan. 2, 2021.
- 17 of the last 22 meetings between the teams have been decided by 11 points or less (the outliers came in 2015 in Las Vegas when the game was decided by 13 points, SDSU's 19-point win at home in 2017-18, the Aztecs 22-point victory on Dec. 4, 2019, a 13-point triumph on Jan. 4, 2021, and 30-point dismantling earlier this season).
- SDSU has held Colorado State below 50 percent from the field in each of the last 32 encounters (CSU shot 50.9 percent on March 8, 2007).
- When SDSU shot 55.6 percent from the field on Jan. 24, 2018, 51.9 percent Feb. 12, 2019 and 55.8 percent on Jan. 4, 2021, it marked the only times either team shot 50 percent or better from the field in any of the last 25 meetings.
- In 30 of the last 32 meetings (25 of which have been won by SDSU), the Aztecs have held Colorado State to 40.7 percent from the field (697-of-1,711).
- San Diego State has nine turnovers or less in 13 of the last 23 meetings (232 total; 10.0 tpg).
- The Aztecs have hosted Colorado State four times in its Mountain West home opener and are 4-1 in those games. (81-69 on Jan. 19, 2002, 83-75 on Jan. 4, 2006, 79-72 in overtime on Jan. 12, 2013, 67-70 on Jan. 2, 2021 & 79-49 on Jan. 8, 2022).

LAST TIME VS. COLORADO STATE

San Diego State 79, Colorado State 49

Jan. 8, 2022 | Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena | San Diego, Calif. | Attn: 10,323

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had just blown out previously undefeated No. 20 Colorado State when coach Brian Dutcher said the Aztecs are still trying to find their rhythm and that their best basketball is still ahead.

That's a scary thought, especially if the Aztecs continue to play defense like they did Saturday.

Matt Bradley scored 26 points and the short-handed Aztecs raced past the Rams 79-49 in a game that wasn't supposed to be played until March 1. Chad Baker-Mazara added 14 points for SDSU, (10-3, 2-0 Mountain West), which outscored the Rams 43-17 in the second half for its largest margin of victory ever against a ranked team.

Colorado State had been one of three undefeated teams left in Division I coming into Saturday. But the Rams were held to just 27.9% shooting from the field and were outrebounded 38-21. The Aztecs also blocked eight of the Rams' shots.

"It's just our culture," Dutcher said. "We just say from Day 1 when you get here, 'You're going to defend and rebound if you're going to play at San Diego State.' That's it. You have to defend and rebound. And we don't use being short-handed as an excuse. I tell them, 'I never worry about who I don't have. I've just got to get the ones I do have ready to play.'"

Isaiah Stevens had 19 and David Roddy 17 for Colorado State.

Lamont Butler, who returned from a broken wrist, had 11 for SDSU while Aguek Arop and Keshad Johnson had 10 apiece.

"When we score like that, I mean it is hard to beat us," Butler said. "Every game we're going to come out with a high defensive mentality. It's what we do. It's our culture. If we play together on the offensive end, it's going to be hard to beat us, for sure."

The Aztecs were scheduled to play Nevada on Saturday but the game was postponed due to COVID-19 issues with the Wolf Pack. The Rams (11-1, 1-1) were supposed to have played at Boise State on Friday night, but that game also was postponed due to COVID-19 concerns. The Mountain West adjusted the schedule on Wednesday and sent the Rams to San Diego.

Bradley, a senior transfer from California, came on strong late in the first half and stayed hot in the second half in his highest-scoring game of the season. He hit consecutive 3-pointers to help the Aztecs extend a four-point halftime lead to 40-34, and just a few minutes later made consecutive turnaround jumpers to push the lead to 49-36.

"Matt Bradley was sensational," Dutcher said. "He got to his spot and he was shooting contested shots over people, foul line, 3-pointers, mid-post. He was just going to work."

Bradley hit a 3-pointer to give SDSU a 19-12 lead with just more than nine minutes left in the first half. The Rams came back to tie it several times, the last at 30-30 on two free throws by Roddy with 2:03 left. Bradley then hit a jumper to put the Aztecs ahead and then had a layup right before the buzzer to give him 14 points at the break.

Baker-Mazara scored seven straight points late in the game — on consecutive dunks and then a 3-pointer. The first dunk was set up when Butler came flying in to block a 3-pointer by John Tonje and the second one came after Baker-Mazara's steal.

BIG PICTURE

San Diego State: Butler returned after missing five games with a broken left wrist. But Adam Seiko and Joshua Tomaic, regulars in the rotation, were among several members of the SDSU program who missed the game due to the COVID-19 protocol (including walk-ons and managers).

Colorado State: The Rams appeared to be at close to full strength. They have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for four straight weeks, a first in school history. The last time they were in the AP poll was late December 2014.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 400-306 vs. current members of the Mountain West Conference and had won 16-straight matchups against its conference opponents, prior to its loss to Boise State (Jan. 22).
- The Aztecs are 94-93 away from home against members of the Mountain West since the start of the 1999-00 season. Of those 94 victories, 48 have come by 10 or more points.
- On its home floor, the SDSU has a 235-90 (72.3 percent) record against the Mountain West, has won 12 of its last 13 league games and has outscored its opponents by 14.6 points per game in those contests.
- Overall San Diego State has won 56.7 percent (400-306) of its games against the current Mountain West teams (H: 235-90, A: 131-196, N: 34-20).

- Entering 2021-22 has averaged 1.5:1 assist-to-turnover ratio and 1.4 turnovers per 40 minutes played.
- In 5 games competing for the Ugandan National Team in AfroBasket 2021, averaged 13.0 points (.488 FG%, .469 3FG% & 1.000 FT%), 3.4 rebounds, 2.5 assists & 1.2 steals.

MATT BRADLEY NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

SAN DIEGO – San Diego State guard Matt Bradley has been named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Jan. 9. The announcement was made from the league office in Colorado Springs, Colo., on Monday morning.

