

PENN STATE LOOKS TO BOUNCE BACK AGAINST TERPS

- OPENING KICK: Penn State hosts regional foe Maryland Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. Coverage is set to start at 3:30 p.m. on the Big Ten Network.
- FAMILIAR FOE: Penn State is meeting Maryland for the 44th time, ranking the Terrapins as the Nittany Lions' sixth-most frequent opponent. Penn State is 40-2-1 in the previous 43 meetings with a 23-1 advantage in Happy Valley.
- LOOKING TO REBOUND: The last time Penn State started a season 0-2, in 2012, it won its next five games and rallied to finish second in the Big Ten Leaders Division.
- YOUTH MOVEMENT: Penn State is one of the youngest teams in the country with 81 underclassmen (31 true freshmen, 24 redshirt freshmen, 26 sophomores) to just 10 players in their final year of eligibility.
- **DOTSON BREAKS OUT:** WR **Jahan Dotson** is tied for the Big Ten lead in receiving touchdowns with Purdue's David Bell with four this season. Dotson had three against Ohio State last week in a career game that included career highs with eight receptions and 144 receiving yards. His receiving yard total was the most by a Penn State receiver since current NFL-er Chris Godwin recorded 187 yards vs. USC in the
- 1,000: Juniors TE Pat Freiermuth (981 yds) and WR Jahan Dotson (929 yds) are both approaching 1,000 career receiving yards, as Freiermuth enters just 19 yards shy of the milestone, while Dotson needs 71 yards. Through two games in 2020, Freiermuth is averaging 53 yards per game, while Dotson is averaging 119 yards per game.
- THE OPPOSITION: Maryland is 1-1 after bouncing back from a season-opening loss at Northwestern with a 17-point fourth-quarter comeback to defeat Minnesota in overtime last week. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa leads the Big Ten's third-ranked offense, while linebacker Chance Campbell is the Big Ten's leading tackler.

RFCORD: 7-9-1

- In 1908, a record crowd of several thousand (exact figure unknown) turned out as Penn State played the final game on Old Beaver Field, beating Bucknell, 33-6. The victory was the 48th against only one defeat on the playing field.
- In 1925, Penn State surprised Notre Dame by tying the Irish, 0-0, in driving rain and mud on Homecoming at New Beaver Field before a record-breaking crowd of 20,000.
- In 1953, heavy snow blanketed State College, forcing a major snow removal at Beaver Field for a game against Fordham.
 Kickoff was delayed by two hours because of the late arrival of the Penn State team, which was trapped in a Clinton County hunting camp known as "Camp-Hate-To-Leave-It."
- In 1964, Penn State, with a 3-4 record, shocked unbeaten No. 2
 Ohio State, 27-0, in what the Associated Press called the "college
 upset of the year." The Nittany Lions' defense limited the Buckeyes
 to 60 net yards, while the Lions' offense totals 341 yards.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of four current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 80-40 career record, with eight consecutive winning seasons, entering 2020.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- Under Franklin, Penn State is one of four teams (Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma) to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings in each of
 the last four seasons
- Franklin has led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton) in the last four years, making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- · Franklin's squads have won two New Year's Six bowl games in the last three years, making the Nittany Lions one of seven teams to do so.
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- Over the last four years, Penn State has 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program-best.
- Franklin has led Penn State to 32 home wins in the past five seasons to rank fourth in the FBS. Those 32 wins have included a trio of undefeated home slates.
- Franklin has 25 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first nine years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 81 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Penn State had six players selected in both the 2018 and 2019 NFL Draft and five players picked in 2020, marking the third-straight year that
 Penn State has had at least five draft picks, the first time that has happened since 1991-93. Penn State is only one of five programs to produce
 at least five draft picks in each of the last three drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last eight seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in the last four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the
 Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and
 were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the
 Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
 Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th
 two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team
 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the
 University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place. The figure surpassed the mark of 56 set in the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0
 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees. A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 for the 2020 semester, also a school record.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Additionally, 28 Nittany Lions earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2019.
- · A total of 52 squad members compiled at least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2019, the third-highest semester total in program history.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

