RANKINGS COMPARISON

INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA

- OPENING KICK: Penn State travels to Lincoln for the first time since 2012 to face Nebraska Saturday
 afternoon in Memorial Stadium. The storied programs are meeting for the fifth time as Big Ten foes.
 Coverage is set to start at noon ET on FS1.
- **WINNING TRADITIONS:** This is the 18th all-time meeting between Nebraska (902 wins) and Penn State (898 wins), the seventh- and eighth-winningest programs in the FBS. The teams last met in 2017 and are next scheduled to face each other in 2024.
- **DOTSON BREAKS OUT:** WR **Jahan Dotson** leads the Big Ten and ranks 23rd in the FBS with five receiving touchdowns this season, and also leads the Big Ten with 361 receiving yards. Dotson is one of three in the FBS this season to total at least 350 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns in the first three games and the first Big Ten player to do so since at least 2000.
- SACKS LEADERS: Penn State ranks third in the Big Ten averaging 2.7 sacks per game. Its eight sacks have been made by six different Nittany Lions. Penn State (228 sacks) only trails Alabama (233 sacks) and Clemson (273 sacks) in sacks since 2015.
- YOUTH MOVEMENT: Penn State is one of the youngest teams in the country with 81 underclassmen (31 true freshmen, 24 redshirt freshmen, 26 sophomores) to just 10 players in their final year of eligibility. Freshman receivers KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Parker Washington both started for the Nittany Lions against Maryland last week, marking the first time two true freshman receivers started for Penn State since Saeed Blacknall and Chris Godwin at Michigan in 2014.
- THE OPPOSITION: Nebraska is playing its home opener after its Oct. 31 game against Wisconsin was
 canceled. The Huskers have started the year 0-2 on the road with a loss at Ohio State to open the season
 and a loss at Northwestern last week. Nebraska's rushing attack ranks second in the Big Ten with 217
 yards per game.

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Penn State and Wisconsin are the only Big Ten teams to have posted a winning season the last 15 consecutive years. Penn State is one of five teams (Penn State, Boise State, LSU, Oklahoma, Wisconsin) in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to have a winning record each of the last 15 years. Penn State holds the FBS record for most consecutive seasons without a losing record at 49 (1939-87). (ESPN Stats & Info)

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 480 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 28 in 2018, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 297-76 (.796) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572.

- In 1925, Penn State visited West Virginia for the first time to participate in dedication ceremonies for West Virginia's new Mountaineer Field.
- In one of the biggest upsets of the Higgins era, Penn State shocked Penn in 1942, 13-7, before 50,000 at Franklin Field behind the punting of Joe Colone and the running and defensive play of Larry Joe, who was carried off the field at the end of the game.
- In 1959, Penn State downed Holy Cross, 46-0, in the 229th and last game played at Beaver Field as 20,000 spectators watched the final quarter in rain and heavy wind. The Nittany Lions ended with a record of 184-34-11 at Beaver Field.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of four current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 80-41 career record, with eight consecutive winning seasons, entering 2020.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- Under Franklin, Penn State is one of four teams (Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma) to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings in each of
 the last four seasons
- Franklin has led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton) in the last four years, making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- · Franklin's squads have won two New Year's Six bowl games in the last three years, making the Nittany Lions one of seven teams to do so.
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- Over the last four years, Penn State has 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program-best.
- Franklin has led Penn State to 32 home wins in the past five seasons to rank fourth in the FBS. Those 32 wins have included a trio of undefeated home slates.
- Franklin has 25 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first nine years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 81 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Penn State had six players selected in both the 2018 and 2019 NFL Draft and five players picked in 2020, marking the third-straight year that
 Penn State has had at least five draft picks, the first time that has happened since 1991-93. Penn State is only one of five programs to produce
 at least five draft picks in each of the last three drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last eight seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in the last four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the
 Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and
 were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the
 Paul "Bear" Brvant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
 Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th
 two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team
 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the
 University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place. The figure surpassed the mark of 56 set in the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0
 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees. A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 for the 2020 semester, also a school record.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Additionally, 28 Nittany Lions earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2019.
- · A total of 52 squad members compiled at least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2019, the third-highest semester total in program history.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST

- Scott Frost is in his third season as Nebraska's head coach and his fifth season overall as a head coach.
- Frost previously the head coach at UCF. He inherited an 0-12 team
 at UCF, made a bowl game in his first season and then led the
 Knights to a 13-0 record in his second and final season in 2017.
 Frost was the consensus national coach of the year in 2017.
- Frost, who previously served as defensive coordinator for an FCS semifinalist, was Oregon's offensive coordinator in the inaugural College Football Playoff Championship Game and called the plays for Heisman Trophy winner Marcus Mariota.
- Frost was a part of two national championship teams as a Husker player.

