Rutgers opened this season 63rd in the ratings & moved up 39 spots, to No. 22, a record-high for the program since the ratings debuted in 2002.

**OPENING TIP:** Rutgers plays its second of three road games over four contests to conclude its regular season at No. 16/14 Penn State. The Scarlet Knights will work for their fourth ranked victory of the season with an opportunity to sweep the home-and-home series with the Nittany Lions after a 72-61 win at The RAC on Jan. 7. RU earned its first ever series sweep since joining the Big Ten earlier this season over Nebraska. Rutgers also has an opportunity to earn its most conference wins (10) since 1990-91 (14-4; A-10). RU's three remaining opponents boast an average NCAA Net ranking of 23.6.

The Scarlet Knights' remaining schedule ranks first in difficulty per the ESPN BPI. Rutgers is the nation's only team with its final five regular season games all designated as Quadrant 1 opportunities.

Geo Baker became the 44th RU player to reach 1,000 career points when he surpassed the milestone via 16 points at Wisconsin on Sunday. The team tri-captain has averaged 16.4 points over his last five games. Ron Harper Jr., who scored a game-high 21 points against the Badgers, has averaged 16.0 points over the last five games.

**THE OPPONENT:** Penn State has earned its most regular season victories during the nine-year tenure of head coach Pat Chambers and is 13-2 at home this season. PSU leads the Big Ten in steals (7.9) and is 18th nationally in blocks (5.0). Senior Lamar Stevens is seventh nationally among active players with 2,145 career points, while senior Mike Watkins ranks second and seventh among active NCAA players with 263 blocks and 935 rebounds, respectively. Stevens is currently fourth among the conference leaders in scoring (18.0), while junior guard Jamari Wheeler is atop the Big Ten in steals (1.63). No. 25 in the NCAA Net rankings, the Nittany Lions have seven quadrant one victories this season, including a home win over Maryland and a road victory at Michigan State.

**THE SERIES:** Wednesday marks the 76th meeting in a series dating back to 1922, with the Scarlet Knights looking for their 35th win, including their 13th on the road. RU has won three its last five against PSU, including two of the last three at the Bryce Jordan Center. Earlier this season, Rutgers overcame a 10-point first half deficit, shooting 51.7 percent after the break, to defeat No. 20 Penn State 72-61 at a sold-out

RAC. Ron Harper Jr. scored a game-high 22 points, as RU deposited a season-high 22 free throws and issued nine blocks, its most ever in a Big Ten game.

## Scarlet Knight Notables

- Steve Pikiell is one of 15 coaches named to the Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year Late 2020 Season Watch List.
- RU joined the rankings for the first time since the final 1978-79 AP Poll (No. 18). The Scarlet Knight were No. 24/25 & No. 25/25 in the Jan. 20 & 27th polls, respectively.
- RU has earned nine conference wins for the first time since 1998-98 (9-9; Big East).
- RU has ensured its first winning season since 2005-06 (19-14).
- Rutgers has tied its record for home wins (17) in a season and boasted the nation's best home record at a perfect 17-0. RU has a +14.3 scoring margin, a +8.6 rebounding advantage and has limited visitors to .365 shooting at the RAC.
- RU has sold-out a record 10 games at the RAC, including the final nine of the regular season. RU welcomed 8,329 fans vs. Seton Hall, its largest crowd in 18 seasons.
- Rutgers is 12th nationally in FG% defense (38.4), 16th in rebounding (40.07), 18th in scoring defense (62.6), 22nd in rebound margin (+6.3) and 34th in blocks (4.6).
- RU leads the Big Ten in scoring defense.
- Myles Johnson is 17th nationally in offensive rebound percentage (14.8) and 2nd in the league during conference games (13.5).
- Akwasi Yeboah is one of 26 active players with 1,500 points and 600 rebounds.
- Rutgers is a young squad, ranking 243rd in experience per Pomeroy.
- RU has claimed three ranked victories for the first time since the 2001-02 campaign.
- RU's 20-point win over No. 22 Seton Hall on Dec. 14 was its largest margin of victory over a ranked foe in program history.
- Rutgers was 4-0 against pro club teams during a tour of Spain in August. RU outscored its opponents 387-284 and had five players average double figures.

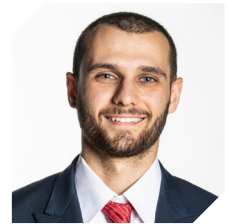

## **PIKIELL ON NAISMITH LATE SEASON WATCH LIST**

Steve Pikiell is one of 15 men's basketball coaches on the Werner Ladder Naismith Coach of the Year Late 2020 Season Watch List, released Feb. 21 by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. In his fourth season "On the Banks," Pikiell has led the Scarlet Knights to numerous achievements in 2019-20, including the program's first national ranking in 41 years. Rutgers was nationally ranked for consecutive weeks in both the AP and Coaches Polls on Jan. 20 and Jan. 27 after last being selected in the final AP Poll of the 1978-79 season (No. 18). The Scarlet Knights' 18 regular season victories are their most since 2001-02 (18) and nine Big Ten Conference wins their most in league play since 1998-99 (9-9, Big East).

