## NOTES AND HEADLINES

### MEN'S SOCCER SET FOR REGULAR SEASON FINALE WITH RUTGERS

The Penn State men's soccer team, under first-year head coach **Jeff Cook**, returns to Happy Valley and Jeffrey Field for the regular season finale with Rutgers on Sunday, Oct. 28 at 4 p.m. The home finale also marks Senior Night, as the Nittany Lion graduating seniors will be honored at the conclusion of the match.

### PENN STATE AGAINST RUTGERS

The Nittany Lions and the Scarlet Knights have met 20 times in program history. Penn State leads the series, 12-8-0, including a four-game win streak.

### SCOUTING RUTGERS

The Rutgers Scarlet Knights come into the finale with a 4-11-1 overall record and a 2-5-0 record in conference play.

Junior Jordan Hall paces the Scarlet Knights with 13 goals and two assists for 28 total points. Redshirt senior Miles Hackett is the team-leader in assists with four. Senior goalkeeper Rafael Pereira has played all 16 games in net, recording 65 saves with a 2.25 goals against average. Pereira and the defense have posted one shutout this season.

### LAST SEASON AGAINST RUTGERS

Penn State routed Rutgers, 6-2, on the road in 2017 as eight Nittany Lions tallied points in the victory. **Ethan Beckford** scored back-to-back goals and **Callum Pritchatt** recorded two assists. The Nittany Lions had 17 points on the day with six goals and four assists which is the most since they had 17 points against Penn in a 6-2 victory on Sept. 24, 2014.

### LAST TIME OUT

After tying the game in the 84th minute, the Penn State men's soccer team dropped a heartbreaker in double overtime to Maryland, 3-2, on Tuesday, Oct. 23 at Ludwig Field.

The Terps offense pressed early, with redshirt sophomore goalkeeper **Josh Levine** making his first save in the seventh minute off a Maryland free kick. Maryland took the early lead, going up 1-0 in the 27th minute and then adding another goal in the 44th minute to make it 2-0.

But then literally seconds before the break, junior **Aaron Molloy** brought the Nittany Lions within one after a corner kick made its way outside the box and to Molloy's right foot. The Dublin, Ireland, native struck it from about 25 yards

out right to the left corner of the goal, stunning the Maryland defense.

The Nittany Lions were able to slow down the Terps pressure in the second half, with Levine saving all four of Maryland's shots on net. In the 84th minute, redshirt senior **Noah Pilato** volleyed the ball of a Maryland defender and put it away in the back of the net to tie the game at two goals each and eventually bring the game to overtime. The goal marks Pilato's first career goal.

After fighting for the golden goal in the first 10 minutes of overtime, the game would find itself in the second overtime with the Terps eventually netting the game-winner in the 107th minute. Levine finished the match with seven saves.

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Penn State men's soccer team has four 2018 opponents ranked in the ninth week (Oct. 23) of the United Soccer Coaches' national poll, with two more receiving votes. Indiana (Sept. 30; L, 0-2) remains at No. 2. Michigan State (Sept. 26; L, 0-1) and UCF (Aug. 24; L, 1-2 2OT) round out the top-15 at No. 12 and 13, respectively. James Madison (Oct. 20; L, 0-1) moves into the top-25 after receiving votes the previous week. Rhode Island (Aug. 31; L, 0-1) and Michigan (Sept. 21; T, 1-1 2OT) received votes in this week's poll.

#### SHUTOUT STREAK

After shutting out Northwestern on the road on Oct. 6, the Penn State men's soccer team returned to Jeffrey Field for three-straight home games, holding each opponent scoreless (Stony Brook - Oct. 9, Wisconsin - Oct. 14, Detroit Mercy - Oct. 17). The last time the Nittany Lions shutout four opponents in consecutive games was during the 2012 season.

#### TRIO EARNS BIG DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Three Nittany Lions have earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors in the 2018 season, all for the first time in their careers.

Redshirt senior **Ryan Gallagher** was named BIG Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 25. At that time he was the team leader in assists with two, including the game-winning assist against Bowling Green on Aug. 28 to help the Nittany Lions secure their first win.

Redshirt sophomore goalkeeper **Josh Levine** was named BIG Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 9, sharing the award with Michigan State's Patrick Nielsen, after playing all 110 minutes in the net en route to the Nittany Lions' 0-0 double-overtime draw at Northwestern on Oct. 6.

Redshirt senior **Dani Marks** was named BIG Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 16. He helped anchor the defense to post back-to-back shutouts and the third consecutive shutout for the first time since the 2014 season, only allowing two shots on net between both opponents. He also recorded the game-winning assist on Jeremy Rafanello's goal in the 80th minute against Wisconsin.

#### GONZALEZ SCORES TWICE, RECORDS FIVE POINTS

Redshirt sophomore **Daniel Gonzalez** made his first career start against Stony Brook on Tuesday, Oct. 9, recording five points in the Nittany Lions' 3-0 victory. Gonzalez scored twice and added an assist for those five points, marking the first time this season a Penn State player has scored multiple goals in a single match, and the first time since **Ethan Beckford** did it at Rutgers last season (10/22/17).

