The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 3 in the AP and Coaches polls, their highest ranking since Nov. 22, 2015 (#3). Iowa has two wins over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17) this season and has won five straight against ranked opponents overall. Only Alabama (9) has more consecutive wins over ranked opponents.

2

Iowa and Penn State are meeting for the sixth time as ranked opponents, the third time in the last four years. The top five matchup is the sixth top-five matchup in Iowa football history, and the first at Kinnick Stadium since No. 1 Iowa defeated No. 2 Michigan, 12-10, in 1985.

3

Iowa has won its last 11 games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last 11 opponents, 380-141, averaging 34.5 points per game offensively and allowing 12.8 ppg during the winning streak.

4

Iowa has won eight straight games against Big Ten opponents (2020-21) for the fourth time in program history. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02, eight straight from 2008-09 and eight straight in 2015.

5

Iowa has won 11 straight for the first time since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game.

6

Iowa leads the country with 12 INTs. The Hawkeyes have 76 INTs since 2017, more than any team in the country. Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin, 1982).

7

DB Riley Moss leads the Big Ten with three interceptions and leads the country with two interceptions returned for touchdowns (30, 55), both in Week 1. Iowa has turned 16 turnovers into 75 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 20 points (2 int. return TDs, one fumble return TD and 1 safety).

8

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 11 consecutive wins. Petras is 177-293 with 2,031 passing yards during Iowa's 11-game winning streak. He has thrown 15 TDs and three INTs over the last 11 games. Petras is 11-2 as Iowa's starting QB, matching the best winning percentage by a starting QB in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846).

9

K Caleb Shudak has connected on 8-of-9 field goal attempts and is good on all 20 PAT tries. His only miss was the result of a bad snap. He connected on career highs in field goals (3) and extra points (6) in Iowa's win at Maryland. He has a team-high 44 points, tied for eighth in the Big Ten. Shudak has 18 touchbacks on 31 kickoffs.

10

LB Jack Campbell ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 46 tackles. He had a career-high 18 tackles in Iowa's Week 4 win against Colorado State, earning B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors.

ABOUT THE 11-GAME WIN STREAK

Iowa finished the 2020 season with six straight wins and opened the 2021 season with five consecutive wins. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last 11 opponents, 380-141, averaging 34.5 points per game offensively and allowing 12.8 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has won 11 straight for the first time since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game that season and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game.

Iowa has won eight straight games against Big Ten opponents (2020-21) for the fourth time in program history. Iowa won 10 straight from 2001-02, eight straight from 2008-09 and eight straight in 2015.

HAWKEYES BATTING 5-FOR-5

Iowa opened the season with five straight wins for the third time in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa started 9-0 in 2009 and 12-0 in 2015.

IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 3 in the AP and Coaches polls, their highest ranking since Nov. 22, 2015 (#3). Iowa opened the season with two wins over ranked opponents (vs. #17 Indiana, 34-6; at #9 Iowa State, 27-17).

Iowa has won five straight games against ranked opponents dating back to 2019. The last time Iowa won five straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

Iowa opened the 2021 season ranked 18th in the AP Poll. It marked the third straight season Iowa was ranked in the AP top 25 preseason poll and its highest preseason appearance since being ranked 17th in 2016.

Iowa's first two opponents were ranked in the AP Top 25 (No. 17 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa State). It marked the fourth time in program history the Hawkeyes have opened a season against consecutive opponents ranked in the AP Top 25 (1960, 1973, 1974). The Hawkeyes started 2-0 in 1960, 1-1 in 1974 and 0-2 in 1973.

Iowa has been ranked in the AP Top 25 at least once in each of the last seven seasons, the third-longest streak in school history. Iowa finished the 2020 season ranked 15th in the coaches poll and 16th in the AP poll. It marked the 26th time in program history that Iowa finished the season ranked in the top 25. Iowa has finished ranked 15th or better in the AP poll six times in 22 completed seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 23rd season as Moon Family Head Football Coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry in 2019. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fourth all-time with 173 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten. He has 105 Big Ten wins, which ranks fourth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 164-85 (.658) overall mark and a 101-63 (.616) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 14 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 173-106 (.620) and a 105-77 (.577) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 173 wins. In 26 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 185-127 (.593).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG BIG TEN'S BEST

Moon Family Head Football Coach Kirk Ferentz has 105 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach, the fourth most of any coach in Big Ten Conference history. The Hawkeyes defeated Penn State, 41-21, on Nov. 21, 2020, to earn Ferentz's 100th conference win.

