PENN STATE READY FOR INDIANA IN BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP REMATCH

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, is set to face Indiana in the Big Ten Tournament Championship on Sunday, Nov. 14 at Jeffrey Field in a rematch of last year's title match. Kickoff between the top-seeded Nittany Lions and No. 3-seed Hoosiers is set for noon and will broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Patrick Doody (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- » Penn State is 34-22-6 (.597) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991.
- » After winning the Big Ten regular season title, the Nittany Lions received the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament for the first time since 2013 after spending the previous two seasons as the No. 2 seed.
- » Penn State is 4-1-1 all-time as a one-seed and is 6-6-0 against the three-seed.
- » The Nittany Lions are 3-8-2 all-time in the championship game. They are making their second-straight appearance in the title match for the first time since 2010-11. Their last title came in 2005 under the program's winningest head coach, Barry Gorman.
- » The Blue and White are 3-9-5 against the Hoosiers in tournament play. The teams last faced off in the Big Ten Tournament last season in the championship match. No. 2-seed Penn State took No. 1-seed Indiana to a 1-1 double-overtime draw before losing the trophy on penalty kicks, 3-2.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE DOWNS MICHIGAN TO ADVANCE TO SECOND-STRAIGHT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP

- » Penn State advances to its second-straight Big Ten Tournament Championship after defeating Michigan, 2-0, in the semifinals Wednesday afternoon at Jeffrey Field.
- » The Wolverines started the game controlling a lot of the possession before the Nittany Lions finally got more control about 10 or so minutes in. After a Michigan foul in Penn State's defensive half of the field, **Femi Awodesu** sent a long ball in near the box in which **Peter Mangione** received and played over to **Liam Butts** who then played it over to classmate **Andrew Privett** who was tripped up right outside the box to set up a free kick.
- » Privett, Mangione and **Seth Kuhn** all stood over the ball and as the whistle blew, Kuhn played a short pass to Mangione who stopped the ball for Kuhn to immediately take a left-footed curled shot at the near post for the Nittany Lions' first goal of the game.
- » Just minutes later, Penn State was determined to find an insurance goal as Butts had two attempts at net, one that was blocked and another saved by Michigan's keeper Hayden Evans.
- » In the 22nd minute, Michigan had chances of its own to find an equalizer with back-to-back blocked shots and one off target.
- » On the counterattack, Penn State raced down the pitch before settling the ball. After sending a ball into the box and it bouncing around, **Jalen Watson** gained possession and sent it out to Privett on the left side. Privett played a cross into the six looking for the head of Mangione and while Mangione froze Evans at the near

post going up for the header, the cross went over his head and into the back of the net to make it 2-0 about 24 minutes in.

- » As the next 20 or so minutes of the half wrapped up, the home team had even more offensive chances by Mangione, **Danny Bloyou** and **Dax Hoffman** but Evans made two saves to keep it a two-goal game at the break.
- » The second half started with a quick shot on goal by the Wolverines, but goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** was there for the save.
- » Shakes had another big save in the 49th minute on a rebounded shot after the original attempt hit the post.
- » Penn State had some more goal-scoring chances in the second half, including one in the 67th minute by Hoffman that was barely cleared off the goal line by the Michigan defense.
- » In the 74th minute, Michigan earned a free kick about five yards or so outside the box in which the Wolverines directly took a shot on target from it, but Shakes made a one-handed save for his third of the half to keep a clean sheet.
- » Between more offensive runs and a strong backline, the Nittany Lions were able to hold down the remainder of the game to again advance to the title game.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- » Kuhn has had an offensive resurgence in the last four games, scoring all four of his goals this season and adding one assist.
- » He paces the team with seven assists which is tied for first in the Big Ten and 39th nationally.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native has set career highs in every category, surpassing his assists high of five from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019 and his goals and points total from last season of two and eight, respectively.
- » He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year. He registered a season-high three points on a goal and the game-winning assist against Maryland (10/26).
- » He recorded his first career multi-goal game at Wisconsin (10/31) to help clinch the regular-season crown for the Nittany Lions.
- » Kuhn's 18 career assists is 33rd on the NCAA active career leaders list.

REEDY NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

- » Redshirt senior **Pierre Reedy** has been named to the 2021 CoSIDA Academic All-District Team for Division I men's soccer, as announced Thursday.
- » This award recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- » The epitome of a student-athlete, Reedy is a two-time graduate of Penn State. He finished his undergraduate degree in security and risk analysis in May 2020 and most recently completed a masters in corporate finance in May 2021, holding impressive GPAs of 3.64 and 3.66, respectively. He is currently working on another undergraduate degree in sociology as he continues to compete with the Nittany Lions.
- » The Kutztown, Pa., native is the program's first back-to-back All-District team member since Andy Parr in 2009-10.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- » Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** is clutch when needed most.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native has a career-high seven goals this season, with four the eventual game-winners.
- » Mangione's latest game-winning goal came just 25 seconds into the Big Ten quarterfinal match against Michigan State (11/7),

- » His four game-winning goals is tied for first in the Big Ten and 16th nationally.
- » Mangione has 13 career goals, eight of which are game-winners.

BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- » For the first time since 2013 and for the sixth time in program history, Penn State won the Big Ten regular season crown, finishing with a 6-2-0 record in conference play to total 18 points.
- » The Nittany Lions had finished runner-up in the league the previous two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

COACH OF THE YEAR

- » Head coach **Jeff Cook** was named the unanimous 2021 Big Ten Coach of the Year as announced with the rest of the Big Ten Men's Soccer conference awards on Friday.
- » Cook earned the program's fourth overall Coach of the Year award and first since former head coach Bob Warming went back-to-back in 2012-13.
- » In his fourth season at the helm, Cook has brought the Penn State men's soccer program back into the national spotlight with two consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament (2019, 2020-21) as well as winning this season's conference regular season title.
- » He holds a 39-21-8 overall record in Happy Valley and an impressive 21-7-4 (.719) record in Big Ten play.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- » Sophomore **Peter Mangione** was named the 2021 Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year as announced by the conference office Friday.
- » His Offensive Player of the Year award is the second Big Ten Player of the Year award under head coach **Jeff Cook's** tutelage, joining Aaron Molloy's Midfielder of the Year nod in 2019.
- » Mangione is the first Offensive Player of the Year since Connor Maloney in 2014.

SIX NITTANY LIONS HONORED IN BIG TEN SEASON AWARDS

- » Highlighted by **Peter Mangione's** Offensive Player of the Year nod as well as head coach **Jeff Cook's** unanimous selection of Coach of the Year, five additional Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with 2021 season awards.
- » Additionally, Mangione and redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** were named to the All-Big Ten First Team and midfielders **Andrew Privett**, **Seth Kuhn** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the All-Big Ten Second Team while junior **Alex Stevenson** is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- » Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- » Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with 22 points on a team-high nine goals and four assists. Sophomore **Peter Mangione** and seniors **Seth Kuhn** and **Danny Bloyou** also each have double-digit points at 17, 15 and 12, respectively.
- » Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn** paces the team with seven assists.
- » Penn State is averaging 1.68 goals per game and 4.95 points per game. The Nittany Lions are second in total goals (32) and total assists (30), and total points (94) in the Big Ten.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- » Junior midfielder **Andrew Privett** is really having a break-out year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 22 on nine goals and four assists.
- » His total goals leads the conference and is 31st in the nation while his total points also stands first in the league and 44th nationally.
- » The Fallston, Md., native recorded his first career game-winning goal in overtime against Maryland (10/26), and a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- » His statistics are all career highs, surpassing his previous bests of two goals, three assists and seven total points as a freshman in 2019.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** has posted six shutouts in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1), at Rutgers (10/5), at Wisconsin (10/31) and against Michigan State and Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament (11/7 and 11/10).

- » Penn State was one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates were the most of any school.

- » Penn State scored three unanswered goals to top then-No. 7 Maryland, 3-2, in overtime at Jeffrey Field on Tuesday (10/26).
- » The Nittany Lions erased a 2-0 deficit to win for the first time since 2019 when they also did so against a ranked Maryland squad at Jeffrey Field in overtime (10/29/19).
- » The win snapped a tough three-game losing streak for Penn State.

- » Indiana is led by 12-year head coach Todd Yeagley and is 14-4-1 overall after finishing Big Ten play with a 5-3-0 record to earn the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament. The Hoosiers are coming off a 1-0 overtime win over No. 7-seed Northwestern in the Big Ten semifinals (11/10) to advance to their fifth-straight conference championship match.
- » Freshman Samuel Sarver paces the Hoosiers with 18 points on a team-high seven goals and four assists. Juniors Victor Bezerra and Herbert Endeley are tied for the team-lead in assists with five each. In all, 16 Indiana players have recorded at least one point this season. Redshirt junior Daniel Munie was named the Big Ten Defender of the Year, but did not play much of the team's semifinal match after leaving with an apparent injury.
- » In net, back-to-back Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year junior Roman Celentano has played lights out for the Hoosiers defense. He holds a 0.68 goals-against average and 0.827 save percentage with 62 saves and 10 shutouts.

PENN STATE AGAINST INDIANA

- » Penn State trails in the all-time series against Indiana, 14-35-5, including a tough 1-0 loss at Jeffrey Field during the regular season (10/17).
- » The Nittany Lions and Hoosiers rematch in the Big Ten Tournament championship after Indiana kept the trophy last season on a 3-2 penalty kick shootout after Penn State tied the game at 1-1 late in regulation with a goal from Liam Butts in the 82nd minute.
- » Penn State is seeking its first win over Indiana since the 2015 season and its first Big Ten Tournament title since beating Indiana 1-0 in 2005.
