#### **OUICK HITS**

- The second-ranked Maryland women's lacrosse team will play its first Big Ten road game of the season, traveling to No. 23 Penn State on Thursday evening.
- · Maryland has started the season 8-0, coming off a Big Ten opening 16-1 win over Ohio State this past weekend, led by six points (five goals, one assist) from junior Kali Hartshorn and a shutout first half from senior Megan Taylor (eight saves, zero goals allowed) and the Maryland defense. On the season, the Terps have four wins over top-10 teams, with the two most impressive coming in overtime fashion vs. No. 3 North Carolina and No. 4 Syracuse.
- Head Coach Cathy Reese picked up her 250th win at Maryland in the Terps second game of the season at No. 6 Florida. Now standing with a 256-21 record in her 13 years at Maryland, Reese is only four wins away from tying her college coach, Cindy Timchal, as the all-time winngest coach at Maryland.
- Maryland has never lost a Big Ten regular season game since joining the conference, now standing at 23-0 all-time. Maryland is 6-0 against Penn State since joining the conference, including a win in last year's Big Ten Tournament Championship game.
- The Terps are led by the midfield corps of senior Jen Giles and transfer Erica Evans. Giles leads the Terps with 22 goals, 10 assists, 32 points, 17 groundballs and five caused turnovers. Evans, a transfer from Canisius, is second on the team with 23 points and eightt assists.
- Maryland is once again backlined by junior goalie Megan Taylor, who has had an incredible start to 2019, leading the country with a .583 save perentage at 77 saves to 55 goals allowed. Taylor was named the B1G Defensive Player of the Week in each of the past two weeks and this week named the IWLCA National Player of the Week.
- The attack is spearheaded by junior Kali Hartshorn and senior Caroline Steele. Hartshorn and Steele are second and third in the team in goals with 20 and 18 respectively, while Hartshorn leads the team with 40 draw controls and Steele had five goals in this past week's win over No. 8 Penn.
- Senior Julia Braig and junior Lizzie Colson guide the Maryland defense. Colson is second on Maryland with 33 draw controls and the duo has combined for 19 groundballs and seven caused turnovers.

#### #2 TERPS HEAD TO #23 PENN STATE

The second-ranked Maryland women's lacrosse team will play its first Big Ten road game of the season, traveling to No. 23 Penn State on Thursday evening. The game will have an opening draw of 5:00 p.m. and air on ESPNU with Jay Alter and Sheehan Stanwick Burch on the call. Maryland is 41-14-1 all-time against Penn State with the last meeting coming in last years Big Ten Tournament Championship, which Maryland won 21-12.

#### DOMINANT DEFENSIVE EFFORT LEADS NO. 2 TERPS PAST OHIO STATE

A dominant defensive effort that held Ohio State to just one goal on 19 shots and forced 10 turnovers led the No. 2 Maryland women's lacrosse team (8-0, 1-0 B1G) to a Big Ten opening 16-1 rout of Ohio State on Saturday afternoon.

The one goal by the Buckeyes is the least ever scored on Maryland by a Big Ten opponent and the second time this season that the Terps have held an opponent to just one goal after defeating UMBC 18-1 a few weeks back. It is the first time since 1996 that Maryland has held two opponents in one season to just one goal.

#### NATION BEST SIX TERPS NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

Six members of the No. 2 Maryland women's lacrosse team, the most in the country, were named to the initial Tewaaraton Watch List, as announced by the Tewaaraton Foundation Thursday evening. Graduate midfielder **Erica Evans**, four seniors: **Julia Braig**, **Jen Giles**, **Caroline Steele** and **Megan Taylor** and junior defender **Lizzie Colson** were all selected for the watch list.

The Terps have the most players in the country named to the watch list. Each Terp named to the list was selected as a preseason All-American by Inside Lacrosse, while **Braig**, **Giles and Taylor** were named Maryland's Big Ten Players to Watch.

**Taylor** has now been selected for the Tewaaraton Watch List in three straight seasons. It's the second appearance for **Braig**, **Evans**, **Giles and Steele**, while **Colson** makes an appearance on the watch list for the first time. Last season, both Braig and Taylor were named one of 25 Tewaaraton nominees.

#### MARYLAND RAISES MONEY FOR JDRF

Last weeks Ohio State game was Maryland's fifth-annual JDRF game, raising money for juvenile diabetes. Head coach Cathy Reese's son, Riley, has Type 1 Diabetes, and the Terps have been raising money for the cause ever since. Thus far this year, Maryland has raised \$9,500 to make Type 1, Type None. Over Maryland's five year fight, the Terps have raised over \$60,000 for the cause. Maryland wore blue warmups and socks in the game against Ohio State.

