## BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• Nine Big Ten schools were selected for postseason bowl games this year, highlighted by a trio of conference teams (Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin) that received invitations to College Football Playoff bowls.

• Ohio State was selected to compete in the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz., on Dec. 28. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 2 by the College Football Playoff selection committee and will take on third-ranked Clemson. The winner of that semifinal will advance to the College Football Playoff National Championship against either No. 1 LSU or No. 4 Oklahoma on Jan. 13 at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans.

• Big Ten West Division Champion Wisconsin will participate in the Rose Bowl Game Presented by Northwestern Mutual, while Penn State will compete in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, joining the Buckeyes as the Big Ten representatives in this year's College Football Playoff bowls. The Badgers were ranked No. 8 by the College Football Playoff selection committee and will play No. 6 Oregon on Jan. 1 in Pasadena, Calif. The Nittany Lions were No. 10 and will meet No. 17 Memphis on Dec. 28 in Arlington, Texas.

• Ohio State was crowned Big Ten Champion after its 34-21 win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game presented by Discover on Dec. 7 at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. It was the Buckeyes' 38th Big Ten title and third in as many years.

• The Buckeyes are the first team since Wisconsin (2010-12) to "three-peat" as Big Ten Champions. A complete statistical recap of this year's Big Ten Championship Game can be found on Page 3.

• Five Big Ten standouts took home national honors. Ohio State's Chase Young claimed the Bednarik Award (Defensive Player of the Year), the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (Defensive Player of the Year) and the Ted Hendricks Award (Nation's Top Defensive End). Wisconsin teammates Tyler Biadasz and Jonathan Taylor took home the Rimington Award (Nation's Best Center) and the Doak Walker Award (Nation's Top Running Back), respectively. Michigan State's Kenny Willekes earned the Burlsworth Trophy, which goes to the nation's most outstanding walk on, while Minnesota's Casey O'Brien was honored with the Disney Spirit Award.

• The Big Ten posted the fifth-highest single-season attendance total in conference history with 6,244,649 fans attending home games. This marks the seventh consecutive season and eighth time in nine years that more than six million fans have attended Big Ten home football games.

## BIG LIFE. BIG STAGE. BIG TEN.

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

## BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• The Big Ten continues to feature the largest and most diverse post-season lineup in conference history, with two schools making their first appearance in their assigned bowl. Indiana and Michigan State will each make their first trip to their destinations. Two teams will return to their respective bowls for the first time since the 1970s, as Penn State returns to the Cotton Bowl for the first time since 1974 and Minnesota heads to the Outback Bowl for the first time since 1977.

• A total of 22 Big Ten standouts from eight different schools have earned All-America status, including 12 that earned first-team distinction from at least one organization. In addition, six Big Ten students were named consensus All-Americans, including five unanimous first-team honorees. Minnesota's Antoine Winfield Jr., Ohio State's Jeff Okudah and Chase Young, and Wisconsin's Tyler Biadasz and Jonathan Taylor were unanimous first-team All-Americans, while Iowa's Keith Duncan earned consensus All-America status. • Four Big Ten students were named Academic All-Americans, giving the Big Ten 106 honorees in the past 15 seasons. This year's Academic All-America first-team honoree from the Big Ten was Penn State's Blake Gillikin, who was named to the first team for the second consecutive season. Minnesota's Blaise Andries and Sam Renner and Ohio State's Jordan Fuller received Academic All-America second-team accolades this season.

• Greg Schiano, who led Rutgers from 2001-11, returned as the head football coach following the Rutgers Board of Governors' approval on Dec. 3. The Wyckoff, N.J., native directed the Scarlet Knights to six bowl appearances, coached 83 players who signed NFL contracts and guided the program to the top APR score in the nation during his previous 11 seasons in Piscataway. Schiano holds a 68-67 record as the Rutgers head coach, including a 56-33 mark in his last seven seasons.

## Indiana's LTC (R) Doug Schlereth and Wisconsin's J.J. Watt Honored with Big Ten Ford-Kinnick Leadership and Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Awards

Indiana's LTC (R) Doug Schlereth is this year's recipient of the Big Ten's Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award, while Wisconsin's J.J. Watt is the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award honoree, the conference announced on Nov. 26. These awards recognize Big Ten football students who have achieved success in the areas of leadership and humanitarianism following their academic and athletic careers at a Big Ten university.

LTC (R) Schlereth was a four-year letterwinner as a defensive lineman at Indiana from 1985-88, where he started in three bowl games for the Hoosiers: All-American Bowl (1986), Peach Bowl (1988) and the Liberty Bowl (1988). LTC (R) Schlereth finished his career with 138 total tackles, 10 tackles for loss and five fumble recoveries.

LTC (R) Schlereth was commissioned through Federal Officer Candidate School in 1990 upon graduating from Indiana University.

LTC (R) Schlereth most recently served as Structure and Analysis Staff Officer at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas where he retired with 29 years of military service on September 1, 2019. His other assignments include service as the Station and Plans Officer at the Headquarters Department of the Army (HQDA) G-3, 5, 7, Pentagon, HQDA G-8 Operations Branch Chief in the Pentagon and the HQDA G-8 Liaison Officer (LNO) to the U.S. Army Central Command (USARCENT), Kuwait.

