### Opening Tip

Underwood vs. Penn State:

- Illinois heads back East for the second part of its two-game road trip, facing No. 9 Penn State on Tuesday (5:30 p.m. CT). It is an All-Access broadcast on FS1, featuring both head coaches mic'd up and bringing viewers into team huddles and the locker rooms.
- Following seven consecutive wins, the Illini are now looking to snap a four-game losing streak.

- Illinois also is looking to end a six-game skid against Penn State. Illinois' last victory over the Nittany Lions was Jan. 31, 2015 in Champaign. The Illini's last win at the Jordan Center, meanwhile, came on Feb. 9, 2014.
- Illinois has dropped 18 straight against Top 25 opponents in true road games. Illinois beat No. 13 Maryland last season at Madison Square Garden, but the Illini's last victory on a ranked team's home court was a 66-63 win at No. 24 lowa on March 8, 2014, on a Jon Ekey three with :00.5 left.
- Illinois' last road win over a Top-10 team was an 85-73 victory at No. 10 Gonzaga on Dec. 8, 2012. The Illini's last conference road win against a Top-10 team, meanwhile, was a 71-67 OT victory at No. 9 Purdue on Dec. 30, 2008.
- Illinois concludes five-straight Quad 1 games on Tuesday, a stretch dating back to Feb. 2 at lowa.

- Four of Illinois' remaining six regular season games are either Quad 1 (3) or Quad 2 (1).
- Illinois has won three Big Ten road games, tied with Michigan State and Wisconsin for third-most in the league behind Penn State and Maryland (4 apiece).
- Illinois is second in the Big Ten in scoring defense during league play, allowing 63.6 ppg.
- The Illini rank fourth in field goal percentage defense (.407) and third in 3-point percentage defense (.314) in conference games.
- The Illini head to Penn State looking for their sixth Quad 1 win of the season. Three of Illinois' five Quad 1 victories have come on the road: at Michigan (26), at Wisconsin (31) and at Purdue (33), with the home wins against Michigan (26) and Rutgers (30).
- The Illini also have two Quad 2 wins both at home with the victory against Purdue (33) just missing Quad 1 status (top 30).
- Illinois was ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 for five straight weeks from Jan. 13-Feb. 10. It marked Illinois' longest streak since appearing in eight straight AP polls from Nov. 26, 2012-Jan. 14, 2013.
- Illinois (+8.0) trails just Penn State and West Virginia for the largest turnaround so far this season among schools from the six major conferences.
- Illinois has surpassed last year's win total by four games and last seasons's B1G win total by one game.
- Illinois is averaging just 10.2 turnovers over the last 13 games, tallying single digits seven times.
- Illinois ranks fourth in the NCAA in rebound margin (+8.7), trailing Houston, UC Irvine and Gonzaga.
- Illinois has outrebounded its opponent in 18 of 25 games, and 10 times by double digits.
- Illinois ranks sixth nationally in offensive rebound rate (36.3%) and is averaging 12.2 second-chance ppg.
- The Illini are 15-1 this season, and 35-3 in the Underwood era, when shooting better than the opponent.
- Illinois has made 39 more free throws than its opponents have attempted on the season, and are currently outscoring foes by an average of 5.6 points per game at the foul line.
- Illinois is No. 17 in the nation in defensive free throw rate at 23.1% (FTA/FGA), a complete contrast from last season when the Illini defense ranked 338th out of 353 teams in that same category (42.4%).

# **Player Items**

- Sophomore Avo Dosunmu leads the team and is sixth in the Big Ten in scoring at 15.8 ppg. He has reached double digits in 20 of the 24 games he's played in, with five 20-point performances.
- Dosunmu has scored in double figures in 14 of his last 15 games, including a career-long active streak of nine straight contests.
- Dosummu is averaging 17.0 points (153), 4.7 rebounds (42) and 4.2 assists (38) over his last nine games.

- Kofi Cockburn has 10 double-doubles, setting the Illinois freshman season record and ranking fifth among all freshmen nationally.
- Cockburn ranks 58th in the NCAA in rebounding and No. 4 among freshmen averaging 9.0 rpg.
- Cockburn is 19th nationally in offensive rebound percentage (14.9).
- Cockburn is averaging 3.9 offensive rebounds over the last nine games (35).
- **Cockburn** is 39th nationally in fouls drawn per 40 minutes (6.4) and 57th in free throw rate (58.7).
- Cockburn has scored in double figures in 19 of 25 games, with five 20-point outings.
- **Cockburn** made 80.5% from the foul line over an eight-game stretch (33-41) before missing all four free throw attempts Saturday at Rutgers.
- Senior **Andres Feliz** is averaging 14.3 points (86) and 5.8 rebounds (35) over the last six games while shooting 50% from the field (31-62) and 90.9% from the foul line (20-22).
- Feliz carries an active career-long streak by scoring in double digits in six straight games.
- Sophomore **Alan Griffin** is averaging 10.7 points (32) and 7.3 rebounds (22) over the last three games while shooting 53.8% from 3-point range (7-13) and making an average of 2.3 treys.

# Last Time Out: Illini Latest Victim at The RAC

Playing for the first time this season without leading scorer and playmaker **Ayo Dosunmu**, the Illini battled for the first 26 minutes before running out of steam, dropping a 72-57 decision at Rutgers as the Scarlet Knights remained undefeated (17-0) on their homecourt.

There were two changes in the starting lineup, with **Andres Feliz** moving from his usual 6th-man role in place of **Dosunmu**, and **Alan Griffin** earning his first start of the season, and second of his career.

The Illini went on a 10-1 run early in the game to take a 14-10 lead, and later cut a five-point deficit to just two at the half. The second half started off much the same way as the first half was played, with the teams exchanging baskets.

A 3-pointer by **Andres Feliz** pulled the Illini within 43-42 with 14 minutes left. But Rutgers then went on the

# Penn State 83, Illinois 76 // Feb. 23, 2019 at Champaign

Penn State played the role of spoiler during the 30th anniversary reunion of the 1989 Flyin' Illini, claiming an 83-66 victory in front of a sellout crowd at State Farm Center

The Nittany Lions broke ahead midway through the first half, going on a 10-1 run to take a 34-22 lead. The Illini trailed by seven at halftime and found itself back down double digits early after the break.

