QUICK HITS

- Michigan enters the 2018 Big Ten Tournament as the No. 8 seed and will travel to No. 1 seeded Penn State Sunday (Oct. 28) for a 1 p.m. match.
- The Wolverines took a 2-1 setback to the Nittany Lions in their regular season meeting, Oct. 7 at U-M Soccer Stadium.
- Michigan has struggled with the Nittany Lions in the all-time series, trailing 4-22-7. The Wolverines have not beaten Penn State since its 1-0 upset in Happy Valley on Oct. 13, 2013.
- U-M has participated in the Big Ten Tournament 18 times and earned the title in the 1997 and 1999 campaigns.
- The Wolverines hold a winning record in tournament action, going 18-15-4 in their 18 appearances.
- Michigan has traveled to University Park, Pennsylvania two times for the Big Ten Tournament, holding a 2-2 record as it defeated Northwestern in 1998 and Indiana in 2006 before falling to host Penn State in the semifinals both times.

MICHIGAN TRAVELS TO PENN STATE FOR BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

After earning the final spot in the 2018 Big Ten Tournament, the University of Michigan women's soccer team will travel to No. 1 seed Penn State for the quarterfinals Sunday (Oct. 28) at 1 p.m. at Jeffrey Field.

WOLVERINES AT THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

In its 25 years in the Big Ten Conference, Michigan women's soccer has made the Big Ten Tournament 18 times, winning the title in 1997 and 1999. The Wolverines missed out on the 2017 tournament and will make their first post-season appearance since the 2016 season when they won one game in the Big Ten Tournament and made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

U-M AGAINST PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Michigan is 4-4-0 all-time against Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament with two of its wins against the Nittany Lions coming down to penalty kicks. The Wolverines first met with Penn State in the 1994 season, playing to a 1-1 tie before advancing on penalty kicks. Michigan also notched wins over Penn State in 1997 and 1999, defeating the Nittany Lions in the championship match in the 1999 campaign. The Wolverines latest victory over the Nittany Lions in the Big Ten Tournament was in the 2005 season when they earned a 3-3 double overtime draw before advancing on penalty kicks, 4-2.

THREE EARN ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Three members of the University of Michigan women's soccer team received All-Big Ten Conference honors Friday (Oct. 26). Senior forward **Reilly Martin** and sophomore midfielder **Sarah Stratigakis** were All-Big Ten second team selections and freshman **Janiece Joyner** earned a spot on the All-Freshman Team. Martin earned her fourth straight conference honor, as she was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team in 2015, All-Big Ten second team in 2016 and All-Big Ten third team in 2017. The Carmel, Indiana native ranked third for the Wolverines with 16 points with six goals and four assists this season, highlighted by her second career two-goal performance against Central Michigan. The starting forward is one of just two players to start all 18 matches for the Wolverines, playing 1,346 minutes on the pitch. Martin will end her career with Michigan as one of just four Wolverines to have 20 goals and 20 assists in four seasons as she heads into the postseason with 21 goals and 24 assists. Stratigakis earns her second straight All-Big Ten second team honor, playing in all 18 matches and starting 17 in her sophomore campaign. The Woodbridge, Ontario native ranks second for U-M and ties for 10th in the Big Ten Conference with 17 points this season (7 goals, 3 assists). Stratigakis scored two game winners this season for the Maize and Blue and had one multi-point match with one goal and one assist against Central Michigan. Joyner was an anchor on the backline for the Wolverines this season, starting 17 matches at center back in her first season donning the Maize and Blue. The Medina, Ohio native played a team-high 1,501 minutes on defense and was a key player in Michigan's five shutouts in the 2018 campaign.

ALL-TIME SERIES WITH THE NITTANY LIONS

Michigan has struggled with the Nittany Lions in the all-time series, trailing 4-22-7. The Wolverines have not beaten Penn State since its 1-0 upset in Happy Valley on Oct. 13, 2013. U-M's upset in the 2013 campaign was the lone win in University Park, Pennsylvania for the Wolverines as they are 1-7-3 all-time at Jeffrey Field.

