PENN STATE HOSTS IOWA IN GENERATIONS OF GREATNESS GAME

- OPENING KICK: Penn State will don its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms when it hosts Big Ten West Division foe Iowa Saturday. Coverage is set to begin at 3:30 p.m. on the Big Ten Network.
- NAIL-BITERS: Penn State has won the last six games against lowa, but the last three have each been decided by just one possession. In 2017, former Penn State quarterback Trace McSorley threw a "walk-off" touchdown as time expired for a 21-19 victory. In 2018, the Nittany Lion defense came up big late, as former safety Nick Scott made an interception on first-and-goal at the 3-yard line with 3:18 remaining to preserve a 30-24 win. Last season, former defensive lineman Robert Windsor recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks and S Jaquan Brisker's first interception as a Nittany Lion set up the game-deciding touchdown, as Penn State won, 17-12.
- WASHINGTON STARTING STRONG: True freshman WR Parker Washington is the only freshman (true
 and redshirt) to have three 70 or more-yard receiving yard games in his team's first four games this
 season. Additionally, he ranks among the top five of his classmates in receiving touchdowns (3), receiving
 yards per game (56.3) and receptions per game (4.8).
- OWEH MAKING STOPS: DL Jayson Oweh has made 27 tackles in the first four games, becoming just the second Penn State defensive lineman since 2000 to total 25 or more since DaQuan Jones in 2013 (25). His 6.8 tackles per game rank 12th in the nation among defensive linemen.
- **THE OPPOSITION:** lowa enters with a 2-2 record, bouncing back from a pair of season-opening losses decided by a combined five points with a pair of convincing wins decided by a combined 70 points. The Hawkeye defense ranks among the nation's best, allowing less than 15 points per game this season. The unit is highlighted by its pass defense, which has tallied an interception in each of its last 11 games since facing Penn State last season. On offense, lowa's 31.0-point scoring average is its best since 2002.

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of four current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 80-42 career record, with eight consecutive winning seasons, entering 2020.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- Under Franklin, Penn State is one of four teams (Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma) to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings in each of the last four seasons.
- Franklin has led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton) in the last four years, making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin's squads have won two New Year's Six bowl games in the last three years, making the Nittany Lions one of seven teams to do so.
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- Over the last four years, Penn State has 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program-best.
- Franklin has led Penn State to 32 home wins in the past five seasons to rank fourth in the FBS. Those 32 wins have included a trio of
 undefeated home slates.
- Franklin has 25 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first nine years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 81 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Penn State had six players selected in both the 2018 and 2019 NFL Draft and five players picked in 2020, marking the third-straight year that
 Penn State has had at least five draft picks, the first time that has happened since 1991-93. Penn State is only one of five programs to produce
 at least five draft picks in each of the last three drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last eight seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in the last four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall
 record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway
 Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first
 outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as
 Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the
 Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
 over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
 College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
 wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
 the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place. The figure surpassed the mark of 56 set in the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees. A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 for the 2020 semester, also a school record.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Additionally, 28 Nittany Lions earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2019.
- A total of 52 squad members compiled at least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2019, the third-highest semester total in program history.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

- · Ferentz is the longest-tenured head football coach in the nation and the winningest coach in lowa history.

- · Ferentz attended Upper St. Clair High School in Pittsburgh and graduated from Connecticut in 1978. He was a football captain and an Academic All-Yankee Conference linebacker at UConn.

- Iowa started the season 0-2, dropping its first contests by a combined five points, falling to Purdue, 24-20 and Northwestern, 21-20

lowa won the inaugural game, 19-0, in lowa City, and then Penn State swept five annual contests from 1971-75.

After splitting a home-and-home series in 1983 and 1984, the two teams did not meet again until Penn State joined the Big Ten Conference in 1993.

In the Big Ten era, the Nittany Lions are 11-9 against the Hawkeyes after winning the last six meetings for the longest winning streak for either team in the series. Penn State is 7-7 against Iowa in Happy Valley.

LAST MEETING

NO. 10/9 PENN STATE WINS AT NO. 17/18 IOWA, 17-12

Relentless pressure from defensive tackle Robert Windsor, a pair of second-half takeaways and big fourth-quarter runs by then-freshman running back Noah Cain led No. 10/9 Penn State to a 17-12 win over No. 17/18 Iowa.

The Nittany Lions led 7-6 at halftime and secured the win by adding 10 points on a pair of scores following the two lowa turnovers. It was the Nittany Lions' first win over a ranked opponent in a true road game since 2013.

Windsor recorded six tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks with two quarterback pressures to lead the Nittany Lion defense. Fellow DT PJ Mustipher made a career-high seven tackles and forced a fumble that linebacker Jan Johnson recovered in the third quarter, leading to a field goal. In the fourth, safety Jaquan Brisker tallied his first interception as a Nittany Lion, leading to Cain's gameclinching touchdown. Cain had 15 carries for 67 yards and the touchdown in the fourth guarter alone.

lowa scored first on a field goal late in the first guarter, but the Nittany Lions found their offensive stride in the second guarter with a 15-play, 85-yard

touchdown drive. The Lions converted a trio of third downs on the drive, including a third-and-7 on a 22-yard touchdown reception by KJ Hamler. Hamler ran down the right sideline and hurdled a defender for the score.

lowa threatened to retake the lead before the halftime break, completing a 36yard pass to Ihmir Smith-Marsette down to the Penn State 4-yard line, but Yetur Gross-Matos and Windsor moved the Hawkeyes back a yard on a running play, and then a pair of incompletions forced them to settle for a field goal.