PSU took its largest lead of the game at 61-46 with 9:53 remaining. The Illini then ran off 10 unanswered over the next two minutes to pull within five. The Orange and Blue had a number of chances from there to make it a one-possession game, but came away empty, and the Lions made their free throws down the stretch

Illinois shot just 39.4 percent on the afternoon. Both teams made 26 field goals, with the Illini tallying one more 3-pointer, but PSU outscored the hosts by eight points at the free throw line, converting 26-of-32 (81.3 percent) while the Illini managed just 18-of-28 (64.3 percent).

Ayo Dosunmu led the Illini in scoring for the third straight game, tallying 18 points.

Andres Feliz had a strong game with 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting, marking his highest scoring Big Ten game of the season.

Giorgi Bezhanishvili recorded his first career double-double with 16 points and a season-high tying 10 rebounds, including five offensive.

# Penn State 72, Illinois 56 // March 10, 2019 at University Park

The Illini played a strong first half but could not keep pace after intermission, falling at Penn State 72-56 to close out the regular season.

Illinois controlled the opening 20 minutes, playing a zone defense that slowed down the Nittany Lions and held them to just 34.5 percent shooting. The Illini led by as many as seven points at 22-15 before taking a 32-31 advantage into the locker room.

PSU quickly took the lead after the break, putting the Illini in catch-up mode. Illinois trailed 47-41 when the Lions scored seven unanswered to open up a 13point lead with 10:30 remaining, and the Illini could draw no closer than nine the rest of the way.

Illinois managed just 24 points in the second half on 20.8 percent shooting (5-24)

Illinois struggled with turnovers, committing 18 which PSU converted into 18

Freshmen Ayo Dosunmu and Giorgi Bezhanishvili led the way for the Illini, scoring 16 points apiece. Dosunmu grabbed a team-high eight rebounds, and **Andres** Feliz added nine points and six boards.

first sizable run for either team, scoring 11 unanswered to extend its lead to 54-42.

Illinois cut that deficit nearly in half, drawing to 54-47. The Knights answered with another run, this time 9-2 to push it back to 63-49 at the 3:00 mark. That made it a 20-7 advantage for Rutgers in an 11-minute stretch which decided the game.

Illinois had trouble shooting against Rutgers once again, finishing 31.1% from the field (19-61) and 28.6% from 3-point land (8-28) while equaling its season high with 28 attempts from long distance. Rutgers, meanwhile, made 49.1% on the afternoon (27-55) and 46.7% from three (7-15). Illinois had only 11 turnovers, but the hosts took advantage, converting those into 19 points.

**Griffin** led the team in scoring for the third time this season, finishing with 14 points. **Kofi Cockburn** recorded his 10th double-double of the season with 10 and 10, and **Andres Feliz** reached double digits for the sixth straight game with 10 points.

#### **SFC Sellouts**

Momentum on the court is carrying over to the Illini fan base. Illinois has played in front of sellout crowds in each of the last three home games against Minnesota, Maryland and Michigan State. Two additional games have sold out: March 1 vs. Indiana and March 8 vs. Iowa (Senior Night). # We're Going Streaking

Illinois' recent seven-game conference winning streak from Jan. 5-30 was its longest in 15 years, since setting a school record with 25 consecutive Big Ten victories spanning the 2004 (10) and 2005 (15) seasons (Jan. 31, 2004-March 3, 2005).

During that seven-game win streak, Illinois' defense allowed an average of just 57.7 points, 36.9% shooting, 28% 3-point shooting, and 4.7 made threes per game.

And as part of that winning streak the Illini won three in a row on the road, its longest since also winning three straight conference road games from Feb. 7-26, 2017. Illinois' three road wins ended lengthy streaks in each of those cities. On Jan. 8, the Fighting Illini earned a win at Wisconsin for the first time in 10 seasons. On Jan. 21, the Orange and Blue notched a victory at Purdue for the first time in 11 seasons. And on Jan. 21, the Illini won at Michigan for the first time in 10 seasons.

Illinois is only the second team in the last 27 years to win at Wisconsin, at Purdue, and at Michigan in the

Those defensive numbers have slipped in the last two weeks, as Illinois has given up an average of 72.3 points on 48.6% shooting and 41.5% from three, leading to an 0-4 mark.

# **Taking Care of The Rock**

Illinois struggled with turnovers throughout the early portion of the schedule. In fact, the Illini entered Christmas ranked 304th in the NCAA in turnovers, averaging 15.6 turnovers per game.

The Illini have turned things around dramatically since the holiday break, however, averaging just 10.2turnovers over the last 13 games (132), posting single-digit turnover numbers in seven of those contests.

Point guard **Trent Frazier** has played the last 402 minutes with only nine turnovers. Meanwhile, guard **Andres Feliz** has had only eight turnovers in 323 minutes, and **Da'Monte Williams** has just five turnovers in 255 minutes during this 13-game stretch.

Sophomore guard **Ayo Dosunmu** has been Illinois' closer, making key plays down the stretch in a number of games during Illinois' recent winning streak:

- At Wisconsin Hit a runner with 1:25 left that gave Illini a 1-point lead, then made a stepback 3-pointer with 46 seconds left to put the Illini up by four ... Directly involved in Illinois' final 14 points of the game, assisting on three consecutive 3-pointers before scoring Illinois' last five.
- Rutgers Broke 46-all tie by scoring Illinois' last eight points in the final two minutes ... Made two free throws with 1:34 left to put the Illini up two, then a layup with 50 seconds left to push the lead to four ... Grabbed defensive rebound on ensuing possession and made two more free throws with :37 left to extend lead to six ... Sealed win with two final free throws with 18 seconds remaining.
- Northwestern After Wildcats pulled within three, drained a crossover jumper with shot clock expiring to put the Illini up by five with 18 seconds remaining ... Made two free throws with six seconds left to put the Illini up four and clinch the victory.

- At Purdue After the Boilermakers cut the deficit to single digits with under five minutes to play, swished back-to-back pullup jumpers at 4:18 and 3:41, thwarting any attempt of a Purdue comeback.

# Game 24 Recap: 20-Point Comeback Ends in Heartbreak

Illinois staged one of the greatest comebacks in school history before falling in the closing seconds to Michigan State, 70-69, at State Farm Center.

The first half belonged to the Spartans, who scored the game's first eight points and led by as many as 19 before taking a 37-20 lead into the locker room.

After a sluggish first 20 minutes on offense, the Illini came out clicking following intermission, making seven of their first 11 shots. But MSU was still scoring on the other end, taking its largest lead of the night at 43-23 and still holding a 17-point lead with 12 minutes remaining.

