PENN STATE MEETS WISCONSIN IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, travels to Madison, Wisconsin to take on the Wisconsin Badgers in the regular-season finale on Halloween Sunday. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. ET/Noon CT and will stream live on B1G+.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE SCORES THREE UNANSWERED TO TOP NO. 7 MARYLAND, 3-2, IN OVERTIME

- » Penn State once again showed its persistence and grit to never give up, scoring three unanswered goals after trailing by two early to top No. 7 Maryland, 3-2, in overtime Tuesday evening at Jeffrey Field.
- » On a rainy and windy night in Happy Valley, Maryland played the first half with the wind in its backs. The Terrapins struck first in the 12th minute on a good ball finished in the box to take the early 1-0 lead.
- » The teams then traded shots the next 18 minutes or so, including one on frame for Penn State by redshirt senior **Pierre Reedy** that was saved by Maryland's keeper Niklas Neumann.
- » After junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** made a save in the 30th minute, the Nittany Lions had an unfortunate turnover in the Terrapins' offensive zone in which Caden Stafford capitalized on to give the visitors a two-goal advantage after 31 minutes of play.
- » As they always do, the Nittany Lions fought back to get on the scoreboard with good sustained pressure and eventually found the back of the net in the 40th minute to make it a one-goal game.
- » Senior **Dax Hoffman** did a good job to head the ball over to senior **Danny Bloyou** in the 18 as Bloyou looked like he was going to shoot but didn't get a good position on the ball, but sophomore **Peter Mangione** was there for the clean up as he squared up to shoot and found upper-90 to get his team on the board.
- » Penn State came out of the halftime break with confidence and determination to find the equalizer as it would play with the wind in the second half.
- » In the 60th minute, senior **Seth Kuhn** had a great look at net but his non-dominant right-footed shot just rang off the crossbar.
- » Nine minutes later, the Nittany Lions hit post again, this time with Reedy's shot to the near post accidentally blocked at the goal line by Mangione and hit the bottom of the crossbar to stay out of the net.
- » Maintaining possession, it was only a matter of time that Penn State would record the equalizer which it did in the 72nd minute on Kuhn's first goal of the season. The play was set up as Mangione had a steal on the Maryland throw in and then got through the remaining defenders to cross the ball to Kuhn at the far post for the delicate left-foot finish to tie the game at 2-2.
- » Penn State would again have chances in the next several minutes as junior **Liam Butts** had two shots on frame that Neumann would save to keep the home team from taking the lead.
- » Regulation would end with Penn State outshooting Maryland, 11-2, in the second 45.

NOTES AND HEADLINES

- » Overtime started as Penn State won the toss to play with the wind in the first extra 10-minute period. Just over three minutes in, a Terrapins defender would be shown a yellow card as he pulled down Mangione right outside the box to set up a free kick.
- » Junior **Andrew Privett**, Mangione and Kuhn all stood around the ball and once the whistle was blown, Kuhn had a little flick of a touch as Privett would take a low shot that was deflected and ended up in the back of the net at the far post to send the Nittany Lions home with a golden goal.
- » The Penn State backline, anchored by Shakes, played well in the second half and overtime period to only allow two total shots. The defense also withstood Maryland's potent offense to not allow any corner kicks in the entire game.

BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS TO BE DETERMINED SUNDAY

- » As of Oct. 29, Penn State is in a tie for first in the conference with Indiana with 15 points and a 5-2-0 record.
- » With a Nittany Lion win over Wisconsin and a Maryland win or draw over Indiana, Penn State can become the stand-alone Big Ten regular season champions for the first time since 2013.
- » Penn State could also share the title with a win and an Indiana win, but would have the No. 2 seed in the upcoming Big Ten Tournament as the Hoosiers hold the head-to-head tie-breaker.
- » Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- » The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

YOU CAN CALL IT A COMEBACK

- » Penn State scored three unanswered goals to top No. 7 Maryland, 3-2, in overtime at Jeffrey Field on Tuesday (10/26).
- » The Nittany Lions erased a 2-0 deficit to win for the first time since 2019 when they also did so against a ranked Maryland squad at Jeffrey Field in overtime (10/29/19).

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- » Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- » Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with 17 points on a team-high seven goals and three assists. Sophomore **Peter Mangione** and senior **Danny Bloyou** also each have double-digit points at 14 and 11, respectively.
- » Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn** paces the team with seven assists.
- » Penn State is averaging 1.63 goals per game and 4.88 points per game. The Nittany Lions are third in total goals (26), total assists (26) and points (78) in the Big Ten.
- » For full national statistical rankings, see page eight.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- » Junior midfielder **Andrew Privett** is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 17 on seven goals and three assists.
- » His total goals lead the conference and is top 50 in the

- nation (47th) while his total points are tied for first in the league and 68th nationally.
- » The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- » Privett recorded his first career game-winning goal in overtime against Maryland (10/26), and a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- » His seven goals is a career high as is his 17 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- » His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- » Kuhn paces the team with seven assists which is tied for first in the Big Ten and 26th nationally.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native's seven assists are a career high, passing his previous of five from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019.
- » He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year. He registered a season-high three points on a goal and the game-winning assist against Maryland (10/26).
- » Kuhn also scored the equalizing goal against Maryland for his first of the season to total nine points, a career best.
- » Kuhn's 18 career assists is 27th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

REEDY NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST

- » Redshirt senior **Pierre Reedy** was named a finalist for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (10/28).
- » Reedy became the first finalist for Penn State since 2009 when Jason Yeisley was a finalist and the eventual winner.
- » To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- » Earlier in the month, Reedy, along with classmate **Brandon Hackenberg** and senior **Danny Bloyou** were all announced as top-30 candidates for the award.
- » An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- » Penn State was one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates were the most of any school.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** has posted three shutouts in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- » Shakes has averaged 3.62 saves per game and has 47 total saves, third and first in the league, respectively, in those categories.
- » He set a season high with seven saves at Ohio State (10/22).
- » The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 25-7-2 career record.





NOTES AND HEADLINES

- » His career save percentage of 0.793 is seventh on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.984 is 33rd.

TOP-50 RPI

- » The third NCAA RPI ranking for the 2021 season was released Monday and has Penn State ranked No. 44, dropping a handful of spots after the loss to Ohio State.
- » Nine 2021 opponents currently rank ahead of the Nittany Lions: No. 9 Pittsburgh, No. 16 Maryland, No. 18 Indiana, No. 19 Akron, No. 23 West Virginia, No. 25 Michigan, No. 28 Michigan State, No. 34 Syracuse, and No. 43 Villanova.
- » Penn State is 4-4-0 against eight of the nine opponents before facing Maryland on Tuesday.

MIDSEASON TOP 100

- » Redshirt senior defender **Brandon Hackenberg** and senior forward **Danny Bloyou** both made Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top 100 update as announced Monday.
- » Hackenberg was ranked No. 46 and Bloyou No. 57.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- » Senior forward **Danny Bloyou** is the most recent Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (10/12) after his three-point week against Rutgers and Michigan.
- » It marked Bloyou's first career conference weekly honor.
- » Sophomore forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week at the end of September (9/28) after recording a hat trick against Villanova for his second career weekly award from the conference.

REMEMBER YOUR FIRST

- » Senior **Dax Hoffman** netted his first career goal at Akron (10/13).
- » He recorded an assist against Maryland (10/26) for a career-high three points this season.
- » The Harrisburg, Pa., native walked on to the team ahead of the 2019 season and has been an unsung contributor with his work ethic the past three seasons.