An lowa turnover in the third quarter allowed Penn State to extend its lead to 10-6 with 2:08 remaining in the frame with a field goal by lowa-native Jake Pinegar.

Penn State went ahead 17-6 in the fourth quarter following Brisker's interception. On the ensuing possession, Cain scored on a 5-yard touchdown run with 5:17 remaining.

lowa scored a touchdown with 2:31 remaining, but Penn State ran out the clock with five-straight rushes from Cain, including a 5-yard run on third-and-3.

- Penn State is turning back the clock for its "Generations of Greatness" game, as the Nittany Lions will don uniforms with design elements from uniforms past.
- Penn State is wearing its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms for the third time in the last four seasons. The threads debuted in 2017 against Indiana (W, 45-14) and Penn State donned them again last season against Purdue (W, 35-7).

Uniform Elements

- Numbers on Helmets The Nittany Lions had the number on the side of their helmet from 1959-61 and then again from 1967-74. A No. 42 also appeared on the side of every Penn State helmet in the season finale against Wisconsin in 2012 to honor injured senior Michael Mauti.
- Block Uniform Numbers The block uniform numbers are similar to those uniform numbers that donned the Blue & White from mid-1950s-66
- White Stripe on Sleeve Penn State's uniform had a white stripe on the sleeve several times, including 1957-66, 1982-89 and 1992-2011
- Stripe on the Pants The Nittany Lions had a blue stripe on their pants from 1952-68.
- Gray Facemask The gray facemask was donned by the Nittany Lions from 1959-86.
- White Cleats The white cleats were worn by the Nittany Lions in the 1979 Sugar Bowl.
- Gloves The gloves will feature the Lion Shrine on the palm of the hands
- · Lion Shrine The image of Lion Shrine appears on the "home plate" of the front of the jersey. It is an original element of the "Generations of Greatness" uniform to pay homage to the Lion Shrine that was a gift from the Class of 1940.
- Back Inside Collar The back inside collar of the jersey reads "Penn State 1959" in recognition of the first Liberty Bowl game, played in Philadelphia. Penn State defeated Alabama, 7-0.

- Penn State is 13-5 against the Big Ten West Division since it was formed in 2014.

- Penn State's iconic S-Zone is a staple of college football and has taken many forms over the years. This year, thanks to the Lion Ambassadors, the Penn State Alumni Association's student alumni corps, the S-Zone is a banner stretching across 800 seats above the team tunnel at Beaver Stadium.
- Through a partnership with the Penn State Alumni Association, Blue & White Society, and Lion Ambassadors, the banner honors the Class of 2020 and Class of 2021 and features the names of members of those classes.
- This S-Zone banner is designed to celebrate and pay homage to both of these classes, who saw their Penn State experiences altered significantly in this past year. In the absence of fans, it also will help to show support for Penn State's student-athletes and coaches who will compete in Beaver Stadium this season.
- The banner is in place in Beaver Stadium through the end of this 2020 season.

MILLEN ON BTN BROADCAST TEAM

- Former Penn State and NFL standout Matt Millen will be calling Saturday's meeting between the Nittany Lions and Terrapins.
- Millen earned first-team All-America honors as a junior in 1978, helping the unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Nittany Lions earn a berth vs. Alabama in the dramatic 1979 Sugar Bowl for the national title. Millen was a team co-captain in 1979, but missed most of his senior year with an injury. He also helped Penn State earn the first of two consecutive 11-1 records in 1977, capped by a win in the Fiesta Bowl.
- The Oakland Raiders selected Millen the second round of the 1980 NFL Draft to begin a 12-year career that would see him earn four Super Bowl rings. Millen played for the Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders (1980-88), San Francisco 49ers (1989-90) and Washington Redskins (1991). He was a Pro Bowl selection in 1988.
- Millen began his broadcasting career in 1992, working NFL games for CBS and then FOX. The Lehigh Valley native left broadcasting in 2001 and was team president of the Detroit Lions for the next eight years. Millen returned to broadcast booth as a college football and NFL analyst with ESPN and the NFL Network in 2009. He joined Fox Sports and BTN in 2015.

- The junior leads the Big Ten and ranks 25th nationally with five receiving touchdowns.
- Dotson's 388 receiving yards rank third in the Big Ten, and his 97.0 receiving yards per game rank fifth, as well as 28th in the FBS
- · Penn State WR Bobby Engram won the Biletnikoff Award in 1994. Engram was also a finalist for the award in 1995.

DOTSON PRODUCES EARLY

- WR Jahan Dotson's five touchdowns in the first three games of the season tied the Penn State record set by Joe Jurevicius in 1997.
- Among teams during their first four games, Dotson's 388 yards rank 19th nationally and his five touchdowns rank tied for sixth.
- Dotson's 5.8 receptions per game rank seventh in the Big Ten.

