STORYLINES

• The No. 4 Maryland men's basketball team, which is off to its best start in 21 years, continues Big Ten Conference play Tuesday at 7:00 pm as it travels for its first true road contest of the season against Penn State.

• The Terps are looking to match the program record for consecutive wins to open a season (11) with the 1996-97 and 1975-76 teams. Maryland's 10-0 start is the second-best in program history, matching the 1998-99 and 1972-73 seasons. The Terps have won their first 10 games by an average margin of 17.1 points.

• Maryland opened Big Ten play with a dramatic 59-58 win over Illinois, coming back from 15 points down in the second half to secure the victory. All-America candidate **Anthony Cowan Jr.** hit a game-tying 3-pointer with 19 seconds remaining, before stealing the ball and knocking down the game-winning free throw with two seconds left.

• Maryland is 14-10 all-time against Penn State in a series that dates back to 1960. The teams met annually from 1960 to 1968. The Terps have won 5-of-8 meetings since joining the Big Ten.

• Sophomore **Jalen Smith** leads the Big Ten and ranks sixth nationally with six doubles-doubles this season. He posted five double-doubles last season as a freshman.

• Recently dubbed the "Mariano Rivera of college basketball" by ESPN analyst Seth Greenberg, All-American candidate **Anthony Cowan Jr.** has scored at least 20 points in four of his last five games. Cowan has scored 61-percent of his points in the second half of games this season.

• The Terps currently lead the Big Ten in turnover ratio (+3.3) and are forcing 14.7 turnovers/g. For comparison's sake, the Terps single-season high in the Turgeon era is 12.8/g in the 2013-14 season.

• Senior **Anthony Cowan Jr.** currently ranks 18th all-time in scoring at Maryland with 1,541 points. The Bowie, Md., native is also 8th all-time in assists (481). Cowan is one of three players in program history with 1,500 points and 450 assists (Greivis Vasquez, John Lucas).

MORE TERRAPIN TIDBITS

- The Terps are second in the Big Ten in both free throws attempted (232) and free throws made (163) this season, while senior **Anthony Cowan Jr.** is second in the conference with 45 free throws made and 59 free throws attempted.

- Maryland is 47-4 in non-conference home games at the XFINITY Center in the past 5+ seasons. The Terps are 36-6 overall at home over the last 2+ seasons.

- The Terps are holding opponents to 36.8% shooting, which ranks second in the Big Ten. The Terps have held their opponents under 40-percent shooting in 8 of 10 games.

- Senior guard **Anthony Cowan Jr.** has 44 assists (4.4/g) against 21 turnovers (2.1/g) through 10 games.. He posted a season-best seven assists in the win against Oakland (11/16).

- Sophomore Jalen Smith leads the Big Ten with six double-doubles (6th nationally), and is third in the conference with 10.1 rebounds/g. He is second in the Big Ten with 3.8 offensive rebounds/g. For his career, 39-percent of his rebounds have come on the offensive end.

ORLANDO INVITATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- The Maryland men's basketball team defeated Temple, Harvard and Marquette en route to claiming the Orlando Invitational title over Thanksgiving weekend.

- Senior **Anthony Cowan Jr.** was named tournament MVP, averaging 24.0 points, 4.3 assists and 2.3 steals. He posted a career-high 30 points against Temple before scoring 20 against Harvard and 22 in the title game against Marquette.

- Junior **Darryl Morsell** was sensational in the tournament, recording his first and second career double-doubles in the semifinals and finals. Morsell was also the primary defender on NCAA leading scorer Markus Howard, holding him to six points on 1 of 12 shooting. Howard had scored 91 points (40, 51) in the two previous games of the tournament.

TERPS IN THE POLLS

- The Terps are making their 105th appearance in the top-5 (15th all-time) and 417th appearance in the top-25 (13th all-time).

- Maryland has the most appearances in the poll all-time without being ranked #1.

- Maryland opened the season ranked top-10 in the preseason polls for the 14th time in its history. Maryland is also one of just two schools in the country (Louisville) with a top-10 men's and women's basketball program.

THE RETURNERS

- Maryland returns nearly its entire lineup from last season's NCAA Round of 32 team, including 7-of-8 rotation players. The lone player from the rotation who moved on was Bruno Fernando, who was drafted 34th overall by the Atlanta Hawks in the 2019 NBA Draft.

