STORYLINES

SENIOR DAY UPSET

- Maryland's 2-1 senior day victory over Northwestern on October 7 was the first win over a ranked opponent since the Terps defeated #13 Iowa on September 25, 2014.
- Maryland got a pair of first half goals from senior Jarena Harmon and freshman Loren Sefcik, while holding off the Wildcats in the second half to clinch the win.
- The win gave the Terps a much-needed boost in the Big Ten table, as Maryland looks to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament down the stretch of the season.

FRESHMAN FIRST

- Freshman Loren Sefcik earned her first career Big Ten honor on October 9 as she was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week.
- Sefcik scored the game-winning goal in Maryland's 2-1 upset win over #14 Northwestern on October 7, nailing a shot from the right wing into the left corner of the net to put the Terps ahead 2-0. The goal scored in the 34th minute was the first of her career, and clinched Maryland's first win over a ranked team since 2014.
- It marks the second weekly honor of the season for Maryland, after redshirt senior goalkeeper Rachel Egyed earned Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week plaudits on September 11. Sefcik is the first Terp to be named Freshman of the Week since Mikayla Dayes garnered the honor on August 29, 2017.

WORKING OVERTIME

- Fans have gotten their money's worth watching Maryland this season, as the Terps have played seven overtime games – the most of any Big Ten team this year.
- Four of those games have gone into double overtime, with Maryland earning draws in all four contests.
- Three of Maryland's overtime games have come in Big Ten play, while the Terps are still looking for their first OT win of the season.

TERPS OPEN B1G PLAY WITH A BANG

- Maryland's four goals scored against Iowa on September 14 were the most-ever in a Big Ten game for the Terrapins since joining the Big Ten in 2014.
- The 4-0 win was also Maryland's largest margin of victory in B1G play, and the most goals scored by the Terps since a 5-1 victory over Yale on September 13, 2015.
- Jarena Harmon posted her second multi-goal game of the season scoring two goals, including the winner, over the Hawkeyes.

TOP TERP

- Redshirt junior Darby Moore's goal against Iowa on September 14 made SportsCenter's Top-10 plays that night, checking in at No. 8 on the countdown.
- It was the first goal of the year for Moore, who scored on a long arcing shot from the sideline 40 yards out from the goal.

EGYED NAMED BIG TEN GOALKEEPER OF THE WEEK

- Redshirt senior goalie Rachel Egyed was named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Week on September 11 in an announcement made by the conference offices. This is the first career B1G Goalkeeper of the Week honor for Egyed.
- Egyed was spectacular in goal for Maryland during non-conference play to help the Terps extend their unbeaten home non-conference streak to nine games.
- The Clifton, N.J. native made eight stops in UMD's 1-1 draw with UCF in double overtime on September 6, then came back and made seven saves on September 9 vs. George Washington to earn her second shutout of the season.
- Egyed finished non-conference play near the top of the Big Ten in several statistical categories, including third in saves (32), third in saves per game (4.60) and fourth in save percentage (.865). She has totaled at least seven saves in three straight games.

HARMON POWERS TERPS TO THREE WINS

- Senior Jarena Harmon has netted three of Maryland's game-winning goals this season while leading the Terps in scoring and points.
- She scored two goals, including the game winner in the 87th minute, to push Maryland to a 2-1 victory over William & Mary in their season opener on August 16.
- She then scored the eventual game-winner for Maryland against Appalachian State on August 24, scoring off a rebound in the 64th minute.
- Harmon netted the first goal of the game in Maryland's 4-0 win over Iowa, and is tied for first in the Big Ten in game-winning goals.
- Harmon surpassed her goals total from last season one game into her 2018 campaign, scoring on both of her attempts against William & Mary.

FIRST YEARS FACTORING IN

- Head coach Ray Leone has wasted no time introducing his freshmen class into the lineup, with four true freshmen and five total freshmen seeing the field for the Terps their opening weekend at the JMU Invitational.
- Freshmen Loren Sefcik, Emily McNesby, Adalee Broadbent and Madison Oracion all saw the field for the Terps in their first two games, with Sefcik, Broadbent and Oracion all earning starts. Sefcik and Broadbent started both games for UMD, with Broadbent being one of two Terps to play all 180 minutes open the season.
- Additionally, redshirt freshman Alyssa Poarch made her collegiate debut after missing the entire 2017 campaign due to injury. The Middletown, Del. native registered her first career assist in the team's season-opener vs. William & Mary, after Jarena Harmon scored the game-winner off her shot in the 87th minute.