- Since 2000, the only other Penn State receiver to total at least 20 receptions, 375 yards receiving and five receiving touchdowns in the first four games of a season was Allen Robinson in 2012 (29 rec, 404 yds, 5 TD).
- Dotson was one of 22 players in the FBS and one of 14 in the Power Five to total at least 20 receptions, 350 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns in the first three games since 2000, and the first in the Big Ten to complete the feat.
- Dotson was the first Penn State football player to have a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of a season since Allen Robinson accomplished the feat in 2013 (vs. Syracuse, Eastern Michigan, UCF).
- Dotson's 388 yards receiving in the first four games of the season are the most by a Nittany Lion since Geno Lewis totaled 462 in the first four games of 2014.
- Dotson is averaging 16.9 yards per reception (minimum 20 catches) through his first four games of 2020, which ranks 12th nationally and fifth in the Power Five for a player's first four games of the 2020 season.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kirk Ciarrocca, defensive line coach John Scott Jr., wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield and offensive line coach Phil Trautwein.
- Ciarrocca spent the last three seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Minnesota. In 2019, the Golden Gophers posted a 10-win regular season for the first time since 1905, thanks in part to the third-highest scoring offense in program history and the second-most passing yards in a season by the Gophers.
- Scott joins the Nittany Lions after spending the previous three seasons in the SEC. He was the defensive line coach during the 2019 season at South Carolina and spent previous two seasons at Arkansas as the defensive tackles coach in 2018 and defensive line coach in 2017.
- Stubblefield comes from the University of Miami, where he was the wide receivers coach. Stubblefield is no stranger to the Big Ten, as he was a consensus All-American wide receiver as a player at Purdue. He finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions at the time and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards.
- Trautwein served as the offensive line coach for the last two seasons at Boston College. He guided all five of his starting offensive linemen to 2019 All-ACC honors. Trautwein was a twotime All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, where he won a pair of BCS National Championships in 2006 and 200

FRANKLIN NAMED TO DODD TROPHY PRESEASON WATCH LIST

- Head coach James Franklin was named to the 2020 Dodd Trophy Watch List, the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl announced. The list includes 18 of the nation's top college football coaches.
- The Dodd Trophy celebrates the head coach of a team who has success on the gridiron, while also stressing the importance of scholarship, leadership and integrity – the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's coaching philosophy. The watch list was created through a selection process by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, taking into consideration each program's graduation rate, commitment to service and charity in the community, projected success for the 2020 season and Academic Progress Rate (APR).

TOUCHDOWN TOSSES

- QB Sean Clifford's nine touchdown passes rank second in the Big Ten and 42nd in the FBS. Clifford was one of 13 FBS quarterbacks to throw for nine touchdowns in the first three games this season.
- Clifford is in sole possession of 10th place in program history with 34 TDs, moving ahead of Anthony Morelli (2004-07).
- Clifford had three passing touchdowns in each of the first three games this season and has nine career games with three or more passing scores.
- Clifford's career passing TD percentage of 7.46 currently ranks third all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford has five career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns.

DEPTH TESTED AT RUNNING BACK

- RB Journey Brown announced his medical retirement from football due to hypertrophic cardiomyopathy on Nov. 11, while RB Noah Cain suffered a season-ending injury on the first drive of the season at Indiana.
- Brown was on the 2020 Doak Walker, Hornung and Maxwell Award preseason watch lists, while Cain was also on the Doak Walker list.
- Brown finishes his career with the Nittany Lions having played 22 games, rushing for 934 yards on 137 attempts (6.8 average) and 13 touchdowns. In the final five games of his career, he ran for 593 yards on 78 carries (7.6) with seven touchdowns.
- Brown averaged 6.89 yards per carry in 2019 for the Nittany Lions, ranking fifth all-time at Penn State, while his 12 rushing touchdowns finished tied for 13th at PSU.
- Penn State ran for 396 yards in the Cotton Bowl, a programrecord for a bowl game and the second-most in Cotton Bowl history, and Brown was a big part of that. The Meadville, Pa, native set a Penn State bowl record with 202 yards in the Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis (12/28/19), topping Saquon Barkley's 194 yards in the 2017 Rose Bowl. The 202-yard rushing mark ranks sixth in Cotton Bowl history and he set a Penn State bowl record with 12.6 yards per carry in the game, shattering the previous mark of 8.6 yards per carry set by Curt Warner in the 1980 Fiesta Bowl.
- Cain set a Penn State freshman record last season with eight rushing touchdowns, passing D.J. Dozier (1983) and Saquon Barkley's (2015) seven. He also became the first Penn State freshman to run for 100 yards in back-to-back games (105 yards vs. Purdue; 102 yards at Iowa) since Barkley in 2015.

