#### Starting Five

- The Buckeyes are 1,158-417 all-time when playing in the state of Ohio (.735) ... against Ohio teams, Ohio State is 237-79 (.749) all-time, regardless of location. The Buckeyes faced a pair of intrastate foes this season. Ohio State defeated Cincinnati Nov. 6 at Value City Arena (64-56) and then Kent State Nov. 25 at St. John Arena (W, 72-51). Ohio State is 179-30 vs. Ohio teams in Columbus (.856). In the state of Pennsylvania, Ohio State owns a record of 25-22 (.532). The Buckeyes last won in Pennsylvania Feb. 28, 2017, a 71-70 victory over Penn State.

- Three current Buckeyes were named Mr. Basketball in their respective states. Junior Kaleb Wesson was named Ohio Mr. Basketball as a senior at Westerville South High School ... freshman D.J. Carton was named Mr. Basketball in Iowa in 2019 as a senior at Bettendorf High School and freshman E.J. Liddell was named Illinois Mr. Basketball in both 2018 and 2019 after leading Belleville High School to back-to-back state titles.

- Andre and Kaleb Wesson are one of 16 sets of brothers playing in NCAA Division I this season and one of two sets in the Big Ten (Iowa, McCaffery) also have siblings on the roster.

- Ohio State has 59 players all-time with 1,000 or more career points, the ninth-most nationally and the most of any Big Ten school (research credit: Duke). Kaleb Wesson is the most recent Buckeye to reach the milestone with 1,051 career points over his career. He became the 37th Ohio State player all-time to reach 500 rebounds with nine vs. West Virginia Dec. 29. His 22 points vs. Wisconsin Jan. 3 put him over the 1,000-point mark.

- Ohio State will play before at least five sold out crowds at Value City Arena in 2020. The Wisconsin (19,049), Indiana (Feb. 1), Purdue (Feb. 15), Maryland (Feb. 23) and Michigan (March 1) games are sellouts. There is limited availability for Minnesota (Jan. 23), Rutgers (Feb. 12) and Illinois (March 5).

#### Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 2 nationally for the most home wins with a 171-31 (.847) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 11 with 158 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the third-most home victories with 186 wins over 220 games (186-34). The Buckeyes also have played the eighth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 148 (62 wins/11th) opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span.

- Ohio State is 61-19 all-time when games are sold out at Value City Arena. Ohio State is 53-16 in sold out games against the Big Ten, including a 20-11 record against ranked conference opponents. The last sellout at VCA was vs. Wisconsin Jan. 3, 2020 (L, 61-57).

- Ohio State is 1,700-1,098 all-time after an 12-5 start this season.

- In the first NCAA NET rankings of the year, released Dec. 16, Ohio State was rated the No. 1 team nationally after its 9-1 start. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 1 in the first NET rankings a year ago as well. This year (as of 1/15), Ohio State is 2-5 in Quad 1 games with a total of 12 Quad 1 (8) and Quad 2 (4) games remaining on the schedule.

- When the then-No. 5 Buckeyes tipped vs. the No. 6 Kentucky Wildcats Dec. 21 in Las Vegas, the Wesson family reached 300 games played as Buckeyes. Keith Wesson, who lettered for Ohio State from 1983-87, played in 115 games. Senior

Andre Wesson has appeared in 113 games while junior Kaleb Wesson has taken the court as a Buckeye 82 times. In 310 games played, the Wessons have scored 2,003 points for an average of 6.5 a game.

- In three seasons as Ohio State head coach, Chris Holtmann teams have made 10 or more 3s 21 times (15-6 rcd.). Ohio State made 10+ from distance five times in 2017-18 and posted a 4-1 record in those games. The Buckeyes were 5-5 in 2018-19 and are 6-0 this year when make 10+ 3-pointers.
- The Buckeyes have made 30 or more field goals seven times this year (7-0) after doing so three times a season ago (3-0). Chris Holtmann Ohio State teams have scored 30 or more FGs in 22 games during his tenure (21-1) after doing so 12 times in his first year (12-1). Ohio State has won its last nine games when reaching at least 30 FGs made.

### Kaleb Wesson Welcomed to Exclusive Club

Ohio State junior Kaleb Wesson has entered both the 1,000 career point and 500 career rebound club with 1,051 points and 547 boards. Wesson became the 29th Buckeye all-time with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career.

### The Ohio State vs. Penn State Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with the Nittany Lions 36-17. Ohio State owns a 19-5 record in Columbus and is 13-9 in State College. The teams have played on a neutral court seven times with the Buckeyes winning four. Andre Wesson has faced the Nittany Lions five times over his career, most of any Buckeye. He averages 8.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in the series. Younger brother Kaleb Wesson averages 11.2 points and 4.6 boards. Luther Muhammad contributes 17 points and 3.5 rebounds. As a ranked team, Ohio State is 19-7 vs. the Nittany Lions.

### Scouting Penn State

The Nittany Lions enter the game with the Buckeyes with a 12-5 record and a 2-4 slate in Big Ten Conference play. League wins have come at home vs. Maryland and vs. Iowa on a neutral court at the Palestra in Philadelphia. Minnesota, Ohio State and Rutgers won home games vs. the Nit-

tany Lions and Wisconsin won in State College. Penn State is led by senior Lamar Stevens with 16.1 points per game. He is followed by sophomore Myreon Jones (13.9 ppg.), junior Izaiah Brockington (10.5 ppg.) and senior Mike Watkins (10.2 ppg.). Watkins is the team leader on the boards with 8.3 a game.

### Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 828-734 against current league members. Chris Holtmann faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes in 2017-18. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs. conference foes. He is 30-28 vs. conference opponents in nine years as a head coach.

### 108 Years in Big Ten

Ohio State celebrated 108 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2020. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 108 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 29 NCAA Tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches

and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 55 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

### Noting the Nebraska Game

- The win over Nebraska gave the Buckeyes win number 1,700 over 121 seasons.
- The win over the Huskers gave the Buckeyes its 10th win in the state of Ohio this year. Ohio State has won at least 10 games in Ohio in each of the last 16 years and for the 56th time in history. The Ohio State record for consecutive seasons winning 10 or more games in the state of Ohio is 17 from 1978-1994.
- With the win over Nebraska, Chris Holtmann has defeated each Big Ten coach, including former Michigan coach John Beilein and Nebraska's Tim Miles, he has faced at least once during his Ohio State career. The only coach Holtmann has yet to face is first-year Michigan coach Juwan Howard. The Buckeyes take on the Wolverines in Ann Arbor Feb. 4 and then in Columbus March 1.

