## MARYLAND:

• The Terps knocked off Penn State the first time the two met as Big Ten foes in 2014 when Brad Craddock kicked a 43-yard field goal with 51 seconds left to give Maryland a 20-19 come-from-behind victory. Maryland came back from 16-7 down in the third quarter to win for the first time ever in Happy Valley. Current Head Coach Michael Locksley was the offensive coordinator for that win.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

After a thrilling 45-44 overtime win over Minnesota, the Maryland football team will travel to Penn State this Saturday, November 7 to face the Nittany Lions. The game is set for a 3:30 p.m. kickoff to air on the Big Ten Network and the Maryland Sports Radio Network.

QB **Taulia Tagovailoa** had a sensational game vs. Minnesota (10/30), completing 26-of-35 passes for 394 yards and three passing touchdowns while rushing for 59 yards and another two touchdowns, including the game-winning score in overtime. Tagovailoa is only the third Big Ten player in the last 20 seasons with 350 passing yards, three passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns in a game, joining Dwayne Haskins (Ohio State, 2018) and Zak Kustok (Northwestern, 2001). The sophomore quarterback was named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week this week for his performance.

RB **Jake Funk** broke out in the Terps win over Minnesota (10/30), rushing for 221 yards, the 11th-most in a single game in program history and the most since Anthony McFarland Jr. had 298 vs. Ohio State (11/17/18). Funk averaged 10.5 yards per carry, also the 11th-best in a single game all-time by a Terp.

The Terps have the 11th youngest team in the country and the youngest in the Big Ten by percentage of underclassmen on the roster, with 63.6 percent of the 118 student-athletes being freshmen or sophomores (46 true/redshirt freshmen, 29 sophomores). Maryland has started two true freshmen in the first two games of the season, with WR Rakim Jarrett starting on the offensive end and tallying seven receptions for 69 yards and CB Tarheeb Still starting on the defensive end, posting nine tackles and two pass breakups. It is the first time the Terps have started two true freshmen in the first two games of a season since K Brad Craddock, QB Perry Hills and S Sean Davis started the first two contests of 2012 (William & Mary & Temple). The Terps have had 20 players and 10 true freshmen see the first action of their careers over the first two games of the season. JUCO transfers Johari Branch, Ami Finau, Mosiah Nasili-Kite have all started both games for Maryland.

LB Chance Campbell currently leads the FBS with 14 tackles per game and stands second in the FBS and leads the Big Ten with 7.5 solo tackles per game, posting a career-best 15 (10 solo) at Northwestern (10/24) and following it up with a team-high 13 in the win over Minnesota (10/30). Campbell's 28 tackles are the most by any Terp over a two-game span since Cole Farrand also had 28 vs. Michigan State (11/15) and Michigan (11/22) in 2014.

Maryland's 17-point comeback in the fourth quarter vs. Minnesota (10/30) was the fourth-largest comeback in any Big Ten conference game since 2004 (Illinois 21-point deficit vs. Michigan State in 2019, Michigan State 21-point deficit vs. Northwestern in 2006, Rutgers 21-point deficit vs. Indiana in 2015).

## ON THE OFFENSE

## By The Numbers

## 1

Last week's game against Minnesota (10/30) was the **first** time in program history that Maryland has had a 300-yard passer (**Taulia Tagovailoa**) and 200-yard rusher (**Jake Funk**) and only the second time that Maryland has had a 200-yard rusher and 100-yard wide receiver (**Dontay Demus Jr., Jeshaun Jones**), first happening when Chris Downs rushed for 212 yards and Scooter Monroe had 106 receiving yards against Georgia Tech on Oct. 17, 2002.

## 2

With both a rushing and receiving touchdown against Texas and Illinois in his freshman 2018 season, redshirt-sophomore wide receiver **Jeshaun Jones** became the first Big Ten freshman to have **two** games with a touchdown catch and touchdown run since Ohio State's Maurice Clarett in 2003. With five receiving touchdowns, Jones tallied the most by a Maryland freshman since Stefon Diggs in 2012. Jones is back for the Terps in 2020 after missing last season with an ACL injury. Jones has eight receptions for 140 yards and a 76-yard touchdown reception, which is the longest play in the Big Ten this season, in his first two games back.

WR **Dontay Demus Jr.** had an impressive sophomore campaign last season, tallying 625 yards, the 23rd most in a single season all-time by a Terp and **six** touchdowns, the first Maryland sophomore with **six** receiving touchdowns in a season since DJ Moore also had six in 2016. In two games this season, Demus Jr. leads Maryland with 11 receptions for 142 yards and a touchdown, recording his third career 100-yard game with seven receptions for 101 yards and a TD vs. Minnesota (10/30).

## 10

**Taulia Tagovailoa's** 394 passing yards vs. Minnesota (10/30) were the **10th** most in a single-game in school history and the most since Danny O'Brien passed for 417 yards against N.C. State on Nov. 27, 2010. Tagovailoa's 26 completions are the most by a Terp since Danny O'Brien had 34 against West Virginia on September 17, 2011.