SCOUTING THE HUSKERS

- Nebraska is 0-2 in 2020, falling to Ohio State during the Big Ten's opening week and then falling at Northwestern last week.
- The game will be Nebraska's home opener after the Wisconsin game scheduled for Oct. 31 was canceled due to COVID-19 concerns for Wisconsin.
- Nebraska returned more than 80 percent of its yards from last year in rushing (86 percent), passing (82 percent) and total offense (82 percent), as well as its entire starting offensive line.
- The Huskers have been strong on the ground, led by dual-threat QB Adrian Martinez, averaging 217 rushing yards per game through two games. Martinez leads the Big Ten with 7.19 yards per carry.
- Redshirt freshman safety Myles Farmer made two interceptions in the Northwestern game.

SERIES RECORD

Penn State and Nebraska are meeting on the gridiron for the 18th time since the first contest in 1920.

When Nebraska traveled to State College for the first meeting between the two schools in 1920, it marked the first time that Penn State played a team that was located west of the Mississippi River. The Huskers hold a 9-8 edge in the series, but had their four-game winning streak snapped in 2017.

Saturday's game will be the fifth Big Ten game between the national powers, as the Cornhuskers and Nittany Lions played annually from 2011-13 when the Huskers first joined the conference in 2011. Penn State is 2-5 at Nebraska, last visiting in 2012 and last winning in 1981.

LAST MEETING

BARKLEY SETS PENN STATE TD RECORD IN 56-44 WIN OVER NEBRASKA

Running back Saquon Barkley and quarterback Trace McSorley scored three touchdowns each as Penn State totaled 609 yards of offense in a 56-44 victory over Nebraska in 2017.

It was Penn State's most prolific offensive performance since rolling for 661 yards against Rutgers in 1995, and ended up being the highest-scoring game in Beaver Stadium history.

The Nittany Lions took control of the game late in the first quarter, rattling off five consecutive touchdown drives to turn a 10-7 deficit into a 42-10 lead before the halftime break. Nebraska scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 18 points, but Penn State answered with a pair of early-fourth quarter touchdowns to restore its 32-point edge. However, the Huskers trimmed the deficit to just 12 points with three late touchdowns.

Barkley's three rushing touchdowns gave him 39 for his career, breaking the record of 38 set by Lydell Mitchell 46 years prior. He did the majority of his work in the first half, totaling 142 yards rushing on just 14 carries with the three scores. He

finished with 158 yards on 17 carries, and added 66 yards on six receptions to total 224 all-purpose yards.

It took Penn State just three plays to score, as Barkley broke free for a 65-yard touchdown run. Nebraska went ahead after taking advantage of a pair of short fields with a field goal and touchdown, but the Nittany Lions answered with a Barkley touchdown for a 14-10 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Penn State scored four unanswered touchdowns in the second quarter while forcing five Nebraska three-and-outs to take a commanding 42-10 lead into halftime. McSorley, tight end Mike Gesicki, Barkley and wide receiver DeAndre Thompkins all found the end zone.

Nebraska scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to cut the deficit to 18 points. In the fourth, McSorley threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to Gesicki and Penn State added another touchdown for a 56-24 lead with 10:13 remaining.

Nebraska shrank the final margin to just 12 points though with three late touchdowns, including one when time expired.

- Penn State and Nebraska both rank among the top-10 programs in winning percentage and total victories in NCAA history.
- Four of the top-10 winningest programs in NCAA history are from the Big Ten, and Penn State is playing the other three this season (Ohio State, Nebraska, Michigan).
- Penn State sits No. 8 in all-time victories (898) and No. 10 in winning percentage (.688).
- Nebraska is seventh with 902 all-time victories and No. 9 with an all-time winning percentage of .689.
- The Nittany Lions and Huskers are also among the most ranked teams in NCAA history according to the AP poll.
- Nebraska has spent 70 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll (7th all-time) and Penn State has earned the No. 1 ranking by the AP on 21 occasions (T-16th all-time). (Not including preseason rankings)

WINNING WAYS

- Penn State is 42-14 over the past five seasons (2016-20), which is the 12th-best record in FBS and third-best in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 52-6; Wisconsin, 43-13).
- Dating back to 2015, Penn State has won 31 of its last 36 home games.
- Penn State's 127-57 record over the last 15 years (2006-20) ranks 15th in FBS and third in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 164-26; Wisconsin, 141-48).
- The Nittany Lions, Wisconsin, Oklahoma, LSU and Boise State are the only teams with a winning season each of the last 15 years.

