STARTING 5

Saturday's game is designated as the annual Penn State Dance Marathon (THON) game with all proceeds from \$5 single-game student tickets benefiting the THON organization of the student's choice.

The year-long efforts of THON, the largest student-run philanthropy in the world, culminate in an annual 46-hour dance marathon Feb. 21-23 in the BJC. THON has raised more than \$168 million dollars and helped more than 4,000 families since 1973.

Penn State lost a rare game, only the second in the last three seasons, when it held an opponent to a field goal percentage of less than 40 percent as Minnesota shot 38.3 percent.

PSU also lost its first game of the season when it had fewer turnovers than its opponent (10-1) with a single-game season low six miscues.

Lamar Stevens was named one of 30 candidates for the 2019-20 Senior CLASS Award for notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Ten finalists will be announced in February.

LAST TIME OUT

LIONS EDGED 75-69 IN TOUGH ROAD BATTLE AT MINNESOTA
Penn State battled Minnesota, but lost a tough Big Ten road game 75-69. Three Nittany Lions scored in double figures with Seth Lundy and Myreon Jones each with 15 points and Lamar Stevens 14. Lundy's 15 points in his first career start were a career high.

Golden Gophers Marcus Carr (27) and Daniel Oturu (26) combined for 53 points. Oturu had 14 rebounds for a double-double.

The second half bore little resemblance to the first. The Nittany Lions shot 60 percent in the first with 18 field goals and zero turnovers for a two-point lead, 46-44 at the half. Neither team shot well in the second with Minnesota at 32.3 percent and Penn State at 24.1.

Penn State scored on its first five possessions after the half to go up 56-48. Minnesota chipped away at the lead, getting second-chance points and converting free throws. Oturu tied the game at 59 at 10:50 and then Alihan Demir's layup gave the Golden Gophers their first lead, 61-59, since the 7:08 mark of the first half.

The Nittany Lion offense struggled with an 11-minute stretch without a field goal, with three points off free throws. Penn State remained without a basket until Myreon Jones scored at the 5:28 mark. Despite the scoring woes, PSU was down only three, 64-61.

Oturu scored the next seven points for Minnesota to extend the lead to 71-64 with 1:52 remaining and the Gophers went back up by 10 before Izaiah Brockington made two free throws and Curtis Jones Jr. knocked in a 3-pointer to bring the score to 74-69 with 17 seconds left. The Nittany Lion defense locked in to gain additional offensive possessions, but an Oturu free throw gave UM the 75-69 final.

Minnesota had a 22-11 advantage on the boards at the break and dominated on the boards in the second half for a 48-32 tally. Penn State had a season-low six turnovers and had 19 points from Brockington, Curtis Jones Jr., and Mike Watkins off the bench.

STEVENS ON KARL MALONE WATCH LIST

Lamar Stevens was named as one of 20 national players on the 2020 Karl Malone Power Forward Watch List as announced by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The Big Ten Conference's leading scorer and rebounder, Stevens averaged 19.9 points per game and 7.7 rebounds per game and earned All-Big Ten Conference honors last season. Stevens also earned pre-season All-Big Ten Conference team accolades.

New this year, Nittany Lion fans can participate in the voting for Stevens at www.hoophallawards.com.

Named after Class of 2010 Hall of Famer and two-time NBA Most Valuable Player Karl Malone, the honor recognizes the top power forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee of college basketball personnel determined the list of 20 candidates.

"To be considered for the Karl Malone Power Forward Award is a great honor," said Stevens. "He was not only a tremendous individual player, but his teammates and coaches could count on him as a leader on and off the court. I want to show that same level of commitment to Penn State, my teammates and coaches, and to the game of basketball."

POINTS RISING

Just one of the indicators of Penn State's increase in its offensive output was the setting of the program's record for points scored overall (2,833) and in the Big Ten (1,297) in 2017-18, with the Nittany Lions' breaking their own league scoring record from 2016-17.

