SETTING THE SCENE

- RV/RV Indiana kicks off its 136th season of football against No. 8/7 Penn State on Saturday, Oct. 24. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. EST at Memorial Stadium (Field Turf) on FS1.
- IU has won 14 of its last 16 season openers.
- The Hoosiers are 42-18 in Memorial Stadium openers with wins in 16 of their last 18 and 33 of their last 38.
- Indiana will start a season with PSU for the first time.
- This is the 12th time IU has opened the year against a ranked team and the second time in Bloomington (No. 2 Ohio State - Aug. 31, 2017).
- The Hoosiers will begin the season at home for the first time since 2017 vs. Ohio State.
- Indiana's last Top-10 win came at No. 9 Ohio State (31-10) on Oct. 10, 1987.
- Penn State leads the overall series, 22-1, including a 9-1 mark at Memorial Stadium. IU defeated PSU, 44-24, in Bloomington on Oct. 5, 2013.
- The team voted husky **Marcelino Ball**, center **Harry Crider**, linebacker **Cam Jones**, linebacker **Micah McFadden** and quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** season captains.
- Three Hoosiers hail from Pennsylvania: defensive tackle **Shamar Jones** (Johnstown), and offensive linemen **Mike Katic** (Gibsonia) and **Tim Weaver** (Hellertown).
- Indiana returns 19 starters, including eight on offense, nine on defense and two on special teams.

THE COACHES

- One of 22 semifinalists for the 2019 George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, **Tom Allen's** 18 wins are the most for an Indiana head coach over his first three seasons. A 28-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016. (full bio on page 14)
- James Franklin is 56-23 (.709) in his seventh season at Penn State. Franklin served as Vanderbilt head coach (2011-13) and carries an overall record of 80-38 (.678).

2019 NEWS & NOTES

- IU posted an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark en route to an appearance in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl against Tennessee, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- The Hoosiers won eight games for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 1993. Indiana owns six eight-win (1905, 1979, 1987, 1988, 1993, 2019) and two nine-win (1945, 1967) campaigns.
- IU's five-conference wins tied for the third-most in program history (1945, 1979, 1988, 1991, 1993, 2019).
- The Hoosiers posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3).
- On Nov. 10, IU entered the Associated Press Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.

TEAM

• **Tom Allen** promoted **Nick Sheridan** (bio on page 3) to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach on January 10, 2020. Sheridan takes over for 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist and Fresno State head coach Kalen DeBoer.

Allen added three new coaches to the staff: **Jason Jones** (safeties), **Kevin Peoples** (defensive line) and **Kevin Wright** (tight ends).

Jones brings 17 years of experience to Bloomington, including eight in the SEC and five in the Big 12. He has mentored four Jim Thorpe Award semifinalists and a Bronko Nagurski Award finalist.

Peoples owns 27 years of experience and arrives at IU after four seasons in the same capacity at Tulane. He tutored a pair of NFL standouts over his stint in New Orleans: end Ade Aruna (Vikings) and tackle Tanzel Smart (Rams).

Wright is a 20-year head coaching veteran with 13 of those seasons in the state of Indiana and the last five at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. Four of his IMG alumni were selected in the 2020 NFL Draft to give Wright 12 current or former NFL players.

Kasey Teegardin (bio on page 15) also earned a promotion to special teams coordinator on Jan. 19, 2020.

• **Tom Allen's** son, Thomas, is an IU redshirt junior linebacker. Tom is one of four FBS coaches to coach his son:

- *Dana and Logan Holgorsen (Houston)
- *Phillip and Cannon Montgomery (Tulsa)
- *Dabo, Will and Drew Swinney (Clemson)

• Twelve Hoosiers are currently on NFL rosters: RB **Tevin Coleman** (49ers), OL **Dan Feeney** (Chargers), RB **Jordan Howard** (Dolphins), OL **Brandon Knight** (Cowboys), WR OL **Wes Martin** (Washington), OL **Rodger Saffold** (Titans), LB **Tegray Scales** (Buccaneers), OL **Jason Spriggs** (Packers), OL **Simon Stepaniak** (Packers), QB **Nate Sudfeld** (Eagles), TE **Ian Thomas** (Panthers) and **Nick Westbrook** (Titans).

Stepaniak was selected in the 2020 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers in the sixth round (209th pick), while Westbrook signed a free-agent deal with the Titans.

• Former IU quarterback **Antwaan Randle El** (1998-2001) is on the 2020 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame for the ninth-consecutive year.

He earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and he was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP and first team All-American in 2001, Randle El was also sixth in Heisman Trophy balloting after he finished 13th in 2000.

The Riverdale, Ill., native was the first player in NCAA history to score 40 touchdowns (45) and throw for 40 TDs (42), the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 yards and rush for over 3,000 yards.

• The entire football team is registered to vote. "Our whole objective, I want our guys to execute their right and their privilege to be able to vote in our democracy," **Tom Allen** said. "We never tell them who to vote for. We talk about the challenge of being able to study and know the issues and vote for the person and individuals that you believe represent what you want."

• Eleven Hoosiers were named 2019 All-Big Ten: six on offense, three on defense and two on special teams.

Returning wide receiver **Whop Philyor** and running back **Stevie Scott III** collected second-team honors, while tight end **Peyton Hendershot** garnered third-team laurels.

Punter **Haydon Whitehead**, defensive tackle **Demarcus Elliott**, linebacker **Micah McFadden** and cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** were honorable-mention honorees.

• Mullen was also named to the 247Sports True Freshman All-America Team and The Athletic Freshman All-America First Team.

• Nineteen Hoosiers earned Academic All-Big Ten in 2019. Under **Tom Allen**, 66 students-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, including a program-record 29 in 2018.

OFFENSE

- **Nick Sheridan** takes over Indiana's offense after 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist Kalen DeBoer was named Fresno State's head coach in December.
- Working closely alongside DeBoer last season, IU improved at least 40 spots in the national rankings from 2018 in time of possession (+87), average yards per pass (+83), average yards per reception (+78), red zone touchdowns (+70), 20-yard passing plays (+69), 20-yard scrimmage plays (+62), points per game (+46) and total touchdowns (+43).
- The Hoosiers finished second in the Big Ten in pass offense (302.4, 15th nationally), completion percentage (67.9, T-8th) and first downs (23.4, T-20th), third in total offense (432.8, 41st), time of possession (33:44, 7th) and pass yards per attempt (8.3, T-24th), tied for third in turnovers lost (15, T-34th), fourth in pass efficiency (150.6, 24th) and third-down conversions (46.9, T-15th), and fifth in scoring offense (31.8, 42nd), while they matched the program record with nine 30-plus point games.
- Sheridan is in his fourth year in Bloomington. He coached the tight ends in 2019, and the quarterbacks in 2017-18.
- The Saline, Mich., native worked as an offensive graduate assistant at the University of Tennessee from 2014-16.
- Sheridan (32) was named one of the nation's top 30 coaches under 30 years of age by 247Sports in 2017.
- A quarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), he appeared in 12 games and made four starts.

- Sheridan's father, Bill, is a 35-year NFL and collegiate coaching veteran, currently serving as the defensive line coach at the Air Force Academy.
- The Hoosiers return eight starters and 25 letterwinners (10 lost) on offense.
- Senior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** and junior running back **Stevie Scott III** earned second-team All-Big Ten honors, while redshirt junior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** carded third-team accolades one season ago.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caleb Jones** received honorable-mention recognition.
- Four of the program's top five receivers are back, led by Philyor (70 receptions, 1002 yards, 5 touchdowns) and followed by Hendershot (52, 622, 4), senior **Ty Fryfogle** (45, 604, 3) and Scott (26, 211, 1).
- Additionally, three of the top four rushers return, topped by Scott (178 carries, 845 yards, 10 TDs) and backed by sophomore **Sampson James** (81, 275, 3) and redshirt sophomore quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** (22, 119, 2).
- Penix, Philyor and Scott appeared on the 2020 Maxwell Award Watch List.
- Philyor is also on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, while Scott is a member of the Doak Walker Award Watch List.
- Hendershot earned a spot on the John Mackey Award Watch List, while center **Harry Crider** is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List.

QUARTERBACK

- Redshirt sophomore **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 110-of-160 passes, good for a school-record 68.8 completion percentage (6th in Big Ten history), for 1,394 yards with 10 touchdowns, four interceptions and a 157.56 pass-efficiency rating in six starts one season ago.
- Penix rushed for 119 yards on 22 attempts (5.4 average) with two TDs.
- He suffered a season-ending right sternoclavicular joint injury in the Northwestern win on Nov. 2.
- A 2020 Maxwell Award Watch Lister, the 6-3 Penix has gained 16 pounds over his 202-pound playing weight from last year.
- In 2019, Penix twice claimed Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors (Ball State, Michigan State).
- The southpaw averaged 232.3 passing yards and 252.2 total yards per game.
- He became the first IU freshman to start the opening game at quarterback since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- The Tampa native joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to ever reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer).
- Penix finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with a 75-yard score, the Hoosiers longest since Sept. 24, 2016. He added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- His total yardage and passing yardage trail only Randle El for the most in a freshman debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- In his first-career road start at No. 25 Michigan State, he went 33-of-42 (78.6 percent) for 286 yards with a career-best three passing touchdowns, which he matched in the Rutgers win (282 yards), and one rushing TD.
- Penix completed a school-record 20-straight passes, the second-longest streak in Big Ten history behind Chuck Long's 22-straight in 1984.
- His 33 completions were a career-high and share seventh on the program's single-game list.
- Penix threw for 61 scores and just six interceptions in his two years as a starter (24 games) at Tampa Bay Technical High School.
- The team captain added 16 touchdowns on the ground. He also played center field, jumped 22 feet in the long jump and tallied a time of 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.

- **Jack Tuttle**, who made his debut against Eastern Illinois in 2019, serves as the Hoosiers backup.
- The redshirt sophomore transferred from the University of Utah on Dec. 17, 2018, practiced with team and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- In five games last season, Tuttle went 6-of-11 for 34 yards and had nine rushes for 20 yards.
- A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, Calif., Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect.
- The 6-4, 210-pound right-hander was ranked the No. 4 pro-style quarterback nationally by Rivals, the No. 5 pro-style quarterback nationally by 247Sports and the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.
- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU (1986-88).

