THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.; September 3, 2019 -- The Penn State Nittany Lions (0-2, 0-0 B1G), ranked No. 9 in the NFCHA Preseason Coaches Poll, travels to Newark, Del., to face No. 16 Delaware (2-0) on Sunday, Sept. 8, at 12 p.m. Delaware hosts American on Friday night before taking on the Nittany Lions.

The Nittany Lions are coming off a tough road weekend that saw them drop a 4-1 game at No. 3 Duke to open the season last Friday and a 2-1 game at No. 11 Virginia on Sunday of last weekend.

Sophomore Anna Simon leads Penn State with three points off a goal (against Virginia) and an assist (in the Duke game). Alexis Horst has two points, having scored Penn State's lone goal against Duke. Freshman goalie Brie Barraco has 13 saves in her first two collegiate starts and a .667 save percentage.

Delaware enters its two game weekend after winning two games last week. The Blue Hens hosted No. 22 Albany on Aug. 30 and posted a 1-0 shutout victory. Delaware then took down Miami, Ohio, 2-1 on Sept. 2. The Blue Hens take on American Friday night, Sept. 6, prior to the Penn State game.

The Blue Hens are being led by Femke Strien who has four points off two goals. Ashlyn Carr has two points off a goal as well. Keeper Sydney Rhodes has a 0.50 goals against average with seven saves and a shutout after two games this year.

Penn State hosts Old Dominion on Friday, Sept. 13, at 6 p.m. in its home opener. The Lions then travel to Princeton on Sunday, Sept. 15, for a 12 p.m. game.

NITTANY LIONS DROP TOUGH 2-1 GAME AT #11 VIRGINIA

Penn State dropped hard fought 2-1 game at #11 Virginia on Sunday, Sept. 1. The Nittany Lions tied the game with a late goal from Anna Simon, but the Cavaliers scored with just over 1:00 to play to steal the win in Charlottesville. Lion keeper Brie Barraco had five saves in the contest.

PENN STATE LOSES OPENER AT #3 DUKE

Penn State scored the first goal of the game in its season opener at Duke on Aug. 30, but the Blue Devils rallied to post the 4-1 victory. Nittany Lion Alexis Horst scored on an assist from Anna Simon in the first period for Penn State. Freshman goalie Brie Barraco made her first career start and had seven saves against a pressing Duke offense.

THREE NITTANY LIONS NAMED TO 2019 BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

Three Penn State Nittany Lions have been named to the 2019 Big Ten 'Players to Watch' list as compiled by the conference's head coaches. Senior Madison Morano, junior Abby Myers and sophomore Anna Simon are Penn State's players on the early season watch list. Morano enters her final season at Penn State with 32 career points, having played in 60 games over three years. Myers, who redshirted as a true freshman in 2016, has 19 points over the last two seasons and has played in 40 games. Simon started all season long last year as a true freshman and had 28 points off 13 goals and two assists.

PENN STATE IS HOST SITE FOR 2019 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

The Penn State Field Hockey Complex will be the site of the 2019 Big Ten Field Hockey Championship Tournament. The tournament, which will determine the conference's automatic qualifier for the 2019 NCAA Championships, reverts to its original format and features six games over four days in November. The first three games take place on Thursday, Nov. 7, the semifinals occur on Friday, Nov. 8, with the Big Ten Championship game set for Sunday, Nov. 10. Times will be determined at a later date and more information is to follow as the event nears.



#9 PENN STATE 1, #3 DUKE 4

Friday, August 30, 2019 -- Durham, N.C.

The Penn State Nittany field hockey team (0-1, 0-0 B1G), ranked No. 9 in the initial NFHCA Coaches Poll, lost to No. 3 Duke (1-0) in the season opener for both teams on Friday. A young Penn State squad battled the veteran Blue Devils tough early before Duke pulled away for the 4-1 non-conference victory.