• All five starters scored in double digits. The last time five starters scored in double figures was at Indiana (2/23/18 2ot).

• The 38 points scored in the first half by the Buckeyes are the most since Ohio State tallied 45 in the second half vs. Southeast Missouri State Dec. 17.

• Six Buckeyes rejected at least one shot vs. the Huskers. The last time six Buckeyes recorded a block in the game was at Nebraska Feb. 20, 2016.

• Nebraska went the FT line just five times, hitting 3. The last time the Buckeyes sent an opponent to the foul line five or fewer times was against Samford Nov. 20, 2018 (4-5).

• With Andre and Kaleb Wesson's combined 24 points, the entire Wesson family, including Keith Wesson (1983-87), surpassed a collective 2,000 points (2,003). The trio have played in 310 games for the Buckeyes.

• The Buckeyes shot 30-for-55 (0.545) from the field, their highest since the game against SEMO (12/17/2019).

• Chris Holtmann remains undefeated against Nebraska, improving his all-time record to 3-0.

• Andre Wesson went 3-for-3 from the 3-point line in the first five minutes in the game to score the Buckeyes first nine points.

• With his 18 points, CJ Walker surpassed his previous season high of 11 against Purdue Fort Wayne (11/22/19).

• Kaleb Wesson recorded his 13th career double-double and seventh of the season. He finished with 13 points and 14 rebounds.

• K. Wesson moved to No. 31 (547) on the all-time rebounds list with 14 vs. Nebraska. He passed J.J. Sullinger (535) and Ron Sepic (543) vs. the Huskers. No. 30 Lenzelle Smith is up next with 551.

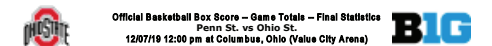
• Offensively, K. Wesson is No. 53 on the all-time scoring list with 1,051 after a 13-point outing vs. the Huskers. Jamie Skelton and Ken Johnson are tied for No. 51 with 1,055. Kam Williams is No. 50 with 1,057.

• His 14 rebounds are a career high. His previous high was 13 (3x) with his last time being against Wisconsin (1/3/20).

## The Last Time vs. Penn State

### No. 6 Ohio State 106, Penn State 74 (12/7/19)

**COLUMBUS** -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team ran past Penn State, 106-74, in its Big Ten opener at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since 2006. Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season with 28 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson totaled 15 points and five boards and Luther Muhammad and Duane Washington Jr. scored 14 apiece. Izaiah Brockington paced Penn State with 19 points, while Lamar Stevens, who fouled out with 13:26 remaining, scored 11. Ohio State held an 11-9 lead after a Mike Watkins jumper with 13:55 left to play in the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 9-0 run over the next 5:01 to push the advantage to 20-9 with 8:54 remaining. Brockington hit a pair of shots later in the half to cut the deficit to seven but a pair of D.J. Carton free throws in the waning seconds of the half gave Ohio State a 46-35 lead at the break. The Buckeyes then caught fire from long distance in the second half. With the Buckeyes up 60-50 with 13:26 remaining, Lamar Stevens, the Nittany Lions' leading scorer, fouled Ohio State's CJ Walker on a 3-0 and then picked up a technical for his fifth foul and the disqualification. Walker followed by making 3-of-4 from the line but Penn State answered right back with a 5-0 spurt of their own to make it a 63-55 game with 12:45 left to play.

The award is given to the organization's national player of the year selection.

### Carton Wins First B1G FOW

After helping the Buckeyes to a pair of wins over Southeast Missouri State and then vs. No. 6 Kentucky in Las Vegas, Ohio State freshman D.J. Carton was named the Big Ten's Co-Freshman of the week Dec. 23. ### Dials Returns to Ohio State Sidelines

Terence Dials, the 2006 Big Ten Player of the Year and 2015 inductee into the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame, was named the director of professional development with the men's basketball program, Chris Holtmann, head coach of the Buckeyes, announced Sept. 4. His duties will primarily include providing and arranging professional development and community service opportunities for the Buckeyes. Dials will work with the Eugene D. Smith Leadership Institute to arrange internships, mentors, job fairs and other personal and career growth initiatives for student-athletes. He also will provide academic support, oversight and mentoring.

### Buckeyes Earn NABC Academic Honor, Lane Named B1G Distinguished Scholar

The National Association of Basketball Coaches named the 2018-19 Buckeyes a winner of the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award after the squad posted a team GPA of 3.03 last year. It marks the second-consecutive year Chris Holtmann's team has earned the honor.

### Cincinnati Game Second Earliest Opener in Ohio State History

When Ohio State tipped vs. Cincinnati in the

2019-20 opener, the game was the second earliest opening date in Ohio State history. The Nov. 6 date with the Bearcats in Columbus was second only to the Nov. 5, 2004 opener, the first game of the Thad Matta era, vs. Towson State in the Guardian's Classic at Value City Arena. Ohio State won that game 74-53.

### Matta Enters Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame

Thad Matta, the all-time winningest coach in Ohio State history, was selected to enter the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame during a ceremony Sept. 6. The 13th coach in program history, Matta recorded 337 career wins, made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, five "Sweet Sixteens," three "Elite Eights" and two Final Fours over 13 seasons (2005-17).

### Kaleb Wesson Tests NBA Waters, Returns for Junior Year

Kaleb Wesson elected to enter his name into the 2019 NBA Draft process to gain feedback into his goal of becoming a professional basketball player. After going through the process he elected to return to Ohio State for his junior year. Wesson made the decision in late May.

### Sueing Selects Ohio State, Eligible in 2020-21

Justice Sueing joined the Ohio State program in May of 2019 following a transfer from the University of California. Sueing, a 6-foot, 6-inch forward from Honolulu, Hawaii, will have two years of eligibility with the Buckeyes after sitting out the 2019-20 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. Sueing played 31 games for the Golden Bears a season ago. He averaged 14.3 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting better than 78 percent from the foul line (129-165).