In dismantling the previously unbeaten and 20th-ranked Colorado State Rams, 79-49, Bradley scored a game and season-high 26 points, pulled down seven rebounds and had a pair of steals in 31:47 of court action.

The San Bernardino, Calif., native was 10-of-17 (.588) from the field, including 4-of-6 (.667) from the bonus distance, and 2-of-2 from the line. His 10 field goals and four 3-pointers are season-bests, and his two steals matched his season best. His 26 points were just three off his career high. Bradley scored in double figures for the seventh straight game and the 11th time this season.

The senior guard's first two points came on a pair of free throws just over two minutes into the game, but he then missed three of his first four field goal attempts, including a 3-pointer. He made his second bucket, a layup with 6:34 to play before intermission to give SDSU a 24-22 lead, and over his succeeding 22:10 went 8-of-12 (.667) from the floor, including 4-of-5 (.800) from distance.

With less than two minutes to play in the first half, his jumper in the lane put San Diego State up 32-30, a lead that the Aztecs would never relinquish.

He missed his first field goal attempt of the second half, but on the ensuing two possessions, banged home a pair of 3-pointers to extend SDSU's lead to nine, 43-34. He scored twice more, on a pair of jumpers as the route was on.

The 30-point victory is the largest against an opponent ranked in the AP Top 25 in program history. SDSU improved to 7-3 against ranked Mountain West teams and in its last two games held its opponents, both Mountain West teams, to less than 30.0 percent shooting.

This is Bradley's first Mountain West Player of the Week honor, the third conference player of the week distinction of his collegiate career, having won two Pac-12 Player of the Week awards while he was at California, and the second for an Aztec in as many weeks.

KESHAD JOHNSON NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

SAN DIEGO – San Diego State's Keshad Johnson has been named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Jan. 2. The announcement was made from the league office in Colorado Springs, Colo., on Monday morning.

In winning its conference opener on Saturday, 62-55 over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas, he scored 10 points, grabbed 11 rebounds and had a block to help improve the Aztecs record to 9-3 on the year and 1-0 in league games.

Johnson's 11 boards led the team and are a season high, and his three offensive rebounds matches his season best. The three offensive boards, all pulled down in the first half, were turned into seven of the Aztecs 16 second chance points in the game.

Four of those 16 points were scored by the Oakland, Calif., native himself. His first two offensive rebounds led to both the Aztecs first bucket of the game, a Matt Bradley 3-pointer, and a Johnson putback with 1:01 to play in the first half to push SDSU's advantage to six points, 35-29.

The first of Johnson's 10 points came on a pair of free throws w/ 5:14 left in the first half and tied the game at 25-25. From there San Diego State trailed just once more in the game. In the contest, he shot .500 from the floor (4-of-8), knocked down 2-of-3 from the line, and committed just one turnover in 30 minutes of game action.

Johnson predominantly covered UNLV's Bryce Hamilton when he was on the floor and held the 44.0 percent shooter to just 31.5 percent and more than three points below his season average of 18.6 points per outing. For the game, the Aztecs limited the Runnin' Rebels to just 29.7 percent shooting, a season-low for UNLV which came into the game hitting 42.6 percent from the floor.

This is the first Mountain West weekly award of the season for an Aztec this season, and the first of Johnson's career.

BRADLEY INCLUDED ON WOODEN, NAISMITH & JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LISTS

Senior Matt Bradley has been included on three of the most prestigious watch lists in college basketball.

On Monday it was revealed that he is one of 50 players to be included on the Naismith National Player of the Year watch list.

On Tuesday he was named one of the early favorites to earn the 2022 John R. Wooden Award Men's Player of the Year and is the first Aztec to garner the honors recognition since Malachi Flynn appeared on the national ballot in 2020.

In 2020-21, his third and final season competing for California, Bradley was 1-of-5 players in Division I to average 18.0 point per game, while shooting at least 45.5 percent from the floor, 36.4 percent from distance, a minimum of 82.1 percent from the line, and grab 4.6 rebounds per game. Except for his rebounding average, those other statistics would have all ranked the top-5 in the Mountain West last year. In addition, the San Bernardino, Calif., native, was one of 23 players in a Power-5 conference to shoot at least 45.5 percent overall and 36.4 percent from the bonus distance in 2020-21 and would have been the only player in the Mountain West to compile those stats last season.

A 2020-21 second-team All-Pac12 performer, he scored in double figures in 21 of the 22 games in which he appeared, finishing with 15+ points 15 times, and 20+ points 11 times, including a career-high 29 points vs. Colorado (2/13). His 11 20+ point games ranked No. 2 in the Pac-12 in 2020-21.

Over a three-year, 85 game career with the Bears, he scored 1,292 points and left California as the program's No. 21 career scorer. The 2021-22 Mountain West Preseason Newcomer of the Year is one of 12 players nationally to score at least 1,290 points in the last three seasons.

Bradley is the only player in the Mountain West conference to be included on the watch list.

Just under two weeks ago, Bradley was included on the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's initial watch list for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the most prestigious individual honor a collegiate shooting guard can earn.

AZTECS INK TWO 4-STAR PROSPECTS

SAN DIEGO – One of the most exciting days of the year is National Signing Day and fans of San Diego State men's basketball have a lot to be excited about. The Aztecs have inked a pair of 4-star recruits in **Elijah Saunders** and **Miles Byrd**. Head men's basketball coach Brian Dutcher made the announcement on Wednesday afternoon.

Saunders is a 6-8, 220-pound forward who will graduate from Sunnyslope High School in Phoenix, Ariz., this year. He is a 4-star recruit, nationally ranked No. 115 at his position and No. 23 at power forward and No. 8 in Arizona according to 247Sports, who has a big body and is equally comfortable down on the block as well as beyond the 3-point line. Saunders can run the floor, has a quick release, and scores with his back to the basket as well as off the bounce. He has shown the ability to attack closeouts, handle the ball, & finish thru contact.

