PENN STATE MEETS ILLINOIS FOR
BIG CHAMPIONS WEEK

- OPENING KICK:** Penn State welcomes Illinois to Beaver Stadium on Saturday for a matchup during Big Ten Champions Week. Kickoff is set for 5:30 p.m. on FS1.
- DECEMBER FOOTBALL:** On Saturday, Penn State will compete in the latest game ever played at Beaver Stadium in a calendar year. Prior to last Saturday's 39-24 win over Michigan State, the previous latest game played at Beaver Stadium was on December 7, 1968 against Syracuse.
- SERIES HISTORY:** The Nittany Lions are 19-5 all-time against Illinois, including a 9-1 mark at home. In 2018, the Nittany Lions trailed 24-21 in the third quarter but finished the game with 42 unanswered points for a 63-24 win. Miles Sanders rushed for 200 yards and three touchdowns, while Ricky Slade added 94 yards and two touchdowns. Trace McSorley threw three touchdown passes. S **Jonathan Sutherland** led the Penn State defense with eight tackles. LB **Ellis Brooks** recorded six tackles, a half-sack and an interception.
- ALL-PURPOSE:** With 695 receiving yards and a 21.0 punt return average, WR **Jahan Dotson** is one of six FBS players (seven occasions) since 2000 with those totals. Dotson and Alabama's Devonta Smith are the only FBS players with those totals this season. Dotson's 695 receiving yards lead the Big Ten, while his 21.0 punt return average paces the conference and ranks third in the FBS.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Illinois has a 2-5 record this season after falling 28-10 at Northwestern last Saturday. Isaiah Williams threw for 86 yards, including a 46-yard touchdown pass to Brian Hightower. Chase Brown rushed for 70 yards on 14 carries. Jartavius Martin led the Illini with 12 tackles and a forced fumble. Jake Hansen added eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup. Seth Coleman recorded two tackles for loss.

PROGRAM NOTES

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

Prior to 2020, Penn State and Wisconsin were the only Big Ten teams to have posted a winning season the last 15 consecutive years. Penn State was one of five teams (Penn State, Boise State, LSU, Oklahoma, Wisconsin) in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to have a winning record each of the last 15 years. Penn State holds the FBS record for most consecutive seasons without a losing record at 49 (1939-87). (ESPN Stats & Info)

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 509 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 29 in 2020, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 298-77 (.795) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572.

- The Nittany Lions are 7-4 all-time in regular-season games in December.
- Prior to 2020, the Nittany Lions last played a December regular-season game on December 1, 2001 at Virginia, a game that was originally scheduled for September 15.
- In 1959, Penn State earned a 7-0 win over No. 10 Alabama in the Liberty Bowl, played at Municipal Stadium in Philadelphia. The game's only points were scored on a fake field goal at the end of the first quarter with Galen Hall throwing to Roger Kochman for a 17-yard touchdown. The Nittany Lions finished the season with a 9-2 record and No. 12 ranking in the AP Poll.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of four current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 83-43 career record, with eight consecutive winning seasons, entering 2020.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- Penn State is one of four teams (Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma) to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings in each of the last four seasons (2016-19).
- Franklin has led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton) - in the last four years, making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin's squads have won two New Year's Six bowl games in the last three years, making the Nittany Lions one of seven teams to do so.
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- In 2016-19, Penn State had 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program-best.
- Entering 2020, Franklin has led Penn State to 32 home wins in the past five seasons to rank fourth in the FBS. Those 32 wins have included a trio of undefeated home slates.
- Franklin has 25 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first nine years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 81 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Penn State had six players selected in both the 2018 and 2019 NFL Draft and five players picked in 2020, marking the third-straight year that Penn State has had at least five draft picks, the first time that has happened since 1991-93. Penn State is only one of five programs to produce at least five draft picks in each of the last three drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last eight seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in the last four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State dimmed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place. The figure surpassed the mark of 56 set in the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees. A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 for the 2020 semester, also a school record.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Additionally, 28 Nittany Lions earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2019.
- A total of 52 squad members compiled at least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2019, the third-highest semester total in program history.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

SERIES NOTES

INTERIM HEAD COACH ROD SMITH

- Rod Smith was named Illinois' interim head coach on December 13, 2020.
- Smith has served as Illinois' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last three seasons. Smith's offense has established a strong rushing attack, averaging 202.3 rushing yards per game.
- From 2012-17, Smith was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona. The Wildcats' offense featured quarterback Khalil Tate who threw for 1,591 yards and rushed for 1,411 yards in 2017.
- Smith was the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Indiana in 2011 after serving as Michigan's quarterbacks coach from 2008-10.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING ILLINI

- Illinois is 2-5 entering the final week of the season after falling 28-10 at Northwestern last Saturday.
- Isaiah Williams threw for 86 yards, including a 46-yard touchdown pass to Brian Hightower. Chase Brown rushed for 70 yards on 14 carries.
- Jartavius Martin led the Illini with 12 tackles and a forced fumble. Jake Hansen added eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup. Seth Coleman recorded two tackles for loss.
- Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten averaging 202.3 rushing yards per game, led by a strong duo at running back. Brown leads the team with 510 yards and two touchdowns, while Mike Epstein has 360 yards and four touchdowns.
- The Fighting Illini have played multiple quarterbacks throughout the season. Brandon Peters has thrown for 429 yards and three touchdowns. Williams has passed for 273 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 287 yards and a score. Coran Taylor has thrown for 379 yards and three touchdowns.
- Jake Hansen leads the Illinois defense with 59 tackles, including 7.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Hansen also has two interceptions, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.
- Owen Carney Jr. has tallied 25 tackles with seven for loss and five sacks.
- Illinois ranks 13th in the Big Ten in scoring offense (20.0 ppg) and 10th in scoring defense (31.9 ppg).
- The Illini sits second in the Big Ten averaging 13.3 yards per completion.

LAST MEETING

NO. 10/9 PENN STATE RUNS PAST ILLINOIS, 63-24

No. 10/9 Penn State totaled 387 rushing yards, led by 200 yards and three touchdowns from junior running back Miles Sanders, as it defeated Illinois, 63-24, Friday night in Memorial Stadium in the Big Ten football opener for both teams.

Penn State put the game out of reach with 42 unanswered points in the second half, with 35 coming in the fourth quarter. Penn State had built a 21-7 lead to start, only to see Illinois score the next 17 points for a 24-21 lead early in the third quarter. However, a Sanders 48-yard touchdown run with 8:36 remaining in the third quarter put Penn State back in the lead, and the Lions never looked back.

The fourth quarter scoring surge pushed Penn State past 50 points for a third consecutive game – a school first – and marked the first time since 1917 that Penn State scored 60-plus points in consecutive games.

Joining Sanders in the prolific Penn State running attack was senior quarterback Trace McSorley, who rushed for a career-high 92 yards, and freshman running back Ricky Slade, who ran for a 61-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter and totaled a career-best 94 yards and two touchdowns for the game.

McSorley added three passing touchdowns, completing 12-of-19 passes for 160 yards. Freshman tight end Pat Freiermuth hauled in his first career touchdown reception,

while Juwan Johnson and KJ Hamler came up with big touchdown receptions in the second half.

After a lost fumble nullified Penn State's opening drive, the Nittany Lion defense forced a three-and-out and the offense responded with a touchdown drive, capped by a 14-yard touchdown run by Sanders.

The Nittany Lions went back ahead 14-7 as McSorley rushed five times for 43 yards and Sanders did the rest, punching the ball across the goal line.

Penn State stretched its lead to two touchdowns after forcing a three-and-out and sticking to the ground game. McSorley dished to freshman Pat Freiermuth for the freshman's first career touchdown reception.

Penn State regained the lead in the third quarter, as Sanders broke free for a 48-yard touchdown run with 8:36 remaining in the third quarter from the 16, McSorley stepped up in the pocket under pressure and rifled a touchdown pass to Johnson.

Jan Johnson intercepted a bobbled pass on Illinois second play of its ensuing drive, setting up a 21-yard touchdown pass from McSorley to Hamler for a 42-24 lead. Slade rushed for touchdowns of 61 and 1 yards, and an Ellis Brooks interception led to running back Journey Brown scoring a 6-yard rushing touchdown for the final margin.

ILLINOIS NOTES

BIG TIGHT END OF THE YEAR

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** was selected as the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year on Tuesday.
- Freiermuth is Penn State's first tight end to win the award.
- Freiermuth started the first four games of the season before a season-ending injury.
- Prior to his injury, Freiermuth led all FBS tight ends with 5.8 receptions per game and ranked fifth averaging 77.5 receiving yards per game.
- Freiermuth sat seventh overall in the Big Ten in receptions, eighth in receiving yards (310) and ninth in receiving yards per game. He still leads all Big Ten tight ends in receiving yards.
- Freiermuth has caught at least one pass in 29-straight games, dating back to the Pitt game (9/8/18), which was tied for the longest active streak among FBS tight ends with Wisconsin's Jake Ferguson through November 14.
- Freiermuth was a preseason first team All-American by multiple outlets and was a member of the John Mackey and Biletnikoff Award Watch Lists.

