**OPENING TIP:** Rutgers returns home to face No. 20 Penn State at a sold-out RAC, the second sell-out of the season, after securing a 79-62 win at Nebraska on Friday. The Scarlet Knights are 10-0 at the RAC, with their last home loss coming to PSU on Senior Day last season. RU downed No. 22 Seton Hall at home on Dec. 14. After defeating No. 16 Ohio State and No. 22 Iowa last season, a victory over the Nittany Lions would provide Rutgers multiple ranked victories in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2001-02 and 2002-03 campaigns.

RU will work to improve to 12-3 and secure the team's best record through 15 games since the 1975-76 undefeated regular season. The Scarlet Knights were last two games over .500 in conference play in February 2002 (7-5). Rutgers last began league play with a 3-1 record as a member of the Atlantic 10 in 1994-95 (4-1). A 12-3 start would also signal Steve Pikiell's best record through 15 games in his head coaching career.

Myles Johnson and Ron Harper Jr. both had double-doubles in Lincoln, marking the first time two RU players produced the feat in a Big Ten game. Caleb McConnell, starting in place of the injured Geo Baker, was 8-of-8 from the field to score 20, as Rutgers led by as much as 22 points en route to its largest margin of victory in a Big Ten road game.

**THE OPPONENT:** Penn State has won five straight and is coming off an 89-86 win over No. 23 Iowa at the Palestra in Philadelphia on Saturday. It was PSU's second ranked victory after defeating then No. 4 Maryland on Dec. 10. The Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten in blocks (6.3), steals (9.4), turnover margin (+3.1) and turnovers forced (15.8). Seniors Lamar Stevens and Mike Watkins lead the team in scoring (16.4) and rebounding (9.0), respectively. Four PSU players boast double figure scoring averages.

**THE SERIES:** Tuesday marks the 75th meeting in a series dating back to 1922, with Rutgers 21-16 at home and 9-8 at the RAC. PSU holds the overall advantage 41-33. RU and Penn State were both members of the Atlantic 10 from 1976-79 and from 1982-1991. In front of a sold-out crowd in last season's home finale, Rutgers fought back from a 20-point deficit to get within one, but could not score on the final possession in a 66-65 loss. Johnson had a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds, while Harper Jr. contributed 14 and McConnell 12.

## Scarlet Knight Notables

- Rutgers is undefeated at home (10-0), when shooting a better percentage than its opponent (9-0) and when limiting foes to less than 60 points (8-0).
- Rutgers has out-rebounded its opponent in 13 of 14 games this season.
- Myles Johnson leads the Big Ten in FG% (71.8), is 2nd in offensive rebounds (3.9), 7th in rebounding (9.1) and 10th in blocks (1.6).
- Johnson is fifth nationally in FG%, seventh in offensive rebounding % (18.4) and 16th in offensive rebounding (3.9).
- Akwasi Yeboah ranks 43rd among active players in career points (1,446) and 48th in rebounds (620). He is 12th in the Big Ten in 3PT% (41.0).
- Rutgers is seventh nationally in rebound margin (+10.3), 16th in scoring defense (59.6), 17th in both rebounding (41.5) and FG% defense (37.4).
- Rutgers is a young squad, ranking 236th in experience per Pomeroy. The starting lineup for the last game featured four sophomores, with all eight players that saw game action against Nebraska in their first or second year of action in an RU uniform.
- RU's 20-point win over No. 22 Seton Hall on Dec. 14 was its largest margin of victory over a ranked foe in program history.
- After five sell-outs in 2018-19, its most since 2004-05 (7), Rutgers welcomed 8,329 fans vs. Seton Hall, its largest crowd in 18 seasons.
- Rutgers had 23 second chance points (23-5) in its victory over Wisconsin on Dec. 11, its most ever in a Big Ten game.
- Rutgers announced the signings of 6-7 F Mawot Mag, 6-8 F Oskar Palmquist and 6-10 F Dean Reiber.
- Rutgers entered the Fall 2019 semester with a 3.06 cumulative team GPA.
- Rutgers posted a 4-0 record against professional club teams during a tour of Spain in August. RU outscored its opponents 387-284 and had five players with double figure scoring averages.
- Of Rutgers' 11 scholarship players, 10 are 6'4 or above and seven are 6'6 or taller.

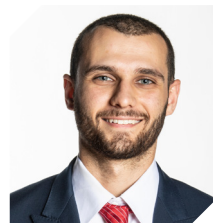

## **GEO BAKER SIDELINED WITH THUMB INJURY**

It was announced on Jan. 3 that junior guard Geo Baker would be sidelined indefinitely with a left thumb injury.

"Our focus is upon Geo receiving the best care and treatment to make a healthy return this season," said Rutgers Head Coach Steve Pikiell. "His absence will be another challenge for our program, and we have every confidence our team will rise to meet it."

Baker started all 13 games at point guard prior to the injury. He led the Scarlet Knights in minutes (30.4), free throw percentage (84.0), assists (52) and steals (23), while placing second in scoring (11.5) and blocks (12).

