PENN STATE TRAVELS TO OHIO STATE

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, travels to Ohio State for another Big Ten match on Friday, October 22 at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and will stream live on B1G+.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE DROPS CLOSE MATCH TO INDIANA

- Penn State dropped a close match to the visiting Indiana Hoosiers, 1-0, Sunday afternoon at Jeffrey Field live on Big Ten Network.
- In blustery conditions in Happy Valley, the Nittany Lions played with the wind in the first half and were able to get five of their six shots on frame but Hoosier goalkeeper Roman Celentano played lights out in order to keep the home team out of the back of the net.
- Senior Danny Bloyou took Penn State's first shot on target in the 24th minute. Junior Liam Butts had one in the 33rd minute that was again saved by Celentano.
- In the 37th minute, sophomore Tyger Evans came off the bench and hit a rocket shot on the left side of the box that was punch saved by Celentano before Butts tried on the rebound but was again denied by the keeper.
- On the other end, junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes made some great saves for Penn State, with four in the first half to keep a dangerous Indiana offense out
- Sophomore Peter Mangione had his shot on goal saved in the 42nd minute as the teams would head to the break with a 0-0 score.
- Out of the break, senior Seth Kuhn and junior Andrew Privett both had decent chances within the first five minutes, but Kuhn would get blocked and Privett would see his strike go wide right.
- Indiana seemed to take advantage of Penn State's struggles playing into the wind in the second half, controlling possession and taking five shots in the next 20 minutes, however none of which were on target.
- In the 75th minute, the Hoosiers had a cross into the box that took an extremely unfortunate skip off redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg's head and into the goal to give the visitors a 1-0 lead.
- The Nittany Lions would furiously search to find the equalizer in the remaining 15 minutes but would come up just short to result in their first conference loss this season.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- As of Oct. 21, Penn State is tied for first in the conference with 12 points with a 4-1-0 record. Indiana also has 12 points, but has played one more conference game with a 4-2-0 record.
- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

NOTES AND HEADLINES

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with 13 points on a tied team-high five goals and three assists. Sophomore **Peter Mangione** and senior Danny Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 11 and 10, respectively.
- Captain of the midfield, Seth Kuhn paces the team with five assists.
- Penn State is averaging 1.57 goals per game and 4.64 points per game. The Nittany Lions are second in total goals (22) and third in total assists (21) and points (65) in the Big Ten.

MIDSEASON TOP 100

- Redshirt senior defender Brandon Hackenberg and senior forward Danny Bloyou both made Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top 100 update as announced Monday.
- Hackenberg was ranked No. 46 and Bloyou No. 57.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou is the most recent Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (10/12) after his three-point week against Rutgers and Michigan.
- It marked Bloyou's first career conference weekly honor.
- Sophomore forward/midfielder Peter Mangione was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week at the end of September (9/28) after recording a hat trick against Villanova for his second career weekly award from the conference.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- Junior midfielder Andrew Privett is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 13 on five goals and three assists.
- The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- Privett recorded a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His five goals is a career high as is his 13 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes has posted three shutouts so far in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.45 saves per game and has 38 total saves, third in the league in both categories.
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 24-6-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.801 is sixth on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.923 is 24th.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (9/30).
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time candidates.
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates are the most of any school.

TOP-35 RPI

- The second NCAA RPI ranking for the 2021 season was released Monday and has Penn State ranked No. 31, dropping a couple spots after losses to Akron (No. 22) and Indiana (No. 18).
- Including Akron and Indiana, five other 2021 opponents rank in the top 35.

- Senior Dax Hoffman netted his first career goal at Akron (10/13).
- The Harrisburg, Pa., native walked on to the team ahead of the 2019 season and has been an unsung contributer with his work ethic the past three seasons.
- Hoffman elected to use his extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BLOW YOU AWAY

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- The Accra. Ghana, native has scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games now. He totals three goals and four assists for 10 total points so far in 2021.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK

- Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- Mangione has a tied team-high five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total is third in the Big Ten.

CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN

- Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of team over self.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native drew a penalty kick against Villanova (9/21) and instead of taking it himself let teammate Peter Mangione step up to the spot to earn a
- Mangione recounted to the media postgame the situation: "Reedy, the exceptional guy he is, he gave it (the PK) to me and said 'I have all the faith in you, go get your hat trick."

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- Junior striker Liam Butts is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native has four goals so far this season, including two game-winners.
- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and midfield.
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn paces the team with five assists which is second in

- the Big Ten and 58th nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has matched his career high from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019.
