THE MATCH

• The University of Pittsburgh men's soccer team [6-4-2, 2-2-1 ACC] concludes non-conference action Tuesday, Oct. 15 when it takes on Penn State [6-2-2, 3-1-1 Big Ten]. The in-state rivals will clash at 7 p.m. at Jeffrey Field in University Park, Pa.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Panthers rolled past No. 22 Virginia Tech Friday night in Pittsburgh, 3-1.
- Pitt netted three consecutive goals in under five minutes of each other en route to the dominant victory.
- Freshman **Valentin Noel** got the scoring going in the 72nd minute as he worked his way past numerous Hokie defenders, burying the ball in the lower right corner from the left side.
- Nearly one minute later, junior **Edward Kizza** drove down the right side and attempted a shot that went in after deflecting off the goalkeeper.
- Freshman **Veljko Petkovic** capped off the scoring with one of his own in the 75th minute. He received a pass from Kizza at the top of the box and finished with his left foot.
- Virginia Tech scored its lone goal in the 79th minute.
- The win was the first over the Hokies in program history as they lead the series 5-1-4.
- The win was the first over a ranked opponent since a Sept. 25, 2018 win over then-ranked No. 12 NC State, 3-1.
- Pitt finished the game with an 18-12 advantage in shots and concluded the first half with a 10-2 edge.
- In goal, redshirt junior **Arie Ammann** earned his fifth win of the year and is now 5-2-1.

THE SERIES - PENN STATE

- The Panthers and Nittany Lions clash for the 34th time in program history Tuesday with Penn State leading the series, 23-7-3.
- The two teams last met in 2017 in Pittsburgh, which resulted in a 3-2 overtime victory for Pitt. It was the first win since 1978. Prior to that, the Nittany Lions had

claimed nine straight matches.
• Head coach **Jay Vidovich** is 2-1-1 all-time versus Penn State.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- Penn State enters Tuesday's game 6-2-2 overall and 3-1-1 against Big Ten foes.
- PSU checks in at No. 10 in the latest RPI ranking released Monday, Oct. 14.
- In their last time out, the Nittany Lions secured a 3-2 overtime victory over Big Ten opponent Northwestern Saturday night.
- Freshman forward Liam Butts leads the squad with 10 points, scoring five goals this season. Close behind is senior Aaron Molloy with nine points off four goals and an assist.
- Penn State is led by second year head coach Jeff Cook, who is 12-11-4 with the Nittany Lions.
- PSU finished the 2018 season 6-9-2 overall and 3-3-2 in conference play, falling in the opening round of the Big Ten Tournament.

UP NEXT

- The Panthers begin the final stretch of the regular season, traveling to Charlottesville, Va., Friday, Oct. 18 to take on No. 1 Virginia at 7 p.m.
- Pitt then hosts No. 21 Duke Friday, Oct. 25, before concluding the regular season at Notre Dame Friday, Nov. 1.

KIZZA COMMANDING ATTENTION

- Junior **Edward Kizza** leads the Panthers with 19 points on the year after netting eight goals and recording three assists.
- The 19 points rank him 16th in the national and third in the ACC.
- Kizza ranks 30th in the NCAA and fifth in the ACC with 0.67 goals per game.
- Kizza has scored in six of the 12 games this season, including two double-scoring games.
- Kizza closed out his 2018 campaign tied for third in program history for single-season goals (15) while ranking fifth in points (30).
- The historic season led Kizza to First Team All-ACC honors, Second Team All-Region recognition and a spot on the All-ACC Academic Team.
- The Kampala, Uganda, native picked up right

where he left off to start the 2019 season, recording a brace against No. 2 Indiana in the squad's season-opener Friday, Aug. 30. In the match, Kizza recorded the fastest consecutive goals in program history after scoring at the 35:24 and 35:31 mark, with the seven-second difference besting the old record of 34 seconds set by Michael Tuohy and John Cordier in 2013.