As a junior, the No. 145 ranked recruit in the nation, according to Rivals, averaged 15.7 points, 6.5 rebounds, and 2.0 assists in 22 games according to Maxpreps. Sunnyslope finished the season on an 11-game winning streak and were 21-1 overall on its way to the 2021 Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) Conference 6A Boys Basketball State Championship and were ranked No. 4 in the state. Saunders was named to The Arizona Republic All-Arizona team.

In 2019-20, Saunders sophomore season, Sunnyslope was 23-6, including 9-3 in 5A League action. The team finished the year ranked No. 11 in the state. In his freshman year, Saunders played at Rancho Solano Prep in Scottsdale, Ariz., and averaged 5.8 points and 3.6 rebounds. Saunders chose San Diego State over 24 other offers, including Miami, Notre Dame, South Carolina, St. John's and Virginia, as well as Mountain West programs UNLV, New Mexico, Nevada, Fresno State and San Jose State.

Byrd is a 6-7, 185-pound shooting guard who will graduate this year from Lincoln High School in Stockton, Calif. A four-star prospect, according to 247 Sports, Byrd is nationally rated as the No. 162 recruit, the No. 20 shooting guard and No. 15 in California. The lefty is the prototypical Aztec shooting guard.

He averaged a team-leading 19.0 points, 3.5 steals and 2.2 blocks in an eight-game COVID-19 shortened 2020-21 season. His 5.7 rebounds and 3.5 assists ranked second on the squad.

In a 28-game sophomore campaign his numbers were 12.3 points, 6.4 rebounds, 2.8 assists, 2.4 steals per game. Per 32 minutes played, he averaged 17.8 points, 9.3 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and 3.2 steals. Lincoln posted a 25-4 overall record, including 10-2 in Tri-City Athletic League play and competed in the CIF-Sac Joaquin Section 2020 Division I Boys Basketball Championship. Combined he shot better than 40 percent from the floor over the last two seasons.

His father, Calvin Byrd, is a former college basketball player and coach, most recently working at The University of the Pacific in Stockton.

Byrd chose the Aztecs over ten other programs, including Washington, California, Stanford, Villanova, Saint Mary's, and Minnesota, as well as Mountain West programs Colorado State, New Mexico, and San Jose State.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH SECOND IN PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won a Mountain West-record 14 titles in men's basketball (eight regular season & six tournament), six more than any other Mountain West program, and despite that winning both the regular season and tournament crowns last season, has been predicted to finish in second by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last eight years. It is also the 13th time in the last 17 years that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the Mountain West's preseason poll. The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in seven of the last eight years.

- San Diego State and Colorado State have played five times in the Aztecs league home opener and SDSU is 4-1 in those games, 81-69 on Jan. 19, 2002, 83-75 on Jan. 4, 2006, 79-72 in overtime on Jan. 12, 2013, 67-70 on Jan. 2, 2021 and Saturday's 79-49 destruction of No. 20 Colorado State.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- San Diego State opened the 2021-22 season defeating in-state foe in UC Riverside and played six of its 11 non-conference games against California opponents, going 5-1 in those contests.
- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 120-34 (.779) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 92 home games against those same 24 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 81-11 (.880).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 454-324 (.584) overall.

ALL-AMERICAN RECRUITS?

San Diego State signees **Elijah Saunders** (Sunnyslope High; Phoenix, Ariz.) and **Miles Byrd** (Lincoln High; Stockton, Calif.) were both included on the initial list to compete in the 2022 McDonald's All-American Game.

Final roster of 24 boys, in an East vs. West format, will be announced on Jan. 25 on ESPN's "NBA Today" show, and the game will be played March 29 in Chicago's Wintrust Arena.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- With its 62-55 win at UNLV (1/1), San Diego State has a 39-37 lead in the all-time series with the Runnin' Rebels. At one time, the Aztecs trailed 26-6 in the series, but is 33-11 in the last 44 meetings between the teams.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 36 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 31 victories.



Head Coach

Fifth Season • 23rd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fifth season as San Diego State head coach after four years in which he led the Aztecs to four Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th Mountain West crowns and two NCAA tournament bids. He is the only coach in the 100-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons at the helm of the program.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State won the league's regular season and tournament crowns to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, where it was a 6-seed. For the second straight year, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened the season with a win over No. 22 UCLA and just over two weeks later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the Mountain West title game for the fourth straight season and earned a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, the team that had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title,

and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.



San Diego State 66 UC Riverside 53

SAN DIEGO — Matt Bradley led all scorers with 23 points and Trey Pulliam added 15 as the San Diego State men's basketball team defeated the UC Riverside Highlanders 66-53 to open the 2021-22 season on Tuesday night in Viejas Arena.

"Obviously, it's a very good Riverside team and we knew this would be a test," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "We prepared hard for it. They were good, but our defense over the years has been good and it was good again tonight. We knew they had to make a lot of threes to beat us. They caught us in some help situations where they kicked it out. They're well coached and they're disciplined, and they play the right way. We had enough grit and toughness about us to be productive at both ends of the floor. I thought Trey Pulliam did a good job getting to his mid-range game and Matt Bradley attacked the paint well. We played downhill against them and we weren't just stuck on the perimeter. We were aggressive getting downhill to the basket and I thought that helped us."

Bradley's 23 points are the most for an Aztec (1-0) in his debut since Jerome Habel scored 23 against California on Nov. 18, 2006. Bradley has scored in double figures in 14 straight games.

San Diego State's win over UC Riverside (0-1) was its 12th in as many tries and is the second longest active winning streak for the program against any opponent. It is also the 16th straight victory against an in-state opponent, the 20th straight against a Big West foe and the ninth consecutive season opening win.

The lead changed five times in the first 13 minutes, but a layup by Keshad Johnson with 6:55 to go in the half gave San Diego State a 22-20 lead, one it would not relinquish. The Aztecs used a 10-0 run late in the half to build a double-digit lead and took a 40-30 advantage into halftime.

