WHAT'S ON TAP FOR AZTEC BASEBALL

Following a lengthy road swing, San Diego State returns to "America's Finest City" this weekend when it plays host to New Mexico in a three-game Mountain West series, March 28-30, at Tony Gwynn Stadium.
 The first two encounters on Thursday and Friday are scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. PT, while Saturday's finale is slated to get underway at 1 p.m. PT.
 In addition to live stats, all three games will be streamed live via the Aztec baseball team's YouTube channel, with a link available

> The first 500 fans in attendance for Thursday's contest will receive a free Tony Gwynn replica jersey.
> Following this weekend's homestand, the Azfecs will once again assume the role of road warriors when they travel up the coast to San Luis Obispo for two non-conference games against Cal Poly, April 1-2, before continuing north to the Bay Area where they lock horns with MW rival San José State, April 5-7, at Stephen Schott Stadium on the Santa Clara University campus.

SETTING THE SCENE

> San Diego State will be looking to snap a six-game losing streak after suffering a sweep against Hawai'i last weekend in its first trip to Honolylut since 2006.

> Against the Rainbow Warriors, Shaun Montoya led the Aztecs with a .500 batting average, six hits and four runs scored, while Colby Turner (.333) and Tino Bethancourt (.308) finished with four hits apiece.

> Bethancourt also topped the squad with nine RBIs, highlighted by a pair of two-run doubles in the series finale.

> For the season, Turner tops the Scarlet and Black in most categories, including batting average (.377), total bases (48), hits (29), RBIs (18) and runs scored (16).


> Entering the week, Turner's .377 batting average and team-high .623 slugging percentage are good for fifth in the Mountain West

doubles, seven RBIs and 13 runs scored.

Despite leading the MW in most offensive categories, UNM enters the series ranked last in the league in team ERA (7.99), opposing batting average (.333) and hits allowed (287).

Shaun COLE Head Coach - First Season, Third overall at San Diego State

Shaun Cole, former national pitching coach of the year and current San Diego State pitching coach, was elevated to head coach of the Aztec baseball program, as announced July 25, 2023 by SDSU Director of Athletics John David Wicker.

Cole's impressive resume includes successful stops as associate head coach/pitching coach at Eastern Kentucky University, coordinator for player development in San Diego Padres' highly rated farm system, USA Baseball 18U National Team director and pitching coach at the University of Arizona, where he won a College World Series championship and oversaw multiple nationally ranked recruiting classes.

"This is the opportunity of a lifetime, and I am very honored to become just the sixth head coach in program history," Cole said. "SDSU baseball has vast potential, and I am excited to build off the previous successes and take this program to new levels. We expect to compete for conference championships through enhanced recruiting, player development and a tireless work ethic.

"I want to say thank you to the administration, alumni and players for supporting me in this transition to be the next head coach. I also want to recognize Mark Martinez and his commitment to San Diego State for 18 years. Mark maintained the program while honoring Tony Gwynn's legacy with passion and pride. I'm thankful for the past two seasons together and his support."

"Shaun is one of the brightest minds in college baseball," Wicker said. "He has continually developed players at all levels, and we're excited to have him leading our program."

Cole spent six seasons at Arizona from 2009-14, serving one year as the Wildcats' director of baseball operations before he was elevated to pitching coach. During Cole's tenure, Arizona made four NCAA regional appearances, highlighted by a College World Series title in 2012, the same season he was named National Pitching Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball newspaper.

While in Tucson, Cole developed and guided three of the school's most successful pitching staffs, as Wildcat hurlers combined for 121 wins, 25 complete games and 1,324 strikeouts between 2010 and 2012. Overall, Cole mentored nine pitchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Kurt Heyer, who received All-America recognition in 2011 by the NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball newspaper.

Not to be outdone, Cole made his mark on the recruiting trail as well at Arizona, contributing to four consecutive nationally ranked signing classes in 2012 (19th), 2013 (37th), 2014 (12th) and 2015 (17th).

Since Cole's arrival on The Mesa for the 2022 season, SDSU pitchers have led the Mountain West in earned run average, strikeouts, opposing team batting average and fewest hits allowed for two straight years while producing a trio of MLB Draft Picks in TJ Fondtain, Kelena Sauer and Troy Melton.

Under Cole's direction, the Aztecs once again flashed their talents during the 2023 campaign, as the Scarlet and Black topped the conference in strikeouts per nine innings (9.7) and hits allowed per nine innings (8.48), both of which ranked 36th in the country, In addition, the SDSU staff tossed a league-leading four shutouts, their highest total since 2017, which was fied for 32nd nationally.

Following the 2023 season, Fondtain was picked by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 14th round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, while Sauer was chosen by the Toronto Blue Jays shortly thereafter in the 15th round.

The 2023 Mountain West Pitcher of the Year, Fondtain burst onto the national scene after completing the eighth no-hitter in program history and the first since 2009 in a 4-0 shutout of Nevada on April 21. For his efforts, the Azlec left-hander garnered widespread acclaim, collecting Pitcher of the Week honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) and D1Baseball.com along with his selection as Peak Performer of the Week from USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award.