DOTSON PRODUCES EARLY

- WR Jahan Dotson leads the Big Ten with five receiving touchdowns and 361 receiving yards. The totals rank 23rd and 69th, respectively, nationally, while his 120.3 yards receiving per game rank 11th nationally.
- Dotson's five touchdowns in the first three games of the season tie the Penn State record set by Joe Jurevicius in 1997.
- Dotson's 361 yards receiving in the first three games rank eighth nationally and his five touchdowns in the first three games rank tied for fourth.
- Dotson's 7.0 receptions per game rank fourth in the Big Ten and 19th nationally.
- Dotson is one of two Power Five receivers to total at least 20 receptions, 350 yards receiving and five receiving touchdowns in the first three games this season, joining LSU's Terrace Marshall Jr. (21 rec, 424 yds, 7 TD), and one of three in FBS, joining Nevada's Romeo Doubs (25 rec, 465 yds, 5 TD) and.
- Dotson is one of 22 players in the FBS and one of 14 in the Power Five to total at least 20 receptions, 350 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns in the first three games since 2000, and the first in the Big Ten to complete the feat.

- Dotson is the first Penn State football player to have a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of a season since Allen Robinson accomplished the feat in 2013 (vs. Syracuse, Eastern Michigan, UCF).
- Dotson's 361 yards receiving in the first three games of the season are the most by a Nittany Lion since Geno Lewis totaled 380 in the first three games of 2014. Allen Robinson is the only Nittany Lion to total more over the same stretch since 2000, totaling 405 to open 2013.
- Dotson is averaging 17.2 yards per reception (minimum 15 catches) through his first three games of 2020, which ranks 10th nationally and third in the Power Five for a player's first three games of the 2020 season.
- Dotson caught three touchdown receptions against Ohio State to become the first Penn State player with three touchdown receptions in a game since Pat Freiermuth (vs. Michigan State, 2019) and the first Nittany Lion receiver since DaeSean Hamilton (vs. Indiana, 2017).

- Washington ranks third on the team this season with 14 catches for 155 yards and second with three touchdown catches. His three touchdowns rank fourth in the Big Ten.
- Washington is the first Penn State true freshman to have two touchdown receptions in a game since Pat Freiermuth did so against Rutgers in 2018.

- Against Ohio State, Washington had four catches for 73 yards including a career-long 31-yard reception in the fourth quarter. He also had a 20-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Washington caught a 9-yard touchdown pass in overtime at Indiana, marking the second-straight season opener with a freshman catching a touchdown pass. Brenton Strange caught a 4-yard touchdown reception against Idaho in 2019.
- Washington is the first true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since Brandon Polk against Temple in 2015.

- TE Pat Freiermuth owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17) with a touchdown catch at Indiana.
- Freiermuth's 16 touchdown receptions make him the career active leader in FBS among tight ends.
- Freiermuth's 16th career touchdown grab at Indiana moved him into a tie for eighth all-time in receiving touchdowns at Penn State with O.J. McDuffie (1988-92). Freiermuth moved past Terry Smith (1988-91), Joe Jurevicius (1994-97) and Gesicki.
- Freiermuth had seven touchdowns last season to rank fourth in FBS among tight ends. Among all positions, he ranked tied for seventh in the Big Ten.

- Clifford has surpassed 350 yards of total offense twice this season, totaling 357 at Indiana and 366 against Maryland. In his career, those efforts only trail a 452-yard game at Maryland (2019) and a 379-yard game at Minnesota (2019).
- Clifford ran for a career-best 119 yards on 17 carries at Indiana. It
 was his first career 100-yard rushing game and Penn State's first

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kirk Ciarrocca, defensive line coach John Scott Jr., wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield and offensive line coach Phil Trautwein.
- Ciarrocca spent the last three seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Minnesota. In 2019, the Golden Gophers posted a 10-win regular season for the first time since 1905, thanks in part to the third-highest scoring offense in program history and the second-most passing yards in a season by the Gophers.
- Scott joins the Nittany Lions after spending the previous three seasons in the SEC. He was the defensive line coach during the 2019 season at South Carolina and spent previous two seasons at Arkansas as the defensive tackles coach in 2018 and defensive line coach in 2017.
- Stubblefield comes from the University of Miami, where he was
 the wide receivers coach. Stubblefield is no stranger to the Big Ten,
 as he was a consensus All-American wide receiver as a player at
 Purdue. He finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions
 at the time and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards.
- Trautwein served as the offensive line coach for the last two seasons at Boston College. He guided all five of his starting offensive linemen to 2019 All-ACC honors. Trautwein was a twotime All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, where he won a pair of BCS National Championships in 2006 and 200