UC Riverside got the lead down to four points three times in the second half before the Aztecs put the game away and won by 13.

Pulliam reached double figure scoring for the fifth time in the last six games and Nathan Mensah added eight points, 10 rebounds and a pair of blocks. He has 102 blocks in his career and is now tied with Billy White for No. 8 on the program's career blocked shots list.

San Diego State next travels to Brigham Young for a Friday matchup with the Cougars in Provo. The tip is scheduled for 7 p.m. MT.

"Well, obviously this is a major road game played in second game of the year," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "And I knew we weren't playing up to what we're going to be down this down the road, but I thought we competed hard enough to keep ourselves in the game and give ourselves a chance to win. We have to execute better at times. But I liked our grit. I liked our fight, like the way we got on the ball after loose balls, got on the floor, dove after it, and competed at a high level. Obviously, the keys of the game were trying to contain Barcello. He made the big basket at the end and to keep Lohner off the glass and he had the big tip and at the end. So we worked hard all game to prevent those things, but at the end those are the two players that made the plays that kind of sealed the victory for them."

In a closely contested game in which neither team led by more than six points, sophomore Keith Dinwiddie Jr. connected on a three-point field goal to give the Aztecs a 54-53 lead with 6:19 to play. It was San Diego State's final lead of the evening.

Brigham Young responded with an 8-2 run. Alex Barcello, who scored a team-high 17 points, scored six points during that spurt that put the Cougars up 61-56.

The Aztecs cut the deficit to three points on two occasions but was unable to draw any closer.

NATHAN CAN'T MISS

As previously mentioned, Nathan Mensah tied a career-high with 18 points on the strength of 6-of-7 shooting from the field. The senior is now 10-for-11 from the floor in his two games this season. He went 4-for-4 from the field in the season opener against UC Riverside.

DEFENSE RULES

San Diego State limited Brigham Young to 38.6 percent field goal shooting. It marked just the second time in the last 43 games (41-2) that the Aztecs have lost when limiting the opposition to 40 percent or less from the field.

Pulliam's floater gave the Aztecs a 64-63 lead. ASU missed three 3-pointers in the final 16 seconds, including a desperation shot by Jamiya Neal with three seconds left, after Bradley made one of two free throws.

Marreon Jackson scored 16 and Kimani Lawrence had 14 points and 12 rebounds for ASU.

Arizona State took a 39-30 lead early in the second half before SDSU used a 12-0 run to take the lead. Butler and Adam Seiko had 3-pointers and Mensah a slam dunk after rebounding a missed free throw by Butler.

ASU worked the lead back to four before SDSU came back on 3-pointers by Butler and Seiko. ASU's last lead was 63-61 on Jackson's jumper with 1:43 left.

Both teams shot poorly. SDSU shot 39.2% while ASU shot 37.3%. ASU made only 6 of 28 3-pointers (21.4%) while SDSU made 6 of 21 (28.6%).

ASU led 30-28 at halftime.

SAN DIEGO -- Senior Matt Bradley had 15 points and six rebounds and senior Trey Pulliam added 11 points as San Diego State defeated UT Arlington, 68-62, at Viejas Arena on Saturday night.

"We did everything we had to do to try to get them ready to play tonight," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "It's the first time in a long time where we've actually played live (at shootaround), because I didn't think they were engaged enough and mentally ready to play and that's on me. That's my job as the head coach. One of my job's is to get them ready to play and the other is to put them in a position to win and I have to do a better job of both. I always say it's better to learn in a win rather than a defeat, and that's what we did. We have a lot of lessons to learn."

The Aztecs (3-1) connected on 30-of-34 free throw attempts in the contest. The 30 makes were the most since March 1, 2006 and the 88.2 percent from the line on at least 30 attempts was its highest in the last 26 seasons.

The Mavs (1-4) kept the game close throughout, with San Diego State never building an advantage greater than 10 points.

The game was tied at 46 with 8:38 to play, when the Aztecs went on a 9-0 run. Nathan Mensah and Bradley combined for three free throws and Lamont Butler followed with a three-pointer in transition and Bradley capped the run with a trey of his own.

"We've just got to pay respects to Texas Arlington," senior guard Matt Bradley said. "They came in here and really battled. It was a battle from the start to the end and, I think it took certain plays for us to wake up. They were crashing the glass hard, something we've been working on throughout the season. And I think we've just got to continue to keep our mental (state) right, and just get better every day."

For the fourth game this season, San Diego State held its opponent to under 70 points, and less than 40 percent shooting from the floor. The Aztecs are 65-5 in the Dutcher era (since the start of the 2017-18 season) when they limit the opponents to less than 40 percent shooting and are 31-8 when they hold an opponent to between 60-69 points.

THE NOTE

San Diego State is now 35-1 the last 36 times it has attempted more free throws than its opponent.

ANAHEIM, Calif. -- Matt Bradley scored 18 points, Lamont Butler added a career-high 16 and the San Diego State Aztecs used a 15-to-1 second half run to pull away from the Georgetown Hoyas and give head coach Brian Dutcher the 100th victory of his career in a 73-56 win in the semifinal game of the Paycom Wooden Legacy in Anaheim Arena.

Coach Dutcher reached the milestone in his 132nd game leading the Aztecs. In comparison, Aztec Hall of Fame coach Steve Fisher reached 100 victories at San Diego State in his 205th game on the Mesa.

San Diego State (4-1) shot a season-high 48.3 percent (29-of-60) from the floor which included seven three pointers. Butler was perfect from the field going 6-of-6, including three 3-pointers. He is the first Aztec in 26 seasons to be perfect from the field, sinking at least six field goals, three from the bonus distance.

The game went back and forth for the first 15 minutes. But tied at 28-28 and 4:07 to go before the intermission, the Aztecs went on a 12-4 run to close the half and take a 40-32 lead into the break. Four players contributed to the run with the last five coming from Adam Seiko, who hit a three at the buzzer. SDSU shot 54.8 percent in the first 20 minutes and had 12 assists on 17 made buckets.