The 2017-18 points per game average of 74.7 (at season's end) was the highest since the 2000-01 season (76.8), highest under Chambers, and a 12.9-point difference from Chambers' first season in 2011-12. The program record is 78.7 ppg, set in the 1954-55 season.

BACK-TO-BACK LESS THAN 60

In its final two games of 2019, Penn State held back-to-back opponents, Central Connecticut and Cornell, to less than 60 points. The Nittany Lions have accomplished this feat 11 times since the start of the 2011-12 season.

Both the 2017-18 and 2015-16 teams had three such back-to-back dominating defensive performances, each with two less-than-60-point pair during nonconference play and one set of opponents during the Big Ten regular season.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

In 2018-19, the Nittany Lions kept 25 of their 32 opponents below their scoring averages (entering the game), holding 13 teams below their average by double digits. Two teams were held 20 points below their scoring averages.

Penn State retains that defensive edge in 2019-20, forcing 14.76 turnovers per game, the best mark in the Big Ten. Twelve teams during the season have been held below their respective scoring averages, not including UMES in the season opener, and 11 of the 17 opponents have been held to 70 points or less per game.

Mike Watkins had 16 rebounds in Penn State's win over Syracuse and, of that season-best total, 11 were on the offensive end. He became only the second Nittany Lion to record double-figures in offensive rebounds in the last 17 years. Aaron Johnson had 11 offensive and 13 defensive for 24 total vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 15, 2004.

ON THE BOARDS

Penn State's hallmarks are defense and rebounding and the Nittany Lions have outrebounded nine of opponents so far this season. Penn State is 9-0 in those games, and recorded an equal total in one contest for a +1.9 rebound margin.

The Nittany Lions recorded a positive rebound margin at +2.1 for all games in 2018-19, the fifth time in eight seasons. The 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons had the top two margins in back-to-back years in the Chambers era.

ANOTHER TOP SPOT

Watkins' 2017-18 season field goal percentage of 68.5 (146-213) also gave him the top spot on the Nittany Lions' season percentage chart. He now owns three of the top-10 single-season marks in Penn State history.

He grabbed another top-10 single-season listing, now tied at No. 5 at 60.3 percent thanks in part to a 7-8 performance vs. Rutgers, making his first seven shots. His rookie year percentage of 59.0 ranks eighth.

MIKE SWAT-KINS

Senior Mike Watkins, who stands second behind Calvin Booth on the Nittany Lions' all-time blocked shot list, hit the 200 career mark with his first block in the season opener vs. Maryland Eastern Shore, then added six more for seven total that night. He has 253, which currently ranks first among the NCAA's Division I active career leaders.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE ABOVE NATIONAL AVERAGE

The NCAA's annual graduation rates study of institutions across the nation revealed Penn State student-athletes at the University Park campus earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 91 percent to break the school's all-time record of 90, which was previously set in the 2010, 2017 and 2018 NCAA reports. Nittany Lion students posted a 91 percent graduation rate compared to the 88 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2009-10 through the 2012-13 academic year.

Penn State student-athletes have delivered a Graduation Success Rate in the 88-91 percent range during each of the past 13 NCAA reports, improving from 88 percent in the 2015 report, to 89 percent in 2016, to 90 percent in 2017 and 2018, and a record-breaking 91 percent figure in 2019.

Men's Basketball was among the 18 Nittany Lion teams at or above the Division I sport average and one of 12 squads that posted a Graduation Success Rates at least five points higher than the national average for their sport (90 to 83, +7). For the 10th consecutive year, the Penn State football (86 percent compared to 78 percent), Nittany Lion basketball (90 to 83) and Lady Lion basketball (92 to 91) teams all earned four-year Graduation Success Rates higher than the national average for their respective sports.

The four-year average for University Park students was 85 percent, exceeding the 66 percent rate for all students nationwide by 19 points.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Participating in sports has been a big part of the families of eight Nittany Lions who have had either parents or siblings compete at the collegiate level. Three sons followed in their fathers' footsteps on the hardwood: Izaiah Brockington (Antoine, Copin State); Myles Dread (Aaron, Millersville) and Lamar Stevens (Lou, Widener). Seth Lundy's older brother, Xavier, played basketball at Rider.