Not to be outdone, Fondtain received All-America recognition from multiple outlets, including second-team honors from the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA/Rawlings), D1Baseball.com and Collegiate Baseball newspaper to go with third-team plaudits from Baseball America.

Meanwhile, Sauer earned first-team all-Mountain West honors after leading the league with 12 saves, becoming the first Aztec to surpass double digits in that season statistic since 2017 (CJ Saylor). He also appeared on the midseason watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) National Stopper of the Year award after collecting consecutive saves vs. UNLV to earn MW Pitcher of the Week honors.

In 2022, Cole made a tremendous impact in his first year at SDSU, as the Aztec pitching staff once again led the Mountain West in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (8.85) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.1), which ranked 55th and 85th in the nation, respectively.

Individually, Cole mentored a pair of all-league hurlers, including Troy Melton, who was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the fourth round of the MLB Draft after earning MW Co-Pitcher of the Year honors along with second-team ABCA/Rawlings All-West Region accolades.

In addition, Cole presided over the mound debut over Fondtain, who received second-team all-conference recognition in his first season as a starting pitcher to go with a trio of MW Pitcher of the Week awards.

Cole arrived in "America's Finest City" after a two-year stint at Eastern Kentucky University, where he served as the Colonels' associate head coach/pitching coach in 2019-20.

During his tenure, Cole developed and guided one of EKU's most successful pitching staffs while enrolling three of the highest ranked recruiting classes in program history. In his first season in 2019, EKU set team records for strikeouts (510) and lowest opposing batting average (.258) while logging the most victories (32) since 2004 and lowest team ERA (4.79) since 2008.

Under Cole's tutelage, three Colonel pitchers garnered all-Ohio Valley Conference accolades in 2019, including first-team selection Aaron Ochsenbein, who was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the sixth round of the MLB Draft that year after setting a school record for lowest single-season ERA (0.83).

During the abbreviated 2020 campaign, Cole helped EKU engineer one of the best starts in school history, as the Colonels rolled to a 12-2 record, highlighted by an upset at No. 11 LSU, before the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to his stint in the Bluegrass State, Cole served as coordinator for player development with the San Diego Padres, where he was involved in all aspects of baseball operations, scouting and player development.

Among his countless duties with the Padres, Cole assisted in player development for the team's minor league system, which was ranked No. 1 in MLB in 2018, including the Padres Dominican Republic Academy. In addition, he cross-checked prospects throughout the country for the 2016 MLB Draft and attended pre-draft workouts.

In 2016, Cole was also the pitching coach for the Tri-City Dust Devils, the Padres' short-season Class A affiliate based in Pasco, Washington, where he developed the organization's top pitching prospects.

In 2017, Cole served as the coordinator for San Diego's spring training facility in Arizona. In that role, he oversaw the daily operations of mini-camp, extended spring training, as well as two rookie ball teams during the Arizona Fall League. He also managed the AZL Padres that season.

From June 2014 to Sept. 2015, Cole served as the director of the 18U National Team for USA Baseball. Among his responsibilities was managing the Tournament of Stars presented by MLB and the 17U National Team Identification Series — both primary selection vehicles for the 18U National Team. Under Cole's guidance, the 18U National Team captured gold medals at the 2014 COPABE Pan American Championships in Mexico as well as the 2015 WBSC 18U Baseball World Championships in Japan.

Cole began his coaching career as the pitching coach for one season at Edmonds Community College in Lynnwood, Washington, helping the Tritons capture the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges (now NWAC) championship in 2008.

In 2004, Cole earned a bachelor of arts degree in education with a concentration in kinesiology at William Penn University in Oskaloosa, Iowa. He also completed a master's of education degree in 2009 at the University of Washington in intercollegiate athletic leadership.

Cole takes over for Mark Martinez, who retired on July 13,2023 following a nine-year tenure as head coach from 2015-23, when he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West tournament championships (2015, 2017, 2018) and one regular-season conference title (2023).

AZTEC WEEKEND ROTATION

- > For the first time in four weeks, SDSU will utilize the starting rotation of Chris Canada, Omar Serrano and Xavier Cardenas III.
- > Canada (0-1, 13.94 ERA, 10.1 IP) will be making his first start since March 1 when he takes the mound on Thursday night after three relief appearances. In the Aztecs' 5-4 victory over UC Riverside on March 12, the SDSU junior completed a scoreless eighth, overcoming a hit and a wild pitch with three strikeouts. Canada was selected to the 2024 preseason all-Mountain West team in a vote of the league's coaches on Feb. 8 after receiving the same recognition from Perfect Game the previous week. The Aztec left-hander finished second among MW leaders last season in fewest hits allowed (62) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (72), compiling a 3-5 record with a 5.69 ERA. In addition, Canada ranked eighth in the conference a year ago in opposing team batting average (.265). In 2023, the Orange, California, native also posted five or more strikeouts in nine of 13 games while yielding two or fewer walks in eight contests. Canada has made four career appearances against UNM, highlighted by a nine-strikeout performance in Albuquerque on April 1, 2023, when he tied his career high. > Friday's starter Serrano (1-3, 4.18 ERA, 32.1 IP) has suffered three straight losses in as many starts after tossing his first career complete game against Fresno State on March 2. In that contest vs. the Bulldogs, the SDSU right-hander yielded just one run on five hits without a walk while striking out six batters en route to his first victory of the year and second as a collegian. Two weeks later, Serrano was saddled with the hard-luck defeat at Air Force in the second game of a doubleheader on March 16, when he offset seven hits and three walks with six strikeouts, allowing