FORD AND TRUE FRESHMEN LEAD LAWNBOYZ

- With the losses of Journey Brown and Noah Cain, Penn State has relied on Devyn Ford as the starter with support from true freshmen Caziah Holmes and Keyvone Lee.
- The trio has combined for 76 carries for 389 yards and four touchdowns.
- Ford leads the trio with 53 carries for 207 yards and two touchdowns.
- At Nebraska, Holmes rushed for a career-high 50 yards on four carries, including a career-long 36-yard run.
- · Holmes has 18 carries for 95 yards in the first four games.
- Lee scored his first career touchdown at Nebraska on a careerlong 31-yard burst in the third quarter, and also set career highs with 49 yards on eight carries.
- Lee has 15 carries for 88 yards and the touchdown for the season.

DEFENSE NOTES

BEHIND THE LINE

- Penn State's 2.25 sacks per game rank fifth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State's nine sacks have been tallied by seven different players.
- DE Shaka Toney registered two sacks at Indiana.
- Toney has collected two or more sacks in four career games and has recorded two or more sacks in a quarter three times in his career (2018 at Indiana, 2019 vs. Purdue, 2020 at Indiana).
- Toney has 17.5 career sacks.
- Penn State's 3.27 sacks per game over the last five years (2015-20) trail only Clemson (3.33).
- Penn State's 229 sacks over the last six years (2015-20) are third only to Clemson (273) and Alabama (233).
- Over the last six years, Penn State has cumulated a 9.13 percent sack percentage (229 sacks on 2,507 plays), which ranks third behind Clemson (10.17%) and Michigan (9.59%).
- PSU posted five consecutive 40-plus sack seasons for the first time in program history after totaling 45 last season, 47 in 2018, 42 in 2017, 40 in 2016 and 46 in 2015.

LINEBACKER U'S NEW CLASS

- Penn State has three new starters at linebacker this season after Micah Parsons opted-out of the season and Cam Brown and Jan Johnson both exhausted their eligibility and moved on to the NFL.
- Brown (26 starts, 199 tackles), Johnson (26, 150 tackles) and Parsons (13, 192 tackles) combined for 65 starts and 541 tackles in their careers.
- Penn State's primary 2020 starting trio of Ellis Brooks (0 starts, 69 tackles), Brandon Smith (0 starts, 14 tackles) and Jesse Luketa (2 starts, 31 tackles) entered the season combining for two starts and 114 tackles in their careers.
- Brooks leads the team this season with 31 tackles.
- Brooks recorded his 100th career tackle at Nebraska and set a career high with 11 tackles against Ohio State.
- Brooks also leads the team with 4.5 tackles for loss and tallied his first sack of the season at Nebraska.
- Brooks' 7.8 tackles per game this season rank 14th in the Big Ten.
- At Nebraska, Luketa notched a career-best nine tackles and his first career solo tackle for loss, while Smith tallied a career-high six tackles and his first career interception in the fourth quarter.

OWEH LEADS D-LINE

- DE Jayson Oweh is averaging 6.8 tackles per game to rank 12th in the FBS among defensive linemen.
- Oweh's 27 tackles are the most in the first four games of a season by Penn State defensive lineman since at least 2000. Daquan Jones (2013) is the only other Penn State defensive lineman to total at least 25 tackles in the first four games of a season since 2000.
- Oweh has 19 tackles over the last two weeks, tallying nine at Nebraska last week and a career-best 10 tackles the previous week against Maryland.
- Before the Maryland game, Oweh set what was then a careerhigh of six tackles against Ohio State.
- Oweh has a tackle for loss in his last three games.
- Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles).
- Oweh's 27 tackles are second on the team and tops among defensive linemen.
- Oweh's 4.0 tackles for loss are second on the team.

TOTAL DEFENSE

- Penn State ranks sixth in the Big Ten and 36th nationally allowing 360.0 yards per game.
- The 298 yards allowed at Nebraska marked the second time this season Penn State had held an opponent under 300 yards of offense (211 vs. Indiana).

FUMBLE!

- LB Lance Dixon forced his first career fumble against Ohio State and LB Ellis Brooks did the same at Indiana.
- Last season, Penn State led the FBS with 22 forced fumbles, totaling its most forced fumbles since tallying a team-record 25 in 1968.
- S Lamont Wade tied a Big Ten record and led FBS for the year with three forced fumbles in a game at Ohio State.

STOPPING THE RUN

- Penn State ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 32nd nationally allowing 129.5 yards per game on the ground.
- Indiana attempted only 26 rushes against Penn State, tied for the sixth-lowest by any opponent in the James Franklin era.
- Penn State limited Indiana to 41 yards rushing, the fewest allowed in the conference during the opening week.

STOUT FROM 50

- K/P Jordan Stout hit a 50-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against Ohio State for his third career field goal of 50 yards or longer (53-yard field goal vs. Idaho, 2019; 57-yard field goal vs. Pitt, 2019).
- With three career field goals of 50 or more yards, Stout ranks second all-time at Penn State. He is tied with Kevin Kelly (2005-08) and Massimo Manca (1982, 84-86). Chris Bahr (1973-75) holds the program record with six career 50 or more yard field goals.
- Stout also booted a 56-yard punt against Ohio State for his first career punt of more than 50 yards.

