INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE VISITS MARYLAND FOR BIG CONTEST

- OPENING KICK: No. 22/23 Penn State faces Maryland on Saturday at Capitol One Field at Maryland Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on FS1. The 2021 season is presented by PSECU.
- SERIES HISTORY: The Nittany Lions will meet Maryland for the 45th matchup. Penn State has won nine of the last 11 contests. Last year, Penn State fell 35-19 in Beaver Stadium. Sean Clifford threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns. Jahan Dotson made nine grabs for 123 yards and a score. Parker Washington added eight catches for 70 yards and two touchdowns. Ellis Brooks registered seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.
- ONE-TWO PUNCH: Jahan Dotson and Parker Washington continued their dynamic seasons at Ohio State. Dotson had a career-high 11 catches for 127 yards and added a 2-yard rushing touchdown. Washington contributed a career-high-tying nine receptions for 108 yards. They also both went over 100 receiving yards against Villanova (Dotson 117, Washington 148). They are the first Penn State receiver duo with multiple 100-yard games in a season since 2014 (DaeSean Hamilton and Geno Lewis).
- NO FLY ZONE: The Nittany Lions' pass defense has been strong in 2021. Penn State ranks eighth in the country in opponent pass efficiency rating (103.56). The blue and white is allowing 193.9 passing yards per contest, good for 25th in the country. The Nittany Lions hold sixth in the country allowing 5.64 yards per pass attempt and seventh allowing 9.94 yards per completion. Penn State's nine interceptions are good for 22nd in the nation.
- **OUTSTANDING PUNT COVERAGE:** Led by Jordan Stout's 48.5 punt average, the highest season punt average in program history by 4.51 yards, Penn State is second in the nation with a 46.54 net punting average. Stout has placed 19 punts inside the 20 this season.
- THE OPPOSITION: Maryland improved to 5-3 with a 38-35 win over Indiana last Saturday. The Terrapins collected 498 total yards, including 419 through the air. Taulia Tagovailoa completed 26-of-40 passes for 419 yards and two touchdowns. Carlos Carriere hauled in eight catches for 134 yards and two touchdowns. Challen Faamatau added two rushing touchdowns. Mosiah Nasili-Kite led the Maryland defense with eight tackles, including a sack.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 89-46 career record with a winning record in eight of his nine seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last five seasons, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From in 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 26 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 10 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 82 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Since 2016, the Nittany Lions have had 29 players selected in the NFL Draft. With six selections in 2021, Penn State is one of five programs to produce at least five draft picks in each of the last four NFL Drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last nine seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In 2020, with Franklin's emphasis on safety, along with the precautions set by him, the coaching staff, medical staff and support staff, Penn State was one of only two Big Ten teams to play all nine of its scheduled games during a shortened season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
 over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
 College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
 wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
 the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- A program-record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

SERIES NOTES

HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

- Michael Locksley is in his third full season as Maryland's head coach.
- Locksley arrived at Maryland following a three-year stint at Alabama. He served as the Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator in 2018 after being co-offensive coordinator during Alabama's 2017 National Championship season.
- This is Lockley's third stint at Maryland. He most recently served as
 offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2012-15, and
 was the Terrapins' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator
 from 1997-2002. Locksley was Maryland's interim head coach for
 the final six games of the 2015 season.
- His other Big Ten coaching experience came at Illinois where he served as offensive coordinator while coaching the tight ends in 2005 and quarterbacks from 2006-08.
- Locksley is a head coach for the second time in his career. He was the head coach at New Mexico from 2009-11.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

- Maryland is 5-3 on the season after a 38-35 win over Indiana last Saturday.
- The Terrapins also have wins over West Virginia (30-24), Howard (62-0), Illinois (20-17) and Kent State (37-16).
- Maryland threw for 419 yards in its win over the Hoosiers.
- The Terrapins rank fifth in the Big Ten in scoring offense (29.2) and total offense (431.1), while holding second in passing offense (309.2).
- QB Taulia Tagovailoa leads the Big Ten with 2,384 passing yards and completions per game (24.75), while sitting second in completion percentage (70.2), passing yards per game (298.0) and passing touchdowns (17).
- WR Rakim Jarrett is fifth in the Big Ten with five touchdown receptions.
- Maryland ranks 13th in the conference in scoring defense (30.4), 12th in total defense (402.5), 10th in passing defense (241.5) and 13th in rushing defense (161.0).
- S Nick Cross paces Maryland with 47 tackles, including a sack, and two interceptions.
- DL Sam Okuayinonu leads the unit with 7.5 tackles for loss and five sacks.

LAST MEETING FIRST HALF LEADS MARYLAND PAST PENN STATE, 35-19

Penn State tried to rally from an early deficit with 290 yards of total offense in the second half, but Maryland's explosive scoring plays in the first half were enough for a 35-19 victory.

Penn State held Maryland to 70 yards with no scores on offense in the second half, but was unable overcome a 28-7 halftime deficit.


Quarterback Sean Clifford attempted a school-record 57 passes and threw for 340 yards and three touchdowns as he tried to rally the Nittany Lions late, and freshman wide receiver Parker Washington caught eight passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson finished with nine catches for 123 yards - his second-straight 100-yard receiving game - and tight end Pat Freiermuth caught six passes for 91 yards, as both surpassed 1,000 yards receiving for their careers in the game.

Maryland scored all of its touchdowns from 34 or more yards out. Quarterback Taulia Tagovailoa completed 18-of-26 passes for 282 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Rakim Jarrett caught five passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns. Defensive end Jayson Oweh led the Nittany Lions on defense with 10 tackles and two tackles for loss, while safety Nick Cross led the Terps with eight tackles, a sack, interception and two pass break ups.

Maryland took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a pair of big touchdown receptions by Jarrett, who caught a 42-yard touchdown the Terps' first possession and a 62-yard score with 19 seconds remaining in the opening frame, and then went up three touchdowns with a 38-yard rush by Funk early in the second quarter.

Penn State got on the board with 6:32 remaining in the half, as Clifford engineered a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive capped by a 20-yard touchdown toss to Dotson, but Tagovailoa connected with Demus for a 34-yard touchdown before the break for a 28-7 halftime lead.

Maryland extended its lead in the second half on a fumble recovery for a touchdown. Clifford connected with Washington for a 23-yard touchdown with 10:16 remaining to complete a 16-play, 98-yard drive, and again in the final seconds for a 1-yard score.

- Franklin and Maryland head coach Michael Locksley coached together on Maryland's staff from 2000-02. Franklin was the wide receivers coach and Locksley was the running backs coach.
- Penn State defensive line coach John Scott Jr. and Maryland offensive coordinator Dan Enos were on the Arkansas staff together during the 2017 season. Scott was the defensive line coach and Enos was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Penn State wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield and Enos coached on the Miami staff together in 2019. Stubblefield was the wide receivers coach and Enos was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Assistant AD of performance enhancement Dwight Galt is a graduate of Maryland and spent 22 years with the Maryland strength & conditioning staff. His sons, Dwight IV and Tommy, both played at Maryland and are former members of the Nittany Lions' staff.
- Maryland cornerbacks coach Henry Baker played at Maryland from 1994-97 when Galt was the director of strength and conditioning and was a recruiting intern at Maryland in 2001 when Franklin was the wide receivers coach.
- Penn State assistant AD, chief of staff Kevin Threlkel served at Maryland as a football operations intern in 2009 and program management specialist in 2010.

OHIO STATE NOTES

- Penn State threw for 361 yards, the eighth-most in a game in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions completed 35 passes, the most in a game under Franklin, and attempted 52 passes, the second-most in a game under Franklin.
- Penn State stopped Ohio State on 4th-and-3 at the PSU 13 to hold their opponent without a score the ninth time this season.
- With a fumble recovery in the first quarter, dating back to the Nebraska game in 2020, Penn State has forced a turnover in 14-straight games (21 total, 14 interceptions, seven fumbles), the sixth-longest streak among FBS teams and the thirdlongest among Power Five teams.

