### Starting Five

- The Buckeyes are 1,155-415 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.736) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 237-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes faced a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and then Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (W, 72-51). Ohio State is 179-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856).

- Three current Buckeyes were named Mr. Basketball in their respective states. Junior Kaleb Wesson was named Ohio Mr. Basketball as a senior at Westerville South High School ... freshman D.J. Carton was named Mr. Basketball in Iowa in 2019 as a senior at Bettendorf High School and freshman E.J. Liddell was named Illinois Mr. Basketball in both 2018 and 2019 after leading Belleville High School to back-to-back state titles.

- Andre and Kaleb Wesson are one of 16 sets of brothers playing in NCAA Division I this season and one of three sets in the Big Ten. Iowa (McCaffery) and Maryland (Mitchell) also have siblings on the roster.

- Ohio State has 58 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the next Buckeye on schedule to reach the milestone with 905 career points over his career.

- Ohio State came in to the North Carolina game limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.

### Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 169-30 (.849) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 14 with 154 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 184 wins over 217 games (184-33). The Buckeyes also have played the eighth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 145 (60 wins/12th) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

### Buckeyes in the Challenge

Ohio State has participated in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge for the last 18 years and has a 7-11 record in the event. The Buckeyes first took part in the event during the 2002-03 season against Duke in Greensboro, N.C., a 91-75 Blue Devils' victory. Ohio State defeated Virginia Tech in Columbus in 2005-06, 69-59, for its first victory in the event. The 2011 game vs. Duke in Columbus pitted the highest combined ranking of Ohio State (2) and Duke (3) in the Buckeyes' previous Challenge games. That record was nearly tied in 2012 with the No. 4 Buckeyes traveling to No. 2 Duke. Ohio State was No. 3 and North Carolina came in at No. 7 in the 2006 Challenge. The Buckeyes entered the event this year at No. 6 with the Tar Heels ranked No. 7 (W, 74-49). Ohio State has faced a ranked ACC opponent 12 times in the Challenge.

### The Ohio State vs. Penn State Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with the Nittany Lions 35-17. Ohio State owns an 18-5 record in Columbus and is 13-9 in State College. The teams have played on a neutral court seven times with the Buckeyes winning four. Andre Wesson has faced the Nittany Lions five times over his career, most of any Buckeye. He averages 6.6 points and 3.2 rebounds in the series. Younger brother Kaleb Wesson averages seven points and 3.3 boards. Luther Muhammad scored 20 points as a freshman last year in Ohio State's 74-70 home win. Duane Washington Jr. added nine points in his first appearance in the series. As a ranked team, Ohio State is 18-7 vs. the Nittany Lions. When ranked in the Top 10, Ohio State is 12-3.

### Noting the North Carolina Game

- The 8-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
- Ohio State has now won four-consecutive true road openers after the 74-49 win over No. 7 North Carolina. The Buckeyes downed Cincinnati to open the 2018-19 season (65-56, 11/7/2018), Wisconsin (83-58, 12/2/17) and Navy (78-68, 11/11/16).
- The 25-point margin of victory was the second-largest by an opponent at the Dean Smith Center. The largest margin of victory by an opponent over North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center was a 29-point margin by Duke in an 87-58 win in 2002.
- The 27.4 (17-62) field goal percentage was the lowest by the Tar Heels in the Dean Smith Center.
- The 49 points were the third-fewest points by North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center.
- Ohio State outscored the Tar Heels by 23 points (45-22) in the second half. The figure is the largest margin by which an opponent has outscored North Carolina in a half at the venue. The previous-highest mark was 22 set by Maryland in

1997 and Temple in 1988.