### Diebler Added to Coaching Staff

Jake Diebler, who spent three seasons with the Buckeyes as the team's video coordinator (2014-2016) was hired as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes after spending the last two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt. Diebler, older brother of Ohio State great Jon Diebler, is a 2009 graduate of Valparaiso. He was a standout high school player at Upper Sandusky (Ohio).

### Diallo Picks Ohio State

Ibrahima Diallo, a 6-foot, 10-inch center from Senegal, signed a letter of intent to play for Chris Holtmann and the Buckeyes in mid-April 2019. Diallo enters the 2019-20 season along with a stellar freshman class. He joins forwards Alonzo Gaffney and E.J. Liddell and guard D.J. Carton. Diallo played a season ago at Prolific Prep in California where he averaged 11 points, 11 rebounds and nearly four blocks a game.

### Buckeyes Enter 2019-20 Campaign with 20+ Wins in 14 of the Last 15 Seasons

Ohio State has 29 seasons with 20 or more wins and three with 30 or more. Holtmann has won at least 20 games in each of his two years at Ohio State and the Buckeyes have won 20 or more in 14 of the last 15 seasons.

Three of the four non-Big Ten games in December are outside Columbus (vs. North Carolina in Big Ten/ACC Challenge (W, 74-49), vs. Kentucky in CBSSports Classic (Las Vegas, W, 71-65) and vs. West Virginia (L, 67-59) in Cleveland Classic).
- Now in its sixth year, Ohio State again played in the CBSSports Classic. The event took place in

Las Vegas Dec. 21. The Buckeyes defeated then-No. 6 Kentucky (71-65) while North Carolina defeated UCLA.

- Villanova traveled to Ohio State Nov. 13. The game was part of The Gavitt Games, which pits members of the Big Ten vs. Big East opponents. The Buckeyes downed the No. 10 Wildcats 76-51.
- Two Big Ten Conference games were played in December after the league expanding to a 20-game, regular-season slate in 2018-19. Ohio State played Penn State in Columbus Dec. 7 (W, 106-74) and traveled to Minnesota Dec. 15 (L, 84-71).

and Nebraska) battle the Buckeyes twice during the regular season with three (Illinois, Purdue, Rutgers) traveling only to Columbus. Ohio State hits the road to face Iowa, Michigan State and Northwestern this year.

- Ohio State will play 19 regular-season games against 13 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2019. Fifteen games are scheduled vs. 2019 NCAA Tournament teams (Maryland-2, Minnesota-2, Michigan State-1, Michigan-2, Wisconsin-2, Villanova-1, Purdue-1, Cincinnati-1, Iowa-1, Kentucky-1, North Carolina-1) while four contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2019 NIT squads (Indiana-2, Nebraska-2).
- Every Ohio State game will be televised or streamed. CBS will feature the Buckeyes five times, FOX/FS1 will carry eight OSU games, ESPN Networks will broadcast nine games with BTN showing 10 games, which includes two BTN+ (Cedarville and Purdue Fort Wayne) games.

### Holtmann Era in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including three at Butler, Holtmann



### Roster Grows for 2020-21 Buckeyes

Chris Holtmann, now in his third year as the head coach of the Ohio State men's basketball team, announced the addition of two student-athletes to the program's roster for the 2020-21 season.

Eugene Brown III, a 6-6, 185-pound guard from Southwest Dekalb (Georgia) High School, and Zed Key, a 6-8, 230-pound forward from Long Island (New York) Lutheran High School, signed NCAA National Letters of Intent in early November.

Brown III was the first player from the class of 2020 to commit. Brown, a native of Decatur, Georgia, averaged 9.1 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.3 assists over his first three years of his high school career, despite a leg injury sidelining him for most of his junior season. In five games as a junior he averaged 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists.

"We are really excited about Eugene," Holtmann said. "He is a gifted perimeter player who has developed a great skill set thanks to many hours in the gym as a coach's son. He plays the game with the energy and competitiveness we want in our student-athletes."

Key, who hails from Brookville, New York, averaged 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds his junior season. He also was a part of the 2019 New York State Federation Class AA State Championship team (25-2), who defeated Chris The King, 51-31, last March. Key played in four games at the 2019 National Basketball Players Association Top 100 camp, averaging 13.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game.

"Zed is a great addition to our university and program," Holtmann said. "He plays the game with a high level of physicality and understanding of the game. He has been a part of championship teams in New York and it became clear early on in the recruiting process how important winning is to him."

became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach-of-the-year honors in the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career. Holtmann was named the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year, has won at least 20 games in each of his two seasons in Columbus, has taken the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and has won an NCAA game each season.

### Holtmann Reaches 50 Wins as a Buckeye

Chris Holtmann is working on 300 games as a head coach (285/171-114) and is off to an 12-5 start this year at Ohio State. He won game No. 50 as a Buckeye Nov. 22, 2019 in an 85-46 win over Purdue Fort Wayne at Value City Arena. Holtmann needed 74 games to reach 50 wins at

Ohio State finished 20-15 overall after the win vs. Iowa State and the loss to Houston in the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Gardner-Webb won 21 games in 2013 with Holtmann at the helm. Butler reached 23, 22 and 25 wins over the three seasons before Holtmann took over at Ohio State in 2017-18. Of Ohio State's 14 head coaches in the history of men's basketball, only Gary Williams and Thad Matta won 20 games in their first season in Columbus. The Buckeyes were 25-9 in 2017-18. Williams was 20-13 in 1987 and took the Buckeyes to the NCAA Tournament, where the team defeated Kentucky for its 20th win of the season before losing to Georgetown. Matta was 20-12 in 2005 but the Buckeyes were ineligible for postseason competition that year. The Buckeyes won their 20th game in the Big Ten Tournament over Penn State before ending the season with a loss to Wisconsin. Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach in history to win 20 regular-season games in his first year in Columbus. The 25 wins in 2017-18 is an Ohio State record for most wins by a first-year coach.