## **RUTGERS MOURNS PASSING OF ALUM DAVID STERN**

David J. Stern, a Dean's List history student and a Henry Rutgers Scholar at Rutgers who became the National Basketball Association's longest-serving commissioner, passed away on Jan. 1 at the age of 77. A 1963 graduate of The State University of New Jersey who was inducted into the school's Hall of Distinguished Alumni in 1999 and served on its Board of Overseers, Stern was instrumental in the NBA's growth into a global powerhouse.

"We are all deeply saddened by the passing of Commissioner Stern," said Director of Athletics Pat Hobbs. "We extend our deepest sympathies to Dianne and his family. I will forever treasure his guidance and counsel, and his humor. He was a very proud Rutgers alum. His was a remarkable life."

Born on Sept. 22, 1942 in New York City, Stern graduated from Teaneck (N.J.) High School and was a member of the Sigma Alpha Mu fraternity at Rutgers before earning his law degree from Columbia University in 1966. He initially became linked to the NBA as part of the law firm Proskauer, Rose, Goetz & Mendelsohn, which represented the league. Stern officially joined the NBA as the league's general counsel in 1978 and succeeded Larry O'Brien as commissioner in 1984.

## **GIVING BACK**

A commitment to the community has been emblematic of Rutgers basketball under Steve Pikiell, with all student-athletes participating in Leadership Development and Strategic Partnerships community service initiatives. The team participated in the annual Tunnel to Towers 5K Run & Walk on Sept. 29 for the third consecutive year. The team has also volunteered at Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, participated in the SAAC Holiday Toy Giveaway and visited children at RWJBarnabas Health facilities around the state.

## **PERFORMING IN THE CLASSROOM**

Rutgers entered the fall semester with a team cumulative GPA of 3.06, an APR score of 984 (4th in the conference) and a GSR score of 82. The program was recognized with two Dean's List honorees in the spring (Joey Downes and Myles Johnson). Downes was named a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar for 2018-2019 and was recently inducted into Chi Alpha Sigma – the National Scholar Athlete Honor Society. In both Fall 2018 and Spring 2019, over half (53%) of the roster earned GPAs of 3.0 or higher each semester.

## **RUTGERS, A BIG TEN SUPER SATURDAY STAPLE**

Rutgers men's basketball and wrestling will be featured in Big Ten Super Saturday - College Hoops & Wrestling in both 2020 and 2021 at the legendary Madison Square Garden. On Saturday, Feb. 1, 2020, Michigan and Rutgers will compete in both men's basketball and wrestling. Michigan will serve as a home team for both events in 2020. The wrestling event will start at 1 p.m. and air on BTN. The basketball game will tip-off at 4:30 p.m. and will also air on BTN. The following year on Jan. 30, 2021, Rutgers will play Michigan State in men's basketball while the Scarlet Knights will compete against Penn State in wrestling with Rutgers serving as the host in both competitions. Times will be announced at a later date.

## **HAPPY ANNIVERSARY**

The 2019-20 season marks the 100th anniversary of the 1919-20 team, the first Rutgers basketball team to play in a postseason tournament. The team played in the National Amateur Athletic Union basketball tournament in Atlanta, the lone national postseason tournament at the time, and finished as runner-up. The squad was inducted into the Rutgers Athletics Hall of Fame in October as part of the class of 2019.

## THE EXCITEMENT IS RISING

Rutgers has experienced ticket growth each season under the leadership of head coach Steve Pikiell. RU had five sell-outs at the RAC in 2018-19, its most since 2004-05 (7). Average attendance improved 31.1% from 2017-18. The 8,329, attendance vs. Seton Hall marked the largest crowd at the RAC since 8,729 watched Rutgers defeat SHU 66-60 on Feb. 23, 2002.

## UTILIZING THE LATEST TRAINING TECHNOLOGIES

Assistant Athletics Director-Strength and Conditionin David VanDyke and Athletic trainer Rich Campbell have made a significant impact on the health and well-being of men's basketball student-athletes. In their initial three seasons, men's basketball players had been sidelined a total of 17 combined games due to injury. The Scarlet Knights had three total games missed among players in 2018-19, 11 in 2017-18 and three in 2016-17.

Rutgers strives to implement the latest technologies to benefit its programs and student-athletes. In that effort, men's basketball utilizes Sparta Science, Catapult, Polar Team Pro and GymAware. Sparta Science provides an objective measure of how players react to gravity with validated scientific assessments and provides evidence-based training prescriptions. Catapult replaces laboratory-based performance testing with microtechnology to obtain actionable data in real time regarding performance. Polar Team Pro provides real-time heart rate data to make objective decisions. GymAware is the gold standard Linear Positional Transducer (LPT with angle measurement) for measuring performance, implementing Velocity Based Training and monitoring power.

Before and after every season, men's basketball welcomes BAM (Basic Athletic Measurement) to the RAC to conduct player testing. A team of strength and conditioning coaches and technology professionals who utilize the most reliable methods and precise measuring tools, BAM has conducted the NBA Draft combine since 2009. Results are registered to a BAMScore™, a proprietary index for reliably measuring athletic performance, and placed in a requisite category. As a result, players receive the information necessary to gauge personal and professional aspirations.