- Senior guard **Anthony Cowan Jr.** tested the draft waters before deciding to return for his final season in College Park to "leave his legacy." Among the feedback Cowan received was the importance of adding weight to his frame, so he added 10 pounds in the offseason. Cowan has started all 99 games since stepping foot on campus, and currently ranks t-10th all-time in assists and 23rd all-time in points (see full lists below).

- Sophomore **Jalen "Stix" Smith** has added 30 pounds since stepping foot on campus last year and returns after his Big Ten All-Freshman Team season. He flashed his brilliance in last year's NCAA Tournament when he averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds in two games.

- Junior **Darryl Morsell** was also fantastic down the stretch last year, averaging 12.4 points and 3.2 assists while committing just three turnovers in the team's final five games.

- Sophomores **Aaron Wiggins**, **Eric Ayala**, **Ricky Lindo Jr.** and **Serrel Smith Jr.** are each expected to make leaps as well. Wiggins and Ayala both shot better than 40-percent from 3 last year, while Lindo was a rebound machine. Lindo has added 35 pounds since stepping foot on campus last year.

MILESTONE WATCH

- **Anthony Cowan Jr.** is on the cusp of a number of milestones:

- 5th all-time in free throws made (452). Adrian Branch (1981-85) is 4th with 454.
- 8th all-time in assists (481). Duane Simpkins (1992-96) is 7th with 483.
- 11th all-time in 3-pointers made (169). Drew Nicholas (1999-03) is 10th with 176.
- 11th all-time in minutes played (3640). Eric Hayes (2006-10) is 10th with 3868.
- 18th all-time in points (1541). Greg Manning (1977-81) is 17th with 1561.

- Cowan is just the third player in Maryland history to record 1,500 points and 450 assists, joining Greivis Vasquez and John Lucas.

- Cowan has started all 109 games since stepping foot on campus in 2016. He has the chance to break Keith Booth's consecutive starts record of 126 (1994-97).

A SIZABLE SQUAD

- Maryland has the tallest team in the Big Ten Conference, posting an average height of 6-8. Iowa ranks second (also 6-8 but slightly shorter), while the majority of the conference is an average of 6-7.

- The Terps were bolstered by a tall freshman class that includes **Choi Marial** (7-2), **Makhel & Makhi Mitchell** (6-10), **Donta Scott** (6-7) and **Hakim Hart** (6-6).

THE NEWCOMERS

- Head coach Mark Turgeon added a freshman class of five players in the offseason, including twin forwards **Makhel** and **Makhi Mitchell** from Washington, D.C., a pair of stars from Philadelphia in **Hakim Hart** and **Donta Scott**, and 7-2 center **Choi Marial**.
- The Mitchell twins, who are identical, were two of the top-3 players out of Washington, D.C. They are one of just two sets of twins in the NCAA's general power-5 conferences.
- Scott was the Philadelphia City League Player of the Year and won three Pennsylvania State Championships at Imhotep Charter, while Hart was the Philadelphia Catholic League Player of the Year at Roman Catholic.
- Marial was Maryland's final addition after committing in May. Marial boasts an incredible 7-8 wingspan and can also shoot from the outside. Marial underwent surgery in early September and his return is indefinite.

DEANDRE HAYNES JOINS COACHING STAFF

- Head coach Mark Turgeon announced **DeAndre Haynes** as the team's newest assistant coach after Kevin Broadus left for a head coaching position at Morgan State.
- Haynes joins the Terps after spending the last two seasons as an assistant at Michigan, where we worked with the Wolverine backcourt and developed offensive strategies. Michigan won 63 games during Haynes' tenure, including a trip to the Final Four.
- Haynes was recently named one of the top-25 "Up-and-Coming" coaches by *The Athletic* on Oct. 29, 2019.

- Mark Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 18 of his 21 seasons, including a current streak of 17 consecutive winning seasons. Turgeon has 430 career wins coming into the 2019-20 season, with 180 coming at the helm of the Maryland program.
- Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns and the first three conference games of the 2005-06 season.

Penn State 78, Maryland 61

UNIVERSITY PARK -- Lamar Stevens scored 16 of his 24 points in the second half to lead Penn State to a 78-61 win over No. 17 Maryland Wednesday night. Myles Dread had 17 points and Myreon Jones added 10 for the Nittany Lions (12-16, 5-12 Big Ten). Aaron Wiggins led Maryland (21-8, 12-6) with 15 points, and Eric Ayala chipped in 11.