HOW MICHIGAN GOT IN

In a must win weekend for the Wolverines, they earned a 2- victory over Maryland off a game-winner from **Sarah Stratigakis** before going on to shut out Michigan State 2-0 on senior day. Despite getting the wins, Michigan's fate was still in the hands of Northwestern and Iowa. Following an Illinois win over Nebraska, the Wolverines needed Northwestern and Iowa to tie in their season finale against one another to guarantee U-M a spot in the 2018 tournament. The Hawkeyes and Wildcats helped the Wolverines, playing to a 1-1 double overtime draw, locking up Michigan's spot as at least the No. 8 seed in the tournament.

WHO IS HOT HEADING INTO THE POSTSEASON?

Sophomores **Nicki Hernandez** and **Sarah Stratigakis** had standout matches in the final weekend of the regular season with Stratigakis scoring one goal and adding two assists and Hernandez scoring her eighth goal of the season. Hernandez ranks fourth in Big Ten with 22 points and eight goal, while her six assists tie for fifth in the conference. Stratigakis has had 17 points this season, making her the second Wolverines to be ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten Conference.

MARTIN STEPS UP IN SENIOR SEASON

Senior **Reilly Martin** has been finding ways to help Michigan win in her final season on the pitch as a Wolverine. Martin ranks third on the U-M roster with 16 points (6 goals, 4 assists) and became just the fourth Wolverine to reach 20 goals and 20 assists in her career as she heads into the postseason with 21 goals and 24 assists.

MICHIGAN TAKES TWO IN FINAL WEEKEND OF REGULAR SEASON

The Wolverines earned the two wins they needed and the rest of the field fell in favor of Michigan as it locked up the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in the final weekend of the regular season. U-M first defeated Maryland, 2-1, behind an own goal and the game-winner from **Sarah Stratigakis**. The Wolverines went into senior day and locked up their fifth shutout of the season with a 2-0 victory over Michigan State with goals from **Nicki Hernandez** and **Emma Cooper**.

U-M HAS TOUGH FINAL ROAD MATCHES

The Wolverines came away with one point in the final two regular season road matches, earning a 1-1 tie over Nebraska before falling to Iowa, 1-0. Senior **Reilly Martin** scored the lone goal of the weekend for Michigan against the Cornhuskers, while U-M was unable to find any further offensive production on the weekend.

WOLVERINES TAKE ONE IN WEEK EIGHT

Michigan opened up week eight of the with a big shutout win over Ohio State. Sophomore **Hillary Beal** made five saves on the night in the 1-0 victory and sophomore **Nicki Hernandez** scored the game-winning goal for the Maize and Blue. Despite tough play from the Wolverines, they would close out the weekend with a 2-1 loss to Penn State. Michigan's lone goal of the match came from **Sarah Stratigakis**, who would give the Wolverines the early lead.

2018 NOTES AND HEADLINES

RECAPPING WEEK SEVEN

Two early goals proved to be too much to overcome for the Michigan women's soccer team as it would fall 4-1 to the No. 17 Wildcats. Northwestern came out quick, scoring its first two goals in the first 17 minutes of play before Michigan answered with a goal of its own from **Alia Martin** in the 27th minute. The Wildcats added two final goals in the first half to lock up the victory as neither team found the back of the net in the second half.

BEALL MAKES HER RETURN TO THE PITCH

Sophomore **Hillary Beall** made her return to the field against No. 17 Wisconsin after sitting out the first nine matches of the season due to injury. Beall was named to the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team roster in early August, but suffered an injury that would prevent her from traveling with the team. Since her return, Beall started against nine matches, giving up 10 goals in 844:13 of play. Beall made five saves in the Wolverines 2-0 win against the No. 17 Badgers in her first appearance of the 2018 season.

