SETTING THE SCENE

- The No. 8-ranked Indiana University men's soccer team heads to University Park, Pa. to face Big Ten-leading Penn State on Sunday at 1:00 p.m. ET.
- Freshman Maouloune Goumballe led the Hoosiers to a 3-1, Big Ten road victory at Northwestern on Tuesday night, totaling one goal and two assists.
- Indiana is undefeated in the team's last 30 regular-season, Big Ten conference matches, posting a record of 21-0-9. IU's last league loss in the regular season came on Oct. 10, 2015 in overtime at Ohio State, 1-0.
- Last season, the Hoosiers won both the Big Ten regular season championship (15th time) and Big Ten Tournament championship (13th time) in the same season for the first time since 2006.
- Also, IU advanced to the College Cup for the second-straight year and for a NCAA-record 20th time in program history.
- Indiana earned the No. 2 overall for the 2018 NCAA Tournament, marking the 14th time in the last 16 years since the current seeding format began in 2003 that IU earned a top-16 seed.
- The berth for the Hoosiers was the team's 32nd-straight bid to the NCAA Tournament and the 43rd overall in the program's history.

NEWS AND NOTES

- The preseason honors have piled up for Indiana sophomore Jack Maher prior to the 2019 season. Maher was the only sophomore named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List and also earned preseason All-America honors from both Top Drawer Soccer (Second Team) and College Soccer News (Third Team).
- Freshman Joshua Penn was named to the preseason Freshman Best XI by Top Drawer Soccer. Indiana's 2019 recruiting class was ranked No. 2 in the nation by Top Drawer Soccer.
- Maher, along with Spencer Glass and Simon Waever, were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List.
- In the Big Ten preseason poll conducted by the league's coaches, Indiana was picked No. 1. Maryland was tabbed second, while Michigan was picked to finish third in the conference.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

- The Penn State Nittany Lions come in to Sunday's match with an overall record of 5-1-2 on the season with a Big Ten mark of 2-0-1.
- PSU is off to a fast start in conference play, earning road wins at Ohio State and Michigan State. They played Michigan to a 0-0 draw at home.
- Aaron Molloy and Liam Butts lead the team with three goals each on the season.
- Before the season, Penn State was picked to finish sixth in a poll conducted of the Big Ten's head coaches.

SERIES HISTORY

- In the series history dating back to 1978, the Hoosiers hold a 33-14-4 over the Nittany Lions.
- Indiana is 4-0 in the last four matches against the Nittany Lions and have not allowed a goal over that span, out-scoring PSU, 5-0.
- IU is 8-8-2 overall in University Park, winning 1-0 in the team's last visit in 2017 on a goal from Spencer Glass.

REGULAR SEASON DOMINANCE

- Indiana is undefeated in the team's last 30 regular-season, Big Ten conference matches, posting a record of 21-0-9.
- IU's last league loss in the regular season came on Oct. 10, 2015 in overtime at Ohio State, 1-0.

FRESHMEN PACE HOOSIERS AT NORTHWESTERN

- Freshman Maouloune Gomballe had a goal and two assists, while fellow freshmen Joshua Penn and Aidan Morris scored in the team's 3-1 road win at Northwestern on Oct. 1.
- Freshman Roman Celentano made his first collegiate start at goalkeeper in the match, earning the win and making two saves.
- In total, five true freshmen earned the start against the Wildcats.

HOOSIERS TABBED BIG TEN FAVORITES

- The Hoosiers were tabbed as the Big Ten preseason favorites in a poll conducted of the league's coaches for the second-straight year.
- Along with being named the preseason favorite, IU's Spencer Glass, Simon Waever and Jack Maher were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List.

IUMS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- Indiana is ranked No. 8 in the country in the United Soccer Coaches poll.
- IU is ranked No. 7 in the nation by Top Drawer Soccer and No. 10 by College Soccer News.

INDIANA UNDEFEATED IN LAST 31 HOME MATCHES

- The Hoosiers are undefeated in the team's last 31 matches at Jerry Yeagley Field at Bill Armstrong Stadium, posting a mark of 28-0-3.
- IU's last loss at home came to No. 20 Virginia Tech, 2-1 in overtime, on Nov. 27, 2016 in the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

IMPRESSIVE RECORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

• In IU's last 52 regular season matches against non-conference opponents dating back through the 2014 season, the Hoosiers have posted an impressive record of 40-5-7.

FRESHMEN COME THROUGH AGAINST WISCONSIN

• In Indiana's 3-1, Big Ten-opening win over Wisconsin on Sept. 20, three freshmen scored goals for the Hoosiers.
• Victor Bezerra opened the scoring to give IU the lead, while both Daniel Munie and Maouloune Gouballe netted the first goals of their careers.

90 MINUTES NOT ENOUGH

• For the first time in program history, Indiana played in five-straight overtime matches to begin the season.
• The five overtime matches in the team's first five games is already more than IU played in 24 of the program's 47 seasons.

BIG TEN CHAMPIONS

• For the first time since 2006, Indiana won both the Big Ten regular season and the Big Ten Tournament titles in the same season in 2018.
• Indiana's regular season title was the 15th in program history, while the tournament championship was the 13th in school history.

CAULFIELD EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

• At the Mike Berticelli Memorial Tournament in South Bend, Ind., Sean Caulfield had a pair of standout performances for the Hoosiers.
• In a 2-1, overtime victory over Denver on Friday, Caulfield made a pair of saves for IU. Then on Sunday against WAC preseason favorite Seattle, the East Lake, Fla. native recorded the first shutout of his career in a 0-0 draw, making three saves.