Grant Hazle's sister, Madeline, completed a four-year career as a member of Wisconsin's women's swimming team in 2017. Both of Curtis Jones Jr.'s parents were student-athletes at Howard as Curtis Sr. played football, and mother, Tara (Irving), played for the Bison women's tennis team. Patrick Kelly's late father, Pat, was a member of Syracuse's 1987 undefeated football team and then played in the NFL.

Four members of Kyle McCloskey's immediate family were involved in athletics including three Nittany Lion letterwinners. Father, Mike, was a tight end for Penn State (1979-82) and played on the 1982 national championship team before continuing his career in the NFL. Kyle's mother competed in track and field and his sister, Megan, was also a member of the Nittany Lion track and field team. Another sister, Kiernan, was a four-year letterwinner in basketball at Lehigh.

As Patrick Chambers challenges his Nittany Lion student-athletes to get better each and every day, he also challenges himself daily to become a better coach and leader. Chambers has spent the last eight years at Penn State establishing a culture of teamwork and excellence, supported by pillars of accountability, faith, humility, gratitude, and passion that is built on a foundation of a positive attitude.

No one could set higher expectations for Nittany Lion basketball than Chambers himself. Competing for Big Ten championships is just one of his many goals, and the journey has produced several "firsts" and "bests" for this Penn State program.

En route to seven wins in their last 10 conference games in 2018-19, the Nittany Lions won five contests in February, the most in that month since the 1997-98 season. Chambers has now compiled 127 victories in his eight seasons at Penn State to rank fifth all-time in coaching wins, the most in any eight-year span in the Big Ten era.

Those victories are celebrated, as is the commitment Chambers makes to the Coaches vs. Cancer mission and the organization's long-time affiliation with the Penn State basketball program.

At the 2019 Final Four, Chambers was honored with the Coaches vs. Cancer Collegiate Champion Award and he accepted the award on behalf of the local committee members, volunteers and sponsors who helped make Coaches vs. Cancer of Penn State one of the top chapters in the nation. CVC-Penn State surpassed the \$3 million mark for net funds raised in fall 2018 with continued support for those in the Centre Region affected by cancer.

Milestones on the court were achieved as well, as the Penn State basketball program took a big step in the pursuit of consistent, sustainable success in 2017-18.

By the end of December, the Nittany Lions reached double-digits in wins and in January, the Nittany Lions stepped into the spotlight, defeating No. 13 Ohio State at Value City Arena, one of only two teams in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2017-18.

The relentless attitude the Nittany Lions possess is paying off: Penn State defeated three top-20 ranked opponents in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever. The 2017-18 season included a 23-point win over a top-10 team, the largest margin of victory over a ranked team in program history. The crowd, unsurprised by the big win at the BJC, swept onto the court to celebrate with the Nittany Lions.

Penn State racked up nine Big Ten Conference wins, the most, to date, in the Chambers era by the end of February 2018. A week later, Penn State picked up its 20th and 21st wins, the latter coming at the earliest point ever for the Nittany Lions. Chambers added those two wins in the 2018 Big Ten Tournament, with a total of five hard-fought Big Ten tournament wins in his tenure, tied with Ed DeChellis for the most by a Penn State coach.

Playing their best basketball in March, Chambers' squad registered seven wins against only one loss and won the National Invitation Tournament title. Penn State defeated teams from the Atlantic Coast, Atlantic 10, Big East, Pac-12 and Southeastern conferences with an average scoring margin of 10.4 points per game in NIT contests.

Dozens of records were broken and the increase in offensive production saw Penn State score 70 points or more in 29 games, while the stalwart defense, a Chambers' hallmark, frustrated opponents. Fourteen teams in 2017-18 failed to score more than 60 points against the Nittany Lions.