FRANKLIN NAMED TO DODD TROPHY PRESEASON WATCH LIST

- Head coach James Franklin was named to the 2020 Dodd Trophy Watch List, the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl announced. The list includes 18 of the nation's top college football coaches.
- The Dodd Trophy celebrates the head coach of a team who has success on the gridiron, while also stressing the importance of scholarship, leadership and integrity — the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's coaching philosophy. The watch list was created through a selection process by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, taking into consideration each program's graduation rate, commitment to service and charity in the community, projected success for the 2020 season and Academic Progress Rate (APR).

BEHIND THE LINE

- Penn State's 2.67 sacks per game rank third in the Big Ten.
- Penn State's eight sacks have been tallied by six different players.
- LB Brandon Smith has tallied a sack in each of the last two games.
- DE Shane Simmons recorded a career-high 1.5 sacks against Maryland
- DE Shaka Toney registered two sacks at Indiana.
- Toney has collected two or more sacks in four career games and has recorded two or more sacks in a quarter three times in his career (2018 at Indiana, 2019 vs. Purdue, 2020 at Indiana).
- Toney has 17.5 career sacks.
- Penn State's 3.30 sacks per game over the last five years (2015-20) trail only Clemson (3.33).

OWEH LEADS D-LINE

- DE Jayson Oweh collected a career-best 10 tackles against Maryland. His previous best was six tackles against Ohio State the previous week.
- Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles)
- Oweh's 18 tackles are second on the team and tops among defensive linemen.
- Oweh's 2.5 tackles for loss are tied with LB Brandon Smith for second on the team and are tops among D-linemen.

FUMBLE!

- Penn State had forced at least one fumble in its last eight games, dating back to last season, until the streak was snapped against Marvland.
- LB Lance Dixon forced his first career fumble against Ohio State and LB Ellis Brooks did the same at Indiana.
- Last season, Penn State led the FBS with 22 forced fumbles, totaling its most forced fumbles since tallying a team-record 25 in 1968
- S Lamont Wade tied a Big Ten record and led FBS for the year with three forced fumbles in a game at Ohio State.

STOPPING THE RUN

- Penn State ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 31st nationally allowing 124.0 yards per game on the ground.
- Indiana attempted only 26 rushes against Penn State, tied for the sixth-lowest by any opponent in the James Franklin era.
- Penn State limited Indiana to 41 yards rushing, the fewest allowed in the conference during the opening week.
- Penn State allowed just 95.0 yards rushing per game last season to rank fifth in FBS and lead the Big Ten, and allowed 2.55 yards per rush to lead FBS.

S-ZONE

- Penn State's iconic S-Zone is a staple of college football and has taken many forms over the years. This year, thanks to the Lion Ambassadors, the Penn State Alumni Association's student alumni corps, the S-Zone is a banner stretching across 800 seats above the team tunnel at Beaver Stadium.
- Through a partnership with the Penn State Alumni Association, Blue & White Society, and Lion Ambassadors, the banner honors the Class of 2020 and Class of 2021 and features the names of members of those classes.
- This S-Zone banner is designed to celebrate and pay homage to both of these classes, who saw their Penn State experiences altered significantly in this past year. In the absence of fans, it also will help to show support for Penn State's student-athletes and coaches who will compete in Beaver Stadium this season.
- The banner is in place in Beaver Stadium through the end of this 2020 season.

PENN STATE DRAWS RATINGS

- The Penn State-Ohio State game in Week 9 drew an average of 6,534,000 viewers, making it the second-most watched game of the season thus far.
- The Penn State-Ohio State game is the most-watched game on an ESPN network this season and drew 27 percent more viewers than ABC's Saturday Night Football average from 2019.
- The Penn State-Ohio State game helped ABC win the night as the most-viewed network in primetime on Saturday.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. lowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23. 2013.

- Penn State returns 39 lettermen from last year's Top 10 squad 16 on offense, 20 on defense and three on special teams.
- A total of 42 lettermen are returning for the Nittany Lions. In addition to the 39 lettermen returning from 2019, Rafael Checa (2018), Donovan Johnson (2018) and Cam Sullivan Brown (2018) each are previous letterwinners.
- The Nittany Lions lost the services of 20 lettermen 11 on offense, eight on defense and one specialist.