PSU LANDS SIX ON ALL-BIG OFFENSE

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** led PSU's six selections. He was selected as first team All-Big Ten by the coaches and second team All-Big Ten by the media.
- Freiermuth was a second team All-Big Ten selection in 2019 and an honorable mention selection in 2018.
- OL **Will Fries** and OL **Mike Miranda** were both named second team All-Big Ten by the coaches. Miranda was also named second team All-Big Ten by the media, while Fries was voted honorable mention by the media. Fries and Miranda have both started all eight games this season.
- WR **Jahan Dotson** and OL **Michal Menet** were picked third team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media. - Oweh and Toney became the first Penn State defensive end duo to receive first team honors since Courtney Brown and Brad Scioli in 1998.
- Oweh and Toney are tied for the team lead with 6.5 tackles for loss and Toney paces the squad with four sacks.
- Toney was a second team honoree by the coaches in 2019.
- S **Jaquan Brisker** was selected third team All-Big Ten by the coaches and honorable mention by the media. He has 50 tackles and a team-high six pass breakups in 2020.
- CB **Joey Porter Jr.** and S **Lamont Wade** were voted third team All-Big Ten by the media and honorable mention by the coaches.
- Wade was named honorable mention by the coaches and media in 2019.
- CB **Tariq Castro-Fields**, DT **PJ Mustipher**, DT **Antonio Shelton** and LB **Brandon Smith** were all named honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media.
- Castro-Fields was a third team selection by the media and an honorable mention pick by the coaches in 2019.

- Dotson leads the Big Ten with a 21.0 punt return average, which is good for second all-time at Penn State.

BIG TEN CHAMPIONS WEEK

- Penn State meets Illinois on Saturday during the first ever Big Ten Champions Week.
- The Nittany Lions rank fourth in the Big Ten East with a 3-5 record after winning their last three games.
- The Fighting Illini sit sixth in the Big Ten West with a 2-4 mark after falling at Northwestern last Saturday.

LATEST GAME IN BEAVER STADIUM

- Penn State's matchup with Illinois, on December 19, is the latest the Nittany Lions have played a game at Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State has played three previous December home games: December 7, 1968 vs. Syracuse, December 1, 1979 vs. Pitt and December 12, 2020 vs. Michigan State.
- In 1968, the Nittany Lions completed an undefeated regular season with a 30-12 win over Syracuse. Penn State ended the season with an 11-0 record and No. 2 national ranking after defeating Kansas, 15-14, in the Orange Bowl.
- Penn State has a 7-4 record in December regular season games.

900 WINS

- Penn State won its 900th game in program history with its 23-7 victory over Rutgers.
- The Nittany Lions became the nation's eighth program to reach 900 wins, joining Michigan (964), Ohio State (929), Alabama (926), Texas (922), Notre Dame (918), Oklahoma (915) and Nebraska (904).
- Penn State is tied for the ninth-best winning percentage in the FBS (.688, 901-398-42).

PENN STATE VS. BIG TEN

- Penn State is 31-13 in the Big Ten since 2016.
- PSU won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94.

- Penn State is one of the better second-half teams in the country, ranking 11th in the FBS in scoring differential among teams that have played at least eight games with a plus-6.63 scoring average.
- In its first eight games, Penn State has outscored teams 135-75 in the second half.
- Penn State has a plus-15.13 point differential between halves, the highest in the FBS this year among teams that have played at least eight games.
- The Blue and White sits 19th in the nation averaging 9.38 points allowed in second halves among FBS teams that have played at least eight games.
- Penn State outscored Michigan State, 29-3, in the second half. QB **Sean Clifford** threw a pair of touchdown passes to WR **Parker Washington** and PR **Jahan Dotson** returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions scored a quick 14 points in the third quarter against Iowa. Clifford connected on touchdown passes with TE **Brenton Strange** (28 yards) and Dotson (68 yards) on back-to-back throws.
- Clifford became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for touchdowns on back-to-back passes since Trace McSorley at Illinois in 2018 (16-yard touchdown pass to Juwan Johnson; 21-yard touchdown pass to KJ Hamler in fourth quarter).

DOTSON'S IMPRESSIVE PRODUCTION

- WR **Jahan Dotson's** 695 yards rank 27th nationally and his six touchdowns rank tied for 25th among teams who have played at least eight games. His 46 receptions rank 38th.
- Dotson is averaging 15.4 yards per reception (minimum 45 catches) through his first eight games of 2020, which ranks ninth nationally and fourth in the Power Five for a player's first eight games of the 2020 season.
- Dotson is one of five Power Five receivers to total at least 46 receptions, 695 yards receiving and six receiving touchdowns in their first eight games this season, joining Ole Miss' Elijah Moore (86 rec, 1,193 yards, 8 TD), Alabama's Devonta Smith (72 rec, 1,074 yards, 12 TD), LSU's Terrace Marshall Jr. (48 rec, 731 yards, 10 TD) and Clemson's Amari Rodgers (48 rec, 720 yards, 6 TD) and one of 10 in FBS.

- Since 2000, Dotson is the only Penn State receiver to total at least 46 receptions, 695 yards receiving and six receiving touchdowns in the first eight games of a season.
- Dotson's 695 receiving yards in the first eight games of the season are the third-most by a Nittany Lion since 2000, trailing Allen Robinson (1,043 yards, 2013) and DaeSean Hamilton (728 yards, 2014).
- Dotson (46 receptions) and **Parker Washington** (35 receptions) are the first Penn State duo with 30 or more catches in a season since 2017.

- He is one of four Big Ten receivers with at least four 100-yard receiving games this season.
- Dotson is one of seven Penn State receivers with at least four 100-yard receiving games in a single season since 2000.

DOTSON LANDS ON BILETNIKOFF LIST

- WR **Jahan Dotson** was tabbed as a midseason addition to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- The Biletnikoff Award is presented annually to the season's most outstanding receiver, regardless of position.
- Dotson joined TE **Pat Freiermuth** on the 2020 Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- The junior sits third in the Big Ten and ranks 33rd nationally with six receiving touchdowns.
- Dotson's 695 receiving yards lead the Big Ten and rank 29th and his 86.9 receiving yards per game rank seventh.
- Dotson was the 35th Nittany Lion to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards. He has 1,386 career receiving yards to rank 20th in program history.
- Dotson and Freiermuth are the first Penn State 1,000-yard career receivers on the same squad since 2018 with DeAndre Thompkins and Juwan Johnson.

- Washington has totaled at least 70 yards receiving in five of his last six games. Washington hauled in four catches for 95 yards and two touchdowns against Michigan State. He earned a career high nine catches for 93 yards at Michigan. He caught five passes for 70 yards at Nebraska, eight passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns against Maryland and four catches for 73 yards against Ohio State.

- RB **Keyvone Lee** led PSU with 95 rushing yards against Rutgers.
- Washington caught a 29-yard touchdown pass, while WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** tied for the team-lead with four catches against the Scarlet Knights.
- True freshmen accounted for 267 of Penn State's 417 total yards (64%) against Michigan.
- With 65 receptions by true freshmen this season, Penn State ranks fifth among FBS programs behind Mississippi State (136), LSU (87), Texas Tech (80) and Pitt (69).
- Against Michigan, TE **Theo Johnson**, Lee and Washington all started. It marked the first time in program history that Penn State started a freshman at all three of those positions.
- Lee rushed for a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown on a career-best 22 carries in his first career start against the Wolverines.

- Clifford has 4,417 career passing yards to sit 11th all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford's career passing efficiency rating of 144.2 currently ranks as the third-best in Penn State history.
- Clifford's career completion percentage of 59.4 currently ranks second in Penn State history.
- Clifford's 340 yards passing against Maryland ranks tied for 16th in a single game in program history, matching his own mark at Minnesota in 2019 and Christian Hackenberg's performance at Indiana in 2013.
- Clifford tied for fifth all-time at Penn State with three games of 300 yards passing. He is tied with Daryl Clark (2006-09) after throwing for 340 yards against Maryland.
- Clifford ranks 10th all-time at Penn State with 10 career games of 200-plus yards passing.
- Clifford has 330 career completions, ranking him 12th all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford has attempted 555 career passes to rank 12th all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford attempted a program-record 57 passes against Maryland. The record was previously held by Christian Hackenberg (55; at Indiana, 2013).

TOUCHDOWN TOSSES

- QB **Sean Clifford** threw his 38th and 39th career touchdown against Michigan State, moving into a tie for eighth all-time at Penn State with Kerry Collins (1991-94).
- Clifford has thrown for 14 touchdowns through the first eight games of the season.
- Nine of Clifford's 14 touchdown passes have gone for 20 or more yards.
- Clifford threw for 11 touchdowns in the first five games of the season. Since 2000, a Penn State quarterback has only thrown for 11 or more touchdowns through the first five games of a season on three occasions. Two of those have been by Clifford.
- Clifford passed for 12 touchdowns through the first five games of the 2019 campaign.
- Trace McSorley also threw 12 touchdowns in the first five contests of 2018.
- Clifford's 14 touchdown passes rank second in the Big Ten and 37th in the FBS. Clifford was one of 22 FBS quarterbacks to throw for 11 touchdowns in their first five games this season.
- Against Iowa, Clifford became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for touchdowns on back-to-back passes since McSorley at Illinois in 2018 (16-yard touchdown pass to Juwan Johnson; 21-yard touchdown pass to KJ Hamler in fourth quarter). In the third quarter, Clifford connected with Brenton Strange for a 28-yard score and then hit Jahan Dotson for a 68-yard score.
- Clifford had three passing touchdowns in each of the first three games this season, as well as two against Iowa, and has nine career games with three or more passing scores.
- Clifford's career passing TD percentage of 7.02 currently ranks fourth all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford has five career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns.