FRESHMEN FOCUS

- The freshmen tandem of **Veljko Petkovic** and **Valentin Noel** has accounted for seven of Pitt's 25 goals this year.
- Petkovic ranks second on the team with 12 points with four goals and assists, respectively. He's recorded two or more points on five occasions this season.
- Noel is just recently starting to make his mark, earning points in four of the last six games.
- He ranks fourth on the team with eight points off three goals and two assists.
- In addition to Petkovic and Noel, **Josh Hesson** has also made an impact this season. He's appeared in 11 games and has one goal and one assist.

PITT IN THE RPI

- The NCAA released the first RPI of the 2019 season Monday, Oct. 14.
- The Panthers rank 68th out of 206 in DI men's soccer.
- Pitt's highest RPI in program history came in October of 2017 at No. 14.
- Three ACC schools are among the top 10 including No. 1 Virginia, No. 3 Wake Forest and No. 8 Virginia Tech.

PANTHERS EARN ACADEMIC HONOR

- For the fourth consecutive year, the men's soccer team has earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award.
- Teams had to have posted a team GPA of 3.0 or higher for the 2018-19 academic year.
- The award is the seventh overall for Pitt.

SIZING UP THE 2019 SLATE

- Pitt faces some tough competition in the 2019 season, with a schedule that includes 10 NCAA Tournament teams and two NCAA

College Cup squads from a year ago.

- The Panthers have already faced then-ranked No. 2 Indiana, No. 1 Wake Forest and RV Akron on the season, and are set to square off with six other teams either ranked or receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches Poll in No. 5 Virginia, No. 11 North Carolina, No. 15 Duke, No. 16 Notre Dame, No. 17 Virginia Tech and RV Boston College.

PANTHERS CRUISE PAST HOWARD, 6-0

- Pitt beat Howard 6-0 Monday, Oct. 7 at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- Five different Panthers scored on the night, including freshman **Valentin Noel**, redshirt freshman **Anthony Harding** and **Alec Townsend**, sophomore **Rodrigo Almeida** and junior **Edward Kizza**. Kizza scored two goals in the win.
- The Panthers dominated the game, attempting 30 total shots. Pitt finished with the advantage in shots, 30-2, and corners, 5-1.

PITT DROPS CLOSE MATCH TO NO. 20 UNC

- The Panthers dropped a 2-1 decision to No. 20 North Carolina Friday night at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- The Tar Heels netted two consecutive goals at the end of the first half and early on in the second half.
- Sophomore **Nyk Sessock** scored Pitt's lone goal in the 87th minute.

PANTHERS OUTLAST DENVER IN 2OT

- The Panthers played their first of a four-game homestand against Denver on Sept. 30.
- Pitt outlasted the Pioneers, 3-2, in double overtime in the teams' first meeting.
- Denver struck first, finding the back of the net in the 41st minute.
- The Panthers responded with two goals within four minutes of each other to go ahead 2-1 to start the second half.
- Freshman **Valentin Noel** scored the first goal off a pass from junior **Sito Sena**. Sena scored the second goal after receiving help from junior **Edward Kizza** and sophomore **Nyk Sessock**.

- Kizza scored the game winning goal in the 107th minute. It was Kizza's fifth goal of the season, ending a four-game scoreless streak.
- Senior **Arie Ammann** had another solid performance in goal, ending the night with a 0.714 save percentage.

PITT TIES SYRACUSE 1-1

- The Panthers continued road ACC play as they faced Syracuse Friday, Sept. 27 in New York.
- Pitt and the Orange played to a 1-1 double overtime draw.
- Syracuse struck first, finding the back of the net in the 18th minute.
- The Panthers responded in the 37th minute as freshman **Veljko Petkovic** received a pass from junior **Edward Kizza** in the box through traffic and buried the ball into the left corner.
- The Orange outshot the Panthers 6-1 through both overtime periods, but neither team was able to score.
- Senior **Arie Ammann** had another solid performance in goal, making a season-high nine saves.

