## **INSIDE** THE GAME

## PENN STATE HOSTS PURDUE IN 100TH HOMECOMING GAME

- **OPENING KICK:** The No. 12/11 Nittany Lions welcome home Penn State alumni for the 100th Homecoming game Saturday against Purdue. Kickoff is set for noon on ESPN.
- BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Penn State QB Sean Clifford was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week. Against Maryland, Clifford set personal bests with 26 completions on 31 attempts for 398 yards, including a Penn State-record 287 yards in the first half, and 452 yards of total offense. Three of his throws went for touchdowns and he earned his first career rushing touchdown on the Lions' first play from scrimmage.
- **BOILERS RETURN:** Purdue is making its first visit to Beaver Stadium since 2013. The teams last met in 2016 when Penn State rolled to a 62-24 victory.
- BIG PASSING ATTACKS: Purdue (351.0 ypg) and Penn State (316.0 ypg) rank first and second, respectively, in the Big Ten in passing yardage. Purdue's Elijah Sindelar (326.0 ypg) and Penn State's Sean Clifford (294.8 ypg) also rank Nos. 1 and 2 in the conference, but Sindelar is out with an injury this week. Freshman Jack Plummer went 23-of-41 for 245 yards and a touchdown after entering in the second quarter last week against Minnesota in relief of Sindelar.
- BEHIND ENEMY LINES: Looking to post its fifth consecutive 40-plus sack season, Penn State is averaging 3.75 sacks per game, led by defensive end Yetur Gross-Matos, who has 3.5 this season to rank in a tie for third in the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions are also averaging 9.8 tackles for loss per game to rank third in FBS. Gross-Matos also leads Penn State in that category and ranks seventh in the Big Ten with 1.4 per game.
- THE OPPOSITION: Purdue is 1-3 this season, defeating Vanderbilt in Week 2 and most
  recently coming up short in its Big Ten opener against Minnesota. The Boilermakers lead
  the Big Ten in passing offense, but rank last in rushing offense (68.3 ypg) for a seventhplace total offense ranking (419.3 ypg). The Boilers returned first-team All-American and
  reigning Big Ten Freshman and Wide Receiver of the Year Rondale Moore, who leads the
  Big Ten with 7.3 receptions per game and ranks third with 96.3 receiving yards per game,
  but he will miss this week's game with an injury.

## SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Penn State and Wisconsin are the only Big Ten teams to have posted a winning season the last 14 consecutive years. Penn State is one of five teams (Penn State, Boise State, LSU, Oklahoma, Wisconsin) in FBS to have a winning record each of the last 14 years. Penn State holds the FBS record for most consecutive seasons without a losing record at 49 (1939-87).

## **ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

A total of 452 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 28 in 2018, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

## ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 293-74 (.798) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572.

## **HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN**

## **CAREER AT A GLANCE**

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is in his ninth year as a collegiate head coach, leading his first eight squads to bowl games.
- Franklin is one of seven current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first eight seasons as a head coach.
- · Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Mark Dantonio, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- · He owns a 73-36 career record, with six consecutive winning seasons.
- Franklin has led his teams to two Top 10 finishes (2 at Penn State) and five Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 3 at Penn State).
- Under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams (Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Washington) to rank in the Top 15 of the CFP final rankings in each of the last three seasons.
- Franklin led the Nittany Lions to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- · Franklin has 24 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first eight years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 68 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last seven seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.

## NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins in 2018 with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. Penn State has finished in the AP Top 25 in the last three consecutive seasons for the first time since a seven-year stint from 1993-99.
- Penn State continued to be among the nation's elite in 2017, climbing as high as No. 2 in the rankings and appearing
  in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl.
  The Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008
  and 2009 with an 11-2 record. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
  and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- · Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. His inaugural season began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Quarterback Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist
  for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF
  Scholar-Athlete
- Two Nittany Lions have garnered Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition. Punter Blake Gillikin earned first-team honors in 2018 and long snapper Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015. Penn State has 66 Academic All-America honorees all-time, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- · The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- The 2015 fall semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 56 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA)
- During Franklin's first fall semester on campus, the football student-athletes set program records with 25 student-athletes earning Dean's List recognition (3.5 GPA) and 57 players owning a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher after the 2014 fall semester. The spring of 2015 saw continued success in the classroom with 51 student-athletes compiling at least a 3.0 GPA, marking the first time in program history with 50 or more 3.0s in a spring semester.

## **NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY**

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- Two Nittany Lions have been named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works team during Franklin's tenure linebackers Ben Kline (2015) and Brandon Smith (2017). Kline and Smith were recognized for their selflessness and community service, and both were one of 11 FBS honorees in their respective years.

## **RECRUITING SUCCESS**

- Franklin's recruiting classes in the last four years have been ranked an average of 13.1 nationally, which is a significant jump from the 40.8 average from 2012-14.
- Penn State is one of nine programs to sign a top-15 class in each of the last three years and one of 12 schools to claim a top-20 class each of the last five seasons.
- Seven of the 15 highest-ranked 247Sports Composite recruits at Penn State since 2000 have been signed by Franklin.
- The 3.83 average star ranking for the 2019 class was the highest in program history since the inception of the 247Sports Composite in 2000.
- The 2018 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 among by ESPN.com, the highest finish in program history. The class was also ranked No. 5 by Rivals and No. 6 by 247Sports.

## **HELPING THE COMMODORES GET THEIR WINGS**

- Franklin directed Vanderbilt to consecutive Top 25 finishes for the first time in the 124year history of the program (No. 23/24 - 2013 & No. 23/20 - 2012).
- · The Commodores finished 23rd in the final 2012 Associated Press poll, marking their first AP final ranking since 1948.
- · Franklin led Vanderbilt to a bowl game in each of his three seasons in Nashville, with the last two years resulting in wins over NC State (Music City Bowl) and Houston (BBVA Compass Bowl). The Commodores had played in four bowl games all-time in the 121 seasons prior to his arrival, none in consecutive years.
- · Vanderbilt had posted four nine-win seasons in program history, with Franklin's last two teams comprising half of the total
- Franklin guided the Commodores to a 6-6 regular-season record and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl during his first season after inheriting a Vanderbilt team that finished 2-10 in both 2009 and 2010, with a combined mark of 1-15 SEC play. The 2011 bowl berth was Vanderbilt's second since 1983.
- The Commodores had a breakthrough campaign in 2012 under Franklin, finishing on a seven-game winning streak (longest since 1948) to post a 9-4 mark for Vanderbilt's most wins in 97 years. Franklin was among five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year award.

## RISING UP THE RANKS

- Franklin began his coaching career as the wide receivers coach at Kutztown (Pa.) University (1995) and was a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater. East Stroudsburg (Pa.) University in 1996, working with the secondary.
- He then was the wide receivers coach at James Madison (1997), a grad assistant (tight ends) at Washington State (1998) and the wide receivers coach at Idaho State (1999).
- · In 2000, Franklin was named the wide receivers coach at Maryland under head coach Ron Vanderlinden, who would go on to coach the Penn State linebackers from 2001-13.
- · Franklin continued in that role under new head coach Ralph Friedgen in 2002 and 2003 and helped the Terps to three consecutive 10-win seasons, including an appearance in the 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl. In 2003. Franklin added duties as recruiting coordinator and directed back-to-back recruiting classes ranked in the Top 25 nationally. Franklin and former Nittany Lion head coach Bill O'Brien (running backs) were Maryland assistant coaches in 2003 and 2004 under Friedgen.
- After five successful years at Maryland Franklin was named wide receivers coach on Mike Sherman's Green Bay Packers staff in 2005. During that season, Green Bay ranked third in the NFL in receptions (383) and seventh in receiving yards (3,766). Donald Driver was among the top receivers in the NFL, ranking second in receptions and eighth in receiving yards, with a then-career-high 86 catches for 1,221 yards.
- Franklin served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Kansas State during the 2006-07 seasons under head coach Ron Prince. In 2006, he helped the Wildcats to their first winning season in four years. Franklin coached quarterback Josh Freeman and oversaw an offense that produced a 3.000-vard passer (Freeman), 1.500yard receiver (All-American wide receiver Jordy Nelson) and 1,000-yard rusher (James Johnson) during the 2007 season, a first in school history. Freeman would go on to become the Wildcats' highest NFL offensive draft pick since 1954 when the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected him 17th overall in the 2009 NFL Draft.
- Franklin returned to Maryland in 2008 as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He helped the Terrapins to victories in the 2008 Humanitarian Bowl and the 2010 Military Bowl. The 2010 squad was among the national leaders in scoring offense at 32.2 points per game.
- In 1998, Franklin began his participation in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program, starting with a stint with the Miami Dolphins and working with Hall of Fame quarterback Dan Marino. Franklin also worked with Donovan McNabb of the Philadelphia Eagles (1999) and Minnesota Vikings (2008) in the NFL program.