- Ohio State improved to 519-152 as a Top 25 team, 341-77 as a Top 10 team, 169-272 vs. Top 25 teams, 72-135 vs. Top 10 teams, 78-77 when both teams are ranked, 21-9 when ranked No. 6 and 8-10 vs. teams ranked No. 7.
- Ohio State has now won four games all-time vs. Top 10 nonconference teams on the road, the last was at No. 9 Florida Nov. 16, 2010. OSU was No. 3 in that game.
- The Buckeyes have won 26 nonconference games vs. Top 10 teams all time, 17 have come away from Columbus (away, neutral). Ohio State's last win vs. a Top 10 away from Columbus was vs. No. 4 Kentucky Dec. 19, 2015 in Brooklyn, New York. That game was part of CBSSports Classic. Ohio State plays Kentucky Dec. 21 in Las Vegas this year in the CBSSports event.
- Ohio State won a Top 10 game in football vs. Michigan last Saturday and then a Top 10 basketball game at North Carolina, a span of 4 days. Ohio State is just the second team to defeat both a Top 10 football and basketball team in a span of four days or less ever, joining Michigan in 1992-93.
- The 25-point win over No. 7 UNC, is the second largest margin of victory over a Top 10 in Ohio State history, The Buckeyes defeated No. 10 Wisconsin 93-65 (+28) March 6, 2011. Ohio State knocked of No. 10 Villanova in Columbus earlier this year 76-51 (+25).
- Ohio State held a 48-32 advantage on the boards, a 25-10 lead in bench points and a 30-10 advantage in points in the paint vs. UNC.
- For the season, Ohio State's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench 244-97.
- Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.
- Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (18), E.J. Liddell (12), CJ Walker (10) and Kaleb Wesson (10).

- Ohio State has held six of its eight opponents to 20 or fewer made field goals. The 17 made field goals for the Tar Heels tie for the second-fewest in a game against the Buckeyes this season.
- Ohio State improved to 7-11 all-time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.
- The Buckeyes' last win in North Carolina prior to Wednesday was at Wake Forest Dec. 1, 1969, a 96-92 victory for the No. 18 Buckeyes. In the state of North Carolina, Ohio State is 5-9 all-time.
- The Buckeyes improved to 3-12 all-time against the Tar Heels, earning their first victory since No. 3 Ohio State topped No. 19 North Carolina, 80-73, in the 1992 Midwest Regional in Louisville, Ky.
- The Buckeyes made 10-of-26 attempts from 3-point range, last time Buckeyes canned 10 from distance as vs. Purdue Fort Wayne, 13-30 (11/22/19)
- Ohio State has now defeated two Top 10 teams this year by 25 points. The Buckeyes downed No. 10 Villanova, 76-51 (11/13/19) and No. 7 North Carolina on the road, 74-49 (12/4/19).

Chris Holtmann improved to 2-3 all-time against North Carolina and earned his first win in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

E.J. Liddell scored a career-high 12 points against the Tar Heels.

Liddell tied his career-best five rebounds.

CJ Walker scored 10 points against the Tar Heels, to eclipse the 500-point mark with 501.

Since joining the starting lineup seven games ago, Duane Washington Jr. has hit at least one 3-pointer in each contest.

Andre Wesson's five assists marked a career best. His previous-high of four was set five times, most recently at Maryland (2/23/19)

Wesson's nine rebounds tied for the second-most in a game in his career. His career high is 10 set last season against Penn State (2/7/19).

Kaleb Wesson scored 10 points in the win, marking his team-best seventh game in double figures scoring.

Wesson moved passed the 900 mark in career scoring (905) in the win.

The Wesson brothers combined for 15 points, 18 rebounds, seven assists and a steal.

## Buckeyes Open 121st Season, 108th in BIG

This is the 108th season of Big Ten membership in men's basketball for the Buckeyes and the 121st overall for the sport at Ohio State. The Buckeyes are 99-21 in season openers and 102-17 in the first home game of the season. Ohio State is 56-63 in the first true road game of the year. In Big Ten Conference play, the Buckeyes are 58-46 in league openers, 72-33 in the first conference home game of the season and 39-66 in league road openers. Ohio State is 40-20 when the first conference game of the year is at home and 19-26 when opening conference play on the road.

The National Association of Basketball Coaches named the 2018-19 Buckeyes a winner of the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award after the squad posted a team GPA of 3.03 last year. It marks the second-consecutive year Chris Holtmann's team has earned the honor.