#### REESE INDUCTED INTO MARYLAND ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Head Coach **Cathy Reese** was part of the nine member 2018 Maryland Athletics Hall of Fame Class and was formally inducted on November 2nd. **Reese** is an 11-Time National Champion (four as a player, four as head coach, three as assistant coach), Three-Time National Coach of the Year (2010, 2014-15) has coached seven Tewaaraton Award winners, 16 Tewaaraton finalists and 57 All-Americans and is Two-Time All-American & First Team All-ACC (1997, 1998) as a player.

#### **TOURNEY TERPS**

The Terps lead the nation with 34 NCAA appearances and are also tops in wins (70), championship game appearances (20) and NCAA titles (13). Maryland made its 29th consecutive appearance in the postseason (1990-2018) last season. The Terrapins have made 10 straight Final Fours (2009-18) and captured four titles in that time (2010, 14, 15, 17).

#### **TERPS SELECT 2019 TEAM CAPTAINS**

Maryland has selected seniors **Julia Braig**, **Jen Giles** and **Megan Taylor** as team captains for the upcoming season. This is the second straight year **Braig** and **Giles** will serve as the team's captains and the first time for **Taylor**. **Braig** is the reigning B1G Defender of the Year and a First Team All-American. **Giles** was also a First Team All-American last season and recently played with Team USA at the Spring Premiere **Taylor** has backlined for the Terps since the day she stepped foot and is the three-time reigning B1G Goaltender of the year. She was the 2017 IWLCA National Goaltender of the Year.

#### TERPS PICKED TO WIN BIG TEN

Maryland who last year won both the Big Ten Regular Season and Tournament Titles, was unanimously selected to win the Big Ten Championship in the preseason coaches' poll, as announced by the conference.

The Terps have won the last four Big Ten regular season titles and have not lost a regular season game in conference play since joining the conference for the 2015 season. Maryland has also won the previous three Big Ten Tournament titles, last year defeating Penn State in the Championship.

#### BRAIG, GILES, TAYLOR NAMED BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

The Big Ten has selected seniors **Julia Braig**, **Jen Giles and Megan Taylor** as Mayrland's three players to watch, as announced by the conference.

**Braig** returns as the defensive leader for the Terps. A 2018 IWLCA First Team All-American, the then-junior was also named the Big Ten Defender of the Year, an All-Big Ten honoree, an All-Big Ten Tournament team member and a IWLCA All-South Region First Team member, as well as being one of the 25 finalists for the Tewaaraton Award.

Also a 2018 IWLCA First Team All-American, **Giles** made an impact all over the field in her junior season, as she led the team in assists (31), was second in points (83) and groundballs (38), while ranking third in goals (52). The Ellicott City, Md. native was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team for the second year in a row as well as the All-Big Ten team. This January, **Giles** played with the US National Team at the Spring Premiere in California.

**Taylor**, the 2017 IWLCA National Goaltender of the Year, last year had a third straight strong season, posting 189 saves on a .477 percentage while leading the conference with a 9.94 goals against average. One of the premier goaltenders in the nation, **Taylor** was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team and a Tewaaraton top-25 finalist as well as being the Big Ten Goaltender of the Year. **Taylor** is a two-time IWLCA All-American.

#### **FAMILY TIES**

The Terps roster features a number of relatives to current and former Terps. Senior Caroline Steele's mother, Gretchen, and cousin, Kristen Lamon, are both former Terps. Seniors Shelby Mercer and Kelsey Cummings' older sisters, Alice and Taylor, were seniors on Maryland's roster last season. Juniors Brindi Griffin and Julia Salandra's sisters, Brooke and Taylor, played lacrosse at Maryland and graduated in 2015. Freshman Hannah Glaros' sister, Beth played lacrosse at Maryland and was on the 2014 National Championship team. Assistant coach Caitlyn Phipps and director of operations Maggie Phipps are married to brothers Brian and Michael Phipps, who both played lacrosse at Maryland, while head coach Cathy Reese's husband, Brian, also played lax at Maryland.

# **CATHY REESE**

### 13th Season at Maryland/16th Overall Maryland '98

One of the most decorated coaches at the collegiate level, former Maryland standout and three-time IWLCA National Coach of the Year Cathy Reese has had unprecedented success, leading the Terps to four National Championships, 10 Final Fours and 19 Conference Championships in 12 years as head coach.

As a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach for the Terrapins, Reese has earned 11 NCAA Championships.

Reese led Maryland to their 10th straight final four in the 2018 season, posting a 20-2 record. The Terps won their fourth consecutive Big Ten regular season tournament title and third consecutive Big Ten tournament title. Going undefeated in College Park for the fifth straight season, Reese and the Terps defeated 15 top-25 opponents. Six Terps earned IWLCA All-American honors, the most for the program since 2014, while Reese was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year for the third straight season.