- · Franklin graduated having broken or tied 23 school records. He set seven school records as a senior to earn team MVP honors and was a Harlon Hill Trophy nominee as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year.
- Among the season records he set were for total offense (3,128 yards), passing yards (2,586) and touchdown passes (19).
- Franklin was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Athletics Hall of Fame October 15, 2016.

## **SERIES NOTES**

## **HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM**

- Jeff Brohm is in his third season as Purdue's head coach and has guided the Boilers to bowl appearances in his first two seasons.
- Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a 30-10 overall record and guided the Hilltoppers to Conference USA Championships in 2015 and 2016.
- Previously, Brohm served as an assistant coach at Louisville (2003-08), Florida Atlantic (2009), Illinois (2010-11), UAB (2012) and Western Kentucky (2013).
- As a student-athlete, Brohm was a three-year starter at quarterback for Louisville from 1989 to 1993.

## SCOUTING THE BOILERMAKERS

- In 2018, Purdue went 6-7, highlighted by a 49-20 rout of then-No. 2 Ohio State and an appearance in the Music City Bowl.
- Purdue uses a pass-heavy offensive attack, with pass attempts and sacks accounting for 65.5 percent of the Boilermakers plays this season.
- Purdue ranks last in the conference in total defense (451.0) and is averaging 32.5 points allowed per game to rank 13th in the conference. Minnesota quarterback Tanner Morgan set an opponent record last week by completing 95.4 percent (21-of-22) of his passes against the Purdue defense.

## **SERIES RECORD**

## NO. 24 PENN STATE ROLLS TO BOWL ELIGIBILITY WITH 62-24 WIN AT PURDUE

After heading into halftime tied at 17, No. 24 Penn State scored 17-straight points to open the third quarter and outscored Purdue 45-7 in the second half on its way to a 66-24 victory inside Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Nittany Lions had six scoring drives of under two minutes on their way to the first 60-point scoring game since the 2008 season.

Then-sophomore running back Saquon Barkley posted career bests to that point of his career with 207 rushing yards and 277 (207 rushing, 70 receiving) all-purpose yards. He also scored two touchdowns, including a then-career long 81-yard score in the fourth quarter, while fellow running backs Andre Robinson, Mark Allen and Miles Sanders combined for an additional four touchdowns.

The defense and special teams forced four turnovers in the game, as Brandon Smith and Christian Campbell each pulled down their second career interceptions and Kevin Givens and Jordan Smith each posted their first career fumble recoveries. Jason Cabinda led in tackles with a game-high nine.

Smith's interception was the turning point, as he halted Purdue's second half-opening drive on the third play from scrimmage, returning the ball to the 24. Four plays later, quarterback Trace McSorley found Chris Godwin for a 1-yard touchdown pass to make it 24-17. Purdue fumbled on their next drive, and Smith recovered it at the Purdue 24. The Nittany Lions scored two plays later after a 20-yard Barkley run and 4-yard Robinson touchdown run.

After a Penn State field goal, Purdue pulled within 10 with a touchdown of its own, but the Lions pulled away with four unanswered touchdowns.

## **PURDUE NOTES**

## SUCCESS ON HOMECOMING

- The Nittany Lions own a 71-23-5 record in 99 games in front of the alumni crowd since their 14-7 victory over Dartmouth in the first Homecoming game on Oct. 9, 1920.
- Last season, the Nittany Lions were defeated by Michigan State, 21-17, snapping a three-game Homecoming winning streak.
- Penn State has won six out of its last eight Homecoming tilts, defeating Rutgers (2017), Maryland (2016), Indiana (2015), Michigan (2013), Northwestern (2012) and Purdue (2011).
- The Nittany Lions have claimed 11 of their last 14 contests in front of the alumni crowd.
- This is the fifth time Penn State will square off against Purdue in a Homecoming game. The Nittany Lions are a perfect 4-0 against the Boilermakers with wins in 1996 (31-14), 1998 (31-13), 2005 (33-15) and 2011 (23-18).

## PENN STATE IN 27TH BIG TEN SEASON

- After 106 years as an independent in football, Penn State began play in the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and is playing its 27th season in the conference.
- The Nittany Lions were outright Big Ten Champions in 1994 and 2016 and shared titles with Ohio State in 2005 and 2008.
- Penn State beat Oregon to win the 1995 Rose Bowl and played USC in the 2009 and 2017 Rose Bowls.

## PENN STATE VS. BIG TEN

- Penn State has won 23 out of its last 28 games against Big Ten opponents.
- Penn State won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94.
- Penn State owns a 215-104-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.
- The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 134-78 mark.
- Penn State played 109 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment when either or both Penn State itself (prior to 1993) or the opponent (Nebraska prior to 2011; Maryland and Rutgers prior to 2014) was not yet a member of the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions went 80-26-3 in those games.

## GENERATIONS OF GREATNESS

- Penn State is turning back the clock for its "Generations of Greatness" game, as the Nittany Lions will don uniforms with designs elements from uniforms past.
- Penn State last wore its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms in 2017 against Indiana.

## **Uniform Elements**

- Numbers on Helmets The Nittany Lions had the number on the side of their helmet from 1959-61 and then again from 1967-74. A No. 42 also appeared on the side of every Penn State helmet in the season finale against Wisconsin in 2012 to honor injured senior Michael Mauti.
- Block Uniform Numbers The block uniform numbers are similar to those uniform numbers that donned the Blue & White from mid-1950s-66.
- White Stripe on Sleeve Penn State's uniform had a white stripe on the sleeve several times, including 1957-66, 1982-89 and 1992-2011.
- Stripe on the Pants The Nittany Lions had a blue stripe on their pants from 1952-68.
- Gray Facemask The gray facemask was donned by the Nittany Lions from 1959-86.
- White Cleats The white cleats were worn by the Nittany Lions in the 1979 Sugar Bowl.
- Gloves The gloves will feature the Lion Shrine on the palm of the hands
- Lion Shrine The image of Lion Shrine appears on the "home plate" of the front of the jersey. It is an original element of the "Generations of Greatness" uniform to pay homage to the Lion Shrine that was a gift from the Class of 1940.
- Back Inside Collar The back inside collar of the jersey reads "Penn State 1959" in recognition of the first Liberty Bowl game, played in Philadelphia. Penn State defeated Alabama. 7-0.

## WINNING THE WEST

- Penn State has won its last 10 games against Big Ten West Division opponents, dating back to an overtime win over Minnesota on Oct. 1, 2016.
- The streak includes Penn State's Big Ten Championship Game victory over Wisconsin in 2016 and three wins over Iowa.

## **FANS FLOCK TO BEAVER STADIUM**

- Penn State ranks second in FBS with an average attendance of 105,775.
- Three Big Ten teams lead the nation, with Michigan ranking first (111,073) and Ohio State (103,502) trailing the Nittany Lions in third.
- The Penn State Student Section has consistently sold out for four decades, showing the unwavering passion and dedication of Penn State students.
- Recognized as one the nation's premier game day atmospheres, the passionate and loyal students, alumni and fans filling Beaver Stadium have Penn State bucking the negative attendance trends among FBS games nationally.

- Penn State's 42 wins over the last five years (2015-19) rank tied for 10th in FBS and third in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 53; Wisconsin, 46).
- Penn State's 131 wins over the last 15 years (2005-19) rank tied for 13th in FBS and third in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 163; Wisconsin, 144).
- · In 2018, Penn State clinched its 14th consecutive winning season. Only four other FBS teams have had a winning season each of the last 14 years (Oklahoma, Boise State, LSU, Wisconsin).

## **BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- QB Sean Clifford was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week and to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 of the Week list following the Maryland game.
- · At Maryland, Clifford set personal bests with 26 completions on 31 attempts for 398 yards.
- · Clifford had 287 passing yards in the first half to break the Penn State record of 258 yards by Trace McSorley against Georgia State in 2017.
- Clifford had his first career 300-yard passing game with a career-high 398 passing yards to surpass his previous high of 280 against Idaho to open the season.
- · Clifford's 300-yard game is the 40th in Penn State
- · Clifford's 398 yards rank third in Penn State singlegame history, behind Christian Hackenberg (454; vs. UCF, 2014) and Zack Mills (299, vs. Iowa, 2002).
- It was his fourth-consecutive 200-yard game
- · Three of his throws went for touchdowns and he earned his first career rushing touchdown on the Lions' first play from scrimmage.
- · With 54 yards rushing, Clifford totaled 452 yards of total offense, which ranks as the third-most in a single game in school history.