### Cincinnati Game Second Earliest Opener in Ohio State History

When Ohio State tipped vs. Cincinnati in the 2019-20 opener, the game was the second earliest opening date in Ohio State history. The Nov. 6 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53.

### Matta Enters Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Thad Matta, the all-time winningest coach in Ohio State history, was selected to enter the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during a ceremony Sept. 6. The 13th coach in program history, Matta recorded 337 career wins, made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, five "Sweet Sixteens," three "Elite Eights" and two Final Fours over 13 seasons (2005-17).

### Kaleb Wesson Tests NBA Waters, Returns for Junior Year

Kaleb Wesson elected to enter his name into the 2019 NBA Draft process to gain feedback into his goal of becoming a professional basketball player. After going through the process he elected to return to Ohio State for his junior year. Wesson made the decision in late May.

### Sueing Selects Ohio State, Eligible in 2020-21

Justice Sueing joined the Ohio State program in May of 2019 following a transfer from the University of California. Sueing, a 6-foot, 6-inch forward from Honolulu, Hawaii, will have two years of eligibility with the Buckeyes after sitting out the 2019-20 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Sueing played 31 games for the Golden Bears a season ago. He averaged 14.3 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting better than 78 percent from the foul line (129-165).

### Diebler Added to Coaching Staff

Jake Diebler, who spent three seasons with the Buckeyes as the team's video coordinator (2014-2016) was hired as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes after spending the last two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt. Diebler, older brother of

Ohio State great Jon Diebler, is a 2009 graduate of Valparaiso. He was a standout high school player at Upper Sandusky (Ohio).

### Diallo Picks Ohio State

Ibrahima Diallo, a 6-foot, 10-inch center from Senegal, signed a letter of intent to play for Chris Holtmann and the Buckeyes in mid-April 2019. Diallo enters the 2019-20 season along with a stellar freshman class. He joins forwards Alonzo Gaffney and E.J. Liddell and guard D.J. Carton. Diallo played a season ago at Prolific Prep in California where he averaged 11 points, 11 rebounds and nearly four blocks a game.

### Buckeyes Enter 2019-20 Campaign with 20+ Wins in 14 of the Last 15 Seasons

Ohio State has 29 seasons with 20 or more wins and three with 30 or more. Holtmann has won at least 20 games in each of his two years at Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won 20 or more in 14 of the last 15 seasons.

### Buckeyes, West Virginia to Meet Dec. 29

Ohio State and West Virginia will play Dec. 29 at Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse in Cleveland, Ohio. The Buckeyes and Mountaineers have played 16 times previously with Ohio State owning the series lead 9-7. **Noting the 2019-20 Ohio State Schedule**

- Ohio State played its first seven games of the season, plus an exhibition, at home with six at Value City Arena and one at St. John Arena. Three of the four non-Big Ten games in December will be played outside Columbus (vs. North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge, vs. Kentucky in CBSSports Classic (Las Vegas) and vs. West Virginia in Cleveland Classic).
- The Buckeyes again took part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Ohio State traveled to North Carolina (W, 74-49).
- Now in its sixth year, Ohio State will again play in the CBSSports Classic. The event will take place in Las Vegas this season Dec. 21. The Buckeyes take on Kentucky while North Carolina and UCLA play in the second game.
- Villanova traveled to Ohio State Nov. 13. The game was part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents. The Buckeyes downed the No. 10 Wildcats 76-51.
- Two Big Ten Conference games will be played in early December after the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate in 2018-19. Ohio State will play Penn State in Columbus Saturday and travel to Minnesota Dec. 15.
- The annual Big Ten Tournament will be contested in Indianapolis in 2020, Chicago in 2021 and then back to Indianapolis in 2022.
- The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2018-19 plus an exhibition contest vs. Cedarville Oct. 30.
- Seven Big Ten teams (Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, Penn State, Maryland, Wisconsin and Nebraska) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hits the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern this year.
- Two Big Ten Conference games will be played in

December. Ohio State faces Penn State at home Dec. 7 and then travels to Minnesota Dec. 15. The Buckeyes are 4-0 in December conference games the last two years with wins at Wisconsin and vs. Michigan in 2017 and victories over Minnesota in Columbus and Illinois in Chicago in 2018.