ILLINOIS NOTES

- The nine overtime-game set an NCAA record for most overtimes across all divisions. The previous NCAA football mark was an eight-overtime game between Bethune-Cookman and Virginia State in 1998. In FBS, there have been six, seven-overtime games.
- The nine-overtime game came under the NCAA's overtime format, adopted before the 2021 season, which includes teams trading 2-point conversion attempts beginning in the third overtime.
- Penn State's previous longest overtime game was a fourovertime win over Michigan (43-40) in 2013.
- The Nittany Lions held Illinois to 38 yards passing, on 21 attempts, the second-lowest mark under James Franklin.
- Penn State held an opponent to 24 or less points for an 11-straight games, dating back to the Michigan game in 2020.

- Four of the last five Penn State-lowa meetings have been decided by one score.
- The Nittany Lions are 4-7 all-time in matchups where both teams are ranked in the top five of the AP Poll.
- Penn State has an all-time record of 101-23-1 when ranked among the Top Five.
- Dating back to the second half at Wisconsin, Penn State had scored in 21-straight quarters until the fourth quarter against lowa.
- The Nittany Lions allowed just 195 passing yards. It marks the 55th time Penn State has held an opponent under 200 passing yards since 2014.
- Penn State had a season-high 11 tackles for loss.

INDIANA NOTES

- The Nittany Lions improved to 19-10 in Big Ten home openers.
- Penn State recorded its first shutout both overall and in a Big Ten game since a 59-0 win over Maryland in 2019.
- Penn State handed Indiana its first shutout since a 2000 loss to Michigan (58-0), a span of 246 games.
- Penn State scored on a 9-play, 96-yard drive in the second quarter. It is Penn State's longest drive, by yards, this season.
- With two touchdowns in the game, QB Sean Clifford and WR Jahan Dotson connected for the 18th time on TD scores, passing Todd Blackledge and Kenny Jackson (1980-82) for the most by a Penn State QB-WR duo in program history.
- With a stop on fourth-and-goal in the first quarter and a blocked field goal in the third quarter, the Nittany Lions earned their seventh red zone stop of the year.
- The Nittany Lions blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter. It was Penn State's second blocked field goal of the season. It marks the first time Penn State has blocked two or more field goals in a season since 2004 (five blocked field goals).

VILLANOVA NOTES

- Penn State improved to 6-3-1 all-time against Villanova.
- The Nittany Lions are 171-96-12 all-time against current FBS and FCS Pennsylvania schools, including 19-straight home wins against Pennsylvania programs dating back to a 42-3 win over Temple in 1989.
- Penn State is now 116-79-12 all-time against current FCS programs.
- The Nittany Lions' 429 passing yards marked the second-highest total in school history, behind only a 454-yard passing effort vs. UCF in the Croke Park Classic in Dublin in 2014.
- WR Parker Washington (148) and WR Jahan Dotson (117) became the first Penn State duo with 100 receiving yards in a game since KJ Hamler (119) and Pat Freiermuth (101) at Minnesota in 2019.

- With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State talied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- Penn State earned its first regular season win over an SEC team since a road victory at Alabama in 1990 (9-0) and first home win over an SEC team since a 19-17 win against Alabama in 1985.
- Penn State is now 2-1 all-time against Auburn.
- The Nittany Lions moved to 24-23 against current members of the SEC.

- Penn State snapped Wisconsin's 25-game home opener win streak.
- Both teams were scoreless at halftime. It marked the first time a Penn State game was scoreless at the half since October 29, 2011 against Illinois.
- It was the first time a Big Ten conference game was scoreless at the half since Michigan-Northwestern in 2014.
- K/P Jordan Stout was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after averaging 53.9 yards per punt, including a 76yard punt.

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in touchdown percentage (32.0; 17th nationally), scoring offense (34.1; 17th), points per possession (2.18; 20th), yards per pass attempt (8.00; 24th), yards per play (6.1; 28th) and total offense (422.3; 37th) and is third in scoring percentage (40 83·20th)
- · Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 70-plus yard play percentage (0.41 percent; 9th nationally) and 80-plus (0.20; 3rd), ranks second in 20-plus (7.99; 12th), 40-plus (2.08; 16th) and 50plus (1.02; 32nd) and holds third in 30-plus (3.64; 20th) and 60-plus (0.55; 30th).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 13th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.75 percent).
- Penn State has gained 200 or more rushing yards 33 times in the James Franklin era. Penn State is 28-5 in those games.
- PSU has rushed for over 200 yards in at least four games in each of the last five seasons (2016-20).
- · Sean Clifford has connected with Jahan Dotson for 18 passing touchdowns in their careers.
- With two Clifford-to-Dotson touchdowns against Indiana, the duo passed Todd Blackledge and Kenny Jackson (17; 1980-82) for the most by a Penn State QB-WR duo.
- Clifford and Dotson are tied for the most passing touchdowns of any current FBS duo with Iowa State's Brock Purdy-Charlie Kolar (18).
- In 2021, Dotson (60 rec, 690 yards, 6 TD) and Parker Washington (41, 482, 2) are one of three receiver duos with at least 40 receptions and 480 receiving yards among Power Five teams through their first eight games of the season.

- The Nittany Lions used a 254-yard offensive effort in the second half at No. 12/15 Wisconsin to secure the win.
- Penn State returned nine starters and 19 letterwinners (10 lost) on offense from the 2020 season. Eight of Penn State's nine leading pass catchers and four of its top five rushers from 2020 are back for 2021.
- During the 2020 season, Penn State true freshmen accounted for 1,486 total yards (38%) of Penn State's 3,873 yards on offense, a school record.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Redshirt senior Sean Clifford is in his third season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 32 career games, making 27 starts.
- Clifford is a finalist for the NFF's William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the nation's top football scholar athlete and is a member of the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Class.
- Clifford, who was also named to the Allstate Good Works Team, owns a 3.45 cumulative GPA, graduated with a degree in public relations in December 2020 and is pursuing a second degree in journalism.
- Clifford is one of 25 quarterbacks being considered for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and is one of 40 candidates for the Davey O'Brien Award.
- Clifford began the 2021 season on the watch lists for the Manning Award, Reese's Senior Bowl and Wuerffel Trophy.
- Clifford is just one of four Penn State players all-time to reach 7,500-plus yards of total offense and one of five quarterbacks to reach 6,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of 16 current FBS quarterbacks with 6,500 passing yards and over 860 rushing yards in his career.
- Clifford owns 24 career games with multi-TD passes, including nine with three or more TDs and three with four or more.
- The redshirt senior has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 14 occasions and nine different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- Clifford owns six career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns.
- The quarterback has tossed five career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 89 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Since 2000, Clifford's 65.2 completion percentage is the secondhighest through eight games (minimum 200 attempts) by a Penn State quarterback, trailing only Trace McSorley (65.9% in 2017).
- Clifford has at least 2,000 passing yards and 13 passing touchdowns through the first eight games of a season for the first time in his career. He joins McSorley (2017), Christian Hackenberg (2013) and Matt McGloin (2012) as Penn State QBs to accomplish the feat since 2000.
- Since 2000, Clifford's 2,008 passing yards are the fifth-most through the first eight games of a season by a Penn State quarterback.
- Clifford ranks third in the conference in completions per game (21.5, 18th nationally), fourth in passing yards (2,008, 30th) and passing touchdowns (13, 43rd) and fifth in completion percentage (65.2, 39th).

