PENN STATE SET FOR BIG TEN BATTLE AGAINST INDIANA

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, is set to host the Indiana Hoosiers for a Big Ten battle at Jeffrey Field on Sunday, Oct. 17. Kickoff is slated for noon and will broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Chris Munroe (analyst) on the call.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE FALLS TO AKRON

- Penn State fell on the road to Akron, 2-1, Wednesday evening at FirstEnergy Stadium in a non-conference contest.
- Akron dominated the first 20 minutes of play, earning a total of four corner kicks in the opening minutes, as well as scoring the first two goals of the game in the 16th and 20th minutes, respectively, to take an early two-goal lead.
- The Nittany Lions earned three-straight corner kicks in the 44th minute for their first real offensive chances of the match, but nothing would come of it as they would head to the break in the hole.
- In the 57th minute, goalkeeper Kris Shakes made a great save at the near post to keep his team within reach. Shakes finished with three saves in the match.
- Andrew Privett took Penn State's first real chances at net in the 67th and 69th minutes, respectively, with a rebound shot that went just wide right and another from longer range that was blocked.
- Tyger Evans had a good look on target in the 83rd minute but the Zips keeper was there for the save. Akron's defense then headed the ball out of play to set up a Penn State corner kick.
- On the corner kick, Seth Kuhn took the set piece as its first bounce went off an Akron defender and immediately out to an awaiting Dax Hoffman whose one-time strike found the back of the net to get the Nittany Lions on the board.
- Penn State would try to find the equalizer in the remaining seven minutes of the match, but would ultimately come up short in the non-conference finale.

SENIOR DAY

- Sunday marks Senior Day for the Nittany Lions in which the program will honor five seniors: Danny Bloyou, Seth Kuhn, Adam Laundree, Alex Morgret, and Keegan Ness.
- Senior Day is presented by the Penn State Alumni Association. The ceremony will take place postgame.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany Lions with 13 points on a tied team-high five goals and three assists. Sophomore Peter Mangione and senior Danny Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 11 and 10, respectively.

REMEMBER YOUR FIRST

- Senior Dax Hoffman netted his first career goal at Akron (10/13).
- The Harrisburg, Pa., native walked on to the team ahead of the 2019 season and has been an unsung contributer with his work ethic the past three seasons.
- Hoffman elected to use his extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BLOW YOU AWAY

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- The Accra. Ghana, native has scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games now. He totals three goals and four assists for 10 total points so far in 2021.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** has posted three shutouts so far in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.40 saves per game and has 34 total saves, third and second in the league, respectively.
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 24-5-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.801 is seventh on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goalsagainst average of 0.920 is 23rd.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK

- Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six points.
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- Mangione has a tied team-high five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total is second in the Big Ten.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates are the most of any school.

CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN

Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of team over self.

- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.
- As of Oct. 14, Penn State is first in the conference with 12 points on a perfect 4-0-0 record.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and midfield.
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn paces the team with five assists which is second in the Big Ten and 40th nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has matched his career high from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019.
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- Kuhn's 16 career assists is 33rd on the NCAA active career leaders list.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione is clutch when needed most.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals so far this season, with three the eventual game-winners.

- Penn State is back receiving votes from United Soccer Coaches, as well as in the College Soccer News poll.

SCOUTING INDIANA

- Indiana is led by 12th-year head coach Todd Yeagley and is 8-3-1 overall and 3-2-0 in Big Ten play. After falling to Michigan, 2-1, in overtime back on Oct. 1, the Hoosiers are on a three-game win streak, including the most recent 3-0 win over Ohio State in league play (10/12).
- Junior Victor Bezerra paces the Hoosiers with 13 points on four goals and a team-high five assists. Freshmen Samuel Sarver and Tommy Mihalic also have four goals each in their rookie seasons. Thirteen other players have recorded at least one point this season.
- In net, junior goalkeeper Roman Celentano has played all but one half this season. He holds a 0.92 goals-against average and 0.750 save percentage with 33 saves. Celentano has five shutouts this season, as well as one combined with redshirt senior Bryant Pratt.

PENN STATE AGAINST INDIANA

- Penn State trails in the all-time series against Indiana, 14-34-5.
- Last season, the regular-season match between the two teams was postponed due to COVID-19 protocols. The Nittany Lions and Hoosiers then met up in the Big Ten Tournament championship game, Penn State's first appearance in the title match since 2011. Liam Butts tied the game at 1-1 in the 82nd minute and it would officially end in a 1-1 double-overtime draw. Indiana then won the trophy in a penalty kick shootout, 3-2.
- Penn State is seeking its first win over Indiana since the 2015 season.