- · Michael Locksley is in his second full season as Maryland's head
- · Locksley arrived at Maryland following a three-year stint at Alabama. He served as the Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator in 2018 after being co-offensive coordinator during Alabama's 2017 National Championship season.
- This is Lockley's third stint at Maryland. He most recently served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15, and was the Terrapins' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator from 1997-2002. Locksley was Maryland's interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.
- · His other Big Ten coaching experience came at Illinois where he served as offensive coordinator while coaching the tight ends in 2005 and quarterbacks from 2006-08.
- Lockslev is a head coach for the second time in his career. He was the head coach at New Mexico from 2009-11.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

- Maryland is 1-1 to start the 2020 season, falling to Northwestern to open the season but rallying for an overtime win over Minnesota last week.
- With his effort against Minnesota, quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa became the third Big Ten player in the last 20 seasons with 350 passing yards, three passing touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns in a game, joining Dwayne Haskins (Ohio State, 2018) and Zak Kustok (Northwestern, 2001).
- Maryland ranks third in the Big Ten in total offense averaging 441.0 yards per game
- · The Terps are led on offense by their passing game, which is averaging 268.5 yards per game, while running back Jake Funk ranks third in the Big Ten with 221 rushing yards.
- Linebacker Chance Campbell leads the Big Ten with 7.5 tackles per game and ranks second with 2.0 tackles for loss per game.

NO. 12/11 PENN STATE BLANKS MARYLAND, 59-0

Quarterback Sean Clifford threw for 398 yards and three touchdowns in less than three quarters of action to lead the No. 12/11 Nittany Lions past Maryland, 59-0.

It was a career night for Clifford as he set personal bests with 26 completions on 31 attempts for 398 yards, including a Penn State-record 287 yards in the first half. Will Levis relieved Clifford with 5:45 remaining in the third quarter and added 23 passing yards to give Penn State 421 yards for the night, ranking as the second-most in program history (behind Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014) and the most in a Big Ten game in program history. Thirteen different Lions caught a pass, led by a career-high six receptions by KJ Hamler, who finished with 108 yards receiving and a 58-yard touchdown reception. In total, Penn State's 619 yards of total offense were its third-most in a Big Ten game all-time.

On defense, Penn State yielded just 128 yards, its second-fewest in a Big Ten game all-time. Jan Johnson and Tariq Casto-Fields both hauled in interceptions that led to Penn State touchdown drives and Ellis Brooks led the unit with six tackles and 2.5 sacks.

Johnson intercepted Maryland quarterback Josh Jackson on the Terps' fifth play from scrimmage, returning it 17 yards to the Maryland 32, and penalties on the play and after the play gave the Nittany Lions the ball at the Maryland 8-yard line. Clifford called his own number on the first play and scampered untouched into the end zone for a quick 7-0 lead.

The Lions went up 14-0 on Hamler's 58-yard touchdown reception. Maryland threatened on its next drive, but Castro-Fields intercepted Jackson at the goal line, setting up a 95-yard touchdown drive that stretched into the second quarter.

Nick Bowers caught a 15-yard touchdown pass with 9:40 remaining in the half, Journey Brown turned a check-down pass into a 37-yard touchdown with 3:04 remaining and Jake Pinegar kicked a 21-yard field goal as time expired for a 38-0 halftime lead.

Brown added a touchdown on the ground in the third quarter and Levis rushed for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter for the final margin.

- Former Penn State and NFL standout Matt Millen will be calling Saturday's meeting between the Nittany Lions and Terrapins.
- Millen earned first-team All-America honors as a junior in 1978, helping the unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Nittany Lions earn a berth vs. Alabama in the dramatic 1979 Sugar Bowl for the national title. Millen was a team co-captain in 1979, but missed most of his senior year with an injury. He also helped Penn State earn the first of two consecutive 11-1 records in 1977, capped by a win in the Fiesta Bowl.
- The Oakland Raiders selected Millen the second round of the 1980 NFL Draft to begin a 12-year career that would see him earn four Super Bowl rings. - · Millen began his broadcasting career in 1992, working NFL games for CBS and then FOX. COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kirk Ciarrocca, defensive line coach John Scott Jr., wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield and offensive line coach Phil Trautwein.
- Ciarrocca spent the last three seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Minnesota. In 2019, the Golden Gophers posted a 10-win regular season for the first time since 1905, thanks in part to the third-highest scoring offense in program history and the second-most passing yards in a season by the Gophers.
- Scott joins the Nittany Lions after spending the previous three seasons in the SEC. He was the defensive line coach during the 2019 season at South Carolina and spent previous two seasons at Arkansas as the defensive tackles coach in 2018 and defensive line coach in 2017.
- Stubblefield comes from the University of Miami, where he was
 the wide receivers coach. Stubblefield is no stranger to the Big Ten,
 as he was a consensus All-American wide receiver as a player at
 Purdue. He finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions
 at the time and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards.
- Trautwein served as the offensive line coach for the last two seasons at Boston College. He guided all five of his starting offensive linemen to 2019 All-ACC honors. Trautwein was a twotime All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, where he won a pair of BCS National Championships in 2006 and 200

