NEBRASKA (0-2) vs. PENN STATE (0-3)

Nebraska returns to Lincoln this Saturday when the Huskers take on Penn State at Memorial Stadium. The Big Ten cross-division matchup is set to kick off shortly after 11 a.m. with the game televised nationally on FS1.

The game will match two traditional Big Ten and college football powers who are looking for their first victory of the 2020 season. The contest against the Nittany Lions will mark Nebraska's second attempt at a 2020 home opener. Nebraska was scheduled to open its home schedule on Halloween against Wisconsin, but that game was canceled. As a result, Nebraska opened the season with two road games for the first time since 1995, and will play three of its five remaning scheduled games at Memorial Stadium.

The Huskers stand at 0-2 after a 21-13 loss at Northwestern on Saturday. The Husker offense moved the ball well against the stingy Wildcat defense, but was unable to finish drives. Nebraska was 3-of-6 in the red zone, including a last-minute drive that ended on a loss of downs inside the Northwestern 20.

Penn State comes into Saturday's matchup with an 0-3 record following a 35-19 home setback against Maryland on Saturday. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked seventh in both polls after an 11-win campaign in 2019. Penn State opened the season with an overtime loss at Indiana, before dropping a home contest against No. 3 Ohio State on Halloween, prior to Saturday's loss against the Terrapins.

Coach James Franklin's team features a strong passing offense that averages 286.3 yards per game through the air. The Penn State defense is strong against the run, allowing opponents just 124.0 yards per game on the ground.

Saturday's game marks just the second trip by Penn State to Lincoln since Nebraska joined the Big Ten in 2011. The only other Big Ten matchup at Memorial Stadium between the Huskers and Nittany Lions was a Nebraska win in 2012. The schools have met seven times overall in Lincoln.

Saturday marks the latest date for a Nebraska football home opener in 125 years. The Nov. 14 date is the latest for a Nebraska home opener since NU hosted Kansas on Nov. 16, 1895.

In Nebraska's past five games (3 in 2019 and 2 in 2020), the Husker pass defense has allowed just 139.2 passing yards per game. Nebraska has held four of the five opponents to less than 170 passing yards, with only Ohio State surpassing that yardage mark.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. PENN STATE

Nebraska leads the all-time series with Penn State, 9-8. The Huskers are 3-1 against the Nittany Lions since joining the Big Ten Conference in 2011.

- Saturday's game will be the fifth meeting between Nebraska and Penn State as Big Ten foes, but only the second at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers lead the all-time series 5-2 at Memorial Stadium, including a 32-23 win over the Nittany Lions in 2012 in the only conference game between the two programs in Lincoln.
- Penn State won the last meeting, defeating the Huskers, 56-44, in 2017. The Huskers' last win in the series was a 23-20 overtime victory in 2013, Nebraska's first overtime game in Big Ten play.
- The first meeting between the teams as Big Ten foes occurred in 2011, when No. 19 Nebraska upset 12th-ranked Penn State, 17-14 in the first game of the post-Joe Paterno era at PSU.
- For the first three years of Nebraska's time in the Big Ten, the Huskers and Nittany Lions met annually as a protected cross-division matchup. That was prior to the Big Ten switching to the current East-West divisional alignment.
- Nebraska and Penn State had a long history of matching up in non-conference games prior to the Huskers joining the Big Ten. The schools met five consecutive years from 1979 to 1983, with Nebraska winning three of the five games. Both teams were ranked in each of those five games, including two games featuring a matchup of top-10 teams.
- The schools had a home-and-home series in 2002 and 2003, with each team winning on its home field.

FROST IN THIRD SEASON LEADING HUSKERS

Scott Frost is in his third season at Nebraska in 2020. The consensus 2017 national coach of the year, Frost boasts a 28-24 career record in five seasons as a collegiate head coach.

- Frost is 9-17 at Nebraska, with 10 losses by eight or fewer points, including eight by five or fewer points.
- Nebraska went 5-7 in 2019, a one-game improvement over the previous two seasons. NU's 12-game schedule in 2019 featured six teams that were ranked in the top 25 at least once during the season, including four that finished the year in the top 15.
- Frost has improved upon his team's previous season record every year he has been a head coach. At UCF, Frost who inherited a winless team went from 6-7 in his first season to 13-0 in year two. He improved by one game at Nebraska from 2018 to 2019.
- At UCF, Frost became the first coach in FBS history to turn a winless team into an undefeated team
 in just two years.
- Of Frost's 10 assistant coaches, seven have been with him in each of his five seasons as a collegiate head coach, while Mike Dawson has been on four of Frost's five staffs.
- In 14 years as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 131-42 record, averaging more than 10 wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams in his 13 seasons and has twice coached in the national championship game.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 13 seasons, including eight final top-10 rankings and six final top-five rankings.