- The magazine's formula takes into account senior starters, returning letterwinners, yardage and tackles returning and offensive line starts.
- Purdue is the only Penn State opponent to rank as less experienced, ranking as the sixth-most inexperienced

## **GILLIKIN UP FOR PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS**

- · P Blake Gillikin is among the 185 semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazda, 137 candidates for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award.
- Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- · The NFF will announce 12-14 finalists on Oct. 30, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 2019 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class presented by Investments. The finalists will travel to New York City for the 62nd NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 10.
- · Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of playing eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.
- The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.
- Penn State's Trace McSorley was a finalist for the award last year, becoming Penn State's 18th NFF Scholar-Athlete, and John Urschel won the award in 2013.
- · The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team is an annual award given to college football players for the impact they make off the field.
- · A perfect 4.0 student, Gillikin was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American last year. He spent the summer interning at Drayer Physical Therapy and performing a job shadow at Penn State Health in State College.
- Established in 1992, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team continues to be one of the most coveted community service awards in college football. From the 137 nominees, the final roster of 23 award recipients will be announced in September, bringing together 11 players from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision; 11 players from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II, III and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA); and one honorary head coach.
- · To be eligible for the Senior CLASS award, a studentathlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- · To determine the final Senior CLASS Award winner, the 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot, Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one candidate who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. Along with the winner, the 10 finalists will be awarded Senior CLASS Award first- or second-team honors.

## **OFFENSE NOTES**

## PILING UP THE POINTS

- Penn State ranks fifth in FBS averaging 50.0 points per game.
- Penn State has scored at least 50 points nine times since 2016.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 18 times since 2016.
   By comparison, from 2008 until 2016, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.
- Penn State has scored 30 or more points 27 times in the last 35 games.
- Penn State has scored 20 or more points in 36 of its last 39 games.
- Penn State scored 124 points (79 vs. Idaho; 45 vs. Buffalo) in its first two games, the second-highest total in the first two games of the season in school history. In 1894, Penn State opened the season with a combined 132 points in the first two games, scoring 60 against Gettysburg in the opener and 72 vs. Lafayette in the second game.
- The Nittany Lions scored 28 points in the third quarter of the Buffalo game, the most in a single quarter since they scored 35 in the fourth quarter of last season's game at Illinois.
- The 28-point third stanza marked the highest scoring by Penn State in a third quarter since the Nittany Lions had 28 points in the third quarter of the 2017 Rose Bowl Game vs. USC.
- Penn State had a high-scoring season-opener, scoring 79 points for its highest single-game total since an 81-0 win over Cincinnati in the 1991 home opener.
- Penn State's 44 points in the first half vs. Idaho were its most in an opening half since scoring 56 at Illinois in 2005.
- The 72-point margin of victory over the Vandals is tied for the 10th-biggest in Penn State history and is the largest since the 1991 Cincinnati game (81).
- The 79 points vs. Idaho are the second-most scored since 1921 and are tied for the sixth-most in program history
- The last time Penn State scored at least 70 points was a 70-24 win over Akron in 1999.

## **GREEN LIGHT IN THE RED ZONE**

- Dating back to 2017, Penn State has scored on 97 of its last 102 red zone trips, including 78 touchdowns.
- This season, Penn State is 19-for-19 in the red zone with 15 touchdowns
- Penn State is one of eight teams to stay perfect in the red zone this season, joining lowa, LSU, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Tulane, UConn and UTEP.
- Penn State is first in red zone scoring over the last three-plus years (2016-19) with a scoring rate of 89.16 percent.

## **EXPLOSIVE PLAYS**

- Explosive plays have been a key part of Penn State's offense this season.
- Penn State ranks:
  - Sixth in FBS in 15-plus yard pass play percentage (33 plays, 25.58%).
  - 11th in FBS big play percentage (12-plus yard runs & 15-plus yard passes) at 17.34 percent (44-of-271).
  - Fourth in FBS with 2.58 percent of plays (7 plays) going for 50 yards or more.
- Accordingly, 79.8 percent (79-of-99) of Penn State's first downs this season have come on first or second down, which ranks eighth in FBS.

## **EARLY SEASON PASSING PRODUCTIVITY**

- QB Sean Clifford is the third Penn State quarterback since 2000 to throw for at least nine touchdowns and 1,000 yards in the first four games of a season, joining Matt McGloin (2012) and Trace McSorley (2017).
- Clifford became the first Penn State quarterback to open a season with six touchdown passes in the first two games since Daryll Clark did the same in 2009.
- Clark and Clifford are the only two Penn State quarterbacks to accomplish the feat since 2000.

## **EFFICIENT AND CONSISTENT**

- QB **Sean Clifford**'s 16.84 passing yards per completion ranks fifth in FBS and leads the Big Ten.
- Clifford's 11.12 yards per pass attempt ranks sixth in FBS and is second in the Big Ten.
- Clifford's 294.8 passing yards per game ranks second in the Big Ten.
- Clifford threw for 398 yards at Maryland, ranking third in Penn State single-game history, behind Christian Hackenberg (454; vs. UCF, 2014) and Zack Mills (299, vs. lowa. 2002).
- Clifford ranks third in the Big Ten and seventh in FBS with a 185.6 passing efficiency rating.
- Clifford's 18 completions of 20 or more yards rank tied for 22nd in FBS.
- Clifford threw for 398 yards at Maryland for his fourthstraight 200-yard game.

## **DUAL THREAT**

- QB Sean Clifford (1,179 passing yds; 9 passing TDs; 167 rushing yds) is one of four FBS quarterbacks with at least 1,000 yards passing, nine passing touchdowns and 150 rushing yards rushing this season, joining Texas' Sam Ehlinger (1,237 passing yds; 15 passing TDs; 191 rushing yds), Oklahoma's Jalen Hurts (1,295 passing yds; 12 passing TDs; 443 rushing yds) and Wake Forest's Jamie Newman (1,278 yds; 12 passing TDs; 160 rushing yds).
- Averaging 336.5 yards of total offense per game, Clifford leads the Big Ten and ranks 12th in FBS.
- Clifford totaled the third-most yards of total offense in a game in school history at Maryland with 452 (398 pass, 54 rush).
- · Clifford is second on the team with 167 yards rushing.
- Clifford had a career-long 58-yard rush against Buffalo and his first career rushing touchdown at Maryland.
- Clifford ranks 14th all-time at Penn State with 164 career rushing yards by a quarterback.

## **MOVING THE BALL**

- Penn State ranks 14th in FBS and second in the Big Ten averaging 509.5 yards per game.
- The Nittany Lions' 619 total yards at Maryland were their third-most in a Big Ten game and the seventhmost in program history. The 619 yards were the most since the 1994 season (689, Minnesota; 653, Michigan State).
- Penn State's 30 first downs at Maryland are tied for seventh in a Big Ten game in program history.
- Penn State's 421 passing yards at Maryland are the most for the Lions in a Big Ten game, breaking the mark of 419 set against Michigan State in 2008. They rank second in program history behind the 454 yards against UCF in 2014.
- Penn State had 673 yards of total offense against Idaho, which was the most since totaling 689 at Minnesota in 1994 and the third most for the Nittany Lions since 1947.
- The Nittany Lions' 406 yards of offense in the first half vs. Idaho were their most in the first half since notching 439 yards vs. Nebraska in 2017.
- Penn State's 35 first downs vs. Idaho were its most since posting the same against Minnesota in 2005.

## **NO. 1 RECEIVER**

- WR KJ Hamler has at least one reception in all 17 games of his career
- Hamler ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 27th in FBS with 88.3 yards receiving per game, and is also sixth in the conference with three receiving touchdowns.
- Hamler ranks second in the Big Ten and 13th in FBS with an average of 22.06 yards per reception.
- Hamler is tied for 10th in FBS with five receptions of 30 or more yards.
- Hamler finished the Maryland game with a career-high six catches for 108 yards for his third career 100-yard receiving game.
- Hamler became the 33rd Nittany Lion to reach 1,000 career receiving yards with a 58-yard touchdown at Maryland and ranks 28th on Penn State's career receiving yards list with 1,107 yards.
- Hamler's two touchdown receptions against Idaho marked the first multi-receiving touchdown game of his career. He did have two scores at Pittsburgh last season, one rushing and one receiving.