WIDE RECEIVER

- Senior **Whop Philyor** enters 2020 with 126 receptions, 1,572 yards, nine touchdowns, six 100-yard games and five double-digit catch games.
- He became the 13th Hoosier to reach 125 receptions and 1,500 yards.
- Philyor is the program's leader in double-figure catch games, shares seventh in 100-yard games, is 15th in receptions and 20th in yardage.
- The Tampa native was named to the 2020 Maxwell Award and Biletnikoff Award Watch Lists.
- A second-team All-Big Ten selection, Philyor caught 70 passes for 1,002 yards and five TDs one season ago.
- He became the seventh Hoosier to reach 1,000 yards, recorded three double-digit catch games, an IU single-season record, and was one of 10 FBS players with a trio of contests with 10-or-more.
- Philyor posted four 100-yard games (T-4th in the Big Ten). His receptions are sixth, 100-yarders share sixth and yardage is seventh on the program's single-season lists.
- The 5-11, 180-pounder finished third in the conference in catches and receptions per game (5.8), and fourth in yardage and yardage per game (83.5).
- His 502 yards after the catch topped the league (24th nationally), and he led the team (10th in the Big Ten) with 1,094 all-purpose yards (91.2 per game) after he rushed 10 times for 43 yards and returned 15 punts for 49 yards.
- In Big Ten games only, Philyor finished first with 101.6 yards per game, second with 6.9 catches per game, third with the four 100-yard games and seventh with 106.6 all-purpose yards per game
- At Nebraska, Philyor matched a career-high set earlier in the year at No. 25 Michigan State with 14 receptions (T-1st in the Big Ten, T-5th nationally in 2019) and had his second-best career yardage mark with 178 (7th in the Big Ten).
- Philyor became the first Hoosier to record double-figure catch games in back-to-back weeks with 10 in the Rutgers win after he hauled in the 14 against the Spartans.
- He topped 100 yards with 142 at MSU, with a career-best two TDs, and a career-high 182 (6th-most) against the Scarlet Knights.
- Philyor also brought in 10-plus completions vs. MSU in 2018 (13 for 148) and at Maryland in 2017 (13 for 127). His 14 receptions share third and the 13 share fifth on Indiana's single-game charts.
- His parents began calling him Whop because of his love for Burger King's Whoppers. Philyor's full name is Mister Elias De'Angelo Philyor.
- Senior **Ty Fryfogle** heads into the year with 75 receptions and 998 yards. He is on pace to become the 47th Hoosier with 1,000 yards and the 28th with 1,000 and 100
- In 2019, he finished third on the team with 45 receptions and 604 yards to go along with three touchdowns.

- Fryfogle averaged 46.5 yards per game, 3.5 catches per game and 13.4 yards per grab.
- The Lucedale, Miss., native reached 100 yards for the first time in his career with 131 yards on five receptions (26.2) with a career-long, 38-yard TD at No. 9 Penn State.
- Fryfogle posted 75 yards on four catches, including a score in the win at Nebraska, and he hauled in a career-high six receptions (41 yards) in the Ball State victory.
- Redshirt sophomore **Miles Marshall** came on strong at the end of 2019, as he posted career-bests with four catches and 49 yards in his first-career start and regular-season finale victory at Purdue.
- The Lilburn, Ga., native appeared in all 13 games and made 16 receptions for 196 yards and one touchdown.
- **Nick Westbrook** (2015-19) closed out his career with 144 catches for 2,226 yards and 16 touchdowns and is currently a member of the Tennessee Titans.
- He ranks sixth in receptions, seventh in yardage and TDs, and tied for seventh in 100-yard receiving games (6) in the IU record book.

RUNNING BACK

- A 2019 second-team All-Big Ten selection and member of the 2019 and 2020 Maxwell Award and Doak Award Watch Lists, **Stevie Scott III** is 18 yards away from becoming the 14th Hoosier to reach 2,000 rushing yards.
- Scott shares eighth in program history with 20 rushing touchdowns, is tied for 10th with nine 100-yard games and shares 11th with 22 total TDs (20 rushing, 2 receiving).
- The junior has scored in 12 of his last 16 contests (16 rushing, 1 receiving) and owns five multi-score career games.
- Scott rushed for 845 yards on 178 attempts (4.7 average) with 10 touchdowns one year ago.
- He averaged 76.8 rushing yards per game and led the team with 96.0 all-purpose yards per game and 11 total TDs.
- Scott finished fourth in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game, fifth in carries, tied for fifth in rushing scores, tied for sixth in total touchdowns and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game despite missing the final two games due to injury.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native reached the century mark three times and collected three multi-TD contests.
- Scott shared third among all B1G backs with 26 catches and was fifth with 211 yards to go along with one score.
- The 6-2, 231-pounder is averaging 4.9 yards per carry, 86.2 rushing yards and 99.1 all-purpose yards in 23 career games (22 starts).
- Scott carded 116 yards with his first-career three-touchdown game (2 rushing, 1 receiving) in the Northwestern win en route to his first-career Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor.
- He rushed for 164 yards, the second-highest total of his career, on 12 carries (13.7) with a career-long rush of 57 yards in the Rutgers win.
- In 2018, Scott turned in the top true freshman running back campaign in program history.
- He set Indiana true freshman records with 1,137 yards (losing just 18 yards), 228 attempts, 10 TDs and six 100-yard games.
- Scott averaged 94.8 rushing yards, 101.9 all-purpose yards per game and 5.0 yards per carry.
- He became the 13th Hoosier (19th time) to reach 1,000 yards and his 1,137 yards rank 14th.
- Amongst true freshmen running backs nationally, Scott finished second in rushing yardage, 100-yard games and rushes, and third in rushing scores.
- He finished fourth in the Big Ten in attempts per game (19.0, 23rd nationally), tied for fourth in rushing touchdowns, fifth in rushing yardage (33rd) and rushing yardage per game (27th), eighth in all-purpose yardage (1,223), tied for eighth in total TDs (11) and 10th in all-purpose yardage per game (101.9).
- A two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Scott tallied 204 yards, three shy of Anthony Thompson's Hoosiers true freshman record (1988), on 31 carries (6.6 average) with his first-career score, a 40-yarder, in a 20-16 victory vs. Virginia.
- IU's Offensive Newcomer of the Year was a 2016 all-state and All-Central New York selection as a back and linebacker before he was limited to three games due to injury in 2017 at Christian Brothers Academy.
- Sophomore **Sampson James** finished second on the team with 81 carries, 275 yards and three touchdowns in 13 games (2 starts) one season ago.
- James filled in for Scott at Purdue and he became the 13th Hoosier true freshman to reach the 100-yard mark.

- He rushed a career-high 22 times for 118 yards (5.4) and one TD in the victory.
- The 6-1, 220-pounder participated in 2019 spring practice after a distinguished career at Avon (Ind.) High School.
- A two-time all-stater, James was a consensus four-star prospect by ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports.
- He closed out his Avon career with 3,451 yards on 573 carries (6.0 average) with 38 rushing touchdowns and 41 total scores.
- **David Ellis** moved from wide receiver to running back during 2020 spring practice.
- The sophomore out of Clinton Township, Mich., rushed nine times for 53 yards in 2019.
- Ellis saw time at running back, wide receiver, defensive back and kick returner at Chippewa Valley High School, where he became the 11th player in state history with a 99-yard TD rush
- A 2018 Broyles Award nominee, **Mike Hart** is in his fourth season as Indiana's running backs coach and his first as associate head coach.
- The University of Michigan's all-time rushing leader, Hart spent three years with the Indianapolis Colts before entering the coaching ranks in 2011.
- In his nine years as a coach (Syracuse, 2016; Western Michigan, 2014-15; Eastern Michigan, 2011-13), Hart has tutored four 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference (MAC) Freshman of the Year and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.
- Each of the Hoosiers last four featured running backs have reached the NFL - **Devine Redding** (Kansas City, Tampa Bay), **Jordan Howard** (Miami), **Tevin Coleman** (San Francisco) and **Stephen Houston** (New England, Pittsburgh and Baltimore).

TIGHT END

- After a breakout 2019 season, **Peyton Hendershot** claimed third-team All-Big Ten honors and is a member of the 2020 John Mackey Award Watch List.
- Hendershot set Indiana single-season tight end records with 52 receptions (10th in the Big Ten) and 622 yards, and he tied for third with four touchdowns in his 13 starts.
- The redshirt junior tied for fourth among tight ends nationally in catches and 10th in yardage.
- He finished second among Big Ten tight ends in receptions and yardage, and tied for third in scores.
- Hendershot ranked second on the Hoosiers in catches and yardage, and tied for third in TDs.
- The North Salem, Ind., native led the team in receptions seven times (7 times game-high) and in yardage four times (2 times game-high), while he posted seven games with 50-or-more yards and six games with five-or-more catches.
- He nearly became the first Hoosier tight end since 1985 (**Dave Lilja**) and the fifth overall to reach the century mark at Maryland, where he posted a career-high 95 yards on six grabs, both game-highs, in the win.
- Against No. 6 Ohio State, he collected 70 yards, including a career-long 49-yard score, on four receptions.
- Junior **Matt Bjorson** pulled in seven passes for 36 yards with one touchdown last season.
- Overall, he has played in 25 games with 12 receptions for 89 yards and the TD.
- IU added **Khameron Taylor**, a fifth-year senior who graduated with an interdisciplinary studies degree from the University of South Alabama in May 2020.
- The 6-4, 265 pounder is a strong blocker and appeared in 24 contests with 14 starts for the Jaguars.
- He caught five passes for 67 yards in 2018, and added three kickoff returns for 23 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- Despite using five different line combinations and three left tackles in 2019, Indiana set a program mark with 3,931 passing yards, and finished third with 5,626 total yards and 413 points.
- The Hoosiers were second in the conference in pass offense (302.4, 15th nationally) and first downs (23.4, T-20th), third in total offense (432.8) and time of possession (33:44, 7th), and fifth in scoring offense (31.8).
- Senior **Harry Crider** (27 career games) and redshirt junior **Caleb Jones** (24) were the only two IU linemen who started all 13 games in 2019.
- Crider made 12 starts at left guard and one at center, where he takes over in 2020.
- The 6-4, 311-pounder attended Columbus East High School in Columbus, Ind.
- He is a 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist, a 2020 Wuerffel Trophy nominee, a Rimington Trophy Watch Lister and was a candidate for the 2020 AFCA Allstate Good Works Team.
- Crider graduated with a criminal justice degree in Dec. 2019, and he is pursuing his master's in criminal justice and public safety.
- Jones (6-8, 362), a 2019 honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree, started 12 games at right tackle and one at left tackle, where he finds himself atop the depth chart this year.
- He was an all-state standout in 2015 and 2016 at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis.
- Sophomore **Matthew Bedford** will start at right tackle. IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year started eight times and played in nine at left tackle as a true freshman.
- Bedford (6-6, 314) chose the Hoosiers over Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- **Darren Hiller** is in his fourth season overseeing the offensive line. A 26-year coaching veteran, Hiller has coached 21 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers **Wes Martin** (guard), **Brandon Knight** (tackle) and **Simon Stepaniak** (guard).
- Stepaniak was a sixth-round selection by Green Bay in the 2020 NFL Draft, Martin was a fourth-round selection by Washington in 2019, and Knight was a 2019 free-agent signing of Dallas.
- Tackle **Jason Spriggs** (Chicago) and guard **Dan Feeney** (Los Angeles Chargers) were drafted in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Spriggs was taken with pick No. 48 (round 2 by Green Bay), and Feeney was selected with pick No. 71 (round 3 by Los Angeles).
- The quintet, along with **Rodger Saffold**, an 11-year veteran guard with Tennessee, gives Indiana six former O-line standouts currently on NFL rosters.

