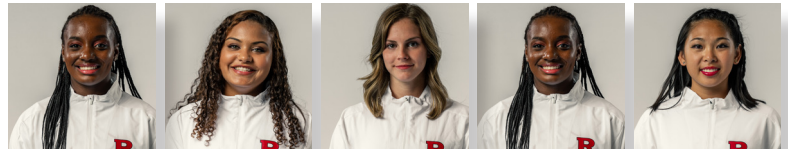

KNIGHT NOTES

RU'S LAST TIME OUT

- Rutgers competed in two road meets over the weekend with stops at then-No. 9 Michigan on Friday and Penn on Sunday.
- At Michigan, Rutgers produced season-highs on vault and beam with marks of 48.775 in each. The Scarlet Knights also posted numerous career- and season-highs.
- Senior Kaitlyn Hall recorded a career-high of 9.800 on vault to tie for third in the competition with the Wolverines. Sophomore Abigail Karolewski registered a career-high of 9.825 on bars, while senior Shannon Farrell added a 9.825 as well.
- At Penn, senior Erin McLachlan broke the school record on beam with a 9.950. Freshman Hannah Joyner followed with a 9.900, reaching that mark or higher for the third time this season.
- Sunday's beam score of 49.125 marked the program's second highest event total ever in the event. The total bested marks of 49.100 achieved twice in March of 2014.

MOST IMPROVED TEAM IN 2019

- After climbing nine spots in the national rankings from 2018 to 2019, Rutgers gymnastics was recognized as the most improved team with a first year head coach in data collected by College Gym News. The Scarlet Knights tied for fifth-most improved overall.
- The Scarlet Knights scored as high as 196.050 last year, earned two Big Ten wins over ranked opponents and saw Belle Huang score a 9.900 at NCAA Regionals to tie the individual program record at the meet. Huang became the second gymnast to garner All-Big Ten honors.
- Overall, RU had 12 routines of 9.900 or better across the four events.
- The team recorded a 194 or better in the last nine meets and in 10 of the last 11, including a victory over No. 25 Penn State to reach 196 for the second time in school history.
- Posting a 194.650 at the Big Five meet, Rutgers topped No. 22 Ohio State for its second Big Ten win of the season. The Scarlet Knights had two combined regular season Big Ten wins in the previous four years.

2020 CAPTAINS

- Seniors Shannon Farrell and Kaitlyn Hall will serve as the Rutgers gymnastics captains for the 2019-20 campaign. The duo, both Academic All-Big Ten selections, bring a combined 45 meets of experience to the season for the Scarlet Knights.

SAGE ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

- Sage Littlejohn won the 2019 Jamaica Cup National Qualifier this past December.

RWJBARNABAS HEALTH ATHLETIC PERFORMANCE CENTER

- This past September, Rutgers gymnastics moved into the RWJBarnabas Health APC, which houses its new practice facility, locker room and offices.
- The APC features a 11,850 square foot training area with two foam pits, Olympic-caliber equipment, stationary bikes, Pelotons and Stairmaster.
- A sports medicine training area, connecting locker room and lounge area are also featured in the practice facility.
- Coaching and administrative offices (1,625sf) overlooks training area as well.
- Overall, the 307,000-square-foot, four-story sports facility and parking deck serves as headquarters for a world-class sports medicine program for gymnastics, men's and women's basketball and wrestling.





Umme Salim-Beasley was hired as the eighth head coach in Rutgers gymnastics history on May 11, 2018. Now in her second season leading the Scarlet Knights, Salim-Beasley was previously on the RU staff as an assistant from 2012-15 before spending three seasons rewriting the record books as the Temple head coach.

Rutgers exceeded expectations and set a foundation in year one under Salim-Beasley and her staff, earning the distinction as the most improved team in the nation with a first-year head coach. RU finished as the fifth-most improved in the national rankings overall. The Scarlet Knights scored as high as 196.050 in 2019, earned two Big Ten wins over ranked opponents and saw Belle Huang score a 9.900 at NCAA Regionals to tie the individual program record at the meet. The team recorded a 194 or better in the last nine meets and in 10 of the last 11, including the victory over No. 25 Penn State to reach 196 for the second time in school history. Huang became the second gymnast to garner All-Big Ten honors.