## 10

**Wide Receiver U:** Maryland is one of only two schools (Alabama) that has two NFL wide receivers currently in the top-10 in the league in receiving yards. Stefon Diggs stands second in the NFL with 555 yards while DJ Moore ranks 10th in the league with 474 yards.

## 100

Maryland had two **100**-yard receivers vs. Minnesota (10/30), with **Jeshaun Jones** notching 103 yards and **Dontay Demus Jr.** recording 101, marking the first time the Terps have had two 100-yard receivers since Sept. 27, 2014 when Stefon Diggs (112) and Deon Long (108) reached the mark at Indiana.

## ON THE DEFENSE/ST

Maryland has consistently had one of the best special teams units in the Big Ten, especially in the return game. **Isaiah Jacobs** is second in the Big Ten through two games with 147 kick return yards. Last season, the Terps ranked fourth in the conference in kick return average (22.73 yards per return) and led the league in punt return average (13.67 yards per return) and opponent net punting average (35.12 yards). The Terps have had a top-**five** kickoff return unit in the Big Ten for each of the past four seasons (2017-pres.) Maryland has scored the most kickoff return touchdowns of any team over that span with **five**.

## 6

**Six** Maryland players from the 2019 team moved onto the NFL this offseason. RB Anthony McFarland Jr. was drafted in the fourth round (124 overall) by the Pittsburgh Steelers, DB Antoine Brooks Jr. was also selected by the Steelers in the sixth round (198), while DB Tino Ellis (Miami Dolphins), LB Keandre Jones (Cincinnati Bengals) and TE Tyler Mabry (Seattle Seahawks) all signed as undrafted free agents.

## 12

LB **Ayinde Eley** ranked **12th** in the Big Ten in total tackles last season with 79 (44 solo). Eley added four tackles for loss, three pass breakups, two fumble recoveries and an interception to his 2019 totals en route to All-Big Ten plaudits. Eley currently stands 21st in the Big Ten this season with 15 tackles (six solo)

## 15

LB **Chance Campbell** became just the sixth Terp to have a **15** tackle game since Maryland joined the Big Ten in 2014 (Cole Farrand (three times), Jermaine Carter Jr., Shane Cockerille, Tre Watson (twice) and Fa'Najae Gotay). With Maryland seeing Campbell tally 15 tackles against Northwestern (10/24) and LB **Fa'Najae Gotay** post 15 tackles in last year's season finale at Michigan State (11/30/19), it was the first time the Terps have had back-to-back games with a player accumulating **15** tackles since Cole Farrand did it in two-straight games in 2014 against Indiana (9/27) and Ohio State (10/4).

## **51**

K **Joseph Petrino** hit a clutch **51**-yard field goal with 7:06 remaining to pull the Terps within seven points in Maryland's 17-point comeback over Minnesota (10/30) last week, the longest field goal of Petrino's career, tied for the longest field goal in the Big Ten this season and the longest by a Terp since Henry Darmstadter also had a 51-yard field goal at Minnesota on September 30, 2017.

## **60**

S **Nick Cross** had a sensational freshman season last year, tallying 45 tackles (30 solo), leading the team with two interceptions and five pass breakups, en route to Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors. Cross was named to the 2019 Pro Football Focus First Team All-Freshman Team after being the primary coverage defender on 22 targeted passes and not allowing more than 60% of those passes to be completed. Cross matched his career-high with nine tackles (five solo) in the first game of his sophomore season at Northwestern (10/24).





# HAEL LOCKSLEY

Towson '92 • 12th Year at Maryland, 2nd as Head Coach

Michael Locksley returned home to become the University of Maryland's 37th head football coach in December 2018. Locksley, a Washington, D.C. native with deep personal and professional connections to the area, has nearly 30 years of coaching experience and 2020 will be his 12th season with the Terps over three separate stints at Maryland.

nation's top assistant coach, Locksley spent three years working under Nick Saban at the University of Alabama before taking the head coaching job at Maryland. He served national championship in 2017 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2018 and helping Alabama return to the College Football Playoff.

Locksley, known for strong recruiting skills, was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003. 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

Locksley has signed 24 four or five star recruits over his coaching career (according to 247sports), 15 of which came from the DMV area, in addition to coaching 98 NFL Draft selections. Among Locksley's successful signings to Maryland were future NFL stars Vernon Davis, Shawne school history to surpass the 5,000-yard mark and first to top Merriman, LaMont Jordan, D'Qwell Jackson, EJ Henderson, Yannick Ngakoue and Stefon Diggs.

Alabama's Locksley-led offense averaged 45.6 points and 522.0 vards per game in 2018. The Tide set school records for points scored (684), single-season total offense (7,830 yards) and passing yards (4,854) in a season. Alabama guarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw for 3,966 yards and a school-record 43 touchdowns in 2018.