That's when Illinois came surging back. The Illini reeled off 10 unanswered to cut the deficit to seven. The hosts then scored 12 of the next 16, taking their first lead of the night at 61-60 on an **Ayo Dosunmu** layup with 5:27 to go. That capped a 22-4 run over six minutes that brought the fans roaring to 111 decibels.

The lead would change hands seven times over the final five minutes, with each team answering the other. **Kofi Cockburn** made the biggest free throws of his young career, draining a pair with 19.1 seconds left to put the Illini ahead 69-68.

Cassius Winston drove the lane on MSU's final possession, missing a runner that only drew backboard. It was cleaned up by Xavier Tillman, who dunked it home with six seconds left to put the Spartans up by one.

Illinois had one last chance, but after racing up court, **Dosunmu** slipped while attempting to make a move and lost control of the ball, crashing to the floor as the clock expired.

**Dosummu** led the Illini with 17 points and a career-high nine rebounds. **Andres Feliz** scored 15, and **Cockburn** added 11 points and eight boards.

# Game 23 Recap: Illini Fall at Home to No. 9 Maryland

Illinois dropped its first conference home game of the season, falling 75-66 to No. 9 Maryland in the first-ever Friday night Big Ten game held at State Farm Center.

The Illini fed off the energy of the sold out crowd right out of the gate, going on a 13-0 run to build a 17-7 lead just five minutes in. Illinois made five of its first seven 3-point shots and built its lead to as many as 14 points on two occasions, the latter at 31-17 with nine minutes left in the half.

But Maryland then surged to the break, outscoring the Illini 23-11 the rest of the way to head into intermission trailing by just two (42-40).

After the Illini opened the second half with a pair of free throws, the Terrapins went on a 13-0 run of their own to take a 53-44 lead. Illinois could not buy a basket, missing 17 of its first 18 attempts during the first nearly

11 minutes of the second half.

But the Orange and Blue kept guarding to stay within striking distance. An **Ayo Dosunmu** layup followed by consecutive **Alan Griffin** 3-pointers pulled the Illini within 56-55 with eight minutes to go.

A critical Illini turnover in the backcourt after a defensive rebound led to a Darryl Morsell open trey to put the Terps up four, and after a **Kofi Cockburn** free throw, Eric Ayala hit another three to give Maryland a six-point lead. The Illini could get no closer than five over the last five minutes as the Terps closed out the win to snap the UI's seven-game home win streak.

The Illini struggled around the basket and on free throws, two uncharacteristic areas. Illinois managed just 35.9 percent on 2-pointers (14-39) and 58.3% at the foul line (14-24). Illinois grabbed 14 offensive rebounds and held a 17-to-4 advantage in second-chance points. But Maryland negated that by pushing in transition off its defensive boards, leading to a 21-to-3 edge in fast-break points.

Ayo Dosunmu led the Illini with 16 points while Andres Feliz added 12.

# Game 22 Notes: Streak Snapped in Iowa City

- Illinois' seven-game winning streak came to an end Feb. 2 at No. 18 lowa, as the Illini allowed an opponent to shoot 50% for the first time in 14 games.
- There were 14 lead changes on the afternoon, marking the most in an Illinois game this season.
- Illinois made eight 3-pointers, its highest total in a road game this season.
- Andres Feliz led the Illini in scoring for the second straight game, scoring 17 points on 6-of-11 shooting to go along with four rebounds and two steals.
- Feliz made two of the biggest shots of the afternoon. He crashed the offensive glass and ripped the ball away from two lowa bigs before going back up in traffic to score the putback and put the Illini up 59-55 with 5:28 remaining. He later drained a 3-pointer with the shotclock winding down to give Illinois its last lead of the game at 62-61 with 4:03 left.
- Feliz led the bench effort that saw the Illini reserves outscore lowa's, 29-0.
- Trent Frazier reached double figures for the fifth straight game, finishing with 12 points while draining a trio of 3-pointers and adding a game-high three steals.
- Ayo Dosunmu was 5-of-8 from the field en route to 11 points.

# Game 21 Notes: Illini Streak Hits Seven in Win over Gophers

- Illinois won its seventh-straight Big Ten game, its longest streak since setting a school record with 25 consecutive conference wins spanning the 2004 and 2005 seasons (Jan. 31, 2004-March 3, 2005).
- Illinois has now opened league play with five home wins for the first time since 2009 when it won its first six and improved to 12-1 this season at State Farm Center, its best home start since 2014-15 (also 12-1).
- Illinois held Minnesota to its season lows in points (51), made threes (3), and 3-point percentage (15.8%),
- Illinois outrebounded the Gophers, 45-36. The Illini have outrebounded its opponent in 15 of 21 games, and 10 times by double digits, to account for its ranking of second nationally in rebound margin (+9.7).
- Illinois closed the game on a 7-0 run in the final 1:30 despite missing its last five shots over the final 4:42.
- Illinois' final nine points came from the foul line, while the Illini went 9-for-10 at the line in the final 2:40.
- Illinois's defense was fueled down the stretch by a steal (1:13) and block (0:39) by **Da'Monte Williams**.
- Illinois and Minnesota both started slow on offense, holding an 11-11 tie after 12 minutes, before Illinois went on a 6-0 run on two **Trent Frazier** 3-pointers at the 7:57 and 7:12 marks of the first half.
- Senior Andres Feliz led Illinois with 17 points on 6-of-11 shooting, tied for his second-most points in a Big Ten game in his career. He also had eight rebounds, his second-most ever against a Big Ten foe. It marked Feliz' third time scoring in double figures in the last four games.
- Kofi Cockburn had 13 points and 10 boards, extending his Illinois freshman record with his ninth double-double.
- Ayo Dosunmu scored in double figures for the sixth straight game with 13 points, while Trent Frazier made it four-straight in double digits with 10 points.

# Cockburn Collects Seventh Big Ten Freshman of the Week Award

Kofi Cockburn was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Jan. 27, earning the honor after averaging 13.5 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocked shots in a pair of road wins.

Cockburn had a huge game at Purdue, recording a double-double with game highs of 22 points, 15 rebounds and three blocks. It marked his fifth 20-point game of the season and highest scoring total in league play. It was his eighth double-double, meanwhile, extending his Illinois freshman record and ranking fourth among NCAA freshmen this season. Cockburn added five points and three boards at Michigan.