Salim-Beasley, who leads unit, saw marked improvement on uneven bars. Shannon Farrell highlighted the efforts with a 9.925, the best number by a Scarlet Knight on the event since 2003. Overall, RU had 12 routines of 9.900 or better across the four events.

Academically, the gymnastics program had 14-of-16 eligible earn Academic All-Big Ten status with at least a 3.0 GPA, with five notching Big Ten Distinguished Scholar status with a 3.7 GPA or better. In addition, Eriel Santagado collected the Female Chancellor's Scholar-Athlete Award at the annual athletic department banquet.

Each of the top 10 team scores in Temple history came under Salim-Beasley's watch. The Owls reset the school record twice in 2018 with marks of 196.050 and 195.800 to post a program-high RQS of 195.015. Earning ECAC Coach of the Year, Salim-Beasley sent two specialists to NCAA Regionals, making it the first time the program sent multiple representatives. A total of 11 gymnasts earned spots on the All-ECAC Teams, including seven on the All-Academic Team.

Salim-Beasley and her squad finished the 2017 season ranking first in the ECAC with the highest RQS in school history at the time at 194.155. She was a finalist for the Philadelphia Coaches Association Head Coach of the Year and was named Northeast Region Co-Coach of the Year. Salim-Beasley also helped lead her team to the best ECAC Championships total in program history with a 193.675. The 2017 Championship performance included the highest ECAC bar total in school history with a 48.825 and the second-highest beam total at a conference championship with a 48.450.

Overall, the Owls tallied 36 total individual scores of 9.800 or above, an improvement from 14 in 2016 and just nine in 2015. Those scores helped Salim-Beasley's squad to 22 individual event titles that included the program's first ever ECAC uneven bars champion in Alexa Phillip.

In her first season with the Owls, Salim-Beasley guided the team to a season-high score of 192.525 at the ECAC Championships to cap off the season. At the meet, four Owls brought home a collective six conference medals, including a gold from Briana Odom. Salim-Beasley also coached Odom to a second-place all-around finish with the programs' second-highest score of 39.050. That would be topped by Tori Edwards in 2018 after registering a 39.125.

During her four years at Rutgers, Salim-Beasley served as the recruiting coordinator and worked with the uneven bars, among other day-to-day duties for the program. Salim-Beasley helped the Scarlet Knights to a NCAA Regional berth in 2014 and its best EAGL finish in school history, winning EAGL Assistant Coach of the Year in the process. Uneven bars were a big part of the success, as four gymnasts earned all-conference in the event.

In addition, Salim-Beasley guided one of her student-athletes, Alexis Gunzelman, to the top regional qualifying score (RQS) in the conference on bars (9.845) on the way to the first NCAA National all-around appearance by a Scarlet Knight in program history. Gunzelman posted a 9.800 at the national meet, her eighth consecutive meet with at least that score to end the season.

As recruiting coordinator, Salim-Beasley expanded the Scarlet Knights' base nationally to attract top talent from outside the area. Traditionally recruiting in New Jersey and the surrounding states, the Scarlet Knights were able to pull in gymnasts from Florida, South Carolina, Arizona and Massachusetts.

Salim-Beasley competed collegiately at West Virginia University from 1995 to 1998, earning a 10.0 on uneven bars on March 14, 1998 in a meet against Rutgers. She scored as high as 39.475 all-around in 1997.

Salim-Beasley was named Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year as a freshman for the Mountaineers, and earned spots on the All-EAGL First Team in all-around, bars and beam her sophomore and junior seasons. She finished off her career by being named the EAGL Gymnast of the Year and Most Outstanding Senior Gymnast in her final season in Morgantown in addition to winning the EAGL all-around, bar and beam titles that year. Her accomplishments also ranked her as the fifth-best gymnast in the country and as a finalist for the AAI Award in 1998.

A native of Pasadena, Maryland, she was a two-time national qualifier at Hill's Gymnastic Training Center in Gaithersburg, Maryland, before earning a full scholarship to West Virginia.

After graduating from West Virginia with a degree in early childhood education, Salim-Beasley went into coaching, starting as an assistant coach at Penn in 1999. During her one season with the Quakers, the team won the Ivy League Championships in addition to an undefeated regular season, breaking team records in every event.

Salim-Beasley returned to Morgantown as a volunteer assistant coach during the 2006-07 season.

For three years, she coached the Severna Park High School gymnastics team to two county championships, including an undefeated regular season in her first year. Additionally, she coached two different gymnasts to all-around championships.