Ferentz's 173 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fourth all-time in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five include Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonzo Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Ferentz (173) and Joe Paterno (162).

Ferentz (173-106) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 23rd season in 2021.

Both Ferentz (173, 104) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top five in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 23rd season as Iowa's head football coach in 2021. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) has been at his current school for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker is in his 23rd season on Iowa's staff, his 10th as defensive coordinator. He is the longest tenured defensive coordinator in FBS.

Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his 10th season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,274 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 671-562-39 (.543). That includes a 417-223-16 (.648) record in home games, a 254-339-23 (.431) record in games away from Iowa City, a 343-383-25 (.473) mark in Big Ten games and a 301-188-15 (.610) record in Kinnick Stadium.

Saturday is the first regular season Big Ten Conference game featuring two top five teams that did not include Ohio State since No. 4 Michigan won at No. 2 Penn State in 1997.

PETRAS CONTINUES TO WIN

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 11 consecutive wins. Petras is 177-293 with 2,031 passing yards during Iowa's 11-game winning streak. He has thrown 15 touchdowns and three interceptions over the last 11 games.

Petras improved to 11-2 as Iowa's starting quarterback, matching the best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846). Petras' 32.3 points per game (2020-21) is the highest average by a Hawkeye starting quarterback since Banks (36.6, 2002).

Petras matched his career high with three touchdown passes and set a career high with two rushing touchdowns Week 5 at Maryland. He became the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a single same game since Banks at Minnesota in 2002.

The Hawkeyes averaged 31.8 points per game in 2020, Petras' first year as starting quarterback. It marked Iowa's highest point per game total since 2002 (36.5). Iowa won its final six games in 2020, outscoring its opponents 214-83.

GOING THE OTHER WAY

Iowa leads the country and 12 interceptions. The Hawkeyes have 76 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass in Iowa's 51-14 win at Maryland, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982.

Iowa has turned 16 turnovers into 75 points in 2021. The Hawkeyes' defense has scored 20 points (3 TDs and 1 safety).

Iowa has 76 interceptions since 2017, the most by any team in the country. Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21. The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten with 11 interceptions in 2020.

THAT’S NOT A PUNT... THAT’S A PUNT

Melbourne, Australia, native Tory Taylor ranks fifth in the Big Ten averaging 47.3 yards per punt. Taylor has 11 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 69-yard punt at Iowa State in Week 2. Iowa’s Week 2 punting average of 51.1 ranks No. 3 all-time in the Ferentz era and its Week 1 punting average of 49.5 ranks No. 7 in the Ferentz era.

Taylor was Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following Iowa’s win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts. Five of his punts were downed inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

In 2020, Taylor was named Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Punter of the Year and first-team All-Big Ten by the coaches, media and Associated Press. He ranked third in the Big Ten and 19th in the country averaging 44.1 yards per punt. The freshman downed 18 of his 40 punts inside the 20. Only six of Taylor’s 32 punts were returned (31 yards). Iowa ranked fifth nationally and No. 1 in the Big Ten in net punting (42.9).

Taylor is on the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and is a preseason first-team All-America honoree by The Athletic. He was one of 10 semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award and was named a first-team Freshman All-American by the FWA in 2020.

GOODSON LEADS GROUND GAME

RB Tyler Goodson leads Iowa’s rushing attack with 430 yards on 99 attempts. He rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns Week 3 against Kent State. It was the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. The 100-yard rushing game was the sixth of his career. Against Kent State, Goodson became the fifth Iowa player (sixth instance as Akrum Wadley did it twice) in the Ferentz era to rush for 150-plus yards and 3-plus touchdowns in a game (LeShun Daniels 2015, Shonn Greene 2008, Akrum Wadley 2015, 2017, Mark Weisman 2012).

Goodson has 11 rushing touchdowns in the last 11 games. He is averaging 99.7 yards per game (5.0 per carry) during Iowa’s 11-game winning streak. He had his first career receiving touchdown Week 5 at Maryland, a career-long 67-yard reception.