just one unearned run in five innings before the Falcons pulled away with five runs off four Aztec relievers in the sixth. Entering the New Mexico series, Serrano shares the seventh position in the MW in innings pitched (32.1) while ranking eighth in ERA (4.18), strikeouts (27) and opposing batting average (.263). The Downey, California, native has made three career appearances against the Lobos, highlighted by eight strikeouts in a stellar relief effort during the final game of the 2023 campaign to help the Aztecs capture a share of the Mountain West regular-season championship.

> Like Serrano, Cardenas is slated to make his seventh straight start of the season when he takes the mound on Saturday. The Aztec sophomore was triumphant in his initial start of the year against Portland on Feb. 18, scattering four hits and two walks while finishing with a trio of strikeouts in five scoreless innings. Cardenas posted a career-high eight strikeouts at Air Force on March 17 but was tagged for seven runs on nine hits and four walks in 5 1/3 innings. The La Habra, California, native pitched a career-long seven-plus innings in his last outing at Hawai'i on March 24, allowing three runs (two earned) on two hits and seven walks but did not factor in the decision after the Rainbow Warriors rallied for the walk-off 6-5 victory in 10 innings. Cardenas has faced New Mexico on two previous occasions, starting the opener of the Aztecs' final series of the 2023 campaign when he struck out five batters in 2 2/3 innings before the Scarlet and Black rallied to win in dramatic fashion later in the contest.

SERIES RECORD VS. NEW MEXICO

- > The Aztecs lead the all-time series vs. the Lobos, 132-84 dating back to 1960.
- SDSU has won 11 straight against New Mexico and 14 of the last 15 meetings since the 2021 campaign.
- > The Lobos are one of five programs the Aztecs have recorded over 100 victories against. The other four are Air Force (121), Fresno State (110), Utah (104) and UNLY (101).
- $>\,$ SDSU boasts a 76-38 record against the Lobos in San Diego, a 46-42 mark on the road and a 10-4 ledger on a neutral field.
- Heading into the final weekend of the 2023 campaign, the Aztecs clinched a shared of the Mountain West regular-season championship with a three-game home sweep of New Mexico at Tony Gwynn Stadium.
- > In the series finale, SDSU overcame a 6-1 deficit to prevail by an 8-6 count in eight innings, as Tino Bethancourt's two-run single in the bottom of the seventh provided the winning margin for the Azters
- > The Scarlet and Black also received a clutch performance on the mound from Omar Serrano, who held the Lobos scoreless over the final 6 1/3 innings in relief for his first victory of the season.
- > Serrano turned in a masterful performance, posting eight strikeouts, his second-highest total of the season, while yielding just one hit and a pair of walks.
- > After giving up a leadoff single in the fourth, Serrano retired 10 straight batters until issuing a walk with one out in the top of the seventh.
- > For his efforts, the SDSU hurler earned a spot on Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's National Players of the Week list.
- Shaun Montoya has feasted on New Mexico pitching during his career, batting .512 (21-41) in nine games with four triples, three doubles, seven RBIs and 13 runs scored.
- > In a three-game road sweep of the Lobos in 2022, Montoya posted a slash line of .714/.733/.929 with 10 hits and seven runs scored, earning MW Freshman of the Week honors.
- $>\,$ In the first two encounters of that series at UNM, Montoya became the first SDSU player to

record four hits in consecutive games since Danny Sheehan accomplished the feat at Air Force, May 13-14, 2017.