FRANKLIN NAMED TO DODD TROPHY PRESEASON WATCH LIST

- Head coach James Franklin was named to the 2020 Dodd Trophy
 Watch List, the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and
 the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl announced. The list includes 18 of the
 nation's top college football coaches.
- The Dodd Trophy celebrates the head coach of a team who has success on the gridiron, while also stressing the importance of scholarship, leadership and integrity — the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's coaching philosophy. The watch list was created through a selection process by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, taking into consideration each program's graduation rate, commitment to service and charity in the community, projected success for the 2020 season and Academic Progress Rate (APR).

TOUCHDOWNS FOR THE TIGHT END

- TE Pat Freiermuth owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17) with a touchdown catch at Indiana.
- Freiermuth's 16 touchdown receptions make him the career active leader in FBS among tight ends.
- Freiermuth's 16th career touchdown grab at Indiana moved him into a tie for eighth all-time in receiving touchdowns at Penn State with O.J. McDuffie (1988-92). Freiermuth moved past Terry Smith (1988-91), Joe Jurevicius (1994-97) and Gesicki.
- Freiermuth had seven touchdowns last season to rank fourth in FBS among tight ends. Among all positions, he ranked tied for seventh in the Big Ten.

WASHINGTON MAKES DEBUT

- WR Parker Washington became the first true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since Brandon Polk against Temple in 2015.
- Washington ranks third on the team with six catches for 85 yards.
- Washington's 85 yards receiving are the most by a Penn State true freshman through the first two games of the season since Derrick Williams caught seven passes for 98 yards in 2005 and the most by Penn State freshman since KJ Hamler caught six passes for 107 yards in 2018.
- Against Ohio State, Washington had four catches for 73 yards including a career-long 31-yard reception in the fourth quarter.
 He also had a 20-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Washington caught a 9-yard touchdown pass in overtime at Indiana, marking the second-straight season opener with a freshman catching a touchdown pass. Brenton Strange caught a 4-yard touchdown reception against Idaho in 2019.

LAWNBOYZ

- RB Devyn Ford had a career-high 20 carries in the seasonopener at Indiana, bettering his previous high of eight against Indiana in 2019.
- Penn State ranked third in the Big Ten with 250 rushing yards in the opening week.

- Making his first career start at Indiana, CB Joey Porter Jr. registered his first career sack.
- Porter has registered a career-best five tackles in each of his last two games.

BEHIND THE LINE

- · Penn State's five sacks rank fifth in the Big Ten.
- DE Shaka Toney registered two sacks at Indiana to tie for the conference lead with three others in the Big Ten for that week.
- Toney has collected two or more sacks in four career games and has recorded two or more sacks in a quarter three times in his career (2018 at Indiana, 2019 vs. Purdue, 2020 at Indiana).
- Toney has 17.5 career sacks.
- Last season, Penn State ranked 11th in FBS and second in the Big Ten in tackles for loss per game (7.8), and seventh in FBS and third in the Big Ten in sacks (3.46 per game), totaling 45 for the year.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23. 2013.

- The Nittany Lions will face five teams that participated in a bowl game during the 2019 campaign.
- Indiana went 8-4 during the regular season and fell to Tennessee in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, 23-22.
- Ohio State won the Big Ten East Division and went on to defeat Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game (34-21). The Buckeyes fell to Clemson in the College Football Playoff Semifinal (29-23).
- lowa finished the season 10-3 overall after defeating the USC Spartans in the Holiday Bowl, 49-24.
- Michigan earned a spot in the VRBO Citrus Bowl, losing to No. 9 Alabama, 35-16, to finish 9-4 on the year.
- Michigan State finished 7-6 overall after picking up a 27-21 victory over Wake Forest in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

- · The 2020 season marks the 20th straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular-season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.