NEW FACES. NEW ROLES ON HUSKER COACHING STAFF

Seven of Nebraska's 10 full-time assistant coaches returned for their third season in 2020, and all seven have been a member of Scott Frost's staff for his entire five-year head coaching career. The Huskers also welcome two new assistant coaches this season, but both are familiar with Frost.

- Matt Lubick joined the staff as Nebraska's offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach. Lubick previously was the offensive coordinator at Pac-12 powers Oregon and Washington. He succeeded Frost as the Ducks' offensive coordinator, as Lubick was the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach in each of Frost's three seasons as Oregon's offensive coordinator.
- The other new face on the Husker sideline is a familiar one. **Mike Dawson**, who was on Frost's staff for both seasons at UCF, coached the Husker defensive line in 2018 before moving on to the NFL in 2019, coaching outside linebackers for the New York Giants. In his return to Nebraska, Dawson coaches the outside linebackers.
- In addition to the two new full-time assistant coaches, two other staff members added responsibilities in 2020. Greg Austin added the title of run game coordinator to his duties as offensive line coach, while Ryan Held serves as recruiting coordinator in addition to continuing his role as running backs coach.
- The Husker staff features three Broyles Award nominees in defensive coordinator Erik Chinander (2016 at UCF), offensive coordinator Matt Lubick (2012 at Duke) and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco (2018 at Nebraska). The Broyles Award is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Lubick was also named the national wide receivers coach of the year and an AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year finalist in 2012.

QUARTERBACK DUO PROVIDING RUNNING THREAT

Nebraska quarterbacks **Adrian Martinez** and **Luke McCaffrey** have each guided the Husker offense to success in 2020. A big part of that success has been the running ability of the quarterback tandem.

- Nebraska ranks second in the Big Ten and 21st nationally in rushing offense, averging 217.0 yards per game. Martinez (93.5 ypg) and McCaffrey (64.5 ypg) combine to average 158.0 rushing yards per contest.
- The 158.0 rushing yards per game by the quarterbacks alone would rank eighth in the Big Ten in team rushing yards per game.
- Against Northwestern, Martinez posted his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 13 carries for 102 yards.
- Excluding sacks, the Husker quarterback duo have combined for 305 rushing yards on 39 attempts, an average of 7.8 yards per carry.
- According to CFBstats.com, both of the quarterbacks rank in the top 20 nationally in yards per carry, regardless of position. Among players with a minimum of 15 carries in 2020, McCafrrey ranks 11th nationally and second among quarterbacks at 7.59 yards per carry. Martinez is 18th nationally and fourth among quarterbacks at 7.19 yards per attempt.

MARTINEZ NUMBERS RANKING AMONG NATION'S BEST QBS

Adrian Martinez has put up statistics in his two-plus seasons that have him ranked among the top quarterbacks in the country and among the Nebraska all-time leaders in several categories. Martinez has thrown for 4,803 career yards, rushed for 1,442 yards and totaled 6,245 yards of offense.

He owns three NU career records, four season records and one game record. Last season, Martinez was just the second Husker sophomore to be a team captain since 1930 and he again holds that distinction this year, becoming one of just 13 two-time captains in Nebraska history.

- Martinez is Nebraska's all-time leader in total offensive yards per game (271.5) and 400-yard total offense games (4). He has produced four of Nebraska's 16 individual 400-yard total offense performances, and Martinez's career average of 271.5 yards of total offense per game is more than 30 yards higher than any other Husker quarterback who played in at least 15 career games.
- Martinez averaged a school-record 295.1 yards of total offense per game as a true freshman in 2018. That average that ranked 12th nationally, led all freshmen and was the ninth-highest average by a freshman in NCAA history, including the third-best mark by a true freshman.
- Martinez also set NU season records for 300-yard total offense games (7) and 400-yard total offense games (3) in 2018.
- Martinez set an NU record with an 86.2 completion percentage against Minnesota in 2018, connecting on 25-of-29 passes for 276 yards and three touchdowns.
- At Illinois in 2019, Martinez produced the second 300-yard passing and 100-yard rushing performance in Nebraska history (328 passing, 118 rushing). His career-high 446 yards of total offense was the third-highest total in program history.