NEW MEXICO AT A GLANCE

- > The Lobos, who were picked to finish in a tie for fifth place in the 2024 Mountain West preseason coaches poll, are one of four teams perched atop the conference standings with a 6-3 record (15-9 overall) heading into the weekend.
- > After falling by a 16-13 count in its weekend opener against San José State on March 22, UNM captured the series victory by winning the final two games by scores of 7-5 and 17-4, with the latter contest ending in seven innings courtesy of the run rule.
- > With the results, the Lobos move to 11-5 in home games this season but are just 4-4 in road/neutral contests.
- > Following its series with San José State, UNM collected two conference awards on March 25, as Jake Holland garnered MW Player of the Week accolades, while Ryan Castillo was named the league's Pitcher/Freshman of the Week.
- > Against the Spartans, Holland hit .727 (8-11) for the weekend with four home runs, two doubles and 14 RBIs, while Castillo posted a career-high seven strikeouts in five scoreless innings of the series finale.
- > Despite missing seven games, Holland leads the Mountain West with a .413 batting average and nine home runs while sharing the top spot with 11 doubles. In addition, the Lobo catcher is slotted third this week with 29 RBIs and 64 total bases.
- > Elsewhere, UNM regulars Tye Wood (.344), Will Asby (.344) and Khalil Walker (.343), Sean Stephens (.338) and Reed Spenrath (.323) also find themselves among the MW top 20 qualifiers in batting average.
- > Asby is perched atop the league in slugging percentage (.699) and shares the top spot in RBIs (31) while ranking second in runs scored (29) and third in home runs (7).
- > Not to be outdone, Wood leads the MW in on-base percentage (.560) and is tied for fourth with 24 runs scored, while Spenrath shares the top spot with Wood in walks (21) and ranks ninth in slugging percentage (.591).
- > As of press time, the Lobos' two known starters for this weekend's series were right-hander Dayne Pengelly (2-1) and left-hander Daxton Purser (0-0), who were projected to pitch on Thursday and Friday, respectively.
- > Pengelly has pitched in four games this year with two starts, logging a 9.00 ERA with 16 strikeouts against 12 walks in 13.0 innings.
- > Meanwhile, Purser has made four consecutive starts, posting a 4.50 ERA for the season while striking out 16 batters. Against Nevada on March 16, the UNM junior pitched six scoreless innings, offsetting two hits and four walks with a season-high six strikeouts but did not factor in the decision.
- > Collectively, the Lobos lead the Mountain West in most offensive categories, including batting average (.332), slugging percentage (.540), on-base percentage (.448), hits (278), runs scored (225), RBIs (209), doubles (64) and home runs (32).
- > New Mexico's .448 on-base percentage and 278 rank seventh and 14th in the nation as of March 27, respectively, while its league-leading average of 9.4 runs per game is good for 18th in the country.
- > Defensively, the Lobos top the conference as well with 28 double plays, which is tied for third nationally.
- > On the flip side, UNM pitchers are slotted third in the conference this week with 184 strikeouts but occupy the basement in team ERA (7.99), opposing batting average (.333) and hits allowed (287).
- > Sophomore Luke Mansey was a prep teammate of the Aztecs' Cade Martinez and Trevor Fox at St. Augustine High School in San Diego. The Lobo infielder/outfielder was a senior on the Saints' 2021 squad, while Martinez and Fox were juniors. Mansey originally signed with Santa Clara out of high school but did not play for the Broncos before transferring to Grossmont College for the 2023 campaign.
- > Tod Brown is his third season at the helm of the New Mexico program after spending 14 years as head coach at North Dakota State, where he finished his tenure as the second-winningest coach in school history. Prior to his stint with the Bison, Brown served as the pitching coach at Bowling Green from 2000-08 after working in a similar capacity the previous two seasons at Sabino High School in his hometown of Tucson, Arizona. Brown pitched collegiately at Arizona from 1989-94, helping the Wildcats to the Pac-10 championship in 1992. In 1993, he set a school record with 35 appearances, posting six wins and eight saves, as Arizona fell one game short of the College World Series.

SDSU IN MW RANKINGS

- > Despite sitting out two games earlier this month, Aztec freshman extraordinaire Colby Turner finds himself among the Mountain West leaders this week, ranking fifth in both batting average (.377) and slugging percentage (.623).
- > The Huntington Beach native has also smacked three triples so far this year, which is tied for third in the league and 14th nationally.
- > In addition, Shaun Montoya is tied for eighth in the conference with four stolen bases.
- > On the mound, Jacob Riordan is slotted third in the MW with a .227 opponent batting average and seventh with 28 strikeouts, ranking ahead of Omar Serrano, who occupies the eighth spot with 27 punchouts.
- > Serrano is listed among the league's top 10 in other categories, tying for the seventh position in innings pitched (32.1) while ranking eighth in ERA (4.18) and opposing batting average (.263).
- > Elsewhere, Xavier Cardenas III is slotted fifth in opponent batting average (.250) and ninth in innings pitched (31.1).
- > Meanwhile, relievers Issac Araiza and Garvey Rumary are tied for the MW lead with 10 appearances, while teammates Chris Canavan, Evan Miranda and Jadon Bercovich share the ninth position with nine games pitched.
- > In addition, Miranda is tied for third in the conference with seven games finished, while Bercovich is tied for eighth in that category with five
- > As a team, SDSU pitchers lead the Mountain West in fewest hits allowed (194) and are slotted second in both opponent batting average (.262) and strikeouts (211) while ranking fourth in ERA (6.52).
- > The Scarlet and Black also tops the conference with 9.9 strikeouts per innings, which ranks 48th in the nation.
- > Offensively, SDSU occupies the fifth position in the MW this week in doubles (42) but ranks seventh in batting average (.249), slugging percentage (.365), on-base percentage (.323), runs scored (106) and RBIs (94).