The second half saw SDSU open with a 14-7 spurt to increase the advantage to 15 points, 54-39 with 15:14 to play. Butler contributed 10 points in the run. The game looked to be in hand, but the Hoyas made a run over the following five and a half minutes and cut the lead to 57-53 with 9:39 to play.

However, from there the vaunted Aztec defense took over. San Diego State did not surrender a field goal for the remainder of the game. The Hoyas (2-2) missed seven shots, SDSU forced them into seven turnovers and used a 15-1 run to blow the game open, en route to the 17-point victory.

San Diego State will play for the championship of the Paycom Wooden Legacy on Friday, Nov. 26 against Southern California. Tip is scheduled for 8:30 p.m. and the game will be broadcast on ESPN2.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Trey Pulliam scored 11 points, while Lamont Butler and Aguek Arop each had nine, but the No. 24 Southern California Trojans, were able to limit the San Diego State Aztecs to 32.1 percent shooting and defeated SDSU 58-43 in the championship game of the Paycom Wooden Legacy on Friday night.

"It was a defensive struggle in the first half, no question about that," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "The only separation we gave them was that we missed three one-on-ones in a row and they had a basket right before the half, which gave them a little lead. I tried to encourage the team, a seven-point game at halftime is nothing in college basketball. But we let them come out and get a run on us early in the second half and they built a 15-point lead. We fought, cut it back to eight, but they're a good defensive team, they played good defense on us."

Isaiah Mobley scored 18 points and had 12 rebounds, Drew Peterson added 16 points and Chevez Goodwin finished with 10 as the Trojans improved to 6-0. They held the Aztecs to just 15 points in the first half.

San Diego State (4-2) was held to its lowest-scoring opening half since 14 points against Air Force on Jan. 12, 2019.

The Aztecs had just one first-half assist on six made baskets, and seven total assists in the game. San Diego State also lost the rebounding battle, with USC pulling down 49 to SDSU's 33.

Both teams struggled to score before halftime, but the Trojans went on an 8-0 run in the final 5:29 to lead 22-15 at the break. San Diego State shot just 23.1% from the field in the first half, while USC was not much better at 33.3%.

USC started the second half on a 10-2 run to take a 32-17 lead with 15:56 remaining in the game. The Aztecs didn't reach the 20-point mark until a 3-pointer by Aguek Arop with 15:03 to play.

Boogie Ellis, who started the game leading USC in scoring at 17.0 points per game, was held to just two points on 1-of-6 shooting.

SAN DIEGO - Trey Pulliam scored 16 points, including the first four in an 18-2 run in the first half that gave San Diego State control en route to a 72-47 win against Long Beach State on Tuesday night at Viejas Arena.

"It was nice to have a little breathing room today," Aztecs head coach Brian Dutcher said. "We created a lead, maintained it, built on it, so we weren't playing in a nail-biter like we've played in the last couple of games. It was good to get out on the break; we worked hard on that. I told the guys if we got stops and rebounds, we'd have the opportunity to run. We've been getting stops, but we haven't been rebounding. We did a little better job of rebounding until the very end, and that allowed us to get out on the fast break."

Matt Bradley had 12 points and Keith Dinwiddie scored 12 off the bench for SDSU (5-2), which beat Long Beach State (2-5) for the seventh straight time and the 15th time in 16 games. Lamont Butler scored 11.

Colin Slater led Long Beach State with eight points.

The Aztecs bounced back from a rough performance in a 58-43 loss to No. 20 Southern California on Friday night in the title game of the Wooden Legacy in Anaheim.

San Diego State will play at No. 24 Michigan on Saturday. It will be coach Brian Dutcher's first time back at Crisler Center since he was on the staffs of Bill Frieder and Steve Fisher from the 1988-89 season until Fisher was fired before the 1997-98 season. Dutcher had a hand in recruiting the Fab Five, including Juwan Howard, who is in his third season as Michigan's coach.

Dutcher followed Fisher to SDSU in 1999 and was elevated to head coach after Fisher retired following the 2016-17 season.

The Aztecs trailed 13-12 when they went on an 18-2 run to take control. Pulliam scored the first four points of the run, on a reverse layup off a turnover and a floater after Lamont Butler stole the ball.

Butler and Chad Baker-Mazara made 3-pointers and Keshad Johnson had a windmill slam dunk to make it 28-15. Dinwiddie made two free throws to finish the run.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Matt Bradley scored 22 points, one of his season high, but it wasn't enough in San Diego State's 72-58 loss at No. 24 Michigan on Saturday afternoon in the Crisler Center.

"I've challenged this team," Aztecs head coach Brian Dutcher said. "I've given us a really difficult schedule. We set a game plan. Michigan had been struggling from three; they were shooting I think 29 percent for the year. (Michigan center Hunter) Dickinson had made one three all year and people basically weren't guarding him. And to his credit, he stepped up and made three today. They (average) five as a team. I think they hit 11 today... 11-for-20. So when you run into a team that shoots that high percentage from three, especially in their home gym, it's hard to get a win."

Aztec senior forward Nathan Mensah had two blocks and moved into a tie with San Diego State Hall of Famer Michael Cage for fourth place on the program's career blocks list with 118.

Dickinson had 23 points and 14 rebounds, freshman Caleb Houston scored a season-high 17 points for the Wolverines.

The Wolverines (5-3) led by just two points at halftime, coming off a 21-point loss at North Carolina. They bounced back and pulled away with a 17-2 run to take a 64-45 lead.

The Aztecs (5-3) were led by Bradley's 22 points and Keshad Johnson had seven rebounds to lead SDSU.

"We played a solid first half," Dutcher said. "We wore down. Trey (Pulliam) wore down. All the things we put on the board; win the free throw battle, we led that at half (and) won that for the game. Win the rebounding war. We were up two rebounds in the first half, and I think they outrebounded us by three. So, we had some keys to the game. Taking away the three was not one of them. That was intentional. Obviously, we rolled the dice, and they made a lot of threes today and that always wins college games. I don't think we give up more than five a game when we concentrate on that. We had a different set of thoughts about this game. We're going to give them some threes, and to their credit they stepped up and made them."