Individual records were rewritten as well, as Shep Garner broke the 23-year-old Big Ten single-season record for 3-pointers with 120 and etched his name in the Penn State yearbook for both the single-season and career mark. Tony Carr became the first Penn State men's sophomore to reach the 1,000-point career mark with Lamar Stevens becoming the second to achieve that milestone.

A Philly native, Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, and has poured his

passion and energy into building the Nittany Lion program. On Feb. 12, 2019, Penn State knocked off No. 6 Michigan in the Bryce Jordan Center and Chambers earned his 122nd win at Penn State, for fifth on the program's all-time win list.

Chambers has sent Reaves, Carr, Garner, Frazier, Newbill and numerous other players into the professional ranks. Carr was the first Nittany Lion drafted since 1999. Frazier (2009-14) an NBA veteran, is now with the Detroit Pistons, and Newbill (2013-15) signed a new contract to play for the National Basketball League's Cairns Taipans.

AT BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Chambers came to Penn State after two years at Boston University, where in 2010-11 he led the Terriers to the America East Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in more than a decade. He posted a 42-28 record, becoming the only coach in BU history to earn 20 wins in each of his first two seasons and the fastest in program history to win a conference championship.

AT VILLANOVA

A native of Newtown Square, Pa., Chambers previously played for and coached with two of the nation's most successful college coaches. From 2004-09, he was a member of Wright's staff at Villanova, serving as associate head coach in 2008-09. He helped the Wildcats earn four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and advance to the 2009 NCAA Final Four. Chambers played for Magee at Philadelphia University (formerly Philadelphia Textile), helping Magee become college basketball's all-time victories leader (941) and a 2011 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee.

During Chambers' five seasons on Wright's Villanova staff, he was instrumental in helping lead the Wildcats to a 126-45 record (.737), including the then-single-season win record of 30-8 in 2008-09. In 2008, Chambers helped lead the Wildcats to the 2009 NCAA Final Four, a first in 24 years, and saw Villanova advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth time in its five NCAA Tournament appearances.

AT PHILADELPHIA

Chambers joined the NCAA Division II Philadelphia University's basketball team as a walk-on in 1990 and went on to have an outstanding career under Magee. He became the team's starting point guard, earning first-team All-ECAC honors, and helped lead the Rams to four NCAA Division II Sweet 16 appearances and two Elite Eight appearances. He still holds the school record for career assists with 709.

THE CHAMBERS FAMILY

The Chambers family is well represented at Penn State basketball games. Chambers and his wife, Courtney, have four children, Grace, Ryan, Caitlin and Patrick and three of Chambers' 11 siblings are Penn State graduates – brothers, Chris and Joe, and a sister, Megan, who resides in State College.

STEVENS LEADS SIX LIONS IN DOUBLE FIGURES WITH 17

Six Nittany Lions scored in double figures in the 2019-20 season opener with an 84-46 win over Maryland Eastern Shore. Lamar Stevens had a team-best 17 points on 50-percent shooting from the field and Mike Watkins posted his 27th career double-double with 11 rebounds on 5-of-6 shooting and a game-high 12 rebounds.

Penn State extended a 37-17 halftime lead with a 22-5 run over the first seven minutes of the second half. That stretch included eight field goals on nine attempts from the field. PSU shot 59.3 percent for the half and finished the night at 50 percent (29-59). Defensively, the Nittany Lions held the Hawks to only 33.3 percent shooting for the game.

The Nittany Lions continued with a stout defense, relentless rebounding and strong shooting in the second half. Penn State forced 19 turnovers and made eight of its 12 three pointers in the second stanza to cruise to the win. For the game, Penn State had a 42-32 rebounding advantage.

Watkins was dominant on both ends of the floor. He registered his 200th block of his career in the first half and added six more for seven on the night, his highest blocked shot total since Dec. 4, 2017 vs. Wisconsin. He was not called for any personal fouls.