DEFENSE

- After three years running the defense, **Tom Allen** turned over the reins to **Kane Wommack** in 2019, who served as linebackers coach in 2018.
- The youngest Power 5 defensive coordinator (33) led IU to Top-50 finishes nationally in scoring, total, rush and pass defense for the first time since 1993.
- Indiana last ranked in the Top 50 in scoring defense in 1993 and rush defense in 1998.
- The Hoosiers finished tied for 12th nationally in defensive touchdowns (3, T-3rd Big Ten), tied for 27th nationally in fumbles recovered (10, T-4th), 34th in opponent third-down conversions (35.2, 5th), 36th in total defense (352.2), tied for 38th in opponent first downs (19.1), 43rd in rush defense (138.5), 45th in scoring defense (24.4), 46th in pass defense (213.7) and 48th in pass efficiency defense (128.01).
- IU held four opponents: Eastern Illinois (52-0), Connecticut (38-3), Rutgers (35-0) and Northwestern (34-3), to three points or less, which marked the most in one campaign since holding five to three or less in 1945.
- Indiana was one of seven teams (Wisconsin-4, Florida-3, Georgia-3, Iowa-2, Utah-2, Virginia Tech-2) with two shutouts.
- The Hoosiers yielded three total points in consecutive Big Ten home victories over Rutgers and Northwestern, marking the second-lowest, two-game home B1G opponent scoring output in a single-season (1958).
- IU held four foes under 200 total yards, four under 115 passing yards and five to 100-or-fewer rushing yards.
- Indiana's four shutouts since the start of 2017 share fourth nationally with Alabama and Iowa, one behind Wisconsin, Georgia and Virginia Tech.
- The Hoosiers have recorded at least one takeaway in 29 of the last 31 games.
- Wommack and Allen stress the importance of takeaways and their magic number per game is three.
- The defense has reached that number 12 times since Allen brought the 4-2-5 defense to IU in 2016.

- Since the start of that campaign (50 games), Indiana has four games with four takeaways, 12 with at least three takeaways and 22 with multiple takeaways.
- Wommack worked with Allen as an Ole Miss graduate assistant in 2012-13, when Allen was linebackers coach under defensive coordinator Dave Wommack, Kane's father.
- He served as the University of South Alabama's defensive coordinator, the youngest in the FBS, and linebackers coach in 2016-17, after two seasons (2014-15) as defensive coordinator at Eastern Illinois University.
- Wommack engineered one of the top turnarounds in the country in 2016. The unit was the fifth-most improved nationally in scoring defense (-10.3), one spot behind the Hoosiers, and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in passing defense.
- Sophomore cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** earned a spot on the 2020 Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Fifth-year senior tackle **Jerome Johnson** is the team's active leader with 9.5 sacks (66 yards) and 16.5 tackles for loss (78 yards).
- The Bassfield, Miss., native has been named the program's most outstanding lineman two years running and has started the last 22 games.
- In 2019, Johnson posted 43 tackles, 20 solo, five sacks (46 yards), 7.5 for loss (51 yards) and two quarterback hurries.
- He shared the team lead in sacks, finished second in TFLs and fifth in stops.
- Johnson led the defensive line in tackles and stops for loss, tied for first in sacks and shared second in solos.
- Over the final five contests, he tallied 24 tackles, 11 solo, three sacks (31 yards), 5.5 TFLs (36 yards) and the two QBHs.
- The 6-3, 304-pounder added one sack in each of the final three games and a tackle for loss in each of the final five.
- Joining Johnson in the interior is junior **Demarcus Elliott** (6-3, 311), an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection one season ago.
- Elliott made 35 tackles, 27 solo, with three sacks (17 yards), five for loss (29 yards), one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry in 13 games (12 starts).
- He finished first among IU defensive linemen in solo stops, second in tackles and third in sacks.
- Elliott also led the team in stops on three occasions and posted six games with at least four.
- The Garden City, Kan., native played the 2018 campaign at Garden City Community College.

- Junior **James Head Jr.** started all 13 games at end in 2019 and gathered 20 tackles, 14 solo, 2.5 sacks, four for loss, five quarterback hurries (2nd on the team), three pass breakups and one forced fumble.
- His strip-sack at No. 9 Penn State resulted in his first-career forced fumble.
- The 6-5, 259-pound Miami native made 17 stops in 11 games last year after a sterling career at Southridge High School. Head finished his career with 250 tackles, 47 for loss and 45 sacks.
- Senior end **Michael Ziemba** (6-3, 258) started nine times and played in all 13 games last year.
- He shared the team lead with two fumble recoveries (T-4th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally)
- Ziemba collected 33 tackles, 20 solo, 6.5 for loss (3rd on the team), with three quarterback hurries.
- He recorded a tackle for loss in seven games.
- The Sanford, Fla., native has played in 35-career games and made his first starts in 2019.
- Stanford grad transfer **Jovan Swann** graduated with a human biology degree in April 2020, and he is currently enrolled in the IU Kelley School of Business MBA program.
- The 6-2, 280-pound tackle owns 85 tackles, 49 solo, 11.5 sacks (45 yards), 18.5 for loss (57 yards), nine quarterback hurries, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, one interception and one blocked field goal in 39 games (19 starts).

LINEBACKER

- In the middle, honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree **Micah McFadden** was named Indiana's 2019 Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Year.
- The junior played in all 13 games, (12 starts) and topped the team with 61 tackles, 42 solos, 10 for loss and two interceptions (tied).
- He also posted 1.5 sacks, four quarterback hurries (3rd on the team) and one pass breakup.
- McFadden closed out 2019 with an INT, one TFL and five stops in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl vs. Tennessee.
- The 6-2, 235-pounder led the team in tackles four times, including in the win at Nebraska, where he made a career-high 11 and 10 solos.
- He picked off his first-career pass and carded six stops, all solos, with one for loss against No. 13 Michigan after he recorded one sack, 1.5 TFLs and a career-best three QBHs at No. 9 Penn State.
- McFadden registered a tackle for loss in nine contests, including three with 1.5 or more.
- He set a career-high with a pair of TFLs at No. 25 Michigan State and added 1.5 in the victory against Rutgers.
- As a true freshman, he posted 20 tackles, 14 solo, with one for loss, one forced fumble and two hurries in 12 games.
- The Tampa Plant grad tallied a program-record 211 stops, 124 solo, 39 for loss, seven sacks, two picks and two fumble recoveries as a senior.
- Junior **Cam Jones** shifted over from the husky position to stinger last year and had 35 tackles, 23 solos, two sacks, 4.5 for loss, one pick-6, one forced fumble, two pass PBUs and two QB hurries in 12 games.
- With his forced fumble in the Northwestern win, he matched redshirt junior safety **Bryant Fitzgerald** for the team lead with six-career takeaways.
- Jones set a career-high with two sacks, the first two of his career, and six solos, while he matched his career-best of six total stops against the Scarlet Knights.
- In the win over UConn, Jones picked off his second-career pass and returned it 44 yards for six points.
- Jones was recognized as the team's 2018 defensive newcomer of the year after he shared the team lead with two forced fumbles (T-1st among Big Ten true freshmen, T-2nd among freshmen nationally, T-7th in the Big Ten overall) in 11 games.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native totaled 20 tackles, 15 solo, with one fumble recovery, one interception, one pass breakup and one QBH.
- Jones finished second on the team with four takeaways.
- **James Miller** totaled 31 stops, 19 solo, 4.5 for loss, a half-sack and a team-high-tying two forced fumbles playing behind McFadden one season ago.

- Miller netted a career-high seven tackles with his second forced fumble at PSU.
- He delivered four stops, one TFL and his first-career forced fumble against the Cornhuskers.
- A 2018 two-time defensive scout team player of the week and one-time special teams scout team player of the week, the Tampa native (Armwood H.S.) chose the Hoosiers over Florida State.
- **Thomas Allen** suffered a season-ending should injury at Nebraska on Oct. 26.
- He finished 2019 with 17 tackles and a half for loss, and he collected 28 stops, 20 solo, with one sack, three for loss, one INT (30 yards) and two hurries in 12 games in 2018.
- A two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, the redshirt junior is the son of head coach **Tom Allen**.
- Allen was a teammate of McFadden's at Plant.

CORNERBACK

- **Brandon Shelby** is in his 10th season as Indiana's cornerbacks coach.
- **Tiawan Mullen** became the fourth Shelby protégé to lead the Big Ten in pass breakups in 2019.
- Mullen, IU's 2019 Defensive Newcomer of the Year, is a member of the 2020 Chuck Bednarik Award Watch List.
- A 247Sports True Freshman All-American, The Athletic Freshman All-American and honorable-mention All-B1G selection, Mullen not only paced the conference, but he finished second among freshmen nationally and shared 11th in the country with 13 PBUs.
- He also shared the team lead with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries (T-4th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally) to go along with 29 tackles, 25 solo, and 3.5 for loss in 13 games (8 starts).
- Mullen broke up four passes at No. 25 Michigan State and at Purdue in the regular-season finale, where he posted career-highs with eight stops, six solos and 2.5 for loss, and he added one fumble recovery and one forced fumble.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native was a Rivals four-star prospect and played in the 2019 All-American Bowl after he picked off 14 career passes and returned three for scores.
- His brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Las Vegas Raiders, and his cousin, Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is currently the Baltimore Ravens quarterback.
- Junior **Jaylin Williams** started seven of the final eight games and appeared in all 13 last season.
- He posted 19 tackles, 15 solo, with one interception and three pass breakups.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native made 22 stops, 19 solo, one sack, one INT and two pass breakups as a true freshman.
- **Reese Taylor** enjoyed a successful transition to corner in 2019 after spending the 2018 campaign on offense. He switched to defense during 2019 spring practice.
- Taylor earned his first-career start in the regular-season finale at Purdue and played in 11 games overall.
- He recorded the first interception of his career with 1:00 left to seal the Hoosiers 34-28 win at Maryland, and the junior collected 13 tackles, one for loss, on the year.