The Nittany Lions got on the board quickly when sophomore Anna Simon (Hanau, Germany) fed junior Alexis Horst (Port Trevorton, N.J.) for the goal with Horst notching Penn State's first goal of the season. The early goal gave Penn State an early 1-0 lead at the 5:08 mark. The Lion offense stayed on attack and the defense held firm as Penn State led 1-0 after the opening period.

Redshirt freshman Brie Barraco (Allentown, Pa.), making her first collegiate start, made the first save of her career early in the second stanza to keep the Nittany Lions on top. Duke found its offense during the second period, forcing Barraco into a couple more saves before Blue Devil Olivia Sahaydak notched a goal at the 24:54 mark to tie the game at 1-1. Duke found the back just minutes later, with Hannah Miller scoring off a Leah Crouse assist at the 27:23 mark to give the Devils a 2-1 lead. The Blue Devils carried that lead into halftime

Duke outshot Penn State 8-1 in the opening half and had the only penalty corner of the first 30 minutes. Barraco had three saves in the first half while Duke's Sammi Steele had none.

Barraco kept Penn State close in the third period, doubling her save total while Duke stacked up five more shots. The Nittany Lions continued to trail by one throughout the third stanza and were within one goal heading into the final period.

The Nittany Lions battled Duke tough throughout the final period, but the Blue Devil offense connected late in the game with Sahaydak notching her second goal of the contest at the 53:00 mark to put Duke up 3-1. Leah Crouse added a late unassisted goal for Duke at the 57:12 mark to close out the game's scoring and give the Devils the 4-1 victory.

"We showed good signs today and we played together throughout the game," said head coach Char Morett-Curtiss. "But we have to do better taking care of the ball. Turnovers and lack of possession really got us in trouble today and against a good team like Duke, it will be costly. Our players gave 100 percent for the entire 60 minutes and that is definitely something we will build on as the season progresses."

Duke outshot Penn State 17-4 while each team had three penalty corners. Barraco finished the game with seven saves and four goals against while Steele had two saves and a goal against.

The Penn State Nittany field hockey team (0-2, 0-0 B1G), ranked No. 9 in the initial NFHCA Coaches Poll, fell to No. 11 Virginia (2-0) in a non-conference road game on Sunday. Penn State tied the game late only to see Virginia notch the game-winning goal with just over a minute left as the Nittany Lions lost 2-1 in Charlottesville.

The two squads battled evenly through the start of the first period, with Virginia getting the early game's lone shot on goal. The Lion defense held, and the game moved into the latter part of the opening stanza still scoreless. The first period ended in a 0-0 tie with Penn State's defense holding off three Cavaller shots in the first 15:00

Virginia got on the scoreboard first less than two minutes into the second quarter when Anzel Viljoen scored unassisted at the 16:54 mark to give the Cavaliers a 1-0 lead. Virginia would hold Penn State off for the rest of the period and the Nittany Lions trailed 1-0 at intermission.

Virginia outshot Penn State 8-5 in the first half. Freshman goalie Brie Barraco (Allentown, Pa.) had four saves in the first half to keep the Nittany Lions close.

Penn State came out aggressively in the third period, forcing the ball down to Virginia's half of the field and setting up a couple shots and a penalty corner. Virginia goalle Lauren Hausheer kept the Lions out of the cage however and the game continued on at 1-0. Penn State was unable to break through the Cavalier defense throughout the third period and trailed by one heading into the final stanza.

The teams traded barbs early in the fourth period with each goalie standing strong to keep the one goal spread intact. Penn State's offensive pressure paid off with under five minutes to play. The Lion offense forced a penalty comer at the 55:30 mark and it led to the first goal for Penn State. Anna Simon (Hanau, Germany) took an assist from freshman Paityn Wirth (Thompsontown, Pa.) and found the back of the cage to tie the game at 1-1 at the 55:34 mark. Virginia, however, answered back just minutes later with a