- Ohio State will play 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2019. Fifteen games are scheduled vs. 2019 NCAA Tournament teams (Maryland-2, Minnesota-2, Michigan State-1, Michigan-2, Wisconsin-2, Villanova-1, Purdue-1, Cincinnati-1, Iowa-1, Kentucky-1, North Carolina-1) while four contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2019 NIT squads (Indiana-2, Nebraska-2).
- Every Ohio State game will be televised or streamed. CBS will feature the Buckeyes five times, FOX/FS1 will carry eight OSU games, ESPN Networks will broadcast nine games with BTN showing 10 games, which includes two BTN+ (Cedarville and Purdue Fort Wayne) games.

**108 Years in Big Ten**

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

last four years and will do so again this year in 2019-20. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC again this season. CBS Sports televises the doubleheader and has done so since the first year of the event in Chicago (2014). These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBSSPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015, where the Buckeyes knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The teams traveled to Las Vegas in 2016 where the Buckeyes fell to UCLA. Ohio State took on North Carolina Dec. 23, 2017 in New Orleans (L, 86-72). The Buckeyes defeated UCLA Dec. 22, 2018 of this year at the United Center in Chicago. The Buckeyes meet Kentucky this year in Las Vegas (Dec. 21/5:15 p.m./CBS).



### Roster Grows for 2020-21 Buckeyes

Chris Holtmann, now in his third year as the head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the addition of two student-athletes to the program's roster for the 2020-21 season.

Eugene Brown III, a 6-6, 185-pound guard from Southwest Dekalb (Georgia) High School, and Zed Key, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Long Island (New York) Lutheran High School, signed NCAA National Letters of Intent in early November.

Brown III was the first player from the class of 2020 to commit. Brown, a native of Decatur, Georgia, averaged 9.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists over his first three years of his high school career, despite a leg injury sidelining him for most of his junior season. In five games as a junior he averaged 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists.

"We are really excited about Eugene," Holtmann said. "He is a gifted perimeter player who has developed a great skill set thanks to many hours in the gym as a coach's son. He plays the game with the energy and competitiveness we want in our student-athletes."

Key, who hails from Brookville, New York, averaged 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds his junior season. He also was a part of the 2019 New York State Federation Class AA State Championship team (25-2), who defeated Chris The King, 51-31, last March. Key played in four games at the 2019 National Basketball Players Association Top 100 camp, averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.

"Zed is a great addition to our university and program," Holtmann said. "He plays the game with a high level of physicality and understanding of the game. He has been a part of championship teams in New York and it became clear early on in the recruiting process how important winning is to him."

### Wesson Brothers = Difference Makers

Senior Andre Wesson along with junior sibling Kaleb Wesson have been significant contributors over the last three seasons for Chris Holtmann, now in his third season as head coach of the Buckeyes.

### Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game

in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his two seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

### Holtmann vs. the Ranked

In nine seasons as a head coach, three at Gardner Webb (2011-13), three at Butler (2015-17) and now in year three at Ohio State, Chris Holtmann is 18-28 overall against opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25. He was 0-2 at GW and 13-13 at Butler. His teams were 6-9 vs. Top 10 foes at Butler and 3-4 vs. Top 5 opponents. He is 5-13 at Ohio State.

### Six Seasons with 20 Wins for Holtmann

Holtmann teams have won 20 or more games in each of his last six full years as a head coach. Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

### Ohio State's 29 20-Win Seasons

The win over Iowa State in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2018-19 season. The feat marked the 29th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 29 in Ohio State history.

### The Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7, 2018 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State earned a 64-56 win in the first game at renovated Fifth-Third Arena last year and is 8-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after winning by the identical score, 64-56, Nov. 6 in Columbus. Three of the last six meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament. Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national

championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66).