STREAKING AZTECS

> Shaun Montoya is the lone Aztec to start all 22 games this season, playing exclusively in right field. The SDSU junior has made 27 consecutive starts dating back to last season and has started 72 of the last 74 contests he has appeared in.

- > Freshman Finley Bates is the only other Aztec to see action in all 22 games thus far, earning 13 starts at second base and eight at shortstop while appearing as a late-inning defensive replacement in SDSU's 7-1 victory over Portland on Feb. 18.
- > A native of Castle Park, Colorado, Bates boasts the team's longest hitting streak of the year in seven consecutive outings from Feb. 21-March 3. He is currently tied for second on the Aztecs with a .253 batting average, 23 hits and five doubles.
- > Tino Bethancourt has reached base in nine consecutive outings and owns the squad's current longest hitting streak at four games. Since March 9, the SDSU junior has raised his batting average from .231 to .288.
- > Colby Turner leads the Scarlet and Black with multiple hits in nine games this season and has compiled two or more RBIs in four different contests.
- > Additionally, Montoya has seven multi-hit games to his credit this season, followed by Bates, Bethancourt, Evan Sipe and Jake Jackson with four apiece.

NOTHING LIKE HOME COOKIN'

- > Despite facing an array of challenging opponents on annual basis, San Diego State is 299-227 (.568) when playing at home since the start of the 2007 campaign.
- > In 2018, the Aztecs set a program record with 25 home victories at Tony Gwynn Stadium (since 1997), besting the previous standard of 24 set in 1997, 2002 and 2014.

COLBY TURNER COLLECTS THIRD MOUNTAIN WEST FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

- > For the third time this season, San Diego State's Colby Turner was named Mountain West Freshman of the Week, as announced March 18 by the conference office in Colorado Sprinas, Colorado.
- > A native of Huntington Beach, California, Turner also collected the award on Feb. 26 and March 4, giving the Aztecs four such honors this year after Jake Jackson received the same distinction on Feb. 19.
- > Despite playing in just the final two games of SDSU's road series against Air Force for the week of March 12-17, Turner led the team in several categories, including batting average (.625), total bases (11), home runs (2), RBIs (5), runs scored (3), slugging percentage (1.375) and on-base percentage (.625).
- > Turner had multiple hits in both contests vs. the Falcons and homered in consecutive games for the first time this season.
- > In last Saturday's doubleheader nightcap, the Aztec rookie went 3-for-4 at the plate, highlighted by his first collegiate grand slam, which narrowed the gap to 7-5 in the top of the ninth inning, although the Scarlet and Black was unable to seize the upper hand.
- > The following day. Turner enjoyed a 2-for-4 effort with two runs scored, including his third homer of the year a solo shot in the top of the eighth.
- > For the season, Turner leads the Mountain West with a .677 slugging percentage while ranking third in batting average (.385) and eighth in RBIs (17). The Aztec infielder is also tied for the ninth spot in the conference with 25 hits and 44 total bases.

GRAND DEBUT

- > Freshman Jacob McCombs made huge splash during the Aztecs' season-opening homestand, launching a pair of grand slams vs. CSUN (Feb. 21) and CSU Bakersfield (Feb. 24) for his first two collegiate home runs.
- > Against the Matadors, McCombs' blast occurred with one out in the bottom of the seventh that gave the Scarlet and Black a brief 5-4 lead before the visitors rallied for a 7-5 victory.
- > McCombs duplicated the feat three nights later vs. the Roadrunners with two outs in the top of the ninth in a contest where the Aztecs played as the visiting team in their own park. SDSU trailed 6-4 entering the ninth but rallied to take the lead when Shaun Montoya scored on a wild pitch following Sammy Kahler's two-run double with two outs. After the Aztecs reloaded the bases, McCombs stepped to the plate crushed a 1-1 offering over the fence in right, giving SDSU added insurance and an insurmountable 11-6 lead, which accounted for the final score.
- > For the season, McCombs is tied for the team lead with three homers and ranks second on the sauad with 14 RBIs and a 479 sluaging percentage.

CTDIVECUITS GALODE

- > Dating back to 2019, San Diego State is 68-48 in its last 116 games when striking out 10 or more batters.
- > Aztec hurlers combined for 15 strikeouts in each of the first two games of the season-opening series vs. Portland, which surpassed the team-high total of 14 for the entire 2023 campaign.
- > Entering the New Mexico series, the Aztecs lead the Mountain West with an average of 9.9 strikeouts, which ranks 48th nationally, while occupying the second spot in the conference with 211 punchouts overall.
- > Individually, Jacob Riordan (7th, 31) and Omar Serrano (8th, 27) find themselves among the conference top 10 this week in strikeouts.
- > In 2023, SDSU also topped the MW with 492 strikeouts and an average of 9.7 punchouts per nine innings, which ranked 36th in the country. Additionally, Aztecs pitchers posted 10 or more strikeouts on 26 occasions.
- > Former SDSU standout TJ Fondtain struck out 14 batters in his no-hitter vs. Nevada on April 21, 2023 to set a career high.
- > Individually, Omar Serrano (10.53) and Chris Canada (10.51) occupied the top two spots in the MW in strikeouts per nine innings last season.

