STORYLINES

Up To Bat

- Penn State baseball continues its six-game road trip with three games at Miami (Ohio) starting Thursday at 4 p.m., Friday at 2 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m.
- The Thursday and Friday games were originally scheduled for 6 and 5 p.m., respectively, but were moved earlier due to expected inclement weather.

Pitching Prowess

- Penn State enters the weekend ranking fourth in the NCAA with a 0.98 WHIP and also fourth with a 1.93 team ERA. The Nittany Lions also rank 11th with 6.01 hits allowed per nine innings and 21st with a 3.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio. All figures lead the Big Ten.
- RHP **Bailey Dees** ranks third in the Big Ten with a 1.14 ERA and second with a 0.76 WHIP.
- RHP **Conor Larkin** ranks eighth in the Big Ten with a 1.68 ERA and seventh with 28 strikeouts.

Stealing Bases

- Penn State has stolen 32 bases on 33 attempts (97.0 percent) this season, ranking the Nittany Lions second to only Charleston Southern (37-for-38; 97.4 percent) in success rate with as many stolen base attempts.
- Penn State's 32 stolen bases rank 19th in the NCAA, and its 2.29 stolen bases rank 11th. Both figures lead the Big Ten.
- Penn State's 2.29 stolen bases per game is a record pace. Penn State's record total is 91 set in 2000.
- Penn State is only 16 stolen bases shy of last year's total of 48.

Offense Clicking

- Penn State is among the conference leaders offensively, ranking second in batting average (.295), on-base percentage (.402), slugging (.430), triples (7), doubles (30), and walks (77). The Nittany Lions are also third in scoring (7.1 runs/game) and runs (99).
- Gavin Homer** is batting .429 to rank fifth in the Big Ten and 34th in the NCAA, while his .529 on-base percentage ranks third in the Big Ten and 32nd in the NCAA, and .738 slugging percentage ranks second in the conference and 36th in the NCAA. His 17 RBIs also rank second in the Big Ten.
- Homer is on a seven-game hitting streak and has a team-best seven multi-hit games.
- Homer and **Curtis Robison** have six doubles each to rank fifth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State leads the Big Ten and ranks 14th in the NCAA with a .425 on-base percentage.
- Johnny Piacentino leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth in the NCAA with a .607 on-base percentage, while Gavin Homer ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 29th in the NCAA with a .568 on-base percentage.

No-Hitter

- RHP **Bailey Dees**, LHP **Tyler Shingledecker** and RHP **Mason Mellott** held Navy hitless for 10.1 innings for the first combined no-hitter and first extra-inning no-hitter in program history.
- The no-hitter was the 10th in Penn State history and first since Steven Hill no-hit Iowa in 2012.
- However, Navy drew five walks, moved base runners and took advantage of late errors to scratch across two runs for a one-run victory.

PROGRAM NOTES

First Varsity Sport

Baseball was Penn State's first varsity sport, playing its first games in 1875.

Team No. 132

Penn State is playing its 132nd baseball season in program history.

Five College World Series Appearances

Penn State has made five trips to the College World Series, placing as high as second in 1957. The Nittany Lions reached the CWS in 1952, 1957, 1959, 1963 and 1973. Penn State has reached the NCAA Tournament 19 times.

1996 Big Ten Champions

The 2016 season marked the 20th anniversary of Penn State's first Big Ten Championship.

Nittany Lions in the Pros

According to Baseball-Almanac.com, 27 Nittany Lions have gone on to play Major League Baseball. A total of 79 have been drafted.

Eight Nittany Lions are currently in Major League organizations. Two 2016 draft picks are entering their fifth pro seasons: Pitcher Jack Anderson is in the Seattle Mariners organization and infielder Jim Haley is in the Tampa Bay Rays organization. A 2017 draft pick, pitcher Sal Biasi, is entering his fourth season and is also with the Mariners organization. Justin Hagenman, who was tabbed by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2018 June, enters his third season, while free agent signee pitcher Taylor Lehman does the same with the Philadelphia Phillies. Penn State had three join the pro ranks last season as LHP Dante Biasi (Royals), RHP Eric Mock (Indians) and C Ryan Sloniger (Blue Jays) were all drafted and signed.

Nittany Lions in Cuba

Penn State participated in a weeklong, four-game tour of Cuba, Nov. 21-28, 2015. The Nittany Lions went 1-3 in the "Cuba Baseball Friendship Tournament." The Lions played against teams from Cuba's top "professional" league, the National Series, becoming the first United States team to play multiple teams from the league and the first to earn a victory.

The team also participated in lectures about Cuban baseball, Jose Marti and the history of Cuban sports and U.S. relations.