## **LONG JOURNEY**

- RB Journey Brown had a 37-yard receiving touchdown at Maryland, the longest reception of his career and his first career receiving touchdown.
- It was his first game with a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- Against Pitt in his first career start, Brown's 85-yard run against Pittsburgh was the second-longest nonscoring run in school history. Blair Thomas had a 92yard rush vs. Syracuse in 1986.
- Brown's 85-yard rush was the longest rush by a Nittany Lion since Saquon Barkley had a 92-yard dash against Washington in the 2017 Fiesta Bowl.
- The 85-yard rush led Brown to a career-high 109 yards for the day on a personal-best 10 carries for his first career 100-yard game.
- It was also Penn State's second run of 80 or more yards this season, joining an 81-yard run by **Devyn Ford** against Idaho.

## FRESHMAN FINDS THE END ZONE

- True freshman RB **Noah Cain** scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season against Pittsburgh.
- Cain is tied for third in FBS in rushing touchdowns by freshmen.
- Overall, Cain ranks 33rd in FBS and sixth in the Big Ten.
- Cain is the first Penn State freshman to rush for at least four touchdowns in the first three games of a season since QB Michael Robinson rushed for five touchdowns in the first three games of 2002.

## TOP TIGHT ENDS

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** extended his streak to 16 consecutive games with at least one reception (all but his first career game).
- With 10 career touchdowns, Freiermuth is tied for 17th all-time at Penn State. Among tight ends, he is tied for third, matching Ted Kwalick (1966-68), and he is one touchdown behind Jesse James (2012-14) for second.

- Sophomore TE Pat Freiermuth had a career day against Buffalo, setting bests for catches (8) and receiving yards (99) and matching his career high of two touchdowns.
- For his efforts, Freiermuth was named the John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week.

## FOUR TOUCHDOWN CLUB

- QB Sean Clifford became the 16th different Penn State quarterback with at least four touchdown passes in a game with four against Buffalo.
- It was Penn State's 17th four-touchdown effort by a guarterback since 2000.
- The last Penn State quarterback to throw for four touchdowns with two or fewer career starts was Matt McGloin in 2010. McGloin had just one start when he threw for four touchdowns off the bench in a comeback win over Northwestern.
- The last Penn State quarterback to throw four touchdowns in a game was Trace McSorley with four vs. Georgia State in 2018.

## **NEW SIGNAL CALLER NO. 2**

- Redshirt freshman QB Will Levis threw for 62 yards in his Penn State debut, completing 11-of-14 passes after entering early in the second half against Idaho.
- Levis connected with true freshman TE Brenton Strange on a 4-yard touchdown pass for his first career touchdown pass.
- Levis also rushed for 21 yards on five attempts with a long run of 12 yards.
- At Maryland, Levis rushed for a career-high 38 yards on six carries, including two touchdowns.

## **GROUND GAME ROLLS AGAINST IDAHO**

- Seven different Nittany Lion rushers combined for 331 rushing yards against Idaho, ranking Penn State ninth in FBS during the opening week.
- The 331 yards on the ground were Penn State's most since rushing for 387 yards at Illinois last season.
- Five Nittany Lion running backs: Journey Brown (2), Noah Cain (2), Devyn Ford (1), Ricky Slade (1) and Nick Eury (1) combined for seven rushing touchdowns
- The last time five different Nittany Lion rushers scored at least one touchdown in the same game was a 70-24 win over Akron in 1999: Omar Easy, Eric McCoo, Mike Cerimele (2 TD), Rashard Casey (QB), Mick Blosser.
- The last time five different Nittany Lion running backs scored at least one touchdown in the same game was a 42-3 win over Syracuse in 1986: Blair Thomas, Tim Manoa (2 TD), D.J. Dozier, Odell Wilson, Steve Smith.
- Penn State's seven rushing touchdowns were its most since doing the same against Coastal Carolina in 2008.
- Brown, a sophomore, earned his first multi-touchdown game of his career.
- Cain, a true freshman making his debut, led the Lions with nine carries, and he finished with 44 yards in addition to his two scores.
- Ford rushed for a game-high 107 yards on six carries, averaging 17.8 yards per attempt in his debut.
- Ford became the first Nittany Lion freshman to run for more than 100 yards in a game since Saquon Barkley rushed for 103 yards against Michigan State on November 18, 2015.
- Ford is the first Penn State freshman to run for 100 yards in a season opener since Curt Warner did so on 12 carries against Rutgers on Sept. 15, 1979.
- Ford scored on an 81-yard run in the second quarter. It was his first career touchdown and Penn State's longest rushing touchdown since Saquon Barkley's 92-yard run in the Fiesta Bowl vs. Washington in 2017.
- Eury, a junior, had career highs of six carries for 44 yards and scored his first career touchdown on Penn State's final drive of the game. He previously had one career rush for 4 yards against Georgia State in 2017.

## IMPROVING ON THE GROUND

 Penn State, Wake Forest and Miami (Fla.) are the only three FBS schools to improve their national rushing offense ranking in each of the last five seasons. (Wake Forest Athletic Communications)

## **DEFENSE NOTES**

## **LOW SCORING**

- Penn State is second in scoring defense overall, allowing just 7.5 points per game to trail only Wisconsin (7.3 ppg).
- Penn State has not allowed a point in the first quarter this season and is one of three teams in the country yet to do so (Missouri, Oklahoma).
- Penn State is tied for second in FBS in third-quarter points allowed (0.75) and is second in second-half points allowed (2.5).
- At Maryland, the Nittany Lions posted their first shutout since the Georgia State game in 2017, first Big Ten shutout since 2016 (seventh overall in Big Ten play) and first of Maryland since 1970.
- It was also Penn State's largest road shutout since beating Fordham, 75-0, in 1947 and largest shutout in a Big Ten game.
- Dating back to last season, Penn State has held its last six regular season opponents to 13 points or less.
- Penn State has held eight of its last nine regular-season non-conference opponents to 14 points or less, dating back to 2017.

## **NOT GOING ANYWHERE**

- Penn State is allowing just 68.0 yards rushing per game to rank seventh in FBS and third in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is allowing just 1.88 yards per rush to rank third in FBS and the Big Ten behind Wisconsin (1.71) and Michigan State (1.86).
- The 128 yards of total offense allowed at Maryland ranks second in a Big Ten game in program history behind the 87 yards allowed to Rutgers in 2016.
- It was the sixth time under James Franklin the Nittany Lions have given up less than 200 yards of total offense.
- The 68 passing yards allowed at Maryland are tied for the seventh-fewest given up by the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten game.
- The 10 first downs allowed at Maryland are the seventhfewest allowed in a Big Ten game in program history.
- Penn State allowed just 24 rushing yards against Pitt, tied for the third-fewest given up by the Nittany Lions under James Franklin.
- Two of the four lowest rushing yard totals allowed under Franklin have been established this season, with 4 yards allowed to Idaho and 24 yards allowed to Pitt.
- The Nittany Lion defense held Idaho to just 4 rushing yards, the fewest since allowing 3 yards to UMass in 2014 and the second-fewest under Franklin.
- Penn State gave up just 145 yards of total offense to Idaho, which are the fewest since allowing 87 yards to Rutgers in 2016 and the second-lowest total under Franklin.

## PRODUCTION FROM LINEBACKER U

- Starting linebackers Jan Johnson (22), Micah Parsons (22) and Cam Brown (21) lead the Nittany Lions in tackles
- Johnson grabbed his second career interception on the
  first drive of the Maryland game (his other interception
  was also on a Friday night when he had a pick at Illinois
  last season) and recorded his first full sack and first
  career forced fumble against Pitt. The effort against
  Pitt also included six tackles and earned him a place
  on the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week.

- Parsons, who led Penn State with 83 tackles as a true freshman last season, has 105 tackles for his career.
- Brown was key in Penn State's win over Pitt, forcing a pair of throw-aways with his pressure on the quarterback as the Panthers ultimately came up empty despite first-and-goal at the 1 in the fourth quarter.

## **TAKEAWAYS**

- Penn State has four takeaways this season to rank sixth in the Big Ten and 27th in FBS.
- Penn State's four interceptions rank sixth in the Big Ten and 49th in FBS. CB John Reid leads Penn State with two picks, while LB Jan Johnson and CB Tariq Castro-Fields added picks at Maryland.