BLACK'S BRACE LEADS IU PAST DENVER IN OT

• Ian Black scored a brace, including the golden goal, in Indiana's 2-1 win over Seattle in overtime on Sept. 6.
• The win marked the third-straight for the Hoosiers in overtime, a first for the program since winning three-consecutive in the NCAA Tournament, Nov. 15-29, in 1998.

MAHER WINS IT FOR IU IN 20T VERSUS UCLA

• Sophomore Jack Maher won it for the Hoosiers in the 104th minute against UCLA on Sept. 2, capping the comeback for IU.
• Freshman Victor Bezerra scored his first collegiate goal to tie the match in the 58th minute.

IU'S MAHER, BLACK EARN WEEKLY HONORS

• After scoring the game-winner against UCLA and notching an assist against Pitt, Jack Maher was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 4.
• Also for IU, Ian Black was named Honorable-Mention on Top Drawer's Soccer's National Team of the Week on Sept. 3.

MAHER NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore D Jack Maher was named to the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List prior to the season.
- Maher was the only sophomore named to the 36-player watch list.
- In the storied history of Indiana men's soccer, an IU player has been named the national player of the year 12 times, including IU head coach Todd Yeagley.
- Last year, Andrew Gutman won the award, while Grant Lillard was a runner-up in 2017. Tanner Thompson was a semifinalist for the Hoosiers in 2016.

MAHER CALLED UP TO USMNT U-23 CAMP

- In March, Indiana sophomore Jack Maher was invited to the U-23 Men's National Soccer Team training camp in Spain.
- Maher was the only collegiate player that earned an invite to the camp, joining 22 professional players.

HOOSIERS TAKE INTERNATIONAL TRIP TO MEXICO CITY

- In March, the Indiana men's soccer team traveled to Mexico City to play in a pair of matches, as well as participate in many cultural experiences.
- On the pitch, the Hoosiers earned a win over the Cruz Azul U-20 team and also defeated the UNAM University team in the legendary Estadio Olimpico, host of the 1986 World Cup.
- Along with the two matches the team played, IU watched a match at Azteca Stadium, toured Mexico City and got an exclusive tour of the ancient pyramids of Teotihuacan.

IU REACHES COLLEGE CUP FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR

- For the second-straight season, Indiana reached the College Cup.
- IU has reached a NCAA-record 20 College Cups.

HEAD COACH
10TH SEASON

- Todd Yeagley was named Indiana head men's soccer coach on December 18, 2009 and is entering his 10th year as the Hoosiers' leader.

2012 NCAA National Champions

- In just his third season as head coach, Yeagley led Indiana to the 2012 NCAA title, the eighth championship in IU history. The Hoosiers became the first No. 16 seed to win the championship, compiling victories over Xavier, at No. 1 Notre Dame, at No. 9 North Carolina, No. 12 Creighton and No. 3 Georgetown during their tournament run.

- Yeagley was named 2012 Soccer America Coach of the Year as he and his father Jerry become the only father-son duo to have won Division I men's soccer championships.

Year-By-Year

- The 2018 season was another historic one for Indiana, as the Hoosiers won both the Big Ten regular season and tournament championships for the first time since 2006. IU advanced to the College Cup for the second-straight season and finished the year ranked No. 3 in the nation with an overall record of 20-3-1. Also for the second-straight season, Yeagley and the IU coaching staff were named Men's North Region Staff of the Year for DI Institutions by United Soccer Coaches. Andrew Gutman and Trey Muse earned First-Team All-America honors from United Soccer Coaches, while Griffin Dorsey earned second-team accolades.

- In 2017, the Hoosiers reached the College Cup Final, falling in double overtime to Stanford. Indiana was unbeaten in the team's first 24 matches and posted an overall record of 18-1-6 on the year, finishing the year ranked No. 2 in the nation. Yeagley and the rest of the IU coaches were named the Men's Midwest Region Staff of the Year (SOY) for Division I Institutions by the United Soccer Coaches. Both Grant Lillard and Andrew Gutman earned All-America honors, as the Hoosiers set the school mark for shutouts in a season with 18.

Playing Career

- As a player, Yeagley was a four-time All-American at Indiana (1991-94) and in 1994 was named the Missouri Athletic Club National Player of the Year. During his stint as a student-athlete in Bloomington, Yeagley was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He led the Hoosiers to three Big Ten titles (1991, 1992, 1994) and a 79-9-5 overall record.

- After his playing days at Indiana, Yeagley also enjoyed a successful seven-year professional career in Major League Soccer with the Columbus Crew. Columbus advanced to the MLS Playoffs in five of Yeagley's seven seasons with the team and won the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2002.

Honors

- Since returning to his alma mater, Yeagley has produced 14 Major League Soccer Draft picks, six MLS Homegrown signees, 45 All-Big Ten honorees (23 first-team selections) and five Big Ten Player of the Year selections.

Personal

- Yeagley is a member of the Indiana Soccer Hall of Fame and in 2013 was inducted into the Monroe County Hall of Fame and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

- Yeagley earned a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology from Indiana in 2002. He and his wife, Suzy, have three children: Ben, Grant and Jay.

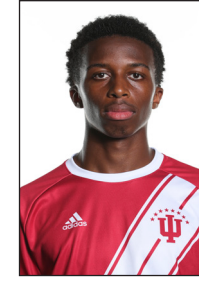