Medlar Field at Lubrano Park

Situated in the shadow of Beaver Stadium, the facility -- completed in June of 2006 -- is arguably one of the premier collegiate stadiums in the country.

The ballpark's signature is the breathtaking view of legendary Mt. Nittany, a local landmark that is near and dear to the heart of every Penn Stater. With the stadium opening to the east, spectators can peer unencumbered down the Nittany Valley for miles and on a clear day Tussey Mountain Ski Resort can be seen from 10 miles away.

Seating capacity for Medlar Field is 5,406 and 20 luxury suites allow area companies to treat clients and friends to an unmatched baseball experience. A party deck along the right field line provides a good place for friends to gather and the picnic pavilion beyond the left field fence is perfect for birthday parties and group outings.

Much like the rest of the park, the dimensions of the playing field are unique as well. A relatively short 325 feet to the left field pole stretches out to the deepest part of the park, the 410 foot nook in left center field. Straightaway center is 399 feet and the 320 foot right field fence is made more daunting with an 18.55 feet high wall, which commemorates the year Penn State was founded.

A 2,500 square foot press box can accommodate traveling and local media and has private broadcast booths for up to three radio teams. A large video scoreboard towers above the left field wall capable of providing up to the minute stats and video replays.

The stadium is named for 1982 Penn State graduate Anthony Lubrano and former Nittany Lion Head Coach Charles "Chuck" Medlar. Lubrano chose to honor Coach Medlar with a generous financial gift toward the realization of the long-discussed project. Coach Medlar served at the helm of the Penn State program for 19 years and guided the Lions to two College World Series appearances.

Did you know?

O.J. McDuffie is mostly known for his stellar career on the gridiron for Penn State and in the NFL, but he also played baseball in 1990. He stole 20 bases (t-3rd, single season-school history) on 21 attempts (96 percent clip), hit .336 and had a .969 fielding percentage. He was drafted by the California Angels in the 41st round of the 1991 MLB June Amateur Draft.

SERIES NOTES

All-Time vs. Miami (Ohio)

Penn State and Miami (Ohio) faced each other three times at neutral sites in Florida in 1998, with the Redhawks taking two of three. trails in the short all-time series against Miami (Ohio), 2-1. This marks the first time Penn State will travel to Miami (Ohio).

Scouting Miami (Ohio)

Miami is off to a 7-7 start this season, sweeping Milwaukee over the weekend, but falling at Wright State Tuesday, 16-5. The RedHawks were tabbed to finish fourth in the MAC in the preseason poll coaches' poll.

Head Coach Danny Hayden

Danny Hayden returns for his seventh season in charge of the Miami baseball program. Prior to being named the 16th head coach of Miami baseball in 2013, Hayden spent five years in various coaching roles, including with the RedHawks from 2008-2010. He was an assistant coach with Xavier University from 2010-2013. As an undergraduate, Hayden was a catcher on the 2004 RedHawk team played his final three seasons at Xavier. He was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 47th round of the 2008 MLB draft.

Touching Home

- Penn State's 81 runs scored in the first 10 games of the year were its most since scoring 105 runs in the first 10 games of the 2000 season.
- Penn State scored 10 or more runs four times in the first 10 games of the season, doing so for the first time since scoring double-digits six times in the first 10 games of the 2000 season.
- Penn State scored 10 or more runs four times all of last season.

Hit Parade

- In the first three weeks of the season Penn State has posted two of its highest hit totals in recent years.
- Penn State's 19 hits against Princeton (2/28) were its most since totaling the same at Houston Baptist on March 9, 2013.
- Penn State's 18 hits against Monmouth (2/16) were its most in a game since also totaling 18 against Rutgers on May 2, 2015.

Walk-Off

- Penn State closed its series with Wagner on a walk-off, three-run home run by Curtis Robison.
- It was Penn State's first walk-off win since defeating UMass Lowell on a Ryan Ford single on Mar. 17, 2019.
- It was Penn State's first walk-off home run since Gavin Homer slugged one over the fence at the USA Baseball NTC on Feb. 24, 2019 to down Fairfield.
- It was Penn State's first extra inning win since defeating Rutgers in the 11th inning on May 4, 2019.

Mellott on Stopper of the Year Watch List

- Junior RHP Mason Mellott was named to the initial watch list for the 16th Annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award.
- The award is annually given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Mellott was one of six Big Ten pitchers and 70 overall to be placed on the preseason watch list.
- Mellott ranks tied for sixth on Penn State's career saves list (Jeff Emerlich, 1993-96) with nine after posting five last season. He was one of the most crucial members of the Nittany Lion pitching staff in 2019, totaling 63.0 innings in relief and posting a 2.43 ERA that led the team and ranked third in the Big Ten. Mellott also led the team with six wins, which were the most by a Penn State reliever since at least 2004. He also ranked among the top-10 in the conference with 2.00 walks allowed per nine innings (5th), a 3.71 strikeout-to-walk ratio (9th) and a 1.16 WHIP (10th).