This was the seventh Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolade for Cockburn, just 12 weeks into the 2019-20 season. He expands his school record for the most honors by

- Illinois snapped a five-game losing streak in Ann Arbor spanning 10 years. Illinois' last victory at Crisler Center was a 51-44 victory on Feb. 23, 2010.
- This marks Illinois' first home-and-home sweep of Michigan since the 2002-03 season.
- Illinois notched its seventh Big Ten victory just nine games into conference play, matching last year's win total.

- Illinois' 79 points equaled its highest output against a high-major opponent this season, while its 1.29 points per possession marked its highest offensive efficiency of the Underwood era.
- Illinois ended a seven-game losing streak at Purdue, winning at Mackey Arena for the first time since a 71-67 overtime victory in the opener of the 2009 Big Ten campaign (Dec. 30, 2008).
- Illinois snapped Purdue's 15-game Big Ten home winning streak, and the No. 21 Illini also ended the Boilers' six-game home winning streak against ranked teams.
- Illinois' 17-point victory at Mackey is the seventh-largest by an opponent since the arena opened in 1967.
- This marks Illinois' first home-and-home sweep of Purdue since the 2008-09 season.
- Illinois shot 55.1% (27-47) against the Boilers, its best accuracy in a road game since making 66.7% in an 87-77 win at lowa on Dec. 29, 2010.
- Illinois shot 75% in the second half (15-20), the fifth-best shooting percentage in a half against Purdue in the last 50 years. Illinois opened the half by making 11 of its first 12 shots.
- Illinois outrebounded Purdue, 37-19. The Boilers finished the game with single-digit defensive rebounds (9), including just two in the second half.
- Kofi Cockburn had game highs of 22 points and 15 rebounds to tally his eighth double-double of the season, extending his Illinois freshman record. His eight doubledoubles are third in the nation among freshmen, behind Memphis' Precious Achiuwa (10) and Washington's Isaiah Stewart (9).
- Cockburn tallied his fifth 20-point game of the season, and first in Big Ten play.
- Ayo Dosunmu registered his first career double-double with 18 points and a career-high 11 assists.
- Illinois had two players record double-doubles in regulation in a Big Ten game for the first time since a 71-62 win over Michigan State win on Jan. 18, 2011, when Demetri McCamey (15 points, 11 assists) and Mike Davis (11 points, 11 rebounds) both had double-doubles.

# **HEAD COACH BRAD UNDERWOOD**

# 3rd Year at Illinois // 7th Year as Div. I Head Coach // 32nd Year in Coaching

Brad Underwood is in his third season at Illinois as the Richmond Family Endowed Men's Head Basketball Coach following his hiring as the 18th head coach in program history in March 2017. Underwood has won more than 67 percent of his games through his first six years as a Division I head coach, recording four 20-win seasons while making four NCAA Tournament appearances.

Illinois was one of the most inexperienced teams in the country last season, with Underwood meshing seven newcomers into his 11-player rotation. Despite that youth, and facing the No. 3-ranked regular seasor schedule by kenpom, the Illini doubled their win total against conference foes in 2019, winning eight games against Big Ten competitors.

The Illini recorded nine wins against teams rated in the top-80 (kenpom), with four victories coming against eventual NCAA Tournament teams. The improvement was highlighted by marquee wins over two top-15 ranked teams. Illinois defeated No. 13 Maryland at Madison Square Garden and knocked off No. 9-ranked and eventual Big Ten champion and Final Four participant Michigan State at home, leading to a court rush celebration by Orange Krush students at the buzzer.

Illinois had 58 percent of its scoring come from newcomers, which was the highest percentage of any team in the Big Ten. For the first time in school history, a true-freshman led Illinois in scoring on the season as rookie Ayo Dosunmu averaged 13.8 points. And in conference play, Illinois had true-freshmen as its top two leading scorers for the first time ever in Dosunmu (14.8 ppg) and Giorgi Bezhanishvili (13.5 ppg).

Year one saw Underwood lay the foundation for the Illini program. Playing at the second-fastest tempo in the Big Ten, Illinois topped 80 points in 12 games and averaged 75.8 points on the season. That marked the Ul's highest scoring average in 13 years, since the 2005 national runner-up season. The offense was aggressive in all phases, recording the team's best offensive rebounding rate (.340) in the last 10 years while also posting the squad's highest free throw rate (.331) since 2008 and making the most free throws (478) since 2002.

Defensively, Illinois ranked fourth nationally in turnover rate, forcing turnovers on 23.2 percent of opponent possessions. The UI defense created its most turnovers (543) in the last 18 years while collecting its most steals (240) since 2005.

Fans have come out to State Farm Center in big numbers to watch the style of play of Underwood's teams at both ends of the floor. Illinois' improvement in average home attendance from 2017 to 2018 ranked 13th nationally. The average increase of 1,231 fans, meanwhile, marked the largest jump for the program in nearly 40 years (1979). Illinois' attendance average increased by an additional 321 fans last season, with the average State Farm Center crowd of 12,935 ranking 23rd nationally while marking the highest mark for the program in the last four years.

Underwood and his staff have also made waves on the recruiting trail during their time in Champaign, signing Ayo Dosunmu, the program's highest-rated guard recruit since 2002, landing a national top-20 class in 2019, and inking Kofi Cockburn, the program's highest-rated center recruit since 2010.

Underwood came to Illinois from Oklahoma State, where he led OSU to a 20-win season and NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cowboys had one of the most exciting and prolific offenses in the country, ranking eighth in the NCAA in scoring (85.7 points per game) and leading the nation in adjusted offensive efficiency (kenpom). The Cowboys ranked eighth nationally in 3-point field goal percentage (.402) and fourth in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (.383).

Oklahoma State finished fifth in the Big 12 with a 9-9 conference record in a season where the Big 12 was rated as the top conference in the nation. That was a dramatic improvement for the Cowboys, who went 3-15 in league play the year prior. Oklahoma State came on strong during the second half of the season, winning 10 of 11 games from Jan. 21-Feb. 25, 2017, which included a pair of five-game winning streaks.

Following that successful turnaround at OSU, he accepted the Illinois job owning a four-year total of 109 wins, third-most ever by a NCAA Div. I head coach.

Underwood arrived in Stillwater following a dominant run at Stephen F. Austin where he led the Lumberjacks to Southland Conference regular season and tournament titles in each of his three seasons. Underwood compiled an 89-14 record at SFA, tied with Brad Stevens (Butler, 2008-10) for the most wins by a head coach in his first three seasons at an NCAA school.