- Martinez has been one of the nation's top dual-threat quarterbacks. He is one of only 12 active FBS quarterbacks with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards. Martinez is only the fourth Husker with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.
- In 2018, Martinez became just the sixth freshman in NCAA history to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game and just the second true freshman to hit those marks. Martinez was also one of only four FBS quarterbacks regardless of class who averaged 225 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game in 2018.

FROST OFFENSES TRADITIONALLY IMPRESSIVE ON OPENING DRIVES

One common theme of a **Scott Frost**-led offense has been a fast start. That trend continued in the 2020 opener, when Nebraska opened the scoring with a four-play, 75-yard touchdown drive at No. 5 Ohio State, needing just 1:51 to find the end zone.

- In Frost's three seasons, Nebraska has scored on its opening possession 12 times in 26 games (11 TD, 1 FG).
- Nebraska scored on its first possession seven times in 12 games in 2018, including six of the final seven games. All seven of NU's opening scoring drives resulted in touchdowns. In 2019, the Huskers scored points on their opening drive four times in 12 games, including three touchdowns.
- Over the last four seasons 2018-20 at Nebraska and 2017 at UCF Frost's offenses have scored a touchdown on their opening possession 20 times in 39 games (51 percent). The average length of the touchdown drive in that span is 74 yards.
- In five years as a head coach, Frost's offenses have scored on their opening drive 25 times in 52 games, with 23 touchdowns and two field goals. In 92 games over eight seasons as a play-caller, Frost's offenses have scored on their first possession of the game 46 times, putting points on the board in half of their opening possessions.
- Nebraska has received the opening kickoff and scored a touchdown nine times in 26 games under Frost. In 2018, the Huskers had a game-opening touchdown drive to take a 7-0 lead in five straight games during the Big Ten Conference season.

NOTING GAME 2

- Four Huskers made their first career start including Ethan Piper (LG), Luke Reimer (ILB), Myles Farmer (S) and Quinton Newsome (CB). Senior OL Matt Farniok made his first career start at center and has started games at tackle, guard and center in his career.
- Redshirt freshman safety Myles Farmer recorded the first two interceptions of his career, both in the second quarter. The first one set up a Nebraska field goal, while he returned his second pick 37 yards to the Northwestern 3 to set up a touchdown. Farmer is the first Husker to have two interceptions in a game since Eric Lee Jr. had two interception in the 2019 season opener against South Alabama.
- Running back Dedrick Mills scored Nebraska's only touchdown, marking the fifth time in six games he has had at least one rushing touchdown.
- Quarterback Adrian Martinez rushed for 102 yards on 13 carries, marking his fourth career 100-yard rushing game. The 100-yard rushing game was the 500th individual 100yard rushing game in Nebraska history.
- Linebacker Luke Reimer had a team-high 10 tackles, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. Reimer entered the game with 11 career tackles.
- Nebraska sophomore receiver Wan'Dale Robinson caught four passes in the game, pushing his career receptions total to 50. He reached 50 career receptions the secondfastest of any Husker in history, achieving the mark in just 12 games.

HUSKERS' YOUTH SHOW POTENTIAL AT NORTHWESTERN

Nebraska's 2020 roster features a mix of veteran players who have been fixtures for Nebraska for the past three and four seasons. However, at Northwestern several young players began to show the ability to form a nucleus of the Husker roster for the next several seasons.

- Nebraska freshmen have produced 44 percent of Nebraska's all-purpose yards through two games.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback Luke McCaffrey has split time with Adrian Martinez at quarterback.
 McCaffrey ranks as Nebraska's second-leading rusher (129 yards) and second-leading passer (148 yards) through two games.
- Several young receivers saw significant action at Northwestern. True freshman Marcus Fleming led the Huskers with 75 receiving yards on five catches, sophomore Wan'Dale Robinson had four catches and true freshman Zavier Betts had a pair of receptions. True freshman wideout Alante Brown and junior-college newcomer Omar Manning also saw extensive action in Evanston.
- Robinson's four receptions increased his career catch total to 50 in his 12th career game. Robinson
 reached 50 career receptions the second-fastest of any Husker. Only JD Spielman reached 50
 career catches (11 games) quicker than Robinson, while Nate Swift also caught his 50th pass in
 his 12th career game as a Husker.
- Senior Dedrick Mills is Nebraska's top running back. He is backed up by a trio of freshmen, including true freshman Marvin Scott III and redshirt freshmen Ronald Thompkins and Rahmir Johnson
- Redshirt freshmen Bryce Benhart (RT) and Ethan Piper (LG) earned starts at Northwestern. It
 marked the second career start for Benhart and first for Piper. The Northwestern game marked
 just the third game in school history Nebraska has started a pair of freshmen offensive linemen.
 Current seniors Brenden Jaimes and Matt Farniok started on the same offensive line against
 Northwestern and Minnesota in 2017.
- Sophomore linebacker Luke Reimer led Nebraska in tackles at Northwestern with 10 stops, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, while adding a fumble caused. Reimer had 11 career tackles before Saturday's game. Redshirt freshman Nick Henrich and true sophomore Garrett Nelson are part of the Huskers' regular rotation at outside linebacker.
- Sophomore cornerback Quinton Newsome and redshirt freshman safety Myles Farmer earned
 their first career starts at Northwestern. Farmer made the most of his first start, with a pair of
 second-quarter interceptions that led to 10 Nebraska points. Newsome finished the game with
 three tackles