In 2017, Locksley coached the Alabama wide receivers, who combined to catch 128 passes for 2,059 yards and 19 touchdowns led by First Team All-SEC selection Calvin Ridley. Ridley hauled in 63 passes for 967 yards and five touchdowns in his junior season. Locksley spent the 2016 season on the Crimson Tide's staff as an offensive analyst.

Prior to Alabama, Locksley served as Maryland's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15. He was named the Terps interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.

During his time as Maryland's offensive coordinator, the Terrapins produced balanced and effective results. Locksley's attack was led by guarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible (58) after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Locksley also mentored

wide receiver, Stefon Diggs, who hauled in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns en route to second team All-Big Ten honors. Diggs is now an NFL superstar for the Minnesota Vikings.

In 2013, Locksley guided an offense that eclipsed 5,000 yards (5,160) for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 2003. The passing game excelled that The winner of the 2018 Broyles Award, given to the season, totaling 3,231 yards for the third-highest total in school history.

Prior to Maryland, Locksley served as the head coach as the Crimson Tide's co-offensive coordinator and won a at the University of New Mexico from 2009-11. Before that, Locksley also served as the offensive coordinator at the University of Illinois from 2005-08. The Illini went from No. 72 nationally in total offense in 2005 to 19th following the 2008 season. They led the Big Ten in rushing in 2006 and 2007 and then led the league in passing in 2008. The rushing attack was twice ranked in the top-10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006 and No. 5 in 2007).

> Under Locksley's offensive plan, wide receiver Arrelious Benn was a first team all-conference pick as a sophomore in 2008 after leading the league in receiving yards (1,055). He went on to become a second-round pick of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2010 NFL Draft.

> The 2007 Illinois offense became just the third unit in 3,000 rushing yards. Led by Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Rashard Mendenhall, the Illini led the league in rushing 256.7 yards a game.

> Illinois played USC in the 2008 Rose Bowl and finished the season ranked 18th in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press following a 9-4 season. In 2006, Locksley led an Illinois offense that paced the Big Ten and ranked 10th in the nation in rushing, averaging 188.8 yards.

> Locksley spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons at the University of Florida as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. In 2004, Gators' running back Ciatrick Fason led the SEC and ranked 19th in the NCAA in rushing (105.6 yards a game) on his way to second-team all-league

In his first stint at Maryland from 1997-2002, Locksley enjoyed success both recruiting and grooming players in College Park. He oversaw the running backs during his entire tenure, including the final five as recruiting coordinator. Three different running backs - Chris Downs, Bruce Perry Locksley and his wife, Kia, have four children: Mike Jr., Kai, and LaMont Jordan - gained more than 1,000 yards and Kori and the late Meiko. were named First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference.

He began his coaching career at Towson in 1992, where

> Locksley played safety at Towson University, where he was the team's defensive MVP as a senior in 1991. He finished his career ranked 19th on the school's alltime tackles list and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing.

> In August 2020, Locksley announced the formation of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches (NCMFC). The NCMFC was formed as a multi-pronaed effort to remove roadblocks, increase awareness and spur action toward fair and equitable hiring at all levels of football. The non-profit organization seeks to prepare, promote and produce qualified minority coaches to ascend in the ranks of college and professional football.

## Maryland 45. Minnesota 44 (OT)

COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP) — A back-and-forth game that featured comebacks by both teams, a dozen touchdowns and more than 1,100 yards in offense seemed destined to reach a second overtime before ending abruptly on — of all things — a botched conversion kick

Minnesota's Brock Walker sent an extra-point try wide right after the potential tying touchdown, giving Maryland a stunning 45-44 comeback victory Friday night.

After the Terrapins rallied from a 17-point deficit in the fourth quarter to force overtime. Maryland quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa ran for a 2-yard touchdown and Joseph Peterino kicked the extra point to give the Terrapins — who came in as 19-point underdogs — a 45-38 lead.

Minnesota answered with a 2-yard touchdown run by Seth Green before Walker's extra-point try went awry to end this Big Ten duel and launch a wild celebration by the Terrapins, who jubilantly sprinted across the field, seemingly uncaring that they had no fans with whom they could share the moment.

Never in school history had Maryland won after trailing by 17 points in the fourth

It was a bitter end for the Golden Gophers (0-2), who had turned a 21-7 deficit into a 38-21 lead late in the third quarter.

Tagovailoa went 26 for 35 for 394 yards and three touchdowns in his second college start. He also ran for 59 yards and two scores to help the Terrapins (1-1) bounce back from a season-opening 43-3 loss to Northwestern.

He became the first Maryland quarterback to throw for 300 yards since Caleb Rowe against Virginia in 2013.

Jake Funk ran for a career-best 221 yards, and Maryland totaled a whopping

Mohamed Ibrahim ran for 207 yards and a career-high four touchdowns on 41 carries for Minnesota, which was bounced from the Top 25 with a season-opening loss to Michigan.