- In 2018, Taylor posted 27 receptions for 166 yards, 15 rushes for 83 yards (5.5 average), three kick returns for 66 yards, seven tackles and was the team's back-up quarterback, the position where he earned Indiana's 2017 Mr. Football honors. He led Indianapolis Ben Davis High School to the 2017 state championship.
- The two-time all-stater broke the Ben Davis career marks with 7,631 passing yards and 79 passing scores on 568-of-828 (68.6 percent) and rushed for 2,077 yards on 374 attempts (5.5 average) with 45 touchdowns.

HUSKY

- **Marcelino Ball** suffered an ACL injury during practice in September. The fifth-year senior entered 2020 as the team leader in career tackles (201) and solo stops (142) with 38 starts at husky in 41 games.
- He shared the top spot with three interceptions and 13 pass breakups, and he was second in sacks (4.5) and tackles for loss (15.5).
- A two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten recipient, Marcelino is the younger brother of Marcus, a former NFL defensive back who played at the University of Memphis (2009-10), Reggie, Jr., a quarterback at Georgia Tech University (2003-06) and Raeshon, a defensive back at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (2006-08).
- **Bryant Fitzgerald** replaces Ball after he moved from safety to husky during 2020 spring practice.

- The redshirt junior started eight games at free safety and played in 25 overall in 2018 and 2019. He did start one game at husky in 2018 at Rutgers.
- Fitzgerald topped the team with three picks (T-8th in the Big Ten), two forced fumbles (tied, T-7th in the Big Ten) and six takeaways as a redshirt freshman in 2018.
- The Indianapolis product out of Avon High School shared first in the Big Ten among freshmen in INTs (T-7th nationally) and forced fumbles (T-4th nationally), and he added one fumble recovery, 31 stops, 24 solo and two for loss in 12 games (3 starts).
- Fitzgerald had 27 tackles, 24 solo, one for loss, with three pass breakups and one quarterback hurry in 13 games (5 starts) last season.
- His six-career takeaways share the team lead with junior linebacker **Cam Jones**.

SAFETY

- **Jamar Johnson** moved to free safety from husky during spring practice. He also played 10 games at safety as a true freshman in 2018.
- Last season, the Sarasota, Fla., native made 25 tackles, 18 solo, three sacks (23 yards), 4.5 for loss (26 yards), two interceptions (1 pick-6), one forced fumble, two pass breakups and one quarterback hurry in 13 games.
- The junior recorded an INT in each of the final two games, including a 63-yard TD in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl vs. Tennessee, the first defensive score in IU postseason history.
- After a career-high two-TFL, one-sack effort at Maryland, Johnson added a strip-sack, which the Hoosiers converted into a touchdown in the win at Nebraska.
- Redshirt junior **Juwon Burgess** started seven times and played in all 13 games at free safety in 2019.
- Burgess shared the team lead with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries (T-4th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally), and also collected 29 tackles, 22 solo, with two for loss and two pass breakups.
- He forced and recovered a fumble with 3:42 to play to help preserve the Maryland win, and he recovered his second fumble in as many weeks in the victory at Nebraska.

- The Tampa Plant graduate forced his first-career fumble against No. 6 Ohio State and added a career-high six stops at No. 9 Penn State.
- In 2018, Burgess tallied 25 tackles, 13 solo, with two for loss, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup in 12 games.
- Junior **Devon "Monster" Matthews** is slated to handle strong safety duties for the second-straight year.
- Matthews posted 37 tackles, 26 solo, with two pass breakups in 13 games (6 starts) one year ago.
- The 6-2, 202-pounder collected career-highs in his first-career start vs. Ball State in the season opener with nine stops and six solos, which he matched in the regular-season finale at Purdue.
- He made 20 tackles, 13 solo, with one for loss, one pick, one fumble recovery and one PBU in 10 games as a true freshman.
- The Jacksonville, Fla., native earned the nickname "Monster" as an 8-year old defensive end when he knocked a quarterback's helmet off on a sack.

SPECIALISTS

- Four-time Ray Guy Award candidate (2017-20) and 2019 honorable-mention All-Big Ten recipient **Haydon Whitehead** was granted a sixth year of eligibility on Nov. 14, 2019.
- Whitehead owns a 41.0 average (187 punts), fifth in program history, with 19 50-yarders. He has pinned 72 punts inside the 20-yard line (38.5 percent), 35 inside the 10 (18.7) and 14 inside the 5 (7.5).
- In 2019, Whitehead averaged a career-high 42.5 yards (5th in the Big Ten) on 51 punts. His average is seventh on IU's single-season list.
- He landed 27.5 percent (14-of-51) inside the 10-yard line, fifth in the FBS, and he pinned opponents inside the 20 on 22 occasions and inside the 5 six times.
- Whitehead blasted a career-best 10 50-yarders, including a career-long 65-yarder, and only five of his punts resulted in a touchback (9.8 percent), 20 resulted in a fair catch (39.2 percent) and just seven were returned (13.7 percent).
- In the season-opening win vs. Ball State, he averaged 51.7 yards (5th in program history) on three punts, including a 63-yarder, and had two inside the 10-yard line en route to being named one of the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8.
- The Melbourne, Australia, native kicked in his first American football game ever in the 2017 season opener, and he went on to earn honorable-mention All-Big Ten (coaches and media).
- Whitehead, who punts left-footed but is able to kick right-footed if necessary, enrolled in 2017 spring classes and participated in practice.
- The 25-year old played Australian Rules Football for 15 years. He made his first trip to the United States when he took his official visit to IU in December 2016.
- Whitehead trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia in Melbourne.
- **Charles Campbell** takes over place-kicking duties for two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist **Logan Justus**.
- Campbell made both of his field goal attempts, from 48 and 41 yards, and his lone extra point in 2019.
- The redshirt sophomore was named IU's special teams player of the week in the win at Purdue (11/30).
- Campbell was a 2017 Tennessee Mr. Football finalist (kicker), three-time district kicker of the year and two-time all-state selection out of University School of Jackson.
- He was a U.S. Army All-American and kicked in the 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl.

- **David Ellis** returned 28 kicks for 579 yards (20.7 average) as a true freshman in 2019.
- The yardage ranked third nationally among true freshmen, fifth in the Big Ten, 12th in IU single-season history and 27th nationally.
- Ellis posted four 100-yard kick return games with a season-high of 110 against No. 6 Ohio State (9/14).
- **Sean Wracher** earned third-team All-Big Ten honors from Phil Steele after he served as the team's long snapper for all 13 games as a true freshman in 2019.
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliagerro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliagerro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

“Throughout his life, not only did George Taliagerro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression,” McRobbie said. “And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.”

“In George Taliagerro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many.”

“It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole,” said Glass. “I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits.”

Taliagerro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers’ unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He’d go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliagerro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions – running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliagerro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliagerro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliagerro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliagerro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliagerro’s contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master’s Degree from Howard University, Taliagerro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliagerro’s lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball’s five national championships.





TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX OPENS

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area will be permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

- One of 22 semifinalists for the 2019 George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, Tom Allen's 18 wins are the most for an Indiana head coach over his first three seasons.
- A 28-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016.
- Made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined IU's staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and he promptly went on to become a Broyles Award nominee.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from Indiana (2002).
- Over the past 25 seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 240-88 (.732).

2019 BREAKTHROUGH

- Guided IU to the 2020 TaxSlayer Bowl, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- The Hoosiers finished with an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark.
- Indiana reached eight wins for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 1993, and finished one win shy of matching the school record (1945, 1967).
- IU's five-conference wins tied for the third-most in program history, one off the school record of six (1967, 1987).
- The Hoosiers posted a winning conference mark for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and their first winning season overall since 2007 (7-6).
- On Nov. 10, Indiana entered the Associated Press Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.

HOOSIER HONORS

- In his three seasons as head coach, 32 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors.
- A school-record 13 collected 2017 all-conference accolades, including six defenders, which matched 2016's program mark.
- Cornerback Tiawan Mullen was named a 2019 True Freshman All-American.
- Seventeen Indiana players have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the past three seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018.
- Nine worked out over the last three NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Right guard Simon Stepaniak (6th round, Green Bay, 2020), right guard Wes Martin (4th round, Washington, 2019), tight end Ian Thomas (4th round, Carolina, 2018) and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas, 2018) have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- Coached eight IU standouts currently on NFL rosters.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr., kicker Griffin Oakes and linebacker Tegrays Scales garnered 2017 first-team all-league honors. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- A school-record 29 Hoosiers secured 2018 Academic All-Big Ten recognition and Allen's three-year mark stands at 66.
- Achieved unparalleled recruiting success. Indiana's 2019 signing class was the highest rated in program history, besting the previous top-ranked class of 2018, and included a record five four-star prospects.

LEADING THE IU DEFENSE (2016-18)

- Allen's defenses reached heights not seen in a generation in Bloomington.
- Continued to oversee the defense as head coach in 2017 and 2018, and his charges finished 2018 with 26 takeaways (T-11th nationally; T-2nd in the Big Ten), 13 fumble recoveries (T-5th; 2nd) and 13 interceptions (T-33rd; T-6th).

- During the 2016-17 campaigns, IU was the most improved team nationally in total defense (-169.4 ypg) and passing defense (-134.1 ypg), the sixth-most improved in third-down defense (-12.2 percent) and the ninth-most improved in points per game allowed (-12.3 ppg).
- The Hoosiers finished ninth nationally in third-down defense (29.9 percent – best program mark since 1992; 3rd in the Big Ten), 17th in passing defense (179.7 ypg – best program mark since 1995; 4th in the Big Ten) and 26th in total defense (340.1 ypg – best program mark since 1995) in 2017.
- Indiana ranked in the top six in the Big Ten in both total offense (6th) and total defense (6th) for the first time since 1991.
- Engineered one of the top defensive turnarounds in the country in 2016. IU improved in every major statistical category against a schedule featuring four Top-10 opponents, a program first.
- The Hoosiers held their opponents to 380.1 total yards, down 129.4 yards from 2015, the largest improvement in the country; limited their foes to 94.1 fewer passing yards, also first nationally; 10.4 fewer points, which ranked fourth nationally; and gave up 25 fewer touchdowns than in 2015.
- Led the program's first All-American at linebacker since 1987, Tegrays Scales (SI.com second-teamer).

AT SOUTH FLORIDA (2015)

- Defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida in 2015.
- South Florida posted an 8-5 record and earned a trip to the Miami Beach Bowl. Allen mentored three all-conference selections and the American Athletic Conference's top scoring defense (19.6 ppg in league play).
- In his lone season in Tampa, USF tied for 13th nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 14th in interceptions (17), 24th in takeaways (25) and 26th in sacks (2.62 per game), and was 31st in rushing defense (141.4 ypg), 34th in passing efficiency defense (118.76) and 35th in scoring defense (22.9 ppg).