He led SFA to a 28-6 overall record and NCAA Round of 32 appearance in 2016. The Lumberjacks rolled past No. 3 West Virginia in the first round, 70-56, before narrowly missing a trip to the Sweet 16 with a 76-75 defeat to No. 6 Notre Dame in the second round.

That Stephen F. Austin squad was efficient on both sides of the ball, ranking 57th nationally on offense and 38th on defense. The Lumberjacks averaged 80.2 points accompanied by high-pressure defense that forced the highest turnover rate in the country (.259).

Underwood's second SFA team went 29-5 in 2015, also advancing to the NCAA Tournament. The Lumberjacks ranked seventh in the nation in field goal percentage (.487) and led the NCAA in assists (18.7 apg).

His debut season in Nacogdoches in 2014 included a 29-game winning streak and culminated in a 32-3 record and NCAA Round of 32 appearance after a victory over No. 5 seed VCU in the opening round. Underwood earned the Joe B. Hall award, given to the nation's top first-year coach.

Prior to taking over at Stephen F. Austin, Underwood served the 2013 season as associate head coach at South Carolina under Frank Martin. He went to Columbia with Martin after serving on his bench for five seasons as an assistant at Kansas State, with his final season elevated to associate head coach. Underwood spent his first year at K-State in the role of director of operations for then-head coach Bob Huggins.

Underwood had two head coaching stints in the junior college ranks, compiling a 70-24 record in three seasons at Daytona Beach (2004-06) and a 57-63 mark in four years at Dodge City (1990-93). In between those opportunities, Underwood was entrenched in the state of Illinois for 10 seasons, as an assistant coach for Jim Kerwin at Western Illinois from 1994-2003.

Underwood is a December 1986 graduate of Kansas State. He played in Manhattan for the legendary Jack Hartman, K-State's all-time winningest coach. Former Illinois head coach Lon Kruger also played and coached for Hartman at Kansas State.

Underwood began his college career at Hardin-Simmons, where he later worked as a graduate assistant. Hardin-Simmons was the first college job for Lou Henson, the Fighting Illini's all-time winningest coach, and whose name permanently adorns the court at State Farm Center.

Brad and his wife, Susan, have a son, Tyler, and two daughters, Katie and Ashley. Tyler is a member of the Fighting Illini basketball team and Katie also is a U of I student.

An even game for 28 minutes turned in favor of the hosts midway through the second half, as No. 21 Arizona broke open a 1-point game with a pivotal 15-0 run to pull away from the Illini.

Illinois was strong out of the gate, making seven of its first eight shots and leading by as many as seven points in the first half. The Wildcats offense also was clicking, as the lead exchanged hands five times to go along with four ties.

Arizona led by one point at the half and extended its lead to eight before the Illini pulled within 53-52 at the 12-minute mark.

But the Orange and Blue went scoreless over the next four minutes and committed four turnovers while the Wildcats reeled off 15 unanswered, making it 68-52 with less than eight minutes remaining.

Illinois struggled with turnovers throughout the night, totaling a season-high 22 that Arizona turned in to 20 points. And while the Illini offense cooled off after intermission, Arizona continued to roll, scoring 51 second-half points.

The starting guard trio of Ayo Dosunmu, Trent Frazier and Andres Feliz all scored in double figures, combining for 42 of Illinois' 69 points (61%).

**Dosunmu** led the Illini with 15 points. **Frazier** had 14, and **Feliz** recorded his third career double-double, and second of the season, finishing with 13 points and game-high 10 rebounds.

# Game 4 Recap - Illini 66, Hawaii 53

Illinois was strong defensively and used a late-game surge to pull away from Hawaii, 66-53, in its first home game in nearly two weeks.

It was a rough first half as both teams struggled from the field and the Illini offense was also limited by 10 turnovers. The teams went into the locker room tied at 26.

The Illini turnover tally reached 13 by the 17:35 mark of the second half, but from there the hosts settled in and played the next nearly 15 minutes without a turnover.

That ball security allowed the offense to heat up. Leading 52-47 with seven minutes remaining, the Illini went on a 14-2 run over the next four-plus minutes to open up its largest lead of the night at 66-49 and seal the win.

Illinois' defense allowed only 53 points on 37.5 percent shooting. Hawaii entered the game shooting 40 percent from 3-point range but made just 3-of-22 threes (13.6%). The Rainbows also attempted just three free throws for the game, marking the UI's lowest opponent free throw rate (4.5) in more than 10 years, since Wisconsin in the 2008 Big Ten Tournament championship (3.9).

The Illini outrebounded the Rainbows 44-26. Illinois grabbed 11 offensive boards and capitalized with a 12-4 advantage in second-chance points.

Kofi Cockburn led the Illini, recording his third double-double in four games with 15 points and a career-high tying 14 rebounds.

**Trent Frazier** had another efficient game, scoring 13 points on just five field goal attempts.

Giorgi Bezhanishvili, meanwhile, just missed a double-double, tallying 10 points and a season-best nine boards.

# Game 5 Recap - Illini 85, The Citadel 57

Illinois was strong on both ends of the floor, leading nearly the entire way in an 85-57 route of The Citadel.

Illinois went on a 13-0 run midway through the first half to open up a 17-point lead at 24-7. The Illini defense held the Bulldogs to just 10 points over the first 17 minutes of the game, before the visitors doubled that output in the closing three minutes of the half.

The Illini scored the first six points after intermission to open up a 20-point lead, and The Citadel got no closer than 14 the rest of the way.

Illinois dominated inside, scoring 52 points in the paint and 30 second-chance points off of 22 offensive rebounds. Illinois outrebounded The Citadel by 20, with its total of 55 boards its biggest night on the glass since 2000.

Illinois also held The Citadel to just 28.4 percent from the field (21-74), the lowest shooting percentage by a UI opponent since 2014.

Freshman Kofi Cockburn did much of the damage, recording his fourth doubledouble in five games with 18 points and 17 boards, breaking the previous Illini freshman single-game rebounding record of 16.

Sophomore Giorgi Bezhanishvili scored a season-high 16 points and equaled his season-high with nine rebounds. And fellow sophomore Avo Dosunmu had 16 points on 7-of-15 shooting (6-of-9 on 2s).