- At Ohio State, Clifford completed a career-high 35 passes, for 361 yards and a touchdown, tying Matt McGloin's school record set against Northwestern in 2012.
- The redshirt senior, who found TE Brenton Strange for a 5-yard touchdown in the first quarter, attempted 52 passes against the Buckeyes, the fourth-most in a game at Penn State.
- Clifford connected with WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** on a 42-yard touchdown against Illinois.
- Against Indiana, Clifford threw three touchdown passes, connecting with Strange (10 yards) and WR Jahan Dotson (8 yards, 30 yards).
- Clifford became the fifth Penn State quarterback to reach 6,000 passing yards, against Indiana. He currently has 6,740 passing yards.
- Against Villanova, Clifford became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 400 passing yards and four passing touchdowns in a game.
- He set career-high 401 passing yards and tied a career high with four passing touchdowns to earn Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- Clifford was 12-of-12 for 265 yards on the day when targeting Dotson (seven catches for 117 yards) and **Parker Washington** (five catches for 148 yards).
- With three touchdown passes of 52 or more yards against Villanova, Clifford brought his career TD pass total of 40-plus yards to 12.
- Against Auburn, Clifford completed a career-high 28 passes, on 32 attempts.
- Per ESPN, Clifford's 87.5 completion percentage, against Auburn, is the highest by a Penn State quarterback in the last 25 years.
- Redshirt sophomore Ta'Quan Roberson completed his first pass as a Nittany Lion against Ball State, a 23-yard touchdown strike to TE Theo Johnson.
- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.

- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.

- Dotson's 14.80 yards per reception in his career is second among current Power Five receivers (minimum 150 catches) and seventh among FBS receivers.
- Dotson had six catches, including a 36-yard grab, vs. Illinois and eight catches against Iowa.
- Dotson caught eight passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns against Indiana, his fourth career multi-touchdown reception game.
- Dotson made seven grabs for 117 yards and a touchdown against Villanova, his eighth career 100-yard receiving game.
- Dotson had a 52-yard touchdown reception on Penn State's first offensive play, giving him nine career touchdown receptions of 40 or more yards.
- Dotson's nine career 100-yard receiving games ties him with Chris Godwin (2014-16), DaeSean Hamilton (2014-17) and Joe Jurevicius (1994-97) for third-most at Penn State.
- Only three current FBS Power Five receivers have more career 100-yard receiving games than Dotson's nine, Purdue's David Bell (14), Texas Tech's Kaylon Geiger (11) and Ohio State's Chris Olave (10).

- Dotson had a career-high 11 receptions at Ohio State, earning his ninth career 100-yard receiving game with 127 yards.
- Dotson and Washington (108) both recorded over 100 receiving yards in a game for the second time this season, joining their performance against Villanova (Dotson 117, Washington 148).
- Dotson and Washington are the first Penn State receivers to post multiple 100-yard receiving games in a season since 2014 (DaeSean Hamilton and Geno Lewis).
- Dotson also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown against the Buckeyes.
- Dotson had a career-best 10 receptions against Auburn, becoming the first Penn State player with double-digit receptions in a game since Saquon Barkley's 12 against lowa in 2017 and the first receiver with double-digit receptions since DaeSean Hamilton's 14 against Ohio State in 2014.
- Dotson caught a 4-yard touchdown against the Tigers.
- Dotson completed a 22-yard pass to redshirt freshman TE Tyler Warren in the second quarter. It was Dotson's first career pass attempt and completion. Dotson also completed a 21-yard pass to Washington against Indiana.
- Dotson had five receptions for 102 yards, and a 49-yard touchdown, against Wisconsin.
- Dotson turned a screen pass into a 25-yard touchdown against Ball State.
- Washington has a catch in all 17 games of his career.
- Washington had a career-high 148 receiving yards and two touchdowns on five catches against Villanova. Washington had touchdown receptions of 52 and 23 yards and added a careerlong 67-yard catch.
- Washington made eight grabs against Auburn.
- Washington sits sixth in the Big Ten averaging 5.1 catches per game, 10th in receiving yards (482) and receiving yards per game (60.2).
- Sophomore KeAndre Lambert-Smith had five receptions for 71 yards against Wisconsin, including a 54-yard catch.
- Lambert-Smith had a career-long 83-yard touchdown reception against Villanova. It's the sixth-longest pass play in program history. Lambert-Smith finished the Villanova game with a career-high 88 receiving yards.
- Lambert-Smith hauled in a 42-yard touchdown reception vs. Illinois, his fourth reception of 30+ yards this season.
- Junior ATH Marquis Wilson made his first career reception in the first quarter against Ball State, making him the first Penn State player to earn snaps on both sides of the ball in the same game since Dae'Lun Darien in 2017 against Maryland.
- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Taylor** Stubblefield is in his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Stubblefield is in his 14th year as a receivers coach, including five seasons with Power Five programs.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Penn State boasts a deep running back corps. The room has combined to play in 107 games, including 38 starts. Four members have started at least one game.
- Junior **Noah Cain** leads the running backs group and returns after missing all but the first drive at Indiana in 2020.
- Cain had a rushing touchdown in each of the first three games of a season for the second time in his career (2019, 2021).
- Cain scored on a 3-yard run against Auburn.
- Cain rushed for 69 yards and a 5-yard touchdown against Ball State. He also set a career high with 30 receiving yards on three catches.
- Cain found the end zone on a 2-yard run at lowa.
- Cain averaged 6.0 yards per carry against Wisconsin. The sophomore had a career-long 34-yard carry in the fourth quarter against the Badgers.
- Cain reached the 500-yard mark for his career with a 48-yard day against Wisconsin.
- Sophomore RB Keyvone Lee had a career-long 44-yard run against Indiana. He added a 21-yard run to lead Penn State with 74 yards on eight carries.
- Lee scored on a 1-yard run at Ohio State.
- Lee averaged 8.5 yards per carry against Ball State with eight carries for 68 yards. He added a career-long 24-yard reception.
- The trio of Lee, junior Devyn Ford and sophomore Caziah Holmes combined for 207 carries, 939 yards and nine touchdowns in 2020.
- · Ford has rushed for 618 career yards and six touchdowns.
- Senior RB John Lovett made his Penn State debut against Auburn and had an 18-yard reception.
- Lovett tallied 1,803 rushing yards and 5.07 yards per carry at Baylor from 2017-20.
- Lovett rushed for 655 yards in 2019 and 573 yards in 2018.
- Run game coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 13 yards of college coaching experience, including 10 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, he won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for fifth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).

- Penn State had four tight ends on opening week NFL rosters (Nick Bowers, Freiermuth, Gesicki and James), trailing only Stanford (5) among FBS programs.
- Redshirt sophomore Brenton Strange leads a young, but talented, tight end room that looks to continue a strong tight end tradition at Penn State.
- Strange caught a 5-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter at Ohio State.
- Strange hauled in a 10-yard touchdown reception against Indiana. It was his fifth career touchdown catch.
- Strange set career highs with four catches for 71 yards against Auburn, including a career-long 40-yard reception.
- Sophomore Theo Johnson caught a 23-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter against Ball State, his first career touchdown reception.
- Johnson had a career-best 37-yard reception against Auburn and a 20-yard reception against Indiana.
- Redshirt freshman Tyler Warren scored a 3-yard run against Villanova and a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn.
- Warren added a career-long 22-yard reception vs. Auburn.
- Johnson (4), Strange (2) and Warren (1) have combined for seven 20-plus yard receptions this season.
- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** was named to the position on February 5, 2021 after serving as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the NIttany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.

2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

2021 PENN STATE FOOTBALL 17

- Penn State lettermen LaVar Arrington, Paul Posluszny and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2022. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2022 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2022. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Arrington, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 1998 and 1999. In 1999, he was selected winner of the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker and Chuck Bednarik Award as the country's top defensive player, while also being a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. The 12th Nittany Lion selected a two-time first-team All-American, Arrington finished ninth in balloting for the 1999 Heisman Trophy. Was the first sophomore selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 1998. In 1999, he made 72 tackles, with 20 TFL, nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries (one TD) and two blocked kicks. His leaping tackle over the offensive line of an Illinois runner was selected the 1998 Compaq Defensive Play of the Year.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American for the Year among Division I football players.
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 24 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Five coaches and 19 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the ARIA Resort & Casino Las Vegas. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2022 season.

LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Several members of the Penn State coaching and support staffs played at Penn State
- Cornerbacks Coach **Terry M. Smith** was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight Ends Coach Ty Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive Graduate Assistant Deion Barnes made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors
- Offensive Graduate Assistant Wendy Laurent played in 34 games and made eight starts as a Nittany Lion from 2013-16. Laurent was a key member of the line that helped Penn State to a Big Ten Championship in 2016
- Assistant Recruiting Coordinator Alan Zemaitis was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are allowing just 17.0 points per game in 2021, ranking eighth in the country and second in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is allowing opponents only a 69.0 conversion rate in the red zone this season, ranking ninth in the country and leading the Big Ten.
- In 29 opponent red zone trips, Penn State has held opposing teams without a score on nine possessions.
- Penn State has held its opponents to a 27.59 touchdown conversion percentage in the red zone, marking the best in the country (29 attempts, eight touchdowns).
- The Nittany Lions' nine red zone stops are behind only Virginia (10) and Washington State (10) among Power Five teams and are tied for second-most with Vanderbilt.
- Penn State has allowed just five passing touchdowns this season, tied for fourth in the country.
- Over the last seven seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.06; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (900), fourth in total pressures generated (1336), sixth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.07), sixth in tackles for loss percentage (10.72), ninth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.29) and 11th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.58).
- Penn State's 254 sacks over the last seven years (2015-21) are fifth behind Clemson (312), Alabama (274), Pitt (256) and Ohio State (255).
- Over the last seven years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.65 percent sack percentage (254 sacks on 3,032 plays), which ranks fourth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 22 times, tied fifth-most among FBS teams. Sixteen of those 22 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2014, Penn State has kept opponents under 300 total yards 44 times, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- Against Illinois, S Ji'Ayir Brown (13), LB Ellis Brooks (11) and DE Arnold Ebiketie (10) all had double-digit tackles. It was the first time Penn State had three players with 10+ tackles in a game since 2019 at Ohio State (Micah Parsons, 11; Garrett Taylor, 11; Lamont Wade 11).
- Ohio State entered the game leading the nation avaerfaging 49.3 points per game and was limited on offense to two touchdowns and three field goals
- Penn State limited Illinois to 38 passing yards, the second-lowest by an opponent since 2014.
- Penn State has held opponents under 100 passing yards in 14 games since 2014, tied 11th-most among Power Five teams.
- Penn State held lowa to 195 passing yards and 2.4 yards per carry.
- The Nittany Lions had 11 tackles for loss against lowa.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 40 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 23 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, six former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs and two former PSU student-athletes from sports other than football are on rosters.
- Six players from PSU's 2020 squad are on NFL teams.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- The Nittany Lions defensive line unit has combined to play in 249 career games.
- Senior DT PJ Mustipher anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 40 career games and making 16 starts. In his Penn State career, Mustipher owns 107 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- A 2020 All-Big Ten honorable mention selection, Mustipher is a 2021 semifinalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award, a quarterfinalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy and is on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- Mustipher suffered a season-ending injury at lowa.
- The senior recorded a sack against Villanova before tallying six tackles and a tackle for loss against Indiana.
- Mustipher and redshirt senior DE Arnold Ebiketie tied for the defensive line lead with seven tackles against Wisconsin.
- Ebiketie, who joined the Nittany Lions after a four-year stint at Temple (2017-20), paces Penn State with 11.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks.
- Ebiketie's 11.5 tackles for loss lead all Power Five defensive linemen.
- The Silver Spring, Md. native ranks second in the Big Ten in tackles for loss per game (1.4, 8th nationally) and sixth in sacks per game (0.69, 37th).
- The defensive end was named a Midseason All-America First Team honoree by The Athletic and is currently on the Ted Hendricks Award Watch List.
- He had an impressive Penn State debut with seven solo tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack, while also adding a blocked field goal against Wisconsin.
- Ebiketie's sack came at a crucial moment of the game, with the Badgers facing 2nd-and-10 at the PSU 25. Ebiketie recorded a 7-yard sack and forced an intentional grounding penalty.
- The redshirt senior recorded a solo sack against Indiana and blocked his second field goal of the season, a 30-yard attempt.
- Ebiketie is the first Penn State player with two blocked field goals in a season since Scott Paxson in 2004.
- Born in Yaounde, Cameroon, Ebiketie tied a career best with 3.5 tackles for loss at lowa and had nine tackles.
- In the Illinois contest, Ebiketie recorded a season-high 10 tackles, matching his career best and the most by a Penn State defensive end since Yetur Gross-Matos recorded 10 at Indiana in 2018, while also adding 1.5 sacks.
- He was one of two veterans Penn State added to its defensive line during the offseason with senior DT Derrick Tangelo joining as well.
- Tangelo came to Penn State from Duke, where he played in 45 career games (27 starts).
- Tangelo recovered a fumble against Auburn.
- He forced a fumble on a sack in the third quarter against Illinois, his first forced fumble at Penn State and the sixth of his career.
- Redshirt junior DE Nick Tarburton has appeared in 17 career games, making five starts.
- He recovered a fumble in the red zone, the first of his career, in the second quarter against Wisconsin.
- Tarburton made an assist on a sack against Illinois that resulted in a forced fumble and recovery for Penn State.
- Senior Jesse Luketa has split time between defensive end and linebacker this season.
- Luketa leads Penn State with five quarterback hurries and is third on the team with five tackles for loss.
- Redshirt freshman DT **Coziah Izzard** made his first career start against Illinois and has appeared in nine career games.
- Izzard recorded his first career sack against Villanova.
- Redshirt sophomore DT **Dvon Ellies** recovered a fumble in the second quarter against Illinois, his first career recovery.
- John Scott Jr. is in his second season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps.
- Scott brings 17 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.

LINEBACKERS NOTES

- Penn State's linebacking corps has combined for 197 career games.
- Redshirt senior Ellis Brooks, a veteran in the group, has appeared in 36 career games, making 16 starts.
- He sits sixth in the Big Ten averaving 5.0 solo tackles per game and 11th averaging 7.8 tackles per game.
- Brooks' 62 tackles are the most by a Penn State player through the first eight games of a season since Marcus Allen in 2016 (69).
- He paced the Nittany Lions with 11 tackles, eight solo, against Wisconsin, while adding a solo sack in the first quarter.
- Brooks recorded a career-best 14 tackles (eight solo) against lowa.
- He added 11 tackles against Illinois, marking his fourth career game, and third this season, with double-digit tackles.
- Senior Jesse Luketa and junior Brandon Smith each earned a spot on the 2021 Butkus Award Watch List.
- Smith was named a semifinalist for the Butkus Award.
- Smith was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after a career-high 10 tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Auburn.
- He recorded a solo sack and a pass breakup against Indiana.
- The junior forced a fumble on a sack in the second quarter against Illinois, marking his first career forced fumble and fourth career sack.
- Luketa, who is tied second on the team with six tackles for loss, has appeared in 42 career games, making 14 starts.
- The senior, who has split time at defensive end and linebacker, was named the Pro Football Focus National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance vs. Ball State.
- He recorded his first career interception against the Cardinals, returning it 16 yards for a touchdown.
- The senior followed that up with eight tackles and a tackle for loss against Auburn.
- Luketa tallied a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss at lowa.
- Sophomore Curtis Jacobs, making his first career start, notched a career-best five tackles in the season opener at Wisconsin.
- Jacobs, who has played in 16 career games and making seven starts, posted his first career sack against Ball State.
- Jacobs registered a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss and a solo sack at lowa.
- He followed that up by making a diving catch for his first career interception in the first quarter against Illinois, while matching his career high in tackles with five.
- Jacobs had a career-high seven tackles and a career-hightying two tackles for loss at Ohio State.
- Redshirt junior **Charlie Katshir** also brings a veteran presence to the group, having played in 23 career games.
- Katshir had a career high-tying three stops against Ball State.
- In addition to leading the Nittany Lion defense, **Brent Pry** is in his eighth season coaching linebackers at Penn State.
- In his previous seven seasons, Pry has coached seven Penn State linebackers that have moved on to the NFL.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- He was the first Nittany Lion defensive player drafted in the first round since Jared Odrick (2010; 28th overall to the Miami Dolphins) and the first PSU linebacker selected in the first round since LaVar Arrington (2000; second overall to the Washington Redskins).
- Parsons became the fifth Penn State linebacker to be selected in the first round, joining Arrington, Shane Conlan (1987; eighth overall to the Buffalo Bills), Ed O'Neil (1974; eighth overall to the Detroit Lions) and Dave Robinson (1963; 14th overall to the Green Bay Packers).
- Penn State has 69 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.