The Nittany Lions took control in the first half forcing eight turnovers, and turned them into 12 points. The hosts took the lead for good with a 13-2 run that broke a 3-3 tie less than two minutes in.

Dread was 3 for 6 from beyond the arc in the half while Josh Reaves and Myreon Jones added back-to-back 3-pointers over the final 1:36. John Harrar made a layup, drew a foul and hit his free throw to give Penn State a 42-20 lead at halftime.

Junior Anthony Cowan Jr. became just the sixth player in Maryland history to record 1,300 points and 400 assists in a career with a free throw in the second half. He joins an impressive group that includes Greivis Vasquez, John Lucas, Johnny Rhodes, Walt Williams and Melo Trimble.

MARK TURGEON

440-251 (22ND SEASON) / 190-92 (9TH SEASON AT MARYLAND)

Mark Turgeon is fresh off his eighth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team, having led the Terrapins winning seasons in all eight years and four NCAA Tournaments appearances in the last five seasons.

Turgeon has led three different programs to 13 postseason appearances, which includes the Terps advancing to their first Sweet 16 in 13 years in the 2015-2016 season. Turgeon signed a four-year contract extension through the 2022-23 season on Oct. 27, 2016.

In his first eight seasons at Maryland, Turgeon has compiled a 180-92 (.662) record. He recorded the most wins for a head coach in his first five years in program history (114). Turgeon won 79 games during a three-season span from 2014 to 2017, the second-most wins during a three-year period in school history. He is the first coach in Maryland history to lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons. Turgeon also had the Terrapins ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10. Maryland had previously not been ranked in the top-10 since Feb. 3, 2003, a span of 12 seasons.

Under Turgeon, Maryland has also thrived in its first five seasons as members of the Big Ten Conference, earning four top-5 finishes and compiling a 59-33 (.641) conference record. Turgeon's teams boast a 35-9 (.795) home record in conference play, including a perfect 9-0 mark in its inaugural season. He was named the 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Since taking over the program in 2011-12, Turgeon's Terrapins have amassed a 122-25 (.830) home record overall, while recording the most consecutive wins at home in program history (27) from Dec. 6, 2015 - Feb. 13, 2016. Maryland has amassed a 77-13 (.856) mark in home games since joining the Big Ten in 2014-15, tied for the second highest home win percentage in the conference during that stretch.

Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 18 of his 21 seasons, including a current streak of 17 consecutive winning seasons. The Terps won 27 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history during the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

The 2018-19 team flourished despite boasting the fourth-youngest team in the nation and playing the eighth-toughest schedule, advancing to the NCAA Tournament Second Round. The Terps won 13 games in the Big Ten Conference, and featured sophomore Bruno Fernando, who was the only player in the Big Ten to earn All-Big Ten First Team and All-Defense honors. Fernando was also a top-5 finalist for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award for the nation's top center.

In 2016-17 Turgeon led Maryland to a 24-9 record, with an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its aforementioned third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. With a 20-2 record through 22 games in 2016-17, Turgeon topped the 1998-99 squad for the best regular season start in program history. Additionally, Turgeon was instrumental in the development of three-time All-Big Ten guard Melo Trimble, who became one of just four players to post 1,600 points, 400 assists and 150 steals at Maryland. Trimble was also just one of two players (Joe Smith) in school history to record 500 or more points in each of his first two seasons at Maryland.

Under Turgeon's direction the 2015-16 team finished with 27 victories and opened the regular season with a 15-1 record – the best start in program history. Maryland featured five All-Big Ten performers, including guard Melo Trimble (Second Team All-Big Ten) who was also named to the Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America Team. Center Diamond Stone was a Third Team All-Big Ten selection and was

named Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year. Forwards Jake Layman and Robert Carter, Jr., as well as guard Rasheed Sulaimon each earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors.

Maryland posted victories over five teams that advanced to the 2016 NCAA Tournament. In addition, the Terrapins also defeated rival Georgetown in a monumental game played on the College Park campus for the first time in four decades.

Maryland, ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press and No. 12 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, finished 27-9, marking the first time in program history the Terps have put together back-to-back 27-plus win seasons.