- Penn State is 55-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 16-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

HOME OPENER HISTORY

- Penn State's all-time record in home openers is 119-14-1 and 51-10 in Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State has won 17 out of its last 19 home openers, but had a streak of seven consecutive wins snapped against Ohio State.
- Penn State played its latest home opener since World War I and an influenza pandemic delayed the start of the 1918 season until Nov. 2 against the Wissahickon Barracks (6-6).
- Penn State is 1-1 when playing its home opener against a Big Ten opponent. Penn State's very first Big Ten game in 1993 was a 38-20 win over Minnesota to open the season.

- OB Sean Clifford was named to the Davey O'Brien Award, The Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Wuerffel Trophy preseason watch lists.
- Clifford was one of 30 quarterbacks named to The Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award watch list. The award is presented annually to the nation's best college quarterback and is the oldest and most prestigious national quarterback award.
- · Penn State has had two O'Brien Award winners, with Todd Blackledge (1982) and Kerry Collins (1994) each earning the honor. John Schaffer was also named a finalist in 1986.
- · Sixteen semifinalists selected from the final watch list will be named on Tuesday, Nov. 10. The Davey O'Brien Foundation will announce the three finalists two weeks later (Tuesday, Nov. 24).
- The Johnny Unitas award is presented annually to the top senior and upperclassman quarterback set to graduate with their class by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Selection Committee. Candidates are chosen based on player performance on and off the field.
- The Manning Award list includes 30 of the top guarterbacks in the nation heading into the 2020 season. It was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. It is the only quarterback award that includes the candidates' bowl performances in its balloting.
- The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented each February in Fort Walton Beach. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback from the University of Florida, Danny Wuerffel, the Wuerffel Trophy exists to honor college football players who serve others, celebrate their positive impact on society, and inspire greater service in the world. Semifinalists for the award will be announced on November 3 and finalists will be announced on November 23. The formal announcement of the 2020 recipient will be made at the National Football Foundation's festivities in New York City on December 8. The presentation of the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy will occur at the 52nd All Sports Association Awards Banquet on February 19, 2021 in Fort Walton Beach.

URSCHEL NAMED TO CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, was named to a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics (expected completion in 2020), which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.
- Urschel has written a memoir, "Mind and Matter," with his wife, journalist Louisa Thomas, chronicling his life in athletics and academics. Last spring, even as he tackled the commitment of a full-time graduate student, he was a teaching assistant for the first time — in a Differential Equations course.

MEDICAL PROTOCOLS

The Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) adopted significant medical protocols including daily antigen testing, enhanced cardiac screening and an enhanced data-driven approach when making decisions about practice/competition. The COP/C voted unanimously to resume the football season starting the weekend of October 23-24, 2020. The decision was based on information presented by the Big Ten Return to Competition Task Force, a working group that was established by the COP/C and Commissioner Kevin Warren to ensure a collaborative and transparent process.

The Big Ten is requiring student-athletes, coaches, trainers and other individuals that are on the field for all practices and games to undergo daily antigen testing. Test results must be completed and recorded prior to each practice or game. Student-athletes who test positive for the coronavirus through point of contact (POC) daily testing would require a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result of the POC test.

Each institution has designated a Chief Infection Officer (CInO) who will oversee the collection and reporting of data for the Big Ten Conference. Team test positivity rate and population positivity rate thresholds will be used to determine recommendations for continuing practice and competition.

All COVID-19 positive student-athletes will have to undergo comprehensive cardiac testing to include labs and biomarkers, ECG, Echocardiogram and a Cardiac MRI. Following cardiac evaluation, student-athletes must receive clearance from a cardiologist designated by the university for the primary purpose of cardiac clearance for COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The earliest a student-athlete can return to game competition is 21 days following a COVID-19 positive diagnosis.

In addition to the medical protocols approved, the 14 Big Ten institutions will establish a cardiac registry in an effort to examine the effects on COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The registry and associated data will attempt to answer many of the unknowns regarding the cardiac manifestations in COVID-19 positive elite athletes.

