PENN STATE TO HOST HOFSTRA IN NCAA TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, will welcome the Hofstra Pride to Happy Valley in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Sunday, Nov. 21 at Jeffrey Field. Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. and will stream for free on B1G+.

PENN STATE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Penn State is making its 35th overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament after earning the Big Ten Conference's automatic bid by winning the 2021 Big Ten Tournament. It also marks the Nittany Lions third-straight trip to the national tournament for the first time since 1993-95. Penn State is 29-33-1 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, including 22-8-1 at Jeffrey Field.
- Penn State received the No. 12 overall seed in the big dance and a first-round bye. It is the second national seed in the Jeff Cook era after earning the No. 15 seed in 2019. It's the highest seed for the Nittany Lions since being the No. 7 seed in 2009.
- The Nittany Lions are one of three teams in the 2021 NCAA Tournament. Indiana and Maryland both earned at-large bids and the Hoosiers also received the No. 15 seed.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE DOMINATES INDIANA TO WIN 2021 BIG TEN **TOURNAMENT TITLE**

- Penn State captured its first Big Ten Tournament title since 2005 after dominating Indiana, 3-0, in the championship match Sunday afternoon at Jeffrey Field.
- Indiana started on the front foot, controlling the majority of the possession in the early stages of the game, registering the first shot on target in the second minute.
- It wasn't until the 36th minute that the Nittany Lions broke through. Danny Bloyou held up a ball for classmate Seth Kuhn and his shot deflected off a Hoosier defender and past back-to-back Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year Roman Celentano for the 1-0 lead.
- The momentum was in the Nittany Lions' favor, as two minutes later, Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Peter Mangione had a golden chance to extend the lead, but Celentano made a massive kick save for the Hoosiers and kept the score at 1-0 heading into halftime.
- The second half started out fast as Penn State found the insurance goal 10 minutes into the frame. Tyger Evans picked up the ball in a one-on-one against an Indiana defender, was able to dance around him, and slotted the ball into the bottom-right corner at the far post for the 2-0 advantage.
- Penn State's defense was able to shut down Indiana's lethal attack in the second half, limiting the Hoosiers to just two shots. Goalkeeper Kris Shakes, along with the backline anchored by Brandon Hackenberg, put out any fire that the visiting offense was causing.
- After the strong defensive half, it would be Pierre Reedy in the 85th minute to officially seal the deal for the Nittany Lions. Kuhn lofted a ball over the top, Mangione chested it down, and Reedy put the ball into the bottom-left corner with

- his left foot, giving Penn State a three-goal lead and putting the preverbal nail in the coffin.
- As the clock wound down, the Park Avenue Army along with an elated crowd at Jeffrey Field counted down the seconds as Penn State avenged last season's Big Ten Tournament final loss to Indiana.

AND WE CAN'T STOP, AND WE WON'T STOP

- The Nittany Lions are in the midst of a five-game winning streak to win both the Big Ten regular season and tournament crowns after hitting a road block of three-straight losses in October.
- In those five games, Penn State has outscored its opponents, 12-2, including 11-0 from the second half of the Maryland game (10/26) through the conclusion of the Big Ten Tournament.
- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes and the backline have recorded four consecutive shutouts, while Shakes has a current 419-minute shutout streak, part of which earned him the title of Big Ten Defensive Player of the Tournament.
- Of the Nittany Lions' 12 goals in the last five games, senior midfield maestro Seth Kuhn has played a role in seven of them, including five goals and three game-winners. He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Tournament.

BIG PERFORMANCE

- Penn State had an outstanding Big Ten Tournament, culminating in lifting the trophy to become the 2021 Big Ten Tournament Champions for the first time since 2005.
- The Nittany Lions outscored their opponents 7-0, the largest margin in conference tournament history.
- Penn State also won each game by two or more games, the first time the champion has done so since the format changed from two games to three.