FAMILIAR FACE

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher helped recruit Michigan coach Juwan Howard to play for the Wolverines three decades ago when he was an assistant under Steve Fisher. Dutcher 10 seasons as an assistant at Michigan from 1988-89 through 1997-98. He succeeded Fisher at San Diego State in 2017.

SAN DIEGO - Three Aztecs scored in double figures and the San Diego State men's basketball team hit a season-best eight three pointers in a 66-56 victory over the Cal State Fullerton Titans on Wednesday night in Viejas Arena.

"I know I've said this before and I'm going say it again. 'It's hard to win a college basketball game,'" Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "I don't care where you're playing, who you're playing, it's hard to win a game. And to our credit, we found a way to win. Everybody deals with adversity. You know, not having Lamont (Butler); Tairou (Daibate) is out; AG (Ageuek Arop), he couldn't go. At pregame meal today, Josh (Tomaic) said he didn't think he could play because his hip was bothering him. He missed two days of practice and just went to walk-through today and he found a way to gut it out and give us valuable minutes when Keshad got in foul trouble. So, can we play better? 100 percent we can play better. But did we play good enough to win tonight? Yes, we did. And so, I'm happy with that."

Matt Bradley led the offensive charge with his second consecutive game with 22 points. He also chipped in with a share of the team lead with three assists and added two rebounds and a steal. Trey Pulliam finished with 15 points, career-bests with seven boards and four steals as well as three assists and a block. Adam Seiko with 11 points, his first double digit scoring effort of the year and chipped in with three rebounds, two steals and an assist.

Leading by a point, 52-51 with 3:57 to play, Bradley took over. He made the second and third of three straight buckets from the San Bernardino native, and he then assisted on a Seiko 3-pointer to give San Diego State (6-3) a six-point cushion which it pushed to double digits by the final horn.

The Aztecs limited the Cal State Fullerton (4-5) to 38.9 percent shooting in the game; the sixth time in eight games this season SDSU has held its opponent to less than 40 percent from the floor. San Diego State equaled a season-best with 15 assists and used those on 24 made baskets.

Both its 11 steals and 16 turnovers forced are the second most in a game this year by the Aztecs and led to 21 points for San Diego State.

The Titan offense was led by Tray Maddox Jr.'s 15 points and Vincent Lee topped the squad with seven rebounds.

PHOENIX — Senior guard Trey Pulliam was one of three Aztecs in double figures and for the eighth time in 10 games San Diego State's men's basketball team limited its opponent to under 40 percent shooting in a 63-53 victory over the Saint Mary's Gaels at the Footprint Center.

Pulliam led all scorers with 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field, including going 1-of-1 from the bonus distance and was 2-of-2 from the line. In addition, he totaled a game-high six assists and had a steal. Matt Bradley recorded 14 points to go along with two assists, two rebounds and two steals and Adam Seiko equaled a career-best four 3-pointers on four attempts and finished with a season-high 12 points.

Leading 26-25 at the half, San Diego State (7-3) came out in the second half and built an 11-point advantage, 46-35 with 14:23 to play. It looked like SDSU would run away with the game, but Saint Mary's (10-3) had other ideas.

The Gaels went on a 13-3 run over the next seven minutes to slice the Aztecs' lead to a single point, 49-48 with 7:33 to go.

SDSU then sank five free throws followed by a Seiko three to push its advantage back to nine points. Saint Mary's then hit five unanswered points to cut its deficit to four, 57-53 with 2:49 left. From there Bradley hit a layup, and Pulliam added two free throws and another layup to secure the 63-53 victory.

Senior Forward Nathan Mensah dominated on the defensive end finishing with 13 rebounds, five points and three blocks. In two games against Saint Mary's, in the last two years, Mensah scored 23 points, grabbed 26 rebounds and blocked nine shots.

San Diego State returns to action on Wednesday, Dec. 22, when it hosts UC San Diego in Viejas Arena.

SAN DIEGO — Four Aztecs scored in double figures led by Nathan Mensah's career-high 19 points as the San Diego State men's basketball team cruised to a 78-57 victory over the UC San Diego Tritons 78-57 on Wednesday night at Viejas Arena.

"We shot the ball very well," Aztec head coach Brain Dutcher said. "I think it's the third or fourth game in a row where we really shot the three well. When we do that, we're a lot more dangerous. It opens everything up. Nathan Mensah was good around the basket today. He had the same looks against Saint Mary's and couldn't get them to fall. But to his credit, he kept his confidence up."

Mensah scored the game's first bucket, six of the team's first 10 points and finished the night 9-of-12 from the floor and 1-of-2 from the line. He added a game-high nine rebounds and blocked two shots. It was the 18th consecutive game the Aztecs, Ghana native has had at least one blocked shot and the eighth straight with multiple blocked shots.

In the first 20 minutes, San Diego State (8-3) hit 19-of-33 field goals for a season-best 57.6 percent for the half and finished the game shooting 54.1 percent (33-of-61), also a season high.

The Aztecs had 23 assists on 33 made baskets and hit a season-high nine 3-pointers. They outrebounded the Tritons 33-to-29, including 8-to-7 on the offensive glass and had a 7-to-2 advantage in second-chance points. SDSU forced 18 UCSD turnovers which they converted into 21 points.

SDSU used a 10-0 run in the first half to turn a seven-point game, 33-26 with 4:07 to go before halftime into a 17-point advantage with just under a 1:30 to go before intermission and took a 15 point, 45-30 lead into the break.

The Aztecs maintained its double-digit lead throughout the second half, with UC San Diego (6-5) get as close as 10 points with just under 12 minutes to play, but SDSU then went on a 14-0 run to blow the game open and cruised to the 21-point victory.