Salim-Beasley was also a teacher at Eagle Cove School in Pasadena, Maryland, for four years. She is married to former WVU football All-American and NFL veteran, Aaron Beasley, and the couple have three daughters: Amirah, Dahlia and Layla.



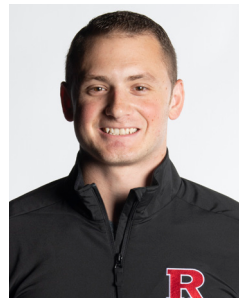
Anastasia Halbig a four-year letterwinner across three events for the Scarlet Knights from 2012-15, is in her second season as an assistant coach after being hired in the summer of 2018. She primarily coaches balance beam.

Halbig played a key role to numerous successes such as the program's highest team score set in her senior season. During that record-setting meet she earned a new career high of 9.875 on balance beam. Also in 2014, she was named the most improved gymnast of the year during her junior season for showing the most growth and reaching three career bests overall. Halbig wrapped up her career at the Big Ten Championships at Michigan posting a 9.800 on the balance beam.

In Halbig's first season as a coach at her alma mater, the Scarlet Knights reached 196 for the second time in program history and earned two Big Ten wins over ranked opponents. The beam unit totaled a 49.000, tied for fourth-best in program history, in the win over No. 25 Penn State, as Belle Huang tied the school record with a 9.925 routine on the event.

Halbig spent three seasons on Salim-Beasley's staff at Temple after being hired as a graduate assistant coach. During that time, she specialized in balance beam technique and skill. The group tied the school record on the event in 2018 with a 49.050 and saw one gymnast earn first team all-conference and two claim spots on the second team.

In addition, Halbig ensured the academic success of the student-athletes, improving the team GPA from 3.07 to 3.38 over three years. Originally from Pipersville, Pennsylvania, Halbig earned her undergraduate degree from Rutgers as a psychology major and achieved a master's degree from Temple in counseling psychology. She is working towards a doctorate degree in sport psychology at Temple, earning an academic grant to work with collegiate student-athletes on preventing burnout in sport.



Michael Rosso, a 2015 Rutgers graduate, is in his second season as an assistant coach after being hired in the summer of 2018. He primarily coaches vault and floor exercise. Rosso returned after working on the Temple staff for three seasons (2016-18). Helping to elevate the team RQS from 190.930 to 195.015 over that span, he coached two conference event champions in Briana Odom (2016, floor) and Daisy Todd (2018, vault).

Rosso was part of leading the Scarlet Knights to a 196 and two wins over ranked Big Ten opponents in 2019. Belle Huang, a Second Team All-Big Ten selection, qualified for NCAA Regionals on floor exercise and posted a 9.900, which tied for the highest individual mark at the meet in program history. RU had seven routines of 9.900 or better on floor throughout the season, with Jenna Rizkalla recording the seventh mark of at least 9.900 in Rutgers history on vault. As a unit, floor exercise scored as high as 49.300, fourth-best in the school record books, and ended with a 49.200 at Big Ten Championships to place 35th nationally with a 49.090 NQS.

In 2018, the Owls sent two vault specialists to NCAA Regionals for the first time in program history after having a representative in 2017 for the first time since 2009. Rosso mentored five first team all-conference performers and three second team athletes between vault and floor this past season. The team established new event score records under Rosso's watch, posting a 49.300 on floor and a 49.125 on vault. That was part of raising the RQS from over four years, bringing the vault mark from 47.995 to 48.890 and the floor number from 48.200 to 49.015.

While studying communications at Rutgers, Rosso was a student assistant coach for the women's gymnastics team for two years. His responsibilities included equipment management and set up, gymnastics drill set up and hands-on spotting on all four events. During his time, Rutgers gymnastics saw its first NCAA regional appearance since 2007 and recorded six of the top 10 highest team scores in program history, including the current record score of 196.225.

Rosso was a gymnast at Surgents Elite School of Gymnastics in Roselle Park, New Jersey, where he was a five-time junior Olympic national qualifier. He is originally from Marlboro, New Jersey. His brother, Ralph, is an assistant coach for the University of Washington women's gymnastics team.

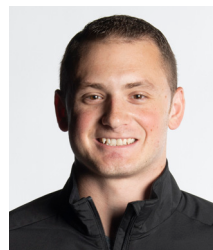
