PENN STATE READIES FOR LAST NON-CONFERENCE MATCH AT AKRON

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, has one final non-conference regular-season match at Akron on Wednesday, Oct. 13 in Akron, Ohio. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and will stream live on ESPN+.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE STAYS UNDEFEATED IN CONFERENCE PLAY WITH 2-1 WIN OVER MICHIGAN

- Penn State remained undefeated in Big Ten play after beating Michigan, 2-1, Sunday afternoon at Jeffrey Field live on Big Ten Network.
- The Nittany Lions started the game with a foot on the pedal, with the first shot on target coming from Danny Bloyou just barely two minutes in but Michigan's goalkeeper Hayden Evans was there for the save.
- Both teams continued to fire off shots in the first half, with a total of 17 being taken, as the Wolverines would head to the locker room with a slight edge, 10-7. while the score would remain 0-0.
- Penn State was determined to strike first out of the break, with Andrew Privett taking a shot on target in the 48th minute that was saved by Evans.
- Just over a minute later. **Peter Mangione** had a sliding pass to Blovou from midfield and then Bloyou played Privett right at the top of the box as Privett came running in and immediately took a strike with his right foot to find the back of the net and give the Nittany Lions a 1-0 lead.
- About 10 minutes later, **Tyger Evans** would get called for a foul in the box on Michigan's Derick Broche to set up a penalty kick opportunity for the Wolverines. Marc Ybarra stepped up to the spot and converted to tie the
- A momentum shift would then happen in the 69th minute as Broche would be shown a straight red card for a high elbow on Femi Awodesu to give Penn State a man-up advantage for the remainder of the match.
- Less than a minute later, Jalen Watson was running up the left side and crossed a ball into the box that deflected off a Michigan defender and went in for an own goal, giving the Nittany Lions a one-goal lead again.
- Even a man down, the Wolverines would fight to try to find the equalizer, including a great attempt at net that was cleared off the line by Brandon Hackenberg in the 82nd minute.
- Goalkeeper Kris Shakes finished with three saves as he and the defense held on to give Penn State its third-straight win and fourth in the league.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Nine different players have already recorded points this season with junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany Lions with 13 points on a tied team-high five goals and three assists. Sophomore Peter Mangione and senior Danny Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 11 and 10, respectively.
- Captain of the midfield, Seth Kuhn, along with Bloyou, pace the team with four assists each.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou is the most recent Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (10/12) after his three-point week against Rutgers and Michigan.
- It marked Bloyou's first career conference weekly honor.
- Sophomore forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week at the end of September after recording a hat trick against Villanova (9/28) for his second career weekly award from the conference.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- Junior midfielder Andrew Privett is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 13 on five goals and three assists.
- The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- Privett recorded a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His five goals is a career high as is his 13 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

BLOW YOU AWAY

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- The Accra, Ghana, native has scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games now. He totals three goals and four assists for 10 total points so far in 2021.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes has posted three shutouts so far in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.44 saves per game and has 31 total saves, third and fourth in the league, respectively.
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 24-4-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.809 is sixth on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.885 is 20th.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- Mangione has a tied team-high five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total is second in the Big Ten.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (9/30).
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time candidates.
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates are the most of any school.

CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN

- Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of team over self.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native drew a penalty kick against Villanova (9/21) and instead of taking it himself let teammate Peter Mangione step up to the spot to earn a hat trick.
- Mangione recounted to the media postgame the situation: "Reedy, the exceptional guy he is, he gave it (the PK) to me and said 'I have all the faith in you, go get your hat trick."

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- Junior striker Liam Butts is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native has four goals so far this season, including two game-winners.
- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.
- As of Oct. 12, Penn State is first in the conference with 12 points on a perfect 4-0-0 record.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.











NOTES AND HEADLINES

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn paces the team with four assists which is second in the Big Ten and 72nd nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has already matched his assist total from a season ago and is one shy of matching his career high (5, 2019).
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- Kuhn's 15 career assists is 44th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione is clutch when needed most.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals so far this season, with three the eventual game-winners.
- His three game-winning goals paces the Big Ten and is
- Mangione has 11 career goals, seven of which are gamewinners.

FIRSTS FOR FEMI

- Sophomore defender Femi Awodesu has had an outstanding start to year two in Happy Valley, recording his first career goal at West Virginia (9/3) and his first career assist against American (9/6).
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native is also defending well on the backline, making crucial tackles and causing turnovers to help out goalkeeper Kris Shakes and get the Nittany Lions back on offense.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Nittany Lions host nine home games within the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field during the 2021 regular
- Penn State Athletics is happy to welcome fans back to its venues in 2021-22 after having empty stands during the 2020-21 year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Penn State soccer student section, Park Avenue Army, and the State College community have come out in full force to support the program, as Penn State men's soccer ranks top-20 in average attendance (17th) with 1.376 fans.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Penn State is back receiving votes from United Soccer Coaches, as well as in the College Soccer News poll.
- Penn State currently has three opponents ranked in the top 25 and an additional three receiving votes: Pittsburgh (No. 7; L, 9/13), Maryland (No. 12; 10/26), West Virginia (No. 21; L, 9/3), Wisconsin (RV; 10/31), Rutgers (RV; W, 10/5), Indiana (RV; 10/17).
- The Nittany Lions picked up their first win over a ranked opponent this season in Piscataway against then-No. 22 Rutgers.

NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES

- Penn State made its debut on national television when it hosted No. 15 Pitt live on FS1 (9/13)