HUSKERS FEATURE RETURNING OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

Nebraska boasted plenty of returning offensive production in 2020. NU returned more than 80 percent of its yards from last year in rushing (86 percent), passing (82 percent) and total offense (82 percent).

- Nebraska returned its top three rushers from last season in Dedrick Mills (745), Adrian Martinez (626) and Wan'Dale Robinson (340).
- Mills averaged 115.7 rushing yards per game over Nebraska's final three contests, despite playing
 only the first half of the Huskers' win at Maryland. He ran for a career-high 188 yards on 17 carries
 against Wisconsin, averaging more than 11 yards per carry. Mills has scored a rushing touchdown
 in five of his past six games, including both of the Huskers' 2020 games.
- NU also returned its leading passer in **Adrian Martinez** (1,956 yards), while **Luke McCaffrey** completed 9-of-12 passes for 142 yards and two touchdowns in 2019.
- In the receiving game, Nebraska is replacing two of its three leading receivers from 2019. **Wan'Dale Robinson**, who split time at running back last fall, is NU's top returning receiver after he ranked second on the team with 40 catches and 453 receiving yards in 2019. Tight end **Jack Stoll** also returns after ranking third with 25 catches in 2019 and fourth with 234 receiving yards.
- Robinson was one of four national finalists for the Paul Hornung Award (nation's most versatile
 player) in 2019, joining Ameer Abdullah as the only Huskers to be a Hornung Award finalist.
 Robinson was also on the preseason watch list for the 2020 Paul Hornung Award, while Stoll
 earned a spot on the Mackey Award (nation's top tight end) watch list in 2018, 2019 and 2020.

A TALE OF TWO LINES

Nebraska returned every offensive line starter from last season, while the Huskers had to replace every defensive line starter, as all three 2019 starting defensive linemen are on NFL rosters. Three Huskers returned to their same spot on the offensive line this season, while senior Matt Farniok moved from right tackle to right guard, with redshirt freshman Bryce Benhart taking over at right tackle. Farniok continued to show his versatility at Northwestern, when he started at center in place on an injured Cam Jurgens.

- Based on available records, 2020 is believed to be the first time Nebraska returns its entire starting offensive line since two-platoon systems were first allowed under NCAA rules in 1964.
- Nebraska is the only team in the country that had the same starting offensive line (by player and position) for every game during the 2019 season and returned all five of those starters.
- Nebraska had the same starting offensive line for all 12 games in 2019, one of eight teams nationally to start the same five linemen every game. It marked the first time since 2010 that NU had the same starting line for an entire season.
- Nebraska's five returning starting offensive linemen combined for 106 career starts entering the season, including three players who have made at least 20 consecutive starts at their position. Nebraska's 106 combined starts among offensive linemen entering 2020 ranked eighth nationally.
- The returning starters were Brenden Jaimes (26 straight starts at left tackle; 35 straight starts overall), Matt Farniok (26 straight starts), Boe Wilson (23 straight starts at guard), Cam Jurgens and Trent Hixson. Hixson started all 12 games at guard last season and is now Nebraska's top backup on the interior of the line.
- Jaimes is a two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick, while Wilson was honorable mention in 2018 and Jurgens is the only Husker freshman (true or redshirt) to ever start at center.
- On defense, the Huskers replaced all three defensive line starters, all of whom are now on NFL rosters. The last time Nebraska had to replace its entire defensive line was in 2016.
- Ben Stille is Nebraska's most experienced defensive lineman. The senior has started 16 games at defensive end in his career and is the Huskers' active leader with 23 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks. Damion Daniels was the only other defensive lineman with a start entering 2020 (1 start in 2019). Daniels and redshirt freshman Ty Robinson started along the defensive line with Stille in game one, while sophomore Casey Rogers earned a start alongside Stille at Northwestern.