### Ohio State's 29 20-Win Seasons

The win over Iowa State in the opening round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament gave the Buckeyes win No. 20 for the 2018-19 season. The feat marked the 29th time in Ohio State men's basketball history the Buckeyes reached 20 victories in a season. The first was in 1950 when William H.H. Dye led the Buckeyes to a 22-4 record in his final of four seasons on the Ohio State sidelines. Fred Taylor was

the next coach in Columbus to guide Ohio State to the 20-win plateau with a 25-3 season in 1960, the year the Buckeyes reached and won the NCAA title game. Taylor led Ohio State to six 20-win seasons in his career, including a streak of four-consecutive from 1960-1963. Taylor's last 20-win campaign was in 1971. Eldon Miller led Ohio State to four 20-win campaigns from 1980-85 before Gary Williams coached two seasons with 20-13 records in 1987 and 1988. Randy Ayers's 1991 and 1992 seasons both ended with 20 or more wins with 27 and 26 respectively. The Thad Matta era (2005-2017) included 12-consecutive 20-win seasons from 2005-2016. Chris Holtmann has reached 20-plus wins in each of his seasons in Columbus to give the Buckeyes a total of 29 in Ohio State history.

### The Cincinnati Opener

Ohio State opened the 2018-19 season officially Nov. 7, 2018 at Cincinnati, the first meeting against the Bearcats on either team's campus since 1921 (Columbus/L, 33-17/Dec. 10, 1921) and the first time at Cincinnati since the 1920 season (Cincinnati/W, 35-13/Jan. 3, 1920). Ohio State earned a 64-56 win in the first game at renovated Fifth-Third Arena last year and is 8-4 all-time vs. the Bearcats after winning by the identical score, 64-56, Nov. 6 in Columbus. Three of the last six meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament. Cincinnati defeated the Buckeyes for the national championship in both 1961 and 1962. Ohio State defeated UC in the 2006 Wooden Tradition in Indianapolis (72-50) and then most recently in the 2012 NCAA East Regional Semifinals in Boston (81-66).

### Throwback Game at St. John Arena

Ohio State played Kent State as part of the 2019 Ohio State Classic at historic St. John Arena Nov. 25.

#### A few notes on the venue:

- Ohio State first played at St. John Arena during the 1956-57 season. The last season the Buckeyes called SJA their home was 1997-98. Ohio State began playing at its current home, Value City Arena, in 1998-99.
- Ohio State has an overall record of 433-151 (.741) at SJA, which includes a 7-0 record in games played at SJA since the end of the 1998 season.
- Ohio State defeated Cleveland State 89-62 Nov. 23, 2018. The Buckeyes had last played at SJA in 2010, an 85-60 win over Western Carolina (12/12/2010).
- The facility is named after former Ohio State director of athletics and men's basketball coach L.W. St. John.
- The first game played at SJA was against Butler (12/1/1956), a 98-82 win for the Buckeyes.
- Capacity is 13,276. The CSU game was a sellout.
- Since the Ohio State men's and women's basketball teams moved to Value City Arena, St. John has been the competition home for the men's and women's volleyball, wrestling, fencing and men's and women's gymnastics teams. Those teams moved out of SJA and into the Covelli Center on Ohio State's campus following the 2018-19 season.

# HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTSMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Gardner-Webb (2011-13).



Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaign with the Bulldogs. He earned the 2018 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award as well after a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 campaign and second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000). He was elected to the Taylor University Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2018.

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-American status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

### Countdown to 6,000,000 at VCA

Value City Arena at the Jerome Schottenstein Center has been the home of the Buckeyes for the last 22 years (1998-99 to present). The Buckeyes have played 380 games at the facility and have averaged 15,481 fans a game for a total of 5,882,780 fans. To reach 6,000,000 in attendance all-time, Ohio State needs to average 16,746 (117,220 total) over the seven games in 2020. Four remaining games are sold out (Indiana, Purdue, Maryland, Michigan) at 18,809 (games where students are in attendance). The Buckeyes need to average 13,995 over the three games that currently have tickets available (Minnesota, Rutgers and Illinois) to reach 6,000,000 in total attendance at Value City Arena all-time.

The Buckeye defense was the story of the opening half as Ohio State held a 42-14 lead after 20 minutes. After Ohio State scored the first eight points of the game, a Christian Jones 3-pointer got the Hatters on the board at the 16:37 mark of the opening half. The Buckeyes would then go on to score the next 20 points, holding Stetson scoreless over the next 10:40 before a Rob Perry free throw made it 28-4 with 5:57 remaining. Ohio State went on another run, this time a 14-4 spurt, to extend the lead to 42-8 with 1:21 left to play before Jones connected on a pair of 3-pointers late in the half to make it a 28-point game at the break. Nine Buckeyes scored in the opening 20 minutes, led by Kaleb Wesson with nine points, while Ohio State held the Hatters to 14.3 percent (4-for-28) shooting. Perry paced Stetson with seven points at the half.

**No. 10 Ohio State 85,**  
**Purdue Fort Wayne 46**  
**Nov. 22, 2019, Columbus**

**COLUMBUS** -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Purdue Fort Wayne, 85-46, at Value City Arena. With the win, which was head coach Chris Holtmann's 50th at the helm, the Buckeyes move to 5-0 on the year while the Mastodons drop to 2-5. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 15 points and seven boards while D.J. Carton added 13 and CJ Walker chipped in with 11 points and a game-high four steals as 11 Buckeyes found the scoring column. Marcus DeBerry scored 16 for Purdue Fort Wayne while Brian Patrick added 13. Ohio State scored the first five points of the game and held a 9-7 lead at the 16:36 mark of the first half after a DeBerry 3-pointer for the Mastodons. The Buckeyes followed with a 16-0 run over a 6:46 spurt to take a 25-7 advantage on a Duane Washington Jr. 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. Ohio State extended its lead to as many as 21 twice in the final three minutes of the first half before Purdue Fort Wayne scored the final four points of the half as the Buckeyes held a 42-25 lead at the break. Ohio State connected on 10 of its first 14 attempts from the field in the second half on its way to a 27-7 run and a 69-32 advantage with 9:27 remaining. The 3-point ball, including three in a three-minute spurt from Justin Ahrens, then pushed the Buckeye lead to a game-high 46 at 84-38 with 3:56 left to play as Ohio State came away with the convincing victory.