CORNERBACKS NOTES

- The Nittany Lion defense includes a deep and talented secondary. The group has combined to play in 342 games and start 86 contests at the Power Five level.
- Penn State has forced nine interceptions in 2021, ranking 22nd in the FBS and fourth in the Big Ten.
- The Nittany Lions are holding opposing offenses to a 103.56 passing efficiency, ranking second in the Big Ten and sitting sixth in the nation.
- Penn State is allowing just 193.9 passing yards per game, holding fifth in the Big Ten and 25th in the country.
- An All-Big Ten selection in 2019 and 2020, senior CB Tariq Castro-Fields returns to lead the cornerbacks. He has 130 tackles, three interceptions and 25 pass breakups in his Penn State career.
- Castro-Fields had a season-high two pass breakups against Indiana.
- Castro-Fields also had a key pass breakup that resulted in an interception by S Ji'Ayir Brown against Villanova.
- Redshirt sophomore CB Joey Porter Jr. matched a career high with six tackles against Wisconsin and made a key pass breakup on third down before an interception by S Jaquan Brisker.
- Porter tied his career best with six stops and had a pass breakup against Auburn.
- Porter added his first career forced fumble in the fourth quarter against the Tigers.
- · Porter grabbed his first career interception against Indiana.
- Porter recorded a career-high nine tackles, eight solo, against Illinois and broke up a pass.
- Redshirt sophomore CB Daequan Hardy recorded his first career interception against Ball State.
- Hardy broke up two passes in each game against Villanova and Indiana.
- Hardy had a career-best 2.0 tackles for loss and a solo sack at lowa.
- Freshman CB Kalen King posted three tackles and his first career forced fumble against Ball State.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 56 games, tied for the fourth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State held Illinois to 38 yards passing, the second-lowest by an opponent in the **James Franklin** era.
- Terry M. Smith is in his eighth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last six seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen six defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).

SAFETIES NOTES

- Senior Jaquan Brisker leads the safeties room.
- Brisker was tabbed a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award and the Bednarik Award.
- Brisker was named Midseason All-America by the Associated Press, ESPN and The Athletic (first team).
- Brisker is on preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Reese's Senior Bowl. He additionally was named a second-team Preseason All-American by the Associated Press.
- Brisker has at least a half tackle for loss in six of eight games this season.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Brisker has played 772 coverage snaps without allowing a touchdown, the most in college football since 2019.
- Against Wisconsin, two Lackawanna College alums played a big role. Brisker and senior S Ji'Ayir Brown each recorded interceptions in the closing minutes to seal the victory.
- Brisker's interception stopped a Wisconsin drive inside the Penn State 10. He returned the interception 41 yards.
- Brisker added a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against the Badgers.
- Brisker recorded an interception in the first quarter against lowa. He added a career-high-tying nine tackles (seven solo).
- Brisker tallied eight tackles and a fumble recovery against Illinois.
- Brown ranks fourth in the Big Ten with three interceptions this season, good for 10th in the FBS.
- Since 2000, Brown is the third Nittany Lion to record three interceptions in the first five games of a season, joining James Boyd (2000) and Nick Sukay (2010).
- Brown had a career-high, and team-best, 13 tackles (11 solo) against Illinois.
- Brown forced and recovered a fumble at Ohio State, his first career forced fumble and recovery.
- Against Indiana, Brown became the first Penn State player with at least three interceptions in a season since 2018 (Garrett Taylor 3, Amani Oruwariye 3, Nick Scott 3).
- Brown made his first start against Wisconsin and tallied his first interception, as time expired, as a Nittany Lion.
- Brown picked off a pass in the third quarter against Villanova and added a tackle for loss.
- · Brown intercepted a pass against Indiana.
- Redshirt senior S Jonathan Sutherland led the PSU secondary with seven tackles, six solo, against the Badgers.
- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach Anthony Poindexter is in his first season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Penn State brought back starters at kicker, punter, long snapper, holder and punt returner in 2021.
- Redshirt senior Jordan Stout has served as Penn State's kicker, for both field goals and extra points, punter and kickoff specialist in all eight games this season.
- Stout was named Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week after his performance against Illinois, where he hit four punts of 50+ yards and dropped six inside the 20.
- Stout owns Penn State's best career punt average (45.37), leading by 2.24 yards per punt.
- Stout also holds Penn State's highest season punt average (48.46), ahead by 4.51 yards per punt.
- Stout, San Diego State's Matt Araiza, Texas' Cameron Dicker and UConn's Joe McFadden are the only FBS players handling kickoff, field goal and punt duties for their team this season.
- Among the four, Stout leads the group in touchbacks (39) and kickoffs returned (0).
- Stout is second among the four in opponent drive start average (28.23 yard-line), net punting average (46.54), 50+ yard punts (20) and punts inside the 20 (19).
- Led by Stout, Penn State ranks second in the country in net punting (46.54).
- Stout is fourth in the country, and second in the Big Ten, with a 48.5 punt average.
- Stout averaged at least 50.0 yards per punt in four games this season.
- Twenty of Stout's 41 punts this season have been 50 or more yards.
- Stout has landed 19 punts inside the 20, including a careerhigh six against Illinois, eight inside the 10 and two inside the 5.
- Stout's 92.9 touchback percentage is the highest in the FBS among kickers with 40 or more kickoffs. Stout has yet to allow a kickoff return this season.
- Since 1997, Stout ranks third at Penn State in career kickoff average (63.7) behind only Anthony Fera (66.4; 2010-11) and Robbie Gould (64.0; 2002-04).
- Since the kickoff yard-line was moved back to the 35 in 2011, Stout has the highest average among Penn State kickers.
- At Ohio State, Stout hit a pair of 55-yard punts, landing one inside the 20.
- Stout also hit a 47-yard field goal to close out the first half.
- Against Illinois, Stout hit four punts of 50+ yards and landed a career-high six inside the 20.
- Stout converted a career-high-tying three field goal attempts.
- Stout was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week following the Indiana game. It marks his second time earning the award this season. He also won it after his performance at Wisconsin.
- Against Indiana, Stout averaged 46.3 yards on six punts. He hit 51 and 50 yard punts and landed four inside the 20, including one inside the 10.
- Stout also hit a 50-yard field goal. It was his fourth career 50+ yard field goal.