### Throwback Game at St. John Arena

Ohio State played Kent State as part of the 2019 Ohio State Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 25.

#### A few notes on the venue:

- Ohio State first played at St. John Arena during the 1956-57 season. The last season the Buckeyes called SJA their home was 1997-98. Ohio State began playing at its current home, Value City Arena, in 1998-99.
- Ohio State has an overall record of 433-151 (.741) at SJA, which includes a 7-0 record in games played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.
- Ohio State defeated Cleveland State 89-62 Nov. 23, 2018. The Buckeyes had last played at SJA in 2010, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina (12/12/2010).
- The facility is named after former Ohio State director of athletics and men's basketball coach L.W. St. John.
- The first game played at SJA was against Butler (12/1/1956), a 98-82 win for the Buckeyes.
- Capacity is 13,276. The CSU game was a sellout.
- Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams. Those teams moved out of SJA and into the Covelli Center on Ohio State's campus following the 2018-19 season.
- SJA also is filled to capacity prior to each home football game during "Skull Session" where the Ohio State Marching Band practices and briefly welcomes the football Buckeyes on their way to Ohio Stadium.
- Between 1960 and 1964, the Buckeyes won 50-consecutive games on their home floor.

### Noting Ohio State vs. Ohio teams

- Ohio State improved its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with the 71-52 win over Kent State last Monday in Columbus.
- Chris Holtmann has an 11-5 career record versus teams from Ohio.
- Ohio State is 29-1 vs. Ohio teams since the 1995-96 season. The loss was to Dayton in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. The Buckeyes fell 60-59 (3/20/2014) to the No. 22 Flyers.
- Ohio State is 179-30 in Columbus vs. Ohio teams, 50-41 in road games and 8-8 at neutral sites all-time.

# HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

Carton scored 10 points and dished out five assists.

- Ohio State had three players in double figures: Kyle Young (15), Kaleb Wesson (13) and D.J. Carton (10).

The last time Ohio State had a 20-point lead at half was 43-21 (+22) against South Carolina State (11/18/18). Buckeyes led Stetson 42-14 (+26) at the half.
Andre Wesson had six points in his first game back since being injured (right eye vs. Cincinnati 11/6/19)
Kyle Young recorded a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds, his second of the season and for his career.
Kaleb Wesson put up 13 points, tying his season high.
Ibrahima Diallo scored his first points on his first field goal attempt. Diallo ended the game with six points.
Diallo pulled down a season high five rebounds.
E.J. Liddell's eight points and five rebounds tied his previous season highs from the game against Villanova (11/13/19).
Harrison Hookfin scored his first career points, a two, in the career-high six minutes he played.

No. 10 Ohio State 85,
Purdue Fort Wayne 46
Nov. 22, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Purdue Fort Wayne, 85-46, at Value City Arena. With the win, which was head coach Chris Holtmann's 50th at the helm, the Buckeyes move to 5-0 on the year while the Mastodons drop to 2-5. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 15 points and seven boards while D.J. Carton added 13 and CJ Walker chipped in with 11 points and a game-high four steals as 11 Buckeyes found the scoring column. Marcus DeBerry scored 16 for Purdue Fort Wayne while Brian Patrick added 13. Ohio State scored the first five points of the game and held a 9-7 lead at the 16:36 mark of the first half after a DeBerry 3-pointer for the Mastodons. The Buckeyes followed with a 16-0 run over a 6:46 spurt to take a 25-7 advantage on a Duane Washington Jr. 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. Ohio State extended its lead to as many as 21 twice in the final three minutes of the first half before Purdue Fort Wayne scored the final four points of the half as the Buckeyes held a 42-25 lead at the break. Ohio State connected on 10 of its first 14 attempts from the field in the second half on its way to a 27-7 run and a 69-32 advantage with 9:27 remaining. The 3-point ball, including three in a three-minute spurt from Justin Ahrens, then pushed the Buckeye lead to a game-high 46 at 84-38 with 3:56 left to play as Ohio State came away with the convincing victory.