NEW CROP OF TERPS

- Head coach Ray Leone added six freshmen to the program this season, featuring players from five different states: Maryland, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Ohio and Texas.
- "This is a fantastic class that provides much needed athleticism and versatility in a variety of positions," Leone said. "We expect these players to play a significant role in the growth of our program. All of these players have demonstrated outstanding dedication in the classroom as well as on the soccer field and we cannot wait for them all to arrive in College Park to get started."
- Maryland's pair of Pennsylvania natives, Emily McNesby and Adalee Broadbent, have played together since they were 12 years old.

SEASON PREVIEW

The Maryland women's soccer program is set to begin its 2018 campaign this week, led by third-year head coach Ray Leone. The team has been hard at work throughout the preseason preparing for the road ahead, with fresh faces and a solid core of experienced players ready for the challenges looming in the Big Ten.

Leone and the Terps will look to further improve upon their progress over the past two seasons, as Maryland jumped to a four-win improvement last year with a 7-8-3 overall record.

"We have had a great energy and togetherness this preseason," said Leone. "You can really feel that throughout the entire time we've been together. This is a very coachable group and they really want to get better. I want our group to demonstrate a consistent work ethic and fight to the last second of every single game. I'm asking our entire team to bring it, and I think this year we have that kind of competitive spirit."

Six newcomers join 21 returners on this year's roster, with the Terps set to kick off their season on August 16 vs. William & Mary at the JMU Invitational in Harrisonburg, Va. Below is a breakdown of each position group.

OFFENSE

Senior Jarena Harmon and junior Darby Moore will be leaders at the top of the formation this year entering 2018 as two Maryland's most experienced players. Harmon, a Big Ten preseason honoree, has appeared in 35 career games for the Terps while notching nine goals and two assists. Moore returns as the third most-capped field player on the roster, starting in 23 of 34 career games, including 10 of 17 last season.

Leone has been excited to see sophomore Mikayla Dayes and redshirt freshman Alysa Poarch back on the field after both were sidelined with injuries last year. Dayes will look to build off a promising start to her collegiate career last year where she recorded eight points in five games before going down with an injury. Poarch is primed to make her Maryland debut after sitting out the entire 2017 season recovering from injury. The Middletown, Del. native was a USA U-18 National Team pool member and Second Team All-American as a senior at Middletown High School.

MIDFIELD/DEFENSE

Leone has several different options throughout his midfield formation, and has commonly interchanged defensive and offensive players into the group throughout his time at the helm for the Terps. Jlon Flippens, Hope Lewandoski, Anissa Mose, Julia New and Sydney Staier are all back for the Terps – with all five earning at least 13 starts between the midfield and defensive units last season. Senior Jenna Surdick will help anchor Maryland's backline again in 2018, a year removed from appearing in 14 games.

Returning for her redshirt senior season with the Terrapins is goalkeeper Rachel Egyed, who garnered Third Team all-Big Ten honor last season. Egyed notched 71 saves while holding a goals against average of 1.36 in 2017. She started in 17 of 18 games for the Terps in the cage, notching five shutouts while helping the Terps to a four-win improvement. The Clifton, N.J. native starred in Big Ten play, saving penalty kicks against Nebraska and Purdue while making numerous one-on-one stops during conference matches.

Leone will have two other solid options to organize the defense as well in junior Erin Seppi and redshirt sophomore Andi Wenck. Seppi made one start while playing in three games for the Terps last season, while Wenck will be in the mix to make her collegiate debut in 2018.

NEWCOMERS

Head coach Ray Leone added six freshmen to the program this season, featuring players from five different states: Maryland, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Ohio and Texas. Emily McNesby, Loren Sefcik, Taylor Whitmer, Madison Oracion, Adalee Broadbent and Katie Krotee will all look to make their Terrapin debuts in their first season in College Park.

"They've done a really good job," said Leone. "Their conditioning coming in was very good, and that's the first thing you have to take care of when you come in as a freshman. They're ready to compete."