MOVING THE BALL

- Penn State ranks second in the Big Ten in total offense, averaging 411.6 yards per game.
- The Nittany Lions registered 405 total yards against Michigan State, including 286 through the air.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2019, Penn State has totaled at least 325 yards in 10 straight games.
- The last time Penn State started a season with eight straight games above 325 yards was 2013.
- The Nittany Lions tallied its fifth game with more than 400 yards of total offense this season (488 at Indiana, 434 vs. Maryland, 501 at Nebraska, 417 at Michigan).
- Penn State's 501 yards of total offense at Nebraska was its most since the 529 it recorded in the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Penn State ran 91 offensive plays at Nebraska, marking back-to-back games (Maryland) with 90 or more plays. The last time the Nittany Lions had back-to-back games with 90 or more plays came in 2012 (99 vs. Northwestern, 10/6/12; 90 vs. Iowa, 10/20/12).
- Penn State leads the Big Ten with 195 first downs.
- Penn State's 195 first downs are ranked the 15th-most by a team this season in its first eight games and the eighth-most among Power Five programs.
- Penn State's 195 first downs are second-most in its first eight games since at least 2000. The Nittany Lions had 197 first downs in 2008.

FORD AND TRUE FRESHMEN LEAD LAWNBOYZ

- With the losses of **Journey Brown** and **Noah Cain**, Penn State has relied on **Devyn Ford** as the starter with support from true freshmen **Caziah Holmes** and **Keyvone Lee**.
- The trio has combined for 176 carries for 777 yards and six touchdowns.
- Lee leads the trio with 353 yards and three touchdowns on 70 carries. He's averaging a team-high 5.0 yards per carry.
- Lee totaled 95 rushing yards on 17 carries at Rutgers.
- Lee rushed for 134 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries at Michigan. Lee had runs of 24 and 23 yards and scored on a 6-yard carry.

- Lee's 134 yards were the most by a PSU freshman since Saquon Barkley's 194 yards at Ohio State in 2015.
- At Nebraska, Holmes rushed for a career-high 50 yards on four carries, including a career-long 36-yard run.
- Ford has 274 yards and three touchdowns on 67 carries in six games played.
- Holmes has 39 carries for 150 yards.
- Lee scored his first career touchdown at Nebraska on a career-long 31-yard burst in the third quarter, and also set then-career highs with 49 yards on eight carries.

CONSISTENT TARGETS

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** has a reception in his last 29 games (all but his first career game), the fifth-longest active streak in FBS and tied for the longest among tight ends through November 14.
- Freiermuth's 29-straight games with a catch is a school record for consecutive games with a reception by a tight end.

- WR **Parker Washington** has caught at least one pass in all eight games of his career.

DUAL THREAT

- QB **Sean Clifford** ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 240.2 yards of total offense per game.

- Clifford's 5,170 career total offense yards rank eighth all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford became the 11th Penn State player to reach the 5,000 career total offense yard mark against Michigan State.
- Clifford has 47 career touchdowns responsible for to rank eighth all-time at Penn State.
- Clifford has 723 career rushing yards to rank third all-time at Penn State in rushing yards by a quarterback.
- Clifford has surpassed 350 yards of total offense twice this season, totaling 357 at Indiana and 366 against Maryland. In his career, those efforts only trail a 452-yard game at Maryland (2019) and a 379-yard game at Minnesota (2019).
- Clifford ran for a career-best 119 yards on 17 carries at Indiana. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game and Penn State's first 100-yard rushing game by a quarterback since Will Lewis ran for 108 yards against Rutgers in 2019.
- Clifford has seven career rushes over 20 yards, including a 28-yard touchdown run at Michigan.
- Clifford scored on a 35-yard run at Indiana. It was Clifford's second career rushing touchdown over 30 yards, joining his 38-yard run against Indiana in 2019.

LEVIS SEES ACTION

- QB **Will Levis** completed all three passes for 53 yards and rushed for 36 yards and a 1-yard touchdown against Michigan State.
- Levis gained 65 yards on 17 carries at Rutgers.
- Levis rushed for 25 yards and a touchdown against Michigan. He scored on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Levis made his second career start against Iowa, completing 13-of-16 passes for 106 yards and rushed for 34 yards on 13 carries.
- On the Nittany Lions' scoring drive in the first quarter, Levis connected on six passes and rushed for 44 yards.
- Levis ranks 10th all-time at Penn State with 435 career rushing yards as a quarterback.

- Levis entered in the second quarter at Nebraska for his first extended action since starting against Rutgers to close out the 2019 regular season.
- Levis completed 14-of-31 passes for 219 yards at Nebraska. He set career highs for completions, attempts and yards.
- Levis rushed for 61 yards while tying a career high with 18 carries.
- Levis completed three passes of 20 or more yards, including a career-long 74 completion to **Pat Freiermuth** in the fourth quarter.

FREIERMUTH'S SEASON ENDED

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** underwent season-ending surgery after Iowa week for an injury suffered in the Ohio State game.
- Freiermuth concluded his 2020 campaign with 23 catches for 310 yards and a touchdown.
- Despite missing four games, Freiermuth still leads Big Ten tight ends in receiving yards.
- Freiermuth's 77.5 receiving yards per game ranks third among FBS tight ends this season.
- The junior has caught a pass in 29-straight games, dating back to the Pitt game (9/8/18), which is the nation's second-longest active streak among tight ends.
- Freiermuth's 29-straight games with a catch is a school record for consecutive games with a reception by a tight end.
- His 1,185 career receiving yards currently rank 26th in program history and third among tight ends. He became the 34th Nittany Lion and seventh Penn State tight end to accumulate 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Freiermuth's 16 career touchdown receptions are the most all-time by a PSU tight end and rank eighth overall in program history.
- Freiermuth earned a spot on the Walter Camp Foundation's Preseason All-American team, presented by Marcum LLP.

TE TARGET

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** owns 92 career receptions, sitting 20th all-time and second among tight ends (Mike Gesicki, 129) at Penn State.
- Freiermuth had a career-high 113 yards receiving at Nebraska for his second career 100-yard receiving game. It included a career-long 74-yard reception in the fourth quarter to set up a Nittany Lion touchdown.

TOUCHDOWNS FOR THE TIGHT END

- TE **Pat Freiermuth** owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17) with a touchdown catch at Indiana.
- Freiermuth's 16th career touchdown grab at Indiana moved him into a tie for eighth all-time in receiving touchdowns at Penn State with O.J. McDuffie (1988-92). Freiermuth moved past **Terry Smith** (1988-91), Joe Jurevicius (1994-97) and Gesicki.
- Freiermuth had seven touchdowns last season to rank fourth in FBS among tight ends. Among all positions, he ranked tied for seventh in the Big Ten.
- TE **Brenton Strange** caught his first career touchdown reception, a 28-yard catch, against Iowa.

PILING UP THE POINTS

- Penn State has scored 40 points 19 times since 2016.
- By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

DEPTH TESTED AT RUNNING BACK

- RB **Journey Brown** announced his medical retirement from football due to hypertrophic cardiomyopathy on Nov. 11, while RB **Noah Cain** suffered a season-ending injury on the first drive of the season at Indiana.
- Brown was on the 2020 Doak Walker, Hornung and Maxwell Award preseason watch lists, while Cain was also on the Doak Walker list.
- Brown finishes his career with the Nittany Lions having played 22 games, rushing for 934 yards on 137 attempts (6.8 average) and 13 touchdowns. In the final five games of his career, he ran for 593 yards on 78 carries (7.6) with seven touchdowns.
- Brown averaged 6.89 yards per carry in 2019 for the Nittany Lions, ranking fifth all-time at Penn State, while his 12 rushing touchdowns finished tied for 13th at PSU.
- Penn State ran for 396 yards in the Cotton Bowl, a program-record for a bowl game and the second-most in Cotton Bowl history, and Brown was a big part of that. The Meadville, Pa, native set a Penn State bowl record with 202 yards in the Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis (12/28/19), topping Saquon Barkley's 194 yards in the 2017 Rose Bowl. The 202-yard rushing mark ranks sixth in Cotton Bowl history and he set a Penn State bowl record with 12.6 yards per carry in the game, shattering the previous mark of 8.6 yards per carry set by Curt Warner in the 1980 Fiesta Bowl.
- Cain set a Penn State freshman record last season with eight rushing touchdowns, passing D.J. Dozier (1983) and Saquon Barkley's (2015) seven. He also became the first Penn State freshman to run for 100 yards in back-to-back games (105 yards vs. Purdue; 102 yards at Iowa) since Barkley in 2015.

DEFENSE NOTES

LIMITING THE YARDS

- The Nittany Lions held Rutgers to just 205 total yards.
- It marked the 40th time keeping an opponent under 300 total yards in the James Franklin era. PSU has the seventh-most games holding opponents under 300 total yards since 2014.
- Penn State held Rutgers to zero or negative yards on 24 of 64 plays on Saturday and 1 or less yard on 29 plays (45.3 percent).
- Rutgers' first six drives resulted in four three-and-outs and two turnovers.
- The Nittany Lions held Rutgers to 43 yards in the first half, the fewest allowed by the Penn State defense in a half since limiting Maryland to 34 yards in the second half in 2019.
- Penn State allowed zero plays of 20 or more yards on defense or special teams for the first time since doing so against Eastern Michigan in 2013.
- Penn State ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 17th nationally allowing 327.4 yards per game.
- The 205 yards allowed at Rutgers marked the fourth time this season Penn State had held an opponent under 300 yards of offense (211 at Indiana, 298 at Nebraska, 286 at Michigan).