PINEGAR CLIMBING KICKING CHARTS

- K Jake Pinegar has converted 31 career field goals to rank 13th all-time at Penn State.
- Pinegar has 43 career field goal attempts, which is 13th on the program's alltime list with Herb Mendhart (1976, 1978-80) and Ray Tarasi (1986-89).
- Pinegar has made 118 extra points rank fifth all-time at Penn State.
- Pinegar has converted 17-straight extra points.
- Pinegar ranks 12th on Penn State's career scoring list with 211 career points. With 11 points at Nebraska, he passed Ki-Jana Carter (204; 1992-94) and Massimo Manca (206; 1982, 1984-86).
- Pinegar has scored double-digit points on six occasions, last doing so at Nebraska (11).

SEASON NOTES

SUTHERLAND HIGHLIGHTS PENN STATE NUMBER CHANGES

- A new tradition begins at Penn State as the No. 0 will be worn by the team's special teams leader. This season, it will be **Jonathan Sutherland**.
- The No. 0 announcement was made following practice on Oct. 17. Sutherland was presented with his new jersey in Beaver Stadium.
- Sutherland was twice named as the Coaching Staff's Special Teams Player of the Week last season, blocking a pair of punts in the season opener against Idaho and making a pair of tackles in punt coverage against Pitt, respectively.
- Additionally, five Nittany Lions are wearing new numbers in 2020: Jaquan Brisker (1), Cam Sullivan-Brown (6), Sebastian Costantini (29), Grayson Kline (89) and Bradley King (93).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests befor falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

VITRUAL VALLEY EXPERIENCE

- Penn State Athletics announced the Virtual Valley Experience as a way to virtually bring Nittany Lion fans to football game days, including having a presence in Beaver Stadium. Virtual Valley will also give fans behind-the-scenes access to the Penn State football program all season long.
- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, tailgating or gathering on campus and/or in University parking lots is not permitted and will be monitored closely. If fans choose to gather at their home, Penn State recommends following local health and safety guidelines as Nittany Nation virtually comes together on football Saturdays. - Athletics is encouraging fans to participate in any of the three options to have a presence in Beaver Stadium, by purchasing a
 fan cutout or participating in the Raise the Song virtual campaign or posting their photos on social using #PSUPride.

PENN STATE DRAWS RATINGS

- The Penn State-Ohio State game in Week 9 drew an average of 6,534,000 viewers, making it the second-most watched game of the season thus far.
- The Penn State-Ohio State game is the most-watched game on an ESPN network this season and drew 27 percent more viewers than ABC's Saturday Night Football average from 2019.
- The Penn State-Ohio State game helped ABC win the night as the most-viewed network in primetime on Saturday.

DEGREES ON THE WALL

- The Nittany Lions have five total graduates on the roster: Will Fries (economics), Isaac Lutz (accounting), Antonio Shelton (broadcast journalism), Shane Simmons (communication arts & sciences) and Justin Weller (finance).
- Fries and Shelton are working on second degrees in telecommunications, Lutz is working on a graduate degree in real estate analysis and development and Weller is working on a graduate degree in economics.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place.
- The 89 Nittany Lions with a 3.0 GPA or higher surpasses the mark of 56 set by the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

WELCOME TO THE GAME

- WR Benjamin Wilson made his Nittany Lion debut against Maryland. He is one of 10 Penn State players who have made their debut this season.
- In the Maryland game, freshman WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith became the ninth Nittany Lion to make their first career start this season.
- Freshman receivers KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Parker Washington both started for the Nittany Lions against the Terrapins, marking the first time two true freshman receivers started for Penn State since Saeed Blacknall and Chris Godwin at Michigan in 2014.
- P Levi Forrest made his Penn State debut against Ohio State.
- LB Lance Dixon and RB Devyn Ford made their first career starts against Ohio State.
- Eight players made their Nittany Lion debut at Indiana: S Ji'Ayir Brown, RB Joseph Bruno, RB Caziah Holmes, LB Curtis Jacobs, TE Theo Johnson, WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith, RB Keyvone Lee, WR Parker Washington.

- Seven true freshmen made their Penn State debut at Indiana: RB Joseph Bruno, RB Caziah Holmes, LB Curtis Jacobs, TE Theo Johnson, WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith, RB Keyvone Lee, WR Parker Washington.
- Six players made their first career start at Indiana: S Jaquan Smith, TE Brenton Strange, OL Caedan Wallace, WR Parker Washington.