I'LL TAKE A DOUBLE, PLEASE

- Penn State claimed both the 2021 Big Ten regular season and Big Ten Tournament crowns for the first time in program
- The 2005 team also technically won both, but prior to 2009, the conference "champion" was not determined until the conclusion of the conference tournament.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn has had an offensive resurrgance in the last five games, scoring all five of his goals this season and adding two assists.
- He paces the team with eight assists which is tied for first in the Big Ten and 24th nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has set career highs in every category, surpassing his assists high of five from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019 and his goals and points total from last season of two and eight, respectively.
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year. He registered a season-high three points on a goal and the game-winning assist against Maryland (10/26) and did so again in the championship game against Indiana (11/14) with the eventual game-winning goal and an assist.
- He recorded his first career multi-goal game at Wisconsin (10/31) to help clinch the regular-season crown for the Nittany Lions.
- Kuhn's 19 career assists is 29th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

TYGER ROAR

Sophomore Tyger Evans played off the bench in the Big Ten Tournament championship game and immediately had an

- impact.
- The Harrisburg, Pa., native help facilitate the eventual gamewinning goal as he found Danny Bloyou in the box before Bloyou showed patience and sent it right outside the penalty area to Seth Kuhn.
- Evans then scored the second goal of the game, his first of the season, as he danced around a Hoosier defender to give the Nittany Lions some insurance.

REEDY NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

- Redshirt senior Pierre Reedy has been named to the 2021 CoSIDA Academic All-District Team for Division I men's soccer, as announced Thursday.
- This award recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom.
- The epiotme of a student-athlete, Reedy is a two-time graduate of Penn State. He finished his undergraduate degree in security and risk analysis in May 2020 and most recently completed a masters in corporate finance in May 2021, holding impressive GPAs of 3.64 and 3.66, respectively. He is currently working on another undergraduate degree in sociology as he continues to compete with the Nittany Lions.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native is the program's first back-to-back All-District team member since Andy Parr in 2009-10.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione is clutch when needed most.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has a career-high seven goals this season, with four the eventual game-winners.
- Mangione's latest game-winning goal came just 25 seconds into the Big Ten quarterfinal match against Michigan State (11/7),
- His four game-winning goals is tied for first in the Big Ten and 19th nationally.
- Mangione has 13 career goals, eight of which are gamewinners.

BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- For the first time since 2013 and for the sixth time in program history, Penn State won the Big Ten regular season crown, finishing with a 6-2-0 record in conference play to total 18
- The Nittany Lions had finished runner-up in the league the previous two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

COACH OF THE YEAR

- Head coach Jeff Cook was named the unanimous 2021 Big Ten Coach of the Year as announced with the rest of the Big Ten Men's Soccer conference awards on Friday.
- Cook earned the program's fourth overall Coach of the Year award and first since former head coach Bob Warming went back-to-back in 2012-13
- In his fourth season at the helm, Cook has brought the Penn State men's soccer program back into the national spotlight with two consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament (2019, 2020-21) as well as winning this season's conference regular
- He holds a 39-21-8 overall record in Happy Valley and an impressive 21-7-4 (.719) record in Big Ten play.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Sophomore **Peter Mangione** was named the 2021 Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year as announced by the conference office Friday.
- His Offensive Player of the Year award is the second Big Ten Player of the Year award under head coach Jeff Cook's

- tutelage, joining Aaron Molloy's Midfielder of the Year nod in
- Mangione is the first Offensive Player of the Year since Connor Maloney in 2014.

SIX NITTANY LIONS HONORED IN BIG TEN SEASON AWARDS

- Highlighted by Peter Mangione's Offensive Player of the Year nod as well as head coach Jeff Cook's unanimous selection of Coach of the Year, five additional Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with 2021 season awards.
- Additionally, Mangione and redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg were named to the All-Big Ten First Team and midfielders Andrew Privett, Seth Kuhn and Pierre Reedy were all named to the All-Big Ten Second Team while junior Alex Stevenson is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany Lions with 22 points on a team-high nine goals and four assists. Sophomore Peter Mangione and seniors Seth Kuhn and Danny Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 18, 18 and 13, respectively.
- Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn** paces the team with eight
- Penn State is averaging 1.75 goals per game and 5.15 points per game. The Nittany Lions are first in total goals (35), total assists (33), and total points (103) in the Big Ten.