His five touchdowns in 2021 tie for second in the Big Ten, and his third touchdown rush against Kent State pushed him over 100 career points scored (104). He now has 110 points.

Goodson led the Hawkeyes and ranked third in the Big Ten with 762 rushing yards in 2020. Goodson had seven rushing touchdowns, tied for fourth in the Big Ten. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches, media and Associated Press in 2020.

Goodson led Iowa in rushing attempts (143) and rushing yards (762) in 2020. He tied for the team lead with seven rushing touchdowns (15, 3, 9, 7, 1, 10, 80). He has 1,830 career rushing yards (18th all-time). He is 170 yards shy of becoming the 16th player in program history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.

In Iowa’s 23-19 win against No. 7 Minnesota in 2019, Goodson became the first true freshman to start at running back under Ferentz since 2012 (Greg Garmon). He was also the first true freshman to lead the team in single-season rushing in 2019 (638 yards).

FRESH LEGS

Two true freshmen made their first career starts Week 4 against Colorado State. OL Connor Colby started at RG. WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby was the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson was the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

CELEBRATING #300

The Hawkeyes’ 30-7 win against Kent State on Sept. 18 was their 300th win at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa’s 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa became the seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

MOSS EARNS WEEKLY CONFERENCE AND NATIONAL HONORS

DB Riley Moss was named Walter Camp FBS National Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following No. 18 Iowa's 34-6 win over No. 17 Indiana on Sept. 4.

Moss became just the third player in school history to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single game. He had a 30-yard interception return to give Iowa a 14-0 advantage in the opening minutes of the game. Moss collected his second touchdown in the final minutes of the second quarter, returning the theft 55 yards for the score. Moss added one solo tackle and two pass break-ups against the Hoosiers as the Hawkeye defense allowed just 233 yards total offense.

Moss has nine career interceptions for 239 yards, including three touchdown returns. The nine thefts tie for 15th in program history, while his 239 return yards rank second among Iowa's career leaders (Tyler Sash, 392 yards). The three touchdowns tie Desmond King and Tom Knight for the most in school history.

Moss is the sixth Hawkeye to earn the Walter Camp national award, which is in its 18th year of being presented on a weekly basis to one offensive and one defensive player. Previous Hawkeye honorees include linebacker Chad Greenway (2004), linebacker Mike Klinkenborg (2006), linebacker Josey Jewell (2017), defensive back Josh Jackson (2017) and quarterback Nate Stanley (2018).

The weekly conference honor is the second of his career. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week in 2018 following a pair of interceptions at Minnesota.

TAYLOR NAMED B1G CO-SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

P Tory Taylor was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following No. 10 Iowa's 27-17 win at No. 9 Iowa State on Sept. 11 in the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. He was also named to the Ray Guy Award's Ray's 8 list following Iowa's Week 2 win.

Taylor earned the Big Ten honors after playing a key role in Iowa's 27-17 win at Iowa State. He averaged 51.1 yards on eight punts, with a long of 69 yards. Five of his punts were downing inside the 20, while Iowa State had just one punt return.

The Big Ten Player of the Week honor is a career first for Taylor. He was named to the Ray Guy Award preseason Watch List in July after being named a semifinalist for the award in 2020. Taylor was the Eddleman-Fields Big Ten Conference Punter of the Year in 2020 while earning first-team All-Big Ten honors. He was named first-team Freshman All-America by the FWAA and second-team All-America by The Athletic.

CAMPBELL NAMED B1G DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jack Campbell was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following No. 5 Iowa's 24-14 win over Colorado State on Sept. 25. He was also named the Bronko Nagurski national Defensive Player of the Week.

Campbell led Iowa's defensive effort in the 24-14 win over Colorado State as the Hawkeyes rallied from a 14-7 halftime deficit. Campbell recovered a Colorado State fumble at the six-yard line in the third quarter, which led to Iowa scoring on the next play to tie the contest, 14-14.

Campbell recorded a career-high 18 tackles against Colorado State. He had seven solo tackles and 11 assists and added three pass break-ups to go with his second fumble recovery of the season (touchdown at Iowa State).

The Big Ten weekly honor is the first of Campbell's career.

IOWA PLAYER COUNCIL GROUP

The University of Iowa football program's 2021 Player Council includes 16 student-athletes -- six seniors and 10 juniors.