Joining Mensah in double figures were Keshad Johnson with 13 points on 6-of-8 from the field, including 1-of-2 from distance. He added seven rebounds, four assists and a career-best with three blocks. Matt Bradley also finished with 13 points, five rebounds, six assists and two steals. Adam Seiko wound up with 11 points, two assists, a steal.

LAS VEGAS - Matt Bradley had 17 points and seven rebounds and Keshad Johnson recorded his first career double double, 10 points and 11 rebounds, to carry San Diego State to a 62-55 win over UNLV on Saturday in each program's Mountain West Conference opener. The victory was San Diego State's 15th-straight against Mountain West Conference opponents and its 12th win against UNLV in Thomas & Mack Center in its last 13 tries.

San Diego State (9-3, 1-0) earned its fourth consecutive victory. Chad Baker added 11 points. Nathan Mensah had 10 points, seven rebounds and four blocks to move in to third place on the program's career blocked shots list. He has 130 rejections in his Aztecs career.

The Aztecs held UNLV to 29.7 percent field goal shooting. That is the lowest for the Runnin' Rebels since they shot 29.0 percent against No. 14 North Carolina on Nov. 30, 2020 (neutral site game). The last time they were held to this percentage or lower at Thomas & Mack Center was Jan. 4, 2017, against Boise State.

Trailing by as many as seven points, 20-13, midway through the first half, SDSU used a 22-12 run in the final nine minutes to take a three-point, 35-32 advantage into the intermission.

The San Diego State defense limited UNLV to 23 points in the second half, a season low for the team, and built a 10-point lead with just over half a minute to play before earning the seven point victory.

SDSU dominated the paint, outscoring UNLV 30-16 and it outrebounded the Runnin' Rebels, 55-42. For the Aztecs, it enjoyed season highs in offensive rebounds (19), defensive rebounds (36), total rebounds (55) and rebound margin (+13).

Donovan Williams had 16 points and three blocks for the Runnin' Rebels (8-6, 0-1), whose four-game win streak ended. Bryce Hamilton added 15 points. Royce Hamm Jr. had 14 rebounds.

San Diego State won the game despite being with out two starting guards in Trey Pulliam and Lamont Butler. The pair are averaging 20.3 of the team's 64.5 points per game.

THE BIG NOTE

SAN DIEGO - Matt Bradley scored 26 points and San Diego State handed No. 20 Colorado State its first loss of the season, 79-49 Saturday in a game that wasn't supposed to be played until March 1.

Chad Baker-Mazara added 14 points for SDSU, (10-3, 2-0 Mountain West), which outscored the Rams 43-17 in the second half for its largest victory margin ever against a ranked team. Colorado State had been one of three undefeated teams left in Division I coming into Saturday.

The Aztecs originally were scheduled to play Nevada on Saturday but that game was postponed due to COVID-19 issues with the Wolf Pack. The Rams (11-1, 1-1) were supposed to have played at Boise State on Friday night, but that game was postponed due to COVID-19 concerns with the Broncos. The Mountain West adjusted the schedule on Wednesday and sent the Rams to San Diego.

Isaiah Stevens had 19 and David Roddy 17 for Colorado State. Lamont Butler, who returned from a broken wrist, had 11 for SDSU while Aguek Arop had 10.

SDSU held the Rams to just 27.9% shooting from the field.

Bradley, a transfer from California, came on strong late in the first half and stayed hot in the second half in his highest-scoring game of the year. He hit consecutive 3-pointers to help SDSU push a four-point halftime lead to 40-34, and just a few minutes later made consecutive turnaround jumpers to push the lead to 49-36.

Bradley hit a 3-pointer to give SDSU a 19-12 lead with just more than nine minutes left. The Rams came back to tie it several times, the last at 30-30 on two free throws by Roddy with 2:03 left. Bradley then hit a jumper to put the Aztecs ahead and then had a layup right before the buzzer to give him 14 points at the break.

Baker-Mazara scored seven straight points late in the game, on consecutive dunks and then a 3-pointer. The first dunk was set up when Butler blocked a 3-pointer by John Tonje and the second one came after Baker-Mazara's steal.

SAN DIEGO — Playing its first game since Jan. 8, San Diego State dropped a 42-37 decision to visiting Boise State in a defensive struggle Saturday night at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs (10-4, 2-1 MW) utilized a 13-0 run, capped by Lamont Butler's three-pointer to grab a 37-35 lead with 2:48 to go. However, the Broncos (15-4, 6-0 MW) closed with seven straight points over the final 1:04 to escape with their 12th straight victory and remain undefeated in conference play.

SDSU was led by Nathan Mensah and Lamont Butler, who scored 10 points apiece, while Matt Bradley finished with seven points in the defeat. Mensah just missed out on a double-double, leading all players with nine rebounds while Butler grabbed seven boards.

Neither team shot the ball well, with the Aztecs connecting on 28.1 percent of their field goals (16-57), while Boise State mustered a 31.1 percent clip from the floor (14-45). Despite committing four more turnovers for the contest (16-12), the Broncos maintained a 39-33 rebounding advantage and sank 9 of 11 free throws to help snap a six-game slide against SDSU.

The Aztecs trailed 6-0 after missing their first eight shots of the first half while committing three turnovers. However, SDSU battled back, forging a trio of ties, including a 17-17 deadlock on a three-pointer by Adam Seiko at the 3:51 mark and took its first lead on a Trey Pulliam floater with two tick left on the clock for a 23-22 halftime lead.

SDSU misfired on its first nine shots of the second half, as Boise State fashioned a 13-1 run to surge in front, 35-24, by the 10:55 mark.

The Aztecs then flashed their resiliency, erupting for 13 straight points over an eight-minute stretch to forge a slim 37-35 advantage. Butler scored five points during the run, including the aforementioned triple that put the Scarlet and Black in front, while Mensah and Bradley added four points each.

Tyson Degenhart then drew a foul and drained both free throws to tie the game at 37-37 with 1:04 to go.