Penn State opened the game on a 9-0 run and led the Hawks 20-12 midway through the first half. Stevens and Izaiah Brockington combined for 11 points over a three-minute span to help Penn State open up the game and take a 33-14 lead.

AJ Cheeseman had a team-best nine points for the Hawks and Gabriel Gyamfi and Glen Anderson each had four rebounds.

Penn State downed Wagner, 91-64 for its second-straight double-digit margin victory. Five Nittany Lions scored in double figures in the win led by Myreon Jones' season-high 14 points.

Lamar Stevens added 13 points and had six rebounds in 24 minutes of action. Seth Lundy and Izaiah Brockington had 12 each with all 12 of Lundy's and 10 of Brockington's points coming in the second half. Jamari Wheeler scored 10 points and finished his career best with two 3-point field goals.

Mike Watkins paced Penn State with eight boards and Lundy grabbed seven.

The two teams traded baskets in the first half with both teams shooting 38 percent and were even on 3-point field goals at four each. The 37-30 Nittany Lion lead at the half was courtesy of one extra field goal and five free throws.

Penn State went on a 12-1 run out of the half to go up 49-31 with baskets from four different Nittany Lions. The second half saw a 54-point total for PSU, including seven treys, and a 54.8 field goal percentage.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions forced 18 turnovers and had nine steals with a game-high three by Wheeler.

SECOND-HALF SURGE LEADS LIONS TO 98-70 WIN

A strong second half by Penn State secured its fourth win of the season with a 98-70 win over Bucknell. Lamar Stevens poured in a season-high 27 points, including 21 of the Nittany Lions' 53 second-half points to lead the charge.

Stevens and Mike Watkins went a combined 20-28 from the field in the victory and Penn State benefitted from 60 percent shooting from the field and 58 points in the paint to take control of the game.

Watkins finished with 18 points and grabbed five rebounds and blocked four shots. His fourth rebound of the night moved him into sole possession of the No. 5 spot on Penn State's career rebounding list, now with 757.

Stevens started the second stanza with the first eight points for a 53-42 lead and he pulled down his own missed attempt and started a stretch where Penn State went 8-8 from the field.

The Nittany Lions led by only three at the half, 45-42. Bucknell made five straight and 7-of-9 baskets over a 4:08 stretch to pull within two at 35-33. The two teams traded baskets in the last 75 seconds of the first half with the Bison getting as close as one point, 43-42. Curtis Jones Jr. scored his seventh point of the half with a field goal to arrive at the halftime score.

Myles Dread added four 3-pointers and finished with 12 points. Wheeler was a perfect 5-5 from the field and had his fifth career double-figure scoring game. Stevens added eight rebounds, three steals and an assist and a block to his stat line.

Bucknell had four starters in double figures led by Andrew Funk with 14 and Moore with 14. Paul Newman had the game-high total in rebounds with nine.

WATKINS, MYREON JONES REGISTER DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN WIN

Lamar Stevens scored 20 points while Mike Watkins and Myreon Jones each produced double-doubles as Penn State topped Syracuse 85-64 in the NIT Season TipOff at the Barclays Center.

Watkins, who was named to the all-tournament team, was dominant on the glass with a game-best 16 rebounds, 11 on the offensive end, to go along with 15 points.

Myreon Jones had 16 points and 10 rebounds, for his first career double-double, connecting on three 3-pointers in the first half to help the Nittany Lions to a fast start offensively.

Penn State never trailed in the game, grabbing a double-digit lead in the first half and countered Syracuse's 8-0 run to start the second period with an 8-1 run of its own. Stevens broke the 35-35 tie with a 3-pointer at 16:49 and Curtis Jones Jr. scored three of the next four baskets to push the PSU lead to nine, 48-39.

Syracuse would get as close as four, 50-46, at 11:52 in the second half, but no closer. For 7:01, the Orange went without a field goal, earning its 10 points at the free throw line in that stretch.

Five Nittany Lions scored in double figures with Curtis Jones, Jr. adding 14 points and freshman forward Seth Lundy finishing with 10, eight in the second half.