Junior Da'Monte Williams also pitched in on the boards, tying his career high with nine rebounds He also had three steals, the most by an Illini on the season.

The Illini dominated Hampton from start to finish, putting on one of the biggest offensive nights in school history at State Farm Center.

The Illini led for the entire 40 minutes, owning the glass and getting out in transition repeatedly. That led to an incredible 42 fastbreak points, accounting for the majority of the UI's 62 points in the paint.

Illinois doubled up the Pirates in the first half in building a 62-31 lead as the Illini went the entire opening 20 minutes without committing a turnover.

The lead continued to grow after intermission to as many as 53 before the final margin of 49 points.

Illinois' 120 points and 45 field goals were its most since Dec. 18, 1993, while its 64.3 field goal percentage (45-70) was its highest since Jan. 6, 2011.

The Illini shared the ball throughout the game, racking up 29 assists which was the highest total for the program since March 11, 2000.

Kofi Cockburn recorded his fifth double-double with 20 points (8-10 FG) and 13 rebounds, and Ayo Dosunmu also scored 20, shooting 9-of-13.

Alan Griffin set a career high with 19 points and tied his career high with six rebounds, and Andres Feliz netted 19 as well.

The Illini blew the game open with an early 21-0 run and led by double figures the rest of the way. After scoring 62 first-half points the last time out vs. Hampton, Illinois topped that effort against Lindenwood, totaling 66 in the opening stanza against Lindenwood to mark the program's most points in a half since Nov. 23, 2001.

Illinois shot 61.9 percent on the night, topping 60 percent in both halves. The Illini offense was efficient in every area, scoring 54 points in the paint and registering season highs of 11 three-pointers and 28 free throws.

Illinois also grabbed a season-high 13 steals while forcing 24 turnovers, converting those extra opportunities into 33 points off turnovers.

Six Illini scored in double figures in a balanced effort. Ayo Dosunmu had 24 points – just one shy of his career high – and set a career best with four steals.

Da'Monte Williams erupted for a career-high 18 points, topping his previous high of 11. Trent Frazier scored a season-high 17 while draining five treys. And Andres Feliz nearly had a double-double with 16 points and a career-high nine assists, the most by an Illini on the season.

A strong second half could not erase a poor start, as the Illini fell at home to Miami in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

Illinois was slow out of the gate, as the Hurricanes quickly built a double-digit lead that later grew to as large as 27 (45-18).

Freshman Kofi Cockburn tied his career high with 23 points, hitting all eight field goal attempts and 7-of-8 from the line.

Junior Trent Frazier scored 14 points and made 4-of-5 from 3-point range.

Also scoring in double figures were sophomore Ayo Dosunmu (12 points) and senior Andres Feliz (11).

#### Game 9 Recap - #3 Maryland 59, Illini 58

Illinois suffered a heartbreaker in College Park, leading nearly the entire way in pursuit for its first road win over a top-3 team in 30 years before falling on a free throw with 2.1 seconds remaining.

Maryland made a 3-pointer on its second possession of the game to take a 3-2 lead, but that would be the last time the Terps held the lead until the final seconds as the Illini controlled the majority of the contest.

Illinois held Maryland without a basket for nearly five minutes, going on a 10-0 spurt to open up an 18-5 lead. Illinois closed the half ahead by 14 after shooting 47.1 percent for its 39 points while holding the hosts to just 25 points on 30.3 percent overall and 21.4 percent from behind the arc.

Maryland tightened up its defense after halftime and awoke the Xfinity Center crowd, but the Illini remained in control, leading 57-50 with three minutes remaining.

The Terps made the plays in crunch time, however. A 3-pointer by Jalen Smith and layup by Donta Scott surrounded missed three attempts by the Illini, making it a 2-point game. **Trent Frazier** then made the first of two free throws to push it to 58-55 with 1:42 remaining.

Both teams came up empty on their next possession, setting up the end. The Illini defended the Terps well, forcing a broken play. But Anthony Cowan rose up from 30+ feet and swished a 3-pointer to tie it at 58-all.

Andres Feliz tried to drive for the win but was stripped and then called for a late foul as the ball came loose. Cowan made the first free throw and purposely missed the second to force an Illini heave beyond halfcourt at the buzzer.

**Trent Frazier** led the Illini in scoring for the first time this season, netting 13 points. **Andres Feliz** also finished in double digits with 11, while **Ayo Dosunmu** and **Kofi Cockburn** added nine apiece.

The Illini got the ball into the lane repeatedly via the post up and the dribble drive, racking up an impressive 44 points in the paint.

Illinois owned the glass, outrebounding the Wolverines 44-to-28. The Illini grabbed 15 boards on the offensive end, which they converted into perhaps the decisive area of the game, a 16-0 advantage in second-chance points.

Four Illini scored in double figures, led once again by **Kofi Cockburn**. The freshman center recorded his sixth double-double of the year with game highs of 19 points and 10 boards (six offensive) to go along with a career-high four blocked shots.

 ${\bf Giorgi\ Bezhanishvili}$  was also effective on the interior, tallying 12 points and eight rebounds.

**Ayo Dosunmu** had 14 points and a season-high eight boards while fellow guard **Andres Feliz** added 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting including the team's only 3-pointer on the night as the Illini earned the victory despite shooting just 1-for-11 from behind the arc.

#### Game 15 Recap - Illini 63, Purdue 37

Illinois recorded the program's 1,800th all-time win with a 26-point victory over Purdue at State Farm Center.

Illinois jumped out to an 11-0 lead, holding the Boilermakers scoreless for nearly the first seven minutes until the drought finally ended on a PU free throw at the 13:09 mark.

The first-half lead grew to as many as 15 at 25-10 on a Kofi Cockburn dunk down the lane. Illinois crashed the offensive glass from the outset, scoring baskets on each of its first five extra opportunities.

Illinois responded to Purdue's second-half rally, making five straight defensive stops after the Boilers had cut it to nine to ignite a 7-0 run over the next 4:47. That gave the Orange and Blue a commanding 48-32 lead with 7:55 left.

The lead then swelled to the final margin of 26 over the final 7:16, as Purdue managed just one basket.

Purdue managed just two field goals and seven points over the final 13-plus minutes. That was a large part of the total defensive effort that saw the Boilers shoot 25% for the game, its lowest percentage in school history.

Purdue's 37 points marked the fewest allowed by an Illini opponent in 12 years, since a 70-37 win over Northwestern on Jan. 27, 2008. It was the fewest points scored by Purdue, meanwhile, since totaling 33 on Jan. 3, 1949.