The Terrapins also led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in attendance in 2015-16, averaging 17,863 fans per game.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and notched 28 total, an eight-game improvement from its 17 victories during the 2013-14 season. The 11-game win total was the second-highest improvement among all Power Five schools. Maryland also advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Terps finished their inaugural season in the Big Ten with an aforementioned 9-0 home record, which included victories against then-No. 5 Wisconsin, Michigan State and Indiana. Overall, Maryland concluded with an 18-1 home mark at XFINITY Center.

Maryland's 14-1 record in 2014-15 marked its best start in 18 years (1996-97). Turgeon posted 25 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his career.

Since arriving in College Park, Turgeon has signed seven consecutive nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including a top-10 class in 2016.

Under Turgeon, the men's basketball team posted its highest single year APR score of a perfect 1,000 in 2012-13 and has also graduated all 13 of his student-athletes who have exhausted their eligibility at Maryland.

In 2013, he captured his 300th career victory with an 85-74 defeat of Tulsa on Dec. 29, before leading the Terps to a thrilling overtime win against No. 5 Virginia in Maryland's final ACC regular season game.

Turgeon's winning percentage of .600 (42-28) was the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons, ahead of Bud Millikan (.592) and Gary Williams (.574). After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, he led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon directed Maryland to three wins over a ranked team in 2012-13 after Maryland had gone two seasons without one. The Terps were the only team in the nation to beat Duke twice, while also knocking off then-14th ranked NC State at home in January. Maryland's win over Duke at home on Feb. 16 was its first over a No. 1 ranked opponent in five years.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

Turgeon has coached and developed nine future NBA players: Gal Mekel, Donald Sloan, Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Brooklyn Nets), Alex Len (Atlanta Hawks), Jake Layman (Minnesota Timberwolves), Diamond Stone, Kevin Huerter (Atlanta Hawks) and Bruno Fernando (Atlanta Hawks). Len was selected in the first round (fifth overall) by the Suns in the 2013 NBA Draft and Huerter was selected 19th overall in the first round by the Atlanta Hawks in 2018. In addition, multiple former players are playing in the NBA's G-League and overseas.

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers

advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

As a student-athlete, he was selected to the Big Eight All-Academic Team in 1986 and was a Big Eight All-Freshman pick in 1984. He earned a bachelor of science degree in personnel administration from Kansas in 1987.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

In the summer of 2008, Turgeon was inducted into the Topeka Sports Hall of Fame. He was also honored as the 2015 Kansan of the Year in June, 2015.

Additionally, Turgeon was selected as a court coach for the USA Basketball Pan-American Team in preparation for the Pan-Am Games in the summer of 2015. The following year, Turgeon served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Under-18 Team, working with head coach Shaka Smart and assistant coach Kevin Ollie, in helping guide the squad to a gold medal. On June 13, 2016, he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Ad Hoc committee on NCAA men's basketball tournament selection, seeding and bracketing.

Turgeon is active in the College Park community and has hosted the Coaches vs. Cancer Season Tip-Off Breakfast in conjunction with the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches for five years. Over the past four seasons, Turgeon worked with the Infinity Coaches Charity Challenge to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association. In addition, Turgeon and his team worked with the Special Olympics of Maryland and hosted a basketball clinic for athletes in the organization along with inviting them to home games the past three seasons. Turgeon also participated in the Special Olympics Relay Across America carrying the Flame for Hope through the College Park campus in 2016.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill. and they have two sons - William (Will) and Leo - and a daughter, Ella. Will currently plays basketball at nearby Catholic University.

MATT BRADY
ASSISTANT COACH
3RD YEAR AT MARYLAND
SIENA '87

Head coach Mark Turgeon announced the addition of Matt Brady as the director of player personnel for the Maryland men's basketball program on July 10, 2017. Brady was elevated to the role of assistant coach in June of 2018 prior to his second season on staff for the Terrapins.

Brady, who has nearly 30 years of experience as a coach at the Division I level, including 12 as a head coach, came to Maryland after serving as an assistant coach at La Salle the past season. Brady reunited with Maryland assistant coach Bino Ranson, who was an assistant under Brady while at Marist.

In Brady's first season as an assistant (2018-19), he helped lead the Terps to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament and a 23-11 overall record despite being the fourth-youngest team in the country according to KenPom.