LTC (R) Schlereth is a graduate of Joint and Combined Warfighting School (JCWS) and the Command and General Staff College (CGSC). He holds a Master of Arts in Homeland Security from the American Public (Military) University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Telecommunications with a Business Minor degree from Indiana University.

His military awards and decorations include Meritorious Service Medal (four oak leaf clusters), Army Commendation Medal (two oak leaf clusters), Army Achievement Medal (one oak leaf cluster), Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Armed Forces Reserve Medal (mobilization device), National Defense Service Medal (one bronze star), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal (three bronze stars), Southwest Asia Service Medal (one bronze star), Army Service Ribbon and NATO Medal.

LTC (R) Schlereth had four combat tours which included one in Saudi Arabia after the Gulf War, two tours in Afghanistan and one in Kuwait. LTC (R) Schlereth will always be a Mallory Man.

Watt maintained a life sciences communication major at Wisconsin, while earning two letters as a defensive end for the Badgers from 2008-10. The Pewaukee, Wis., native earned All-America and first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2010, as well as earning the 2010 Lott IMPACT Trophy. The two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree was also instrumental in helping the Badgers earn a share of the Big Ten Championship in 2010 and receiving invitations to three bowl games, winning the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl.

In 2010, he started the Justin J. Watt Foundation in Wisconsin out of a desire to help underserved kids. His personal motto of "Dream Big, Work Hard" culminated into a mission that he continues to use to impact communities nationwide. The foundation has provided more than \$5.2 million in funding to more than 700 middle schools and organizations in 30 states that have insufficient funding for after-school athletic programs or no after-school athletics whatsoever for sixth through eighth grade children.

Watt was drafted by the Houston Texans in the first round of the 2011 NFL Draft and is currently in his ninth season in the NFL. Watt has been named to the Pro Bowl four times and is a four-time first-team All-Pro. Leading the league in sacks in 2012 and 2015, Watt was named NFL Defensive Player of the Year in 2012, 2014 and 2015.

In the wake of Hurricane Harvey, Watt posted a video on social media announcing a fundraising campaign with an initial goal of \$200,000, to which he matched the first \$100,000. In 19 days, he raised more than \$37 million. To date, Watt has raised more than \$41 million for hurricane relief which helped repair more than 1,100 homes and 950 childcare centers. Watt earned both the Sports Illustrated Man of the Year award and Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year plaudit for his fundraising efforts in 2017.

The Ford-Kinnick Leadership and Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Awards are part of the Big Ten's annual awards program. The Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award is named for Michigan's Gerald Ford and Iowa's Nile Kinnick. The Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award is named for Minnesota's Tony Dungy and Indiana's Anthony Thompson. Since its inception in 1896, the pursuit and attainment of academic excellence has been a priority for every Big Ten member institution. But maintaining the conference's standard of competing at the highest level in athletics also endures as an important component of the Big Ten experience. Striking that balance between academics and athletics is integral to the Big Ten's identity. Recognized as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten strives for success from its students not only on the field and in the classroom, but around the world as well.

### PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 65 universities in the nation according to the 2017 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including five in the top 25.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,800 Academic All-Americans, including 37 honorees during the 2018-19 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

### A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least five national championships in 24 of the last 25 years including an average of seven per year over the last 13 years.

Since the 2008-09 academic year, current Big Ten institutions have claimed 76 team national championships in 21 different sports.

### BROAD-BASED PROGRAMMING

The Big Ten will administer over \$200 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on more than 350 teams in 42 different sports.

The Big Ten sponsors 28 official conference sports, 14 for men and 14 for women, including the addition of men's ice hockey and men's and women's lacrosse in this decade.

The Big Ten leads the nation in total students competing in intercollegiate athletics and participation opportunities, and sponsors more official sports than all conferences except the Ivy League.

Almost 1,400 Big Ten competitors have participated in the Olympics, winning more than 600 medals, including nearly 300 gold. In the 2016 and 2018 Olympic Games, more than 200 representatives from Big Ten institutions including current or former students and coaches were members of Olympic teams. Big Ten Olympians collected more than 50 medals in the most recent games in Rio and PyeongChang.

### PASSIONATE FOLLOWING

The Big Ten leads all conferences with 5.7 million alumni and nearly 580,000 students.

Each year more than 11 million patrons attend Big Ten home contests, as the conference has led the nation in attendance for men's basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and wrestling.

### LEADERS IN INNOVATION

Took part in the nation's first bowl game, winning the 1902 Rose Bowl Game, and signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl with permanent conference affiliations.

Awarded the first Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915, honoring outstanding seniors who demonstrated excellence in academics and athletics.

Formed the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, enlisting former students that competed in conference athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

Became the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

Implemented the first collegiate football system of instant replay in 2004, which the NCAA approved for use among all conferences in 2006.

Launched the Big Ten Network (BTN) in 2007, the first national conference-owned television network.

Began partnering with the Ivy League to study the effects of head injuries in sports in 2012.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

### EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 2,000 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada, and is also available internationally via the Fox Sports App, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. BTN Plus streams hundreds of additional events each season.

### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 30 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.