#### BIG TEN OPENING DAY VICTORY

The Penn State men's soccer team rallied for a 3-1 victory over Big Ten foe Ohio State in the conference opener at Jeffrey Field on Sunday, Sept. 16. Three different Nittany Lions scored in the victory, including a first career goal by redshirt junior **Stephen Kenney**. Junior **Aaron Molloy** and senior **Mac Curran** provided the other two while redshirt senior **Ryan Gallagher**, sophomore **Callum Pritchatt** and Molloy added assists. Penn State is now 15-11-2 in Big Ten regular season openers since joining the conference in 1991.

#### FIRST MULTIPLE-GOAL GAME OF 2018

The Nittany Lions scored three goals in the Big Ten opener victory against Ohio State on Sunday, Sept. 16 to mark the first game of the 2018 season scoring multiple goals in a single match. It was also the first game since Oct. 21, 2016 (vs. Rutgers) that the Blue and White have scored three goals in a single game and the first time since Sept. 20, 2017 (vs. Detroit Mercy) that

they have won by multiple goals within the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field.

## COACH COOK'S FIRST WIN

First-year head coach **Jeff Cook** picked up his first win at the helm of Penn State men's soccer on Tuesday, Aug. 28 when the Nittany Lions defeated Bowling Green, 1-0. **Ryan Gallagher** and **Ethan Beckford** connected in the 80th minute to lift the Nittany Lions over the Falcons for the team's first win in 2018.

## NEWCOMERS MAKE PENN STATE DEBUT

Freshman forward **Jeremy Rafanello** made his Penn State debut in the season opener on Aug. 24 against UCF. The Delran, N.J. native made an immediate impact, scoring the first goal of the 2018 campaign for the Nittany Lions and the first goal of his collegiate career in the ninth minute to put the Blue and White up early. He has since seen minutes in all 15 games and is the team leader in total points (7 - 3 goals, 1 assist).

Georgetown transfer **Mason Deeds** also made his Penn State debut in the season opener on Aug. 24. The junior defender played in six games before an injury sidelined him for the rest of the season.

Oregon State transfer **Keegan Ness** made his debut donning the Blue and White on Sept. 3 against his former team. Ness made his first career start at Northwestern on Oct. 6, playing 79 total minutes.

## FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

The Nittany Lions return 22 student-athletes from the 2017 roster, including nine starters. Sophomore forward **Ethan Beckford** returns as the leading goal scorer for the Blue and White with five goals and one assist (11 points) in his rookie campaign. **Aaron Molloy** (three goals), **Mac Curran** (two goals) and **Callum Pritchatt** and **Christian Sload** (one goal each) also return to the lineup.

On the backline, redshirt senior **Dani Marks**, senior **Brennan Ireland** and junior **Mitchel Bringolf** look to keep the opposition out of the box after helping the goalkeepers to two shutouts in 2017.

In the net, redshirt sophomore **Josh Levine** returns after having nine starts in the 2017 season. Levine earned Big Ten All-Tournament Team honors after recording a career-best 12 saves in the quarterfinal match up with No. 1 Indiana on Nov. 6, 2017. Junior **Arie Ammann** hopes to be back in the net for the Blue and White after missing 2017 with an injury. As a freshman, Ammann earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the week honors.

## NEW FACES

Despite returning nearly the entire 2017 squad, head coach **Jeff Cook** added four new faces for the 2018 season, including two freshmen and two transfers.

In his first signing class as the leader of the Penn State men's soccer team, Cook signed forward **Jeremy Rafanello** and brought in commit **Joshua Dabora**. Prior to preseason, Cook announced the addition of transfers **Mason Deeds** (Georgetown) and **Keegan Ness** (Oregon State) to complete the 26-man roster.

## AROUND THE WORLD WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

The 2018 roster features seven student-athletes who crossed oceans to be a part of the Penn State family. **Mitchel Bringolf** comes to Happy Valley from Montreal, Quebec, Canada, captain **Dani Marks** is from Israel, and **Daniel Gonzalez** came to Penn State from Costa Rica. The four other student-athletes join the Nittany Lions from the United Kingdom, including **Ethan Beckford** (Manchester, England), **Mikey Conneh** (Sheffield, Yorkshire, England), **Aaron Molloy** (Dublin, Ireland), and **Callum Pritchatt** (Kinghurst, Birmingham, England).

## THREE NITTANY LIONS LAND PRESEASON HONORS

Senior **Brennan Ireland**, junior **Aaron Molloy** and sophomore **Ethan Beckford** each earned Big Ten preseason honors as announced by the conference office.

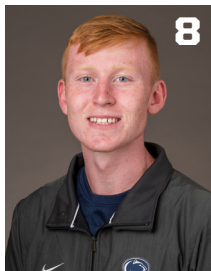

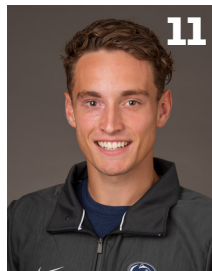