At the Plate

- Penn State returns Big Ten All-Freshman third baseman **Justin Williams**. Last season, Williams made his presence in the lineup felt during his first career start at Pittsburgh in mid-March, going 3-for-5 with a double and four RBIs. He finished the year tied for the team lead in home runs with four, and batted .262 with five doubles, a triple and 18 RBIs. Williams flashed his potential with a 445-foot home run against Lafayette in April and a 12-game reached-base streak from late April through early May. During the streak, Williams led the team with a .442 on-base percentage, .333 batting average, eight runs, 14 hits, two home runs, .548 slugging percentage, 23 total bases and nine walks.
- OF/IF **Mac Hippenhammer** boasts the top returning batting average. He batted .272 in 2019 with a .350 on-base percentage, four doubles, two triples and eight RBIs in 39 games (35 starts).

The 2020 Slate

- The 56-game schedule includes six opponents that participated in the 2019 NCAA Baseball tournament, including College World Series finalist Michigan. The Wolverines will visit Medlar Field at Lubrano Park Apr. 17-19, as will NCAA Regional teams Indiana (Apr. 3-5), West Virginia (Apr. 28) and Illinois (May 1-3). Penn State will also play at Nebraska (May 8-10) and Creighton (May 12).
- Power Five non-conference match-ups include a home-and-home series against Pittsburgh (Mar. 24 [H] & Apr. 7 [A]), a visit from West Virginia (Apr. 28) and a three-game series at Arizona (May 14-16)
- Penn State plays eight Big Ten series, opening its conference slate at Northwestern (Mar. 20-22) and its home conference slate the following weekend against Iowa (Mar. 27-29).

Head Coach

The 2020 baseball season is Rob Cooper's seventh as head coach of the Nittany Lion baseball program. Cooper was selected as the 14th head baseball coach in Penn State history on August 9, 2013. Not shy about stating his ultimate goal of returning Penn State to Omaha in June, the Lions have made significant strides under his leadership.

Under his tutelage, seven players have been drafted and eight total have signed with MLB teams in the last four seasons. However, his strong belief in the first part of the term "student-athlete" is perhaps the top reason he has proven to be an excellent fit at Penn State. Even with state-of-the-art facilities, the chance to take on elite competition and a program history that includes five trips to the College World Series, Cooper cites the value of a Penn State degree as one of the top reasons to play baseball at Penn State.

The 2019 season concluded with Penn State's largest draft class since 2012, headlined by Dante Biasi's selection in the sixth round by the Kansas City Royals. Biasi became the highest-selected left-handed pitcher in Penn State history, the highest-selected Nittany Lion pitcher overall since 2008 and the highest-selected Nittany Lion overall since 2010. Eric Mock was also drafted, becoming the fifth Penn State pitcher in the last four years to get drafted, while Ryan Sloniger became the 14th player to get drafted in Cooper's head coaching career, including his time at the helm of Wright State. During a successful nine-year stint as the head coach at Wright State, seven of his players were drafted, including eventual Major Leaguer Joe Smith, and 12 more signed professional free agent contracts.

Biasi was the leader of Penn State's starting rotation in 2019, earning a place on the 2019 All-Big Ten Second Team. He posted a 2.55 earned run average with 102 strikeouts in 74.0 innings over 14 starts. His 6.32 hits allowed per nine innings were the fewest in the conference, his ERA ranked fourth in the Big Ten, and he was one of the top strikeout pitchers during the regular season, ranking second in the Big Ten, 33rd nationally and fifth in a single-season in Penn State history. His 12.41 strikeouts per inning also ranked second in the Big Ten.

Behind Biasi, Penn State improved its win total by seven from the prior season, including a win over No. 21 Duke. The Nittany Lions also excelled in the classroom with 15 earning Academic All-Big Ten honors, tying a program record and tying for second overall in the conference.

In 2018, Justin Hagenman joined Sal Biasi, Jim Haley and Jack Anderson as recent Nittany Lion draft selections, while fellow pitcher and Cooper's first Penn State recruit signee, Taylor Lehman, signed as a free agent with the Phillies. Before Anderson's selection in 2016, just one Penn State pitcher had been taken in the previous six years. A member of Cooper's first full recruiting class, Sal Biasi led Penn State during the 2017 season, earning All-Big Ten second team honors following a career year with 88 strikeouts - the most by a Nittany Lion pitcher since 2009 and tied for the ninth-most in a single-season all-time at Penn State.