PITT BEATS BOSTON COLLEGE 2-0

- Pitt earned a 2-0 victory over Boston College Friday, Sept. 20 at Newman Soccer Field.
- Both teams were scoreless through most of the first half before a strike from freshman **Veljko Petkovic** off the free kick 26 yards out gave the Panthers a 1-0 advantage they'd never relinquish.
- Junior **Alexander Dexter** made the score 2-0 when he scored inside the 18' with less than five minutes to play.
- Petkovic closed the match with a team-high seven shots, followed by senior **Braden Kline** and junior **Sito Sena** with two. Dexter and freshman **Valentin Noel** each recorded one shot.
- In goal, redshirt junior **Arie Ammann** recorded the clean sheet while collecting four saves in 90 minutes of action.

PITT EARNS WIN OVER AKRON

- Pitt earned a 1-0 victory over Akron

- Monday, Sept. 16 at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- Both teams were scoreless through most of the match before a strike from junior **Alexander Dexter** from the left of the box gave the Panthers a 1-0 advantage they'd never relinquish.
- Junior **Edward Kizza** closed the match with a team-high four shots, followed by senior **Braden Kline** with three. Dexter, junior **Matt Bailey** and freshman **Valentin Noel** each recorded two shots, while redshirt junior **Tim Ekpone**, juniors **Sito Sena** and **Chad Stout**, sophomore **Rodrigo Almeida** and freshman **Josh Hesson** all added one shot apiece.
- In goal, redshirt junior **Arie Ammann** recorded the clean sheet while collecting four saves in 90 minutes of action.

PITT FALLS TO #1 WAKE FOREST

- Pitt dropped a 2-0 contest to No. 1 Wake Forest Friday, Sept. 13 at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- In a physical match that saw 20 total fouls and six total yellow cards, goals by Wake Forest in the 34th and 53rd minute led to the eventual Demon Deacon win.
- Junior **Edward Kizza** led the team with three shots, followed by sophomore **Rodrigo Almeida** with two. Juniors **Alexander Dexter** and **Sito Sena** and freshmen **Josh Hesson** and **Arturo Ordonez** each added one shot apiece in the matchup.
- In goal, redshirt junior **Arie Ammann** collected two saves while allowing two goals in 90 minutes of action.

PITT PLAYS TO DRAW AGAINST DELAWARE

- Pitt played to a 3-3 double overtime draw against Delaware Monday, Sept. 9 at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- Following an early goal by Delaware, the Panthers scored three unanswered to jump out to a 3-1 advantage, but a second half rally by the Blue Hens led to the eventual 3-3 draw.
- Junior **Sito Sena** scored two goals in the match via penalty kicks, with junior **Edward Kizza** adding a goal of his own off assists from Sena and sophomore **Rodrigo Almeida**.

- Sena closed out the contest with a team-high seven shots, while Kizza followed behind with four. Freshman **Veljko Petkovic** collected three shots on the night, with freshmen **Josh Hesson** and **Arturo Ordonez** adding two apiece. Juniors **Matt Bailey** and **Alexander Dexter**, along with Almeida, each recorded one shot apiece in the matchup.

PITT TOPS LIBERTY IN HOME OPENER

- Pitt earned a 3-0 victory over Liberty in its home opener Friday, Sept. 6 at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- The Panthers opened the scoring quickly, with junior **Edward Kizza** heading in a cross from junior **Matt Bailey** in the third minute to give Pitt the early 1-0 lead. Goals from freshman **Veljko Petkovic** in the 31st minute and freshman **Josh Hesson** in the 82nd minute would then lead to the 3-0 win.
- Hesson closed the match with a team-high five shots, while Bailey added four. Kizza and Petkovic each collected three shots, with redshirt sophomore **Chad Stout** and sophomore **Rodrigo Almeida** both recording two in the contest. Senior **Braden Kline**, junior **Alexander Dexter** and redshirt sophomore **Tim Townsend** each added a shot apiece in the matchup.
- In goal, sophomore keeper **Alexander Steinbach** recorded the clean sheet while collecting one save in 90 minutes of action.