The Hawkeyes are 23-4 in their last 27 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 20-4 in their last 24 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa is undefeated in its last three bowl appearances. Iowa defeated Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl; No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, at the 2019 Outback Bowl; and No. 22 USC, 49-24, at the 2019 Holiday Bowl. Iowa's 2020 Music City Bowl game was canceled.

Iowa has four rivalry games on its schedule in 2021. The Hawkeyes defeated No. 9 Iowa State, 27-17, to win the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series on Sept. 11.

Iowa defends the Heartland Trophy Oct. 30 at Wisconsin, Floyd of Rosedale Nov. 13 against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium, and the Heroes Trophy Nov. 26 at Nebraska. Iowa has won six straight against The Cyclones, Gophers and Huskers.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Iowa defeated Maryland on Oct. 1 in its first of two Friday games in 2021. In addition to the Hawkeyes trip to College Park, Maryland, Iowa faces Nebraska on Friday, Nov. 26 (12:30 p.m., BTN). Iowa has won eight straight games played on a Friday.

Iowa and Nebraska meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the 11th consecutive season. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference in 2011. Iowa is 7-3 in the previous 10 Black Friday meetings, including winners of six straight.

NONCONFERENCE, NO PROBLEM

Iowa has won 15 straight non-conference games, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. The nonconference win streak is the longest in the country. Iowa's last nonconference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl (Florida, 30-3).

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 199 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (79 draft picks/120 free agents).
Iowa football is tied for sixth in the nation with 34 active players on NFL rosters to start the 2021 season.
Iowa and Florida lead all schools with five offensive tackles currently active in the NFL.
Iowa is tied with Miami, Florida, Notre Dame, Penn State and Stanford with the most tight ends active in the NFL (4).
At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (44 consecutive years).
TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft (2019).
OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) was named first-team All-Pro in 2020. TE T.J. Hockenson was named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) and TE George Kittle (San Francisco) were named to the 2020 Pro Bowl.
TE George Kittle (San Francisco) was a first-team All-Pro in 2019. OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) was named second-team All-Pro that same season.
DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
Over the past 20 years, 163-of-188 (87 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
Over the past 14 years, Iowa has had 53 NFL Draft picks, the third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (83), Michigan (63), Wisconsin (52).
Iowa has had seven first round picks in the last 11 NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant, 2019; OL Tristan Wirfs, 2020.
Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) was an eight-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018, 2019) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019. He retired following the 2019 season.
In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his 10th year on staff and fifth as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

- The Hawkeyes earned bowl eligibility in 19 of the last 20 seasons. Iowa is 9-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (11) and Wisconsin (10) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 17-15-1 in 33 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (173-106) replaced Fry and is in his 23rd season in 2021. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 345 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa was 81-49 (.623) from 2010-19.
- Iowa had 47 wins from 2015-19, the most of any five-year period in school history.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa extended its winning streak to seven games. Iowa has outscored its last seven opponents, 248-89, averaging 35.4 points per game offensively and allowing 12.7 ppg during the winning streak.

The 34 points scored are the most in a Big Ten opener since scoring 42 at Penn State in 2002.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Spencer Petras is 91-158 (59.5) with 1,233 passing yards (176.1 ypg) during Iowa's seven-game winning streak. He has thrown eight touchdowns and two interceptions over the last seven games.

DB Riley Moss returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. Moss returned an interception 55 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. The interceptions were No. 7 and 8 of his career. He has three career pick-sixes. Iowa has had at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 14 seasons and 19 of the last 21.

DB Dane Belton recorded his first career interception.

QB Spencer Petras rushed for a touchdown in the second quarter. It was his fourth career rushing touchdown and the longest rushing touchdown of his career (9 yards).

Iowa had three offensive linemen make their first career start: LT Mason Richman, RG Justin Britt and RT Nick DeJong. Iowa DL John Waggoner and DL Logan Lee also made their first career starts. WR Charlie Jones made his first career start.

TE Sam LaPorta had a career-high 83 receiving yards.

Noah Shannon (4), John Waggoner (4), Jestin Jacobs (3), Logan Lee (3) and Ethan Hurkett (3) recorded career highs in tackles.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa has played 23 straight games without surrendering 25 points, the longest streak in the nation among Power 5 teams.