AT OLE MISS (2012-14)

- Spent the 2012-14 campaigns as linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Ole Miss, where he coached All-SEC linebackers Serderius Bryant and Denzel Nkemdiche.
- The Rebels closed out 2014 with a 9-4 record and ranked No. 9 after they met No. 6 TCU in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Ole Miss spent nine weeks in the AP Top 10 with a high-water mark of No. 3.
- Additionally, the Rebels led the nation in scoring defense (13.8 ppg) and allowed a national-low 18 touchdowns.
- Ole Miss topped the SEC in five categories and ranked in the Top 20 nationally in 11, including 10th in red zone defense, 11th in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), 12th in takeaways (28), 13th in total defense (321.2 ypg) and 13th in defensive touchdowns scored (4).
- Worked with defensive coordinator Dave Wommack to help guide a huge improvement in the Rebels defense, which ranked last in the SEC in total defense before their arrival in 2011. Under their stewardship, Ole Miss consistently ranked among the top teams in the SEC and nationally in tackles for loss and sacks.
- Nkemdiche earned Freshman All-America honors and second-team AP All-SEC after leading the Rebels in tackles (82), TFLs (13.0), forced fumbles (4) and interceptions (3) in 2012.

In his nine seasons as a coach, Hart has tutored four 1,000-yard rushers, two Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year winners and the 2014 MAC Offensive Player of the Year, Jarvion Franklin.

• Coached wide receivers at Ole Miss from 2012-16 and has worked with Tom Allen at Ole Miss, Arkansas State and Lambuth. Six times Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors during Heard's time in Bloomington, highlighted by 2019 second-team selection Whop Philyor. Heard mentored 2015 Biletnikoff Award finalist Laquon Treadwell.

• A 26-plus year veteran, Hiller has coached 21 players who went on to the NFL. He has mentored right guard Simon Stepaniak, a sixth-round selection by the Green Bay Packers in the 2020 NFL Draft, left guard Wes Martin, a fourth-round selection by the Washington Redskins in the 2019 NFL Draft, and right tackle Brandon Knight, a 2019 free-agent signing of the Dallas Cowboys.

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



DON FISCHER

Don Fischer is in his 48th year as the "Radio Voice" of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 34 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield IMG College. In

addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball.

Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the recently announced 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times.

In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play by play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non alumni for distinguished service to the University. This past year IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,000 Indiana University games that include 11 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their pre-season television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 54 years with stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons, 12 grandchildren and one great grandchild. He and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr is entering his 16th season as the color commentator and analyst for Indiana University football.

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95)

as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 37th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 51st

year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAJK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University in June 2004.

In March 2020, Smith was given the IU Bicentennial Medal by President Michael A. McRobbie, awarded to organizations and individuals who, through their personal, professional, artistic or philanthropic efforts, have broadened the reach of Indiana University around the state, nation and world.

Smith has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

- Today's game kicked off the 135th season of Indiana Football.
- Indiana has won 14 of its last 16 season openers.
- Head coach **Tom Allen** is 2-1 in openers, with the lone loss coming in 2017 to No. 2 Ohio State.
- IU has won 15 of its last 16 non-conference games, including seven straight.
- Indiana leads the all-time series with the Cardinals, 7-3, and has won three-consecutive contests.
- IU is now 40-9-1 (.810) all-time against Mid-American Conference opponents.
- The Hoosiers won the coin toss and elected to defer.
- True freshmen **D.K. Bonhomme, David Ellis, Sampson James, Tiawan Mullen** and **Sean Wracher** made their Indiana debuts.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk**, fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains.

OFFENSE

- Redshirt freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** became the first IU freshman quarterback to start a season opener since Antwaan Randle El in 1998.
- Penix joined Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to reach the benchmark (Kellen Lewis, Bob Hoernschemeyer). The Tampa native finished with 326 yards on 24-of-40 with one touchdown. Penix added 67 yards on the ground for 393 total yards.
- His total yards and passing yards trail only Randle El for the most in a debut. Randle El posted 467 total yards and 385 passing yards against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- The Hoosiers reached the end zone for the first time in 2019 when Penix connected with fifth-year senior **Nick Westbrook** from 75 yards out in the first quarter. It marked Indiana's longest passing touchdown since Westbrook hauled in a 75-yarder from Richard Lagow vs. Wake Forest on Sept. 24, 2016.
- Westbrook now owns three 70-plus yard TDs (79, 75, 75), two of which have come against Ball State (79, Ball State in 2016), while the 75-yarder was a career-best for Penix.
- The Lake Mary, Fla., native went over 100 yards for the sixth time in his career with 103 on three receptions.
- **Stevie Scott III** reached the end zone twice, his third-career multi-score rushing game. The sophomore rushed for 48 yards, matched a career-best with three catches and set a career-high with 28 receiving yards.
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** set new career-highs with 69 yards and four receptions. Hendershot also hauled in a two-point conversion in the fourth quarter.
- Junior **Ty Fryfogle** set a new career-high with six receptions and finished with 41 yards.
- Junior **Whop Philyor** caught six balls for 66 yards and added a 22-yard rush.
- Penix, junior left guard Harry Crider and redshirt sophomore right tackle Caleb Jones made their first career starts.

DEFENSE

- Fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones** led the Hoosiers in tackles with a career-high 11, his first double-digit game.
- Redshirt junior husky **Marcelino Ball** matched his career-best for the fifth time with 10 stops.
- Sophomore safety **Devon Matthews** posted a career-high with nine tackles and six solos.
- Sophomore linebackers **Micah McFadden** (1 TFL) and Cam Jones (1 PBU, 1 QBH) also netted career-bests with six stops.
- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** secured the team's first sack of the season and the first of his career in the third quarter.
- Redshirt junior defensive lineman **Jerome Johnson** and redshirt freshman linebacker **James Miller** combined for a sack in the fourth quarter, and Johnson accounted for the team's final sack later in the stanza.
- Johnson tied his career-high with 1.5 sacks and five tackles. He now owns six career sacks, while Miller entered the sack column for the first time.
- Sophomore **Jaylin Williams** pulled in his second career interception in the fourth quarter, returning the pick 29 yards.
- With the INT, the Hoosiers have at least one takeaway in their last 19 games, the longest streak in the country, and at least one pick in 11 straight contests.
- Fifth-year senior cornerback **Andre Brown Jr.** posted four stops to push his career total to 101.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive end **Alfred Bryant**, redshirt sophomore defensive tackle **Juan Harris**, sophomore defensive end **James Head Jr.**, sophomore safety **Devon Matthews** and sophomore linebacker **Micah McFadden** made their first career starts.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Fifth-year senior **Logan Justus** put the Hoosiers first points of 2019 on the board with a then-career-long 48-yard field goal in the opening quarter. He then went on to best that twice, including a 49-yarder in the second quarter and a 50-yarder in the fourth quarter. Justus also added a 30-yard field goal to finish the game with a career-high four, tying the single-game Indiana record.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native collected his second game with at least three field goals, and is now 19-of-22 in his career (86.3 percent). Justus recorded his sixth-career multi-FG game and his fourth in five games, and he has hit 12 of his last 13 attempts.
- Justus is the 11th Hoosier (22nd time) to record a 50-yarder.
- Freshman **David Ellis** returned four kicks for 104 yards. In addition, he completed a two-point conversation on a pass to **Peyton Hendershot** in the fourth quarter.
- Fifth-year senior **Haydon Whitehead** averaged 51.7 yards on three punts. Whitehead recorded a career-best 63-yard effort in the fourth quarter and had two punts downed inside the 10-yard line.

- The 52-point margin of victory was the most in Memorial Stadium history, eclipsing the 51-point win the Hoosiers had over Missouri (58-7) on Sept. 22, 1990. It was also IU's largest margin of victory since a 54-0 blanking of Nebraska in Bloomington on Oct. 14, 1944.
- Indiana is 42-18 in Memorial Stadium openers with wins in 16 of its last 18 and 33 of its last 38.
- The Hoosiers improved to 2-0 for the second-straight season, the second time under head coach **Tom Allen** and the fourth time in the past five campaigns.
- Today marked the first meeting between the two programs.
- IU has won 16 of its last 17 non-conference games, including eight straight.
- The 1979 Holiday Bowl championship team held its 40-year reunion this weekend.
- Indiana received the ball first for the first time this season after Eastern Illinois won the coin toss and deferred to the second half.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk**, fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains. The four are the Hoosiers season captains.
- The 1979 Holiday Bowl championship team captains served as today's honorary captains: quarterback Tim Clifford, fullback Tony D'Orazio, linebacker Terry Tallen and defensive end Brent Tisdale.
- True freshmen **Sio Nofogato'a**, **Beau Robbins**, **Josh Sanguinetti** and **Larry Tracy III**, made their season debuts to push the number of Indiana true freshmen seeing the field in 2019 to nine.

OFFENSE

- The 52 points scored in a home opener was the most for IU since beating Indiana State, 73-35, on Aug. 29, 2013.
- Indiana scored 35 points in the first half, its first half over 30 points since a 31-point opening 30 minutes against Georgia Southern on Sept. 23, 2017.
- The Hoosiers posted 21 points in the first quarter, their first time with 21-or-more in a quarter since the final stanza at Minnesota on Oct. 26, 2018 (22 points).
- Redshirt freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** completed 14-of-20 (70.0 percent) for 197 yards and two touchdowns in just under one half of play. The multi-TD game was the first of his career.
- On his first pass of 2019, redshirt junior **Peyton Ramsey** hit **Ronnie Walker Jr.** in the flat and Walker raced 64 yards for his first-career receiving score. It marked Ramsey's second-career 60-plus yard touchdown.
- Ramsey added a 43-yard TD to fifth-year senior **Donavan Hale** in the third quarter and closed out the afternoon 13-for-14 (92.9 percent), a new program single-game completion percentage mark, with 226 yards and a pair of TDs.
- The Cincinnati native moved into a share of eighth on the program's career passing scores list (31) and into ninth on the career passing yardage list (4,481).
- Hale went over 100 yards for the first time in his career with 110 yards on five receptions. The Largo, Fla., native owns nine career touchdowns.
- **Stevie Scott III** rushed for 61 yards on 12 attempts with a 5-yard TD. The sophomore has reached the end zone on the ground in seven-straight games, has three rushing scores in 2019 and 13 in his career.
- Tight end **Peyton Hendershot** hauled in his first touchdown of the year and the third of his career, from 8 yards out, in the second quarter. The redshirt sophomore made a career-high five grabs for 52 yards.
- Junior **Whop Philyor** tallied four catches for a season-high 75 yards.
- Redshirt freshman **Miles Marshall** opened the scoring with his first-career reception, a 10-yard TD.
- True freshman **Sampson James** scored his first career touchdown on a 1-yard run in the fourth.
- Redshirt freshman **Turon Ivy Jr.** set career-highs with the first three receptions of his career for 24 yards.
- True freshman **David Ellis** recorded the first two catches (26 yards) of his career.
- A total of 12 players had at least one reception in the game, while eight different players had at least one rush.
- Sophomore tight end **Matt Bjorson** made his first-career start.