Alan Griffin recorded his first career double-double, finishing with 16 points on 6-8 FG and a career-high 12 rebounds in just 20 minutes. Trent Frazier reached double figures for the first time in six games, scoring 12 points.

#### Game 16 Recap - Illini 71, Wisconsin 70

Illinois snapped a 15-game losing streak to Wisconsin, catching fire late to stun the Kohl Center crowd in a one-point win while claiming its first victory in Madison since 2010.

The Badgers took control late in the first half and carried the lead until the closing minutes. The Illini trailed 63-56 with less than five minutes remaining, equaling its largest deficit of the game. But that's when the Orange and Blue took over, scoring on six of their final eight possessions and outscoring the Badgers 15-to-7 to the finish.

After a Kofi Cockburn free throw, Alan Griffin hit back-to-back threes to tie the game at 63 with 3:22 left. Wisconsin then went ahead by two before Trent Fra**zier** gave the Illini a 66-65 lead with a baseline triple. A pair of UW free throws exchanged the lead again before Ayo Dosunmu drove the lane and scored on a layup to put the Illini back ahead 68-67.

After a defensive stop, **Dosunmu** then made the biggest play of the game, draining a stepback trey from the top of the key with :46 left that put the Illini up by four, 71-67. The Badgers then cut it to one with a three of their own, setting up the final action.

An Illini missed free throw gave the ball back to the hosts, but D'Mitrik Trice's drive to the basket was thwarted by Giorgi Bezhanishvili, and Alan Griffin grabbed the defensive rebound and threw an outlet pass as the clock expired, ending the streak and securing the Illini it's first win at Kohl Center in 10 years.

**Dosunmu** led the Illini with 18 points and a season-high tying six assists. He scored or assisted on Illinois' final 14 points of the game.

Kofi Cockburn had 15 points and six boards, and Griffin continued his hot play with 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting with three treys.

## Game 17 Recap - Illini 54, Rutgers 51

The Illini came out on top in a low-scoring, physical battle with Rutgers at State Farm Center.

Defense and rebounding carried the day for both teams, with points at a premium. The entire contest was played within a two-possession margin, featuring eight ties and 11 lead changes.

After Rutgers matched its biggest lead of the game early in the second half, the Illini rattled off six unanswered points to tie it at 28. The last 10 minutes alone saw the lead exchange hands seven times, with players on both teams stepping up to make big plays.

Andres Feliz' fourth basket of the second half tied it at 46, and after a Rutgers turnover, Ayo Dosunmu drove to the basket and was fouled, making two free throws to put the Illini up two with 1:34 left.

Another Rutgers turnover gave the ball back to the Illini, and Dosunmu was aggressive once again, driving in for a layup with the shot clock winding down to make it 50-46 with 50 seconds remaining. After a Rutgers miss, it was Dosunmu skying for the defensive rebound and he was fouled, going to the line to drain two more free throws to give the Illini its largest lead of the game at 52-46.

Dosunmu added two more free throws to seal the win, accounting for Illinois' final eight points on the afternoon as the Orange and Blue secured their thirdstraight victory.

Dosunmu had a game-high 18 points to go with seven rebounds. Kofi Cockburn also scored in double figures with 11, but it was his dominance on the glass that stole the show, as he tied his career-high with 17 rebounds, equaling his record for most boards ever by an Illini freshman. Cockburn finished with his seventh double-double of the season, setting another UI freshman record.

## Game 18 Recap - #24 Illini 75, Northwestern 71

Illinois extended its winning streak to four in a row, defeating Northwestern at State Farm Center in front of a season-high crowd of 14,131.

The Orange and Blue had been winning with defense, but this time rode its offense to victory. The Illini shot 50 percent on the day and scored 1.22 pointsper-possession, its best number recorded against a high-major opponent this season.

And the Illini needed every one of those points, as Northwestern proved difficult to put away in a game that featured 11 lead changes and six ties.

Illinois led 60-58 at the under-8 media timeout then scored seven unanswered on a dunk by Kofi Cockburn, a layup by Ayo Dosunmu and a 3-pointer by Giorgi Bezhanishvili. That pivotal run put the Illini ahead by nine with five minutes remaining.

In closing time it was once again **Dosunmu** making plays for the Fighting Illini. Leading by three, he hit a crossover jumper from the top of the key with 18.1 seconds remaining to give the Illini a 73-68 lead. And after a Wildcats 3-pointer cut it to two, **Dosunmu** was fouled on the inbounds and drained two free throws with just 7.7 seconds left to put the Illini ahead by four and seal the win.

**Dosunmu** finished with 15 points and a game-high six assists.

Trent Frazier had a big game, leading the Illini with 16 points and making four 3-pointers. He also reached a milestone against the Wildcats, hitting a trey with 1:36 left before halftime that marked his 1,000th career point.

Bezhanishvili also had a breakout offensive performance, scoring 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting. **Cockburn** had 12 points and game-high seven rebounds and Andres Feliz added 10 off the bench as the Illini had five players score in double figures for the first time in Big Ten play.

The Illini had one of their best road performances in years, and that's what it took to earn a victory at Purdue to end the Orange and Blue's 11-year skid in West Lafayette and snap the Boilermakers 15-game Big Ten home winning streak.

Illinois started strong, jumping out to a 14-7 lead. Purdue answered with seven unanswered to tie it and the rest of the half was back and forth until the closing seconds when the Boilers first three of the game to take a 30-29 lead into the halftime.

Kofi Cockburn was dominant, registering his eighth double-double of the season with game highs of 22 points and 15 rebounds.

Trent Frazier scored a season-high 21 points on just seven shot attempts, going 5-for-7 from three 6-of-6 at the foul line.

**Dosunmu** tallied his first career double-double with 18 points and a career-high 11 assists, the most by an Illini in the last years.

Illinois shot an amazing 75% in the second half to end the game at 55.1%, its highest percentage in a road game since 2011. The Illini also controlled the glass by a +18 margin (37-19).

Ayo Dosunmu's jumper with five-tenths of a second remaining took down Michi-

gan, extending Illinois' win streak to six and giving the Orange and Blue their

#### Game 22 Recap - #18 Iowa 72, #19 Illini 65

Illinois put itself in contention for another road win, but the Hawkeyes controlled the last five minutes to claim victory and snap the Illini seven-game win streak.