 Penn State continues to rank near the top of the sacks and tackles for loss national rankings, ranking eighth with 3.75 sacks per game and third with 9.8 tackles for loss per game.

- DE Yetur Gross-Matos leads Penn State with 3.5 sacks to rank tied for 20th in FBS and third in the Big Ten with 0.88 per game, and 5.5 TFLs to rank 34th in FBS and seventh in the Big Ten.
- A total of 21 Nittany Lions have recored at least a halftackle for loss.
- Penn State's leaders behind the line at Maryland were LB Ellis Brooks, who recorded a career-best 2.5 sacks
   his first of the season, and freshman DE Adisa Isaac, who had a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks.
- Penn State posted double-digit tackles for loss in the first three games of the season (11 vs. Idaho; 10 vs. Buffalo; 10 vs. Pitt) for the first time since opening 2007 by accomplishing the feat in four consecutive games (10 vs. FIU; 10 vs. Notre Dame; 10 vs. Buffalo; 15 vs. Michigan).
- Penn State's 11.0 tackles for loss in the season opener against Idaho were the most since recording 15.0 vs. Maryland last year.
- Penn State's 7.0 sacks against Idaho were the most since notching 7.0 vs. Kent State last season.
- Penn State's 3.33 sacks per game over the last five years (2015-19) are the second most in FBS, trailing Clemson (3.38).
- Penn State's 190 sacks over the last five years (2015-19 are second only to Clemson (216) and Alabama (202), the teams that have won the last four National Championships.
- Over the last five years, Penn State's defense has cumulated a 9.3 percent sack percentage (190 sacks on 2,033 plays), which ranks third behind Clemson and Michigan.
- Penn State has posted four consecutive 40-plus sack seasons for the first time in program history after totaling 47 last season, 42 in 2017, 40 in 2016 and 46 in 2015.
- In 2018, Penn State led the country in sacks per game (3.62) and ranked fourth and led the Big Ten in tackles for loss (8.2) per game.

## **SOLID IN THE MIDDLE**

- Penn State is not leaving early for halftime or returning late, boasting a plus-9.3 scoring differential in the middle eight minutes of the game that ranks fourth in FBS.
- Penn State owns a plus-7.0 scoring differential in the first four minutes of the second half, which ranks tied for first in FBS with Oklahoma.
- Penn State has not allowed a point in the first four minutes of the second half this season.

## **REID ALL ABOUT IT**

- CB **John Reid** tallied an interception in each of the first two games this season.
- Reid's interception return for a touchdown against Buffalo was the first interception returned for a TD since Amani Oruwariye returned an interception 30 yards for a score against Kent State in 2016.
- It was Reid's first career touchdown and his seventh career interception.
- In the opener against Idaho, Reid had an interception and tallied the first full sack of his career, as he forced an intentional grounding penalty in the opening stanza.

- Five student-athletes have earned six Penn State degrees already, while Weston Carr is a graduate transfer from Azusa Pacific who earned a degree in sociology.
- Jan Johnson earned an undergraduate degree in psychology in August 2018 and a master's in management and organizational leadership in May 2019. He is now working on a third degree in health policy and administration.
- Nick Bowers graduated with a degree in labor and employment relations in May 2019 and is now working on a second degree in health policy and administration.
- Steven Gonzalez graduated with a degree in history in December 2018 and is working on a second degree in rehabilitation and human services.
- Garrett Taylor graduated with a degree in advertising and public relations in December 2018 and is working on a second degree in telecommunications.
- Robert Windsor graduated with a degree in telecommunications in December 2017 and is working on a second degree in media studies.

## **CONTINUING ACADEMIC TRADITION**

- Punter Blake Gillikin (kinesiology) leads the Nittany Lions in the classroom with a perfect cumulative 4.0 grade point average following the 2019 spring semester.
- Gillikin was one of 15 Penn State student-athletes to earn a 4.0 GPA last academic year.
- Gillikin claimed the Evan Pugh Scholar Award, given to those juniors and seniors who are in the upper 0.5 percent of their respective classes, in May 2018.
- Gillikin was presented with the President's Freshman Award, given annually to undergraduate degree candidates who have earned a 4.0 cumulative gradepoint average based on at least 12 graded Penn State credits completed in their first semester of admission, in May 2017.
- Gillikin led seven Nittany Lion football players earning Big Ten Distinguished Scholar recognition for having a 3.7 or higher GPA for the 2018-19 academic year, contributing to a school-record 117 honorees across all sports. He was joined by **Dan Chisena** (security and risk analysis), **Nick Eury** (agribusiness management), **Cameron Pica** (finance), Charlie Shuman (management and organizational leadership), Jason Vranic (kinesiology) and Christopher Welde (mechanical engineering).
- Those seven were among 28 football student-athletes to earn All-Big Ten Academic honors following the 2018 fall semester.

## BEAVER STADIUM WINS 2019 ULTIMATE STADIUM BRACKET

- Beaver Stadium was the winner of For the Win/USA Today's 2019 Ultimate Stadium Bracket.
- The competition pitted venues from college football, college basketball, the NBA, NFL and Major League Baseball against each other in a bracket-style tournament with the winner of each round advancing based on fan votes.
- The home of the Nittany Lions topped Kansas' Allen Fieldhouse in the final, earning 78.64 percent of the vote (14,026 votes to 3,810). Beaver Stadium's route to the final included wins over LSU's Tiger Stadium, UCLA's Rose Bowl and the Atlanta Falcons' Mercedes Benz Stadium.

- K **Jake Pinegar** has converted 20 career field goals to rank 15th all-time at Penn State. Next on the list is Ray Tarasi (1986-89) with 27 career field goals.
- Pinegar has 79 career extra points to rank 11th in program history.
- Pinegar has hit 36-straight extra point attempts.

## STOUT LEG

- Junior transfer K Jordan Stout has made an impact with several booming kicks.
- Stout has 30 touchbacks to rank second in FBS, and they have come on 34 kickoffs to rank fifth in FBS with a 88.24 kickoff percentage.
- Stout had a streak of 26-straight touchbacks stopped at Maryland. It was the first kickoff return allowed by Penn State this season.
- Stout's 57-yard field goal late in the second quarter against Pitt broke the Penn State school record. The previous record was held by Chris Bahr, who booted three 55-yard field goals in 1975 at Temple, at Ohio State and at Syracuse.
- Stout's 57-yard field goal tied the Beaver Stadium record for longest field goal, equaling the mark established by Gary Homer of Ohio in 1973.
- Stout's 57-yard field goal is tied for the 12th-longest in Big Ten history, and it is the longest by a Big Ten kicker since Marshall Koehn of lowa had a 57-yard boot vs. Pittsburgh in 2015.
- Stout is the first Penn State kicker to have multiple 50yard field goals in a season since Kevin Kelly had two in 2008. Kelly's two kicks were 52 yards at Syracuse and 50 at Wisconsin.
- Stout had 12 touchbacks on 13 kickoffs vs. Idaho, which is the most at Penn State since the kickoff spot moved to the 35-yard line in 2011.
- Idaho was unable to return any of Stout's 13 kickoffs, as the lone kick to not go for a touchback was fair caught at the 2-vard line.
- Stout's 53-yard field goal against Idaho is tied for seventh-longest in Penn State history with Kevin Kelly (vs. lowa, 2007) and Massimo Manca (vs. Notre Dame, 1985)
- Stout's 53-yard field goal at the time was the longest since Sam Ficken had a 54-yard field goal vs. Kent State in 2013 and the first 50-plus-yard field goal since Ficken converted a 50-yard kick vs. Temple in 2014.

## **PUNT BLOCKING**

- Penn State has blocked three punts this season to lead FBS, blocking (2 vs. Idaho; 1 vs. Buffalo).
- Journey Brown earned his first career block against Buffalo.
- Jonathan Sutherland blocked two punts against Idaho for the first blocked punts of his career.
- The last time Penn State was credited with two blocked punts in the same game was against Louisiana Tech in 2000.
- Penn State was the only team to block two punts in the opening week.

## PREMIER PUNTING

- P Blake Gillikin leads Penn State with a career average of 43.13 yards per punt.
- Gillikin has landed 77 career punts inside the 20.
- Gillikin has landed 39 career punts inside the 10.
- Gillikin has 45 career punts of 50 or more yards.