Iowa has won seven straight Big Ten games for the fifth time in the last 30 years. Iowa won eight straight conference games in 2015 and 2008, and seven straight in 2004 and 1991.

Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each of its wins during its winning streak. It is the second time in school history Iowa has scored 25 points or more in seven straight wins (2015, seven games).

Iowa and Indiana met as AP ranked opponents for the second time ever and the first time since 1991, when No. 10 Iowa defeated No. 25 Indiana, 38-21, at Kinnick Stadium.

Iowa has won its last eight games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last eight opponents, 275-106, averaging 34.3 points per game offensively and allowing 13.3 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each win.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to eight consecutive wins. Petras is 116-204 with 1,339 passing yards during Iowa's eight-game winning streak. He has thrown nine touchdowns and two interceptions over the last seven games.

WR Charlie Jones set career highs in receptions (2) and yards (36). His 26-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter was a career first.

DB Matt Hankins had two interceptions, the fourth and fifth of his career.

P Tory Taylor's 69-yard punt in the third quarter was a career long.

LB Jack Campbell returned a fumble six yards for his first career touchdown. The last time Iowa returned a fumble for a touchdown was 2018 (A.J. Epenesa at Illinois). The fumble was caused by Jestin Jacobs, the first of his career. Campbell matched his career high with eight touchdowns.

LB Seth Benson's third-quarter interception was the first of his career.

K Caleb Shudak's 51-yard field goal in the third quarter was a career long.

Iowa had four takeaways today and zero turnovers. The last time Iowa turned the ball over against Iowa State was in 2015 (352 plays). Iowa has scored 37 points on seven turnovers this season.

Iowa has won five straight games against ranked opponents dating back to 2019. The last time Iowa won five straight against ranked opponents was a six-game stretch in 1960.

Today was Iowa's highest ranked road win since defeating #5 Penn State, 21-10, in 2009.

Iowa has won 13 straight non-conference games, including 10 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. Iowa's last non-conference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl.

The Hawkeyes are 23-4 in their last 27 trophy games (includes bowl games) and 20-4 in their last 23 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin). Iowa has won six straight against Iowa State, and five straight in Ames.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa (3-0) defeated Kent State (1-2), 30-7, on Saturday at Kinnick Stadium.

Iowa has won its last nine games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last eight opponents, 305-113, averaging 33.9 points per game offensively and allowing 12.6 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has scored at least 25 points in each win.

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to nine consecutive wins. He was 25-36 for 209 yards passing today. The 25 completions are one shy of matching a career-high. Petras is 141-240 with 1,548 passing yards during Iowa's nine-game winning streak. He has thrown 10 touchdowns and two interceptions over the last nine games.

RB Tyler Goodson rushed 22 times for a career-high 153 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, the third-multi-touchdown game of his career. The last Hawkeye to rush for three touchdowns in a single game was Akrum Wadley in 2017 vs. Nebraska. Goodson recorded his sixth career 100-yard rushing yard game, his first this season.

RB Tyler Goodson has 11 rushing touchdowns in the last nine games. Goodson is averaging 105.8 yards per game (5.4 per carry) during Iowa's nine-game winning streak.

TE Sam LaPorta had a team and career-high seven receptions. LaPorta's second-quarter touchdown was the second touchdown of his career.

DB Riley Moss's fumble recovery in the endzone was the first fumble recovery of his career.

Iowa's defense registered seven sacks against Kent State, its high total since registering seven sacks against Northwestern in 2000. Lukas Van Ness recorded a career high in sacks (2) and tackles (7). DE Joe Evans recorded career highs in sacks (2) and tackles (5).

LB Jack Campbell had a game and career-high 11 tackles. Campbell added half a sack and forced a fumble at the goal line that was recovered by DB Riley Moss.

MISCELLANEOUS

The Hawkeyes won their 300th game at Kinnick Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. The first game played at Kinnick Stadium was Oct. 5, 1929, a 46-0 Hawkeye win against Monmouth. Iowa's 100th win at Kinnick was a 31-19 victory over Arizona on Oct. 4, 1969. The 200th win at Kinnick Stadium was a 44-19 victory against Miami, Ohio, on Sept. 8, 2001. Iowa is seventh Big Ten school to celebrate at least 300 wins in its home stadium.

Iowa's first-quarter safety was the first safety for the Hawkeyes since 2018 (at Penn State).