SEVENTEEN STARTERS RETURNING

- The Nittany Lions return 17 starters 10 on offense, four on defense and three on special teams.
- Nine additional Penn Staters have starting experience three on offense, five on defense and one specialist.
- Among the returning starters are 2019 All-Big Ten second team honorees Pat Freiermuth and Shaka Toney, third team honoree Tariq Castro-Fields, as well as honorable mention selections Journey Brown, Sean Clifford, Will Fries, Michal Menet, Jake Pinegar and Lamont Wade.
- Freiermuth was also a second team All-America honoree by the AFCA and The Athletic.

FIVE BOWL TEAMS HIGHLIGHT SCHEDULE

- The Big Ten announced a revised nine-game conference only football schedule on Sept. 19. It has eight scheduled games with the ninth game to be played Dec. 19, featuring an East vs. West match-up as part of Big Ten Champions week.
- The Nittany Lions will face five teams that participated in a bowl game during the 2019 campaign.
- Indiana went 8-4 during the regular season and fell to Tennessee in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, 23-22.
- Ohio State won the Big Ten East Division and went on to defeat Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game (34-21).
 The Buckeyes fell to Clemson in the College Football Playoff Semifinal (29-23).
- lowa finished the season 10-3 overall after defeating the USC Spartans in the Holiday Bowl, 49-24.
- Michigan earned a spot in the VRBO Citrus Bowl, losing to No. 9 Alabama, 35-16, to finish 9-4 on the year.
- Michigan State finished 7-6 overall after picking up a 27-21 victory over Wake Forest in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2020 season marks the 20th straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular-season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- Penn State had a four-game night-game winning streak snapped against Ohio State.
- Penn State's only three losses in its last 14 night games are to Ohio State.
- Penn State is 55-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 16-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

- QB Sean Clifford was named to the Davey O'Brien Award, The Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award and Wuerffel Trophy preseason watch lists.
- Clifford was one of 30 quarterbacks named to The Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award watch list. The award is presented annually to the nation's best college quarterback and is the oldest and most prestigious national quarterback award.
- Penn State has had two O'Brien Award winners, with Todd Blackledge (1982) and Kerry Collins (1994) each earning the honor. John Schaffer was also named a finalist in 1986.
- Sixteen semifinalists selected from the final watch list will be named on Tuesday, Nov. 10. The Davey O'Brien Foundation will announce the three finalists two weeks later (Tuesday, Nov. 24).
- The Johnny Unitas award is presented annually to the top senior and upperclassman quarterback set to graduate with their class by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Selection Committee. Candidates are chosen based on player performance on and off the field.
- The Manning Award list includes 30 of the top quarterbacks in the nation heading into the 2020 season. It was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. It is the only quarterback award that includes the candidates' bowl performances in its balloting.
- The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented each February in Fort Walton Beach. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback from the University of Florida, Danny Wuerffel, the Wuerffel Trophy exists to honor college football players who serve others, celebrate their positive impact on society, and inspire greater service in the world. Semifinalists for the award will be announced on November 3 and finalists will be announced on November 23. The formal announcement of the 2020 recipient will be made at the National Football Foundation's festivities in New York City on December 8. The presentation of the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy will occur at the 52nd All Sports Association Awards Banquet on February 19, 2021 in Fort Walton Beach.

URSCHEL NAMED TO CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, was named to a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics (expected completion in 2020), which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.
- Urschel has written a memoir, "Mind and Matter," with his wife, journalist Louisa Thomas, chronicling his life in athletics and academics. Last spring, even as he tackled the commitment of a full-time graduate student, he was a teaching assistant for the first time — in a Differential Equations course.

MEDICAL PROTOCOLS

The Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) adopted significant medical protocols including daily antigen testing, enhanced cardiac screening and an enhanced data-driven approach when making decisions about practice/competition. The COP/C voted unanimously to resume the football season starting the weekend of October 23-24, 2020. The decision was based on information presented by the Big Ten Return to Competition Task Force, a working group that was established by the COP/C and Commissioner Kevin Warren to ensure a collaborative and transparent process.

The Big Ten is requiring student-athletes, coaches, trainers and other individuals that are on the field for all practices and games to undergo daily antigen testing. Test results must be completed and recorded prior to each practice or game. Student-athletes who test positive for the coronavirus through point of contact (POC) daily testing would require a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result of the POC test.

Each institution has designated a Chief Infection Officer (CInO) who will oversee the collection and reporting of data for the Big Ten Conference. Team test positivity rate and population positivity rate thresholds will be used to determine recommendations for continuing practice and competition.