- Stout sits second all-time at Penn State in 50-yard field goals, behind only Chris Bahr (6; 1973-75).
- Against Auburn, Stout averaged 50.0 yards per punt with two over 50 yards and one downed inside the 20.
- Stout earned Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career after averaging 53.9 yards on seven punt attempts against Wisconsin.
- His 53.9 punt average ranks second-best in a game at Penn State behind only Ralph Giacomarro (54.75; 1981 at Syracuse).
- Stout hit five punts of 50-plus yards, including a 76-yarder.
- The 76-yard punt is the longest of Stout's career and tied for third-longest in program history.
- Stout has 23 career punts of 50+ yards.
- Stout hit three field goals against the Cardinals, incuding a 45-yarder.
- Nine of Stout's 16 career field goals are longer than 40 yards.
- On kickoffs, Stout has landed 39 of 42 for touchbacks.
- Senior PR Jahan Dotson averaged 24.6 yards per punt return in 2020, ranking first all-time at Penn State. He was named honorable mention All-Big Ten as a punt returner.
- Dotson's 14.6 career punt return average is sixth all-time at Penn State.
- Dotson's 14.6 career punt return average (21 returns) is the fifth-best among current FBS players.
- Dotson returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown against Michigan State in 2020.
- DE Arnold Ebiketie blocked an Indiana 30-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter. It was his second blocked field goal of the season.
- Ebiketie is the first Penn State player with two blocked field goals in a season since Scott Paxson in 2004.
- The Nittany Lions blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter. It was Penn State's second blocked field goal of the season. It marks the first time Penn State has blocked two or more field goals in a season since 2004 (five blocked field goals).
- Ebiketie blocked a Wisconsin 25-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter.
- Senior SN Chris Stoll is in his third season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 29 career games.
- S Jonathan Sutherland will wear No. 0 for the second straight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- Special teams coordinator Joe Lorig is in his third season at Penn State.
- Lorig has 24 years of coaching experience, including eight as a special teams coordinator.
- In 2019, the Penn State special teams unit was ranked first among Power Five schools, and tied for second in the FBS, in special teams efficiency according to ESPN.com.

GAME RECAP

MADISON, Wis. - The No. 19/20 Penn State football team opened its 2021 campaign with a 16-10 road victory against Big Ten foe No. 12 Wisconsin.

The Nittany Lion defense shined in the game, tallying three takeaways in the contest including two in the game's final minutes. Linebacker Ellis Brooks led all players with a career-high 11 tackles. He also recorded a sack. Arnold Ebiketie was strong off the edge, adding a sack, two tackles for a loss and a blocked field goal. Penn State sealed the victory with key interceptions by Jaquan Brisker and Ji'Ayir Brown.

Penn State (1-0, 1-0 Big Ten) gained 297 total yards, with 247 yards coming from its passing attack. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18-33 passes for 247 yards and a touchdown. Senior Jahan Dotson had a big day on the outside, highlighted by a 49-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter and a 42-yard grab in the fourth that led to Penn State's second touchdown of the game. Noah Cain capped off that drive with a two-yard TD run in his first game since Penn State's season opener in 2020. Wisconsin (0-1, 0-1 Big Ten) found success on the ground on Saturday,

Wisconsin (0-1, 0-1 Big Ten) found success on the ground on Saturday, led by a 31-carry 121-yard day from junior Chez Mellusi. Penn State held Wisconsin quarterback Graham Mertz to 185 yards passing and forced two interceptions.

The win is Penn State's first season-opening victory against a ranked opponent since 1999 when the Nittany Lions defeated No. 4 Arizona, 41-7. The Nittany Lions have now won their last five contests against Wisconsin.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Both defenses were on display in a scoreless opening quarter. Wisconsin threatened on its first drive of the second, getting inside Penn State's fiveyard line. The Nittany Lions would stand strong, holding the Badgers to a field goal attempt that was blocked by Arnold Ebiketie to keep Wisconsin off the board.

The Badgers would once again reach the red zone on their next drive, when their 12-play drive ended on the game's first turnover. Nick Tarburton jumped on a fumbled exchange between Wisconsin's Graham Mertz and Chez Mellusi to give the Nittany Lions their first takeaway of the 2021 season. The game would remain scoreless at the half, marking the first time since

In game would remain scoreless at the half, marking the first time sin 2011 that Penn State and an opponent were tied 0-0 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions struck first on their opening drive of the second half when Sean Clifford found Jahan Dotson deep down field for a 49-yard touchdown. Penn State went 86 yards on just four plays for its first score of the year. Wisconsin would even the score on the ensuing drive, capping off a 10-

Wisconsin would even the score on the ensuing drive, capping off a 10play, 75-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run by Mellusi. The Badgers took their first lead of the game early in the fourth on a 43-

yard field goal by Collin Larsh to make it 10-7.

Penn State followed with a field goal of their own, when Jordan Stout knocked a 24-yarder through the uprights. The drive was highlighted by a 34yard carry by Noah Cain.

The Nittany Lions jumped back in front, 16-10, with 9:17 remaining in the fourth on a two-yard touchdown rush by Cain. Clifford and Dotson once again connected on a big play on the drive, this time on a 42-yarder to get Dotson over the 100-yard receiving mark. The Penn State defense continued to make big plays to close out the

The Penn State defense continued to make big plays to close out the victory. With Wisconsin threatening inside the 5-yard line, the Nittany Lion defense stood strong with three consecutive stops, capped off by an interception by Jaquan Brisker on fourth down.

The Badgers would get the ball back with 1:10 remaining and quickly got into the red zone again. The Nittany Lions closed out the game with two big defensive plays, first a sack by Ebiketie, followed by a game-sealing interception by Ji'Ayir Brown to clinch the 16-10 victory.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - For the first time in 22 months, fans filled the seats of Beaver Stadium as the Penn State football team opened its home schedule with a 44-13 victory over Ball State on Saturday. It was Penn State's 300th win in Beaver Stadium

The crowd of 105,323 saw a strong offensive performance from the No. 11/13 Nittany Lions, as Penn State complied 493 yards of total offense on the day.

Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 21 of 29 passes for 230 yards and a touchdown. He also added 66 yards and a touchdown on the ground. The passing score came on a 25-yard connection with Jahan Dotson in the second quarter. Dotson has now reached the end zone in four consecutive games dating back to last season.

Penn State was also strong on the ground, as the Nittany Lion rushing attack compiled 240 yards with three different players tallying 60-plus yards. Noah Cain was the team's leading rusher with 69 yards and his second touchdown of the season.

After a three-takeaway day in the team's season-opener against Wisconsin, the ball-hawking Penn State defense added two more interceptions on the day, highlighted by a 16-yard interception return for a touchdown by linebacker Jesse Luketa.

The Nittany Lions now turn their attention to No. 25/RV Auburn as the two teams are set to meet next Saturday night at Beaver Stadium for the annual Penn State White Out game.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions methodically marched down the field on their opening possession, driving 13 plays on 78 yards resulting in a Noah Cain 5-yard touchdown run.

Penn State would double its lead on its ensuing drive, highlighted by 20-plus yard completions by Clifford to Parker Washington and Keyvone Lee to set the Nittany Lions up inside the five-yard line. Clifford completed the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to give Penn State a 14-0 lead.

Ball State would get on the board in the opening minute of the second quarter on a Jake Chanove 24-yard field goal.

Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week Jordan Stout would follow with a field goal of his own, connecting from 45-yards to extend the Penn State lead to 17-3.

The Nittany Lions would score once more in the first half, when Sean Clifford found Jahan Dotson for a 25-yard catch and run to make it 24-3. Ball State would end the half with a 23-yard field goal by Chanove as time expired.

The Penn State defense got the scoring started in the second half with 5:56 remaining in the third quarter when Jesse Luketa intercepted a Drew Plitt pass and returned it 16 yards for a touchdown. It was Penn State's first pick-six since John Reid intercepted a pass for a touchdown in 2019 against Buffalo.

Stout would add three more to the scoreboard in the closing minutes of the third on a 26-yard field goal to give Penn State a 34-6 lead.

The Nittany Lions got another takeaway on Ball State's next drive on Daequan Hardy's first-career interception. Penn State would add another field goal with 9:59 to go in the fourth when

Penn State would add another field goal with 9:59 to go in the fourth when Stout connected on a 22-yarder.