The Big Ten Conference will use data provided by each Chief Infection Officer (CInO) to make decisions about the continuation of practice and competition, as determined by team positivity rate and population positivity rate, based on a seven-day rolling average:

Team positivity rate (number of positive tests divided by total number of tests administered):

- Green 0-2%
- Orange 2-5%
- Red >5%

Population positivity rate (number of positive individuals divided by total population at risk):

- Green 0-3.5%
- Orange 3.5-7.5%
- Red >7.5%

Decisions to alter or halt practice and competition will be based on the following scenarios:

- Green/Green and Green/Orange: Team continues with normal practice and competition.
- Orange/Orange and Orange/Red: Team must proceed with caution and enhance COVID-19 prevention (alter practice and meeting schedule, consider viability of continuing with scheduled competition).
- Red/Red: Team must stop regular practice and competition for a minimum of seven days and reassess metrics until improved.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 41 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 23 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, seven former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs and two former PSU student-athletes from sports other than football are on rosters.
- Eight players from PSU's 2019 squad are on NFL teams.

FOUR FORMER LIONS ON 2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen D.J. Dozier, Bobby Engram and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2021. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2021 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2021. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Additionally, current Penn State wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is on the ballot. Stubblefield was a wide receiver at Purdue (2001-04) and was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier will forever have a place in Penn State Football lore for scoring the gamewinning touchdown on a six-yard fourth quarter run to lift the Nittany Lions past Miami, 14-10, in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl.
- Engram is considered one of the greatest wide receivers in Penn State history. As a junior on Penn State's undefeated Big Ten and Rose Bowl championship team of 1994, Engram won the first Biletnikoff Award that is given annually to the best receiver in college football. When he graduated in 1996, Engram held 12 team receiving records, and still holds the records for receiving yards in a career (3,026) and single season (1,084) and touchdown receptions in a game (four against Minnesota in 1993), a season (13 in 1993) and career (31).
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American
 at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at
 Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and
 West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach
 in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania
 Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Stubblefield finished his career with an NCAA-record 325
 receptions and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629
 yards. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions,
 while his NCAA receptions record stood until 2011. Stubblefield
 also holds the Purdue record for receiving touchdowns in a
 season with 16 in 2004.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2021 season.

GAME RECAP

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford accounted for four touchdowns, including a late go-ahead touchdown pass and an overtime touchdown throw, but Indiana rallied to defeat No. 8/7 Penn State, 36-35, in the extra frame.

Clifford accounted for four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing) and 357 yards of total offense, throwing for 238 yards on 24-of-35 passing and rushing for 119 yards — the seventh-most by a quarterback in Penn State history. Pat Freiermuth became Penn State's career leader in touchdown receptions by a tight end and caught seven passes for 60 yards. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson had four catches for 94 yards, including a late 60-yard touchdown reception. Shaka Toney led the Penn State defense with seven tackles, which were all solo and included two sacks. Safety Lamont Wade recovered a fumble and made his first career interception.

For Indiana, quarterback Michael Penix Jr. went 19-for-36 passing for 170 yards with a touchdown throw in overtime and two successful two-point conversion rushes - one to force overtime and one to win the game - while running back Stevie Scott III rushed for two touchdowns in the first half. Safety Jamar Johnson made 10 tackles, an interception and forced a fumble the Hoosiers recovered, while cornerback Jaylin Williams also added an interception.

How It Happened

With Penn State trailing by six late in the fourth quarter, Clifford found Dotson over the middle for a 60-yard touchdown strike and a 21-20 Penn State lead. Then after stopping Indiana on fourth down, running back Devyn Ford rushed for a touchdown with 1:42 remaining for a 28-20 PSU advantage. However, Indiana's Penix led the Hoosiers on a game-tying touchdown drive, rushing for both the touchdown and ensuing two-point attempt.

In overtime, Clifford threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Parker Washington for a 35-28 Nittany Lion lead, but Penix answered with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Whop Philyor on Indiana's possession, and the Hoosiers elected to go for two to decide the game. Penix ran left and dove, extending the football towards the pylon, making contact with both it and the ground out of bounds, for what was ruled a touchdown. The play was reviewed, but the call stood.

Penn State took the game's first lead with Freiermuth's touchdown catch on the opening drive, converting on fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line.

Williams intercepted Clifford late in the first quarter leading to the Hoosiers' first score, a field goal, early in the second quarter. Scott then gave Indiana a 17-7 lead with a pair of rushing touchdowns.

Clifford scampered for a 35-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to three at the end of the third quarter, before Indiana added a field goal for a 20-14 advantage. Penn State was able to retake the lead on the Clifford-Dotson score, but Indiana answered.