GOING, GOING, GONE

- > San Diego State has emerged victorious in 67 of its last 111 games dating back to 2019 when launching one out of the park, including a 14-12 mark during the 2023 season and a 5-4 ledger this year.
- $>\,$ During an admittedly down year in 2022, the Aztecs logged a 7-14 record in games when they hit a home run.
- > Previously, the Scarlet and Black homered in 29 of 46 games during the 2021 campaign, posting a 21-8 record in those contests.
- > In addition, SDSU went 17-5 during the 2019 season when going yard and 5-2 in the shortened 2020 campaign.

OTHER TRENDS

- > The Aztecs are 158-50 over the last seven-plus seasons when scoring five or more runs, including a stellar 38-6 record during the 2017 campaign.
- > SDSU won 10 consecutive games over the final two months of the 2023 season when scoring at least five runs, but that streak was snapped in a
- 7-6 loss to Portland in 13 innings on Feb. 17.

- San Diego State is 85-72 in its last 157 games following a loss, including a 12-18 mark after its previous 30 defeats dating back to last year.
- > A total of 16 of 19 true freshmen have seen game action for the Aztecs this season.

JAKE JACKSON TABBED MW FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FEB. 19

- > Jake Jackson was named Mountain West Freshman of the Week for his performances in the Aztecs' threeaame home series vs. Portland. Feb. 16-18.
- > A graduate of nearby Madison High School, Jackson earned the starting left field position for SDSU's season-opening set against the Pilots, batting .250 with one homer, four RBIs, four runs scored and a stolen base. He led the team in runs scored while tying for the top spot in hits and RBIs for the series.
- > In game one, Jackson reached on an error and scored during a three-run eighth-inning outburst that knotted the contest at 4-4 before Portland broke the tie in the ninth to escape with the win.
- > Jackson then finished with two hits and two RBIs in each of the final two contests.
- > In game two, the San Diego native smacked a two-run double and scored the tying run during the Aztecs' furious rally in the ninth inning, which knotted the score at 6-6 before SDSU succumbed in 13 innings. He also registered his first collegiate stolen base earlier in the contest.
- > In the series finale, Jackson belted his first career homer, a two-run blast in the bottom of the seventh to close out the scoring of SDSU's 7-1 triumph, which gave Shaun Cole his first victory as a collegiate head coach.
- > Earlier in that game, Jackson also threw out a runner at the plate from left field in the top of the fourth to keep Portland off the scoreboard after the Aztecs grabbed an early 2-0 lead.
- > On Jan. 30. Jackson was named the preseason Mountain West Freshman of the Year by Perfect Game in its 2024 conference previews.

AZTECS PICKED FOURTH IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON POLL

- > In a vote of the league's seven head coaches, San Diego State was pegged for a fourth-place finish in the 2024 Mountain West preseason poll, as announced by the conference office on Feb. 8.
- Collectively, San Diego State earned a total of 19 points in the coaches poll, trailing preseason favorite San José State (33 pts), which received four first-place votes, and second-place Fresno State (28 pts), which netted another pair of first-place votes, while Air Force landed in the third spot with 27 points and one firstplace vote. New Mexico and UNLV tied for the fifth position behind the Aztecs with 15 points, while Nevada (10 pts) rounded out the rankings.

CANADA, SERRANO NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST TEAM

- > Pitchers Chris Canada and Omar Serrano were named to the preseason all-Mountain West team announced on Feb. 8.
- > Entering their junior campaigns, both Canada and Serrano have helped the SDSU pitching staff lead the Mountain West in ERA in each of the last two seasons.
- > A 6-7 left-hander, Canada finished second among Mountain West leaders last season in fewest hits allowed (62) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (72), compiling a 3-5 record with a 5.69 ERA. In addition, he ranked eighth in the conference a year ago in opposing team batting average (.265).
- > In 2023, Canada also collected five or more strikeouts in nine of 13 appearances while yielding two or fewer walks in eight games. The Orange, California, native tied his career high with nine strikeouts in back-to-back outings vs. Air Force and at New Mexico.
- > Meanwhile, Serrano led the Mountain West last season with fewest hits (46) and runs allowed (34) while ranking second in opposing team batting average (.237). He also finished third on the Aztecs with career highs in strikeouts (62) and innings pitched (53.0), posting a 1-5 record with a 5.43 ERA and one save.
- > A 6-4 right-hander, Serrano surrendered two walks or less in 13 of 16 games and struck out six or more batters on four occasions. The Downey, California, native set a career best with nine strikeouts in 5.1 innings at Fresno State.

ADDITIONAL AZTEC PRESEASON HONORS

> On Jan. 30, Chris Canada was also named to Perfect Game's preseason all-Mountain West team, along with fellow pitcher Xavier Cardenas III, while outfielder Jake Jackson received preseason MW Freshman of the Year recognition by the website.

