#### PENN STATE BEGINS POSTSEASON PLAY WITH MICHIGAN STATE IN BIG TEN **QUARTERFINALS**

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, begins postseason play in the Big Ten Tournament on Sunday, Nov. 7 when it hosts Michigan State at Jeffrey Field in the quarterfinals. Kickoff between the No. 1-seeded Nittany Lions and No. 8-seed Spartans is set for 4 p.m. and will broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dan Kelly (pxp) and Patrick Doody (analyst) on the call.

#### PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Penn State is 32-22-6 (583) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991
- After winning the Big Ten regular season title, the Nittany Lions received the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament for the first time since 2013 after spending the previous two seasons as the No. 2 seed.
- Penn State is 2-1-1 all-time as a one-seed and has never faced the eight-seed
- The Nittany Lions are 7-4-1 against the Spartans in tournament play.

#### LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE EARNS BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CROWN WITH SHUTOUT WIN OVER WISCONSIN

- Penn State earned the outright Big Ten regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the upcoming Big Ten Tournament with a 2-0 shutout win over Wisconsin Sunday in the regular-season finale at a windy McClimon Track/Soccer Complex in Madison.
- After getting Wisconsin to turn the ball over, running up the right side, senior Danny Bloyou played a perfect ball to classmate Seth Kuhn at the top of the 18 as Kuhn took a great strike with his left foot to find the top-left corner of the goal to give the Nittany Lions a 1-0 lead 18 minutes in.
- The Nittany Lions would eventually head to the break with a one-goal advantage and a shot advantage of 5-3.
- Just like the first half, the wind definitely played a factor as a lot of the game was back-and-forth as it was hard to hold onto possession and therefore with very few looks on frame by either team.
- In the 80th minute, junior Liam Butts nearly scored an insurance goal at the far post but he couldn't quite square up on the ball and missed to the right.
- About two minutes later, Kuhn would find that insurance goal for Penn State as his long shot from the sideline on a pass by junior Andrew Privett had incredible bend to just get over the outstretched fingers of Wisconsin's keeper and into the back of the net to make it 2-0.
- The backline held strong through the entire game to keep junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes from having to make a save for the fifth shutout of the season and third in conference play.

# **NOTES AND HEADLINES**

#### **BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS**

- For the first time since 2013 and for the sixth time in program history, Penn State won the Big Ten regular season crown, finishing with a 6-2-0 record in conference play to total 18 points.
- The Nittany Lions had finished runner-up in the league the previous two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

#### **COACH OF THE YEAR**

- Head coach Jeff Cook was named the unanimous 2021 Big Ten Coach of the Year as announced with the rest of the Big Ten Men's Soccer conference awards on Friday.
- Cook earned the program's fourth overall Coach of the Year award and first since former head coach Bob Warming went back-to-back in 2012-13.
- In his fourth season at the helm, Cook has brought the Penn State men's soccer program back into the national spotlight with two consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament (2019, 2020-21) as well as winning this season's conference regular season title.
- He holds a 37-21-8 overall record in Happy Valley and an impressive 21-7-4 (.719) record in Big Ten play.

#### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Sophomore Peter Mangione was named the 2021 Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year as announced by the conference office Friday.
- His Offensive Player of the Year award is the second Big Ten Player of the Year award under head coach Jeff Cook's tutelage, joining Aaron Molloy's Midfielder of the Year nod in 2019.
- Mangione is the first Offensive Player of the Year since Connor Maloney in 2014.

#### SIX NITTANY LIONS HONORED IN BIG TEN SEASON **AWARDS**

- Highlighted by Peter Mangione's Offensive Player of the Year nod as well as head coach Jeff Cook's unanimous selection of Coach of the Year, five additional Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with 2021 season awards.
- Additionally, Mangione and redshirt senior **Brandon** Hackenberg were named to the All-Big Ten First Team and midfielders Andrew Privett, Seth Kuhn and Pierre Reedy were all named to the All-Big Ten Second Team while junior Alex Stevenson is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

### YOU CAN CALL IT A COMEBACK

- Penn State scored three unanswered goals to top then-No. 7 Maryland, 3-2, in overtime at Jeffrey Field on Tuesday (10/26).
- The Nittany Lions erased a 2-0 deficit to win for the first time since 2019 when they also did so against a ranked Maryland squad at Jeffrey Field in overtime (10/29/19).
- The win snapped a tough three-game losing streak for Penn State.

#### **OFFENSIVE WEAPONS**

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany

- Lions with 18 points on a team-high seven goals and four assists. Sophomore Peter Mangione and seniors Seth Kuhn and Danny Bloyou also each have double-digit points at 14, 13 and 12, respectively.
- Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn** paces the team with seven assists.
- Penn State is averaging 1.65 goals per game and 4.94 points per game. The Nittany Lions are third in total goals (28), total assists (28) and points (84) in the Big Ten.

#### **PRIVETT IN FORM**

- Junior midfielder Andrew Privett is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 18 on seven goals and four assists.
- His total goals is second in the conference and 64th in the nation while his total points second in the league and 77th nationally.
- The Fallston, Md., native recorded his first career gamewinning goal in overtime against Maryland (10/26), and a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His statistics are all career highs, surpassing his previous bests of two goals, three assists and seven total points as a freshman in 2019.

#### **KUHN IN THE MIDDLE**

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn paces the team with seven assists which is tied for first in the Big Ten and 33rd nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native's seven assists are a career high, passing his previous of five from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019.
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year. He registered a season-high three points on a goal and the game-winning assist against Maryland (10/26).
- Kuhn also scored the equalizing goal against Maryland (10/26) for his first of the season and followed up that performance with his first career multi-goal game at Wisconsin (10/31) to help clinch the regular-season crown for the Nittany Lions.
- Kuhn's 18 career assists is 30th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

#### **REEDY NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST**

- Redshirt senior Pierre Reedy was named a finalist for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (10/28).
- Reedy became the first finalist for Penn State since 2009 when Jason Yeisley was a finalist and the eventual winner.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- Earlier in the month, Reedy, along with classmate **Brandon** Hackenberg and senior Danny Bloyou were all announced as top-30 candidates for the award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Penn State was one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates were the most of any school.

#### **SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING**

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes has posted three shutouts in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- Shakes has averaged 3.62 saves per game and has 47 total saves, third and first in the league, respectively, in those categories.
- He set a season high with seven saves at Ohio State (10/22).
- The Parkland, Fla., native has 10 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 25-7-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.793 is seventh on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goalsagainst average of 0.984 is 33rd.

#### TOP-30 RPI

- The fourth NCAA RPI ranking for the 2021 season was released Monday and has Penn State ranked No. 29, rising again after two big wins to end the regular season.
- Five 2021 opponents currently rank ahead of the Nittany Lions: No. 4 Pittsburgh, No. 16 Indiana, No. 17 West Virginia, No. 18 Maryland, and No. 20 Akron.