Illinois broke a 15-all tie by scoring eight unanswered to open up its largest lead of the afternoon. The hosts quickly responded with an 8-0 run of its own, and from that point on nearly the entire remainder of the game was played within a two-possession margin.

There were 14 lead changes — most in an Illinois game this season — and eight ties. The Illini rattled off five straight on a deep 3-pointer by **Trent Frazier** followed by an offensive rebound basket by **Andres Feliz** to take a 59-55 lead with 5:28 remaining, forcing an lowa timeout.

The hosts responded with the next six points before **Feliz** ended the run with a 3-pointer to put the Orange and Blue back up, 62-61 at the 4-minute mark.

Crunch time belonged to the home team, as the Hawkeyes rolled off nine unanswered, with the pivotal points coming on 3-pointers by Connor McCaffery and Luka Garza with the shotclock expiring. Illinois managed just one basket in the last four minutes.

Illinois' defense allowed 50 percent shooting for the first time in 14 games.

Andres Feliz led the Illini in scoring for the second straight game, finishing with 17 points on 6-of-11 from the field. **Trent Frazier** added 12 points and hit a trio of 3-pointers, while **Avo Dosunmu** also scored in double figures with 11.

#### Game 23 Recap - #9 Maryland 75, #20 Illinois 66

Illinois dropped its first conference home game of the season, falling 75-66 to No. 9 Maryland in the first-ever Friday night Big Ten game held at State Farm Center.

The Illini fed off the energy of the sold out crowd right out of the gate, going on a 13-0 run to build a 17-7 lead just five minutes in. Illinois made five of its first seven 3-point shots and built its lead to as many as 14 points on two occasions, the latter at 31-17 with nine minutes left in the half.

But Maryland then surged to the break, outscoring the Illini 23-11 the rest of the way to head into intermission trailing by just two (42-40).

After the Illini opened the second half with a pair of free throws, the Terrapins went on a 13-0 run of their own to take a 53-44 lead. Illinois could not buy a basket, missing 17 of its first 18 attempts during the first nearly 11 minutes of the second half.

But the Orange and Blue kept guarding to stay within striking distance. An Ayo **Dosunmu** layup followed by consecutive **Alan Griffin** 3-pointers pulled the Illini within 56-55 with eight minutes to go.

A critical Illini turnover in the backcourt after a defensive rebound led to a Darryl Morsell open trey to put the Terps up four, and after a Kofi Cockburn free throw, Eric Ayala hit another three to give Maryland a six-point lead. The Illini could get no closer than five over the last five minutes as the Terps closed out the win to snap the UI's seven-game home win streak.

The Illini struggled around the basket and on free throws, two uncharacteristic areas. Illinois managed just 35.9 percent on 2-pointers (14-39) and 58.3% at the foul line (14-24). Illinois grabbed 14 offensive rebounds and held a 17-to-4 advantage in second-chance points. But Maryland negated that by pushing in transition off its defensive boards, leading to a 21-to-3 edge in fast-break points.

Ayo Dosunmu led the Illini with 16 points while Andres Feliz added 12.

#### Game 23 Recap - Michigan State 70, #22 Illinois 69

Illinois staged one of the greatest comebacks in school history before suffering heartbreak in the closing seconds, falling to Michigan State 70-69 at State Farm Center.

The first half belonged to the Spartans, who scored the game's first eight points and led by as many as 19 before taking a 37-20 lead into the locker room.

After a sluggish first 20 minutes on offense, the Illini came out clicking following intermission, making seven of their first 11 shots. But MSU was still scoring on the other end, taking its largest lead of the night at 43-23 and still holding a 17-point lead with 12 minutes remaining.

That's when Illinois took over, surging back behind strong defense and an electric crowd pushing the team along. The Illini reeled off 10 unanswered to cut the deficit to seven. The Orange and Blue then scored 12 of the next 16, taking their first lead of the game at 61-60 on an **Ayo Dosunmu** layup with 5:27 to go. That capped a 22-4 run over six minutes that brought the State Farm Center to its feet.

The lead would change hands seven times over the final five minutes, with each team answering the other. Kofi Cockburn made the biggest free throws of his young career, draining a pair with 19.1 seconds left to put the Illini ahead 69-68.

Cassius Winston drove the lane on MSU's final possession, missing a runner that only drew backboard. It was cleaned up by Xavier Tillman, who ran down the lane and dunked it with six seconds left to put the Spartans up by one.

Illinois had one last chance, but after racing up court, **Dosunmu** slipped while attempting to make a move and lost control of the ball, crashing to the floor as the clock expired.

**Dosunmu** led the Illini with 17 points and a career-high nine rebounds. **Andres** Feliz scored 15, and Cockburn added 11 points and eight boards.

#### Game 25 Recap - Rutgers 72, #22 Illinois 57

Playing for the first time this season without leading scorer and playmaker Ayo Dosunmu, the Illini battled for the first 26 minutes before running out of steam, falling at Rutgers as the Scarlet Knights remained undefeated (17-0) on their homecourt.

There were two changes in the starting lineup, with Andres Feliz moving from his usual 6th-man role in place of Dosunmu, and Alan Griffin earning his first start of the season, and second of his career.

The Illini went on a 10-1 run early in the game to take a 14-10 lead, and later cut a five-point deficit to just two at the half. The second half started off much the same way as the first half was played, with the teams exchanging baskets.

A 3-pointer by **Andres Feliz** pulled the Illini within 43-42 with 14 minutes left. But Rutgers then went on the first sizable run for either team, scoring 11 unanswered to extend its lead to 54-42.

Illinois cut that deficit nearly in half, drawing to 54-47. The Knights answered with another run, this time 9-2 to push it back to 63-49 at the 3:00 mark. That made it a 20-7 advantage for Rutgers in an 11-minute stretch which decided the game.

Illinois had trouble shooting against Rutgers once again, finishing 31.1% from the field (19-61) and 28.6% from 3-point land (8-28) while equaling its season high with 28 attempts from long distance. Rutgers, meanwhile, made 49.1%on the afternoon (27-55) and 46.7% from three (7-15). Illinois had only 11 turnovers, but the hosts took advantage, converting those into 19 points.

Griffin led the team in scoring for the third time this season, finishing with 14 points. Kofi Cockburn recorded his 10th double-double of the season with 10 and 10, and Andres Feliz reached double digits for the sixth straight game with 10 points.