The Nittany Lions lead 34-27 at the half with Stevens with 10 points, despite having two personal fouls, and M. Jones had nine points.

Neither team shot well in the first half with the Orange with a 34.6 to 32.4 advantage in field goal percentage.

Elijah Hughes had 19 points for Syracuse and Quincy Guerrier was the top rebounder for the Orange with 10.

Mike Watkins pulled down a game-best 16 rebounds to put him over the 800-career rebound mark in Penn State's 76-54 win over Wake Forest in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Nittany Lions topped the Demon Deacons with a 22-point margin of victory, the largest in its 19 Big Ten/ACC Challenge games.

Myreon Jones scored a career-best 22 points, 16 in the first half, to lead three Nittany Lions in double figures. Lamar Stevens finished with 14 points and Izaiah Brockington added 13. Watkins had seven points on the night with his 800th career rebound coming at the 13:12 mark of the second half.

While the offense was potent in the first half, it was the Nittany Lions' defense that created havoc for Wake Forest. The Demon Deacons managed only 54 points, tying the lowest total (2011) by an opponent in a Big Ten/ACC Challenge game.

The Nittany Lions held Wake Forest to 29 percent shooting from the field and forced 20 turnovers. Watkins had five of Penn State's six blocked shots to go along with three steals. Stevens tied his career best with four steals and had seven rebounds.

Penn State built a quick double-digit lead in the first half behind Myreon Jones who had 13 points in 13 minutes. He went 6-8 with three 3-pointers. The Nittany Lions used an 11-1 run late in the half to take a 41-23 lead into the locker room.

Penn State dominated on the glass with a 52-33 rebound margin and scored 40 points in the paint compared to Wake Forest's 18.

Wake Forest's Olivier Sarr had 14 points and 10 rebounds off the bench to lead the Demon Deacons in both categories.

FRONTCOURT DOMINATES FOR FRONT-STRAIGHT WIN

Led by senior forwards Lamar Stevens and Mike Watkins, No. 20 Penn State topped Cornell 90-59 on Sunday, Dec. 29 in the Bryce Jordan Center.

Watkins and Stevens combined for 38 points and helped Penn State extend its home winning streak to 13 games.

Watkins went 9-10 (90 percent) to tie a program record for field goal percentage en route to a season-best 19 points. He added 10 rebounds for the 31st double-double of his career.

Penn State's potent frontcourt established its presence with 44 points in the paint and a 43-28 advantage on the boards. Penn State shot 52.2 for the game en route and forced 17 Cornell turnovers en route to its 11th win of the season.

Four Nittany Lions finished in double-figures led by Watkins and Stevens with 19 points. Sophomore guards Myreon Jones (18) and Izaiah Brockington (11) also finished in double-figures in the victory. Myreon Jones was electric in the second half, scoring 14 of his 18 points and swiping three steals.

Watkins was perfect from the field in the first half, scoring 16 points on 8-8 shooting to pace the Nittany Lions. With a 4-4 outing vs. Central Connecticut State, Watkins had a skein of 12 made field goals. Stevens had added 14 points, four assists and three rebounds in the first half.

Penn State shot 54.5% in the first half and led Cornell 45-29 at the break. Stevens had 10 points in the first eight minutes of the game.

Big Red junior forward Jimmy Boehem led Cornell with 17 points and shared the team rebounding lead with six rebounds.

LIONS ELECTRIFY PALESTRA WITH FIFTH-STRAIGHT VICTORY

Penn State extended its win streak to five games with an 89-86 victory over No. 23 Iowa Saturday in The Palestra. The teams battled for 40 minutes as PSU secured the win by making its final five shots and Myles Dread made six free throws in the final 30 seconds.