DEFENSE

- Indiana recorded its first shutout since a 41-0 whitewashing of Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2017. It is the third shutout in the Tom Allen Era.
- The shutout was the first for the Hoosiers in a home opener since beating Toledo, 27-0, on Sept. 4, 1993.
- The shutout was the largest for IU since beating Nebraska, 54-0, on Oct. 14, 1944.
- The 116 total yards allowed are the fewest by Indiana dating back to 1966.
- The 64 yards passing allowed are the fewest since the Hoosiers allowed just 58 to Michigan on Oct. 14, 2017.
- The 52 rushing yards allowed are the fewest since IU allowed 33 at Illinois on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Indiana held EIU to -5 total yards in the first quarter - 0 passing and -5 rushing - and posted three-and-outs on all three of the Panthers drives. The Hoosiers posted eight total three-and-outs in the game.
- The Hoosiers' streak of at least one takeaway in 19 games, the longest streak in the country, and at least one pick in 11 straight contests, was snapped.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive end **Alfred Bryant** posted a pair of tackles for loss in the first quarter, his second-career, multi-TFL game.
- Sophomore defensive tackle **Demarcus Elliott** and sophomore defensive end **James Head Jr.** each recorded the first sacks of their careers in the opening quarter. Head added a half-sack in the second quarter.
- Elliott and sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** made their first-career starts.

SPECIAL TEAMS

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- Indiana improved to 4-2 (1-2 Big Ten) in 2019 with a 3-1 mark at Memorial Stadium. IU is outscoring opponents 125-3 in its three home victories this season.
- The Hoosiers are 45-56-6 in 107 Homecoming games.
- Indiana last won on Homecoming in 2010, a 36-34 victory over Arkansas State on Oct. 16.
- IU has won the last four games in the Rutgers series, owns a 4-2 overall lead and a 2-1 edge in Bloomington.
- **Reakwon Jones** scoop-and-score touchdown on the first play of the game was the first opening-play TD for the Hoosiers since Jahkeem Gilmore caught an 80-yard touchdown from Matt LoVecchio on Nov. 6, 2004, at Illinois.
- Today's score happened at the 14:50 mark in the first quarter and is believed to be the fastest TD scored in Memorial Stadium history.
- True freshman tight end **Gary Cooper** (1 catch for 2 yards) and true freshman defensive tackle **C.J. Person** (1 TFL), made their season debuts to push the number of Indiana true freshmen seeing the field in 2019 to 12.

OFFENSE

- Junior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** became the 46th player in Indiana football history to amass 1,000 career receiving yards. Philyor has 97 catches for 1,123 yards.
- Philyor compiled 10 receptions for a career-high 182 yards overall. The 100-yard game marked the fourth of his career and second in as many games.
- He is the first Indiana pass catcher since Ricky Jones to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. In 2016, Jones had 208 yards against Wake Forest on Sept. 24, and 124 yards against Michigan State on Oct. 1. Philyor's two-game stretch of 24 catches is the most over a two-game stretch in school history and his 324 yards are the second-most.
- The game marked the fourth time Philyor has hauled in at least 10 receptions in a single game, which extended his program record. He made 14 grabs last time out at Michigan State and is the first Hoosier to record back-to-back 10-plus catch games.
- Indiana compiled a season-high 557 yards of total yards of offense. The game marks the second time this season in which the Hoosier offense compiled at least 500 yards of offense after collecting 555 yards of offense in the 52-0 victory over Eastern Illinois on Sept. 7.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** finished the game with 20 completions on 29 attempts for 282 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. His TD total matched a career-high and marked the second time this season he threw for three scores.
- Sophomore running back **Stevie Scott III** registered 12 carries for 164 yards (13.7 average). The rushing total marked the seventh time in Scott's career in which he has rushed for 100-plus yards and his first time this season.
- Junior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** nabbed his first receiving touchdown of the season with a 10-yard scoring grab in the third quarter. The catch was his fourth-career touchdown and first since Nov. 17, 2018 at Michigan.
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** hauled in his fourth touchdown reception of the season and the sixth of his career on a 14-yard TD reception in the first quarter. He has caught a touchdown in four of the last five games for the Hoosiers.
- Fifth-year senior **Nick Westbrook** brought in his third touchdown of the season and the 14th of his career on a 19-yard TD in the first quarter. His career total ties Bill Malinchak, Duane Gunn and Rob Turner for ninth in program history in career receiving touchdowns.
- True freshman running back **Sampson James** scored his second-career rushing TD on a 1-yard plunge in the third quarter.
- Indiana went on a 13-play, 98-yard scoring drive that covered 7:07 on the clock in the third quarter. The drive was the longest-scoring drive for the Hoosiers in both yardage and time. It marked the second 13-play scoring drive in as many weeks and was the third 90-plus yard scoring drive of the season for IU.

DEFENSE

- Indiana held Rutgers to 5-for-13 passing for one yard. The passing total is the lowest output for a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team this season and the lowest figure IU has yielded against a Big Ten Conference opponent since holding Minnesota to 0 yards on Oct. 19, 1985.
- The Hoosiers have blanked Rutgers in each of RU's last two trips to Memorial Stadium after defeating the Scarlet Knights, 41-0, on Nov. 18, 2017. The last time Indiana shut out a Big Ten opponent in back-to-back home games was in 1991 and 1993 against Michigan State.
- The shutout is the fourth for IU since the start of the 2017 season.
- The Hoosiers held Rutgers to 75 total yards, the fewest allowed dating back to 1966.
- With the first-quarter fumble recovery, Indiana has recorded at least one takeaway in 22 of the last 24 games played.
- Indiana racked up 14 tackles for loss, the first double-digit effort since stopping Purdue 11 times behind the line of scrimmage on Nov. 24, 2018. The TFL total marked the most for an Indiana defense since IU had a school-record 16 tackles for loss against Penn State on Nov. 12, 2016.
- The defense compiled six sacks in the game, the most since securing eight against Illinois on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Rutgers did not convert on a third-down play in 11 attempts. It is the first time on record that Indiana has not allowed a third-down conversion to an opposing offense.
- Sophomore defensive lineman **Demarcus Elliott** totaled a career-high three tackles for loss, including his third sack of the season. His first-quarter strip sack set up Indiana's first touchdown and marked his first-career forced fumble.
- Fifth-year senior **Reakwon Jones** recovered his second-career fumble and took it 17 yards for his first-career touchdown. The scoop-and-score marked the fifth defensive TD for Indiana since **Tom Allen** came to Bloomington ahead of the 2016 season.
- It marked the Hoosiers second defensive TD of 2019 (**Cam Jones** 44-yard INT return) and the defense's first fumble return for a score since Andre Brown Jr. vs. Georgia Southern on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Jones also recorded his first sack of the season. The sack marked the second of his career.
- Sophomore linebacker **Cam Jones** registered his first two sacks in his career to go along with a team-high and career-high six solo stops and a quarterback hurry. He is the first Hoosier since Marcelino Ball to record two sacks in a game. Ball secured two sacks against Michigan State on Sept. 22, 2018.
- Junior defensive end **Michael Ziemba** posted a career-best five tackles, with a half-TFL.
- Senior defensive lineman **Allen Stallings IV** recorded his third sack of the season and the eighth of his career.
- Redshirt freshman linebacker **Aaron Casey** recorded his first-career sack.
- Redshirt sophomore safety **Juwan Burgess**, sophomore cornerback **Jaylin Williams** and true freshman cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** earned their first-career starts.

- Indiana holds a 6-2 advantage in the series with a 3-1 road mark.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk** (injured), fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains. The four are the team's season captains.
- Maryland won the coin toss and elected to defer. IU is 4-2 when receiving the ball first.

OFFENSE

- Indiana reached 30 points for the sixth time in seven games, 500 yards (520) for the third time and 300 passing yards (334) for the third time.
- IU scored (TD) on its opening offensive possession for the fourth time (3 TDs) in seven games.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **Peyton Ramsey** finished the game completing 20-of-27 passes (74.1 percent) for 193 yards and a 26-yard touchdown. He added 46 yards on the ground on eight carries.
- Ramsey moved into a tie for fifth in school history with 35 career TD passes and sixth with 759 career attempts.
- Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Donavan Hale** hauled in his third touchdown of the season on a 28-yard strike from redshirt freshman quarterback **Michael Penix Jr.** with 13:03 to play in the first quarter. The TD grab was the 11th of his career.
- Fifth-year senior **Nick Westbrook** has racked up 123 career receptions for 1,948 yards after he compiled six catches for 75 yards and the 26-yard score.
- His second-quarter touchdown gave him four on the season and 15 for his career. His career mark moves him into a tie with **Trent Smock** and **Ted Bolser** for seventh in program history.
- Westbrook made the 30th start of his career.
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** established a career-high with six receptions for a career-best 95 yards.
- Sophomore running back **Stevie Scott III** carried the ball 18 times for 108 yards and two touchdowns. The 100-yard game was the eighth of his career, second of the season, and the third time in his career in which he secured at least two-straight games of 100-plus yards. Scott has tallied four multi-touchdown games in his career.
- The scores marked his sixth of the season and 16th of his career. Scott has registered a rushing TD in nine of the last 12 games and has totaled 12 scores in those 12 games.
- Scott set a career-high with five receptions for a career-best 36 yards.
- Junior **Ty Fryfogle** posted a season-high 63 yards on four catches.
- Junior **Harry Crider** made his first-career start (7th overall) at center.

DEFENSE

- After yielding 239 yards of total offense in the first half, the Hoosiers defense buckled down and held Maryland to 144 yards in the second half. The Terrapins tallied just 48 total yards of offense and committed two turnovers in the final quarter of the game.
- Redshirt sophomore safety **Juwan Burgess** matched a career-best outing with four solo tackles. His fourth-quarter forced fumble was his second of the season and his career. He recovered the loose ball for his second-career fumble recovery and his first of 2019.
- Sophomore cornerback **Reese Taylor** sealed the game with his first-career interception. The pick came with 1:00 left in the game as Maryland was attempting to drive in for the winning score. Reese also totaled a career-best three solo stops in the game.
- Sophomore linebacker **Micah McFadden** set a career-high with five solo tackles. His five stops tied for the team lead.
- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** set a career-high with two tackles for loss and matched a career-best with one sack. The sack marked the second of his career. He finished the game with three tackles (2 solo).
- Redshirt junior husky **Marcelino Ball** recorded his first sack of the season in the third quarter. He has 3.5 sacks in his career. Ball also tallied five total tackles, tied for the team lead, with four solo stops.