## PINEGAR MATCHES EXTRA POINT RECORD

- K Jake Pinegar connected on all 10 extra point attempts against Idaho, which tied the Penn State record for extra points made and extra point attempts in a game. He equaled the mark set by Charles Atherton vs. Gettysburg in 1894 and Travis Forney vs. Akron in 1999.
- He also tied the program record for extra point percentage (min. 10 attempts) with Atherton and Forney.

## **SEASON NOTES**

## **COMING OFF A BYE**

- Penn State was successful coming off its first bye week of the season (Sept. 21), earning a 59-0 win at Maryland.
- Penn State has another bye week Nov. 2.
- The last time Penn State had two bye weeks in a season was during the 2013 and 2014 seasons. The Nittany Lions went 0-4 following those bye weeks, coming up short against Indiana (Oct. 5) and Ohio State (Oct. 26) in 2013 and Michigan (Oct. 11) and Ohio State (Oct. 25) in 2014.
- Penn State has a 18-15 record after a bye week since starting Big Ten competition in 1993.

## LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2019 season marks the 19th straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule and the 11th since 2000 with multiple night games in the same season.
- Penn State has won both of its night games this season, defeating Maryland, 59-0, (Sept. 27) and Buffalo, 45-13 (Sept. 7).
- Penn State is next scheduled to play at night at lowa (Oct. 12) with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff.
- Game times for the final six games of the regular season have not been announced.
- Penn State's only losses in its last 12 night games are both to Ohio State.
- Penn State is 53-31 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 15-10 at home, 26-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

## **NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS**

- Penn State has won 10 consecutive games over nonconference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- The Nittany Lions have won 16-straight non-conference regular-season home games, dating back to a win over Kent State on Sept. 21, 2013.
- Under James Franklin (since 2014), Penn State is 18-2 against non-conference opposition during the regular season and 20-5 when including bowl games.

- For the sixth consecutive year, Penn State is playing at least four FBS teams that are within a 250-mile drive (based on Google Maps from stadium to stadium).
- The Nittany Lions have won their last 14 consecutive against their neighbors.
- Since joining the Big Ten in 1993, Penn State is 53-4 against FBS teams within 250 miles.
- All-time, Penn State is 299-111-17 against its current FBS regional foes.

- Penn State has many long and storied series on the gridiron. The Nittany Lions have played 20 teams 20 or more times in the 133-year history of the program.
- · Penn State owns a winning record against 16 of the 20 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Eight of the 20 teams are on the 2019 schedule, including Pitt (100 meetings), Maryland (42), Iowa (27), Michigan (21), Michigan State (33), Indiana (22), Ohio State (34) and Rutgers (28).
- Since 2012, Penn State has played or has a future meeting scheduled meeting with 13 of the 20 teams (all of the FBS teams except Navy). Those opponents include: Army (2015), Illinois (2014-15, '18, '21), Iowa (2016-21), Pitt (2016-19), Syracuse (2012), Temple (2014-16) and West Virginia (2023-24), while the Lions will meet yearly with Big Ten East Division opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State and Rutgers.
- Fifteen of the 20 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are in NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are Division III programs.

- WR KJ Hamler found his way on to three preseason watch lists: the Maxwell Award for national player of the year, the Paul Hornung Award for the most versatile player in major college football and the Biletnikoff Award for the nation's top wide receiver.

## THREE NAMED TO NAGURSKI LIST

- DT Robert Windsor, who also earned a berth on the Outland Trophy watch list for the nation's top interior lineman, DE Yetur Gross-Matos and LB Micah Parsons were all selected to the Bronko Nagurski Trophy watch list for the nation's top defensive player.
- The Bronko Nagurski Trophy is given yearly to the National Defensive Player of the Year. The award is named for legendary two-way player from the University of Minnesota, Bronko Nagurski, who dominated college football then became a star for the Chicago Bears in the 1930s.
- Penn State has never won a Nagurski Trophy, but has had five finalists, most recently Carl Nassib in 2015.
- The Outland Trophy is named after the late John Outland, an All-America lineman at Penn at the turn of the 20th century and is given to the nation's top interior lineman (offensive or defensive).
- Penn State defensive tackle Mike Reid won the Outland Trophy in 1969 and All-America defensive tackle Devon Still was the most recent Nittany Lion finalist, in 2011.

## EIGHT BOWL TEAMS HIGHLIGHT SCHEDULE

- The Nittany Lions will face eight teams that participated in a bowl game during the 2018 campaign.
- Three of Penn State's 2019 opponents won their respective conference divisions last season.
- Buffalo won the MAC East Division title and lost to Troy in the Dollar General Bowl (42-32).
- Pittsburgh won the ACC Coastal Division crown and lost to Stanford in the Hyundai Sun Bowl (14-13).
- Ohio State won the Big Ten East Division and went on to defeat Northwestern in the Big Ten Championship Game (45-24). The Buckeyes defeated No. 9 Washington in the Rose Bowl (28-23).
- lowa defeated No. 18 Mississippi State in the Outback Bowl (27-22), while Minnesota defeated Georgia Tech in the Quick Lane Bowl (34-10).
- Michigan lost to No. 10 Florida in the Chick-fil-a Peach Bowl (41-15), Michigan State lost to Oregon in the Redbox Bowl (7-6) and Purdue lost the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl to Auburn (63-14).

## OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996.
- · Since then, Penn State has played 13 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons. Nine of the 13 overtime tilts have come at home, two in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014
- Penn State is 8-5 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-1 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- · Penn State has won three-straight overtime games under James Franklin. It's the longest streak of overtime wins since winning five-straight from 2006 to 2013
- Penn State went into overtime in a season opener for the first time, opening the 2018 season with a 45-38 OT-win over Appalachian State. It was the seventh overtime game at Beaver Stadium since the start of the 2012 season. Penn State is 5-2 in those games.
- The 2018 overtime game was the first since Penn State defeated Minnesota, 29-26, on Oct. 1, 2016. After Minnesota kicked a field goal on its first possession, Saguon Barkley rushed 25 yards for a touchdown on the Nittany Lions first offensive play.
- · Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

## THREE ON COLLEGE HOF BALLOT

- First-team All-Americans Jeff Hartings and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2020.
- · A total of 76 players and five coaches from FBS are on the 2020 ballot.
- · To be eligible for the Hall of Fame ballot, players must have been named a first-team All-America by a major/ national selector as recognized and utilized by the NCAA for their consensus All-America teams; played their last year of intercollegiate football at least 10 years prior to nomination; played within the last 50 years and cannot be currently playing professional football. Once nominated for consideration, all player candidates are submitted to one of eight District Screening Committees, which conducts a vote to determine who will appear on the ballot and represent their respective districts.
- The pair of standouts were instrumental in helping Penn State post undefeated and championship seasons have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- · Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion student-athlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2019. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- The announcement of the 2020 Class will be made in January 2020 in the days leading up to the College Football Playoff (CFP) National Championship in New
- · Hartings excelled on the field and in the classroom for the Nittany Lions, claiming first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and six first-team All-America accolades during his career. In 1995, he was an NFF Hall of Fame Scholar-Athlete team honoree and Rotary Lombardi Trophy semifinalist. The native of St. Henry, Ohio was the keystone of the offensive line that helped the 1994 offense break 14 school season records and seven Big Ten season marks,.
- · Hartings was a three-time All-Big Ten first team selection and a three-time Academic All-Big Ten choice in his career. He earned first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press and Walter Camp in 1994 and followed that up by collecting first-team All-America honors from UPI, AFCA, Sporting News and Walter Camp.
- Hartings was selected with the 23rd overall pick of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions. He played 11 seasons in the NFL with the Lions and Pittsburgh Steelers. He was a three-time All-Pro selection, twotime Pro Bowl pick and member of the 1996 NFL All-Rookie Team.
- · Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Westfield High School in Houston, Wisniewski was the first pick in the second round of the 1989 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys, who immediately traded his rights to the Los Angeles Raiders. Wisniewski was a mainstay for the Raiders from 1989-2001, starting the final 175 games of his career. He was selected to the Pro Bowl eight times, with six first-team All-Pro selections. He was elected a Raiders team captain seven times, was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 1990's and to Oakland's 50-Year All-Raider Team. Wisniewski missed only two of a possible 208 career games.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.

## **GAME** RECAP

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. –** Penn State cruised to a 79-7 win over Idaho in its season-opening football contest.