NEBRASKA LINEBACKING CORPS A MIX OF VETERANS, YOUTH

Nebraska replaced one starting inside and outside linebacker, but the Huskers have ample experience at the second level of the defense. Overall, NU has a youth movement at linebacker, as 22 of the 29 linebackers on the Husker roster are either freshmen or sophomores.

- Outside linebackers JoJo Domann and Caleb Tannor split time as starters in 2019, and Domann had nine TFLs, the most of any returning Husker. Domann and Tannor are two of only four upperclassmen among NU's 14 outside linebackers, while sophomore Garrett Nelson has made his first two career starts this season.
- Seniors Will Honas and Collin Miller split time at inside linebacker in 2019, and are the veterans in a three-man linebacker rotation. Honas ranked second on the team with 73 tackles, while Miller tied for third with 67 tackles. Honas opened the season with two sacks for 14 yards at Ohio State.
- Honas and Miller are two of the three upperclassmen among Nebraska's inside linebacker group, along with first-year junior college transfer Eteva Mauga-Clements. All other inside linebackers are either freshmen or sophomores.

SECONDARY LOOKS STRONG AGAIN

Nebraska's secondary was stout in 2019, as the Huskers allowed only 200.8 passing yards per game, the program's fewest yards allowed since 2012. Although Nebraska replaced all-conference cornerback Lamar Jackson, the rest of last year's regular secondary members return.

- Dicaprio Bootle, a third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2018 and honorable-mention pick in 2019, has started 26 consecutive games. The senior corner's 22 career pass breakups are tied for 10th place in Nebraska history.
- Cam Taylor-Britt starts at the other cornerback spot. In 10 starts as a sophomore in 2019, Taylor-Britt ranked third nationally in forced fumbles and also intercepted three passes.
- Marquel Dismuke started all 12 games at safety last fall, and he led the secondary with a careerhigh 67 tackles, which tied for third on the team overall. Dismuke also added four pass breakups.
- The secondary also features the return of safety **Deontai Williams**, who suffered a season-ending injury in the first game of 2019. In his first season at Nebraska in 2018, Williams was a ballhawk who led NU in interceptions (2), forced fumbles (2) and fumble recoveries (1).

NEBRASKA AIMS FOR SPECIAL TEAMS IMPROVEMENT

Nebraska fields an entirely new special teams unit this season - including a new special teams coach - as it aims to improve in that aspect of the game in 2020. To help improve those rankings, Scott Frost hired **Jonathan Rutledge** as Nebraska's Senior Special Teams Analyst during the offseason. With Auburn the past two seasons, Rutledge led a Tigers' special teams unit that was ranked 13th nationally in 2019 and 14th in 2018 by Football Outsiders.

- Nebraska features a new punter, new place-kicker, new long snappers and a new holder. NU also replaced its top punt returner from last season.
- Sophomore **William Przystup** averaged 44.6 yards on five punts at Ohio State in the season opener, and is averaging 42.5 yards on the season. He previously punted at Michigan State in 2018 before transferring to Nebraska.
- Nebraska used six place-kickers last season and only one returned for 2020 in Lane McCallum, a defensive player who filled in as an emergency kicker last season and figures to focus exclusively on defense this fall. NU added five place-kickers to its roster during the offseason, including a pair of transfers. Senior Connor Culp joined Nebraska as a graduate transfer from LSU, and he was the Tigers' starting place-kicker as a sophomore in 2017, connecting on 11-of-16 field goals. Culp has connected on 3-of-4 field goals and all 3 PATs to open the season.
- At long snapper, Nebraska replaced Chase Urbach, who started every game last season. No Husker had snapped in a game prior to the season opener. Sophomores **Cade Mueller** (punts) and **Cameron Pieper** (place-kicks) are splitting snapping duties to start the season.

HUSKER STREAKS CONTINUE INTO 2020 SEASON

A pair of impressive team streaks and several individual streaks will continue this season, while a legendary streak takes a one-year hiatus in 2020.