RAY LEONE

296-182-53 (28TH SEASON) / 14-30-8 (3RD SEASON AT MARYLAND)



Ray Leone is in his third season as Maryland head coach. He was named the ninth head coach in the history of Maryland women's soccer on Jan. 13, 2016.

Leone continued his rebuild of the Maryland program in 2017, authoring a four-win improvement over 2016. The Terps went unbeaten in nonconference play after welcoming a top-25 recruiting class. Goalkeeper Rachel Egyed earned All-Big Ten honors, becoming the first Maryland player to earn a Big Ten honor.

Leone helped Maryland improve offensively in his first season. The Terps surpassed their total from 2015 (17 in 19 games) in just 12 games. In addition, Leone seamlessly integrated transfers Chelsea Jackson (9 goals) and Jarena Harmon (8 goals), who both finished in the top-10 in the Big Ten in goals. Harmon earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors after scoring Maryland's first hat trick since 2012.

A native of Severna Park, Md., Leone carries a wealth of experience with over 20 years as a collegiate head coach. He has accumulated 285 wins, which ranks 21st among active Division I head coaches. He has been named a conference coach of the year twice; in the ACC at Clemson in 2000 and in 2014 at Harvard.

Leone's nine-year tenure at Harvard was highlighted by five appearances in the NCAA Tournament and five Ivy League Championships. Three Crimson players

were honored as Ivy League Player of the Year under Leone with four earning Ivy League Rookie of the Year honors.

He coached 22 first-team All-Ivy League selections along with 16 second team all-league players. Leone also developed 12 NSCAA All-Region selections,

Academically, Leone's teams have performed well, with two Academic All-Americans and 11 Ivy All-Academic selections during his tenure.

Leone came to Harvard after six successful seasons at Arizona State, where he posted 60 wins. The Sun Devils made a pair of appearances in the NCAA Tournament and achieved a school record No. 9 national ranking in 2004. Leone coached nine All-Pac 12 honorees with his squad annually achieving the school's highest grade point average among its 22 varsity programs. The Sun Devils placed a school record 11 student-athletes on the Academic All-Pac 12 team in 2005.

Prior to his time in Tempe, Leone was a coach at Clemson from 1994-to-2000, serving as an assistant for five years before becoming the head coach in 2000 after serving as the co-head coach in 1999. That season saw the Tigers win a school record 19 games en route to an ACC regular season championship. Leone's squad broke North Carolina's 37-game ACC winning streak and started the season with 12 straight wins.

In his seven years at Clemson, the Tigers finished among the nation's top-15 teams each year and produced 20 All-ACC selections. Additionally, the 1994 Clemson squad was the first team in NCAA women's soccer history to make the NCAA tournament in its first varsity season. During Clemson's NCAA tournament runs from 1994-2000, only six other Division I programs advanced to the NCAA tournament the same number of years (7) as the Tigers.

Leone came to Clemson from Creighton, where he started the varsity program in 1989 and within five years guided the Bluejays to a top-five regional ranking. He led Creighton to a 14-3-2 record in his final season.

His coaching career began at Berry College (Ga.) in 1986 and he became the only coach to take a first-year program to a national championship game in college

soccer history. The following season, Leone's squad won the NAIA national championship and he earned national coach of the year honors. Berry is considered the most successful program in NAIA history.

As a player, Leone starred from Charlotte and was a three-time all-conference selection at three different positions. He scored the winning goal in what still stands as the longest game in Sun Belt history, a seven-overtime affair in the 49ers' first conference championship title game. As a senior, Leone received the David Schlee Memorial Award given to the Charlotte player most demonstrating his desire to succeed. He earned a BA in sociology at Charlotte before receiving a masters in sports sciences from the United State Sports Academy in 1990.

MANYA PUPPIONE

3rd Season • Arizona State '06

Decorated professional and national team player Manya Puppione is in her third season on head coach Ray Leone's staff after being hired in April of 2016.

Puppione helped the Terps notch a four-win improvement over 2016, including an unbeaten record in nonconference play. Her efforts also helped the Terps bring in a top-25 recruiting class in 2017.

Puppione boasts a spectacular resume at the national and professional level, including playing at one time with 13 of the 23 players that made up the roster of the United States' 2015 World Cup champions. Puppione has played with two FIFA World Players of the Year (Marta, Carli Lloyd), and helped the US capture the 2002 FIFA U-19 World Cup title.