FIVE BOWL TEAMS HIGHLIGHT SCHEDULE

- The Big Ten announced a revised nine-game conference only football schedule on Sept. 19. It has eight scheduled games with the ninth game to be played Dec. 19, featuring an East vs. West match-up as part of Big Ten Champions week.
- The Nittany Lions will face five teams that participated in a bowl game during the 2019 campaign.
- Indiana went 8-4 during the regular season and fell to Tennessee in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, 23-22.
- Ohio State won the Big Ten East Division and went on to defeat Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game (34-21). The Buckeyes fell to Clemson in the College Football Playoff Semifinal (29-23).
- Iowa finished the season 10-3 overall after defeating the USC Spartans in the Holiday Bowl, 49-24.
- Michigan earned a spot in the VRBO Citrus Bowl, losing to No. 9 Alabama, 35-16, to finish 9-4 on the year.
- Michigan State finished 7-6 overall after picking up a 27-21 victory over Wake Forest in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2020 season marks the 20th straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular-season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- Penn State had a four-game night-game winning streak snapped against Ohio State.
- Penn State's only three losses in its last 14 night games are to Ohio State.
- Penn State is 55-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 16-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

- Penn State football head coach James Franklin announced redshirt seniors Michal Menet and Shaka Toney, senior Lamont Wade, redshirt juniors Sean Clifford and Jonathan Sutherland, and juniors Pat Freiermuth, Jesse Luketa and Jordan Stout have been named team captains for the 2020 season.
- Clifford, Freiermuth, Menet and Sutherland (special teams) are captains for the second-straight season.

URSCHEL NAMED TO CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, was named to a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics (expected completion in 2020), which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.
- Urschel has written a memoir, "Mind and Matter," with his wife, journalist Louisa Thomas, chronicling his life in athletics and academics. Last spring, even as he tackled the commitment of a full-time graduate student, he was a teaching assistant for the first time – in a Differential Equations course.

FOUR FORMER LIONS ON 2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen D.J. Dozier, Bobby Engram and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2021. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2021 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2021. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Additionally, current Penn State wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is on the ballot. Stubblefield was a wide receiver at Purdue (2001-04) and was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier will forever have a place in Penn State Football lore for scoring the gamewinning touchdown on a six-yard fourth quarter run to lift the Nittany Lions past Miami, 14-10, in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl.
- Engram is considered one of the greatest wide receivers in Penn State history. As a junior on Penn State's undefeated Big Ten and Rose Bowl championship team of 1994, Engram won the first Biletnikoff Award that is given annually to the best receiver in college football. When he graduated in 1996, Engram held 12 team receiving records, and still holds the records for receiving yards in a career (3,026) and single season (1,084) and touchdown receptions in a game (four against Minnesota in 1993), a season (13 in 1993) and career (31).
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two firstteam All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and DJ. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Stubblefield finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions, while his NCAA receptions record stood until 2011. Stubblefield also holds the Purdue record for receiving touchdowns in a season with 16 in 2004.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2021 season.

MEDICAL PROTOCOLS

The Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) adopted significant medical protocols including daily antigen testing, enhanced cardiac screening and an enhanced data-driven approach when making decisions about practice/competition. The COP/C voted unanimously to resume the football season starting the weekend of October 23-24, 2020. The decision was based on information presented by the Big Ten Return to Competition Task Force, a working group that was established by the COP/C and Commissioner Kevin Warren to ensure a collaborative and transparent process.

The Big Ten is requiring student-athletes, coaches, trainers and other individuals that are on the field for all practices and games to undergo daily antigen testing. Test results must be completed and recorded prior to each practice or game. Student-athletes who test positive for the coronavirus through point of contact (POC) daily testing would require a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result of the POC test.

Each institution has designated a Chief Infection Officer (CInO) who will oversee the collection and reporting of data for the Big Ten Conference. Team test positivity rate and population positivity rate thresholds will be used to determine recommendations for continuing practice and competition.

All COVID-19 positive student-athletes will have to undergo comprehensive cardiac testing to include labs and biomarkers, ECG, Echocardiogram and a Cardiac MRI. Following cardiac evaluation, student-athletes must receive clearance from a cardiologist designated by the university for the primary purpose of cardiac clearance for COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The earliest a student-athlete can return to game competition is 21 days following a COVID-19 positive diagnosis.

In addition to the medical protocols approved, the 14 Big Ten institutions will establish a cardiac registry in an effort to examine the effects on COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The registry and associated data will attempt to answer many of the unknowns regarding the cardiac manifestations in COVID-19 positive elite athletes.

The Big Ten Conference will use data provided by each Chief Infection Officer (CInO) to make decisions about the continuation of practice and competition, as determined by team positivity rate and population positivity rate, based on a seven-day rolling average:

Team positivity rate (number of positive tests divided by total number of tests administered):

- Green 0-2%
- Orange 2-5%
- Red >5%

Population positivity rate (number of positive individuals divided by total population at risk):

- Green 0-3.5%
- Orange 3.5-7.5%
- Red >7.5%

Decisions to alter or halt practice and competition will be based on the following scenarios:

- Green/Green and Green/Orange: Team continues with normal practice and competition.
- Orange/Orange and Orange/Red: Team must proceed with caution and enhance COVID-19 prevention (alter practice and meeting schedule, consider viability of continuing with scheduled competition).
- Red/Red: Team must stop regular practice and competition for a minimum of seven days and reassess metrics until improved.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 40 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 23 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, seven former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs and two former PSU student-athletes from sports other than football are on rosters.
- Eight players from PSU's 2019 squad are on NFL teams.

GAME RECAP

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. - Penn State guarterback Sean Clifford accounted for four touchdowns, including a late go-ahead touchdown pass and an overtime touchdown throw, but Indiana rallied to defeat No. 8/7 Penn State, 36-35, in the extra frame.