The Aztecs came up empty on their next trip down the court, setting the stage for Shavers' heroics. Degenhart then sank two foul shots to account for the final score.

With the loss, SDSU had its 16-game home court winning streak halted, as well as a 16-game victory streak against Mountain West Conference opponents, including the 2021 league tournament.

SAN DIEGO — Bolstered by Matt Bradley's season-high 27 points, San Diego State earned an impressive 80-55 victory over UNLV on Monday at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs connected on 52.9 percent of their field-goal attempts (31-of-59) and outscored the Runnin' Rebels 48-20 in the paint to improve their record to 11-4 on the season and 3-1 in Mountain West play.

In addition, SDSU maintained a comfortable 43-33 advantage in rebounds, including a 34-21 spread on the defensive glass, while recording a season-best 15 steals to secure the program's 300th win at Viejas Arena, which opened for the 1997-98 campaign.

Bradley tied his career high with 10 field goals, matching the highest shooting percentage (10-of-11, .909) by an Aztec (min. 11 FG att.) since Nov. 28, 2009, when Matt Thomas put up the same numbers in a 21-point effort vs. Northern Arizona.

Along with Bradley's heroics, SDSU got double-digits from Trey Pulliam, who scored 11 points, while Lamont Butler finished with nine. The SDSU cause was also aided by Keshad Johnson's team-high seven rebounds, while Nathan Mensah came through with three blocks.

The Aztecs, who never trailed in the contest, raced to a 15-5 lead on a Pulliam layup with nearly six minutes elapsed in the first half. UNLV (11-9, 3-4 MW) responded with six straight points over a 2:37 span to cut the deficit to four points but could draw no closer.

SDSU shifted into overdrive at that juncture with a 27-12 surge over the final 11:33 of the half to build a comfortable 42-33 advantage by intermission. Bradley fueled the blitz with 12 points, while Butler tallied all nine of his points in that stretch.

The Aztecs headed into the locker room with their biggest half-time lead of the season, while their 42 points were more than they scored in the entire game vs. Boise State (37) two nights early. In addition, the Scarlet and Black posted its highest first-half field-goal percentage of the year (.621) after draining 18 of 29 attempts.

UNLV was led by Bryce Hamilton's 23 points.

With the victory, SDSU raised its record to 12-1 in its last 13 games immediately following a loss and improved to 19-2 in its last 21 outings against UNLV.

LOGAN, Utah — Matt Bradley led all scorers with 19 points and Chad Baker-Mazara had his best offensive night as an Aztec, but the Utah State Aggies shot better than any team had against the San Diego State and pulled away in the second half for a 75-57 victory in a Mountain West game on Wednesday night.

“They put six days of work to good use,” Aztec coach Brian Dutcher said. “They moved at a pace they hadn’t moved at all year. They were sensational and we did what you can’t do on the road. We let them get out early on the break, build an early lead and to our credit, we fought our way back into it. It was a one-point game at halftime, and they have struggled in close games. We used two timeouts in the first half. We started the second half, and they get off running again. So, I burned a time out and you can’t start like that on the road. We chipped our way back and I think maybe we got as close as seven with maybe six minutes to go. We had a chance to get back in the game and then they went on another run, and it was over after that because they were running the clock, and they spread us out.”

In addition to Bradley’s 19 points, he added six rebounds and six assists to lead the team in all three categories.

Utah State shot 49.1 percent from the field (27-of-55), becoming just the fourth team in 16 games to crack the 40 percent mark against SDSU and just the second team this season to amass more than 66 points against the Aztecs, who rank second in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 56.4 points per game in its first 15 contests.

Both teams shot the ball well, SDSU finished the game at 48.9 percent (23-of-47), but Utah State 10 3-pointers to the Aztecs five and beat SDSU on second chance points 9-to-0.

Utah State was up 32-31, but the Aggies opened the second half with a 13-2 run in the first four minutes to build a 12-point advantage. SDSU cut the lead to seven points on three occasions, the last coming at 62-55 with 5:19 to play, but could not get any closer.

Utah State, led by 17 points from Steven Ashworth, closed the contest with its second 13-2 run of the half and won the game 75-57.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State got a dominating performance on its return to Viejas Arena Monday, cruising past New Mexico, 72-47, as the duo of Keshad Johnson and Matt Bradley scored 14 points apiece to help spark the victory.

With the win, the Aztecs (12-5, 4-2 Mountain West) won 15 of the last 19 meetings against the Lobos and became the first team in the last 42 seasons to defeat UNM by 20 or more points in three consecutive meetings. In addition, SDSU improves to 13-1 in its last 14 games immediately following a loss.

Johnson, who set a season-best for points on 6-of-10 shooting, also pulled down 10 rebounds for his second career double-double. Lamont Butler finished with nine points and matched his personal best with six boards while adding four assists.

In addition, Trey Pulliam led all players with six assists, while Nathan Mensah came up with a career-best five steals to go with a game-high four blocks.

Collectively, SDSU connected on 26-of-58 of its field-goal attempts (.448) while sinking 11-of-14 free throws (.786). The Aztecs also had a 19-8 advantage in assists and while outscoring UNM on the fastbreak by a 25-1 margin.

San Diego State led throughout, but the Lobos (8-14, 1-8 MW) remained within striking distance for much of the first half, narrowing the gap to 25-20 on a three-pointer by Jamal Mashburn, Jr. with just under eight minutes left.

The Aztec defense clamped down for the rest of the period as the visitors misfired on six straight shots and sank just two free throws during an 11-2 surge that gave the SDSU a 36-22 lead by intermission.

SDSU maintained the momentum in the early stages of the second half, using 13-4 run over the first 4:16 to build an insurmountable 49-26 advantage.

The Aztecs enjoyed their biggest lead of the night at 67-39 following a Chad Baker-Mazara dunk with 4:27 remaining.

New Mexico was led by KJ Jenkins’ game-high 16 points, while Mashburn, Jr. added 10 points in the defeat.