The Terps competed perfection in 2017 as the team went 23-0 and won the program's 14th national title. Maryland won both the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles. Five Terps were honored as All-Americans while Maryland featured the IWLCA National Midfielder, Defender and Goalie of the Year in Zoe Stukenberg, Nadine Hadnagy and Megan Taylor. Zoe Stukenberg went on to win the Tewaaraton Award, Maryland's sixth-straight honoree.

Maryland had a near-perfect season in 2016 as the Terps posted a 22-1 record with the only blemish coming in the national championships game. Maryland won the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles. Five Terps earned All-American honors while six players were named All-Big Ten. Taylor Cummings finished her playing career as the most decorated player in lacrosse, three-peating as the Tewaaraton and Honda Award winner and as the IWLCA National Midfielder of the Year. Alice Mercer garnered IWLCA National Defender of the Year honors.

The Terps garned their second-straight NCAA Championship in 2015 under Reese. Maryland posted a 21-1 overall record and earned the first-ever Big Ten Regular Season Championship with a 5-0 conference record. Reese was named the IWLCA National Coach of the Year for the third time while Taylor Cummings and Megan Douty repeated as the IWLCA National Midfielder and Defender of the Year, respectively. Five Terps were named IWLCA All-Americans while eight players earned All-Big Ten honors. Cummings repeated as the Tewaaraton Award and Honda Award winner while posting her best season to date under Reese.

Reese led the Terps to their second NCAA title in five years in 2014. Maryland garnered a 23-1 record on their way to a sixth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference title in the team's last season in the conference. Reese was named ACC Coach of the Year for a league-high seventh time. The Terps boasted six IWLCAAII-American, including IWLCA National Midfielder of the Year Taylor Cummings and IWLCA National Defender of the Year Megan Douty. Cummings went on to become the first sophomore to earn the women's Tewaaraton Award. Reese capped the season with IWLCA Regional and National Coach of the Year honors.

The Terps were near perfect in 2013, going 22-1 with its lone loss coming in heartbreaking fashion in overtime against North Carolina in the national title game. Maryland won its unprecedented fifth straight ACC title and senior Katie Schwarzmann won the Tewaaraton Award for the second straight year. The Terps boasted the IWLCA Midfielder and Attacker of the Year in Schwarzmann and Alex Aust. Taylor Cummings was named ACC Rookie of the Year.

Maryland captured its conference-record fourth consecutive ACC title in 2012 and landed in the final four for the fourth straight season. Reese mentored her second Tewaaraton winner - Katie Schwarzmann - and landed four student-athletes on the IWLCA All-America list.

Reese's Terps won their third-straight conference championship in 2011 while landing in the final four of the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship for the third consecutive season. Maryland concluded the season with a 21-2 record, falling short in the title game to Northwestern. The Terps put together another stellar season, boasting two Tewaaraton finalists, an ACC Player of the Year and four IWLCA First Team All-Americans.

With the Terps falling just once in regular season play, Maryland wrapped up the 2010 campaign on a 10-game winning streak, which concluded in elation with a gallant comeback against five-time defending national champion Northwestern in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship. Reese coached Maryland's first Tewaaraton Award winner since Jen Adams as Caitlyn McFadden was tabbed the top player in all of women's lacrosse. Four other Terpains landed All-America status as well and Reese garnered IWLCA National Coach of the Year honors along with being named the top coach in the conference for the second straight season.

Reese had Maryland on the verge of perfection in 2009, leading the Terps to a 21-1 record, an NCAA Final Four trip and ACC Tournament and Regular Season championships. She boasted three Tewaaraton nominees, five All-Americans, five All-ACC honorees, the ACC Player and Rookie of the Year and the IWLCA Midfielder of the Year.

Reese returned to her alma mater in 2007 as the head coach and guided the Terps to a 16-4 record, including a first-place finish in the Atlantic Coast Conference at 4-1, earning the conference's Coach of the Year award. Reese continued to move Maryland in a positive direction in 2008, steering the Terps to an 18-3 record and an Atlantic Coast Conference regular season title. Once again, Reese boasted some of the top talent in the nation as senior Dana Dobbie was tabbed ACC Player of the Year in addition to being named a finalist for the Tewaarton Trophy, given annually to the nation's best player.

Reese returned to Maryland after spending her first three seasons as head coach at the University of Denver where she guided the Pioneers to their most successful season in school history in 2006 with a 16-5 record.

Prior to lifting the Denver program to national attention, Reese spent nine seasons in College Park, four as a student-athlete and five as an assistant coach. During that span, the women's lacrosse program had one of the most successful streaks seen in collegiate women's sports history. The Terps won seven national championships in her first nine years on campus.