- Nebraska has sold out 375 consecutive games at Memorial Stadium, dating from the next-to-last home game of the 1962 season through all seven home games last season. With the Big Ten Conference decision to prohibit the sale of tickets this year, the Huskers' legendary sellout streak an NCAA record will pause during the 2020 season. Nebraska's streak will remain at 375 consecutive home sellouts until next year's home opener with Buffalo on Sept. 11, 2021.
- The Huskers have scored in 309 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the seventh-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak. The last time Nebraska was shut out was a 19-0 loss at No. 17 Arizona State on Sept. 21, 1996.
- Nebraska has also scored in 341 consecutive home games, a school record. The last time the Huskers were shut out at home came on Nov. 9, 1968 against Kansas State (12-0 loss).
- Nebraska is 251-0 all-time when scoring 35 or more points at home. **Scott Frost** is also 21-0 in his head coaching career when his team scores at least 35 points.
- Several individual Huskers have double-digit streaks of consecutive starts, including four offensive linemen. **Brenden Jaimes** has started 35 consecutive games overall and 26 straight at left tackle, **Dicaprio Bootle** (cornerback/safety) and **Matt Farniok** (center/right tackle/guard) have each started 26 consecutive games and **Boe Wilson** (guard) has made 23 consecutive starts.

HUSKERS OWN BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

Nebraska has enjoyed much success in its history when playing at home in front of the greatest fans in college football. Recently, the Huskers have won at least six home games in 24 of the past 33 seasons. Nebraska is 178-40 (.838) at home over the last 30 seasons.

- Since 1970, NU is 280-55 (.836) at Memorial Stadium and has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 549-159-20 all-time in Lincoln (.768 in 130 years).
- Nebraska is 422-136-13 in Memorial Stadium (.750 in 96 years dating back to 1923).
- The Huskers are 47-8 all-time in Memorial Stadium night games.

FROST AS A HEAD COACH

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 131st season this fall, and the Huskers boast a 902-397-40 all-time record in 1,339 games (.689). Nebraska is one of seven programs with 900 wins.

- Nebraska joined the 900-win club at Illinois on Sept. 21, 2019, along with Michigan, Ohio State, Texas and Alabama in that club. Notre Dame and Oklahoma joined the elite club on Sept. 28.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 468-156-5 record (.748) with five national championships. The Huskers rank second among all FBS programs in national titles and third in wins since 1970.
- Nebraska boasts 27 10-win seasons in school history, including 24 since 1970. The Huskers also
 have 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win
 seasons.
- The Huskers own 50 nine-win seasons, tied with Alabama for the most in NCAA history. Fortytwo of those nine-win seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 13 more than any other school.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

HUSKERS RANK HIGHLY IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska has won five national championships, including three outright titles (1971, 1994, 1995) and two shared championships (1970, 1997). In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the Associated Press national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- Nebraska's four AP national championships rank seventh all-time.
- The Huskers' four coaches' poll national championships rank fourth all-time.

NEBRASKA NO. 2 IN CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska is one of only five schools in NCAA history that has won at least 40 conference championships, ranking second all-time with 46 conference titles. In 36 seasons (1962-97) under Hall-of-Fame coaches Bob Devaney (8) and Tom Osborne (13), the Huskers won 21 conference titles.

NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, as the Huskers have been outstanding in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 340 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any single sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 17 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics for NCAA student-athletes.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.
- Nebraska recorded an all-time high in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate numbers released in October of 2019. Nebraska's all-sports GSR rate of 93 percent marked the seventh consecutive year the Huskers GSR rate had improved.
- The football team posted a program-record team grade-point average of 3.297 in the 2020 spring semester. Entering this fall, the team's 3.149 cumulative GPA was also the highest in program history.

HUSKERS HONOR FLIPPIN

 Nebraska is wearing a helmet decal this year in honor of George Flippin. Flippin, who lettered from 1892-94, was NU's first African-American player. He was elected a captain for the 1895 season, but did not participate in that year. Flippin went on to practice medicine in Stromsburg, Neb.

SCHEDULE NOTES

 Nebraska was scheduled to play more than half of its schedule against top-15 teams from a year ago, facing a top-15 team in five of its eight scheduled games.

- Nebraska and Arkansas are the only teams in the country that were scheduled to play more than four top-15 opponents from a season ago. Arkansas faces five 2019 top-15 opponents in 10 games, while Nebraska faces five top-15 opponents in its eight scheduled games.
- The Huskers' original 12-game schedule was altered to become a 10-game conference-only schedule on Aug. 5. Six days later on Aug. 11, the Big Ten Conference postponed the season. The Big Ten then announced a nine-game conference-only slate on Sept. 16.
- With a nine-game schedule, now reduced to eight games, Nebraska is set to play its fewest regular-season games since an eightgame slate in 1944. Nebraska also opened the season on its latest date (Oct. 24) since 1892.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Scott Frost is in his fifth season as a head coach. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 17 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater in 2020.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches to win a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions as players at Nebraska.
- Frost and seven of his 10 assistant coaches are in their fifth consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- There are two new addition to the staff in 2020.
 Matt Lubick is in his first season as the Huskers' offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach.
 Mike Dawson, who spent the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Frost's UCF staff and the 2018 season on Frost's Nebraska staff, returns to Lincoln to coach the outside linebackers.

• Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Matt Lubick was a finalist for AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2012. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco was a Broyles Award nominee in 2018.

ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska's roster features 154 players. NU is believed to have the largest roster of any non-service academy in the country.
- The roster features players from 27 states, including 64 homegrown Huskers. Besides Nebraska, the states with at least five players on the roster are: Florida (10), Georgia (8), lowa (8), Texas (7), Colorado (6), Arizona (5) and Oklahoma (5).
- The roster also features three players from foreign countries in Daniel Cerni (Australia), Barron Miles Jr. (Canada) and Nouredin Nouili (Germany).
- The roster features 53 newcomers, including 39 true freshmen and 14 transfers. NU added five FBS transfers - four from Power Five teams - one FCS transfer and eight junior college transfers.
- More than two-thirds of the Husker roster is underclassmen, as 109 of the 154 players are either freshmen or sophomores (71 percent).
- Nebraska has 79 freshmen on its roster, more than the sophomore, junior and senior classes combined. Fifty-one percent of NU's roster is freshmen, the second straight season freshmen have made up more than half of the roster.
- Nebraska has four sets of brothers on its 2020 roster (Brant & Brig Banks; lan & Nate Boerkircher; Matt & Will Farniok; Connor & Corbin Ruth). The four sets of brothers ties for the second-most brothers on any FBS roster.
- The Husker team captains are seniors Dicaprio Bootle, Matt Farniok and Collin Miller and juniors Adrian Martinez and Kade Warner. Farniok and Martinez are serving as captains for the second straight season.

ACADEMIC NOTES

• A total of 11 Huskers are playing the 2020 season as graduates, including 10 of 18 seniors.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST



HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
 The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

13-0 AS A PLAYER & COACH

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost became the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only seven active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Ed Orgeron, Gary Patterson, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. He joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the last 12 years, Scott Frost has either been an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 11 previous seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 11 seasons.

FROST A PROVEN WINNER

Frost is a proven winner. In his 14-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 131-42 record.

- Frost teams have averaged more than 10 wins per season, including seven 12-win campaigns.
- He has won seven conference titles in 13 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 13 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped NU to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

Penn State was ranked No. 8 in the preseason poll but has gotten off to a slow start. The Nittany Lions are looking for their first win of the 2020 season after losing their

first three games.

Most recently, the Nittany Lions fell to Maryland, 35-19. Penn State held Maryland to 70 yards with no offensive touchdowns in the second half, but was unable overcome a 28-7 halftime deficit.

Sean Clifford leads the PSU offense on the ground and in the air. The dual-threat quarterback is Penn State's top rusher with 52 carries for 150 yards and one touchdown. In the air, he is 69-for-155 with 859 yards and nine touchdowns. Clifford's top target is Jahan Dotson who has 21 catches for 361 yards and five touchdowns.

On the other side of the ball, Ellis Brooks has a team-high 23 tackles, which includes 3.5 tackles for a loss. Brandon Smith and Shaka Toney have 10 and eight tackles respectively, and each have a team-best 2.0 sacks on the season.

James Franklin, a 25-year football coaching veteran, enters his 10th season as a collegiate head coach. Franklin's career head coaching record is 80-41 and he is one of only four current FBS coaches to lead his team to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach. Franklin attributes his success on the field to the strength of his teams' dedication to four core values: positive attitude, great work ethic, compete in everything you do and must be willing to sacrifice.

Under Franklin's direction, Penn State has finished in the top 12 in the final College Football Playoff rankings four consecutive seasons, earned berths in three New Year's Six bowl games, with two wins, and won the 2016 Big Ten Championship. Franklin has guided the Nittany Lions to an 86 percent graduation success rate, a perfect single-year 1,000 APR for the 2018-19 school year and record-breaking performances in the classroom.

The Nittany Lions were crowned national champions in 1982 and 1986, and PSU has produced 13 undefeated seasons in its history. Columbus, Ohio (Oct. 24) - Adrian Martinez and Luke McCaffrey combined for 165 rushing yards, but Nebraska was unable to keep pace in a 52-17 loss to fifth-ranked Ohio State.