STOPPING THE RUN

- Penn State ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 25th nationally allowing 127.4 yards per game on the ground.
- The Nittany Lions limited Michigan State to 69 yards, the 34th time holding an opponent under 100 yards rushing since 2014. Penn State is 28-6 in those games.
- Indiana attempted only 26 rushes against Penn State, tied for the sixth-lowest by any opponent in the James Franklin era.
- Penn State limited Indiana to 41 yards rushing, the fewest allowed in the conference during the opening week.

ALLOWING FEW POINTS

- Penn State held Rutgers to seven points, marking the 21st time holding an opponent to seven or less points since 2014. That is tied for the fourth-most among FBS teams.
- Fifteen of the 21 times holding opponents to seven or less points have come against Big Ten opponents.

BALANCED DEFENSIVE EFFORT

- One of the strengths of the Penn State defense this season is a balanced effort in getting to the ball carrier.
- Seven players have at least 32 tackles on the season, led by LB **Ellis Brooks'** 54 stops. Nine players own at least 25 tackles.
- LB **Jesse Luketa** has tallied 52 tackles, while S **Jaquan Brisker** has collected 50 stops. DE **Jayson Oweh** has 38 tackles and S **Lamont Wade** owns 36.
- Four players have recorded double-digit tackle games this season: Brooks (11 vs. Ohio State), Oweh (10 vs. Maryland), Wade (10 vs. Iowa) and Luketa (10 vs. Rutgers).
- It has also been a balanced effort to stop plays behind the line of scrimmage. Twenty-one players have contributed to Penn State's 52 tackles for loss this season.
- Oweh and DE **Shaka Toney** are tied for the team-lead with 6.5 tackles for loss. LB **Ellis Brooks** owns 5.5 tackles for loss and LB **Brandon Smith** has five.

BEHIND THE LINE

- Penn State's 2.38 sacks per game rank fifth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State's 18 sacks have been tallied by 11 different players.
- The Nittany Lions tallied 10 tackles for loss and four sacks against Michigan State.
- Penn State registered its 24th game with 10 or more tackles for loss in the James Franklin era.
- DE **Shane Simmons** had two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. S **Jaquan Brisker**, DT **Antonio Shelton** and S **Jonathan Sutherland** each registered 1.5 tackles for loss against Michigan State.
- DE **Shaka Toney** notched three tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble against Iowa.
- It was Toney's second game with multiple sacks this season. He also had two at Indiana.
- Toney has collected two or more sacks in five career games and has recorded two or more sacks in a quarter three times in his career (2018 at Indiana, 2019 vs. Purdue, 2020 at Indiana).
- Toney has 19.5 career sacks, tied for 10th all-time at Penn State, passing Bob White, Don Graham, Yetur Gross-Matos, Jay Alford, LaVar Arrington and Bruce Clark.
- Toney also has 28.5 career tackles for loss. He has seven career games with at least two tackles for loss.
- Penn State's 3.19 sacks per game over the last five years (76 games; 2015-20) trail only Clemson (3.35).
- Penn State's 236 sacks over the last six years (2015-20) are third only to Clemson (281) and Alabama (248).
- Over the last six years, Penn State has cumulated a 9.00 percent sack percentage (236 sacks on 2,769 plays), which ranks fourth behind Clemson (10.20%), Michigan (9.39%) and Florida (9.04%).
- PSU posted five consecutive 40-plus sack seasons for the first time in program history after totaling 45 last season, 47 in 2018, 42 in 2017, 40 in 2016 and 46 in 2015.

OWEH LEADS D-LINE

- DE **Jayson Oweh** is averaging 5.4 tackles per game to rank eighth in the FBS among defensive linemen who have played at least seven games.
- His 38 tackles rank fourth on the team and Oweh holds the team-lead with 6.5 tackles for loss.
- Oweh's 38 tackles were the most in the first seven games of a season by a Penn State defensive lineman since Daquan Jones and Austin Johnson had 40 tackles in 2013 and 2015, respectively.
- Oweh has 30 tackles over the last six weeks, including nine at Nebraska, a career-best 10 tackles the previous week against Maryland and six against Iowa.
- Before the Maryland game, Oweh set what was then a career-high of six tackles against Ohio State.
- Oweh had a tackle for loss in four straight games between the Ohio State and Iowa games.
- Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles).

LINEBACKER U'S NEW CLASS

- Penn State has three new starters at linebacker this season after Micah Parsons opted-out of the season and Cam Brown and Jan Johnson both exhausted their eligibility and moved on to the NFL.
- Brown (26 starts, 199 tackles), Johnson (26, 150 tackles) and Parsons (13, 192 tackles) combined for 65 starts and 541 tackles in their careers.
- Penn State's primary 2020 starting trio of **Ellis Brooks** (0 starts, 69 tackles), **Brandon Smith** (0 starts, 14 tackles) and **Jesse Luketa** (2 starts, 31 tackles) entered the season combining for two starts and 114 tackles in their careers.
- Brooks holds the team lead this season with 54 stops. Luketa ranks second with 52. Smith ranks fourth on the team with 5.0 tackles for loss.
- Luketa registered a career-high 10 tackles at Rutgers.
- Brooks recorded his 100th career tackle at Nebraska and set a career high with 11 tackles against Ohio State.
- Brooks has 6.5 tackles for loss and tallied his first sack of the season at Nebraska.
- At Nebraska, Smith tallied a career-high six tackles and his first career interception in the fourth quarter.

FUMBLE!

- LB **Ellis Brooks** forced a fumble at Rutgers, resulting in LB **Jesse Luketa's** first career fumble recovery.
- S **Drew Hartlaub** recovered a fumble on a muffed punt return against Michigan. It was his second career fumble recovery.
- Penn State forced two fumbles against Iowa. One came on a strip-sack in the third quarter by DE **Shaka Toney**, his fourth career forced fumble. The second fumble came on a botched snap, which was recovered by S **Lamont Wade** and setup a Penn State touchdown.
- Wade ranks ninth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with two fumble recoveries this season.
- LB **Lance Dixon** forced his first career fumble against Ohio State and LB **Ellis Brooks** did the same at Indiana.
- Last season, Penn State led the FBS with 22 forced fumbles, totaling its most forced fumbles since tallying a team-record 25 in 1968.
- Wade tied a Big Ten record and led FBS for the year with three forced fumbles in a game at Ohio State.

SPECIAL TEAMS

DOTSON BIG SPECIALS TEAMS HONOREE

- PR **Jahan Dotson** was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following the Michigan State game.
- Dotson is PSU's first Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since Blake Gillikin on October 28, 2019.
- Dotson returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown against Michigan State.
- Dotson's return marked the first Nittany Lion punt return for a touchdown since DeAndre Thompkins scored on a 39-yard return against Pittsburgh in 2018.
- The 81-yard punt return is tied for the eighth-longest in program history, tying Bryant Johnson's return against Michigan State in 2002.
- Dotson is one of three Big Ten players to have 100 receiving yards and a punt return for a touchdown in the same game since 2000. Michigan's Steve Breaston (2006; vs. Indiana) and Wisconsin's Brandon Williams (2005; vs. Indiana) were the others to accomplish the feat.
- Dotson is averaging 21.0 yards per punt return this season, ranking second all-time at Penn State.
- Since 2000, Dotson is one of six FBS players (seven occasions) to total at least 695 receiving yards and average 21.0 yards per punt return.

- K/P **Jordan Stout** hit a 50-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against Ohio State for his third career field goal of 50 yards or longer (53-yard field goal vs. Idaho, 2019; 57-yard field goal vs. Pitt, 2019).
- With three career field goals of 50 or more yards, Stout ranks second all-time at Penn State. He is tied with Kevin Kelly (2005-08) and Massimo Manca (1982, 84-86). Chris Bahr (1973-75) holds the program record with six career 50 or more yard field goals.
- Stout also booted a 56-yard punt against Ohio State for his first career punt of more than 50 yards.
- Stout made a 47-yard field goal at Rutgers.

- Sutherland was twice named as the Coaching Staff's Special Teams Player of the Week last season, blocking a pair of punts in the season opener against Idaho and making a pair of tackles in punt coverage against Pitt, respectively.

PORTER WINS BIG FRESHMAN AWARD

- CB **Joey Porter Jr.** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week following the Rutgers game.
- The Nittany Lions have earned back-to-back Big Ten Freshman of the Week awards after RB **Keyvone Lee** claimed the honor for his performance at Michigan.
- Porter collected a career-best six tackles, including four solo, in the win over Rutgers.
- Porter added a solo tackle for the loss, his second of the season.
- On the year, Porter ranks sixth on the team, and third among defensive backs, with 30 tackles. He also has four pass breakups
- The last Penn State defensive player to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week was DE **Jayson Oweh** on October 28, 2019.