- > Additionally, Cardenas merited preseason MW Pitcher of the Year honors by D1 Baseball.com on Feb. 7.
- > Not to be outdone, Jadon Bercovich was listed No. 3 on Perfect Game's list of the top 75 college seniors in early January.

OUTFIELD LEADERSHIP

- San Diego State returns 17 letterwinners and five starters from last year's squad that captured a share of the Mountain West regular-season championship, including outfielders Shaun Montoya and Irvin Weems.
- > Last season, Montoya was a second-team all-Mountain West selection who ranked third in the league with 16 stolen bases. The Rancho Cucamonga native led the Aztecs in hits (56) and doubles (15) while tying for the top spot in total bases (85) and runs scored (36). Additionally, he finished second on the squad in batting average (.298) and on-base percentage (.388).
- > In 2023, Montoya also fashioned the team's second-longest reached base streak at 18 games. He also tied for second on the squad with multiple hits in 14 starts and crafted a season-long seven-game hitting streak
- > Weems, meanwhile, battled a shoulder injury last year to post a slash line of .266/.400/.406 with three homers, 19 RBIs and 29 runs in 48 games. The Las Vegas product led the Scarlet and Black with 26 walks and a .400 on-base percentage while ranking fourth in the conference with 11 stolen bases.
- > In addition, Weems collected multiple hits in eight games and totaled two or more RBIs in four contests. He garnered MW Player of the Week accolades after batting .500 with five RBIs, five runs scored and one stolen base in a series victory at home over Air Force in March 2023.

YOUTH SHALL BE SERVED

- > The Aztecs enter the upcoming season with 21 newcomers, including 19 true freshman, led by outfielder Jake Jackson, who was named MW Preseason Freshman of the Year by Perfect Game on Jan. 30.
- > A graduate of nearby James Madison High School, Jackson garnered Western League Player of the Year accolades and merited all-CIF San Diego Section plaudits following his junior and senior campaigns. He .369 with a 1.013 OPS during his high school career finishing with seven homers, 66 RBIs, 71 runs scored and 37 stolen bases. according to MaxPreps.
- > Huntington Beach High graduate Colby Turner has been penciled in as the Aztecs' opening-day third baseman after helping his prep squad to a first-place finish in the Sunset Surf League and a second-round appearance in the 2023 CIF Southern Section Division I playoffs.
- > As a senior, Turner was rated as the No. 6 third base prospect in California by Perfect Game and No. 143 overall in the state for the 2023 high school graduating class. In 2023, he hit .337 in 30 games, totaling four doubles, 12 RBIs, 12 runs scored and a pair of stolen bases, according to MaxPreps.
- > Also looking to make a splash in the infield this season is Finley Bates, who is slated to open the 2023 campaign at second base for the Scarlet and Black.
- > Bates was a first-team all-state selection as a senior at Douglas County High School in Colorado, where he led the team in numerous categories in 2023, including batting average (.433), OPS (1.344), hits (26), RBIs (24), runs (21) and triples (3).
- > In addition, Bates was rated as the No. 2 shortstop in Colorado and the No. 5 player overall in the state by Perfect Game for the 2023 high school graduating class. Also received a No. 56 national ranking at his position and was listed No. 265 among the website's Top 500 recruits overall.
- > Along with the freshmen class, the Scarlet and Black welcomes Division I transfer Jacob Riordan (RHP, Arkansas-Pine Bluff) and junior college transfer Dylan Hawkes (LHP, Utah State Eastern), both of whom are pegged for key roles on the mound this season.
- In his lone season at Arkansas-Pine Bluff in 2023, Riordan set a school-record with 87 strikeouts, which ranked sixth in the Southwestern Athletic Conference. His 11.69 strikeouts per nine innings was also slotted second in the SWAC and 42nd in the nation.

JULIUS MCDOUGAL JOINS AZTEC COACHING STAFF

- > San Diego State baseball head coach Shaun Cole announced his first staff hire on Aug. 30, 2023 with the addition of Julius McDougal as assistant coach.
- > With his appointment, McDougal rekindles his professional association with Cole after their careers intersected as assistant coaches at Eastern Kentucky University in 2019 and 2020.
- McDougal arrives on The Mesa after spending the past three seasons as associate head coach at Georgetown University, where he served as the Hoyas' hitting coach and recruiting coordinator. Among his numerous responsibilities, McDougal will also continue those duties with the Aztecs, along with overseeing the team's infield defense.
- > During McDougal's tenure at Georgetown, the Hoyas fashioned a dramatic turnaround with back-to-back seasons of 30 victories or more for the first time in program history, highlighted by a pair of Big East tournament appearances, after posting a 6-25 record in 2021.
- > With McDougal on board, Georgetown was collectively named the Big East Conference Coaching Staff of the Year for the first time in school history following the 2022 campaign after the Hoyas established a program record for victories (32), home runs (98) and total bases (925), while setting second-best team marks in winning percentage (.571 (32-24)), runs scored (400), RBIs (367) and slugging percentage (.480).

