PENN STATE BACK HOME TO HOST MICHIGAN

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, returns to the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field to host the Michigan Wolverines on Sunday, Oct. 10. The conference match will broadcast live on Big Ten Network starting at 2 p.m. with Dean Linke (pxp) and Tim Lenahan (analyst) on the call.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE DOWNS NO. 22 RUTGERS

- Penn State recorded its second-straight Big Ten road shutout to remain undefeated in the Big Ten as it downed 22nd-ranked Rutgers, 2-0, Tuesday evening at Yurcak Field live on Big Ten Network.
- As most games are in the Big Ten, it was a fast first half with lots of offensive chances by both teams. Rutgers seemed to establish possession in the first five minutes or so before Penn State tilted the possession toward its advantage and started ripping off chances at net.
- After a corner kick attempt by the Scarlet Knights in the 38th minute, goalkeeper Kris Shakes had a great goal kick down the field to Liam Butts who passed it off to Pierre Reedy. Reedy then played Danny Bloyou who just flew into the box and used his head to put the ball in the back of the net to give the Nittany Lions the first goal of the game.
- The second half would start a little slower than the match as a whole, with the first shot not coming until the 61st minute by Rutgers and a save by Shakes.
- In the 83rd minute, Alex Stevenson drew a foul in the box as he got tripped up on a run in the box, setting up a penalty kick opportunity for the Nittany Lions.
- Reedy stepped up to the spot to take the PK and converted to give Penn State some insurance with about seven minutes to play in the match.
- The Penn State defense contained the Scarlet Knights for the remainder of the game to secure its second-straight shutout and fourth of the season. Shakes finished with four saves.
- Penn State now owns nine consecutive wins over Rutgers.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Nine different players have already recorded points this season with sophomore Peter Mangione and junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany Lions with 11 points each. Mangione has a team-high five goals and one assist while Privett adds four goals and three assists.
- Captain of the midfield, Seth Kuhn, paces the team with four assists.
- Penn State is averaging 1.73 goals per game to pace the conference. The Nittany Lions also have the most total goals (19), assists (19) and points (57) in the Big Ten, all marks that also stand top-40 in the nation.

BLOW YOU AWAY

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- The Accra, Ghana, native has scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games now. He totals three goals and three assists for nine total points so far in 2021.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK -> BIG TEN CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six points.
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- The hat trick earned Mangione a Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week nod along with Michigan's Kevin Buca who also had a hat trick. It's Mangione's second career weekly award from the conference.
- Mangione now has a team-high five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total is second in the Big Ten.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (9/30).
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time candidates.
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates are the most of any school.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- Junior midfielder Andrew Privett is really playing well to start the 2021 season, currently tied for the team lead in points with 11 on four goals and three assists.
- The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of
- Privett recorded a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His four goals is a career high as is his 11 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN

- Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of team over self.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native drew a penalty kick against Villanova (9/21) and instead of taking it himself let

- teammate Peter Mangione step up to the spot to earn a hat trick.
- Mangione recounted to the media postgame the situation: "Reedy, the exceptional guy he is, he gave it (the PK) to me and said 'I have all the faith in you, go get your hat trick."

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes has posted three shutouts so far in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.50 saves per game and has 28 total saves, both third in the league.
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 23-4-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.810 is sixth on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.881 is 18th.

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- Junior striker Liam Butts is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native has four goals so far this season, including two game-winners.
- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.
- His two game-winners are third in the conference and 44th in the nation.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.
- As of Oct. 7, Penn State is first in the conference with nine points on a perfect 3-0-0 record.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central
- Kuhn paces the team with four assists to average 0.36 assists per game, a mark that is second in the league. The four total assists also is second in the Big Ten and top-55
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has already matched his assist total from a season ago and is one shy of matching his career high (5, 2019).
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- Kuhn's 15 career assists is 43rd on the NCAA active career leaders list.

FIRSTS FOR FEMI

- Sophomore defender Femi Awodesu has had an outstanding start to year two in Happy Valley, recording his first career goal at West Virginia (9/3) and his first career assist against American (9/6).
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native is also defending well on the backline, making crucial tackles and causing turnovers to help out goalkeeper Kris Shakes and get the Nittany Lions back on offense.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Nittany Lions host nine home games within the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field during the 2021 regular
- Penn State Athletics is happy to welcome fans back to its venues in 2021-22 after having empty stands during the 2020-21 year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Penn State soccer student section, Park Avenue Army, and the State College community have come out in full force to support the program, as Penn State men's soccer ranks top-20 in average attendance with 1,399 fans.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- After a couple of tough results against current ranked teams, Penn State dropped out of the United Soccer Coaches rankings.
- The Nittany Lions are currently receiving votes in the College Soccer News poll.
- Penn State currently has four opponents ranked in the top 25 and an additional two receiving votes: West Virginia (No. 4; L, 9/3), Maryland (No. 12; 10/26), Pittsburgh (No. 13; L, 9/13), Rutgers (No. 22; W, 10/5), Akron (RV; 10/13), Indiana (RV; 10/17).
- The Nittany Lions picked up their first win over a ranked opponent this season in Piscataway against No. 22 Rutgers.

NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES

- Penn State made its debut on national television when it hosted No. 15 Pitt live on FS1 (9/13)
- The Nittany Lions also have four conference games on the Big Ten Network in the month of October, including three crucial games at Jeffrey Field.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Danny Bloyou and Pierre Reedy were both named to the MAC Hermann Trophy preseason watch list on August 26.
- Both are first-time members to the list after standout seasons in 2020-21 as United Soccer Coaches Third Team All-Americans and first team All-Big Ten members.

PRESEASON HONORS

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou is considered a second team preseason All-American by College Soccer News.
- Bloyou was also named a Big Ten Player to Watch along with sophomore forward **Peter Mangione** and redshirt

- senior midfielder Pierre Reedv.
- Bloyou and redshirt senior defender Brandon Hackenberg have also been ranked as No. 34 and No. 39, respectively, by Top Drawer Soccer in the preseason top-100 individual player rankings.

KEEP IT 100

- Penn State returned 100 percent of its scoring offense in 2021, including top point scorers in Danny Bloyou, Peter Mangione and Pierre Reedy.
- The Nittany Lions averaged 2.15 goals per game in 2020-21 to pace the league and rank 13th nationally.
- They also had three games with four goals for the most four-goal games in a season since 2010.

- Penn State returns 21 players from the 2020-21 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Danny Bloyou, Peter Mangione and Pierre Reedy.
- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg also returns for extra season of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after another solid season where he held a 1.05 goals-against average and 0.782 save percentage in 11 starts.

- Penn State added four newcomers to the 2021 roster in four freshmen and one graduate transfer.
- The freshmen include midfielders Sean Bettenhausen (Media, Pa.), Van Danielson (Columbia, Md.), and Ben Liscum (Lewisburg, Pa.).
- Goalkeepr Christopher Palacios (Washington, D.C.) joins the Nittany Lions as a graduate transfer from Dartmouth.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy will lead the Nittany Lions for the second-straight season as team co-captains.
- Senior Seth Kuhn and sophomore Peter Mangione have been added as vice captains for a broader leadership group.

- Last season, the regular-season match between the two teams was postponed due to COVID-19 protocols. The Nittany Lions and Wolverines then met up in the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament in which Penn State dominated Michigan, 4-1, at Jeffrey Field to advance to the championship game.