- Three players scored in double-digits for the Buckeyes: Kaleb Wesson (15), D.J. Carton (13) and CJ Walker (11).
- Ohio State's bench outscored Purdue Fort Wayne's bench 40-7. This is back-to-back games with 40-plus bench points.

**No. 10 Ohio State 71, Kent State 52**  
**Nov. 25, 2019, Columbus**

**COLUMBUS** -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team used a 17-0 second-half run to pull away from Kent State on its way to a 71-52 victory at St. John Arena. The Buckeyes' Kaleb Wesson totaled 17 points and six rebounds while Duane Washington Jr. went for 16 points, a team-high seven boards and three assists. Danny Pippen scored a game-high 19 points and eight rebounds while Antonio Williams scored 17 for the Golden Flashes. Kent State scored the first five points in a physical first half but the Buckeyes, up 14-13 with 9:37 remaining in the half, took control with a 19-6 run, capped by a D.J. Carton 3-pointer, over the next 7:36, to take a 33-19 lead with just over two minutes left to play. After an Williams jumper for the Golden Flashes and two free throws from Carton, an Anthony Roberts layup with four seconds remaining in the half trimmed the Buckeye lead to 35-23 at the break. A dunk by Wesson and a 3-pointer from Luther Muhammad pushed the Ohio State lead to a game-high 17 at 40-23 with 17:33 left to play but the Golden Flashes responded with a 3-pointer from Pippen and a three-point play from Philip Whittington to make it a 40-29 game with 16:44 remaining. Washington Jr. followed with a layup to push the lead back to 13 but Kent State connected on four of its next six attempts from deep as the Golden Flashes battled back to tie it at 48-48 with 10:30 left to play. However, Muhammad scored the tie five points and Carton followed with a highlight-reel layup as the Buckeyes took control with a 17-0 run spanning 6:35 for a 65-58 lead with 3:55 remaining. The Golden Flashes would get no closer than 15 the rest of the way.

- Ohio State improves its record to 237-79 versus teams from Ohio with a 71-52 win over Kent State.
- Four players scored in double-digits for Ohio State: Kaleb Wesson (17), Duane Washington Jr. (16), Luther Muhammad (13) and D.J. Carton (11).

No. 10 Ohio State 90, Morgan State 57 Nov. 29, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 10 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Morgan State, 90-57, at Value City Arena. Andre Wesson led Ohio State with 19 points and seven rebounds while Kaleb Wesson totaled 13 points and eight boards. Stanley Davis Jr. paced Morgan State with 13 points. Morgan State scored the first four points of the contest and held a 6-5 lead a little over two minutes into the game but Ohio State responded with a 14-2 run over 6:25 to take a 19-8 advantage with 11:31 remaining after three free throws from Andre Wesson. The Buckeyes then outscored the Bears 26-10 the remainder of the half, holding a 14-0 lead in points off turnovers, to take a 45-18 lead into the break. Ohio State held Morgan State at a distance after the break, with the Bears getting no closer than 24 at 55-31 with 15:50 left to play. Eleven Buckeyes scored in the final 20 minutes as Ohio State came away with the 33-point win. For the game, the Buckeyes held a 43-31 advantage on the boards, a 22-1 lead in points off turnovers and a 46-18 edge in bench points.

The Buckeyes scored 46 bench points.
The last time Ohio State scored 90 points was in a 90-70 win over Iowa (2/26/19).

No. 6 Ohio State 74, No. 7 North Carolina 49 Dec. 4, 2019, Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team used a dominant second half to go on the road to defeat No. 7 North Carolina 74-49 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge at the Dean Smith Center. Duane Washington Jr. led four Buckeyes in double figures with 18 points while E.J. Liddell came off the bench for a career-best 12 points. Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and nine boards while CJ Walker added 10 points. Cole Anthony paced North Carolina with 15 points while Brandon Robinson chipped in with nine. Ohio State struggled with turnovers in the opening half but took a 29-27 lead into the break. The Buckeyes came out of the half using a 10-3 spurt, capped by layups from Washington Jr. and Kyle Young, to take a 39-30 lead at the 16:49 mark but Anthony responded with a pair of 3-pointers to make it a three-point contest at 39-36 with 15:57 left to play. This time, Ohio State answered with a 15-4 run over the next 4:09, finished by a fast-break dunk by E.J. Liddell, to push its lead to 14 at 52-38 with 11:48 remaining. The Buckeyes then used another 14-0 run over 3:11 to put the game out of reach at 71-47 on a Young layup with 3:40 left in the contest. Ohio State shot 53.6 percent (15-for-28) from the field in the second half and held the Tar Heels to 17-for-62 (27.4 percent) from the field for the game.

Notes:

- The 8-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The 25-point margin of victory was the second-largest by an opponent at the Dean Smith Center. The largest margin of victory by an opponent over North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center was a 29-point margin by Duke in an 87-58 win in 2002.
The 27.4 field goal percentage was the lowest by the Tar Heels in the Dean Smith Center.
The 49 points were the third-fewest points by North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center.
Ohio State outscored the Tar Heels by 23 points (45-22) in the second half. The figure is the largest margin by which an opponent has outscored North Carolina in a half at the venue. The previous-highest mark was 22 set by Maryland in 1997 and Temple in 1988.
Ohio State held a 48-32 advantage on the boards, a 25-10 lead in bench points and 30-10 stronghold in points in the paint in the contest.
For the season, Ohio State's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench 244-97.
Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.0 points per game, despite them averaging 15.1 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Cole Anthony to 15 points on 4-for-15 from the field. Anthony came in averaging 20.7 points per game, the most of any freshman nationally. For the year, Ohio State is holding these opponents to 30.3 percent (30-for-99) from the field and 27.0 percent (10-for-37) from 3-point range.
Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Duane Washington Jr. (19), E.J. Liddell (12), CJ Walker (10) and Kaleb Wesson (10).