Prior to La Salle, Brady was the head coach at James Madison for eight seasons, racking up 139 wins, including four seasons with 20 or more victories. In 2013, he led the Dukes to a CAA Championship and an NCAA Tournament bid. He also guided the Dukes to three additional postseason appearances and the 2015 CAA regular season title.

Brady was recognized as State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors in 2013 following his NCAA Tournament campaign and was also tabbed District 10 Co-Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Brady inherited a JMU program that finished last in the conference in scoring, field goal and three-point percentage in 2007. The following season, Brady had the Dukes atop the conference in all three statistical categories. While at JMU, Brady coached 10 all-CAA players and four all-district honorees. Brady mentored three of the top 10 scorers in program history as well as three of the top 10 three-point shooters.

Prior to leading the program at James Madison, Brady was the head coach at Marist for four seasons from 2004-08 where compiled a 73-50 record with the Red Foxes and improved their win total during each of his first three seasons with the team. Marist set a program record for wins during its 25-9 season in 2006-07 when Brady was the MAAC and New York City-area coach of the year. Marist had dramatic statistical improvements under his direction, ranking in the top three in the 10-team MAAC in overall field goal percentage, three-point percentage and three-pointers per game during each of his four seasons. While at Marist, Brady mentored MAAC Player of the Year Jared Jordan, who was a two-time NCAA Division I assists champion and the 45th overall choice in the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Clippers.

A 1987 Siena graduate and a native of Haddon Heights, N.J., Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons at Rhode Island (1987-89), Wagner (1989-93) and Saint Joseph's (1993-04).

While Brady was at Saint Joseph's, the Hawks appeared in the NCAA Tournament four times, the NIT three times and won four Big 5 championships and three Atlantic 10 titles.

Saint Joseph's was 27-0 during the regular season in 2003-04, earned a No. 1 national ranking and a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament, ultimately reaching the Elite Eight. Brady was involved in recruiting several of the top players in Saint Joseph's history, including 2004 National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West, an honorable mention Associated Press All-America selection. Nelson, who was selected in the first round of the 2004 NBA Draft and has gone on to play 12 seasons in the NBA, continues to be mentored and trained by Brady during his offseason.

As a player at Siena, Brady appeared in 114 career games, including 92 as a starter. He completed his career as the program's all-time assists leader (593), and he was inducted into the school's hall of fame in 1993. For his career he accumulated 1,106 points (9.7 points per game) and was a 45.9 percent shooter from the field.

Brady was a standout at Paul VI High School in Haddon (N.J.) Township and was named to the 1980s South Jersey All-Decade Team. He was enshrined in the Camden County Sports Hall of Fame in 2012. Brady and his wife Mary have three sons, Logan - who is a student at Maryland - and twins Cole and Griffin.

Widely regarded as one of the fastest rising coaches in the country, DeAndre Haynes was officially announced as assistant coach by Maryland head coach Mark Turgeon on June 10, 2019.

Haynes was named one of the top-25 "Up-and-Coming" coaches by *The Athletic* on Oct. 29, 2019.

Haynes most recently spent two seasons as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan men's basketball program, where he was instrumental in working with the Wolverine backcourt and offensive strategies.

"Throughout the hiring process I was very deliberate about finding the right fit for our coaching staff and we hit a home run with DeAndre," Turgeon said. "DeAndre is one of the brightest up and coming coaches in the business and has gained experience working for some of the most well-respected coaches in the country. He was an exceptional point guard during his playing days and he possesses a contagious personality that will fit well with our staff and players. We are excited to welcome DeAndre and his family to College Park."

The Wolverines set a program record with 33 wins in 2017-18 en route to winning the Big Ten Tournament and advancing to the Final Four. The following season, U-M recorded its second straight 30 win season to give them 63 wins in two seasons.

Haynes assisted in the development of Xavier Simpson, who was named to the All-Big Ten and All-Big Ten Defensive teams, and All-Big Ten guard Jordan Poole in 2018-19.

Prior to Michigan, Haynes served as an assistant coach at Toledo on head coach Tod Kowalczyk's staff during the 2016-17 season following four years as an assistant at his alma mater - Kent State - on head coach Rob Senderoff's staff (2012-16).