RU began its home season with a nation's best 17-0 record to set the program mark for its best home start, while tying the team record for most home victories in a season (17-1; 1977-78). Rutgers has sold-out a record 10 games at the RAC, including the final nine of the regular season. Nicknamed the "Trapezoid of Terror" by the fan base, the 8,000-seat venue has helped the Scarlet Knights earn three double-digit victories over ranked opponents in 2019-20.

A Bristol (Conn.) native with 28 years of coaching experience, Pikiell has ensured Rutgers' first winning season on the hardwood since 2005-06 (19-14). Under his direction, the Scarlet Knights have earned multiple ranked wins in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2001-02 and 2002-03 campaigns. In 2018-19, RU was recognized as the nation's Most Improved Team by Sports Illustrated after the Scarlet Knights improved 70 positions in the KenPom rankings, best among all power conference programs.

The Naismith Men's and Women's College Coach of the Year Awards were established in 1987 and were originally given to the coaches of the men's and women's NCAA Division I Tournament Champions. In 1989, the governing board changed the selection criteria to the voting process used today in which the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors first votes to compile a top 25 list of coaches for each award. Then, through additional votes, the list is narrowed down to four and finally, the national winner.

## **QUADRANT 1/3**

Forget Quad 1, Rutgers men's basketball is playing 90% of its Big Ten games away from the RAC in Quad 1/3. Quadrant 1 is defined as games with an opponent NCAA NET ranking of 30 or better at home, 50 or better at a neutral site, and 75 or better on the road. The Scarlet Knights are the nation's only team with their final five regular season games all designated as Quadrant 1 opportunities.

On the road in conference, other than Rutgers' game at Nebraska, the nine games are against opponents with Net rankings of 36 or lower. Collectively, the teams boast an average NCAA Net score of 24.0, placing them in the top third of the Quad 1 road game parameters. Including Nebraska, the average NET of RU's Big Ten opponents on the road is 40.2.

## **PACK THE RAC**

The Scarlet Knights have sold-out a program-record 10 games this season at the RAC. RU has hosted capacity crowds versus No. 22 Seton Hall (Dec. 14), No. 20 Penn State (Jan. 7), Indiana (Jan. 15), Minnesota (Jan. 19), Nebraska (Jan. 25), Purdue (Jan. 28), Northwestern (Feb. 9), Illinois (Feb. 15) and Michigan (Feb. 19), as well as the Senior Knight game against Maryland (March 3). Rutgers streak of nine consecutive sold-out games is also a program record. Last season, RU had five sell-outs, its most since 2004-05 (7). The RAC has been sold-out 17 times in the past three seasons. The prior 17 sell-outs spanned 11 seasons, from 2004-05 to 2014-15.

## **TRAPEZOID OF TERROR**

Rutgers began the home season with a nation's best 17 wins at The RAC prior to the Michigan loss. The mark signaled RU's best home start to a season. The 1975-76 Final Four team boasted an undefeated regular season, but played only 10 home games at the College Avenue Gym. The most home wins prior to this season was also 17 (17-1) in 1977-78, the season the RAC opened. The 17 home wins remain the most in the nation. Louisiana and South Dakota State are second with 16

## **BUILDING A RESUME**

Rutgers has a strong resume in the NCAA metrics, at 34th in the NET. RU has seven wins versus Quad 1 + Quad 2 opponents, defeating Seton Hall (17), Penn State (25), Wisconsin (29), Illinois (35), Purdue (36), Minnesota (42) and Indiana (52). The Scarlet Knights are the nation's only team with their final five regular season games all designated as Quadrant 1 opportunities.

## **BUILT ON DEFENSE**

Rutgers has built a legacy of tough defense under head coach Steve Pikiell. After Pikiell inherited a team that ranked 236th the season prior in Ken Pom's adjusted defense metric, he raised that number 166 spots the following season. RU has rated among the top-50 in the nation ever since. Currently, the program ranks 12th nationally in adjusted defense. Rutgers ranks first in the Big Ten in scoring defense (62.2), and second in field goal percentage defense (38.4). Five of the seven lowest ever field goal percentages against RU in Big Ten play have come this season.

## **HISTORIC START**

As this season has progressed, the Scarlet Knight have eclipsed some historic markers for success along the way.