Game 9

No. 6 Ohio State 106, Penn State 74 Dec. 7, 2019, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- The No. 6 Ohio State men's basketball team ran past Penn State, 106-74, in its Big Ten opener at Value City Arena. The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark against a Big Ten opponent for the first time since 2006. Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season with 28 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson totaled 15 points and five boards and Luther Muhammad and Duane Washington Jr. scored 14 apiece. Izaiah Brockington paced Penn State with 19 points, while Lamar Stevens, who fouled out with 13:26 remaining, scored 11. Ohio State held an 11-9 lead after a Mike Watkins jumper with 13:55 left to play in the opening half but the Buckeyes went on a 9-0 run over the next 5:01 to push the advantage to 20-9 with 8:54 remaining. Brockington hit a pair of shots later in the half to cut the deficit to seven but a pair of D.J. Carton free throws in the waning seconds of the half gave Ohio State a 46-35 lead at the break. The Buckeyes then caught fire from long distance in the second half. With the Buckeyes up 60-50 with 13:26 remaining, Lamar Stevens, the Nittany Lions' leading scorer, fouled Ohio State's CJ Walker on a shot and then picked up a technical for his fifth foul and the disqualification. Walker followed by making 3-of-4 from the line but Penn State answered right back with a 5-0 spurt of their own to make it a 63-55 game with 12:45 left to play.

Notes:

- The 9-0 start for the Buckeyes is the best for Ohio State since the 2013-14 season when Ohio State opened the season 15-0.
The Buckeyes eclipsed the 100-point mark in a Big Ten game for the first time since a 104-69 victory over Penn State Jan. 5, 2006.
The 106 points are the most since Ohio State scored 107 against Purdue Fort Wayne Nov. 11, 2018.
Ohio State's 14 made 3-pointers and 30 made free throws are both season highs.
Ohio State has outscored its last two opponents by at least 20 points in the second half. The Buckeyes outscored Penn State by 21 points (60-39) after outscoring No. 7 North Carolina by 23 points (45-22).
Ohio State came in limiting its opponents' leading scorers to 10.7 points per game, despite them averaging 15.6 points per game for the season. The Buckeyes continued the trend, limiting Lamar Stevens to 11 points on 4-for-8 shooting. For the year, Ohio State is limiting these opponents to 31.7 percent (34-for-107) from the field and 27.5 percent (11-for-40) from 3-point range.
Four Buckeyes scored in double figures: Kaleb Wesson (28), Andre Wesson (15), Luther Muhammad (14) and Duane Washington Jr. (14).
Ohio State improved to 36-17 all-time against Penn State and 19-5 against the Nittany Lions in Columbus.
Luther Muhammad scored a season-best 14 points against the Nittany Lions.
Walker's seven assists tied his career high set three times, most recently against Villanova Nov. 13.
Kaleb Wesson notched his third double-double of the season, going for a season-high 28 points to go along with 10 boards.
Wesson made a career-high four 3-pointers.

## Game 10

### Minnesota 84, No. 3 Ohio State 71

#### Dec. 15, 2019, Minneapolis

**MINNEAPOLIS** -- The No. 3 Ohio State men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season, an 84-71 decision at Minnesota. D.J. Carton led Ohio State, which was playing without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr., with a career-high 19 points while E.J. Liddell scored a career-best 14 and Kaleb Wesson scored 12. Minnesota's Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35, including 28 in the second half, to go along with seven assists while Gabe Kalschauer scored 15 and Daniel Oturu went for 14 points and 13 boards. The contest was back-and-forth early with Ohio State using a Liddell jumper to take a 14-11 lead with 13:15 remaining in the first half. However, Minnesota responded with a 13-2 run over the next 6:00 to pull ahead 24-16 with 7:15 left to play. The Buckeyes cut the deficit to four at 27-23 on a Kaleb Wesson 3-pointer at the 3:49 mark but the Golden Gophers again answered with a run of their own, this time a 9-2 spurt, to go up 36-25 with 1:10 remaining before taking a 38-29 lead into the break. A Luther Muhammad made 3-pointer made it an eight-point game in the opening minute of the second half but Minnesota hit six of its next seven shots from the field, going on a 15-5 run to push the lead to a game-high 18 at 55-37 with 12:29 remaining. Ohio State scored the next six points to trim the deficit to 12 at 55-43 at the 10:15 mark but the Buckeyes would get no closer than nine the remainder of the way.

**Notes:**

- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures: D.J. Carton (19), E.J. Liddell (14) and Kaleb Wesson (12).
- With the loss, Ohio State drops to 87-58 all-time against the Golden Gophers. The Buckeyes are 39-32 in games played against the Golden Gophers in Minneapolis and 30-5 when ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 against Minnesota.
- Ohio State falls to 520-153 all-time when ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25. The Buckeyes are 342-78 when ranked in the Top 10 and 42-10 when ranked No. 3 nationally.
- The Buckeyes fall to 39-67 all-time in Big Ten road openers.
- Ohio State was playing the game without second-leading scorer Duane Washington Jr. (rib soreness), who was averaging 11.4 points per game.
- Minnesota's 84 points, 31 made field goals and 15 made free throws were opponent season highs against the Buckeyes.
- The Golden Gophers' Marcus Carr scored a game-high 35 points, marking the first time an opponent eclipsed the 30-point mark against the Buckeyes since Penn State's Tony Carr scored 30 Feb. 15, 2018.
- Chris Holtmann falls to 2-1 all-time against Minnesota.
- Holtmann dropped his first December Big Ten contest and now sits 5-1 in such games.
- D.J. Carton scored a career-high 19 points on 6-for-12 shooting.
- E.J. Liddell went for a career-best 14 points while tying his career-high five rebounds.
- Also blocked two shots and recorded two steals.
- Andre Wesson made the start against the Golden Gophers, his first since the season-opener against Cincinnati. Wesson suffered an eye injury in that contest and was forced to miss the following two games.
- Kaleb Wesson scored 12 points, marking his ninth-consecutive game scoring in double figures.