While at Toledo, Haynes helped the Rockets to 17 wins and a postseason appearance in the 2017 College Basketball Invitational (CBI). With Haynes as an assistant, forward Steve Taylor Jr. earned All-MAC second team honors after leading the nation with 9.9 defensive rebounds per game and ranking third nationally with 12.2 rebounds per contest. Additionally, guard Jonathan Williams received All-MAC third team accolades after ranking third in MAC scoring with 19.6 points per game.

Haynes began his coaching career in 2012 as an assistant at Kent State where he helped the Golden Flashes to the 2014-15 MAC regular-season title and a pair of CollegeInsider.com Tournament appearances, in 2013 and 2015. He was instrumental in the development of guards Kris Brewer, who earned MAC Sixth Man of the Year (2015) and All-MAC honorable mention (2014, '15) accolades, as well as guard Devareaux Manley, who earned All-MAC second team honors in 2015. Additionally, he helped coach forward Jimmy Hall to two All-MAC first team honors (2015, '16) as well as forward Chris Evans to first team honors in 2013.

Before becoming a coach, Haynes played professionally for six years in FIBA Europe with stops in Belgium, Hungary, Germany and Finland. In his final professional season, Haynes averaged 14.2 points, 4.8 assists and 4.8 rebounds per game for Finland's Namika Lappeenranta.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, and a Southwestern High School graduate, Haynes was a four-year starter at point guard for Kent State (2002-06), totaling 89 wins and four postseason appearances. Haynes ranks 12th in program history with 1,259 career points, while his 114 career starts rank second all-time. He also led the MAC in assists in the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns with 5.5 and 5.8 assists per game, respectively.

Haynes is KSU's program leader in career assists (625), steals (229) and minutes (4,070). During his senior season in 2006, Haynes became the first Golden Flash to earn MAC Player of the Year honors. An Associated Press All-America honorable mention selection that year as well, Haynes led Kent State to the 2006 MAC regular season and tournament titles and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Haynes and his wife Tierra have three sons, DeAndre Jr., Devon and Dallas.

Orlando "Bino" Ranson was hired as an assistant coach at Maryland in the summer of 2010 and is now entering his 10th season in College Park, including the ninth on the staff of head coach Mark Turgeon. During his time with Turgeon, Ranson and the Terps have collected 180 wins.

Ranson played a major part in helping lead the Terps to four NCAA Tournament appearances, including four in the last five seasons, and a berth in the Sweet Sixteen during the 2015-16 season. It marked the Terps' longest run in the NCAA Tournament since 2003. In the 2015-16 season, Maryland started 15-1 – the best start in program history and finished the campaign with a 27-9 overall record No. 12 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Terps won 79 games between the 2014-15 through 2016-17 seasons, adding up to the second-most wins in school history over a three-year span. Ranson has helped lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons, while the Terrapins were also ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10.

In their inaugural season in the Big Ten (2014-15), Ranson and the Terrapins posted a school record 26 regular season wins en route to advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Ranson played a major role in helping Maryland sign five consecutive top-25 recruiting classes in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. Ranson was critical in helping Maryland secure a top-10 recruiting class in 2018, leading the recruiting efforts to sign five-star McDonald's All-American Jalen Smith out of Mount Saint Joseph's High School in Baltimore. In addition, Ranson directed the recruiting efforts for Darryl Morsell from the class of 2017, a four-star recruit out of Mount Saint Joseph's.

Ranson has helped develop seven future NBA Draft selections while at Maryland: Alex Len, Jordan Williams, Jake Layman, Diamond Stone, Kevin Huerter, Justin Jackson and Bruno Fernando.

In 2016, Ranson led the recruiting efforts for consensus four-star forward Justin Jackson, who was selected in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft before signing with the Orlando Magic. Jackson played high school basketball at national power Findlay Prep as a junior before finishing his high school career at Hill Academy in Ontario, where he was named a First Team All-Star in the Ontario Scholastics Basketball Association. He was also a member of the Canadian U-19 national team that participated at the 2015 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

Ranson has strong ties to the Baltimore-Washington area, having coached for two seasons at St. Frances Academy in Baltimore.

He came to Maryland after one season as an assistant at Xavier, during which the Musketeers went 26-9 and reached the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. In his lone season on the staff of Maryland head coach Gary Williams in 2010-11, the Terrapins went 19-14. Ranson has had a winning season in each of his 11 seasons as an assistant coach.

He spent two years as an administrative assistant at Loyola University on the staff of long-time Maryland assistant and former Siena head coach Jimmy Patsos.