MICHIGAN TAKES BIG WIN AGAINST NO. 17 WISCONSIN

The University of Michigan women's soccer team topped No. 17 Wisconsin, 2-0, in a Big Ten Conference match at U-M Soccer Stadium. The Wolverines were paced by goals from their senior leaders, **Reilly Martin** and **Ashley Calcagno**. The win over the No. 17-ranked Badgers marks the second straight time that Michigan has defeated a ranked Wisconsin team as it took down the No. 9 Badgers in double overtime Sept. 24, 2017.

U-M SPLITS OPENING WEEKEND OF BIG TEN ACTION

The Wolverines fell in a heartbreaking 3-2 double overtime loss at Indiana before bouncing back to earn a 1-0 shutout at Purdue to open the 2018 Big Ten Conference season. The Maize and Blue held a 2-0 advantage over the Hoosiers until the final two minutes when they found two straight goals to knot the score and send the match into overtime. With no goals in the first overtime period, it was Indiana who scored the golden goal in the second overtime to earn the 3-2 B1G victory Thursday (Sept. 16) night. Michigan quickly recovered from the loss and earned a 1-0 victory, snapping a seven-match win streak for Purdue at Folk Field.

FRESHMEN PLAYING BIG ROLES FOR MICHIGAN

Freshman **Janiece Joyner** has started 17 matches for the Michigan defense, playing 1,501 minutes. Joyner has made some key stops on the backline including chasing down the ball in what would have been a one-on-one with the keeper situation had she not made the stop at the top of the 18-yard box against Louisville. **Sammi Atterbury** and **Raleigh Loughman** have each contributed one goal with Atterbury playing in 14 matches and Loughman playing in 15. Loughman has a total of four points on the season with two assists to her name as well. Also playing a big role for the Wolverines in her first 18 matches as a collegiate student-athlete is **Meredith Haakenson**. Haakenson has made an appearance in all 18 matches and earned her first career start against Louisville. The freshman midfielder has tallied two assists for the Maize and Blue. Finally, **Skylar Anderson**, **Sophia Ivezaj**, **Kierra Krawec** and **Sydney Shepherd** have all seen playing time for the Wolverines this season.

TWO TALLY MULTI-GOAL MATCHES AGAINST CMU

In Michigan's decisive 6-1 victory over Central Michigan at U-M Soccer Stadium, two players tallied multi-goal matches, while three players earned multi-point matches for the Maize and Blue. Senior **Reilly Martin** and sophomore **Nicki Hernandez** scored two goals each for Michigan to mark the first time two Wolverines have scored multiple goals in a match since Aug. 21, 2015 when Michigan defeated Eastern Michigan 8-1. Then-sophomore **Taylor Timko** paced the Wolverines against EMU, netting three goals, while Lulu Haidar added two goals to the Michigan tally. Hernandez finished the night against the Chippewas with six points as she added two assists, while Martin had one assist on the night. Finally, **Sarah Stratigakis** had a three-point performance with the game-winning goal and an assist for the Wolverines.

HERNANDEZ RECORDS SIX-POINT OUTING AGAINST CMU

Sophomore **Nicki Hernandez** led the Wolverines in their 6-1 victory over Central Michigan, scoring two goals and adding two assists. Hernandez had the lead pass to **Sarah Stratigakis** on what would prove to be the game-winning goal before scoring a goal of her own less than a minute later. Hernandez added an assist on **Reilly Martin's** second goal of the match and the fourth straight unanswered Michigan goal. Hernandez added her sixth point of the night when she scored U-M's sixth and final goal off a pass from Stratigakis in the 64th minute of the match.

2018 NOTES AND HEADLINES

MARTIN TALLIES SECOND CAREER TWO-GOAL PERFORMANCE

Senior **Reilly Martin** earned the second two-goal performance of her career as she netted the first and fourth goals of the night for the Wolverines against Central Michigan. Martin was the last Wolverine to accomplish the two-goal feat as she scored two against Iowa Sept. 27, 2017. The senior midfielder ended the match with five points as she assisted on **Nicki Hernandez's** first goal of the night against Central Michigan.