### No. 5 Ohio State 80, SEMO 48

#### Dec. 17, 2019, Columbus

**COLUMBUS** -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team topped Southeast Missouri, 80-48 Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fourth double-double of the season with 18 points and 10 rebounds while Andre Wesson scored 14, Kyle Young went for 10 points and nine boards and D.J. Carton totaled 10 points, five boards and five assists. DQ Nicholas and Isaiah Gable each scored 10 for the Redhawks. The Buckeyes battled back from a sluggish start to take a 35-26 lead at the break. Southeast Missouri held a 16-12 lead after an Isaiah Gable 3-pointer with 9:39 remaining in the half before Ohio State went on a 13-1 spurt over the next 4:01 to take a 25-17 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup at the 4:58 mark. The Redhawks cut the lead to five twice in the final two minutes but the Buckeyes' CJ Walker scored the final four points of the half as Ohio State took a nine-point advantage into the break. The Buckeyes' lead stood at 45-30 after a pair of Nicholas free throws with 14:47 remaining before Ohio State went on a 14-0 run, spurred on by a 3-point play from Andre Wesson, a 3-pointer from Kaleb Wesson and a pair of 3s from D.J. Carton, to take a commanding 59-30 advantage with 11:40 left to play. Ohio State then pushed its lead to a game-high 38 at 78-40 with 3:17 remaining after a pair of Andre Wesson 3-pointers as the Buckeyes picked up their 10th win of the season.

## Game 12

### No. 5 Ohio State 71, No. 6 Kentucky 65

#### Dec. 21, 2019, Las Vegas

**LAS VEGAS** -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team held off No. 6 Kentucky for a 71-65 victory in the CBS Sports Classic at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. D.J. Carton led a balanced Buckeye attack with 15 points while Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and eight rebounds and Kyle Young totaled 10 points and six boards. Nate Sestina paced Kentucky with 17 points while Tyrese Maxey went for 15 points and six rebounds. Ashton Hagans scored 14 points while dishing out a game-high nine assists for the Wildcats. Both teams shot at least 50 percent from the field in a back-and-forth opening half as neither team held a lead of more than four points. A hookshot from Wesson followed by a pair of free throws from Young gave the Buckeyes a 6-2 advantage at the 16:34 mark but the Wildcats battled back, taking a 19-15 lead on a 3-pointer by Sestina with 10:32 remaining in the half. However, Ohio State regained its advantage at 22-21 on a Carton layup with 8:30 left to play, pushing it to four twice in the final minutes of the half before another Sestina 3-pointer cut the Buckeye lead to 37-36 at the break. Sestina hit his first three from deep in the second half, moving to 5-for-8 from 3-point range for the game, to keep the Wildcats in it at 45-44 with 14:11 left to play, but the Buckeyes scored the next six points over the next 3:24 to push their lead a game-high seven at 51-44 with 10:47 left to play.

**Notes:**

- With the victory against the Wildcats, Ohio State earned its third victory against an *Associated Press* Top 10 team this season, marking the first time Ohio State had won three such games since the 2012-13 season. The Buckeyes defeated Michigan State twice and Indiana once in that campaign.
- With Andre and Kaleb Wesson each appearing in the game against the Wildcats, members of the Wesson family have combined to appear in 300 career games for Ohio State. Andre has appeared in 108 career games while Kaleb has played in 77 contests. Their father, Keith, played in 115 career games for the Buckeyes from 1983-87.
- Three Buckeyes scored in double figures while seven scored at least seven points against the Wildcats.
- Ohio State held a 33-25 lead on the boards in the contest.
- The Buckeyes connected on 22-of-44 attempts from the field against the Wildcats. The contest marked the fifth time this season Ohio State shot at least 50 percent from the field.
- The Buckeyes finished 21-for-27 from the free throw line while Kentucky went 8-for-13 from the charity stripe. The game marked the sixth time this season Ohio State made at least as many free throws as its opponents attempted.
- Ohio State improves to 10-11 all-time against Kentucky and 39-35 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference.
- The game marked head coach Chris Holtmann's first against the Wildcats.
- D.J. Carton scored 15 points on 5-for-6 from the field.
- Duane Washington Jr. has connected on at least one 3-pointer in each of his last nine games.
- Kaleb Wesson went for 10 points and eight rebounds, scoring in double figures for his 11th-consecutive game.

**CLEVELAND** -- The No. 2 Ohio State men's basketball team fell to No. 22 West Virginia, 67-59, Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse in Cleveland. Kaleb Wesson led Ohio State with 17 points to go along with nine boards while Duane Washington Jr. scored 12 and Luther Muhammad and CJ Walker scored 10 apiece. Miles McBride went for a game-high 21 points for the Mountaineers while Chase Harler poured in 10. The Buckeyes got out to an early lead in a tightly-contested first half but were never able to push the advantage to more than four before a Harler 3-pointer gave the Mountaineers their second lead of the contest with 7:38 remaining in the opening period. With the game tied at 24-all with 6:19 left to play, Ohio State went on a 13-4 spurt over the next 5:17 to regain the lead at 37-28 with 1:02 remaining before a Sean McNeil 3-pointer trimmed the Buckeye advantage to 37-31 at the break. The Mountaineers came out of the break on a 10-3 run, using a 3-pointer and a jumper from McBride, to take a 41-40 lead with 13:28 remaining. West Virginia then pushed its lead to 52-47 on a 3-point play by Jermaine Haley with 8:38 left to play but the Buckeyes answered right back, using four free throws from Kaleb Wesson and a 3-pointer from Andre Wesson to regain the lead at 54-53 at the 4:40 mark. However, the Buckeyes missed five of their next six shots as West Virginia went on an 8-0 run over the next 4:43 to take a 61-54 lead with 57 seconds left to play. Kaleb Wesson followed with a 3-pointer to trim the deficit to 61-57 and the Buckeyes forced a turnover on the ensuing inbound play but a Washington Jr. 3-pointer rimmed out and Kaleb Wesson's follow-up layup was blocked as the Mountaineers came away with the win.

### Wisconsin 61, No. 5 Ohio State 57 Jan. 3, 2020, Columbus

**COLUMBUS** -- The No. 5 Ohio State men's basketball team dropped a 61-57 decision to Wisconsin at Value City Arena. Kaleb Wesson notched his fifth double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 boards while Duane Washington Jr. added 18. Nate Reuvers led Wisconsin with 17 points and nine rebounds while Kobe King poured in 13. Ohio State raced out to an early 7-0 lead on a Kaleb Wesson layup with 16:33 remaining but the Buckeyes missed six of their next seven shots as Wisconsin trimmed the deficit to 9-8 on a King jumper with 11:22 remaining in the half. The Buckeyes held a 23-19 advantage after a pair of Andre Wesson free throws with 2:06 left to play but the Badgers went on a 10-2 run the rest of the way, capped by 3-pointers from Trevor Anderson and Aleem Ford, to take 29-25 lead into the break. Ohio State trailed 31-28 less than a minute into the second half before going on a 10-0 run over a 2:21 spurt to take a 38-31 lead with 16:58 left to play. The Buckeye lead remained at six at 45-39 with 9:19 left to play but the Badgers pulled back even with an 8-2 run over 2:28 to knot the score at 47-all with 6:51 remaining. The Buckeyes led a 51-49 advantage at the under-4 timeout with 3:47 to go but Wisconsin scored 12 of the next 15 points over the next 3:44 to gain a commanding 61-54 lead in the final seconds before a Washington Jr. 3-pointer made it a four-point game.