- > During McDougal's final season on the D.C. campus in 2023, Georgetown compiled a 30-27 record, featuring its first conference tournament victory, and boasted six all-Big East selections.
- Prior to his stint with the Hoyas, McDougal spent three years at Eastern Kentucky from 2018-20, serving as the program's recruiting coordinator, infield coach and assistant hitting coach after joining the Colonels' staff as a volunteer assistant in the summer of 2017.
- > With McDougal's assistance, EKU posted consecutive 30-win seasons in 2018 and 2019, accomplishing the feat for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 campaigns. The Colonels' 16 conference victories in 2019 were the most for the program since 2013 and he helped direct an offense that ranked among the top 30 nationally in walks, runs, home runs and stolen bases.
- > A renowned recruiter, McDougal helped assemble the 65th-ranked national recruiting class in 2020, according to Perfect Game. EKU boasted six of the top 20 freshmen in the Ohio Valley Conference, according to PG, which was the most of any school in the league. Between 2018-19, three of McDougal's recruits were selected in the MLB Draft.
- > In 2020, McDougal helped guide the Colonels a 12-2 mark, including a Friday night upset at No. 11 LSU, before the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As a team, EKU finished 10th in the nation in on-base percentage (.420), 12th in batting average (.314), 13th in doubles per game (2.43), 14th in slugging percentage (.492), and 15th in scoring (8.4 runs/game).
- > Previously, McDougal spent the 2016 and 2017 campaigns as head coach at Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, where he guided the Tigers to the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) regular-season championship in his first year at the helm. That season, Stillman earned the No. 1 seed at the SIAC tournament and advanced to the finals. In all, he had five players sign pro contracts during his tenure.
- > Prior to his elevation to head coach, McDougal worked as an assistant at Stillman after serving the same role at Kentucky State for one season in 2014.
- > McDougal played collegiately at Claflin University in Orangeburg, South Carolina, earning all-conference honors in 2010 after hitting .416, which was ranked 53rd in the country. In addition, he was named Claflin's Defensive Player of the Year in 2011.
- > McDougal earned a bachelor of science degree in marketing from Claflin in 2012 before completing his master's degree in business administration at Alabama in 2016.

LOCAL HEROES

> San Diego State sports nine players on its current roster who are alumni of San Diego County high schools, including Trevor Fox and Cade Martinez (St. Augustine); Manoah Chapman and Jake Jackson (Madison); Xavier Gonzalez (Hilltop); AJ Klubeck (Westview); Brady Lavoie (La Costa Canyon); Evan Sipe (San Marcos); and Nico Tomasello (Granite Hills).

AZTECS IN MLB DRAFT

- > Since 1965, San Diego State has had 227 student-athletes chosen in the MLB First-Year Player Draft, including 31 selections since 2015.
- > Former Aztec center fielder Cole Carrigg was taken by the Colorado Rockies as a catcher in the Competitive Balance "B" Round with the 65th overall pick of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft; pitcher TJ Fondtain was selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 14th round (423rd overall), while fellow hurler Kelena Sauer went to the Toronto Blue Jays shortly thereafter in the 15th round (454th overall).
- > With its selections, SDSU has had multiple players picked in six of the last seven years and nine of the last 11 overall.
- > In 2022, former Aztec right-hander Troy Melton was chosen by the Detroit Tigers in the fourth round with the 117th selection overall.
- > The previous year, in 2021, SDSU had five individuals drafted by MLB organizations.
- > Infielder Mike Jarvis was selected by Pittsburgh in the sixth round with the 163rd pick, while catcher Wyatt Hendrie also went to the Pirates shortly thereafter in the seventh round in the 193rd spot overall.
- > In addition, the New York Mets grabbed center fielder Matt Rudick in the 13th round (382nd overall); right fielder Jaden Fein was selected by the Washington Nationals in the 15th round (443rd overall), while right-handed pitcher Michael Paredes was snapped up by the Minnesota Twins in the 18th round (549th overall).

MOUNTAIN WEST TOURNAMENT RETURNS TO SAN DIEGO

- > The Mountain West Championship returns to "America's Finest City" this season and will be conducted at Tony Gwynn Stadium, May 23-26. The top four teams in the MW regular-season standings will qualify for the double elimination tournament, with the winner receiving an automatic berth into NCAA regional competition. NCAA Regionals will be held May 31-June 3.
- > SDSU has hosted the MW Championship on five previous occasions, most recently after the 2022 season. The Aztecs also welcomed the event in 2018 when the Scarlet and Black claimed its fifth tournament crown in a six-year span.

CRAZY TONY GWYNN PLAYER STATS

 $>\,$ Tony Gwynn completed his illustrious career with a .338 lifetime batting average. Every other player who

had a career batting average of at least .338 played before 1943.

- > Gwynn hit .368 over a five-year stretch between 1993 and 1997.
- > Gwynn faced Tom Glavine, Greg Maddux, Pedro Martinez, and John Smoltz a combined 323 times. He struck out three times over those at bats.
- > Gwynn never struck out more than 40 times in a season and struck out less than 20 times in six straight years. He had a career-low 15 strikeouts in 1995.