Penn State rolled for 673 total yards on offense – the third-most in program history - while holding Idaho to just five first downs and 145 total yards. The Nittany Lion ground game led the offensive charge with five different running backs combining for seven rushing touchdowns and a total of nine different rushers combining for 331 yards on 45 attempts. Freshman Devyn Ford ran his second career carry for an 81-yard touchdown en route to a 107-yard day, while classmate Noah Cain and sophomore Journey Brown both added two scores each.

Making his first career start, sophomore quarterback Sean Clifford threw for 280 yards and two touchdowns on 14-of-23 passing and rushed seven times for 57 yards in a little more than a half of action. KJ Hamler led the receivers with four catches for 115 yards and both of Clifford's passing touchdowns.

The Vandals were limited to just four yards rushing as Penn State totaled seven sacks and 11 tackles for loss, led by 2.5 sacks by junior defensive end Yetur Gross-Matos.

## **How It Happened**

Penn State jumped out to a 20-0 lead in the first quarter behind a pair of field goals by Jake Pinegar (28 yards) and Jordan Stout (53 yards), respectively, and a rushing touchdown each from Brown and Ricky Slade.

The Nittany Lions added 24 points in the second quarter to take a 44-0 lead into halftime. Hamler caught a 36-yard pass from Clifford in the back of the end zone early in the frame, and then in the final five minutes, Ford broke free for 81 yards on his second career carry, Hamler hauled in a 21-yard touchdown, and a quick three-andout setup a successful 38-yard field goal conversion by Pinegar as time expired.

Brown and Cain added rushing touchdowns in the third quarter for a 58-0 lead. In the fourth, quarterback freshman quarterback Will Levis threw his first career touchdown pass to rookie tight end Brenton Strange to put the Nittany Lions up 65-0.

Idaho's lone score came with 12:35 remaining, as a mishandled punt reception gave the Vandals a short 25yard field, and quarterback Mason Petrino eventually connected with fullback Logan Kendall from a yard out.

Penn State added a pair of rushing touchdowns from Cain and Nick Eury in the final eight minutes to cement the 79-7 victory.

## Note

- The Nittany Lions have won 16 of their last 18 season openers, including four-straight victories.
- The Nittany Lions have won 17 of their last 18 home openers, including seven straight victories.
- Penn State won its eighth consecutive non-conference regular season game.
- Penn State's 79 points mark the most the Nittany Lions have scored in a game since scoring 81 in an 81-0 win over Cincinnati in the 1991 home opener.
- The 79 points are the second-most since 1921 and are tied for the sixth-most in program history.
- The 72-point margin of victory is tied for the 10thbiggest in Penn State history and is the largest since the 1991 Cincinnati game (81-0).
- Penn State's seven rushing touchdowns are the most since rushing the ball into the end zone seven times against Coastal Carolina in 2008.
- The Nittany Lions had five different running backs score the seven rushing touchdowns. It is the first time since at least 2000 that five different players have scored a rushing touchdown in the same game.
- Penn State's 673 yards of total offense were the most since 689 at Minnesota in 1994 and the third most for the Nittany Lions since 1947.
- Penn State's 35 first downs were the most since it had 35 against Minnesota in 2005.
- The Nittany Lion defense held Idaho to just 4 rushing yards, the fewest since allowing 3 yards to UMass in 2014 and the second-fewest under James Franklin.
- Penn State gave up just 145 yards of total offense, which are the fewest since allowing 87 yards to Rutgers in 2016 and the second-lowest total under James Franklin.
- RB Devyn Ford became the first Nittany Lion freshman to run for more than 100 yards in a game since Saquon Barkley rushed for 103 yards against Michigan State on November 18, 2015. He is also the first Penn State freshman to run for 100 yards in a season opener since Curt Warner rushed for 100 yards on 12 carries against Rutgers on September 15, 1979.
- Ford scored on an 81-yard run in the second quarter. It was his first career touchdown and Penn State's longest rushing touchdown since Saquon Barkley's 92-yard run in the Fiesta Bowl vs. Washington in 2017.
- CB John Reid notched the first full sack of his career in the opening stanza. He previously had a half-sack against Kent State in 2016. He also grabbed the sixth interception of his career early in the third quarter.

## **GAME RECAP**

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. –** No. 15/14 Penn State scored four touchdowns in the third quarter en route to a 45-13 win over Buffalo in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State trailed Buffalo, 10-7 at the half, but cornerback John Reid returned an interception 36 yards for a touchdown early in the third quarter to swing the momentum in Penn State's favor. Sean Clifford added a pair of touchdowns and Noah Cain rushed for one before the frame ended to establish a 35-13 lead.

Clifford finished the game with four touchdown passes, connecting twice each with Jahan Dotson and Pat Freiermuth.

## How It Happened

The Nittany Lions took advantage of a Buffalo fumble on its second offensive possession for their first score. Linebacker Cam Brown caused and forced it at the Bulls' 37-yard line, and then two plays later, Clifford found Dotson in the right corner of the end zone for a 28-yard score.

Buffalo got on the board with a field goal early in the second quarter by Alex McNulty. The 32-yard kick concluded a 19-play, 69-yard drive that consumed 8 minutes, 34 seconds. Buffalo then found the end zone with 11 seconds remaining before the halftime break. A 40-yard completion to Antonio Nunn at the 6-yard line from quarterback Matt Myers setup the score.

Penn State received the second-half kickoff and reached Buffalo 33, but a fumble gave the Bulls the ball back. However, on Buffalo's third play of the drive, Reid jumped a route along the left sideline and went untouched into the end zone for a 36-yard score, his first career pick-

After the Nittany Lions forced a three-and-out and followed it with a 22-yard punt return by KJ Hamler and a personal foul penalty setup Penn State at the Bulls' 23. On the first play of the drive, Clifford connected with Freiermuth for his first score of the quarter.

Following a 25-yard field goal by Buffalo, the Nittany Lions answered with a 2-yard touchdown run by Cain. Cain's run was setup by a career-long 58-yard rush along the sideline by Clifford.

The next Penn State drive ended with a 28-yard touchdown reception by Freiermuth. On fourth-and-2, Clifford found Freiermuth on a short pass to the left of the line and the sophomore pulled it in with one hand and took it up the sideline and into the end zone

A 45-yard reception by Hamler setup Penn State's next score, a 32-yard field goal by Jake Pinegar, early in the fourth quarter. Later in the frame, Clifford connected with Dotson on a 56-yard touchdown to complete the scoring.

## Notes

- Penn State won its ninth consecutive non-conference regular season game.
- The Nittany Lions won their 15th straight nonconference regular season home game.
- Penn State has scored 124 points (79 vs. Idaho; 45 vs. Buffalo) in its first two games, the second-highest total in the first two games of the season in school history. In 1894, Penn State opened the season with a combined 132 points in the first two games, scoring 60 against Gettysburg in the opener and 72 vs. Lafayette in the second game.
- Penn State scored 40 points for the 17th time since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2016, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.
- The Nittany Lions scored 28 points in the third quarter, the most in a single quarter since they scored 35 in the fourth quarter of last season's game at Illinois.
- The 28-point third stanza marked the highest scoring by Penn State in a third quarter since the Nittany Lions had 28 points in the third quarter of the 2017 Rose Bowl Game vs. USC.
- The Nittany Lions are now 52-31 all time in night games, including a 15-10 mark at home.
- Penn State improves to 27-3 against the 2019 football alignment of the Mid-American Conference.
- Penn State's interception return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first interception returned for a TD since Amani Oruwariye returned an interception 30 yards for a score against Kent State in 2016.
- The 19-play drive allowed by Penn State over the first and second quarter was the longest given up by the Nittany Lions in terms of plays since at least 2002.
- The 8:34 scoring drive by Buffalo was the longest given up by Penn State in terms of time since Texas A&M had an 8:45 field goal drive in the 2007 Alamo Bowl
- Penn State's 17:28 time of possession is the lowest for the Nittany Lions since at least 1993.
- Sean Clifford becomes the 16th different Penn State quarterback with at least four touchdown passes in a game. The last time was Trace McSorley's four TD passes vs. Georgia State in 2018.
- Pat Freiermuth had areer-bests of eight catches and 99 yards receiving. He also tied his personal best with two touchdowns.
- Dotson had a career-best 109 yards receiving, bettering his previous career mark of 58 yards at Rutgers last year.

## **GAME RECAP**

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. –** No. 13/11 Penn State used a 13-play, 88-yard touchdown drive in the third quarter and a goal line stand late in the fourth to secure a 17-10 victory over Pittsburgh in front of a "Stripe Out" crowd of 108,661.