GAME 1

PENN STATE AT INDIANA

Clifford accounted for four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing) and 357 yards of total offense, throwing for 238 yards on 24-of-35 passing and rushing for 119 yards - the seventh-most by a quarterback in Penn State history. Pat Freiermuth became Penn State's career leader in touchdown receptions by a tight end and caught seven passes for 60 yards. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson had four catches for 94 yards, including a late 60-yard touchdown reception. Shaka Toney led the Penn State defense with seven tackles, which were all solo and included two sacks. Safety Lamont Wade recovered a fumble and made his first career interception.

For Indiana, guarterback Michael Penix Jr. went 19-for-36 passing for 170 yards with a touchdown throw in overtime and two successful two-point conversion rushes - one to force overtime and one to win the game - while running back Stevie Scott III rushed for two touchdowns in the first half. Safety Jamar Johnson made 10 tackles, an interception and forced a fumble the Hoosiers recovered, while cornerback Jaylin Williams also added an interception.

How It Happened

With Penn State trailing by six late in the fourth quarter, Clifford found Dotson over the middle for a 60-yard touchdown strike and a 21-20 Penn State lead. Then after stopping Indiana on fourth down, running back Devyn Ford rushed for a touchdown with 1:42 remaining for a 28-20 PSU advantage. However, Indiana's Penix led the Hoosiers on a game-tying touchdown drive, rushing for both the touchdown and ensuing two-point attempt.

In overtime, Clifford threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Parker Washington for a 35-28 Nittany Lion lead, but Penix answered with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Whop Philyor on Indiana's possession, and the Hoosiers elected to go for two to decide the game. Penix ran left and dove, extending the football towards the pylon, making contact with both it and the ground out of bounds, for what was ruled a touchdown. The play was reviewed, but the call stood.

Penn State took the game's first lead with Freiermuth's touchdown catch on the opening drive, converting on fourth-andgoal from the 2-yard line.

Williams intercepted Clifford late in the first quarter leading to the Hoosiers' first score, a field goal, early in the second guarter. Scott then gave Indiana a 17-7 lead with a pair of rushing touchdowns.

Clifford scampered for a 35-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to three at the end of the third guarter, before Indiana added a field goal for a 20-14 advantage. Penn State was able to retake the lead on the Clifford-Dotson score, but Indiana answered.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Wide receiver Jahan Dotson scored three touchdowns and totaled 144 yards receiving for No. 18/17 Penn State, but No. 3 Ohio State made an early lead last for a 38-25 win over the Nittany Lions.

It was Dotson's second career 100-yard receiving game and a career-high total, and his three touchdowns and eight receptions were also career highs. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18of-30 passes for 281 yards and the three touchdowns. Of Clifford's passing yards, 252 came in the second half.

Ohio State was paced by quarterback Justin Fields, who completed 28-of-34 passes for 318 yards and four touchdowns. Garrett Wilson caught 11 passes for 111 yards and had a 62yard rush, while Chris Olave caught seven passes for 120 yards and 2 touchdowns and Jeremy Ruckert added a pair of receiving touchdowns.

Linebacker Ellis Brooks paced the Penn State defense with a career-high 11 tackles, while linebacker Brandon Smith and defensive tackle Antonio Shelton both tallied sacks. Tommy Togiai led Ohio State with seven tackles and three sacks and Marcus Hooker had six tackles and an interception.

How It Happened

Ohio State jumped out to an early two-touchdown lead. Wilson broke free for 62 yards on the first play from scrimmage and Master Teague III scored from four yards out two plays later to give the Buckeyes a 7-0 lead. Penn State failed to convert on fourth-and-two at its own 45 on the ensuing drive, and Ohio State took advantage of the short field when Olave hauled in a 26-yard touchdown catch.

Penn State put together a field goal drive for its first score with 2:57 remaining in the first guarter, but the Buckeyes added another touchdown before the end of the half on a 10-yard throw to Jeremy Ruckert over the middle. Jordan Stout drilled a 50-yard field goal for the Nittany Lions as the half expired to go to halftime down 21-6.

Penn State opened the second half with the ball and marched down the field for an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 14-yard touchdown reception by Dotson. Ohio State answered midway through the third guarter with a 49-yard touchdown catch by Olave and added a field goal before the end of the quarter.

The Nittany Lions made it a 31-19 game at the start of the fourth guarter after a pair of highlight reel catches by Dotson. On the first play of the final stanza on third-and-17, Dotson caught a 37-yard pass with one hand and the side of his helmet. On the next play, he made a one-handed snag for a 21-yard touchdown catch.

Fields found Ruckert again in the end zone with 9:14 to go and Clifford connected with Dotson on a 20-yard strike with 6:27 to go to make it a 38-25 game. Hooker sealed the game for Ohio State with an interception in Penn State territory in the game's final minutes.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Penn State tried to rally from an early deficit with 290 yards of total offense in the second half, but Maryland's explosive scoring plays in the first half were enough for a 35-19 victory in Big Ten football action Saturday in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State held Maryland to 70 yards with no scores on offense in the second half, but was unable overcome a 28-7 halftime deficit.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford attempted a school-record 57 passes and threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns as he tried to rally the Nittany Lions late, and freshman wide receiver Parker Washington caught eight passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson finished with nine catches for 123 yards - his second-straight 100-yard receiving game - and tight end Pat Freiermuth caught six passes for 91 yards, as both surpassed 1,000 yards receiving for their careers in the game.