DEFENSE HOLDS STRONG AGAINST CHIPPEWAS

The Michigan backline was in top shape against Central Michigan as it saw the return of junior **Jada Dayne**. Dayne returned from injury to earn her first start of the 2018 season on the Michigan defense. Dayne, along with the rest of the Wolverine defense, gave up just two shots on the Chippewas in the full 90 minutes of play. Michigan outshot Central Michigan 20-2, putting 10 shots on net.

U-M HAS TOUGH ROAD STINT

The Wolverines opened up their 2018 road campaign with a pair of losses, falling to both Wake Forest and Florida Gulf Coast. Michigan looked to take an early lead on the Demon Deacons, but a header from **Janiece Joyner** sailed wide of the net. Wake Forest scored two goals in the first half and added two more in the second to take a 4-0 win over Michigan. Moving into the second match of the week, the Wolverines were the first to get on the board against Florida Gulf Coast with an own goal but the Eagles quickly responded, netting the next two goals to take a 2-1 advantage. U-M evened the score in the first half of play on a **Sarah Stratigakis** goal, but FGCU would find one more before the half ended to take a 3-2 lead. Neither team would score in the final 45 minutes as Michigan fell 3-2.

MICHIGAN SPLITS WEEK TWO OF 2018

The Wolverines earned a 3-2 win over Marquette after coming back from a 2-1 deficit. Sophomore **Sarah Stratigakis** scored tying goal off a pass from **Nicki Hernandez** before Hernandez found the back of the net for the game-winner minutes later. Michigan was unable to tally its fourth win of the season as it fell to Louisville 3-1 on Sunday (Aug. 26). Hernandez netted her fourth goal of the season for the Wolverines, scoring the lone goal of the match for Michigan.

WOLVERINES OPEN 2018 WITH A PAIR OF WINS

Michigan opened its 2018 season with a 3-1 victory over Boston University that included goals from **Nicki Hernandez**, **Abby Kastroll** and **Alia Martin**. The Wolverines scored all three of their goals before the Terriers netted a late goal in the second half to cut the U-M victory to two goals. Michigan returned to the field Sunday, Aug. 18 where it picked up its first shutout of the season, seeing goals from **Nicki Hernandez** and **Sarah Stratigakis**, while **Izzy Nino** earned her second win between the pipes.

HAAKENS ON LENDS A HELPING HAND

Freshman **Meredith Haakenson** made her first collegiate appearances donning the Maize and Blue, coming in off the bench against Boston University and Western Michigan. Coming in late in the second half, Haakenson connected on a pass to **Alia Martin** that would lead to the final goal of the game for Michigan against Boston University. Haakenson also contributed on the game-winning goal against Western Michigan when she found **Nicki Hernandez** for the first goal of the match, tallying her second assist of the season.

KLEIN COMPLETES COACHING STAFF

Head coach **Jennifer Klein** announced the completion of her coaching staff April 13 with the hiring of **Katie Hultin** as an assistant coach. Hultin's arrival rounded out the assistant staff which also includes **Tiffany Hansen**, **Bilal Hussein** and **Holly Hein**. Hultin came to Michigan following two seasons at the University of Oregon where she worked as a specialist with the defense and goalkeepers. Hansen begins her fourth season on the sidelines with the Wolverines where she oversees recruiting efforts and works with the keepers. Hussein will enter a new role as the Director of Soccer Analytics in the 2018 campaign after serving as the volunteer coach in the 2017 season. Finally, Hein, a former Michigan women's soccer stand out joins the staff as a volunteer coach in the 2018 campaign.