LEE EARNS BIG HONOR

- RB **Keyvone Lee** was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after the Michigan game.
- Lee made his first career start against Michigan and took full advantage of the opportunity, rushing for a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown on a career-best 22 carries.
- Lee's 134 yards were the most by a Penn State freshman since Saquon Barkley's 194 yards at Ohio State in 2015.
- Lee had runs of 24 and 23 yards and scored on a 6-yard rush. He gained 39 yards on PSU's opening drive.

FOUR EARN ALL-START GAME INVITES

- CB **Tariq Castro-Fields**, OL **Michal Menet** and DE **Shaka Toney** have all accepted invites to play in the Senior Bowl.
- The 2021 Senior Bowl will be held on January 30 in Mobile, Ala.
- They are three of 126 Penn State players to be invited to the Senior Bowl.
- LB Cam Brown and DT Robert Windsor played in the 2020 game.
- S **Lamont Wade** has been selected for the 2021 East-West Shrine Bowl.
- Wade is the 85th Penn State player to receive an East-West Shrine Bowl invite.

S-ZONE

- Penn State's iconic S-Zone is a staple of college football and has taken many forms over the years. This year, thanks to the Lion Ambassadors, the Penn State Alumni Association's student alumni corps, the S-Zone is a banner stretching across 800 seats above the team tunnel at Beaver Stadium.
- Through a partnership with the Penn State Alumni Association, Blue & White Society, and Lion Ambassadors, the banner honors the Class of 2020 and Class of 2021 and features the names of members of those classes.
- This S-Zone banner is designed to celebrate and pay homage to both of these classes, who saw their Penn State experiences altered significantly in this past year. In the absence of fans, it also will help to show support for Penn State's student-athletes and coaches who will compete in Beaver Stadium this season.
- The banner is in place in Beaver Stadium through the end of this 2020 season.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 29 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2020.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA) with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place.
- The 89 Nittany Lions with a 3.0 GPA or higher surpasses the mark of 56 set by the 2015 fall semester for the most 3.0 students in a semester in football program history.
- A total of 36 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher while taking at least 12 credits in the 2020 spring semester, marking a school record for Dean's List honorees.
- A program record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.

MEDICAL PROTOCOLS

The Big Ten Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) adopted significant medical protocols including daily antigen testing, enhanced cardiac screening and an enhanced data-driven approach when making decisions about practice/competition. The COP/C voted unanimously to resume the football season starting the weekend of October 23-24, 2020. The decision was based on information presented by the Big Ten Return to Competition Task Force, a working group that was established by the COP/C and Commissioner Kevin Warren to ensure a collaborative and transparent process.

The Big Ten is requiring student-athletes, coaches, trainers and other individuals that are on the field for all practices and games to undergo daily antigen testing. Test results must be completed and recorded prior to each practice or game. Student-athletes who test positive for the coronavirus through point of contact (POC) daily testing would require a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result of the POC test.

Each institution has designated a Chief Infection Officer (CInO) who will oversee the collection and reporting of data for the Big Ten Conference. Team test positivity rate and population positivity rate thresholds will be used to determine recommendations for continuing practice and competition.

All COVID-19 positive student-athletes will have to undergo comprehensive cardiac testing to include labs and biomarkers, ECG, Echocardiogram and a Cardiac MRI. Following cardiac evaluation, student-athletes must receive clearance from a cardiologist designated by the university for the primary purpose of cardiac clearance for COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The earliest a student-athlete can return to game competition is 21 days following a COVID-19 positive diagnosis.

In addition to the medical protocols approved, the 14 Big Ten institutions will establish a cardiac registry in an effort to examine the effects on COVID-19 positive student-athletes. The registry and associated data will attempt to answer many of the unknowns regarding the cardiac manifestations in COVID-19 positive elite athletes.

The Big Ten Conference will use data provided by each Chief Infection Officer (CInO) to make decisions about the continuation of practice and competition, as determined by team positivity rate and population positivity rate, based on a seven-day rolling average:

Team positivity rate (number of positive tests divided by total number of tests administered):

- Green 0-2%
- Orange 2-5%
- Red >5%

Population positivity rate (number of positive individuals divided by total population at risk):

- Green 0-3.5%
- Orange 3.5-7.5%
- Red >7.5%

Decisions to alter or halt practice and competition will be based on the following scenarios:

- Green/Green and Green/Orange: Team continues with normal practice and competition.
- Orange/Orange and Orange/Red: Team must proceed with caution and enhance COVID-19 prevention (alter practice and meeting schedule, consider viability of continuing with scheduled competition).
- Red/Red: Team must stop regular practice and competition for a minimum of seven days and reassess metrics until improved.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Kirk Ciarrocca**, defensive line coach **John Scott Jr.**, wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield** and offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein**.
- Ciarrocca spent the last three seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Minnesota. In 2019, the Golden Gophers posted a 10-win regular season for the first time since 1905, thanks in part to the third-highest scoring offense in program history and the second-most passing yards in a season by the Gophers.
- Scott joins the Nittany Lions after spending the previous three seasons in the SEC. He was the defensive line coach during the 2019 season at South Carolina and spent previous two seasons at Arkansas as the defensive tackles coach in 2018 and defensive line coach in 2017.
- Stubblefield comes from the University of Miami, where he was the wide receivers coach. Stubblefield is no stranger to the Big Ten, as he was a consensus All-American wide receiver as a player at Purdue. He finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions at the time and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards.
- Trautwein served as the offensive line coach for the last two seasons at Boston College. He guided all five of his starting offensive linemen to 2019 All-ACC honors. Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, where he won a pair of BCS National Championships in 2006 and 200

- The Dodd Trophy celebrates the head coach of a team who has success on the gridiron, while also stressing the importance of scholarship, leadership and integrity – the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's coaching philosophy. The watch list was created through a selection process by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, taking into consideration each program's graduation rate, commitment to service and charity in the community, projected success for the 2020 season and Academic Progress Rate (APR).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 PinStripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

- Penn State is 55-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 16-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

URSCHEL NAMED TO CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, was named to a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics (expected completion in 2020), which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.

Last spring, even as he tackled the commitment of a full-time graduate student, he was a teaching assistant for the first time – in a Differential Equations course.

FOUR FORMER LIONS ON 2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen D.J. Dozier, Bobby Engram and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2021. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2021 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion student-athlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2021. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Additionally, current Penn State wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield** is on the ballot. Stubblefield was a wide receiver at Purdue (2001-04) and was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- A tailback, Dozier matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. and earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier will forever have a place in Penn State Football lore for scoring the game-winning touchdown on a six-yard fourth quarter run to lift the Nittany Lions past Miami, 14-10, in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl.
- Engram is considered one of the greatest wide receivers in Penn State history. As a junior on Penn State's undefeated Big Ten and Rose Bowl championship team of 1994, Engram won the first Biletnikoff Award that is given annually to the best receiver in college football. When he graduated in 1996, Engram held 12 team receiving records, and still holds the records for receiving yards in a career (3,026) and single season (1,084) and touchdown receptions in a game (four against Minnesota in 1993), a season (13 in 1993) and career (31).
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Stubblefield finished his career with an NCAA-record 325 receptions and ranked second in Big Ten history with 3,629 yards. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions, while his NCAA receptions record stood until 2011. Stubblefield also holds the Purdue record for receiving touchdowns in a season with 16 in 2004.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the New York Hilton Midtown. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2021 season.

VITRUAL VALLEY EXPERIENCE

- Penn State Athletics announced the Virtual Valley Experience as a way to virtually bring Nittany Lion fans to football game days, including having a presence in Beaver Stadium. Virtual Valley gives fans behind-the-scenes access to the Penn State football program all season long.
- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, tailgating or gathering on campus and/or in University parking lots is not permitted and will be monitored closely. If fans choose to gather at their home, Penn State recommends following local health and safety guidelines as Nittany Nation virtually comes together on football Saturdays. The Virtual Valley Experience website will be updated weekly. Visit the site at GoPSUsports.com/virtualvalley to find out more.
- Athletics has encouraged fans to participate in any of the three options to have a presence in Beaver Stadium, by purchasing a fan cutout or participating in the Raise the Song virtual campaign or posting their photos on social using #PSUPride.
- Fans purchased cutouts of themselves to be placed inside Beaver Stadium for the entire 2020 football season.
- Portions of the net proceeds from this initiative have been donated to THON, as well as Penn State equity and inclusion programs: Bunton-Waller scholarship program and Multicultural Faculty Development Support Funds. The Bunton-Waller scholarship is named in honor of Mildred Settle Bunton (1932), recognized as the first African American woman to graduate from Penn State, and Calvin Hoffman Waller (1904), believed to be Penn State's first African American graduate. The scholarship is given to students who enhance the broad and diverse student population at PSU.
- The cutouts were placed inside Beaver Stadium and visible to the student-athletes. Traditionally for the biggest games of the season, fans are asked to Penn State White Out gear to create the greatest atmosphere in college football. While this season will be different, we are still asking fans to wear their Penn State White Out gear in their submitted image. - The Raise the Song virtual campaign asks Penn State fans to submit videos of themselves cheering on the Nittany Lions. Those videos will be used in-stadium on game day to support our student-athletes. Videos may also be featured during virtual programming or on Penn State Athletics social media accounts. Fans can submit their videos at: www.gopsusports.com/raisethesong.
- The long-running Penn State Coaches Show featuring James Franklin presented by Pepsi airs Thursday evenings at 6 p.m. and is available on Penn State Sports Network affiliates and LionVision. On game days, the Penn State Sports Network pregame and postgame shows will air on network affiliates, as well as LionVision, and features Steve Jones and Jack Ham. The postgame show is presented by the PA Propane Foundation.
- The Unrivaled Pregame Show airs prior to kickoff each week. This new show will bring the game day experience into fans' homes by highlighting the traditions and fan experiences which make Penn State the best game experience in the country. The Unrivaled Postgame Show, returning for its second season, recaps the game with coach and student-athlete interviews. Both programs are available to fans for free on LionVision, Facebook LIVE and Twitter.