- Earned first national ranking in 41 years, since concluding 1978-79 No. 18 in the AP Poll.
- 17-0 home start was best in the nation and tops in program history.
- 17 home wins ties for the most (17-1; 1977-78) in a season in program history.
- Have sold-out 10 home games at the RAC, the most in program history.
- 12-3 start was its best through 15 games since the 1975-76 undefeated regular season.
- Held opponents to 65 points or fewer in nine straight games, RU's longest stretch in 70 years, since 1949-50 season.
- Opened conference play 3-1 for the first time since 1994-95 (4-1) as a member of the Atlantic 10.
- Four games over .500 in conference play (7-3) for the first time in 21 years, since the 1998-99 Big East campaign (9-5).
- Defeated three ranked teams, its most ranked wins since 2001-02 (4).
- Defeated three ranked teams by double digits for the first time in school history.
- Clinched its first winning season since 2005-06 (19-14).
- Earned nine conference wins for first time since 1998-98 (9-9; Big East).
- Earned its largest comeback victory in 24 years, overcoming an 18-point deficit to defeat Northwestern at the RAC on Feb. 9.
- Have earned multiple ranked wins in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2001-02 and 2002-03 campaigns.

## PERFORMING IN THE CLASSROOM

Rutgers entered the spring semester with a team cumulative GPA of 3.04, an APR score of 984 (4th in the conference) and a GSR score of 82. In each of the past three semesters, over half of the roster earned GPAs of 3.0. This fall, 60% of the roster reached above a 3.0 for the semester, led by Akwasi Yeboah with a 3.667 semester GPA. Every student-athlete on the roster now holds a cumulative GPA above 2.50 and 53% of roster has cumulative GPA above 3.00. The team has continued to improve, as from the fall of 2018 to fall of 2019, the team's term GPA improved by 0.228 and the cumulative GPA improved 0.167

The program was recognized with two Dean's List honorees last spring (Joey Downes and Myles Johnson). Downes was named a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar for 2018-2019 and was recently inducted into Chi Alpha Sigma – the National Scholar Athlete Honor Society.

## RUTGERS MOURNS PASSING OF ALUM DAVID STERN

David J. Stern, a Dean's List history student and a Henry Rutgers Scholar at Rutgers who became the National Basketball Association's longest-serving commissioner, passed away on Jan. 1 at the age of 77. A 1963 graduate of The State University of New Jersey who was inducted into the school's Hall of Distinguished Alumni in 1999 and served on its Board of Overseers, Stern was instrumental in the NBA's growth into a global powerhouse.

"We are all deeply saddened by the passing of Commissioner Stern," said Director of Athletics Pat Hobbs. "We extend our deepest sympathies to Dianne and his family. I will forever treasure his guidance and counsel, and his humor. He was a very proud Rutgers alum. His was a remarkable life." Rutgers before earning his law degree from Columbia University in 1966.

## UTILIZING THE LATEST TRAINING TECHNOLOGIES

Assistant Athletics Director-Strength and Conditioning David VanDyke and Athletic trainer Rich Campbell have made a significant impact on the health and well-being of men's basketball student-athletes. In their initial three seasons, men's basketball players had been sidelined a total of 17 combined games due to injury. The Scarlet Knights had three total games missed among players in 2018-19, 11 in 2017-18 and three in 2016-17.

Rutgers strives to implement the latest technologies to benefit its programs and student-athletes. In that effort, men's basketball utilizes Sparta Science,

Catapault, Polar Team Pro and GymAware. Sparta Science provides an objective measure of how players react to gravity with validated scientific assessments and provides evidence-based training prescriptions. Catapult replaces laboratory-based performance testing with microtechnology to obtain actionable data in real time regarding performance. Polar Team Pro provides real-time heart rate data to make objective decisions. GymAware is the gold standard Linear Positional Transducer (LPT with angle measurement) for measuring performance, implementing Velocity Based Training and monitoring power.

Before and after every season, men's basketball welcomes BAM (Basic Athletic Measurement) to the RAC to conduct player testing. A team of strength and conditioning coaches and technology professionals who utilize the most reliable methods and precise measuring tools, BAM has conducted the NBA Draft combine since 2009. Results are registered to a BAMScore™, a proprietary index for reliably measuring athletic performance, and placed in a requisite category. As a result, players receive the information necessary to gauge personal and professional aspirations.

### HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

The 2019-20 season marks the 100th anniversary of the 1919-20 team, the first Rutgers basketball team to play in a postseason tournament. The team played in the National Amateur Athletic Union basketball tournament in Atlanta, the lone national postseason tournament at the time, and finished as runner-up. The squad was inducted into the Rutgers Athletics Hall of Fame in October as part of the class of 2019.