- Justus is now 24-of-27 on field goals (88.9 percent) and 59-of-60 on PATs (98.3 percent). His 24 career field goals are tied for ninth in program history and his 59 PATs are 10th on the program's career list.
- The McCordsville, Ind., native has converted nine-straight field goals, a career-best streak, and a mark that ranks tied for the sixth-longest streak in IU history.

- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk** (injured), fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains. The four are the team's season captains.
- Indiana won the coin toss for the second time season and elected to defer for the second time. IU is 1-0 when winning the coin toss.

OFFENSE

- Indiana reached 30 points for the seventh time in its first eight games, a program record, and for the fifth time in as many games, its longest streak since the final four games of 2015 and the first two games of 2016.
- The Hoosiers passed for 351 yards, their fourth game with 300-plus yards in 2019.
- IU scored (FG) on its opening offensive possession for the third-straight game and the fifth time (3 TDs) in eight games.
- Redshirt junior **Peyton Ramsey** finished the afternoon 27-for-40 (67.5 percent) for a career-high 351 yards, his fourth 300-yard game, with two passing touchdowns (37 career, 8 in 2019) and one rushing TD (8 career, 1 in 2019). It is his 12th career multi-passing score game, and the seventh game of his career with a passing and a rushing touchdown.
- The Cincinnati native added 42 rushing yards for a career-high 393 total yards.
- Ramsey moved into fourth in career completions (535), fifth in passing touchdowns (37) and 300-yard games (4), seventh in total offense (6,022) and eighth in passing yardage (5,321) on the school's career charts. He also sits first in completion percentage (67.0) and sixth in attempts (799).
- Junior **Whop Philyor** collected his third 10-reception game (IU single-season record) and third 100-yard game of the season (T-8th IU single-season list) with 14 for 178.
- Philyor owns five-career games with 10-or-more catches, which extended his Indiana record, and has reached the century mark five times, which shares 12th in program history.
- The Tampa native became the 28th Hoosier to record 100 receptions and is the 27th with 100 catches (113) and 1,000 yards (1,307).
- Junior **Ty Fryfogle** hauled in his second touchdown of 2019 and the fifth of his career in the second quarter. He made four receptions for a career-high 75 yards.
- True freshman **David Ellis** collected his first-career touchdown on a 1-yard rush in the third quarter.
- Sophomore tight end **Matt Bjorson** brought in his first-career TD from 2 yards out to close out the third quarter.
- Sophomore running back **Stevie Scott III** scored from eight yards out in the fourth quarter, his seventh score of the season and the 17th of his career. Scott has registered a rushing TD in 10 of the last 13 games and has totaled 13 scores in those 13 games.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native posted a career-high 41 receiving yards on four catches. Scott added 68 yards on the ground.

DEFENSE

- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** recorded his third sack of the season and of his career in the second quarter, and stripped Nebraska quarterback Noah Vedral for his first-career forced fumble.
- Senior defensive end **Allen Stallings IV** recovered, the first of his career, and returned it 68 yards to set up an IU touchdown on the next play.
- The 68-yard return is the Hoosiers longest since cornerback Tracy Porter scored on a 76-yard return at Michigan State on Oct. 13, 2007.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman **Alfred Bryant** forced his second-career fumble and redshirt sophomore **Juwan Burgess** made his third-career recovery and second in as many weeks in the fourth quarter.
- Indiana has a takeaway in 24 of its last 26 games and has eight takeaways in 2019 with five fumble recoveries and three interceptions. IU has two multi-takeaway games in 2019, in back-to-back weeks.
- The Hoosiers scored 31 points off of the eight takeaways.
- Sophomore linebacker **Micah McFadden** recorded career-highs with 11 tackles and 10 solo stops.
- Senior safety **Khalil Bryant** also notched a career-high with 10 tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Indiana's career field goal percentage leader **Logan Justus** opened the scoring with a 22-yarder to improve to 10-for-10 on the season. The McCordsville, Ind., native's 10-straight field goals share fourth in program history.
- Justus is now 25-of-28 on field goals (89.1 percent) and 62-of-64 on PATs (96.9 percent). His 25 career field goals are good for ninth in program history and his 62 PATs are 10th on the program's career list.
- Fifth-year senior **Haydon Whitehead** punted three times and dropped all three inside the 10-yard line (8, 7, 3). Whitehead has landed three inside the 5-yard line and 11 inside the 10-yard line on the season.

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- Indiana improved to 7-2, 4-2 in the Big Ten and 4-1 at Memorial Stadium.
- IU clinched its first winning season since 2007 (7-6) and has won seven games for just the 13th time in program history. The Hoosiers own five eight-win (1993, 1988, 1987, 1979, 1905) and two nine-win (1967, 1945) campaigns.
- The 7-2 record is Indiana's best opening-game mark since 1993 (7-2) and tied for the fourth-best in program history (1987, 1993). The 1945 (8-0-1), 1967 (8-1) and 1905 (7-1-1) teams hold the Top-3 spots.
- IU's conference and home records are its best five-game starts since the 1993 team posted the same 4-2 and 4-1 marks.
- The Hoosiers have won four-straight league games for the first time since 1993 and the seventh time ever. The four-consecutive wins are tied for the second-most in school history, behind the 1967 team's five-straight victories.
- Indiana has two 30-plus point Big Ten wins this season – Rutgers (35-0) and Northwestern (34-3) – for the first time since 2001 – at Wisconsin (63-32) and Northwestern (56-21).
- Tonight marked the first November night kickoff in Memorial Stadium history.
- IU defeated Northwestern for the first time since a 21-19 victory in Bloomington on Oct. 25, 2008.
- The Hoosiers unveiled a statue of the late George Taliaferro in George Taliaferro Plaza on Friday and wore his number 44 on the left side of the players helmets.
- Taliaferro's daughters Renee Buckner, Terri Johnson and Donna Taliaferro served as honorary game captains.
- Northwestern won the coin toss and elected to defer. Indiana improved to 5-1 when receiving the ball first.

OFFENSE

- Indiana reached 30 points for the eighth time in its first nine games, a program record, and for the sixth time in as many games, tied for the longest streak in school history (last 4 of 2015 and first 2 of 2016).
- The eight 30-point games are tied for the second-most in an IU single season (1988, 2007, 2013). The 2015 offense produced nine 30-point contests.
- IU scored (FG) on its opening offensive possession for the fourth-straight game and the sixth time (3 TDs) in nine games (30 points).
- The Hoosiers first scoring drive covered 11 plays and 5:21. Indiana has 14 double-digit scoring drives and seven drives resulting in points of over 5:00 this year.
- Sophomore running back **Stevie Scott III** reached the end zone twice on the ground, which gives him nine in 2019 and 19 in his career (9th in program history). Scott has three multi-TD rushing games this year and five in his career. He has registered a rushing score in 11 of the last 14 games and has totaled 16 touchdowns (15 rushing, 1 receiving) in those 14 games.
- The Syracuse, N.Y., native added a 20-yard receiving TD in the third stanza, his second-career receiving score and first of the year, for his first-career three-touchdown game.
- Scott rushed 26 times for 116 yards and made one catch for 20 yards. He has three 100-yards games this year and nine in his career, which is tied for 10th in school history.
- Redshirt freshman **Michael Penix Jr.** went 10-of-15 for 162 yards with his second rushing TD of the season in just under two quarters of action.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **Peyton Ramsey** came in relief late in the second quarter and completed 7-of-10 passes for 108 yards and one score.
- The two quarterbacks combined to complete 17-of-25 passes (68.0 percent) for 270 yards and one touchdown. IU has thrown for 270-plus yards in 7-of-9 games, including a stretch of five-straight contests. Indiana is 6-1 in those seven games.
- Fifth-year senior **Nick Westbrook** became the ninth Hoosier to reach 2,000 receiving yards and the first since Shane Wynn (2011-14). Westbrook owns 128 receptions and 2,007 yards, which is 9th in IU history. He is one of seven Hoosiers with 125 receptions and 2,000 yards.
- Westbrook caught a game-high-sharing five passes for 59 yards in the game.
- Junior wide receiver **Ty Fryfogle** tallied four receptions for 49 yards, while junior wide receiver **Whop Philyor** added two catches for a team-high 76 yards.

DEFENSE

- The Hoosiers yielded three total points in their last two Big Ten home victories, marking the second-lowest, two-game home Big Ten opponent scoring output in a single-season and lowest since IU blanked Minnesota (6-0) and Michigan State (6-0) on Nov. 1 and Nov. 8, 1958.
- Indiana has held four opponents: Eastern Illinois (52-0), Connecticut (38-3), Rutgers (35-0) and Northwestern (34-3), to three points or less this season, which marks the most since holding five opponents to three points or less in the 1945 season.
- IU recorded its first three-takeaway game of 2019 with three fumble recoveries. It marked the first time the Hoosiers have recovered three fumbles since its victory over Maryland on Nov. 10, 2018.
- Indiana has a takeaway in 25 of its last 27 games and has 11 takeaways this season with eight fumble recoveries and three interceptions. IU has three multi-takeaway games this year, all in the last three weeks.
- True freshman cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** forced the first fumble of his career and junior defensive end **Michael Ziemba** made the recovery, the first of his career, on Northwestern's opening drive. Ziemba tallied one tackle for loss to give him five for the season and six for his career.
- In the second quarter, sophomore linebacker **Cam Jones** forced a fumble, the third of his career, and Mullen collected his first recovery. Jones added his fourth tackle for loss of his career and his season.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive end **Alfred Bryant** closed out the first half with his first recovery of 2019 and the second of his career.
- IU has scored 45 points off of the 11 takeaways.
- Redshirt junior husky **Marcelino Ball** led the team with five total tackles (4 solo). The game marks his third-straight with at least five stops and fourth of the season. Ball added one pass breakup.
- Senior defensive end **Allen Stallings IV** tallied his fourth sack of the season and the ninth of his career in the third quarter.
- Redshirt junior defensive tackle **Jerome Johnson** secured three tackles and one TFL.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Indiana's career field goal percentage leader **Logan Justus** connected on both of his field goal attempts, his third multi-FG game of 2019 (8 career), to improve to 12-for-12 on the season. The McCordsville, Ind., native's 12-straight field goals are second in program history. Austin Starr made 15-consecutive kicks in 2007.
- Justus is now 27-of-30 on field goals (90.0 percent) and 66-of-68 on PATs (97.1 percent). His 27 career field goals and his 66 PATs are ninth on the program's career list.