Nebraska generated 370 yards of total offense, including 210 rushing yards and 160 passing yards, as McCaffrey tallied 80 yards on nine carries, including a 47-burst on Nebraska's opening drive. His run set up a 10-yard touchdown trot for Martinez to cap a four-play, 75-yard drive to give NÚ an early lead. Martinez finished with a team-high 85 rushing yards on 13 carries for the Big Red. Martinez added an efficient passing day by completing 12-of-15 passes for 105 yards, while McCaffrey completed 4-of-5 passes for 55 yards.

While Nebraska's quarterbacks combined to complete 16-of-20 passes, Ohio State's Justin Fields was even more efficient, completing 20-of-21 passes

for 276 yards and two TDs. Fields added 15 carries for 54 yards and another

After Nebraska took a quick 7-0 lead, Fields pushed the Buckeyes down the field for an 11-play, 75-yard drive in 5:05 to tie the score. After the Buckeyes got a stop on Nebraska's next drive, Fields found Garrett Wilson for a 42-yard got a stop on Nebraska's next drive, Fields found Garrett Wilson for a 42-yard touchdown pass with 4:02 left in the opening quarter. NU tied the score at 14 midway through the second quarter on Dedrick Mills' three-yard touchdown run. Ohio State answered with an 11-play drive of its own that covered 71 yards, but Nebraska held and forced a 34-yard Blake Haubeil field goal with 3:12 left in the half. NU struggled on its next possession, and OSU took advantage, going 46 yards in just five plays capped by a Master Teague III six-yard run to put the Buckeyes ahead 24-14. OSU extended its lead on the opening series of the second half, as Fields' 17-yard run put the Buckeyes ahead 31-14.

The three consecutive scores by Ohio State in just 6:48 of game time put Nebraska in a must-score position on its opening drive of the second half, and the Huskers started marching. However, on the sixth play of Nebraska's drive, Martinez fumbled at the OSU 45, and Sevyn Banks scooped up the ball and raced 55 yards for a touchdown to give Ohio State a 38-14 lead. Nebraska ended Ohio State's surge with a 22-yard Connor Culp field goal with 3:56 left in the period to send the Huskers to the fourth trailing 38-17. OSU added a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns to complete the scoring.

Evanston, III. (Nov. 7) - In another game between Nebraska and Northwestern that came down to the final play, Luke McCaffrey's pass to Wan'Dale Robinson fell incomplete as the Wildcats escaped with a 21-13 win.

Nebraska lost despite putting up 442 yards of total offense and 28 first downs against Northwestern, while holding the Wildcats to just 317 total yards.

The Huskers led 13-7 at the half, but Peyton Ramsey threw a pair of secondhalf touchdowns passes for Northwestern, including a 10-yard pass to Riley Lees with 9:53 left.

Nebraska had two opportunities to get the tying score in the fourth quarter, but could not crack the end zone. Luke MaCaffrey drove the Huskers down the field, and Nebraska had the ball first-and-goal at the Northwestern 3-yard line and had another first and goal at the Wildcat 2, but Chris Bergin's interception snuffed out the drive.

After forcing a punt, the Huskers got the ball back at their 8-yard line with 2:14 remaining. NU eventually got the ball to the Wildcat 14, but his fourthdown incompletion on fourth-and-4 with five seconds left ended the Huskers' scoring threat. McCaffrey completed 12-of-16 passes for 93 yards in just over one quarter of action, while added 49 yards on eight carries. Adrian Martinez led the Nebraska ground game with 102 yards on 13 carries, while adding 125 yards by completing 12-of-27 passes.

Northwestern jumped out to a 7-0 lead on Drake Anderson's 41-yard run, capping a seven-play, 80-yard drive. The Huskers chipped away, getting two Connor Culp field goals to pull within 7-6 midway through the second quarter.

Late in the second quarter, Myles Farmer gave the Big Red their best opportunity of the day, intercepting a Peyton Ramsey pass and taking it down to the Northwestern 3. Dedrick Mills scored on the next play to give the Huskers a 13-7 lead with 1:25 left in the half.

Farmer, making his first career start, picked off two Ramsey passes for Nebraska, while Luke Reimers added a career-high 10 stops and a sack for the Big Red.

Northwestern went back in front with its opening drive of the second half. Ramsey found John Raine on a two-yard pass to cap a 10-play, 61-yard drive that used up 4:57 to put the Wildcats up 14-13 with 9:53 left in the third.

Ramsey, who went 16-of-27 for 169 yards and two scores, added his second scoring toss early in the third quarter to stake the Wildcats an eight-point cushion