Ball State scored its first points of the second half on a 6-yard touchdown run by Carson Steele with 6:58 to go.

Penn State would add one final score with 2:10 remaining in the game when Ta'Quan Roberson tossed his first career touchdown pass, a 23-yarder to Theo Johnson to cap off the 44-13 victory.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 10/12 Penn State football team celebrated the annual Penn State White Out game with a 28-20 win over No. 22/20 Auburn on Saturday night.

The Nittany Lion's have defeated two ranked opponents in their first three games of the season for the first time in program history. The win is Penn State's first regular-season victory over an SEC opponent since the Nittany Lions defeated Alabama, 9-0, in 1990.

Penn State's high-powered offense was on display in this prime time contest, compiling 391 total yards.

Quarterback Sean Clifford continued his fast start to the 2021 campaign, completing 28-of-32 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns.

Wide receiver Jahan Dotson hauled in a career-high 10 catches for 78 yards and a touchdown in the contest. He has now reached the end zone in five consecutive games dating back to last season. Tight End Brenton Strange also put together a career-best performance, setting a new high mark with 71 yards on four catches and a touchdown.

The Penn State defense would seal the victory in the dosing minutes, forcing Auburn to turn the ball over on downs at the Penn State 2 yard-line with 3:08 remaining in the game. Brandon Smith paced the Nittany Lion defense with a career-high 10 tackles.

The crowd of 109,958 was the ninth largest in Beaver Stadium history.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After Penn State turned the ball over on downs on its opening drive, Auburn got on the board first with a 45-yard field goal by Anders Carlson.

The Nittany Lions got the offense going on their third possession. Sean Clifford delivered two long passes to his tight ends on back-to-back plays, first a 23-yarder to Brenton Strange and then a 37-yarder to Theo Johnson to set Penn State up inside the five. Penn State would score on the next play when Clifford hit Jahan Dotson in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown to give Penn State a 7-3 lead.

Auburn would reclaim the lead on its ensuing drive on a 4-yard touchdown run by Tank Bigsby.

In the closing minutes of the second quarter, Penn State would go on a 14play, 91-yard drive to jump back in front. The long scoring drive was capped off by a 4-yard TD pass from Clifford to Strange to put the Nittany Lions ahead 14-10 at the half.

On the first play of the second half, a botched trick play by Auburn resulted in Derrick Tangelo falling on a loose ball to set Penn State up at the Auburn 20 yard-line. The Nittany Lions would extend the lead on Tyler Warren's first career rushing touchdown to give Penn State a 21-10 advantage.

Bigsby would reach the end zone for the second time in the game with 5:52 remaining in the third, when his 6-yard TD run cut the Penn State lead to 21-17. The Tigers would add three more on the first play of the fourth quarter when Carlson converted on a 43-yard field goal attempt.

Penn State would fire back on the following drive, highlighted by a 40-yard connection between (lifford and Strange that put the Nittany Lions inside the five. Noah Cain would find the end zone for the third time this season with a S-yard TD run to give Penn State a 28-20 lead.

The Nittany Lion defense would put the finishing touches on the victory, forcing Auburn to turn the ball over on downs at the Penn State 2 yard-line with 3:08 remaining in the game.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The Penn State passing attack was on display Saturday as the Nittany Lions defeated Villanova 38-17 at Beaver Stadium.

Quarterback Sean Clifford recorded career numbers in the contest, reaching the 400-yard passing mark for the first time with a total of 401 yards. He also matched his career-high with four passing touchdowns.

The offense was spread evenly among the Penn State receiving corps, with both Parker Washington (148 yards) and Jahan Dotson (117 yards) reaching the century mark. KeAndre Lambert-Smith also added 88-yards receiving, marking the first time since a 2017 contest against Michigan State that three Penn State wide receivers recorded 80+ yards in a game. Washington and Lambert-Smith recorded career highs with their yard totals.

As a unit, Penn State accumulated 500 yards of total offense for the first time this season with 509 total yards.

The Penn State defense produced a solid overall performance, with 24 different players recording a tackle in the game.

The Nittany Lions now turn their attention to Indiana as they host the Hoosiers at Beaver Stadium on Oct. 2 at 7:30 p.m.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions struck quickly on their first drive, as Sean Clifford hit Jahan Dotson for a 52-yard touchdown on Penn State's first offensive play. It was the longest catch of the year for Dotson. The wideout has now reached the end zone in six consecutive games dating back to last season.

Villanova got on the board in the final minutes of the first quarter on a 39-yard field goal by Cole Bunce.

Penn State struck right back on the first drive of the second when Clifford once again connected on a long TD pass, this time to Parker Washington for a career-long 52-yard score to put the Nittany Lions up 14-3.

Clifford would find Washington again for a long gain on Penn State's next drive for a 67-yard catch and run to set the Nittany Lions up inside the ten. It would set up a 29-yard field goal from Jordan Stout. They would lead 17-3 at the half.

The Nittany Lions would once again score on a long play to open the second half when Clifford hit KeAndre Lambert-Smith for a season-long 83yard touchdown. The catch was the longest of Lambert-Smith's career.

Penn State would force the game's first turnover on the ensuing drive when Jy'air Brown corralled a tipped pass by for the interception.

Clifford and Washington would add another score in the final minutes of the third, a 23-yard grab for Clifford's fourth TD pass of the game.

They would add to the lead in the opening minutes of the fourth when Tyler Warren carried the ball up the middle for a 3-yard score, his second of his career.

Villanova reached the end zone for the first time in the contest on the following drive on a 57-yard TD pass from Daniel Smith to Rayjoun Pringle. They would follow with another score with under two minutes to go when Smith hit Pringle for a 17-yarder to cut the Penn State lead to 38-17.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – No. 4/6 Penn State held Indiana's offense scoreless in two trips to the red zone, culminating in a 24-0 shutout win Saturday evening at Beaver Stadium in the annual Penn State Stripe Out game.

Quarterback Sean Clifford threw for three touchdowns, including two to wide receiver Jahan Dotson for the duo's 18th-career passing touchdown, the most in Penn State history.

The Penn State defense produced its first shutout in two years, its last also coming in Big Ten play at Maryland in 2019. The defense held Indiana over 100 yards below its season average in total offense, and nearly 100 yards below its season average in rushing yards.

How It Happened

The Nittany Lions struck first on their second drive of the game, as Sean Clifford found tight end Brenton Strange in the end zone for the 10-yard score.

After a defensive red-zone stop at their own four yard-line, running back Keyvone Lee used a career-long 44-yard rush and another 21yard rush to get the Nittany Lions in the red zone. Clifford then connected with wide receiver Jahan Dotson for an 8-yard touchdown to put Penn State up 14-0. With the score, Clifford and Dotson have connected on 17 career touchdown passes, tying Todd Blackledge and Kenny Jackson (1980-82) for the most by a Penn State QB-WR duo.

The Penn State defense recorded its first takeaway of the game with about four minutes to play in the second quarter as cornerback Joey Porter Jr. grabbed his first career interception. The Nittany Lions would take a 14-0 lead into halftime.

Clifford and Dotson linked up again in the third quarter for a 30yard touchdown to give Penn State a 21-0 advantage. It marked Clifford and Dotson's 18th career touchdown pass, officially passing Blackledge and Jackson for the most by a Penn State QB-WR duo in program history.

On Indiana's next drive, the Hoosiers marched down the field to the Penn State 13 yard-line but were held to a field-goal attempt in hopes of finding their first points of the game. Linebacker Brandon Smith got a hand on the 30-yard attempt for the Nittany Lions' second blocked field goal of the season as the score would remain 21-0 at the end of the third quarter.

Penn State added to its lead in the fourth quarter with a 50-yard field goal from Jordan Stout to make it 24-0. It was Stout's first 50-plus yard field goal of the season and the fourth in his career.