Additional virtual initiatives for the 2020 football season include:

- Fan Photos on Beaver Stadium Videoboard – Fans can show their support of Penn State football student-athletes by posting photos on Twitter and Instagram using the hashtag #PSUPride. Photos will be featured on the videoboard in Beaver Stadium during home games and on the Virtual Valley Experience website.
- Unrivaled Podcast – Unrivaled: The Official Podcast of Penn State Football, returns for its second season with new episodes each Thursday.
- Virtual Tailgate of the Game Contest – Each game day, fans will be asked to share photos of their socially distant or virtual tailgates on social media, using #PSUTailgate. The fans showing the most Penn State spirit will be selected as the Tailgate of the Game and claim a prize from the Nittany Lion Club.

GAME RECAP

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford accounted for four touchdowns, including a late go-ahead touchdown pass and an overtime touchdown throw, but Indiana rallied to defeat No. 8/7 Penn State, 36-35, in the extra frame.

Clifford accounted for four touchdowns (3 passing, 1 rushing) and 357 yards of total offense, throwing for 238 yards on 24-of-35 passing and rushing for 119 yards – the seventh-most by a quarterback in Penn State history. Pat Freiermuth became Penn State's career leader in touchdown receptions by a tight end and caught seven passes for 60 yards. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson had four catches for 94 yards, including a late 60-yard touchdown reception. Shaka Toney led the Penn State defense with seven tackles, which were all solo and included two sacks. Safety Lamont Wade recovered a fumble and made his first career interception.

For Indiana, quarterback Michael Penix Jr. went 19-for-36 passing for 170 yards with a touchdown throw in overtime and two successful two-point conversion rushes - one to force overtime and one to win the game - while running back Stevie Scott III rushed for two touchdowns in the first half. Safety Jamar Johnson made 10 tackles, an interception and forced a fumble the Hoosiers recovered, while cornerback Jaylin Williams also added an interception.

How It Happened

With Penn State trailing by six late in the fourth quarter, Clifford found Dotson over the middle for a 60-yard touchdown strike and a 21-20 Penn State lead. Then after stopping Indiana on fourth down, running back Devyn Ford rushed for a touchdown with 1:42 remaining for a 28-20 PSU advantage. However, Indiana's Penix led the Hoosiers on a game-tying touchdown drive, rushing for both the touchdown and ensuing two-point attempt.

In overtime, Clifford threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Parker Washington for a 35-28 Nittany Lion lead, but Penix answered with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Whop Philyor on Indiana's possession, and the Hoosiers elected to go for two to decide the game. Penix ran left and dove, extending the football towards the pylon, making contact with both it and the ground out of bounds, for what was ruled a touchdown. The play was reviewed, but the call stood.

Penn State took the game's first lead with Freiermuth's touchdown catch on the opening drive, converting on fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line.

Williams intercepted Clifford late in the first quarter leading to the Hoosiers' first score, a field goal, early in the second quarter. Scott then gave Indiana a 17-7 lead with a pair of rushing touchdowns.

Clifford scampered for a 35-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to three at the end of the third quarter, before Indiana added a field goal for a 20-14 advantage. Penn State was able to retake the lead on the Clifford-Dotson score, but Indiana answered.

Notes

- Penn State dropped to 22-2 all-time against Indiana, including an 11-2 mark in Bloomington. The Nittany Lions snapped a six-game win streak against the Hoosiers.
- Penn State converted 27 first downs, tying the ninth-most by the team in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions tallied 52 rushing attempts, equaling the fourth-most by the program under James Franklin. Penn State last had 52 rushing attempts against Iowa in 2016.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive, covering 7:01. It was Penn State's longest time-covering drive since a 9:01 drive against Indiana in 2019.
- WR Parker Washington became the first true freshman wide receiver to start a season opener since Brandon Polk against Temple in 2015.
- Washington caught a 9-yard touchdown pass in overtime, marking the second-straight season opener with a freshman catching a touchdown pass. Brenton Strange caught a 4-yard touchdown reception against Idaho in 2019.
- QB Sean Clifford ran for a career-best 119 yards on 17 carries. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game and Penn State's first 100-yard rushing game by a quarterback since Will Lewis ran for 108 yards against Rutgers in 2019.
- Clifford scored on a 35-yard run at the end of the third quarter. It was Clifford's second career rushing touchdown over 30 yards, joining his 38-yard run against Indiana in 2019.
- TE Pat Freiermuth owns the Penn State career record for receiving touchdowns by a tight end with 16 career touchdown grabs. He broke a tie with Mike Gesicki (2014-17).

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Wide receiver Jahan Dotson scored three touchdowns and totaled 144 yards receiving for No. 18/17 Penn State, but No. 3 Ohio State made an early lead last for a 38-25 win over the Nittany Lions.

It was Dotson's second career 100-yard receiving game and a career-high total, and his three touchdowns and eight receptions were also career highs. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18-of-30 passes for 281 yards and the three touchdowns. Of Clifford's passing yards, 252 came in the second half.

Ohio State was paced by quarterback Justin Fields, who completed 28-of-34 passes for 318 yards and four touchdowns. Garrett Wilson caught 11 passes for 111 yards and had a 62-yard rush, while Chris Olave caught seven passes for 120 yards and 2 touchdowns and Jeremy Ruckert added a pair of receiving touchdowns.

Linebacker Ellis Brooks paced the Penn State defense with a career-high 11 tackles, while linebacker Brandon Smith and defensive tackle Antonio Shelton both tallied sacks. Tommy Togiai led Ohio State with seven tackles and three sacks and Marcus Hooker had six tackles and an interception.

How It Happened

Ohio State jumped out to an early two-touchdown lead. Wilson broke free for 62 yards on the first play from scrimmage and Master Teague III scored from four yards out two plays later to give the Buckeyes a 7-0 lead. Penn State failed to convert on fourth-and-two at its own 45 on the ensuing drive, and Ohio State took advantage of the short field when Olave hauled in a 26-yard touchdown catch.

Penn State put together a field goal drive for its first score with 2:57 remaining in the first quarter, but the Buckeyes added another touchdown before the end of the half on a 10-yard throw to Jeremy Ruckert over the middle. Jordan Stout drilled a 50-yard field goal for the Nittany Lions as the half expired to go to halftime down 21-6.

Penn State opened the second half with the ball and marched down the field for an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 14-yard touchdown reception by Dotson. Ohio State answered midway through the third quarter with a 49-yard touchdown catch by Olave and added a field goal before the end of the quarter.

The Nittany Lions made it a 31-19 game at the start of the fourth quarter after a pair of highlight reel catches by Dotson. On the first play of the final stanza on third-and-17, Dotson caught a 37-yard pass with one hand and the side of his helmet. On the next play, he made a one-handed snag for a 21-yard touchdown catch.

Fields found Ruckert again in the end zone with 9:14 to go and Clifford connected with Dotson on a 20-yard strike with 6:27 to go to make it a 38-25 game. Hooker sealed the game for Ohio State with an interception in Penn State territory in the game's final minutes.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Penn State tried to rally from an early deficit with 290 yards of total offense in the second half, but Maryland's explosive scoring plays in the first half were enough for a 35-19 victory in Big Ten football action Saturday in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State held Maryland to 70 yards with no scores on offense in the second half, but was unable to overcome a 28-7 halftime deficit.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford attempted a school-record 57 passes and threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns as he tried to rally the Nittany Lions late, and freshman wide receiver Parker Washington caught eight passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson finished with nine catches for 123 yards - his second-straight 100-yard receiving game - and tight end Pat Freiermuth caught six passes for 91 yards, as both surpassed 1,000 yards receiving for their careers in the game.

Maryland scored all of its touchdowns from 34 or more yards out. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa completed 18-of-26 passes for 282 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Rakim Jarrett caught five passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns and wide receiver Dontay Demus caught six passes for 86 yards and one touchdown. Running back Jake Funk ran 16 times for 80 yards and a 38-yard touchdown run.

Defensive end Jayson Oweh led the Nittany Lions on defense with a career-high 10 tackles and two tackles for loss, while safety Nick Cross led the Terps with eight tackles, a sack, interception and two pass break ups.

How It Happened

Maryland took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a pair of big touchdown receptions by Jarrett, who caught a 42-yard touchdown the Terps' first possession and a 62-yard score with 19 seconds remaining in the opening frame, and then went up three touchdowns with a 38-yard rush by Funk early in the second quarter.

Penn State got on the board with 6:32 remaining in the half, as Clifford engineered a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive capped by a 20-yard touchdown toss to Dotson, but Tagovailoa connected with Demus for a 34-yard touchdown before the break for a 28-7 halftime lead.

Maryland extended its lead in the second half on a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Clifford connected with Washington for a 23-yard touchdown with 10:16 remaining to complete a 16-play, 98-yard drive, and again in the final seconds for a 1-yard score.