Notes

- Penn State dropped to 22-2 all-time against Indiana, including an 11-2 mark in Bloomington. The Nittany Lions snapped a sixgame win streak against the Hoosiers.
- Penn State converted 27 first downs, tying the ninth-most by the team in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions tallied 52 rushing attempts, equaling the fourth-most by the program under James Franklin. Penn State last had 52 rushing attempts against lowa in 2016.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive, covering 7:01.
 It was Penn State's longest time-covering drive since a 9:01 drive against Indiana in 2019.
- WR Parker Washington became the first true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since Brandon Polk against Temple in 2015.
- Washington caught a 9-yard touchdown pass in overtime, marking the second-straight season opener with a freshman catching a touchdown pass. Brenton Strange caught a 4-yard touchdown reception against Idaho in 2019.
- QB Sean Clifford ran for a career-best 119 yards on 17 carries. It
 was his first career 100-yard rushing game and Penn State's first
 100-yard rushing game by a quarterback since Will Levis ran for
 108 yards against Rutgers in 2019.
- Clifford scored on a 35-yard run at the end of the third quarter.
 It was Clifford's second career rushing touchdown over 30 yards, joining his 38-yard run against Indiana in 2019.
- TE Pat Freiermuth owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17).
- WR Jahan Dotson hauled in a 60-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. It was Dotson's fifth career touchdown catch and his fourth of 40 or more yards.
- The Nittany Lions held Indiana to 211 total yards, the ninthfewest allowed under James Franklin.
- Indiana attempted only 26 rushes, tied for the sixth-lowest by any opponent in the James Franklin era.
- DE Shaka Toney matched a career high with seven tackles, tying his performance against Michigan in 2019.
- S Lamont Wade intercepted a pass in the third quarter, his first career interception.
- CB Joey Porter Jr. registered his first career sack in the first quarter and collected a career-best five tackles, topping two tackles against Rutgers in 2019.
- LB Ellis Brooks forced his first career forced fumble.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Wide receiver Jahan Dotson scored three touchdowns and totaled 144 yards receiving for No. 18/17 Penn State, but No. 3 Ohio State made an early lead last for a 38-25 win over the Nittany Lions.

It was Dotson's second career 100-yard receiving game and a career-high total, and his three touchdowns and eight receptions were also career highs. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18-of-30 passes for 281 yards and the three touchdowns. Of Clifford's passing yards, 252 came in the second half.

Ohio State was paced by quarterback Justin Fields, who completed 28-of-34 passes for 318 yards and four touchdowns. Garrett Wilson caught 11 passes for 111 yards and had a 62-yard rush, while Chris Olave caught seven passes for 120 yards and 2 touchdowns and Jeremy Ruckert added a pair of receiving touchdowns.

Linebacker Ellis Brooks paced the Penn State defense with a career-high 11 tackles, while linebacker Brandon Smith and defensive tackle Antonio Shelton both tallied sacks. Tommy Togiai led Ohio State with seven tackles and three sacks and Marcus Hooker had six tackles and an interception.

How It Happened

Ohio State jumped out to an early two-touchdown lead. Wilson broke free for 62 yards on the first play from scrimmage and Master Teague III scored from four yards out two plays later to give the Buckeyes a 7-0 lead. Penn State failed to convert on fourth-and-two at its own 45 on the ensuing drive, and Ohio State took advantage of the short field when Olave hauled in a 26-yard touchdown catch.

Penn State put together a field goal drive for its first score with 2:57 remaining in the first quarter, but the Buckeyes added another touchdown before the end of the half on a 10-yard throw to Jeremy Ruckert over the middle. Jordan Stout drilled a 50-yard field goal for the Nittany Lions as the half expired to go to halftime down 21-6.

Penn State opened the second half with the ball and marched down the field for an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 14-yard touchdown reception by Dotson. Ohio State answered midway through the third quarter with a 49-yard touchdown catch by Olave and added a field goal before the end of the quarter.

The Nittany Lions made it a 31-19 game at the start of the fourth quarter after a pair of highlight reel catches by Dotson. On the first play of the final stanza on third-and-17, Dotson caught a 37-yard pass with one hand and the side of his helmet. On the next play, he made a one-handed snag for a 21-yard touchdown catch.

Fields found Ruckert again in the end zone with 9:14 to go and Clifford connected with Dotson on a 20-yard strike with 6:27 to go to make it a 38-25 game. Hooker sealed the game for Ohio State with an interception in Penn State territory in the game's final minutes.