Prior to Xavier, Ranson was an assistant coach at James Madison for one season, helping the Dukes to a 21-15 mark, the most wins by JMU in a season since 1992-93. The Dukes advanced in the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for the first time since 2003 and their berth in the College Insiders.com Tournament marked their first postseason appearance since 1994.

Ranson also worked for Matt Brady at Marist University for three seasons. The Red Foxes were 62-33 in those three seasons and won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season in 2007. That season, Marist won at Oklahoma State in the Postseason NIT. Ranson coached under current Maryland assistant Matt Brady during his stops at Marist and JMU.

Considered an outstanding recruiter, he helped bring in excellent classes at James Madison, Marist and Xavier. Ranson helped land Jay Gavin at Marist, who went on to become the MAAC Rookie of the Year.

Ranson coached at St. Frances Academy for two seasons before joining the Loyola staff. He handled St. Frances' junior-varsity program, directing the 2003-04 team to a 24-5 record, titles in the MIAA and the Baltimore Catholic League. He also founded Team Baltimore, one of the top AAU programs in the Northeast.

Among the players Ranson worked with at the AAU level are Sean Mosley and Juan Dixon of Maryland, Ricky Harris of Massachusetts, Jermaine Dixon of Pittsburgh and Donte Greene of Syracuse.

A 1999 graduate of Southern New Hampshire with a B.S. in sports management, Ranson completed his collegiate career as one of the top players in the history of the school. He ranked seventh in career scoring (1,899 points), fifth in assists (598) and fourth in 3-point field goals (226) after lettering for four seasons. He was inducted into the school's hall of fame in January 2007.

Ranson and his wife, Shannon, have two sons; BJ and Bradshaw.

Mark Bialkoski is entering his second season as director of operations after being elevated to the role in June of 2018. He previously served three seasons as the program's video coordinator.

"Mark is very deserving of this promotion, as he's been a great addition to our staff and program over the past three years," said head coach Mark Turgeon. "He's a tireless worker who is very committed to our team, and will continue to play a major role in our day-to-day activities. Mark has a promising future ahead of him in this business, and we're excited to reward him for his dedication and commitment to Maryland basketball."

In four seasons with the program, the Terrapins have advanced to three NCAA Tournaments and finished in the top-5 in the Big Ten three times. In his first season at Maryland in 2015-16, the Terps won 27 games, finished No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2003.

Bialkoski spent three seasons as the Charlotte 49ers director of basketball operations. Prior to serving as the director of operations, he spent three years (2009-12) as a program assistant and a graduate manager with the 49ers men's basketball program.

In his three seasons on the staff, the 49ers captured the Great Alaska Shootout and Puerto Rico Tip-Off titles and reached the Charleston Classic championship game. The 49ers defeated No. 10 Butler on the road as well in 2013. The 49ers won 52 games, including a 21 wins season in 2013 which marked the program's first 20 wins season since 2007-08. With another winning season in 2014, the 49ers posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2007. Charlotte made its first postseason tournament appearance since 2008 with an NIT appearance in 2013.

During the 2012-13 season, Bialkoski played a major role in helping set up the first annual Military Appreciation game (the Georgia Southern game) where the 49ers were able to raise over \$600 for military personnel.

As Director of Operations, Bialkoski helped with team travel, budgeting, scheduling and academic support as well as helping run the Alan Major Basketball Camps. In the fall of 2013, the Niners men's basketball team achieved its highest semester grade point average in program history.

While as a program assistant and graduate manager at Charlotte, Bialkoski did advance opponents scouting, assisted in scheduling, and managed all video related tasks for the coaching staff in addition to designing and developing the first Charlotte 49ers Men's Basketball Newsletter. Bialkoski facilitated all pre- and post-game practice set-up, created recruiting mail-outs and was a key resource to all basketball operational functions.

The Jacksonville, Florida native earned a Bachelor's of Science with a major in Exercise Science from Georgia Southern in 2008. While at Georgia Southern, Bialkoski served as head manager for the men's basketball program under Head Coach Jeff Price. During his time at Georgia Southern, the Eagles captured the 2006 Southern Conference Championship. He also served as assistant director of the Jeff Price Basketball Camp.

Bialkoski and his wife, La Shae Marie, have a daughter Baylee Josephine and a son Finley.
