PENN STATE HOSTS NO. 7 MARYLAND IN FINAL REGULAR-SEASON HOME **MATCH TUESDAY**

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, will look to get back in the win column when it welcomes a tough Big Ten opponent in No. 7 Maryland to Jeffrey Field on Tuesday, Oct. 26. The final regular-season home match is slated for an 8 p.m. kickoff live on Big Ten Network with Chris Vosters (pxp) and Tim Lenahan (analyst) on the call.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE COMES UP SHORT AT OHIO STATE

- Penn State attempted to front a comeback on the road at Ohio State after going down by two goals early, but the effort would come up just short, 2-1, Friday evening at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium.
- Ohio State struck first in the seventh minute off a corner kick to take an early 1-0 lead.
- Seconds after kickoff, junior Liam Butts tried to answer with a shot on frame, but the Buckeye goalkeeper was there for the save.
- After continuing to maintain possession, the Buckeyes made it 2-0 on another set piece, this time a free kick outside the 18, in the 17th minute.
- Senior Seth Kuhn had a rocket of a shot that he fired off in the 36th minute straight at Noah Lawrence for the punch save.
- The Nittany Lions had their offensive chances with a 6-1 advantage in corner kicks in the first half, but would ultimately find themselves in a two-goal hole
- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg had the first chance at net for Penn State in the second half with a header shot off a free kick in the 53rd minute, but Lawrence would push it just over the crossbar to keep the Nittany Lions out of the back of the net.
- Penn State finally got on the scoreboard in the 67th minute thanks to a set piece of its own as Kuhn originally had a great look at net that was saved to set up a corner kick. Kuhn then took the corner and placed a perfect ball into the box to find the head of junior Andrew Privett for the score to make it a one-goal game.
- The Nittany Lions would do their best to find the equalizer in the remaining 20 or so minutes, getting the ball into the offensive zone and taking four more good looks at net, including one on frame in the last 30 seconds by sophomore Femi Awodesu, but ultimately would come up short.
- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes did all he could to keep his team in the game, making a season-high seven saves, including five in the second half alone.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- As of Oct. 25, Penn State is in fourth in the conference with 12 points with a 4-2-0 record. Maryland sits just one point ahead of the Nittany Lions at 13 with a 4-1-1 record.
- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons

with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with 15 points on a team-high six goals and three assists. Sophomore **Peter Mangione** and senior **Danny** Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 11 and 10, respectively.
- Captain of the midfield, Seth Kuhn paces the team with six assists.
- Penn State is averaging 1.53 goals per game and 4.53 points per game. The Nittany Lions are third in total goals (23), total assists (22) and points (68) in the Big Ten.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- Junior midfielder Andrew Privett is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 15 on six goals and three assists.
- His total goals and points are tied for first in the Big Ten and both rank top-90 nationally.
- The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- Privett recorded a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His six goals is a career high as is his 15 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central
- Kuhn paces the team with six assists which is second in the Big Ten and 43rd nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native set a career high with his sixth assist of the season at Ohio State, passing his previous of five from his first season in the Blue and White
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- Kuhn's 17 career assists is 33rd on the NCAA active career leaders list.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes has posted three shutouts so far in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.75 saves per game and has 45 total saves, second in the league in both categories.
- He set a season high with seven saves at Ohio State (10/22).
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 24-7-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.800 is sixth on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.955 is 29th.

MIDSEASON TOP 100

- Redshirt senior defender Brandon Hackenberg and senior forward Danny Bloyou both made Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top 100 update as announced Monday.
- Hackenberg was ranked No. 46 and Bloyou No. 57.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou is the most recent Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (10/12) after his three-point week against Rutgers and Michigan.
- It marked Bloyou's first career conference weekly honor.
- Sophomore forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week at the end of September (9/28) after recording a hat trick against Villanova for his second career weekly award from the conference.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (9/30).
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time candidates.
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates are the most of any school.

TOP-50 RPI

- The third NCAA RPI ranking for the 2021 season was released Monday and has Penn State ranked No. 44, dropping a handful of spots after the loss to Ohio State.
- Nine 2021 opponents currently rank ahead of the Nittany Lions: No. 9 Pittsburgh, No. 16 Maryland, No. 18 Indiana, No. 19 Akron, No. 23 West Virginia, No. 25 Michigan, No. 28 Michigan State, No. 34 Syracuse, and No. 43 Villanova.
- Penn State is 4-4-0 against eight of the nine opponents before facing Maryland on Tuesday.

REMEMBER YOUR FIRST

- Senior Dax Hoffman netted his first career goal at Akron (10/13).
- The Harrisburg, Pa., native walked on to the team ahead of the 2019 season and has been an unsung contributer with his work ethic the past three seasons.
- Hoffman elected to use his extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- The Accra, Ghana, native has scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games now. He totals three goals and four assists for 10 total points so far in 2021.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corev Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- Mangione has five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total is fourth in the Big Ten.

CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN

- Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of
- The Kutztown, Pa., native drew a penalty kick against Villanova (9/21) and instead of taking it himself let teammate Peter Mangione step up to the spot to earn a

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- Junior striker Liam Butts is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native has four goals so far this season, including two game-winners.
- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and midfield.
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione is clutch when needed most.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals so far this season, with three the eventual game-winners.

Sophomore defender Femi Awodesu has had an outstanding start to year two in Happy Valley, recording his first career goal at West Virginia (9/3) and his first career assist against American (9/6).

The Philadelphia, Pa., native is also defending well on the backline, making crucial tackles and causing turnovers to help out goalkeeper Kris Shakes and get the Nittany Lions back on offense.

- Bloyou and redshirt senior defender Brandon Hackenberg have also been ranked as No. 34 and No. 39, respectively, by Top Drawer Soccer in the preseason top-100 individual player rankings.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- Maryland is led by 29-year head coach Sasho Cirovski and is 11-2-1 overall and 4-1-1 in Big Ten play. The seventh-ranked Terrapins are riding a four-game win streak, most recently picking up a 3-1 conference road victory at Michigan State on Friday (10/22).
- Sophomore midfielder Ben Bender paces the Terrapins with 14 points on a team-high five goals and four assists. Classmate Jacen Russell-Rowe also has four assists to co-lead the team in that category. In all, 17 different Maryland players have recorded at least one point this season.
- In net, junior goalkeeper Niklas Neumann has played a majority of the time with 10 starts and 11 games played. He holds a 0.85 goals-against average and 0.727 save percentage with 24 saves. Neumann has three shutouts this season and one combined.

PENN STATE AGAINST MARYLAND

- Penn State trails Maryland 19-25-6 in the all-time series, but is on a three-game unbeaten streak against the Terrapins (W - 10/29/19; W - 2/19/21; T - 3/31/21).
- Last season, Penn State and Maryland met twice during the regular season in a home-and home. The Nittany Lions held on for a 3-2 victory inside Holuba Hall in the postponed season opener. They then played the Terrapins to a 2-2 double-overtime draw, finding the equalizer twice in the pouring rain in College Park at the end of the regular season.
- The Nittany Lions and Terrapins have played overtime games in three of the last four matchups.