Maryland scored all of its touchdowns from 34 or more yards out. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa completed 18-of-26 passes for 282 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Rakim Jarrett caught five passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns and wide receiver Dontay Demus caught six passes for 86 yards and one touchdown. Running back Jake Funk ran 16 times for 80 yards and a 38-yard touchdown run.

Defensive end Jayson Oweh led the Nittany Lions on defense with a career-high 10 tackles and two tackles for loss, while safety Nick Cross led the Terps with eight tackles, a sack, interception and two pass break ups.

How It Happened

Maryland took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a pair of big touchdown receptions by Jarrett, who caught a 42-yard touchdown the Terps' first possession and a 62-yard score with 19 seconds remaining in the opening frame, and then went up three touchdowns with a 38-yard rush by Funk early in the second quarter.

Penn State got on the board with 6:32 remaining in the half, as Clifford engineered a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive capped by a 20-yard touchdown toss to Dotson, but Tagovailoa connected with Demus for a 34-yard touchdown before the break for a 28-7 halftime lead.

Maryland extended its lead in the second half on a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Clifford connected with Washington for a 23-yard touchdown with 10:16 remaining to complete a 16-play, 98-yard drive, and again in the final seconds for a 1-yard score.

- Dotson's five touchdowns in the first three games of the season tie the Penn State record set by Joe Jurevicius in 1997.
- WR Parker Washington became the first Penn State true freshman to have two touchdown receptions in a game since Pat Freiermuth did so against Rutgers in 2018.
- DE Jayson Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles).

GAME RECAP

LINCOLN, Neb. – Penn State trimmed a 21-point halftime deficit to just seven points late, but Nebraska took advantage of early turnovers and made a pair of fourth-down stops in the red zone in the final minutes to hang on for a 30-23 victory.

The Nittany Lions outscored Nebraska 17-3 over the final 30 minutes, but it was not enough to overcome a 27-6 halftime deficit.

Will Levis threw for a career-high 219 yards on 14-of-31 passing and rushed for 61 yards after entering the game in the second quarter, and running backs Keyvone Lee and Devyn Ford ran for a touchdown each in the second half. Pat Freiermuth led Penn State in receiving with seven catches for a career-high 113 yards, including a career-long 74-yard reception, while Parker Washington caught five passes for 70 yards. Jayson Oweh and Jesse Luketa paced the defense with nine tackles each, and Oweh made 1.5 stops behind the line while Luketa made one.

How It Happened

Penn State trimmed its first-half deficit to 11 in the third quarter with a 31-yard rushing touchdown by Keyvone Lee followed by a field goal. Nebraska added a field goal early in the fourth quarter for a 30-16 lead, but on the Nittany Lions' next possession, Levis spun away from a blitzer to connect with Freiermuth for a 74-yard gain to the Nebraska 1, which led to a Ford rushing TD with 9:20 to go.

Trailing 30-23 during the ensuing Nebraska drive, Oweh pressured McCaffery, forcing him to throw a ball up for grabs, and linebacker Brandon Smith snagged it for Penn State at the Nebraska 48 with 7:39 remaining. Penn State drove to the 11-yard line, but the Huskers forced four-straight incompletions and took over on downs with 3:37 to go. However, the Nittany Lion defense forced a threeand-out to get the ball back with 2:34 left.

Levis started the offensive drive from the Penn State 31 with a 14-yard rush, and then went 5-for-6 passing for 46 yards to lead the Lions to the Nebraska 9. However, the Huskers drew incompletions on the next two plays, Luke Reimer sacked Levis on third down, and Penn State was unable to convert on fourth down from the 13.

Nebraska had built a 27-6 lead through halftime, including 10 points off turnovers. The Huskers opened the game with a McCaffery touchdown run, and an interception by Cam Taylor-Britt led to a field goal for a 10-0 lead. Penn State kicked a field goal at the start of the second quarter, but then Nebraska's Zavier Betts broke free for a 45-yard touchdown reception and Deontai Williams scored on a 26-yard strip-sack fumble recovery touchdown run for a 24-3 lead. Both teams added field goal before the break.

- Penn State is now 8-10 all-time against Nebraska.
- The Nittany Lions moved to 2-6 at Nebraska.
- The Blue & White is now 1-4 against Nebraska since the Cornhuskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- Penn State's 501 yards of total offense is its most since the 529 it recorded in the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Penn State ran 91 offensive plays, marking back-to-back games with 90 or more plays. The last time the Nittany Lions had backto-back games with 90 or more plays came in 2012 (99 vs. Northwestern, 10/6/12; 90 vs. lowa, 10/20/12).
- The Nittany Lions gained 30 first downs, tying a season high. The 30 first downs are tied for their fourth-most under James Franklin.