PITT OPENS SEASON AT IU CLASSIC

- Pitt dropped two highly competitive matches against No. 2 Indiana and Northwestern in the adidas/IU Credit Union Classic last weekend.
- The Panthers dropped a 3-2 double overtime contest to the second-ranked Hoosiers in their season-opener Friday, Aug. 30, with junior **Edward Kizza** collecting two goals while junior **Sito Sena** and freshman **Veljko Petkovic** added one assist apiece.
- Pitt then fell to Northwestern, 1-0, Sunday, Sept. 1 after seeing some stout defense from the Wildcats' goalkeeper, who recorded eight saves in the contest.
- Kizza and Sena were both named to the All-Tournament Team for their efforts,



with Kizza also earning the honor of Most Outstanding Offensive Player.

SYNOPSIS OF THE SQUAD

- Pitt returns 14 players from a season ago in senior **Alex Peperak**, juniors **Alexander Dexter**, **Edward Kizza** and **Sito Sena**, redshirt sophomores **Chad Stout** and **Tim Townsend**, sophomores **Rodrigo Almeida**, **Johan Penaranda**, **Nyk Sessock**, **Alexander Steinbach**, **Chandler Vaughn** and **Jackson Walti** and redshirt freshmen **Anthony Harding** and **Alec Townsend**.
- Both Kizza and Vaughn earned numerous accolades following the conclusion of the 2018 season, with Kizza being selected to the All-ACC First Team and All-Region Second Team and Vaughn being voted to the ACC All-Freshman Team, while both players earned All-ACC Academic Team honors.
- The Panthers also welcome 12 newcomers in senior **Braden Kline**, redshirt juniors **Arie Ammann** and **Tim Ekpone**, juniors **Matt Bailey** and **Bryce Washington** and freshmen **Lucas Cyriacus**, **Josh Hesson**, **Luke Mort**, **Valentin Noel**, **Arturo Ordonez**, **Veljko Petkovic** and **Sebastian Serpa**.
- The team's four transfer additions come from Penn State (Ammann), Providence (Kline), Rutgers (Washington) and UMBC (Bailey). Ekpone, who competed for the Panthers in 2017, will be rejoining the team for its 2019 campaign.

2018 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Pitt amassed an 8-10-1 overall record while collecting multiple marquee wins.
- The Panthers earned regular season victories over Clemson and No. 12 NC State while also picking up an ACC Tournament win against No. 7 Virginia.
- Pitt's win against the Cavaliers was its first ACC Tournament victory in program history, with the Panthers' last conference tournament win coming in 1995 via a 3-1 victory against Rutgers in the Big East Tournament.
- Following the conclusion of the 2018 season, the Panthers saw several players

earn postseason accolades. **Edward Kizza** was named First Team All-ACC and Second Team All-Region, **Javi Perez** was selected to the All-ACC Second Team and All-Region Third Team, **Chandler Vaughn** was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team and the trio also earned All-ACC Academic Team recognition.

- Perez also became just the second player in program history to be selected in the MLS SuperDraft after being taken by LAFC in the third round.

VIDOVICH'S COACHING CAREER

- Head coach **Jay Vidovich** enters his fourth year with the program heading into the 2019 season.
- Vidovich led the Panthers to an 8-10-1 record and their first-ever ACC Tournament victory in 2018.
- He helped Perez become just the second player in program history to be selected in the MLS SuperDraft after being taken by LAFC. Vidovich also guided Pitt's first MLS draftee, with **Pol Planellas** earning the honor in 2018 after also being selected by LAFC.
- Prior to Pitt, Vidovich spent 21 years as the head coach at Wake Forest, where he led the Demon Deacons to a 2007 National Championship, made four College Cup appearances and claimed five ACC regular season titles.
- The two-time NSCAA Coach of the Year has produced 37 professional players, 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees while compiling a 295-158-56 (.635) career record.