2018 NOTES AND HEADLINES

COACH KLEIN ERA

University of Michigan Donald R. Shepherd Director of Athletics Warde Manuel announced Wednesday, Feb. 28, 2018 the appointment of **Jennifer Klein** as the third head coach in women's soccer program history. Klein came to Ann Arbor after spending the last four seasons at the University of Southern California, including the last three as USC's associate head coach. Prior to her time at USC, Klein spent two seasons as an assistant at Washington State, where the program twice advanced to the NCAA Tournament and produced the 2014 Pac-12 Player of the Year in Michaela Castain. In 2013, the Cougars tied the program records for victories with a 14-3-4 mark, as the team and players set or tied 27 school records including allowing just 11 goals. Klein graduated from the University of Arizona with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology in May of 2006. She earned her master's degree in athletic administration at UNLV in May of 2011. At Arizona, Klein was a four-year letter winner from 2002-05 and was a two-time team captain. She was part of the school's first Pac-10 championship team in 2004 and was a starter on the 2005 squad that advanced to the third round of the NCAA Championship. Klein appeared in 78 career games, starting 60 contests at midfield and outside back. She was also a member of the Arizona Heatwave in the semi-professional W-League from 2003-05.

PRESEASON RECAP

The Wolverines took on No. 14 Notre Dame and Air Force in preseason play, coming away with a tie and a victory. Michigan earned a 2-2 draw against the Fighting Irish with **Nicki Hernandez** and **Reilly Martin** finding the back of the net in the contest. U-M went on to take a dominating 6-1 victory over Air Force at U-M Soccer Stadium with **Katie Foug** tallying two goals and **Taylor Timko** adding one goal and an assist for the Wolverines.

KEY RETURNERS

Michigan returns 21 letter winners, including eight starters from the 2017 campaign. Redshirt-senior **Taylor Timko** highlights the returners after earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors starting all 18 matches with 10 points including four goals and two assists. Also returning to the offensive strike are senior **Reilly Martin**, who led the Wolverine offense in 2017 with six goals and five assists and sophomore **Sarah Stratigakis**, who was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team after netting five goals and tying a team-high five assists. Defensively, **Jada Dayne** returns to the backline after starting all 18 matches in the 2017 season and **Sura Yekka** makes her return from injury for her redshirt-junior season after being named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2015 and taking the 2016 season to play for the Canadian U-20 Women's National Team. Finally, both **Hillary Beall** and **Izzy Nino** come back for their second seasons donning the Maize and Blue between the pipes. Beall will miss the first part of the season as she is playing for the U20 U.S. Women's National Team but returns to Michigan after starting six matches in her freshman season with 31 saves.

THREE WOLVERINES EARN BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS

Sophomore **Hillary Beall** appeared in seven matches (six starts), including three against ranked opponents in her first season donning the Maize and Blue. Beall made 31 saves and allowed just six goals in 560 minutes of action for a 0.96 goals against average. This summer, the Laguna Beach, California, native was named to the U.S. U-20 World Cup Roster. Senior **Reilly Martin** was named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List for the third consecutive season. She led Michigan in points the past two seasons with 17 in 2017 and 24 in 2016. Martin finished her junior season with a team-high six goals and five assists, starting in 17 matches. The Carmel, Indiana, native scored two game-winners for the Wolverines in 2017 and was named All-Big Ten third team. Sophomore **Sarah Stratigakis** was one of three players to start all 18 matches for U-M last season. She ranked second on the team with 11 points (three goals, five assists). She was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week after scoring one goal in each of U-M's first two games of the season, then earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors when she tallied two assists and scored the game-tying goal against Minnesota.

NEXT TIME OUT

If the Wolverines win against Penn State in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament, Michigan will travel to Westfield, Indiana for the semifinal and final rounds Friday, Nov. 2 - Sunday, Nov. 4.

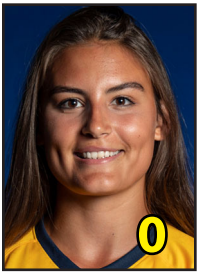

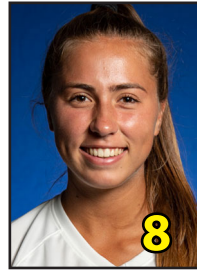