Notes

- Penn State dropped to 40-3-1 against Maryland all-time, snapping a five-game win streak.
- The Nittany Lions are now 23-2 at home against Maryland.
- Penn State is 5-2 against Maryland since the Terrapins joined the Big Ten in 2014.
- The Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 14-straight wins against teams within 250 miles of Beaver Stadium.
- Freshman receivers KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Parker Washington both started for the Nittany Lions, marking the first time two true freshman receivers started for Penn State since Saeed Blacknall and Chris Godwin at Michigan in 2014.
- Penn State's 93 plays on offense were its most since having 99 at Iowa in 2017.
- QB Sean Clifford attempted a program-record 57 passes. The record was previously held by Christian Hackenberg (55; at Indiana, 2013).
- Clifford finished with 340 passing yards, marking his third career 300-yard game. He is tied with Daryll Clark (2006-09) for fifth place on Penn State's all-time list.
- His nine career games of 200-plus yards passing moves him into a tie for 10th with Todd Blackledge (1980-82) and Wally Richardson (1992, 94-96).
- The 340 yards ranks tied for 16th in program history, matching his own mark at Minnesota in 2019 and Christian Hackenberg's performance at Indiana in 2013.
- WR Jahan Dotson became the first Penn State football player to have a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of a season since Allen Robinson accomplished the feat in 2013 (vs. Syracuse, Eastern Michigan, UCF).
- Dotson's five touchdowns in the first three games of the season tie the Penn State record set by Joe Jurevicius in 1997.
- WR Parker Washington became the first Penn State true freshman to have two touchdown receptions in a game since Pat Freiermuth did so against Rutgers in 2018.
- DE Jayson Oweh is the first Penn State defensive lineman with 10 or more tackles in a game since Yetur Gross-Matos against Indiana in 2018 (10 tackles).
- DE Shane Simmons recorded a career-high 1.5 sacks.
- K Jake Pinegar registered his 200th career point on an extra point in the second quarter.

GAME RECAP

LINCOLN, Neb. — Penn State trimmed a 21-point halftime deficit to just seven points late, but Nebraska took advantage of early turnovers and made a pair of fourth-down stops in the red zone in the final minutes to hang on for a 30-23 victory.

The Nittany Lions outscored Nebraska 17-3 over the final 30 minutes, but it was not enough to overcome a 27-6 halftime deficit.

Will Levis threw for a career-high 219 yards on 14-of-31 passing and rushed for 61 yards after entering the game in the second quarter, and running backs Keyvone Lee and Devyn Ford ran for a touchdown each in the second half. Pat Freiermuth led Penn State in receiving with seven catches for a career-high 113 yards, including a career-long 74-yard reception, while Parker Washington caught five passes for 70 yards. Jayson Oweh and Jesse Luketa paced the defense with nine tackles each, and Oweh made 1.5 stops behind the line while Luketa made one.

How It Happened

Penn State trimmed its first-half deficit to 11 in the third quarter with a 31-yard rushing touchdown by Keyvone Lee followed by a field goal. Nebraska added a field goal early in the fourth quarter for a 30-16 lead, but on the Nittany Lions' next possession, Levis spun away from a blitz to connect with Freiermuth for a 74-yard gain to the Nebraska 1, which led to a Ford rushing TD with 9:20 to go.

Trailing 30-23 during the ensuing Nebraska drive, Oweh pressured McCaffery, forcing him to throw a ball up for grabs, and linebacker Brandon Smith snagged it for Penn State at the Nebraska 48 with 7:39 remaining. Penn State drove to the 11-yard line, but the Huskers forced four-straight incompletions and took over on downs with 3:37 to go. However, the Nittany Lion defense forced a three-and-out to get the ball back with 2:34 left.

Levis started the offensive drive from the Penn State 31 with a 14-yard rush, and then went 5-for-6 passing for 46 yards to lead the Lions to the Nebraska 9. However, the Huskers drew incompletions on the next two plays, Luke Reimer sacked Levis on third down, and Penn State was unable to convert on fourth down from the 13.

Nebraska had built a 27-6 lead through halftime, including 10 points off turnovers. The Huskers opened the game with a McCaffery touchdown run, and an interception by Cam Taylor-Britt led to a field goal for a 10-0 lead. Penn State kicked a field goal at the start of the second quarter, but then Nebraska's Xavier Betts broke free for a 45-yard touchdown reception and Deontai Williams scored on a 26-yard strip-sack fumble recovery touchdown run for a 24-3 lead. Both teams added field goal before the break.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Penn State trimmed its third-quarter deficit to 13 with touchdowns on back-to-back throws by Sean Clifford, but the Nittany Lions fell 41-21 against Iowa in Big Ten action at Beaver Stadium on Saturday. The Hawkeyes found success on the ground, scoring four rushing touchdowns.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford entered the game in the third quarter and immediately sparked the Nittany Lion offense. He found Brenton Strange (28 yards) and Jahan Dotson (68 yards) for touchdowns on back-to-back throws. The Nittany Lions' late rally was not enough to overcome a 24-7 halftime deficit. Iowa added a late touchdown on a 71-yard interception return by Daviyon Nixon.

Clifford finished the game completing 13-of-22 passes for 174 yards, while starter Will Levis completed 13-of-16 passes for 106 yards. Dotson caught eight passes for 139 yards to earn his third 100-yard receiving game of the season. Lamont Wade led the Penn State defense with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery to setup a touchdown. Shaka Toney recorded three tackles for loss, including two sacks, while Jayson Oweh had six tackles, including 1.5 for loss. Iowa rushed for 175 yards, led by Mekhi Sargent's 101 yards and two touchdowns. Tyler Goodson added 78 yards and a touchdown. Spencer Petras completed 18-of-28 passes for 186 yards and rushed for a 3-yard score. Nick Niemann led the Hawkeye defensive unit with 17 tackles. Jack Campbell contributed seven tackles, a sack and a forced fumble.

How It Happened

Penn State answered an Iowa field goal with a 6-yard rushing touchdown by Keyvone Lee late in the first quarter. A methodical drive included 44 rushing yards and six completions by Levis. On third-and-goal, Lee took a handoff through the middle.

The Hawkeyes responded with three rushing touchdowns, including a 10-yard run by Goodson and a pair of 1-yard runs by Sargent, to take a 24-7 lead into halftime. Iowa pushed its lead to 31-7 in the third quarter on a 3-yard sneak by Petras.

The Nittany Lions trimmed the deficit on a 28-yard touchdown pass by Clifford to Strange along the right sideline. The score was setup by an Iowa botched snap at their own 30, recovered by Wade and returned to the 28-yard-line.

Following a missed field goal by Iowa, Clifford's first throw of the ensuing drive connected with Dotson for a 68-yard touchdown. Clifford got the Hawkeyes' defense to bite on a pump-fake before finding an open Dotson deep down the field. Lee scored on a run to convert the two-point conversion. The Nittany Lions trailed 31-21 with seven seconds left in the third quarter.

Iowa answered with a 24-yard field goal by Keith Duncan. The Hawkeyes added to their lead on Nixon's pick-six late in the fourth quarter.

GAME RECAP

ANN ARBOR, Mich. – Penn State collected a season-high 254 rushing yards as it earned a 27-17 win over Michigan on Saturday. It was Penn State's first win in The Big House since 2009.

Penn State gained 417 total yards, its fourth time this season reaching the 400-yard mark. The Nittany Lions were led by Keyvone Lee, who rushed for a career-high 134 yards on 22 carries, while adding a 6-yard score. Sean Clifford completed 17-of-28 passes for 163 yards. He added 73 yards on the ground, including a 29-yard touchdown run. Will Levis added a 2-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter to help put the game away. Parker Washington led the PSU receivers with nine catches for 93 yards, both career marks.

The Nittany Lions held Michigan to 126 total yards in the second half. Penn State limited the Wolverines to 112 passing yards for the game. A balanced defensive effort saw five players record at least five tackles, led by Ellis Brooks' six stops. Jaquan Brisker, PJ Mustipher, Brandon Smith and Marquis Wilson each had five tackles.

How It Happened

Penn State scored on its opening drive for the first time this season, finishing the drive on a 6-yard run by Lee. On the drive, Lee gained 39 yards on six carries, while Clifford completed a 20-yard pass to Washington and a 16-yard strike to Isaac Lutz to setup the Nittany Lions in the red zone.

Michigan answered late in the first quarter. Haskins scored on a 2-yard run after having a 59-yard burst on the first play of the drive.

Clifford found the end zone on a 28-yard run in the second quarter. On a draw play, the Nittany Lion offensive line created a huge hole up the middle for Clifford to run through and find his way up the left sideline, untouched into the end zone.

The Nittany Lions added to their lead with a 22-yard field goal by Jake Pinegar to close out the first half. Penn State benefitted from a muffed punt return that bounced right into the hands of Drew Hartlaub at the Michigan 27-yard line. A 9-yard connection from Clifford to Dotson and a 10-yard run on a draw by Clifford setup an easy kick for Pinegar.

The teams traded field goals in the third quarter with Jake Moody hitting a 40-yard kick for the Wolverines and Pinegar converting a 33-yard field goal for the Nittany Lions.

Michigan cut the Nittany Lions' lead to three early in the fourth quarter on a 2-yard touchdown run by Haskins.