Iowa has won its last 10 games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last 10 opponents, 329-127, averaging 32.9 points per game offensively and allowing 12.7 ppg during the winning streak.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 10 consecutive wins. He was 15-23 for 224 yards passing today. Petras is 156-263 with 1,772 passing yards during Iowa's 10-game winning streak. He has thrown 12 touchdowns and three interceptions over the last 10 games.

LB Jack Campbell had a career-high 18 tackles, the most by a Hawkeye since Anthony Hitchens had 19 tackles against Iowa State in 2012. It is his second straight week setting a career high in tackles. He had 11 against Kent State in Week 3. Campbell added two pass breakups and recovered a fumble that led to Iowa's game-tying touchdown.

Yahya Black (4), Noah Shannon (4) and Jestin Jacobs (8) tied their career highs in tackles. Logan Lee had a career-best five tackles.

WR Tyrone Tracy's rushing touchdown in the third quarter was the second rushing touchdown of his career (vs. USC at 2019 Holiday Bowl).

Two true freshmen made their first career starts today. OL Connor Colby started at RG. WR Keagan Johnson started at wide receiver. Colby is the first true freshman offensive lineman to start since Tristan Wirfs in 2017. Johnson is the first true freshman wide receiver to start since Ihmir Smith-Marsette in 2017.

WR Keagan Johnson's first career reception was a 43-yard touchdown from QB Spencer Petras. Johnson finished the game with two receptions for 92 yards and a touchdown.

Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as Iowa head coach, 30 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

Iowa outscored Colorado State, 14-0, in the third quarter and has outscored its four opponents, 31-3, this season in the third quarter.

Iowa scored a touchdown off of one takeaway today and has scored 51 points on nine takeaways this season.

Iowa has won 15 straight nonconference games, including 12 regular season non-conference victories and three bowl wins. Iowa's last non-conference loss was at the 2017 Outback Bowl. The 15-game nonconference win streak is the longest in the nation.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa has won 11 consecutive games. The Hawkeyes have outscored their last 11 opponents, 380-141, averaging 34.5 points per game offensively and allowing 12.8 ppg during the winning streak. Iowa has won 11 straight for the first time since opening the 2015 season with 12 straight wins. Iowa reached the Big Ten Championship game and accepted an invitation to the 2016 Rose Bowl game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Spencer Petras improved to 11-2 as Iowa's starting quarterback, matching the best winning percentage by a starting quarterback in program history (Brad Banks, 11-2, .846).

QB Spencer Petras has led Iowa to 11 consecutive wins. He was 21-30 for 259 yards passing Friday. He matched his career-high with three touchdown passes and set a career-high with two touchdown rushes. Petras is 177-293 with 2,031 passing yards during Iowa's 11-game winning streak. He has thrown 15 touchdowns and three interceptions over the last 11 games.

QB Spencer Petras had two 1-yard touchdown rushes in the second quarter. He has three rushing touchdowns this season, five in his career (1, 3, 9, 1, 1). Friday was his first career multi-touchdown game. Petras is the first Iowa quarterback with multiple passing touchdowns and multiple rushing touchdowns in a single same game since Brad Banks in 2002 at Minnesota.

QB Spencer Petras connected with RB Tyler Goodson for a 67-yard touchdown in the third quarter. It was a career-long pass for Petras and a career-long reception for Goodson.

Iowa scored 31 points in the second quarter, the most points scored in a single quarter since scoring 37 in the first quarter against Akron on Aug. 31, 2002. The 31 points scored in a Big Ten game are the most by a Hawkeye team since putting up 35 points on Illinois in the first quarter in 1985.

Six different Hawkeyes intercepted a pass Friday, tying a school record for most players with an interception in a single game (vs. Wisconsin in 1982). The six interceptions are the most in a game since Iowa had a school-record seven interceptions vs. Wisconsin in 1982. Iowa leads the Big Ten with 12 interceptions. Iowa has 76 interception since 2017, more than any team in the country.

Iowa had seven takeaways, its most in a single game since 1987 against Northwestern (8). The Hawkeye defense has scored 20 points this season (3 TDs and 1 safety).

Iowa scored points following its first four takeaways, turning the four takeaways into 24 points. The Hawkeyes have scored 75 points on 16 takeaways this season.