Penn State's third-quarter scoring drive was capped by a 13-yard touchdown run by freshman running back Noah Cain, which proved to be the game-deciding score. The Nittany Lion defense prevented Pittsburgh from tying it up late, denying the Panthers despite first-and-goal at the 1-yard line. Linebacker Cam Brown forced Pitt quarterback Kenny Pickett to throw the ball away on first and third downs, and safety Garrett Taylor and linebacker Jesse Luketa stuffed Pickett on a rush on second down, leading to a failed 19-yard field goal attempt on fourth down with 4:54 remaining.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford threw for 222 yards and the Nittany Lions combined for 167 yards rushing, led by Journey Brown's 109 yards – including an 85-yard run – on 10 carries, Cain's 40 yards and one touchdown on six carries and a touchdown by freshman Devyn Ford.

Pickett led Pitt's offense, completing 35-of-51 passes for 372 yards. He primarily targeted Taysir Mack, who finished with a career-high 12 catches for 125 yards.

The Penn State defense held Pitt to 24 yards rushing on 25 attempts, including minus-6 yards on 10 attempts in the second half. The Panthers managed just 8 yards on 12 plays in the third quarter. Linebacker Micah Parsons led the way with nine tackles (seven solo), including two tackles for loss, while linebackers Brown and Jan Johnson and defensive end Shaka Toney each added second-half sacks.

## **How It Happened**

Pitt started to gain momentum in the latter half of the first quarter, pinning Penn State at its own 2-yard line, but on third-and-9 from the 3, Brown broke through the middle, slipped through a tackle and ran 85 yards to the Pitt 12. After a penalty moved the Lions to the 4, Ford found the end zone after consecutive rushes of 4 and 1 yards, and Penn State took a 7-0 lead with 4:43 on the clock.

Pitt answered to take the lead with an 18-play, 85-yard field goal drive for its first score with 6:43 remaining in the half, and followed that with an eight-play, 78-yard touchdown drive capped by a 3-yard A.J. Davis touchdown run with 2:08 remaining. However, Penn State tied the game at 10-10 in the closing seconds with a school-record 57-yard field goal by Jordan Stout.

The Nittany Lions retook the lead, 17-10, with 5:50 remaining in the third quarter on Cain's touchdown. Pitt threatened with a pair of late fourth quarter drives but was denied both times.

- In the 100th all-time meeting, Penn State improved to 53-43-4 against Pitt.
- The Nittany Lions moved to 19-6 all-time at home against Pittsburgh.
- Kickoff time was delayed 34 minutes due to lightning in the area during pregame warm-ups.
- The Nittany Lions won their 16th-straight nonconference regular-season home game.
- Penn State's 17 points in victory were the fewest by the Nittany Lions in a win since a 13-7 win against Indiana in 2014
- Penn State allowed 24 rushing yards, tied for the thirdfewest given up by the Nittany Lions under James Franklin with 24 given up to UCF in 2014. Two of the four lowest rushing yards allowed under Franklin have been established this season, with 4 yards allowed to Idaho previously.
- K Jordan Stout's 57-yard field goal late in the second quarter is a Penn State school record. The old record was held by Chris Bahr, who booted three 55-yard field goals in 1975 at Temple, at Ohio State and at Syracuse.
- In his first career start, RB Journey Brown's 85-yard run was the second-longest non-scoring run in school history. Blair Thomas had a 92-yard rush vs. Syracuse in 1986.
- Brown's 85-yard rush was the longest rush by a Nittany Lion since Saquon Barkley had a 92-yard dash against Washington in the 2017 Fiesta Bowl.
- It was also Penn State's second run of 80 or more yards this season, joining an 81-yard run by Devyn Ford against Idaho.
- Clifford threw for 222 yards for his third-straight 200-yard game, which is tied for 18th on Penn State's career list.
- Cain scored a touchdown for the third-straight game to open his collegiate career. He has four rushing scores this year.
- LB Jan Johnson recorded the first full sack of his career in the third quarter. He had a half-sack last season at Pittsburgh.
- S Garrett Taylor recorded seven tackles to reach the 100-career tackle mark. He now has 101 career stops.
- P Blake Gillikin landed a career-best six punts (out of seven attempts) inside the 20. He previously had three games with four punts landed inside the 20 with the last coming at Pitt in 2018.

## **GAME RECAP**

**COLLEGE PARK, Md. –** Quarterback Sean Clifford threw for 398 yards and three touchdowns in less than three quarters of action to lead the No. 12/11 Nittany Lions past Maryland, 59-0, on Friday night.

It was career night for Clifford as he set personal bests with 26 completions on 31 attempts for 398 yards, including a Penn State-record 287 yards in the first half. Three of his throws went for touchdowns and he earned his first career rushing touchdown on the Lions' first play from scrimmage.

Will Levis relieved Clifford with 5:45 remaining in the third quarter and added 23 passing yards to give Penn State 421 yards for the night, ranking as the second-most in program history (behind Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014) and the most in a Big Ten game in program history.

Thirteen different Lions caught a pass, led by a careerhigh six receptions by KJ Hamler, who finished with 108 yards receiving and a 58-yard touchdown reception.

In total, Penn State's 619 yards of total offense were its third-most in a Big Ten game all-time.

On defense, Penn State yielded just 128 yards, its second-fewest in a Big Ten game all-time. Jan Johnson and Tariq Casto-Fields both hauled in interceptions that led to Penn State touchdown drives and Ellis Brooks led the unit with six tackles and 2.5 sacks.

## **How It Happened**

Johnson intercepted Maryland quarterback Josh Jackson on the Terps' fifth play from scrimmage, returning it 17 yards to the Maryland 32, and penalties on the play and after the play gave the Nittany Lions the ball at the Maryland 8-yard line. Clifford called his own number on the first play and scampered untouched into the end zone for a quick 7-0 lead.

The Penn State defense forced a three-and-out on Maryland's next possession, and the Lions went up 14-0 on an electrifying 58-yard touchdown reception by Hamler with 9:28 remaining in the first quarter. Maryland threatened on its next drive, but Castro-Fields intercepted Jackson at the goal line, setting up a 95-yard touchdown drive that stretched into the second quarter. Ricky Slade capped the drive with a 3-yard touchdown run for a 21-0 lead.

Nick Bowers caught a 15-yard touchdown pass with 9:40 remaining in the half, Journey Brown turned a checkdown pass into a 37-yard touchdown with 3:04 remaining and Jake Pinegar kicked a 21-yard field goal as time expired for a 38-0 halftime lead.

Brown added a touchdown on the ground in the third quarter and Levis rushed for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the final margin.

- The Nittany Lions are 16-9-1 in Friday regular-season games, including an 8-4 record in road Friday regularseason games.
- Penn State improved to 40-2-1 overall against Maryland and 14-1 all-time on the road.
- The Nittany Lions posted their first shutout since the Georgia State game in 2017, first Big Ten shutout since 2016 (seventh overall in Big Ten play) and first of Maryland since 1970.
- It was also Penn State's largest road shutout since beating Fordham, 75-0, in 1947 and largest shutout in a Big Ten game.
- The Nittany Lions' 619 total yards are the third-most in a Big Ten game for PSU and are seventh in program history. The 619 yards are the most since the 1994 season (689, Minnesota; 653, Michigan State).
- Penn State's 30 first downs are tied for seventh in a Big Ten game in program history.
- Penn State's 421 passing yards are the most for the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten game, breaking the mark of 419 set against Michigan State in 2008, and rank second in program history behind the 454 yards against UCF in 2014.
- The 128 yards of total offense allowed rank second in a Big Ten game in program history behind the 87 yards allowed to Rutgers in 2016.
- The 68 passing yards allowed are tied the the seventhfewest given up by the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten game.
- Penn State has outscored Maryland 159-10 in the last three meetings in College Park.
- Penn State converted its first seven third down attempts and finished 9-for-13 on the night.
- QB Sean Clifford had 287 passing yards in the first half to break the Penn State record of 258 yards by Trace McSorley against Georgia State in 2017. McSorley, now a Baltimore Raven, was in attendance.
- Clifford had his first career 300-yard passing game with a career-high 398 passing yards to surpass his previous high of 280 against Idaho to open the season.
- Clifford's 398 yards rank third in Penn State singlegame history, behind Christian Hackenberg (454; vs. UCF, 2014) and Zack Mills (399, vs. Iowa, 2002).
- Hamler became the 33rd Nittany Lion to reach 1,000 career receiving yards with a 58-yard touchdown catch on Penn State's second offensive drive.
