Opening Statement

Rutgers is a really good defensive team and made it hard for us at certain times for us to get into a rhythm offensively. So we have to figure out and continue to work on our offensive flow and be able to get a few more points here. If we can do that I think it will go well for us moving forward.

Q: Coach at one point at the end of the first half it seemed that there was a small momentum shift where Rutgers finished the half off strong, got some buckets to conclude the half, and then obviously once you guys got back out there they took charge and went on an 18-6 run. What do you think was it the offensive end or the defensive end that really led to that coming to fruition and that whole run occurring?

A: I think it was a little bit of everything, kind of a potpourri. I think they got a couple of offensive rebounds, they got a couple run outs off some of our turnovers, and so I think it was a little bit of everything. And then on our end, we struggled to get great looks, so a little bit of both into the four.

Q: Obviously the field goal percentage wasn't where you'd probably like it to be and you guys got to the foul line a lot, but would you attribute your poor shooting performance to anything specific? Was it what they were doing defensively, shot selection, or just a bad shooting day?

A: Well I thought we had some good looks that didn't go down. Teniya [Page] had a lot of good looks, Jaida [Travascio-Green] had a lot of good looks, Amari [Carter] had some good looks, so we had good looks that just didn't fall. I think Smitty [Alisia Smith] getting a foul trouble in the first half kind of hurt our flow, but I did think [Lauren] Ebo came in and played pretty well in terms of being a big target for us in the post. When you get good looks and we get open looks we have to knock them down and I thought we had our fair share of those.

Q: We all know that Teniya Page is such a 100% team-oriented player. After tonight she is 13 points away from 2000 which is an unbelievable accomplishment. She will likely be the sixth player in program history. As a teammate or coach can you talk about just one thing that you see in Teniya that her legacy will be remembered for because of it.