All COVID-19 positive student-athletes will have to undergo comprehensive cardiac testing to include labs and biomarkers, ECG, Echocardiogram and a Cardiac MRI. Following cardiac evaluation, student-athletes must receive clearance from a cardiologist designated by the university for the primary purpose of cardiac clearance for COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The earliest a student-athlete can return to game competition is 21 days following a COVID-19 positive diagnosis.

In addition to the medical protocols approved, the 14 Big Ten institutions will establish a cardiac registry in an effort to examine the effects on COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The registry and associated data will attempt to answer many of the unknowns regarding the cardiac manifestations in COVID-19 positive elite athletes.

The Big Ten Conference will use data provided by each Chief Infection Officer (CInO) to make decisions about the continuation of practice and competition, as determined by team positivity rate and population positivity rate, based on a seven-day rolling average:

Team positivity rate (number of positive tests divided by total number of tests administered):

- Green 0-2%
- Orange 2-5%
- Red >5%

Population positivity rate (number of positive individuals divided by total population at risk):

- Green 0-3.5%
- Orange 3.5-7.5%
- Red >7.5%

Decisions to alter or halt practice and competition will be based on the following scenarios:

- Green/Green and Green/Orange: Team continues with normal practice and competition.
- Orange/Orange and Orange/Red: Team must proceed with caution and enhance COVID-19 prevention (alter practice and meeting schedule, consider viability of continuing with scheduled competition).
- Red/Red: Team must stop regular practice and competition for a minimum of seven days and reassess metrics until improved.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 40 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 23 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, seven former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs and two former PSU student-athletes from sports other than football are on rosters.
- Eight players from PSU's 2019 squad are on NFL teams.

FOUR FORMER LIONS ON 2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen D.J. Dozier, Bobby Engram and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2021. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2021 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2021. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Additionally, current Penn State wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is on the ballot. Stubblefield was a wide receiver at Purdue (2001-04) and was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier will forever have a place in Penn State Football lore for scoring the gamewinning touchdown on a six-yard fourth quarter run to lift the Nittany Lions past Miami, 14-10, in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl.
- Engram is considered one of the greatest wide receivers in Penn State history. As a junior on Penn State's undefeated Big Ten and Rose Bowl championship team of 1994, Engram won the first Biletnikoff Award that is given annually to the best receiver in college football. When he graduated in 1996, Engram held 12 team receiving records, and still holds the records for receiving yards in a career (3,026) and single season (1,084) and touchdown receptions in a game (four against Minnesota in 1993), a season (13 in 1993) and career (31).
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two firstteam All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American
 at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at
 Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and
 West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach
 in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania
 Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Stubblefield finished his career with an NCAA-record 325
 receptions and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629
 yards. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions,
 while his NCAA receptions record stood until 2011. Stubblefield
 also holds the Purdue record for receiving touchdowns in a
 season with 16 in 2004.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2021 season.

GAME RECAP

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford accounted for four touchdowns, including a late go-ahead touchdown pass and an overtime touchdown throw, but Indiana rallied to defeat No. 8/7 Penn State, 36-35, in the extra frame.

Clifford accounted for four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing) and 357 yards of total offense, throwing for 238 yards on 24-of-35 passing and rushing for 119 yards — the seventh-most by a quarterback in Penn State history. Pat Freiermuth became Penn State's career leader in touchdown receptions by a tight end and caught seven passes for 60 yards. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson had four catches for 94 yards, including a late 60-yard touchdown reception. Shaka Toney led the Penn State defense with seven tackles, which were all solo and included two sacks. Safety Lamont Wade recovered a fumble and made his first career interception.

For Indiana, quarterback Michael Penix Jr. went 19-for-36 passing for 170 yards with a touchdown throw in overtime and two successful two-point conversion rushes - one to force overtime and one to win the game - while running back Stevie Scott III rushed for two touchdowns in the first half. Safety Jamar Johnson made 10 tackles, an interception and forced a fumble the Hoosiers recovered, while cornerback Jaylin Williams also added an interception.

How It Happened

With Penn State trailing by six late in the fourth quarter, Clifford found Dotson over the middle for a 60-yard touchdown strike and a 21-20 Penn State lead. Then after stopping Indiana on fourth down, running back Devyn Ford rushed for a touchdown with 1:42 remaining for a 28-20 PSU advantage. However, Indiana's Penix led the Hoosiers on a game-tying touchdown drive, rushing for both the touchdown and ensuing two-point attempt.