Penn State baseball's trip to Cuba prior to the 2016 season is perhaps the best example of Cooper's commitment to the first part of the "student-athlete" term. The Nittany Lions attended academic lectures and toured Havana, becoming the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. team at any level to defeat a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division I baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba. The harmony between academics and athletics was on full display, as multiple Penn State professors and a group of journalism students also joined the travel party.

The rare, once-in-a-lifetime experience helped bring a young Penn State team together, and the Lions went on to earn their first winning record (overall and in conference) since 2012. The starting lineup included at least three freshmen in all but six games and five to six freshmen in 19 games, and took on nine eventual NCAA tournament teams, including a three-game series at home against College World Series participant TCU. The Lions' 28 wins were a 10-win improvement over the previous season, and its 12 Big Ten wins doubled the 2015 total. Haley and Anderson were the first drafted out of Penn State since 2012, and Anderson and senior outfielder Greg Guers became the program's first All-Big Ten picks also since 2012. Pitcher Justin Hagenman became Penn State's first Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American since 1997.

The Lions started making gains during Cooper's second season in Happy Valley in 2015. Penn State played 10 games against top-25 opponents and rallied from a 7-0 deficit against No. 21 Indiana for their first win over a ranked opponent in three seasons. Penn State ultimately won one more conference game than the year before, despite the Big Ten enjoying arguably its most competitive season to date with a league-record five teams earning NCAA tournament bids.

Shortly after Cooper accepted the PSU head coaching position in 2014, the California native traveled to Taichung, Taiwan to serve as the head coach of USA Baseball's 18U National Team at the IBAF U18 World Cup. Cooper steered Team USA to an 8-1 record in World Cup play, including seven consecutive victories to win the gold medal.

Not long after the triumph in Taiwan, Cooper received one of the highest honors bestowed in the profession, as he was announced as the Rod Dedeaux USA Baseball Coach of the Year. With the honor, Cooper became just the 16th individual in the award's history to receive the accolade, joining the likes of Scott Brosius, Davey Johnson and Tommy Lasorda.

Cooper was also a member of the coaching staff for the 2007 and 2009 USA College National teams. The 2007 team earned a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Fourteen of the 20 players on the 2007 team reached the Major Leagues, including 2013 All-Star Pedro Alvarez. Fourteen of the 22 members of the 2009 team also reached the Major Leagues, including three-time All-Star Gerrit Cole.

Cooper brought an accomplished resume to Penn State that included three NCAA Tournament appearances as a head coach at Wright State and five more at various stops as an assistant coach, including two trips to the College World Series with Miami (Florida). Cooper was twice named the Horizon League Coach of the Year and guided Wright State to three league tournament championships and two regular-season championships after the team suffered six losing seasons in the seven years before his arrival.

Cooper methodically built Wright State into a perennial contender in the Horizon League with seven 30-win seasons, two Horizon League regular-season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and six Horizon League Championship game appearances. In nine seasons starting in 2005, Cooper accumulated a 286-230 record, including a pair of wins over No. 1-ranked opponents Virginia (3/5/10) and Georgia (3/24/09). He was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2011.

Cooper guided 47 players to all-conference accolades and 18 garner all-newcomer honors. He also produced five Horizon League Players of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, three Relief Pitchers of the Year and two Newcomers of the Year.

Before arriving at Wright State, Cooper served as the hitting coach, recruiting coordinator and bench coach at Oral Roberts University. A perennial power of the Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League), ORU advanced to the finals of the NCAA Austin Regional in 2004, beating TCU twice before falling to Texas, 7-3 and 7-5. The Golden Eagles finished with an overall mark of 50-11 in 2004 and had five players selected in the Major League Baseball draft, two honored as All-Americans by the ABCA and three named All-Americans by the College Baseball Insiders website.

Cooper began his coaching career at national power Miami, spending two seasons (1994-95) as a student/graduate assistant on the Hurricanes' staff. While at Miami, Cooper helped the Hurricanes to College World Series berths in 1994 and 1995. Cooper spent the 1996 season as an assistant and team academic coordinator at Wake Forest, then moved on to Tulane for the next two seasons, serving as the Green Wave's hitting coach. In 1997, the Green Wave won the Conference USA regular-season crown, and in 1998, they advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Cooper left Tulane following the 1998 season and returned to Sacramento City College, where he starred in the early 1990's before lettering at Miami in 1993.

Along with his college coaching experience, Cooper also was an associate scout for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 1990-92 and has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

Cooper earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Miami in 1994 and a master's in sports sciences/administration from Miami in 1996. He is married to his wife, Maureen, and has two sons, Jake and Tyson.