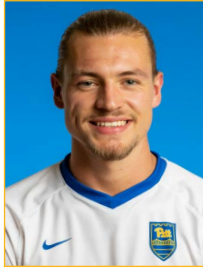

Jay Vidovich, one of America's most respected and accomplished soccer coaches, was named the third Pitt men's soccer head coach at the University of Pittsburgh in December of 2015.

During his third year at Pitt in the 2018 season, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over two ranked opponents in No. 12 NC State and No. 7 Virginia in the ACC Men's Soccer Tournament. The victory over the Cavaliers marked the Panthers' first ACC Tournament win in program history. Pitt collected its first conference win on the season against the Wolfpack and picked up another ACC victory over Clemson on Oct. 5.

Vidovich played a crucial role in the development of Javi Perez, who was drafted by LAFC in the third round of 2019 MLS Superdraft. With the selection, Perez became only the second player in program history to be drafted to an MLS club team. Three Panthers were also named to All-ACC teams under Vidovich's guidance as Edward Kizza was given First Team honors, Javi Perez earned Second Team recognition and Chandler Vaughn was named to the All-Freshman Team. Both Kizza and Perez earned All-Region Honors as well, with Kizza voted to the Second Team and Perez named to the Third Team.

Following his first year at the helm, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse in the 2017 season. The win against Syracuse would be the Panthers' first win over a ranked opponent since the 2008 season. The victory over the Orange was also the first conference win for Pitt since moving into the ACC at the start of the 2013 season, and they would add their second conference win against the Fighting Irish on Oct. 13. The Panthers would also capture victories against rivals Penn State and West Virginia throughout the season.

Vidovich also guided four players to All-ACC recognition, with Javi Perez earning Second Team honors, Pol Planellas receiving Third Team recognition and both Alexander Dexter and Edward Kizza being named to the All-Freshman Team. The postseason accolades were the team's first in program history since joining the ACC.

Planellas would go on to become the first Pitt men's soccer player in program history to be drafted by an MLS Club team after being selected by the Los Angeles Football Club in the second round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, becoming the 36th professional player under Vidovich's tutelage.

Prior to making the move to Pittsburgh, Vidovich oversaw the men's soccer program at Wake Forest for 21 seasons (1994-2014), building the Demon Deacons into a national power and winning the 2007 NCAA championship. He spent 2015 in professional soccer, coaching the Portland Timbers 2 (T2) in the United Soccer League (USL).

During his Wake Forest tenure, Vidovich compiled a 272-121-50 record and led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in 13 of his final 14 seasons. Wake Forest won five Atlantic Coast Conference titles under his watch, compiling a 76-52-22 mark in one of the nation's most challenging leagues.

In 2007, Wake Forest went 22-2-2—the winningest season in school history—and defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in the national final to claim the program's first NCAA title. The Demon Deacons made four consecutive appearances in the College Cup from 2006-09.

Vidovich, a two-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Coach of the Year (2007 and 2008) and five-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), ranks among the most decorated coaches in collegiate soccer.

Vidovich was the 2008 recipient of the prestigious Walt Chyzowych Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of soccer. Vidovich was an assistant under the legendary Chyzowych for eight seasons at Wake Forest from 1986-93.

Widely regarded as one of the game's top evaluators and developers of talent, Vidovich has produced 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees (three offensive and two defensive). He also coached Marcus Tracy, the first player in Wake history to win the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, which honors the top individual player in college soccer.

Thirty-five players under Vidovich went on to play in the professional ranks from 2002-14. His Wake Forest teams also achieved academically, evidenced by two ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, two Academic All-Americans, one adidas National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and one Senior CLASS Award recipient.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Vidovich was an all-state player for New Canaan High School in Connecticut. He played for Indiana University in 1978 before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan, where he was a three-year starter. As a senior, Vidovich was team captain and helped lead OWU to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

A 1982 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in physical education, he went on to earn a master's degree in sports sciences from the University of Denver in 1983.

It was at Denver where Vidovich's coaching career was launched as an assistant in 1982. He served in additional assistant posts at Regis College (1983) and his alma mater Ohio Wesleyan (1984-85) before joining Wake Forest's staff in 1986.