In overtime, Clifford threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Parker Washington for a 35-28 Nittany Lion lead, but Penix answered with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Whop Philyor on Indiana's possession, and the Hoosiers elected to go for two to decide the game. Penix ran left and dove, extending the football towards the pylon, making contact with both it and the ground out of bounds, for what was ruled a touchdown. The play was reviewed, but the call stood.

Penn State took the game's first lead with Freiermuth's touchdown catch on the opening drive, converting on fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line.

Williams intercepted Clifford late in the first quarter leading to the Hoosiers' first score, a field goal, early in the second quarter. Scott then gave Indiana a 17-7 lead with a pair of rushing touchdowns.

Clifford scampered for a 35-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to three at the end of the third quarter, before Indiana added a field goal for a 20-14 advantage. Penn State was able to retake the lead on the Clifford-Dotson score, but Indiana answered.

Notes

- Penn State dropped to 22-2 all-time against Indiana, including an 11-2 mark in Bloomington. The Nittany Lions snapped a sixgame win streak against the Hoosiers.
- Penn State converted 27 first downs, tying the ninth-most by the team in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions tallied 52 rushing attempts, equaling the fourth-most by the program under James Franklin. Penn State last had 52 rushing attempts against lowa in 2016.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive, covering 7:01.
 It was Penn State's longest time-covering drive since a 9:01 drive against Indiana in 2019.
- WR Parker Washington became the first true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since Brandon Polk against Temple in 2015.
- Washington caught a 9-yard touchdown pass in overtime, marking the second-straight season opener with a freshman catching a touchdown pass. Brenton Strange caught a 4-yard touchdown reception against Idaho in 2019.
- QB Sean Clifford ran for a career-best 119 yards on 17 carries. It
 was his first career 100-yard rushing game and Penn State's first
 100-yard rushing game by a quarterback since Will Levis ran for
 108 yards against Rutgers in 2019.
- Clifford scored on a 35-yard run at the end of the third quarter.
 It was Clifford's second career rushing touchdown over 30 yards, joining his 38-yard run against Indiana in 2019.
- TE Pat Freiermuth owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17).
- WR Jahan Dotson hauled in a 60-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. It was Dotson's fifth career touchdown catch and his fourth of 40 or more yards.
- The Nittany Lions held Indiana to 211 total yards, the ninthfewest allowed under James Franklin.
- Indiana attempted only 26 rushes, tied for the sixth-lowest by any opponent in the James Franklin era.
- DE Shaka Toney matched a career high with seven tackles, tying his performance against Michigan in 2019.
- S Lamont Wade intercepted a pass in the third quarter, his first career interception.
- CB Joey Porter Jr. registered his first career sack in the first quarter and collected a career-best five tackles, topping two tackles against Rutgers in 2019.
- LB Ellis Brooks forced his first career forced fumble.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Wide receiver Jahan Dotson scored three touchdowns and totaled 144 yards receiving for No. 18/17 Penn State, but No. 3 Ohio State made an early lead last for a 38-25 win over the Nittany Lions.

It was Dotson's second career 100-yard receiving game and a career-high total, and his three touchdowns and eight receptions were also career highs. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18-of-30 passes for 281 yards and the three touchdowns. Of Clifford's passing yards, 252 came in the second half.

Ohio State was paced by quarterback Justin Fields, who completed 28-of-34 passes for 318 yards and four touchdowns. Garrett Wilson caught 11 passes for 111 yards and had a 62-yard rush, while Chris Olave caught seven passes for 120 yards and 2 touchdowns and Jeremy Ruckert added a pair of receiving touchdowns.

Linebacker Ellis Brooks paced the Penn State defense with a career-high 11 tackles, while linebacker Brandon Smith and defensive tackle Antonio Shelton both tallied sacks. Tommy Togiai led Ohio State with seven tackles and three sacks and Marcus Hooker had six tackles and an interception.

How It Happened

Ohio State jumped out to an early two-touchdown lead. Wilson broke free for 62 yards on the first play from scrimmage and Master Teague III scored from four yards out two plays later to give the Buckeyes a 7-0 lead. Penn State failed to convert on fourth-and-two at its own 45 on the ensuing drive, and Ohio State took advantage of the short field when Olave hauled in a 26-yard touchdown catch.

Penn State put together a field goal drive for its first score with 2:57 remaining in the first quarter, but the Buckeyes added another touchdown before the end of the half on a 10-yard throw to Jeremy Ruckert over the middle. Jordan Stout drilled a 50-yard field goal for the Nittany Lions as the half expired to go to halftime down 21-6.