The Nittany Lion defense had their second takeaway of the game, an interception in the fourth quarter by safety Ji'Ayir Brown, his third of the season.

GAME 6 PENN STATE VS. IOWA

The Nittany Lions got off to a guick start in the game, jumping out to a 17-3 lead in the first half, but the lowa defense would hold Penn State to just three second half points as the Hawkeyes came from behind for the victory.

In a defensive affair, the Penn State defense held lowa to 305 yards of total offense. Linebacker Ellis Brooks led the unit with a career-high 14 tackles in the contest. Jaquan Brisker tied a careerhigh with nine tackles while adding an interception and a pass breakup. Arnold Ebiketie was a force off the edge for Penn State, recording 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack to go along with his seasonhigh nine tackles.

Both of the Nittany Lions' offensive touchdowns came on the ground, with Noah Cain punching in a 2-yarder and guarterback Sean Clifford scoring from four yards out. Clifford completed 15-of-25 passes for 145 yards before leaving the game late in the second quarter.

HOW IT HAPPENED

lowa capitalized off a turnover to get on the board first. After a Jestin Jacobs interception set the Hawkeyes up inside the 5 yardline, the Penn State defense stood strong to hold lowa to a field goal in the game's opening minutes.

The Nittany Lions guickly moved down the field on their ensuing drive, moving 75 yards in just 2:31 to set up a 2-yard touchdown run by Noah Cain.

Brisker would give the Nittany Lions their first takeaway, intercepting a tipped pass to give Penn State the ball in Iowa territory. After Sean Clifford connected with KeAndre Lambert-Smith for a 30-yard gain deep into the red zone, the quarterback would score on his own with a 4-yard touchdown run.

Penn State would extend its lead in the opening minutes of the second quarter on a Jordan Stout 32-yard field goal to make it 17-3 Nittany Lions.

lowa cut into the lead on its next position as Spencer Petras found Charlie Jones for a 9-yard touchdown to cut the Penn State lead to seven.

Stout would push the Nittany Lion lead back to double-digits midway through the third with a 44-yard field goal.

lowa's Caleb Shudak would cut Penn State's advantage back to single digits in the closing minutes of the third quarter with a 48yard field goal. They would add another three points minutes later on a 36-yarder from Shudak.

The Hawkeyes would jump ahead with a quick strike late in the fourth quarter when Petras hit Nico Ragaini for a 44-yard touchdown to give lowa a 23-20 lead that would hold as the final score.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 7/8 Penn State football team fell to Big Ten foe Illinois, 20-18 in nine overtimes, in a noon contest at Beaver Stadium on Saturday. The nine-overtime game was the first in college football history.

After the sides traded field goals in the first two overtimes, the game would head to the two-point conversion portion of overtime. After the defenses held in the first five rounds, teams would trade rushing conversions in the eighth overtime. Illinois would clinch the walk-off victory when Brandon Peters hit Casey Washington in the back of the end zone.

The Nittany Lions leaned on a bend but don't break defense in the contest, winning the turnover battle, 3-0. Ten different Penn State athletes recorded at least five tackles in the game, with Ji'Ayir Brown leading the way with a career-high 13 tackles.

Clifford returned to action after missing the second half of Penn State's game in lowa two weeks ago, completing 19-of-34 passes with 165 yards and a touchdown. He connected with KeAndre Lambert-Smith on a 42-yard touchdown strike to open the scoring for the Nittany Lions in the first quarter.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lion defense made their mark early when Illinois' opening drive was stopped on a diving interception by linebacker Curtis Jacobs, the first of his career.

Penn State got the passing game going in the final minutes of the first. Sean Clifford connected on back-to-back long strikes to put the Nittany Lions on the board. He first hit Jahan Dotson deep down the right sideline for a 36-yard gain and then found KeAndre Lambert-Smith over the middle for a 42-yard catch-and-run for the touchdown.

The Penn State defense added another turnover in the opening minutes of the second when a Brandon Smith strip-sack was recovered by Dvon Ellies in Illinois' territory. They would extend the lead to 10-0 on the ensuing drive on a 35-yard field goal by Jordan Stout.

Illinois would follow with its first points of the day, capping off an 8:20 drive with a 1-yard touchdown run by Chase Brown.

The Illini would tie the game in the opening minutes of the fourth on a 37-yard field goal by James McCourt.

The teams traded defensive stops throughout the fourth, sending the game to overtime.

Penn State got the ball first in OT, jumping out in front on a 31-yard field goal by Jordan Stout. Illinois would answer with a field goal of their own, a 38-yarder by McCourt.

McCourt would once again convert in the opening drive of the second overtime, this time from 22-yards. Stout matched his counterpart with a 40-yarder, sending the game to two-point conversion triple overtime.

Illinois would clinch the win in the ninth overtime when Brandon Peters hit Casey Washington in the back of the end zone.

GAME RECAP

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The No. 20/17 Penn State football team fell to No. 5/5 Ohio State, 33-24, in a road contest at Ohio Stadium on Saturday night. In a primetime slugfest, the Nittany Lions and Buckeyes combined for 860 yards of total offense in the game.

Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford completed a career-high 35 passes on the night for 361 yards and a touchdown. The Nittany Lions had a pair of 100-yard receivers for the second time this season, as Jahan Dotson tallied a career-high 11 catches for 127 yards and Parker Washington tied a careerhigh with nine catches for 108 yards. This marks the first time since 2014 that two Penn State wide receivers posted concurrent 100-yard games twice in one season (DaeSean Hamilton and Geno Lewis). Dotson also recorded his first career rushing touchdown, scoring on a 2-yard run in the second quarter.

Penn State's defense showed their grit throughout the night, holding Ohio State to just one red zone touchdown on six opportunities. Linebacker Brandon Smith led the unit with seven tackles in the contest.

Ohio State quarterback C.J. Stroud completed 22-of-34 passes for 305 yards and a touchdown. The Buckeyes leaned on freshman running back TreVeyon Henderson to put the game away in the second half. He totaled 152 yards on 28 carries with a rushing touchdown. The Buckeyes also added a defensive score in the game, a 57-yard fumble return by Jerron Cage.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions would get on the board first, going 89 yards on 13 plays en route to the game's first touchdown. Sean Clifford went 5-6 for 72 yards on the drive, capping it off with a 5-yard touchdown pass to Brenton Strange. The drive was highlighted by a 32-yard catch and run from Clifford to Parker Washington.

Penn State's red zone defense would hold Ohio State to a field goal on the ensuing drive, as the Buckeyes got on the board with a 35-yard field goal by Noah Ruggles.

Ohio State would take its first lead in the closing minutes of the second when C.J. Stroud found Chris Olave deep for a 37-yard touchdown to put the Buckeyes ahead 10-7.

The Buckeye defense would force a turnover to extend the lead on the ensuing drive on a 53-yard scoop and score by Jerron Cage.

Penn State would cut the deficit back to one possession going into the half with a 47-yard field goal by Jordan Stout. Ohio State led 17-10 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions would even the score on their first drive of the second half, finishing off a 75-yard scoring drive with Jahan Dotson's first career touchdown rush.

Penn State's defense would record another trademark goal line stop, forcing Ohio State into a field goal inside the five-yard line. Ruggles 23-yard field goal gave Ohio State a 20-17 lead.

Ohio State would extend the lead to 27--17 their next drive. After TreVeyon Henderson set the Buckeyes up inside the five on a 68-yard run, the freshman would score on a 1-yard rush two plays later.

Clifford would once again drive the Nittany Lions down the field on the following drive, putting Penn State inside the red zone with five straight completions. The Nittany Lions would pull within 27-24 on a 1-yard touchdown run by Keyvone Lee.

Penn State would hold the Buckeyes to a red zone field goal once again, a 24-yarder from Ruggles to extend the lead to 30-24. They would repeat this later in the fourth with Ruggles tacking on three more with a 26-yarder. **Notes**