OFFENSE

- IU scored (TD) on its opening offensive possession for the sixth-straight game and the eighth time (five TDs) in 11 games (44 points).
- The game-opening scoring drive covered 10 plays, 75 yards, and 4:53 of game time. The drive marked the 17th scoring drive of the season for the Hoosiers of at least 10 plays.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **Peyton Ramsey** finished the game completing 17-of-29 for 217 yards and one interception. He added a second-quarter touchdown rush, his fourth of the season and of the 11th of his career.
- Ramsey became the sixth QB in program history to surpass the 6,000-yard mark. He now has 6,017 and became the first to do eclipse 6,000 since Nate Sudfeld (2012-15).
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** had six receptions for 62 yards. He now has 42 catches, which ranks third on IU's single-season list for tight ends and 506 yards, which also ranks third.
- Sophomore running back **Stevie Scott III** compiled 54 yards rushing on 13 carries and one score. His first-quarter rushing touchdown marked his 10th of the season and 20th of his career. He ranks tied for eighth (Trent Green) in school history in career rushing scores.
- Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** secured two catches for 49 yards. - Indiana wins the Old Oaken Bucket for the first time since 2016 and for the first time on the road since 2015.
- IU finished the decade with a 6-4 mark against Purdue.
- This is the second overtime game in the Bucket series (2010) and the first double-OT game.
- The Hoosiers improved to 4-7 all-time in overtime games.
- They last played in an overtime game against Michigan on Oct 14, 2017, a 27-20 loss, and their first double-overtime game since a 48-41 loss against Michigan on Nov. 14, 2015.
- Indiana closed the regular season with an 8-4 overall record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark.
- IU has won eight games for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 1993. The Hoosiers own six eight-win (1993, 1988, 1987, 1979, 1905) and two nine-win (1967, 1945) campaigns.
- The Hoosiers fifth-conference win is tied for their third-most in program history (1993, 1991, 1988, 1979, 1945). The school record for conference wins is six (1987, 1967).
- Indiana posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3).
- IU will play in its third bowl game in five seasons.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk** (injured), fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, redshirt junior quarterback **Peyton Ramsey**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains. The five are the team's season captains.
- Indiana improved to 4-2 when its opponent receives the ball first.

OFFENSE

- Indiana reached 30 points for the ninth time this season, tying the 2015 Hoosiers for the program record.
- IU scored (TD) on its opening offensive possession for the seventh-straight game and the ninth time (6 TDs) in 12 games (51 points).
- The game-opening drive covered 12 plays, 91 yards and 6:44 of game time. It marked the Hoosiers third-longest drive of the year and their fifth of 90-plus yards.
- Indiana's second scoring drive also took 10-plus plays (11) and over 5:00 (5:09) to give it 11 drives over 10 and 5:00 in 2019.
- **Peyton Ramsey** finished 23-of-39 for 337 yards, his sixth-career 300-yard passing game, with a career-high-tying three touchdowns (5th time). He added 42 yards on the ground with a career-high-tying two scores (2nd time).
- It marked his first-game with five total TDs, the first for a Hoosier since Tre Roberson's six on Nov. 30, 2013, against Purdue, and his ninth-career game (3rd this season) with at least one passing and one rushing TD.
- The redshirt junior has 42 career passing touchdowns, tied with Antwaan Randle El for fourth-most in school history, and 13 career rushing scores. He is the fifth Hoosier to surpass 40 passing scores and the first since Nate Sudfeld (61, 2012-15).
- Ramsey moved into fifth in IU history with 7,132 total yards, surpassing Steve Bradley's mark of 6,943 (1983-85). He ranks second in program history with 613 career completions, trailing only Ben Chappell (651, 2007-10) on the all-time list. Ramsey moved into a tie with six other Hoosiers for third (most recently, Richard Lagow in 2016) with three 300-yard passing games in a single season.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio, native is the second quarterback in IU history to accumulate 600 career completions, 7,000 total yards and 40 touchdown tosses, joining Chappell.
- **Whop Philyor** became the seventh Hoosier with 1,000 receiving yards and sits seventh on the single-season list with 1,001. The junior finished with eight receptions for 138 yards and two touchdowns, his second multi-TD game of the season and his career.
- Philyor reached 100 yards for the fourth time in 2019, tied for the sixth-most in IU history, and the sixth time in his career, tied for the seventh-most in Indiana history.
- The Tampa native moved into sixth on the single-season receptions list with 69. He is the 13th pass-catcher in program history to record at least 125 career receptions and 1,500 career yards.
- **Sampson James** became the 13th IU true freshman to surpass 100 rushing yards. He rushed for 118 yards on 22 attempts (5.4 average) with one touchdown in his first-career start. The rushing score was his third.
- Redshirt sophomore **Peyton Hendershot** moved into second place on the school's single-season list for tight ends in receptions (46) and yardage (555) after he hauled in four passes for 49 yards.
- Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** made the 35th start of his career. Westbrook tallied five receptions for 88 yards and a score in the contest.
- Westbrook has hauled in 140 career catches for 2,178 yards and 16 touchdowns. He topped Simmie Cobbs Jr. (139, 2014-17) for the eighth-most career receptions on the IU leaderboard and moved into sole possession of seventh in TDs.
- Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Miles Marshall** made the first start of his career. He compiled a career-high four receptions for a career-best 49 yards.
- Fifth-year senior right tackle **DaVondre Love** made the first start of his career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Caleb Jones** made the first start of his career at left tackle and his 12th overall.

DEFENSE

- With sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson's** first-quarter interception, Indiana has a takeaway in 28 of its last 30 games.
- Johnson picked off his first pass of 2019 and the second of his career.
- True freshman cornerback **Tiawan Mullen** forced and recovered a fumble on Purdue's opening, third-quarter possession to give him two forces and recoveries on the year. He led the Hoosiers with career-bests in tackles (8), solos (6), TFLs (2.5), and pass breakups (4, tied).
- IU has 15 takeaways this season with 10 fumble recoveries and five interceptions.
- The Hoosiers scored seven points off of the takeaways and have scored 52 points off of the 15 takeaways overall.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Jerome Johnson** picked up his fourth sack of the season and now owns 8.5 in his career. He charted a career-best seven stops and two for loss.
- Sophomore safety **Devon Matthews** notched a career-high-tying solos, while fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones** tallied five solos, one TFL, and one PBU in the victory.

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- The Hoosiers played in their first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- IU's 16 points in the third quarter are tied for the second-most points scored in any quarter of a bowl game in program history. IU scored 17 in the second quarter of the 2015 Pinstripe Bowl and 16 in the fourth quarter of the 2007 Insight Bowl.
- Indiana played in its third bowl game in five seasons.
- The Hoosiers posted their first winning campaign since 2007 (7-6).
- IU won eight games for just the eighth time in program history and the first time since 1993. The Hoosiers own six eight-win (1993, 1988, 1987, 1979, 1905) and two nine-win (1967, 1945) campaigns.
- Senior left tackle **Coy Cronk**, fifth-year senior linebacker **Reakwon Jones**, redshirt junior quarterback **Peyton Ramsey**, fifth-year senior right guard **Simon Stepaniak** and fifth-year wide receiver **Nick Westbrook** served as game captains. The five are the team's season captains.
- Indiana won the coin toss for the fourth time this season and elected to defer for the fourth time.

OFFENSE

- Indiana's first touchdown drive took 10-plus plays (11) and over 5:00 (5:09) to give it 12 drives over 10 and 5:00 in 2019.
- Redshirt sophomore tight end **Peyton Hendershot** caught six passes for 67 yards. He set the Indiana single-season tight ends record with 643 yards and 55 receptions (Bob Stephenson, 1979). Hendershot also shares third with four touchdowns.
- Hendershot reached the five-catch mark for the sixth time in 2019.
- **Peyton Ramsey** put the Hoosiers in the end zone for the first time in the ballgame with a 1-yard touchdown run, his seventh of the season and the 14th of his career.
- The redshirt junior finished with 227 passing yards and 54 rushing yards en route to being named Indiana's Most Valuable Player in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
- Ramsey finished the season completing 204-of-300 passes (68.0 percent) to break the single-season record for completion percentage. He now holds the top three spots after completing 295-of-447 (66.0 percent) in 2018 and 134-of-205 (65.4 percent) in 2017.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio, native has totaled 6,581 passing yards, the fourth-most in program history. He also ranks fourth among team leaders in career total offense with 7,411 yards.
- Fifth-year senior **Nick Westbrook** finished his career with four catches for 48 yards. His career receiving yardage (2,226) is good for sixth on the all-time Hoosier leaderboard, while his career receptions (144) are seventh.
- Sophomore tight end **Matt Bjorson** matched a career-high in receptions after hauling in two grabs for 12 yards.

DEFENSE

- Sophomore husky **Jamar Johnson** scored Indiana's first defensive touchdown in its bowl history with a 63-yard interception return in the third quarter.
- Johnson finished with a team-high two INTs on the year, has three in his career and recorded his first pick-6.
- It marked IU's second interception return for a score this year. Sophomore linebacker **Cam Jones** picked off a pass and returned it 41 yards against UConn on Sept. 21.
- With sophomore linebacker **Micah McFadden's** second-quarter INT, Indiana has a takeaway in 29 of its last 31 games.
- The Hoosiers scored a field goal off of the McFadden pick and scored 67 points off of the 18 takeaways overall.
- IU has 18 takeaways this season with 10 fumble recoveries and eight interceptions.
- Senior defensive end **Allen Stallings IV** made his first start of the season (ninth career).
- Redshirt junior defensive tackle **Jerome Johnson** recorded a team-best six tackles and his fifth sack of the season.
- Redshirt junior safety **Marcelino Ball** recorded four tackles (3 solos) to give the Roswell, Ga., native 201 total tackles in his career at Indiana.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Fifth-year senior kicker **Logan Justus** became the ninth Hoosier with 30 career field goals with a 24-yarder to end the first half, a 49-yarder in the third quarter and a 30-yarder in the fourth. Justus finished the year 17-of-21 (81.0 percent) and finished his career 32-of-39 (82.1 percent).
- Indiana's all-time career percentage leader also ranks eighth in extra points (75) and ninth in field goals. His 17 field goals share third on IU's single-season list, while his 45 PATs are tied for fourth and his 96 total points are tied for seventh.
- Justus finished the game 3-for-4 on field goals. His three made field goals established an IU program bowl record.
- Fifth-year senior punter **Haydon Whitehead** recorded four punts for 185 yards (46.2 yards per punt) with a long of 56 yards. He knocked one punt inside the 20-yard line.