Philadelphia product Izaiah Brockington turned in a career-high 23 points, scoring 15 points in the second half. He and Curtis Jones Jr. were catalysts with 39 of Penn State's 46 bench points as Lamar Stevens and Mike Watkins were hampered by foul trouble. LIONS CAN'T OVERCOME HALFTIME DEFICIT IN LOSS TO BADGERS

Penn State matched Wisconsin point-for-point in the second half, but couldn't overcome a slow start offensively. Penn State fell to Wisconsin, 58-49, in the Bryce Jordan Center as the Badgers' snapped the Nittany Lions' 13-game home win streak.

Lamar Stevens and Izaiah Brockington had 19 and 15 points, respectively, with both contributing double figures in the second half. Stevens posted his 15th career double-double with 13 rebounds.

Wisconsin went up by as many as 12 points in the second half, 39-27, before Stevens, Myreon Jones and Brockington responded points to fuel a 10-2 run.

The Nittany Lions cut the Badgers' lead to four, 41-37, midway through the second half, but Wisconsin added four points to go up by eight. The Badgers didn't let the Nittany Lions any closer than six with the teams trading baskets for the next five minutes.

Wisconsin had an answer on the offensive side for every Nittany Lion score and held Penn State scoreless for the last two minutes. Izaiah Brockington scored 10 of his 15 points in the second half and eight points in the final 7:46.

The slow start offensively began from the tip with both teams going 0-6 from the field through the 15:47 mark. Micah Potter scored 10-straight points over the next four minutes for the Badgers before Stevens put PSU on the board with a basket and a foul shot.

The Badgers shot 45.5 percent in the second half and 40 percent overall. Wisconsin had a 20-11 advantage on the boards in the second half after Penn State had a 22-20 edge at the break.

Off the bench, Potter scored a game-high 24 points with 18 coming in the first half, and tied Stevens for a share of the game-high rebounding lead.

PSU EDGED 75-69 IN TOUGH ROAD BATTLE AT MINNESOTA

Penn State battled Minnesota, but lost a tough Big Ten road game 75-69. Three Nittany Lions scored in double figures with Seth Lundy and Myreon Jones each with 15 points and Lamar Stevens 14. Lundy's 15 points in his first career start were a career high.

Golden Gophers Marcus Carr (27) and Daniel Oturu (26) combined for 53 points. Oturu had 14 rebounds for a double-double.

The second half bore little resemblance to the first. The Nittany Lions shot 60 percent in the first with 18 field goals and zero turnovers for a two-point lead, 46-44 at the half. Neither team shot well in the second with Minnesota at 32.3 percent and Penn State at 24.1.

Penn State scored on its first five possessions after the half to go up 56-48. Minnesota chipped away at the lead, getting second-chance points and converting free throws. Oturu tied the game at 59 at 10:50 and then Alihan Demir's layup gave the Golden Gophers their first lead, 61-59, since the 7:08 mark of the first half.

The Nittany Lion offense struggled with an 11-minute stretch without a field goal, with three points off free throws. Penn State remained without a basket until Myreon Jones scored at the 5:28 mark. Despite the scoring woes, PSU was down only three, 64-61.

Oturu scored the next seven points for Minnesota to extend the lead to 71-64 with 1:52 remaining and the Gophers went back up by 10 before Izaiah Brockington made two free throws and Curtis Jones Jr. knocked in a 3-pointer to bring the score to 74-69 with 17 seconds left. The Nittany Lion defense locked in to gain additional offensive possessions, but an Oturu free throw gave UM the 75-69 final.

Minnesota had a 22-11 advantage on the boards at the break and dominated on the boards in the second half for a 48-32 tally. Penn State had a season-low six turnovers and had 19 points from Brockington, Curtis Jones Jr., and Mike Watkins off the bench.

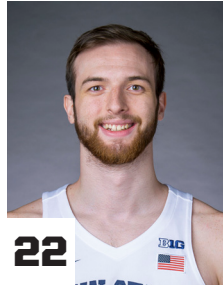

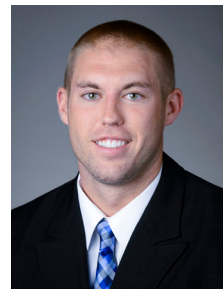