Penn State opened the second half with the ball and marched down the field for an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 14-yard touchdown reception by Dotson. Ohio State answered midway through the third quarter with a 49-yard touchdown catch by Olave and added a field goal before the end of the quarter.

The Nittany Lions made it a 31-19 game at the start of the fourth quarter after a pair of highlight reel catches by Dotson. On the first play of the final stanza on third-and-17, Dotson caught a 37-yard pass with one hand and the side of his helmet. On the next play, he made a one-handed snag for a 21-yard touchdown catch.

Fields found Ruckert again in the end zone with 9:14 to go and Clifford connected with Dotson on a 20-yard strike with 6:27 to go to make it a 38-25 game. Hooker sealed the game for Ohio State with an interception in Penn State territory in the game's final minutes.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Penn State tried to rally from an early deficit with 290 yards of total offense in the second half, but Maryland's explosive scoring plays in the first half were enough for a 35-19 victory in Big Ten football action Saturday in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State held Maryland to 70 yards with no scores on offense in the second half, but was unable overcome a 28-7 halftime deficit.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford attempted a school-record 57 passes and threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns as he tried to rally the Nittany Lions late, and freshman wide receiver Parker Washington caught eight passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson finished with nine catches for 123 yards his second-straight 100-yard receiving game - and tight end Pat Freiermuth caught six passes for 91 yards, as both surpassed 1,000 yards receiving for their careers in the game.

Maryland scored all of its touchdowns from 34 or more yards out. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa completed 18-of-26 passes for 282 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Rakim Jarrett caught five passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns and wide receiver Dontay Demus caught six passes for 86 yards and one touchdown. Running back Jake Funk ran 16 times for 80 yards and a 38-yard touchdown run.

Defensive end Jayson Oweh led the Nittany Lions on defense with a career-high 10 tackles and two tackles for loss, while safety Nick Cross led the Terps with eight tackles, a sack, interception and two pass break ups.

How It Happened

Maryland took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a pair of big touchdown receptions by Jarrett, who caught a 42-yard touchdown the Terps' first possession and a 62-yard score with 19 seconds remaining in the opening frame, and then went up three touchdowns with a 38-yard rush by Funk early in the second quarter.

Penn State got on the board with 6:32 remaining in the half, as Clifford engineered a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive capped by a 20-yard touchdown toss to Dotson, but Tagovailoa connected with Demus for a 34-yard touchdown before the break for a 28-7 halftime lead.

Maryland extended its lead in the second half on a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Clifford connected with Washington for a 23-yard touchdown with 10:16 remaining to complete a 16-play, 98-yard drive, and again in the final seconds for a 1-yard score.

Note

- Penn State dropped to 40-3-1 against Maryland all-time, snapping a five-game win streak.
- · The Nittany Lions are now 23-2 at home against Maryland.
- Penn State is 5-2 against Maryland since the Terrapins joined the Big Ten in 2014.
- The Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 14-straight wins against teams within 250 miles of Beaver Stadium.
- Freshman receivers KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Parker Washington both started for the Nittany Lions, marking the first time two true freshman receivers started for Penn State since Saeed Blacknall and Chris Godwin at Michigan in 2014.
- Penn State's 93 plays on offense were its most since having 99 at lowa in 2017.
- QB Sean Clifford attempted a program-record 57 passes. The record was previously held by Christian Hackenberg (55; at Indiana, 2013).
- Clifford finished with 340 passing yards, marking his third career 300-yard game. He is tied with Daryll Clark (2006-09) for fifth place on Penn State's all-time list.
- His nine career games of 200-plus yards passing moves him into a tie for 10th with Todd Blackledge (1980-82) and Wally Richardson (1992, 94-96).
- The 340 yards ranks tied for 16th in program history, matching his own mark at Minnesota in 2019 and Christian Hackenberg's performance at Indiana in 2013.
- WR Jahan Dotson became the first Penn State football player to have a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of a season since Allen Robinson accomplished the feat in 2013 (vs. Syracuse, Eastern Michigan, UCF).
- Dotson's five touchdowns in the first three games of the season tie the Penn State record set by Joe Jurevicius in 1997.
- WR Parker Washington became the first Penn State true freshman to have two touchdown receptions in a game since Pat Freiermuth did so against Rutgers in 2018.
- DE Jayson Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles).
- DE Shane Simmons recorded a career-high 1.5 sacks.
- K Jake Pinegar registered his 200th career point on an extra point in the second quarter.