### No. 12 Maryland 67, No. 11 Ohio State 55 Jan. 7, 2020, College Park

**COLLEGE PARK, Md.** -- The No. 11 Ohio State men's basketball team fell to No. 12 Maryland, 67-55, at XFINITY Center in College Park. Kaleb Wesson led the Buckeyes with 15 points while Andre Wesson and D.J. Carton scored 14 apiece. Anthony Cowan Jr. poured in 20 for the Terrapins while Jalen Smith went for 11 points and seven rebounds and Darryl Morsell scored 10. Ohio State ran out to an 8-0 lead, limiting Maryland to 0-for-5 from the field with three turnovers before Eric Ayala hit a free throw at the 14:33 mark to make it an 8-1 contest. The Terrapins scored 11 of the next 14 points on their way to their first lead of the game at 12-11 after a Serrel Smith Jr. 3-pointer with 9:57 remaining in the half. After holding a 19-17 advantage with 4:17 left to play, Maryland went on a 9-3 spurt to increase the advantage to 28-20 with 2:39 remaining before a CJ Walker jumper in the final minute made it a 28-22 contest at the half. A 3-pointer and a layup by Andre Wesson trimmed the Maryland lead to 31-29 with 18:15 left to play but the Buckeyes missed their next 12 shots from the field as the Terrapins went on a 10-2 run to extend their advantage to 41-31 after a Cowan Jr. 3-pointer with 12:58 remaining. Maryland pushed its lead to a game-high 12 at 51-39 at the 8:49 mark and the Buckeyes were unable to narrow the deficit to fewer than seven the remainder of the way. Ohio State held a 17-6 advantage on the offensive boards but were unable to overcome a difficult shooting night, finishing 21-for-67 (31.3 percent) from the field and 5-for-27 (18.5 percent) from long distance. The Terrapins shot 45.7 percent (21-for-46) from the field and 44.4 percent (8-for-18) from 3-point range.

Indiana raced out to an early 13-5 lead on a Phinisee 3-pointer at the 16:40 mark but Andre Wesson scored the next five to make it 13-10 contest with 15:52 remaining. The Hoosiers then pushed their lead to nine at 25-16 on a Green layup with 9:57 left to play in the half but Ohio State would hold Indiana without a field goal the rest of the way (9:57), going on an 18-6 run to take a 34-31 lead into the break. The Hoosiers scored the first eight points of the second half, taking a 39-34 lead with 16:44 remaining but the Buckeyes battled back to knot the score at 40-all on an E.J. Liddell layup at the 12:21 mark. However, after Ohio State took a 45-43 lead on a Carton 3-pointer with 10:24 left to play, Indiana went on a 10-0 run to regain a 53-45 advantage with 7:57 remaining before coming away with the 12-point win.

COLUMBUS -- The No. 21 Ohio State men's basketball team picked up an 80-68 victory over Nebraska at Value City Arena. C.J. Walker led a season-high six Buckeyes in double figures with 18 points to go along with five boards and four assists while Kaleb Wesson posted his seventh double-double of the year with 13 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. D.J. Carton went for 13 points and five assists while Andre Wesson scored 11 and Kyle Young and E.J. Liddell chipped in the 10 apiece. Thorir Thorbjarnarson led Nebraska with 15 points and six boards while Cam Mack, Yvan Ouedraogo and Jervy Green each scored 10. After Nebraska scored the first four points of the game, Ohio State responded with a 9-0 run on three 3-pointers by Andre Wesson, to take a 9-4 advantage with 15:51 to play in the half. Ohio State extended its lead to 16 when a Justin Ahrens 3-pointer made it 36-20 with under two minutes left in the half before taking a 38-25 lead into the break. Ohio State pushed the lead to 46-28 on a 3-pointer from Carton with 18:17 left to play but the Huskers were able to come back, trimming the Buckeye advantage to 56-43 on a Thorbjarnarson 3-pointer with 11:54 remaining. However, the Buckeyes connected on four of their next six shots from the field, including a pair of Walker 3-pointers, to use a 12-0 spurt take a commanding 68-43 lead to put the contest out of reach with 8:25 left to play.

Notes:

- The win over Nebraska gave the Buckeyes win number 1,700 over 121 seasons.
With the win over Nebraska, Chris Holtmann has defeated each Big Ten coach, including former Michigan coach John Beilein and Nebraska's Tim Miles, he has faced at least once during his Ohio State career. The only coach Holtmann has yet to face is first-year Michigan coach Juwan Howard.

All five starters scored in double digits. The last time five starters scored in double figures was at Indiana (2/23/18 2ot).
The 38 points scored in the first half by the Buckeyes are the most since Ohio State tallied 45 in the second half vs. Southeast Missouri State Dec. 17.
Six Buckeyes rejected at least one shot vs. the Huskers. The last time six Buckeyes recorded a block in the game was at Nebraska Feb. 20, 2016.
Nebraska went the FT line just five times, hitting 3. The last time the Buckeyes sent an opponent to the foul line five or fewer times was against Samford Nov. 20, 2018 (4-5).
With Andre and Kaleb Wesson's combined 24 points, the entire Wesson family, including Keith Wesson (1983-87), surpassed a collective 2,000 points (2,001). The trio have played in 310 games for the Buckeyes.
The Buckeyes shot 30-for-55 (0.545) from the field, their highest since the game against SEMO (12/17/2019).
Andre Wesson went 3-for-3 from the 3-point line in the first five minutes in the game to score the Buckeyes first nine points.
With his 18 points, CJ Walker surpassed his previous season high of 11 against Purdue Fort Wayne (11/22/19).