The Bridgeport, Conn., native was a national team stalwart at a variety of age groups from 2002-to-2008. Makoski was a member of a pair of U-21 national teams that won back-to-back Nordic Cups in 2004 and 2005. She then won the same championship as a player on the U-23 national team in 2007 and was a member of the full national team pool in 2008. For those youth national teams, Puppione

joined up with notable US standouts such as Lloyd, Megan Rapinoe, Heather O'Reilly, Lauren Holiday and Amy Rodriguez.

Puppione played alongside Marta, the five-time FIFA World Player of Year, as a member of the Los Angeles Sol of Women's Professional Soccer (WPS). The Sol won the WPS Regular Season title in 2009 and advanced to the WPS Playoff finals. Other notable players on that Sol roster included Japanese World Cup Champion Ali Miyama, French international stalwart Camille Abily and World Cup champion and Olympic gold medalist Shannon Boxx.

The following season, Puppione moved on to play for the WPS' Atlanta Beat, where she played alongside World Cup and Olympic champion Tobin Heath. Puppione transitioned her career to Iceland for Thor/KA in 2011 and helped lead the squad to a fourth-place league finish and the first round of the UEFA Champions League while being voted to the league's first-half Best XI.

Puppione continued her time in Europe for Aland United in Finland and was voted Naisten Liiga Player of the Year after breaking the league record for goals. She also served as a team captain.

She moved back to the United States to play for Sky Blue FC in 2013 and guided the team to a National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) semifinal appearance. After a brief stint back with Aland United in 2014, where she played in the UEFA Champions League qualifying rounds, Makoski retired from professional soccer.

Puppione has a decorated college career at Arizona State from 2002-to-2006, including being named a Freshman All-American in 2002. Puppione also flourished in the classroom, earning NSCAA Academic All-American honors in 2004 and being named an ASU Sparky Female Scholar of the Year award recipient. Puppione graduated with bachelor's degree in journalism and mass communication from Arizona State in 2006 before earning a master's degree at the University of New Haven in business administration in 2008.

As a coach, Puppione has served in various roles in clubs throughout Connecticut, including as a staff coach at USSF training centers in the state. She is also an accomplished writer, penning columns and blogging for websites including ussoccer.com, nbcolympics.com and the WPS' website; womensprosoccer.com.



YEWANDE BALOGUN

3rd Season • Maryland '12

Former Maryland goalkeeper Yewande Balogun is in her third season as an assistant coach under head coach Ray Leone. Balogun previously served as an assistant at American University and had a distinguished career at Maryland as a goalkeeper.

Balogun's work with Maryland's goalkeepers has paid dividends early and often. She tutored Rachel Egyed to All-Big Ten Third Team honors in 2017. Egyed became the first Maryland player to ever earn a spot on an All-Big Ten team. Maryland improved by four wins in 2017 and went through nonconference play undefeated.

In her lone season at American, Balogun oversaw senior goalkeeper Charlene Belanger, who saw improvements in goals against average, shutouts and save percentage from the previous year. American also performed in the classroom during Balogun's tenure with

14 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll selections.

One of the most decorated goalkeepers in Maryland history, Balogun helped the Terps reach the Sweet 16 in 2009 and 2011. She was a 2010 All-ACC Academic Team and All-Tournament selection. As a freshman in 2007, Balogun was named a SoccerBuzz Freshman All-American and was selected to the ACC All-Freshman team. She was also a captain during her time in College Park.

Balogun made her mark in the Maryland record book as the all-time school leader in goals against average (0.93). She is third in goalie game started (64), sixth in saves (242) and tied in shutout (19). She defeated seven ranked teams, including four wins over top-10 teams, during her career.

As a prep, Balogun was one of the top goalkeeping recruits in the country out of Roosevelt High School, helping lead the Raiders to a 4A class state championship. She was involved in the US National Team as a 2007 U-20 National Camp invitee and U-14 and U-17 national team pool member. She was a two-time NSCAA/ Adidas Youth All-American and 2006 high school All-American.

The Bowie, Md., native holds a USSF "D" License and NSCAA Goalkeeping Level III Diploma. She is completing her master's degree in business administration at Maryland's Robert H. Smith School of Business. She graduated from Maryland with a bachelor's degree in marketing.