However, Penn State responded with a 12-play, 75-yard drive covering five minutes. The drive finished on a 2-yard touchdown run around the right side of the line by Will Levis. A key 24-yard run by Lee took the Nittany Lions into Michigan territory. The drive was aided by two catches by Dotson that resulted in first downs. Levis' score put the Nittany Lions ahead by two possessions, 27-17.

- This was Penn State's first win in Ann Arbor since Oct. 24, 2009, a 35-10 victory.

GAME RECAP

PISCATAWAY, N.J. — Penn State added to its impressive football history on Saturday as it earned the program's 900th win. The Nittany Lions' used a strong defensive effort to pick up a 23-7 win over Rutgers at SHI Stadium.

The Nittany Lion offense gained 248 yards on the ground, its third time running for over 245 yards in the last four games. Keyvone Lee led Penn State with 95 yards on 17 carries, while Devyn Ford rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown. Sean Clifford completed 15-of-22 passes for 133 yards, including a 29-yard touchdown pass to Parker Washington. Will Levis added 65 yards on 17 carries. Jake Pinegar hit both of his field goal attempts, while Jordan Stout converted a 47-yard kick.

Penn State held Rutgers to 205 total yards, including just 83 rushing. Jesse Luketa led the unit with 10 tackles, a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery. Ellis Brooks and Joey Porter Jr. each recorded seven tackles with Porter adding a tackle for loss. Brooks forced a fumble in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions held Rutgers to just 43 yards in the first half, including just 12 yards on the ground. Rutgers' first six drives resulted in four three-and-outs and two turnovers. Penn State held Rutgers to zero or negative yards on 13 plays in the half.

How It Happened

After stopping a Rutgers run on fourth down, the Nittany Lions found the end zone on a 29-yard strike from Clifford to Washington. After starting the drive on the Rutgers 45 yard-line, Penn State got on the board as Washington caught a slant pass over the middle and went untouched into the end zone.

The Nittany Lions added a field goal on their next drive. An 11-play, 74-yard drive was capped by a 30-yard boot from Pinegar. All 74 yards coming through runs.

Penn State expanded its lead to 17-0 on a 7-yard touchdown run by Ford. After another stop on a Rutgers fourth down attempt, a 21-yard run by Lee placed Penn State just outside the red zone. A connection from Clifford to Isaac Lutz set up the Nittany Lions inside the Rutgers 5 yard-line. Two plays later, Ford found open space around the right side of the line.

Stout converted a 47-yard field goal early in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions took advantage of another short field after a fumble was forced by Brooks and recovered by Luketa at the Rutgers 39 yard-line.

Penn State extended its lead to 23-7 in the fourth quarter. After a punt pinned the Nittany Lions at their own 2 yard-line, Lee broke a 31-yard run and a penalty moved the ball to the 50 yard-line. A 14-yard run by Lee and a 12-yard carry by Levis got the blue and white into the red zone. The drive finished with a 27-yard field goal by Pinegar.

Notes

- Penn State won its 900th game in program history. The Nittany Lions are the nation's 8th program to reach 900 wins.
- The Nittany Lions are now 29-2 all-time against Rutgers, including 14-straight wins.
- In its first season in the Big Ten, Rutgers scored 10 points against the Nittany Lions in 2014. Since then, Penn State has held the Scarlet Knights to single-digit points in all six contests (3 in 2015, 0 in 2016, 6 in 2017, 7 in 2018, 6 in 2019, 7 in 2020).
- Robbie Dwyer, Coziah Izzard, Amin Vanover all made their first career appearance, bringing the number to 14 Nittany Lions who have made their debuts this season, including 12 true freshmen.
- In six drives in the first half, Penn State's defense held Rutgers to four, three-and-outs and two turnovers on downs.
- The Nittany Lions held the Scarlet Knights to 43 total yards in the first half, the fewest yards allowed by the Penn State defense in a half since limiting Maryland to 34 yards in the second half on Sept. 27, 2019.
- Penn State's defense had 29 plays (out of 64 total plays; 45.3%) go for 1 yard or less (includes incompletions), 24 of which were for no gain or negative yardage (37.5%).
- The Nittany Lions held the Scarlet Knights to zero plays of 20-plus yards on defense or special teams for the first time since doing so against Eastern Michigan in 2013.
- The Nittany Lions rushed for 248 yards, their fourth 200-plus rushing yard game of the season.
- QB Sean Clifford threw one touchdown in the first quarter to total 37 career passing touchdowns and moved into a tie for 9th all-time with Chuck Fusina.
- Clifford rushed for 21 yards. He now totals 675 career rushing yards to jump to third all-time by a quarterback at Penn State, passing John Huftnagel and Rashard Casey.
- WR Parker Washington had his fourth career touchdown reception on a 29-yard catch in the first quarter.
- RB Devyn Ford had his third rushing touchdown of the season and sixth of his career with a 7-yard score in the second quarter.
- LB Jesse Luketa recorded his first career fumble recovery in the third quarter after Ellis Brooks stripped the ball.
- Luketa registered a career-high 10 tackles, topping a previous high of nine against Nebraska earlier this season (11/14).
- CB Joey Porter Jr. tallied a career-high six tackles.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Penn State outscored Michigan State, 29-3, in the second half on its way to a 39-24 win on Saturday at Beaver Stadium. A pair of touchdown connections from Sean Clifford to Parker Washington and a punt return touchdown by Jahan Dotson highlighted a big second half.

Sean Clifford completed 17-of-27 passes for 232 yards and two touchdowns. He added 48 rushing yards, including a 31-yard score. Will Levis completed all three of his pass attempts for 54 yards and scored on a 1-yard run. Jahan Dotson caught eight passes for 108 yards, his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season. Dotson also had an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown. Parker Washington hauled in four catches for 95 yards and two touchdowns.

Shane Simmons led the Penn State (3-5, 3-5 Big Ten) defense with a career-high seven tackles, including two for loss and 1.5 sacks. Jaquan Brisker tallied nine tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and an interception.

How It Happened

The Nittany Lions got on the board on their opening drive on a 24-yard field goal by Jake Pinegar.

Michigan State responded with a touchdown early in the second quarter. Thorne hit Nailor in the end zone for a 45-yard score.

A 37-yard kick return by Lamont Wade jumpstarted Penn State's ensuing drive. On third-and-4 at the Michigan State 31-yard line, Clifford found a hole up the middle on a draw and went untouched into the end zone.

Michigan State answered with a 26-yard strike from Thorne to Tre'Von Morgan. The Spartans added to their lead with a 7-yard touchdown grab by Nailor in the corner of the end zone. Michigan State led 21-10 at halftime.

Penn State opened the second half with a 75-yard scoring drive. The drive ended as Clifford found Washington in the back of the end zone for an 8-yard touchdown. The Nittany Lions converted a two-point conversion as Clifford hit Dotson over the middle.

The Nittany Lions took a 25-24 lead in the closing seconds of the third quarter as Levis scored on a 1-yard run. The drive was boosted by 36-yard completion from Levis to Dotson and a 26-yard completion from Clifford to Washington to setup Penn State at the Michigan State 7-yard line.

After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State extended its lead early in the fourth quarter on a 49-yard strike from Clifford to Washington.

Penn State forced another three-and-out before an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown by Dotson. He broke a pair of tackles around the Penn State 40-yard line and followed a key block by Isaac Lutz to free him for the final 40 yards.

Notes

- Penn State is now 18-16-1 all-time against Michigan State.
- The Nittany Lions are now 16-9 in Land Grant Trophy games (since joining Big Ten in 1993).
- Penn State is now 7-4 all-time in December regular season games.
- The Nittany Lions played the latest game in a calendar year in Beaver Stadium history. The previous latest game was December 7, 1968 vs. Syracuse.
- Senior DE Shane Simmons made his first career start.
- After trailing 21-10 in the first half, Penn State outscored Michigan State 29-3 in the second half.
- The Penn State offense did not allow a sack for the first time this season. This was the first time since the Maryland game (9/27/19) the Nittany Lions did not give up a sack.
- The Penn State defense totaled 10 tackles for loss, the 24th time registering 10 or more tackles for loss in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions held Michigan State to 64 rushing yards, marking the third time this season they have kept their opponent under 100 rushing yards.
- QB Sean Clifford now has 4,447 career passing yards to move into 11th all-time.
- Clifford threw two touchdowns, both to WR Parker Washington, and now has 39 career passing touchdowns to his credit. He moved into a tie for eighth with Kerry Collins (1991-94).
- WR Jahan Dotson recorded 108 receiving yards, his fourth 100-plus yard receiving game of the season (Ohio State, 144; Maryland, 123; Iowa, 139).
- Dotson ran back an 81-yard punt return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. The 81-yard punt return is tied for the eighth-longest in program history.
- Dotson is one of three Big Ten players to have 100 receiving yards and a punt return for a touchdown in the same game since 2000. Michigan's Steve Breaston (2006; vs. Indiana) and Wisconsin's Brandon Williams (2005; vs. Indiana) were the others to accomplish the feat.
- Washington recorded a career-high 95 receiving yards.
- Washington has six receiving touchdowns this season, which ranks third in program history for freshmen (true or redshirt) behind Deon Butler (9; 2005) and Pat Freiermuth (8; 2018). It is also second among true freshmen in Penn State history.
- Simmons recorded a career-high seven total tackles and a career-best 2.0 tackles for loss.