Notes:

- Three players scored in double-digits for the Buckeyes: Kaleb Wesson (15), D.J. Carton (13) and CJ Walker (11).
Ohio State's bench outscored Purdue Fort Wayne's bench 40-7. This is back-to-back games with 40-plus bench points.
Ohio State held the Mastodons to 17 made field goals, marking the first time since at least 1996 that Ohio State limited five consecutive opponents to 20 or fewer made field goals.
Ohio State shot 10-for-14 (.714) 3FG in the second half.
This was Holtmann's second matchup against Purdue Fort Wayne. His record improves to 2-0.
Luther Muhammad passed 100 career rebounds with four, giving him a total of 103.
C.J. Walker had three 3-pointers, going 3-for-4 (.750) from behind the arc.
Duane Washington Jr. had a season- and career-high five assists, surpassing his four at Maryland (2/23/19).
Kaleb Wesson had a season-high three three-pointers.
Kyle Young had four assists, tying his previous career high vs. Michigan State (3/15/19).
Justin Ahrens was perfect from the floor, shooting 3-3 in three-pointers. His nine points tie his season high.
E.J. Liddell's eight points and five rebounds tied his previous season high from the games against Stetson (11/18/19) and Villanova (11/13/19).

No. 10 Ohio State 71, Kent State 52
Nov. 25, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team used a 17-0 second-half run to pull away from Kent State on its way to a 71-52 victory at St. John Arena. The Buckeyes' Kaleb Wesson totaled 17 points and six rebounds while Duane Washington Jr. went for 16 points, a team-high seven boards and three assists. Danny Pippen scored a game-high 19 points and eight rebounds while Antonio Williams scored 17 for the Golden Flashes. Kent State scored the first five points in a physical first half but the Buckeyes, up 14-13 with 9:37 remaining in the half, took control with a 19-6 run, capped by a D.J. Carton 3-pointer, over the next 7:36, to take a 33-19 lead with just over two minutes left to play. After an Williams jumper for the Golden Flashes and two free throws from Carton, an Anthony Roberts layup with four seconds remaining in the half trimmed the Buckeye lead to 35-23 at the break. A dunk by Wesson and a 3-pointer from Luther Muhammad pushed the Ohio State lead to a game-high 17 at 40-23 with 17:33 left to play but the Golden Flashes responded with a 3-pointer from Pippen and a three-point play from Philip Whittington to make it a 40-29 game with 16:44 remaining. Washington Jr. followed with a layup to push the lead back to 13 but Kent State connected on four of its next six attempts from deep as the Golden Flashes battled back to tie it at 48-41 with 10:30 left to play. However, Muhammad scored the next five points and Carton followed with a highlight-reel layup as the Buckeyes took control with a 17-0 run spanning 6:35 for a 65-58 lead with 3:55 remaining. The Golden Flashes would get no closer than 15 the rest of the way.

Notes:

- Ohio State improves its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with a 71-52 win over Kent State.
Four players scored in double-digits for Ohio State: Kaleb Wesson (17), Duane Washington Jr. (16), Luther Muhammad (13) and D.J. Carton (11).
The Buckeyes improved to 7-0 at St. John Arena since the end of the 1998 season.
Since trailing Cincinnati by seven (26-19) at the half in the season opener, the Buckeyes have led by at least 12 in each of the last five games (35-23 vs. Kent State).
Ohio State's bench has outscored the opponents' bench every game this season. The Buckeye bench put up 21 to Kent State's six.
After being tied at 48-41 10:30 into the second half, Ohio State went on a 17-0 run. The run ended with a Kent State free throw with 3:38 left in the game.
The game marked the first time Chris Holtmann coached against Kent State.
Holtmann improved to 11-5 when facing teams from Ohio.
Kaleb Wesson had a season-high 17 points.
Luther Muhammad surpassed the 300-career points milestone with 13 in the game. His 13 points are also a season high.
He went 7-for-7 from the free throw line.
Duane Washington Jr. reached two career milestones in the contest. With his three rebounds, he reached the 100-career rebound mark. He also surpassed 300 career points.
